2024 SO FAR

- The Horned Frogs clinched their sixth consecutive ITA Indoor National Championship berth.
- While playing host of the ITA Kickoff weekend, TCU took down in-state foe Rice, 4-0 on Saturday then beat Tulsa 4-0 on Sunday to punch its ticket to New York City.
- After ITA Weekend, TCU played host to two top-15 teams inside the Bayard H. Friedman Tennis Center.
- No. 15 Stanford (Feb. 2) traveled to Funky Town to take on the No. 2 Horned Frogs. TCU won the doubles point and earned wins on courts two, three, four and five to win the match, 5-2.
- Just two days later, TCU played in an instant-classic against No. 6 Tennessee (Feb. 4). TCU trailed 3-1 and was down to match point on court one, before Jake Fearnley earned his biggest collegiate victory and his defeated Wimbledean doubles partner Johannus Monday. Fearnley's win fueled the TCU comeback which led to Tomas Jirousek clinching the match on court six over Tennessee's Chris Li, 6-3, 6-2.
- TCU then traveled up north to play No. 13 Michigan (Feb. 13) in its indoor regular season finale and won 4-0 in Ann Arbor.
- TCU made its third-straight ITA Indoor National Championship.
- TCU went 3-1 in the ITA Indoor National Championships
- TCU took down No. 15 Arizona State (Feb. 16), No. 10 Texas A&M (Feb. 17) and No. 6 Wake Forest (Feb. 18) in the ITA Indoor National Championships before falling to No. 1 Ohio State (Feb.19), 4-3.
- In its first outdoor dual of 2024, TCU defeated No. 10 Texas (Mar. 2), 4-3 in a thrilling collegiate tennis match.
- Jake Fearnley clinched the match with a win over the No. 1 ranked Eliot Spizzirri, 4-6, 7-6(6), 6-4.
- TCU is 13-3 against ranked foes.
- The Horned Frogs took down No. 29 UCLA (Mar. 13), No. 44 USC (Mar. 15) and No. 40 Pepperdine (Mar. 17) in a span of five days.
- TCU took down No. 27 Baylor (Mar. 22) 4-1.
- TCU is 4-0 at home against ranked opponents, 6-2 on the road and 3-1 on neutral courts.

Frog Focus

- TCU was picked second in the Big 12 Men's Tennis Preseason Poll.
- TCU is No. 3 in the ITA rankings.
- TCU had two selections on the ITA Indoor National Championships All-Tournament Team as Jake Fearnley and Jack Pinnington garnered the honor.
- Five Horned Frogs are in the latest ITA rankings.
- No. 72 Lui Maxted leads the Horned Frogs in with 13 single wins in 2024.
- No. 8 Jack Pinnington is second on the team with 12 singles wins.
- Pinnington is the leader in overall wins with 25.
- Pinnington filled in for the injured Jake Fearnley (March 13-17) on court one and went 3-0.
- Pinnington defeated three ranked foes (Mar. 13-17) on court one and was named Big 12 POTW.
- Pinnington is 6-2 in 2024 on court one.
- Pinnington was the ITA Fall National Championship Finalist.
- Jake Fearnley is an impressive 9-2 in 2024.
- All nine of Fearnley's wins have come on court one.
- Fearnley owns six wins over nationally ranked foes.
- No. 71 Sebastian Gorzny, the 2023 Big 12 Freshman of the Year, is 7-4 so far in 2024.
- Two of TCU's three doubles pairs are nationally ranked.
- The third-ranked duo of Pedro Vives and Sebastian Gorzny are 8-2 on the year with all matches on court one.
- The 70th-ranked tandem of Duncan Chan and Lui Maxted are 11-5 in 2024.
- Jake Fearnley and Jack Pinnington are 6-4 with fives wins coming on the second flight.
- Duncan Chan played on court six vs. No. 25 Baylor (Mar. 10) and clinched the match for the Horned Frogs.
- Chan clinched the match against No. 44 USC on court six.
- Chan tallied his first Big 12 win at Baylor (Mar. 28)
- Chan is 4-2 in 2024 in singles play.
- Tomas Jirousek is 8-6 in 2024 and is a combined 5-2 on courts four and five.
- Julian Alonso is 2-1 in 2024
- Alonos registered his first career Big 12 win at Oklahoma State (Mar. 30)

THE BEST BOSS IN BIG 12 HISTORY

David Roditi now stands alone amongst his Big 12 head coaching peers.

Roditi was named Big 12 Coach of the Year for the fifth time since 2015 on Apr. 28. His five selections are the most received by any Big 12 head coach since the conference's inception in 1997.

In addition to ranking first on the Big 12 record book in career Big 12 Coach of the Year accolades, Roditi is the only head coach to win the award five times in an eight-year period. He claimed the honor in three consecutive seasons from 2015-2017 and received the recognition in 2022.

HAVE A WEEK, COOBS

Jake Fearnley had quite the showing last week to begin the outdoor season. Fearnley got the best of No. 1 Eliot Spizzirri to clinch the match over the No. 10 Longhorns. After dropping the first set, 6-4, Fearnley battled back to win the second set, 7-6, winning the tiebreaker, 8-6. By this time it was all tied 3-3 with the match hinging on the result on court one. Fearnley came through in the clutch, winning the final set, 6-4, to claim his highest ranked win in his career.

PROTECT THE PURPLE

The Bayard H. Friedman Tennis Center is arguably the toughest venue in the nation for opposing teams to compete at. TCU has amassed a 116-12 (.906) record on the purple courts since 2015. Of the 116 victories, 71 have come at the expense of ranked opponents. Under head coach David Roditi, the Horned Frogs have posted a remarkable 156-36 (.813) home record.

THE LONGEST STREAK OF ITA TOP-10 TEAM RANKINGS IN THE COUNTRY

TCU is the only program in the country that has finished in the top-10 of the final ITA team rankings for eight consecutive seasons. The Horned Frogs are enjoying the longest consecutive streak of weeks ranked in the top-10 of any Division I program. TCU has boasted a top-10 ITA team ranking for 182 consecutive weeks, dating back to March 10, 2020.

SUPER SWANNIE

Luke Swan started his TCU career in 2022 when he walked on in the fall. He has been a vocal leader on the court for the Horned Frogs ever since. After being named to the ITA Student-Athlete Council early last fall, Swan earned a Nike Summer Internship in January as he earned TCU's annual selection to the prestigious Nike summer internship program.

Swan, a marketing major, boasts a 3.75 GPA and will intern as marketing specialist.

CHAN IS THE MAN

Against No. 25 Baylor, Duncan Chan stepped in on court six for the Horned Frogs when Jake Fearnley was a late scratch.

After the Horned Frogs jumped out to a 3-0 lead, Baylor battled back get within one point. With the match up in the air on court five, Chan delivered in the clutch winning the third set tiebreaker.

Chan delivered once again at No. 44 USC clinching the match on court six, winning 6-4, 3-6, 7-5.

JPJ STEPPING UP

After a strong fall, where Jack Pinnington garnered a record of 13-3, safe to say Pinnington has picked up where he left off.

Pinnington is 10-2 in 2024 with both losses to nationally ranked foes, one coming to No. 2 Micah Braswell of Texas.

Pinnington was named the Big 12 Player of the Week (Mar. 19) after he filled in for the injured Jake Fearnley. Pinnington went 3-0 on court one with all wins being against ranked foes.

THE STORY BEHIND DAVID RODITI'S MATCH DAY COWBOY HAT

No matter the court or where his constant pacing leads him throughout a dual, it's not difficult to spot David Roditi at any time during a match.

Like Bear Bryant's plaid hat, or Tom Landry's fedora, the TCU men's tennis head coach sports a unique look, one that augments his infectious personality and endears him further to both his players and fans.

Without fail, one element of Roditi's match day attire never changes. Come high tide or low, indoors or outside, Roditi will take the court wearing an authentic cowboy hat.



Originally from Mexico City, Roditi developed a hobby of collecting restored cowboy hats from Chieffalo Vintage Hats, about a 10 minute drive from TCU's campus.

Though his collection is expansive, repping one of his many hats on match day did not become routine until 2015.

It was wintertime, and Roditi's fifth year at the helm was fast approaching. One day proved particularly chilly, so naturally, as Roditi stepped outside his house, he reached for one of his more impressive lids – a lustrous brown felt cowboy hat crafted of 100 percent beaver fur. Later, he was stopped by a TCU athletics assistant coach, who asked him, "You're not going to wear that on the court, are you?"

Roditi had never considered the prospect, but partially emboldened by the question, and without

hesitation, Roditi said, "Yes I am. Of course I am."

From there, a tradition took shape. Fans began commenting about the hat at matches and on social media.

"I heard a saying that players come and go, but coaches stay," Roditi said. "So it became the signature. I can't take it off now. That ship has sailed."

The beaver fur felt hat is his trademark hat during the indoor season. As temperatures rise with the advent of the outdoor season, Roditi shifts to an ivory, weaved straw cowboy hat. No matter the trajectory of TCU's season, or the combination of TCU athletics gear he chooses to wear, one of the two cowboy hats always completes the ensemble.

Roditi has guided TCU to a 197-46 overall record since the cowboy hat became a fixture of his persona nine seasons ago. The Beaver hat has been particularly fruitful over the last two seasons, as it rested atop Roditi's noggin during the program's first-ever ITA Indoor National Championships. With a little help from the hat, TCU has won 25



consecutive indoor matches dating back to the 2022 campaign.

Roditi lists a few reasons as to why he wears a cowboy hat at a tennis match.

He knows it's perhaps a bit goofy, but that's precisely the point.

One of his most significant accomplishments as head coach has been the vibrant match day experience he has created at the Bayard H.

Friedman Tennis Center. The cowboy hat is but a modest addition to the spectacle, and helps further the fun, all-inclusive atmosphere.



More importantly, a initialize firefox/IE support. s a TCU men's tennis alum, Roditi has felt the immense pressure his athletes navigate on the court.

"I know how nervous these guys are when they play," Roditi said. "If they look over and see a short Mexican dude with a cowboy hat on coaching tennis in the middle of a match, that's got to make them smile a little. It is, in a way, a little ridiculous and different. It's also sort of an underlying message to our guys that we're playing college tennis. We're not doing brain surgery out here, so let's not take ourselves too seriously."

And ultimately, the cowboy hat has become an extension of who Roditi is, and the culture he has created with TCU men's tennis. Simply put, at this point, it just feels natural.

DAVID RODITI CONTINUED...

David Roditi, one of the great players in the history of the TCU men's tennis program, was hired as the Horned Frogs' head coach on Sept. 7, 2010. A three-time All-American who lettered from 1993 through 1996, he still holds the school record for combined career victories (250).

Upon his return to Fort Worth, Roditi has led TCU to the top of the intercollegiate tennis world. A top-50 program when he was hired, Roditi has led the team to eight consecutive NCAA Sweet 16 appearances (2015-2022) and guided the program to its first ITA Indoor National Championship in 2022. The Horned Frogs have finished in the top-10 of the ITA team rankings for eight straight seasons, a streak unmatched by any Division I program. Entering the 2023 campaign, Roditi sports a 224-96 (.700) career record. He holds the second most wins in TCU history behind his own coach, and TCU legend, Tut Bartzan. Roditi owns a 20-8 career record in NCAA Tournament play and a 11-8 record at ITA National Indoor Championships. He has been honored as Big 12 Coach of the Year in four of his 12 seasons at the helm (2015-2017, 2022).

Under Roditi, TCU has claimed five of the last seven Big 12 Conference regular season championship. The Horned Frogs won three straight titles from 2016-2018 and enter 2023 in possession of back-to-back conference crowns. Since the start of the 2015 season, Roditi has posted a phenomenal 172-46 (.789) record, the best record in the Big 12 and one of the most consistent winning efforts in the country over that six-year span.

One of his most significant accomplishments has been the atmosphere that he has inspired at outdoor home matches. The Bayard H. Friedman Tennis Center has become one of the hardest places to play in the nation for opponents. Over 2,000 fans have regularly flooded the tennis center in his tenure, leading to a remarkable 125-35 home record, including a 95-11 record since the 2015 season. The Horned Frogs have won 61 home matches against ranked opponents in that span, with seven of the 11 losses coming against opponents ranked in the top-10 of the ITA team rankings.

Roditi has ushered seven All-Americans through his program, including four-time All-American Luc Fomba (2021-2022) and two two three-time honorees; Cameron Norrie (2015-17) and Alex Rybakov (2017-19). The 2017 squad tied a program record with four All-American selections - Norrie, Rybakov, Jerry Lopez and Reese Stalder. The only other TCU team to do so was Roditi's own 1996 squad in which he, Paul Robinson, Ashley Fisher and Jason Weir-Smith earned the accolade. Guillermo Nuñez became the fifth All-American in Roditi's tenure after the 2018 season. Roditi produced three All-American honorees in 2022; Fomba, Jake Fearnley and Juan Carlos Aguilar.

TCU commenced the 2022 campaign with a historic victory, downing No. 1 Florida inside the Bayard H. Friedman Tennis Center in its second match of the season. The win marked the Horned Frogs first-ever victory over an ITA No. 1 opponent. The triumph over the Gators foreshadowed a historic indoor season. TCU posted an 8-1 indoor record on its way to its sixth straight appearance at the ITA Indoor National Championships. There, the Horned Frogs toppled four top-15 programs - No. 12 Virginia, No. 13 Texas, No. 1 Ohio State and No. 3 Tennessee - to capture the program's first national championship. TCU avenged its lone indoor loss vs. the Volunteers to secure the title. In the process, TCU notched its seventh consecutive win over a ranked opponent, its longest such streak since 2018. The momentum bled into the outdoor season, as TCU competed to a 10-2 regular season record, with all 10 victories coming at the expense of ranked opponents, on its way to a fifth Big 12 regular season championship. TCU held the No. 1 ITA team ranking for much of the outdoor season and was rewarded with the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Horned Frogs shut out Drake, No. 37 Utah and No. 20 NC State in the first three rounds of the Big Dance to punch their fourth straight ticket to the Elite 8, where they ultimately fell to No. 9 Kentucky. TCU concluded the 2022 season with a 26-5 overall record - its best mark under Roditi - and defeated 20 ranked opponents.



The Horned Frogs' dominant run saw Roditi rewarded with his fourth Big 12 Coach of the Year accolade and first since 2017. Individually, he coached six players to postseason All-Big 12 accolades, tying a program record set in 2018. Juan Carlos Aguilar was named Co-Newcomer of the Year. Aguilar, Luc Fomba and Sander Jong were chosen to the All-Big 12 Singles first team while Jake Fearnley received second team singles recognition. In doubles, Fomba and Fearnley picked up first team credentials and Jong and Maxted were selected to the All-Big 12 Doubles second team. A memorable year concluded with a trio of All-American honorees, Fomba received the recognition in singles and doubles for the second straight year, making him the most decorated All-American in the Roditi era. Aguilar (singles) and Fearnley (doubles) became the 28th and 29th All-Americans in program history and ran Roditi's All-American total to seven.

In 2021, Roditi guided TCU to a 19-8 overall record, its fourth Big 12 regular season championship and third straight run to the Elite 8 of the NCAA Tournament. The Horned Frogs posted a 6-0 indoor regular season record to earn the program's third consecutive ITA Indoor National Championships berth.

The 2020 campaign started with another infusion of talent from the No. 4 recruiting class in the nation as TCU started the year without any seniors on the team. The Horned Frogs managed a 12-4 record despite playing a significant number of matches with three freshman, two sophomores and one junior in the lineup. TCU hosted the ITA kick-off weekend for the fifth-straight season and qualified for the National Indoor Championships for the second straight season and fourth time in Roditi's tenure. TCU fell in the first round to No. 1 USC in what would be the final loss of the season as the team finished off the weekend with 4-0 sweeps of No. 10 NC State and No. 6 Texas A&M for the first two victories of a nine-match winning streak before the cancellation of the season. TCU finished the year with the longest winning streak in the country among Power Five conference schools and a season-best ranking of No. 7 in the Oracle/ITA poll, including four players ranked in the singles Top 125 and two doubles pairings in the Top 75.

In 2019, the TCU reign of dominance continued with its fifth straight Sweet 16 appearance and third Elite 8 match in the last five seasons. The Horned Frogs turned in a 22-7 record, playing 21 of 29 matches against ranked opponents (15-6). It was also the fifth-straight season with 20 or more wins. The Horned Frogs reached the quarterfinals of the ITA National Indoor Championships, finishing with a 2-1 record on the weekend, beating No. 3 Mississippi State and No. 7 UCLA. The team re-asserted themselves over Mississippi State in the NCAA Tournament, taking down the Bulldogs in Starkville, Miss, 4-2 to advance to the Elite 8. Three-time All-American Alex Rybakov reached the NCAA Semifinals in individual singles play that season, joining Cameron Norrie for the longest individual singles run at the NCAA tournament in program history.

The 2018 season saw the Horned Frogs rise to as high as No.

6 in the Oracle/ITA poll in the midst of a 12-match win streak to close out the regular season. TCU won all five Big 12 matches to take its third-consecutive Big 12 regular season title while posting a 20-5 record, including 12 wins over ranked opponents. All-Americans Alex Rybakov and Guillermo Nuñez delivered a combined 36-11 record at the No. 1 and No. 2 singles positions to lead the charge. TCU hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the fourth consecutive year, taking down Oregon and Utah State to reach the Sweet 16 once again.

In 2017, Roditi led the Horned Frogs to yet another NCAA Elite 8, a Big 12 regular season title and a Big 12 tournament title with a 22-5 end-of-season record. The Horned Frogs finished the year ranked No. 8 in the Oracle/ITA poll. Posting the sixth-best winning percentage in program history and the second highest in Roditi's tenure (2016 - .867), TCU took down 16 ranked opponents and finished the Big 12 season a perfect, 5-0, for the first time in program history. A TCU-record, four Horned Frogs were named All-Americans (Norrie, Rybakov, Lopez and Stadler). The Horned Frogs dominated Texas Tech (4-0) to claim their second straight Big 12 tournament title, earning themselves the title of one of the best TCU teams in history.

Starting the 2015-16 at No. 3 in the first Oracle/ITA poll, Roditi led the team to unprecedented heights, which included the program's first Big 12 Regular Season title as well as being named champions of the Big 12 Tournament. After hosting the ITA Kick-Off Weekend for the first time in program history, TCU earned a bid to the ITA National Team Indoor Championship for the second straight season where the team advanced to the semifinals. The team finished with a 26-4 record, the second-highest winning percentage in program history, second only to the 1996 Horned Frogs, featuring Roditi as a player (23-3).

Climbing as high as No. 2 during that season, Roditi continued the dominance at home as the team increased their home winning streak to 30 matches after going 15-0 for the second straight season. The 26 wins the team posted during the season were the most wins since 1989 when TCU made its first appearance in the NCAA Final Four. After defeating four top-10 opponents in 2014-15, Roditi was able to top that with five wins over top-10 foes. Twenty-three of the team's 26 wins came over opponents ranked inside the Oracle/ITA top-75 while all four losses were to team's ranked inside the top-25.

Individual accolades were aplenty in 2015-16 as Roditi earned Big 12 Co-Coach of the Year for the second straight season, while Cameron Norrie picked up his second All-America honors in his career. Norrie became the sixth player in program history to be named an ITA Singles All-American twice during their Horned Frog career, the first singles player to reach the Final Four and the first player to make back-to-back appearances in the Elite 8. Freshman Alex Rybakov became the first player in TCU men's tennis history to earn ITA Men's Tennis National Rookie of the Year honors while also being the second straight Horned Frog to be named Big 12 Freshman of the Year.

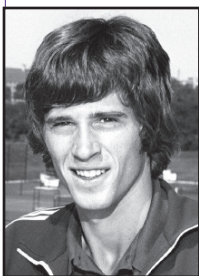
The 2014-15 season marked a huge resurgence, as Roditi turned around a program that missed the NCAA tournament a year ago to its fourth final four in program history. By leading the team to the semifinals of the NCAA Championship, Roditi became the

An All-American Legacy

From 1977-2022, 29 Horned Frogs have combined to garner 59 sets of All-American credentials. Fourteen different TCU netters have earned multiple selections, led by David Pate and Paul Robinson, who each tallied six. Pate was named an All-American in both singles and doubles from 1981-1983. Pate teamed up with Karl Richter to earn doubles All-American accolades in 1981 and 1982, and played with Corey Wittenberg in 1983 to pick up his final set of All-American doubles credentials. Pate and Richter went on to claim the 1981 NCAA Doubles Championship. As a professional, Pate reached No. 1 in the ATP doubles rankings in 1991. Robinson also earned three selections in both singles and doubles from 1994-1996. Robinson teamed up with David Roditi all three years in doubles play. Luis Ruette earned four All-America selections, with two each in singles and doubles. Ruette was named a singles All-American in 1990 and 1991, and earned the doubles honor alongside Sandon Stolle in 1990 and Tony Bujan in 1992.

Fifth-Year senior Luc Fomba ranks third in program history with four sets of All-American credentials. Fomba received All-American recognition in singles and doubles in 2021 and 2022, making him the most decorated All-American in the David Roditi era.

Five Horned Frogs boast the distinction of being named a singles All-American for three consecutive years: Robinson, Pate, Esteban Carril (1999-2001), and current British No. 1 singles player Cameron Norrie (2016-2017). Other players who earned multiple selections include Tony Bujan (3), Alex Rybakov, (3), Clinton Banducci (2), Ashley Fisher (2), Jason Weir-Smith (2) and Alex Rybakov (2). Four different squads in TCU history have had at least three All-Americans named in that season. The 1996 and 2017 teams had four All-Americans, while the 1990, 2001 and 2022 squads each produced three honorees.
