The tournament was held at the University of Georgia Golf Course and was the only the second NCAA-sanctioned event to determine a national champion.

The squad was selected to the TCU Athletics Hall of Fame in 2023 and is one of only two teams to be inducted into the Hall.

The 1983 triumph is one of eight NCAA team championships in TCU Athletics history and one of five women's titles.

"When Marci Bozarth watched her 25-foot putt plop into the hole to save par on the first hole, she thought to herself, 'This is going to be a good day.'"

She just didn't know how good. But it was one of the best in TCU history as the Frogs quickly wiped out a two-stroke deficit and fired a record four-under par 292 to win the NCAA Women's Golf Championship.

The day's effort gave the Frogs a four-day, 72-hole total of nine-over 1,193 on the hilly and pine-lined University of Georgia course as they beat defending champion Tulsa by three strokes.

For TCU, this was the first national team title that the school actually "won," although the 1938 Frog football team was voted No. 1 in the nation after going undefeated.

It was definitely a time to celebrate as the Frogs won the national title and two golfers—Marci Bozarth and Jenny Lidback—were named first-team All-Americans.

Bozarth, a senior, closed with a 74 over the 6,064-yard course while, ironically, Lidback's 78 was the throw-away score.

Senior Anne Kelly, who helped the Frogs win the SWC crown by firing a final day 69, pitched in with a one-under 73 from her fifth player spot.

And Rae Rothfelder, who was two-under after nine holes, came through with a 74.

"The key is that we got off to a good start," said head coach Fred Warren. "I thought we could shoot this course under par, but we always got off to such a bad start we were always just trying to get back to par the first three days."

"But I had a good feeling coming out here today. I just really thought we would win, and it's much more satisfying to do it by beating an excellent Tulsa team. And Tulsa played good today, too."

According to Tulsa's coach Dale

McNamara, "We made an honorable run at it. TCU just played fantastic. But that's golf, and that's the way it should have been."

The Frogs didn't make their move until the seventh hole, though, and had actually lost two strokes through the first six as the Golden Hurricane was one-over at that point and TCU was three-over.

Then in the closing holes on the front, disaster struck the Hurricane and the Frogs finished in a flurry of red numbers.

Rothfelder drilled a five-iron to within a foot of the hole on the short (401 yards) par-five ninth and sank the putt for an eagle. Moore birdied seven and nine to go from one-over to one-under, and Kelly did likewise.

When the Frogs and Hurricane finished the first nine holes, the Frogs had picked up four strokes with a one-under total to a three-over sum.

There were some anxious moments on the back when Rothfelder bogeyed her first three holes and when Moore bogeyed 10. However, Moore came back with a birdie on 11 and Rothfelder birdied 13 to get the Frogs back on track.

Kelly and Bozarth said the victory helped ease some of the pain from last year when they finished second to Tulsa in the NCAA, but 36 strokes off the pace.

"We came away angry at ourselves last year," Bozarth said. "But we had a good attitude this year. Everyone has won a tournament this year, so everyone knows how to win. And winning this—it's like a dream come true."

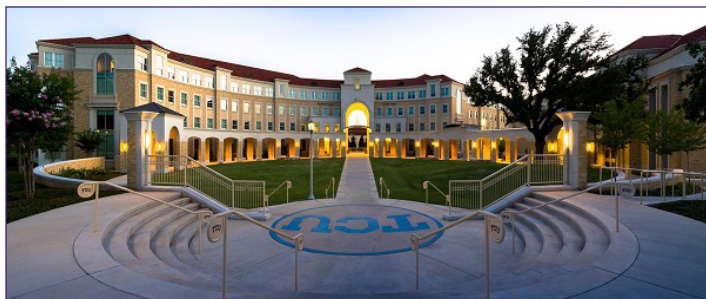

THE BIG 12 CONFERENCE

The Big 12 enters its 30th year as one of the nation's premier conferences in college athletics under the leadership of Commissioner Brett Yormark. Since joining the Conference in August 2022, Yormark has elevated the Big 12 to new heights, emphasizing marketing, brand building and instilling an innovative strategy that has resonated across the college athletics landscape.

The Conference is composed of 16 universities spanning 10 states and four time zones. The Big 12 members include Arizona, Arizona State, Baylor, BYU, UCF, Cincinnati, Colorado, Houston, Iowa State, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas Tech, Utah and West Virginia.

The Big 12 began play in 1996 and is the home of 91 team NCAA national championships, and 775 individual national champions. The Big 12 Conference office is located in Irving, Texas.

The Conference's hard work ethic and strong values have translated to enormous success in its first 26 years. Since it began competition in 1996-97, the league can boast of 77 NCAA team titles and 718 individual national championships.

The Big 12 has been at the forefront in college athletics reform, specifically with student-athlete welfare issues to include cost of attendance, student-athlete time demands and strengthening its policy for concussion diagnosis and management. In 2014-15, the Big 12 introduced and hosted three "State of Collegiate Athletics" forums to examine the issues facing college athletics. Two were conducted in Washington, D.C. and one in New York City. Panelists included respected authorities from intercollegiate athletics, university leadership and sports journalism. The third forum featured a special session comprised of student-athletes. The Big 12 continued the "State of Collegiate Athletics" forums with Dallas serving as the host site for three events and one staged in Atlanta.

The award-winning Big 12 Champions for Life, an initiative of the Conference, begins its eighth year in 2022-23. It features current and former student-athletes, selected by league institutions, in a series of public service announcements highlighting the positive impact an athletics scholarship has had on their lives leading to stories of personal growth and success.

During the 2021-22 athletics season, an all-time high eight national titles were won by teams that compete under the Big 12 banner. Additionally, six teams finished as runners-up in their respective national championships while 15 student-athletes brought home individual titles. Kansas won the Conference's second-consecutive and third overall men's basketball crown. Baylor was the 2021 champion while Kansas also won in 2008. Oklahoma collected its and the league's fifth gymnastics national championship. Texas brought home the Big 12's first NCAA title in men's indoor track & field while Oklahoma State earned the league's second trophy in Equestrian. Four titles were added to the ledger in the spring season with Texas capturing its second-consecutive championships in women's tennis and rowing. The Longhorns also won the Big 12's seventh men's golf crown. Oklahoma snagged its second straight and sixth overall softball national title.

The Big 12 has the best bowl win percentage of any conference over the last two seasons (.833). The Conference placed 70 percent of teams in 2021 bowl games for the first time since 2018, and had seven bowl squads for the 18th season out of the last 23. Baylor and Oklahoma State played in and won CFP New Year's Six Bowls to give the Big 12 two teams in the postseason structure for the sixth time in its eight years. From 2017-19, Oklahoma made three straight CFP semifinal appearances and has made four since 2015.

The Conference has claimed seven Heisman winners, including former OU signal callers Kyler Murray in 2018 and Baker Mayfield in 2017. The

Big 12 has had a finalist in 16 of its 26 seasons for a total of 21 with two finalists in five seasons.

The Big 12 and its member institutions are committed to a competitive environment where sportsmanship and fair play take center stage. Whether on the field, in the classroom, or within the community, the student-athletes, administrators, coaches and game officials of the Big 12 support the highest ideals in sportsmanship.

National academic accolades have always been strong in the Big 12. Charlie Kolar (Iowa State) was the recipient of the 2021 William V. Campbell Trophy, known as the Academic Heisman. He is the Big 12's fifth honoree since 2000. Alison Gibson (Texas) was presented the NCAA Today's Top 10 Award in January 2021. It recognizes former student-athletes for their successes on the fields and courts, in the classroom and in the community. Since 1996, the Big 12 has a total of 14 honorees for this prestigious award. In the last 12 seasons, 25 student-athletes were recipients of the NCAA Elite 90 Award with Emma LaPinta (Oklahoma gymnastics) and Jules Callahan (Oklahoma State softball) earning their second straight honor in 2022. Additionally, OSU's Ryan Schoppe was rewarded for Men's Indoor Track in 2022. The accolade showcases individuals who have reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level, while also achieving the highest academic standard among their peers.

In its short history, the Big 12 has over 780 Academic All-America recipients, averaging over 30 each season. Big 12 student-athletes have shown commitment to their studies by earning numerous individual academic recognitions. On 24 occasions a league athlete has garnered the top academic honor for their respective sport, including Bianca St. Georges (West Virginia) for soccer in 2018-19, Brittany Brewer (Texas Tech) for women's basketball in 2019-20 and Charlie Kolar (Iowa State) for football in 2021-22.

Competitive excellence, scholarship and sportsmanship are all equal components of the Big 12 philosophy. All-Big 12 teams and Academic All-Big 12 squads are recognized for each sport at the end of their respective seasons. At the end of each academic year, the Conference honors its top male and female student-athletes with the Big 12 Athlete of the Year and Big 12 Sportsmanship awards.

Institutions can also nominate student-athletes for the prestigious Dr. Prentice Gautt Postgraduate Scholarships. A total of 481 scholars have received over \$3.7 million in postgraduate financial aid through the first 25 years of the program.

The Big 12 sponsors 23 sports. Men's squads include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, swimming & diving, tennis and wrestling. Women's teams are fielded in basketball, cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis and volleyball.

Big 12 institutions create a league that encompasses five states and nearly 38 million people. Nearly 5,000 student-athletes from across the United States and around the World compete annually in the sports sponsored by the Conference.

The Conference currently conducts postseason championships for 22 of its 23 sports with the Football Championship Game returning in 2017 after a six-year absence. Each championship helps to determine teams and/or individuals that will represent the Conference in national postseason competition.

The Conference office is headquartered in Irving, Texas.

COURSE HISTORY

Colonial Country Club was founded in 1936 by Marvin Leonard, a self-taught golfer whose interests lie far beyond the fairway. Leonard studied every aspect of the sport, including course architecture – right down to the blades of grass and grains of sand used.

Driven by excellence, Leonard set out to create his own club and championship-caliber course with the goal of challenging and inspiring players of every level. Beginning in 2023, Gil Hanse will restore the historic venue to perfection and provide a challenging but complementary golfing experience to elicit awe.

At the club's founding, Leonard enlisted the help of two legendary course architects, John Bredemus and Perry Maxwell. While the duo worked independently, Leonard selected his favorite elements of both designs to create a championship course that would challenge the game's most respected figures.

By 1936, Colonial Golf Club opened with 100 members. Thanks to Leonard's appreciation of golf, Colonial's course and clubhouse were on par with some of the best private golf club's in the nation. In 1941, Colonial hosted golf's most prestigious event – the U.S. Open.

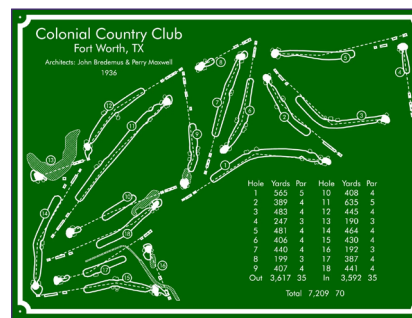
Colonial has since set a record in championship golf as the only club to host a Men's U.S. Open (1941), a Women's U.S. Open (1991), and THE PLAYERS Championship (1975). Alongside these prestigious tournaments, Colonial has hosted the longest-running tournament on the PGA Tour. Every May since 1946, the world's greatest golfers travel to Fort Worth to compete in the Colonial National Invitational, known today as the Charles Schwab Challenge.

The course has been the site of the men's Ben Hogan Collegiate Invitational in five of the last six seasons. In 2024, Colonial and TCU partnered to launch the Charles Schwab Women's Collegiate Invitational. Colonial hosted the second playing of the event in March of 2025. The tournament immediately became the most competitive regular season invitational in college golf, drawing 11 teams featured in the top-20 of the national rankings, and will return to Colonial for a third edition on March 23-24, 2026.

In advance of the 2025-26 season, Colonial holds the distinction of being the only country club in the United States to sponsor a PGA Tour event and both a men's and women's collegiate invitational.

COURSE RENOVATION

In 2021 the Colonial membership approved a Golf Course Renovation Master Plan. The course renovation was led by world renowned golf course architect, Gil Hanse. This renovation began in June 2023 and included all new grass, irrigation, drainage, hydronic's green cooling system, as well as the proposed Hanse architectural improvements.

ABOUT THE COURSE

Whether the early morning dew is still on the grass, or the afternoon sun is blazing down, it seems that even nature conspires to make the golf course at Shady Oaks, at any time of day, an incomparable experience.

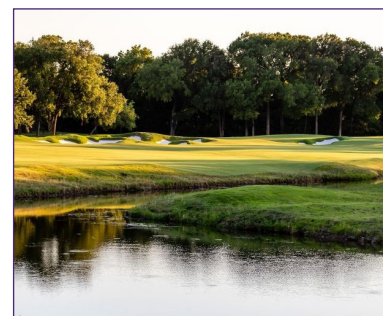
Designed by world-renowned golf course architect Robert Trent Jones and built by Plummer, the golf course features large bent grass greens and broad, gently rolling fairways. Majestic trees dot the course. Many of these grand oak trees are estimated to be hundreds of years old.

Jones designed Shady Oaks, best known as being Ben Hogan's home club in the decades after his retirement, in the mid-1950s for founder Marvin Leonard. The design of the course was state of the art and emblematic of the new style of design: heavily engineered; long, with narrow fairways through treeliined corridors that placed a premium on driving accuracy; and large, sectioned greens. That mode prevailed until 2020 when the club hired the Australian firm of Ogilvy, Cocking and Mead to remodel the course. The architects infused it with a bigger, more sweeping style of bunker, removed trees, and shifted and extended greens. It's once again a course that reflects the popular architecture of the moment.

The Shady Oaks golf course encompasses 27 holes. The championship 18-hole course surrounds the other nine holes, known informally and affectionately as the "Little Nine."

Located in the heart of North Texas, the par 71 course takes advantage of the natural beauty provided by the 700-acre development, as it meanders through the scenic vistas.

Mira Vista is a unique 18-hole championship Fort Worth country club golf course that impressively winds through the Mira Vista community. This layout surrounds the multi-level clubhouse and presents an array of beautiful holes that will challenge every level of golfer. The masterful course is the creation of golf professional Tom Weiskopf and golf course architect Jay Morrish.

The course aims to suit both designers' personalities. For example, it was undoubtedly Weiskopf who suggested the No. 12 par three replicate the famous Postage Stamp at Royal Troon (where he won The Open, his only major).

Perhaps the former pro's personality began to overtake the project before Morrish stepped in and created No. 18, dubbed "Jay's Revenge." Sounds intimidating, and the club feeds into that paranoia by describing the hole as "things aren't always what they appear. Jay asked that we not reveal the secret of this hole." Hmm.

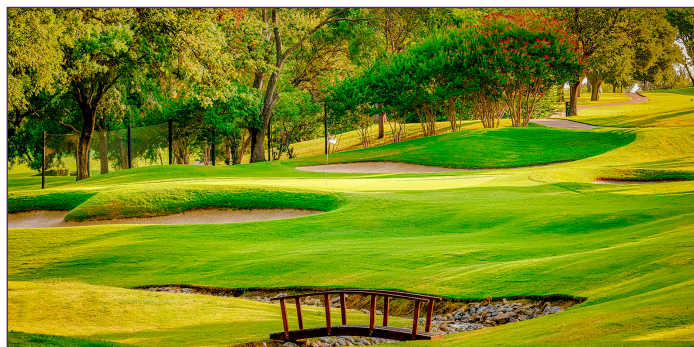
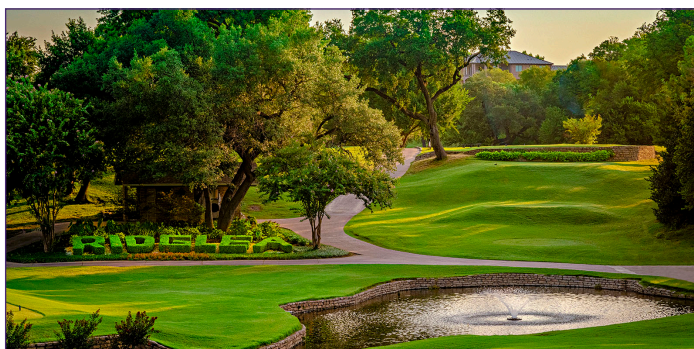
One item that represents both Weiskopf and Morrish as a collective is a drivable par four, which the duo guarantees for every one of its designs. At Mira Vista, the candidate is No. 16, which tips out at 315 yards. A powerful draw could get you on in one, but a series of pot bunkers up the right-hand side could get you on in three or more.

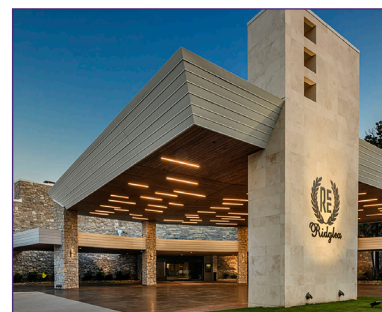


The North Course at Ridglea Country Club is an old, traditional course that features narrow fairways and small greens. It was built in 1928 by course designer John Bredemus. In 1954 Ralph Plummer renovated parts of the course. It was then redesigned in 1987 by Jay Morrish. The course is always impeccably maintained and features TifSport fairways and TifEagle greens.

The front nine offers players reasonable chances at birdie with par 5's on No. 1 and No. 9, but there is plenty of golf in between. No. 1 starts you off on a tee surrounded by a horseshoe of seasonal floral with a view that stretches south to the horizon. The hole is guarded left by fairway bunkers and doglegs right over several fairway bunkers towards a well guarded green. No. 4 is the first of Ridglea's incredibly demanding par 3's. Looks are deceiving when you read the yardage at 156 yards, but hit your ball above the hole, and you will be praying for only a three putt! No. 5, the number one handicap hole, is a long dogleg left with trouble everywhere but down the middle. A small lake juts out from the left and the right is guarded at length with out of bounds. Adding to the difficulty of No. 5 is a small hazard down the right side 150 yards from the green and two deep green side bunkers.

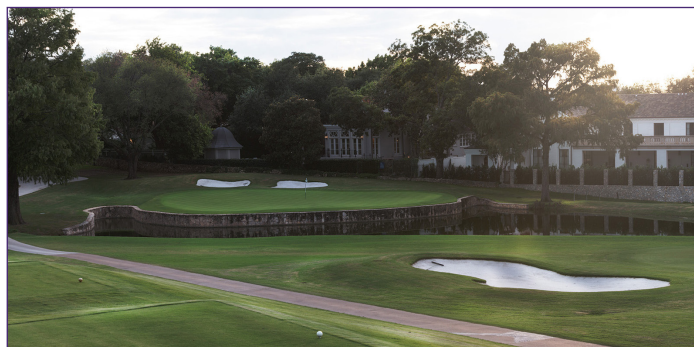
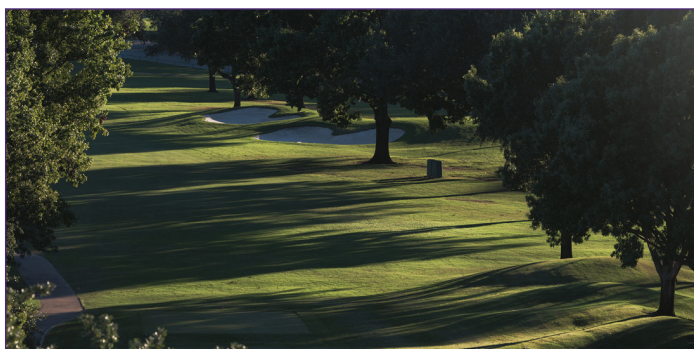
The back nine is no less benign than the front. Sloping greens and tree lined fairways are par for the course. At 430 yards, hole No. 13 plays as the number two handicap hole. A well struck left to right tee shot will avoid the trees on the left and the out of bounds on the right. Unfortunately, you are still left with almost 180 yards to a well protected kidney shaped green. No. 16 heads towards the clubhouse and steeply uphill. Once on the green you have a spectacular view of south Fort Worth, but a putt too well struck can send you fifteen yards back down the hill you just ascended. No. 18 concludes your round with a fair chance at birdie. This 485 yard, par 5, has three adjoining lakes on the left side with 20 foot fountains billowing from two of them. The right side of the fairway is tree lined with two fairway bunkers that must have magnets. The green is mild by Ridglea standards and is often viewed by spectators from the 19th hole balcony.

RIVER CREST

River Crest Country Club was the dream of a tight group of cattlemen, cotton merchants, railway executive, bankers, builders, land developers, and lawyers, many of whom were golfers. In mid-1910, they regrouped, gathering more partners and raising more capital to survey the countryside. On May 23, 1910 the visionaries set up a land corporation called the River Crest Company to purchase the 629 1/2-acre River Crest tract.

When River Crest Country Club opened on May 6, 1911, it was the state's eighth country club and was the first to include a residential housing development on its acreage, an innovation that provided start-up capital and insured the venture's survival.

The club's 6368-yard golf course, which borders homes designed by leading architects of yesteryear, has hosted legends of the game. Ben Hogan enjoyed the privacy of River Crest as he regained his form and stamina following a near-fatal highway crash in 1949. Byron Nelson was a regular in the River Crest gang. Olympic superstar Babe Didrikson Zaharias took golf lessons at River Crest and became such a fixture that the ladies created a tournament for her—the Texas Women's Open, which brought top competitors to River Crest from 1935 to 1955. Home-grown golfing greats from River Crest include Polly Riley and Aniela Goldthwaite, who were players and captains on the U.S. Curtis Cup Team. Hollywood came to River Crest to film a scene for the Ben Hogan story, "Follow the Sun." More recently, the course and clubhouse have figured in the novels of sportswriter Dan Jenkins.

River Crest, however, is more than a "Who's Who" of Fort Worth. It fosters an atmosphere in which parents and kids walk up to the greens together to practice putting. It is a social hub, a family club where member mingle as they enjoy club events, celebrate birthdays and marriages, and families mark holidays together. It is a place where third-and-fourth-generation members play cards in the clubhouse or touch football on the fairways, just like their parents and grandparents use to do.

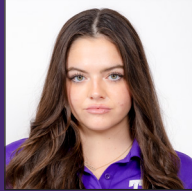

ANGIE RAVAIOLI-LARKIN

Head Coach | 32nd season

Since her arrival at TCU in August 1994, Angie Ravaioli-Larkin has become an institution on campus and in Fort Worth.

Ravaioli-Larkin is the longest-tenured head coach at TCU and across all sport programs in the Big 12 Conference, having completed her 31st season at the helm of TCU women's golf in 2024-25. A lifelong Texan, Ravaioli-Larkin is a fixture within the TCU community and the history of its athletics department. She has worked with six athletic directors and coached in five conferences.

During her storied and distinguished career, she has transformed TCU into an annual contender for the NCAA Tournament. Under Ravaioli-Larkin, the Horned Frogs have notched 28 NCAA Regional Championships berths and reached the NCAA National Championships nine times (1997, 1999, 2000, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2022, 2023). Ravaioli-Larkin has also coached four NCAA Regionals individual qualifiers in her tenure, including two in 2023-24. Ravaioli-Larkin has either advanced her team to or qualified individuals for the NCAA Tournament in 23 consecutive seasons dating back to 2002, which is the second-longest streak of continuous postseason appearances in TCU Athletics history.

TCU has won 25 tournaments under Ravaioli-Larkin, including three in 2024-25 for the first time under her leadership. The Horned Frogs have also produced the top-10 team season scoring averages in program history over the last decade, highlighted by a school record 289 in 2024-25.

Ravaioli-Larkin has mentored nine All-Americans, 38 all-conference players and 46 All-

American Scholars in her time as head coach. A total of 19 of Ravaioli-Larkin's former players have gone on to enjoy professional careers; Susan Horton, Angela Stanford, Lori Sutherland, Brooke Tull, D'Rae Ward, Stacey Bieber, Elin Emanuelsson, Catherine Matranga, Valentine Derrey, Brooke Beeler, Rachel Raastad, Chaney Uhles, Sanna Nuutinen, Alexandra Bonetti, Emmy Martin, Annika Clark, Greta Bruner, Sabrina Iqbal and Lois Lau

She has led TCU to five conference titles in three different leagues. Ravaioli-Larkin claimed the first conference crown in program history in 1998 when TCU captured the Western Athletic Conference championship. TCU notched its second-ever league title in 2002, winning the Conference USA, and hoisted the Mountain West Conference championship in 2007, 2011 and 2012.

Ravaioli-Larkin authored arguably her greatest season as the Horned Frogs head coach this past season. TCU broke 17 team or individual program records in 2024-25, including scoring average (289), birdies (533), par-or-better rounds (15), top-five finishes (nine), low-36 (557, -19), low-54 (830, -34) and year-end national ranking (No. 15). The 2024-25 squad became the first team in the Ravaioli-Larkin era to win three championships in the same season, the first in 35 years to collect a trio of titles and one of only four in program history to achieve the feat alongside the 1982, 1983 and 1989 contingents. With Ravaioli-Larkin leading the charge, TCU ascended as high as 13th in the national rankings - its highest mark in program history - and saw four players maintain top-100 individual rankings.

Prior to leading the program into its Big 12

era, Ravaoli-Larkin was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year each of TCU's final three seasons of conference affiliation from 2010-2012. She has five conference coach of the year accolades to her name. Ravaoli-Larkin was chosen as the Southwest Conference Coach of the Year in 1996 and was honored as WAC Coach of the Year in 1996 after leading TCU to the league title.

Ravaoli-Larkin came to TCU as a proven winner on the links. A four-year letterman at SMU, she was a two-time All-Southwest Conference honoree and was instrumental in helping the Mustangs consistently qualify for the postseason. As a freshman, she was the runner-up at the 1986 SWC Tournament. She won a pair of tournaments her senior year. Ravaoli-



Larkin led SMU to NCAA Championships in 1986 and 1989.

In August 1989, Ravaoli-Larkin turned professional and racked up an assortment of impressive results. She competed in the 1992 U.S. Open and

was the leading money winner on the 1991 Players West Golf Tour. Playing on the Asahi Asian Tour in 1992, Ravaoli-Larkin earned order merit honors and finished in the top-15 four times in five events.

Ravaoli-Larkin, a Bedford, Texas, native, joined the TCU family in August 1994 after five years in the professional golf world. Undoubtedly known for her playing ability, she was quickly recognized for her coaching chops.

She was named the 1996 Southwest Conference Co-Coach of the Year. In 1997, she was a finalist for NCAA District VI Coach of the Year laurels after leading her team to 12th place at the national tournament.

In the spring of 1998, Ravaoli-Larkin netted District Coach of the Year honors as well as Coach of the Year distinction from the Western Athletic Conference.

Ravaoli-Larkin's teams have always been active members of the Fort Worth community, spending time with several charitable causes. She also developed a senior charity program in which the team's seniors are responsible for adopting a charity of their choice. During the off-season, the Horned Frogs donate their time to that cause.

Ravaoli-Larkin leads by example in serving on several boards and committees herself. On June 1, 2020, she became president of the Women's Golf Coaches Association (WGCA) for the 2020-21 season. She has served in various vice-president capacities since 2014. Additionally, she has also held several leadership and committee roles in the organization, including All-America and Hall of Fame selections, new coaches' orientation, and education. Ravaoli-Larkin has also served on the NCAA Regional Selection Committee. These commitments not only demonstrate her character, but they show her ability to "walk her talk."

On the recruiting trail, Ravaoli-Larkin seeks quality student-athletes. She strongly believes in having positive attitudes and wants her players to leave TCU better people, no matter how life directs them after graduation. Ravaoli-Larkin truly feels that TCU is more than just four years -- it is a lifetime. She understands that golf is an individual sport but expects teamwork and team spirit to become champions.

Golfing is at the core of Ravaoli-Larkin's fabric. For her, it is a family affair. Her husband, Rob Larkin, is vice president of asset management for Pegasus Golf. Together, they are the parents of two TCU graduates; a daughter, Brittney, and son, Braeden.

KENDALL AHRENS

Assistant Coach | 3rd season

A proven program builder and rising star in the coaching ranks, Kendall Ahrens is in her third season as an assistant women's golf coach at TCU.

Originally from Montgomery, Texas, Ahrens returned home in August 2023 following a two-year assistant coaching tenure at James Madison. She previously spent two seasons on the coaching staff at Mississippi State, her alma matter, from 2019-21.

Ahrens has spearheaded a pair of college golf's greatest turnaround seasons in each of her past pair of coaching stops.

In her second year in Fort Worth, TCU concluded the 2024-25 campaign with a final Scoreboard team ranking of No. 15 after being tabbed 57th at season's end in 2023-24. The 42-spot improvement was good for the third-largest year-over ranking increase among all Power Four conference programs. With Ahrens patrolling the fairways, the Horned Frogs won three team championships in a season for the first time in 35 years. TCU achieved an all-time high team ranking of 13th and saw four players maintain top-100 national rankings during the spring portion of the season. Including year-end national ranking, Ahrens helped the Frogs break seven school records, among them scoring average (289), birdies (533) par-or-better rounds (15) and top-five team finishes (nine).

While in Virginia, Ahrens was invaluable in fostering a resurgence of JMU's golf program. The Dukes produced just one team victory in 2020-21 prior to Ahrens' arrival. The Dukes doubled their win total from the previous season in Ahrens' first year in Harrisburg, as the team nabbed two wins and accumulated four top-five finishes. JMU broke every single-season program record during the 2021-22 season, including the lowest combined scoring average (293.03) in school history. The Dukes ascended 29 spots in the Golfstat team rankings, rising from No. 109 to No. 80.

TCU and Ahrens enjoyed arguably their finest season in the program's Big 12 era in 2024-25. The Horned Frogs notched their 28th NCAA Regionals berth in the past 31 years. Ahrens coached a seven-player roster that accumulated a combined 20

top-10 and 35 top-20 individual finishes. The Horned Frogs collectively finished no worse than sixth in any tournament. TCU's birdie game blossomed under Ahrens' guidance, as the Frogs averaged a program-record 43.2 per tournament. Individually, Ahrens assisted in coaching Camille Min-Gaultier to WGCA All-American and Big 12 Freshman of the Year accolades. She also played a leading role in helping Sofia Barroso Sá qualify for the NCAA National Championships as an individual.

Ahrens arrival in Fort Worth in August of 2023 was preceded by heavy roster turnover during the offseason. Ahrens helped TCU notch six top-10 team finishes in 2023-24 despite the Horned Frogs sporting the youngest roster in the Big 12 with six underclassmen players. She also saw TCU break its program record for low round vs. par on the final day of the Jim West Invitational (-17, 271) at Kissing Tree Golf Club. Ahrens' mentorship helped transform Lois Lau into a top-100 player in the country and culminated in both Lau and Barroso Sá qualifying for NCAA Regionals as individuals.

In Ahrens' second-and-final season at JMU in 2022-23, the Dukes collected three tournament victories and produced four top-five finishes. Ahrens also mentored Kendall Turner into an individual qualifier for the NCAA Raleigh Regional, where she placed T37.

Ahrens (née Wisenbaker), enjoyed a standout playing career at Mississippi State before transitioning into the coaching ranks. She served as an operations fellow in her first season on staff in Starkville, assisting in player analysis and evaluation, practice planning, travel and recruiting while overseeing the day-to-day operations of the program. Ahrens was elevated into an assistant coaching role ahead of the 2020-21 campaign. With Ahrens on staff, the Bulldogs finished fifth in stroke play at the SEC Championships, reached the finals of SEC match play and concluded the season ranked No. 42 in the country.

She and her husband, Ryan, were married in 2021 and reside in Fort Worth.

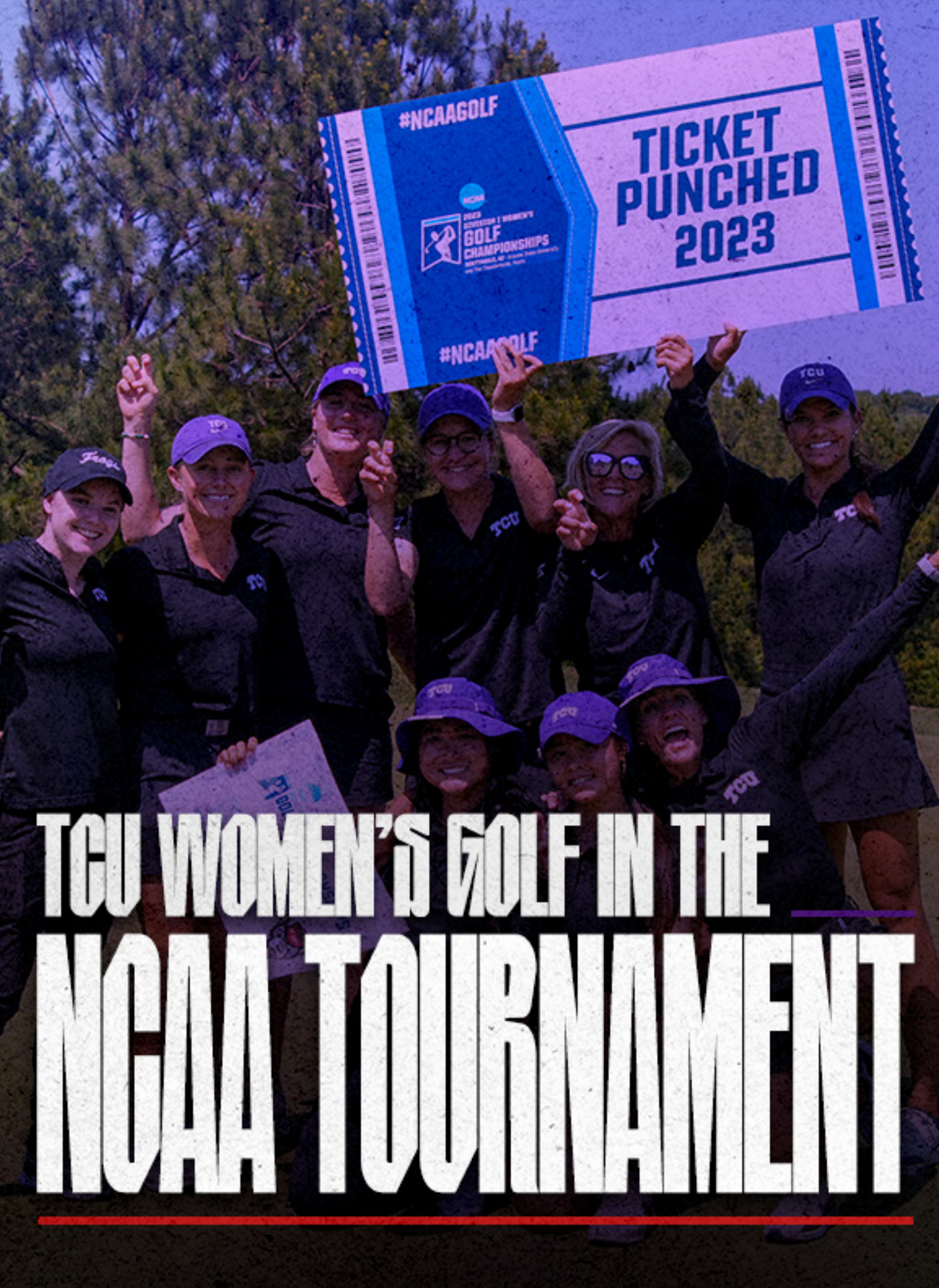

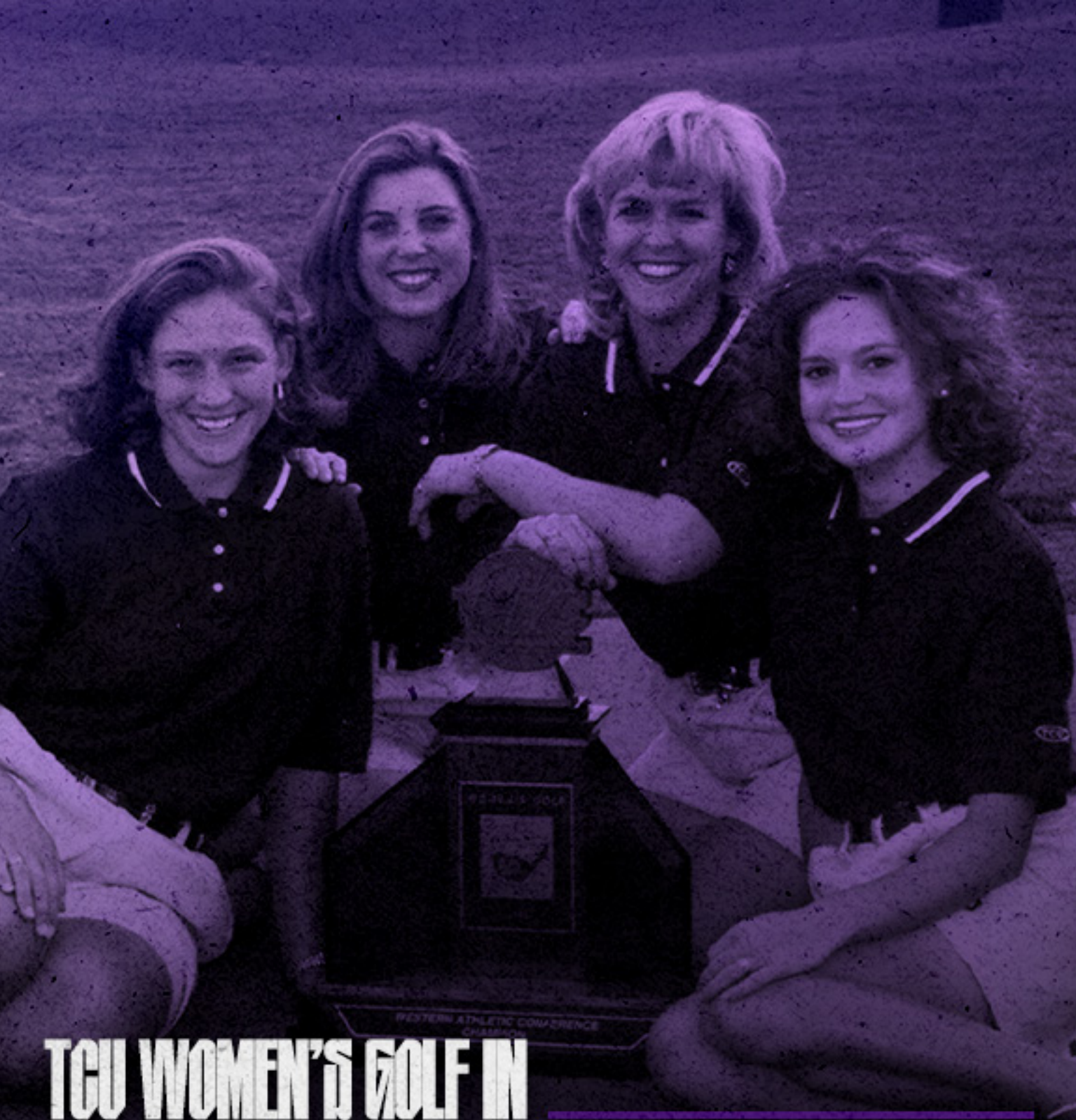

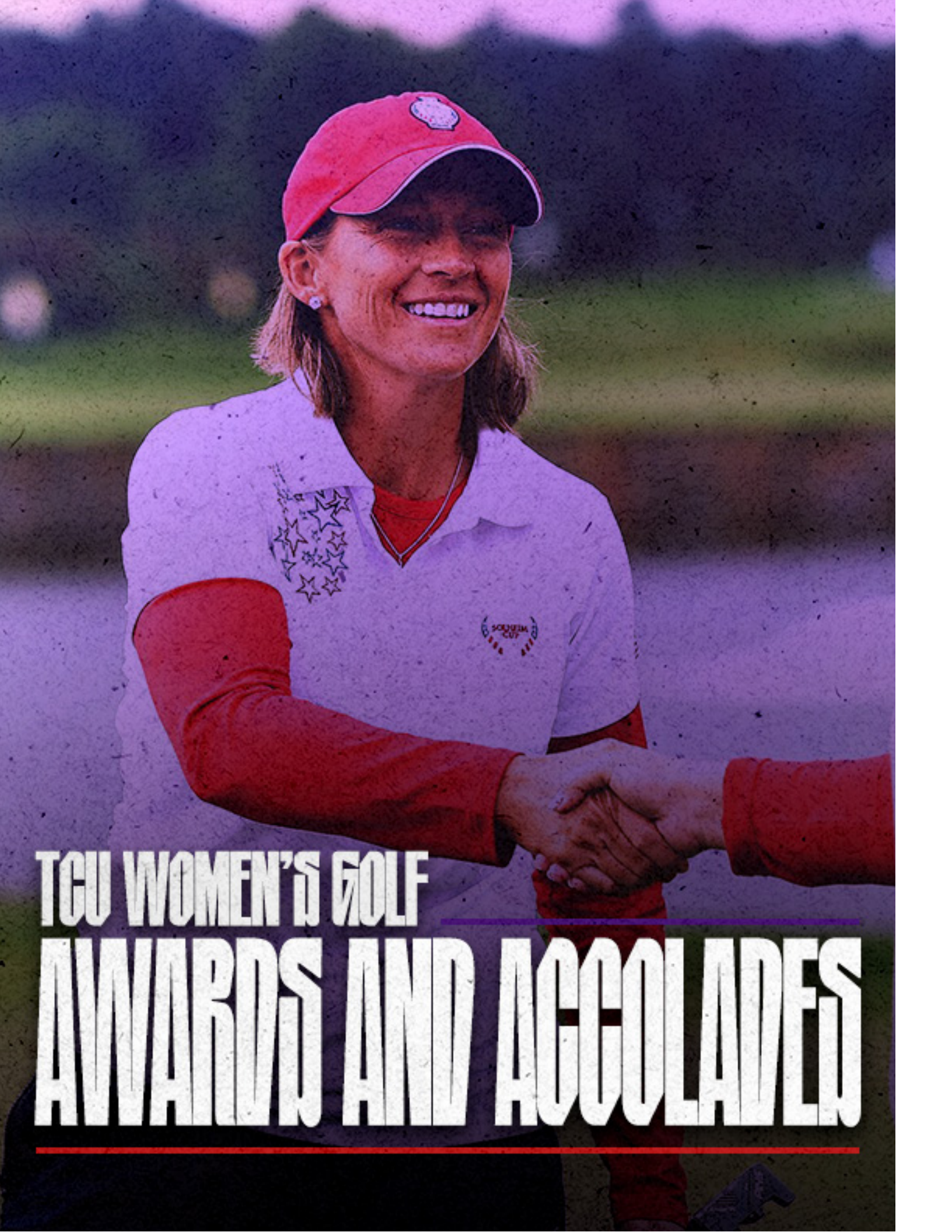

An Enduring Legacy

TWENTY-THREE YEARS ON THE LPGA TOUR

Stanford turned professional following the 2000 U.S. Women's Amateur in August and played on the Futures Tour, where she earned a victory at the season-ending event in early October. She finished fourth in the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament that year to earn exempt status on the LPGA Tour for 2001.

Her first victory on the LPGA Tour came in her third season, at the 2003 ShopRite LPGA Classic. A week later Stanford was in a three player 18-hole playoff for the U.S. Women's Open; she lost to Hilary Lunke by one stroke. Her best finish on the LPGA money was in 2008, at ninth place with over \$1.1 million.

Stanford has won seven times on the LPGA Tour, with her most recent victory coming at the 2020 Volunteers of America Classic. She has amassed 95 top ten finishes in LPGA tournaments and ranks 11th on the LPGA Career Money List.

At age-40 and after 18 years spent on Tour, Stanford won her first major title at the Evian Championship on Sept. 16, 2018 in Evian-Les Baines, France. She shot 12-under 272 and scored a one-stroke victory over Austin Ernst, Kim Sei-young, Mo Martin and Amy Olson. Stanford had produced 13 top-10 finishes in majors before finally entering the winner's circle.

She enjoyed a streak of 98 consecutive major starts, a run that began with the 2002 KPMG Women's PGA Championship and ultimately concluded 22 years later at the Chevron Championship. Stanford announced her retirement from the LPGA Tour following the conclusion of the 2024 season and after having competed in 102 major championships. She continues to play professionally on the Legends of the LPGA, the official senior tour of the LPGA Tour, and began commentating career with the Golf Channel in 2025.

Stanford has been a playing member of six U.S. Solheim Cup teams; 2003, 2007, 2009, 2011, 2013, and 2015. She led the Americans to repeat victories in 2007 2009 and once more in 2015, where in the penultimate match, she defeated Suzann Pettersen, which cleared the way for Paula Creamer to score the winning point, and gave the U.S. Its first Solheim Cup triumph since 2009. Stanford has thrice served as an assistant captain (2021, 2023, 2024) and was named the 14th U.S. captain in the biennial event's history for the 2026 Solheim Cup, which runs from Sept. 7-13, 2026, at Bernardus Golf in Cromvoirt, The Netherlands.



"I didn't even think I was going to make my traveling team at TCU. To come this far, I definitely didn't think I would. The thing that has served me well is just my competitive nature. Growing up, I knew every time I played golf, I just wanted to win."

Angela Stanford Named 2026 U.S. Solheim Cup Captain

TCU Athletics Hall of Famer Angela Stanford has been named the 2026 United States Solheim Cup captain as announced by the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA).

Stanford is the 14th U.S. captain in the biannual event's history, which began in 1990.

"There have been a lot of things that have happened in my life," Stanford said, "and I'm in a spot where I can totally focus on the Solheim Cup, and I can give it everything I have."

She served as an assistant captain at the past three editions of the Solheim Cup in 2021, 2023 and 2024.

The captaincy signifies Stanford's 10th Solheim Cup appearance. She was a member of six U.S. Solheim Cup teams as a player; 2003, 2007, 2009, 2011, 2013, and 2015.

"I love being an American, and I've loved playing for my country, and I'm going to love representing my country again."

The Solheim Cup is the women's professional golf equivalent to the Ryder Cup. The event incorporates team match play competition between 12 players from LPGA Tour and Ladies European Tour (LET).

Stanford helped Team USA hoist the Cup for the first time in seven years in September. She'll aim to become the first U.S. captain to win overseas since 2015.

"I've always wanted to be a captain overseas," Stanford said.

"The last time the US won in Europe was 2015. Angela Stanford earned the winning point. She'll lead the team next fall as they look to get another rare overseas victory."

"I won my Curtis Cup overseas. I got to play on two of the teams that have won the Solheim Cup overseas. Growing up, I played a lot of different team sports, and I loved going to other people's gyms, going to their fields. It doesn't bother me to go into a hostile environment and try to play and try to perform."

Stanford's name is synonymous with the United States' shining moments in the Solheim Cup. She has been a member of four of the Americans' last five championships. Stanford scored the winning point for the Team USA in 2015 with her 2-and-1 victory over Suzann Pettersen in her final Cup appearance as a player. Her performance punctuated the largest comeback win in team history and remains the last time the Americans won in Europe. Stanford was also a member of championship teams in 2007 and 2009.

A four-time All-American for TCU from 1996-00, Stanford retired from the LPGA Tour in November. She holds the record for the most consecutive major starts in LPGA history (98). Stanford won her first major title at the Evian Championship on Sept. 16, 2018, in Evian-Les Bains, France, and has seven tournament titles to her name. Over the course of her 23-year playing career, Stanford racked up 95 top ten finishes in LPGA tournaments and ranks 11th on the LPGA Career Money List.

The 2026 Solheim Cup takes place from Sept. 7-13, 2026, at Bernardus Golf in Cromvoirt, The Netherlands.

Stanford has received three hall of fame honors over her storied career. She was inducted into the TCU Lettermen's Association Hall of Fame in 2010 in her first year of eligibility. In 2017, Stanford was selected to the Women's Golf Coaches Association Players Hall of Fame. She most recently joined the Texas Golf Hall of Fame in 2020, becoming the first woman in 10 years to join the Hall's Tour Professional class.

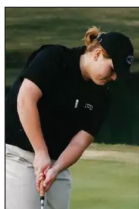

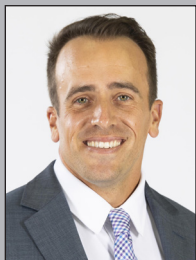

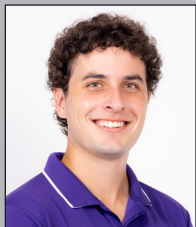

MIKE BUDDIE

**DIRECTOR OF
INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS**

First year at TCU

Mike Buddie was named TCU's ninth Director of Intercollegiate Athletics on Jan. 1, 2025.

Since his arrival to Fort Worth, TCU's beach volleyball team won its first NCAA National Championship and the women's basketball team won the Big 12 Championship and reached the Elite Eight for the first time in program history. He then locked up both head coaches, Hector Gutierrez and Mark Campbell, with contract extensions.

Buddie joined TCU from the United States Military Academy at West Point, where he served as Director of Athletics for more than five years. During his tenure, he led Army Athletics to new heights. Football earned a College Football Playoff ranking in 2024 as the Black Knights won a program record 12 games, a mark that ties for the most in a season by any service academy in history.

In September 2023, Buddie launched a "Fruits of Victory" strategic plan aimed at delivering a premier cadet-athlete experience to mold them into exceptional leaders and officers in the United States Army. Buddie led major facilities improvements and innovative investments in the Black Knights' programs, highlighted by a \$170 million Michie Stadium Preservation Project which is the most ambitious private gift-funded construction project in the history of the United States Military Academy. He also secured football-only membership in the American Athletic Conference in 2024, as Army went undefeated in winning the league championship in its debut season while also maintaining its fight for the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy.

Buddie was instrumental in securing Army West Point's television contract with CBS and extended partnerships with bowl games and Nike. Additionally, he has been prominent on

the national level as Chair of the Division I Baseball Committee.

Buddie was able to retain successful head coaches throughout his time at West Point, providing contract extensions to Head Football Coach Jeff Monken as well as coaches in four other sports who received Patriot League Coach of the Year honors.

Prior to his time at Army West Point, Buddie served four years as athletics director at Furman University. He negotiated a multi-year partnership with Nike, produced the department's first balanced budget and spearheaded an effort to bring the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament back to Upstate South Carolina in 2017. He also secured several major financial gifts, including a trio of \$1 million endowments in support of the football and volleyball programs. Under Buddie's leadership, the Paladins won 26 Southern Conference Championships.

Buddie was also senior associate athletic director for administration/development at Wake Forest. During his decade in Winston-Salem, N.C., he oversaw a number of different areas while serving as the sport administrator for baseball, women's soccer and men's golf. He also worked with the football and men's basketball programs. He was previously director of Wake Forest's Varsity Club.

Buddie is a 1993 graduate of Wake Forest with a degree in communications. He was a standout on the mound for the Demon Deacons baseball team. He was selected by the New York Yankees in the fourth round of the 1992 Major League Baseball draft. During his career, Buddie played for the Yankees and Milwaukee Brewers from 1998 to 2002 and was a member of the Yankees' 1998 World Series championship team.

Buddie and his wife Traci have two children, Zachary and Zoe.



Buddie is the sixth athletic director TCU women's golf head coach Angie Ravaoli-Larkin has worked under. The Horned Frogs broke 17 team or individual school records and achieved their highest year-end national ranking in Buddie's first semester at the helm.



The Furman women's golf program won four consecutive conference championships from 2015-19 during Buddie's tenure as athletic director. The Paladins notched back-to-back NCAA National Championships appearances in 2017 and 2018 under Buddie's leadership.

Guided by the TCU core values of integrity, engagement, community and excellence, and inclusive of input from more than 10,000 stakeholders, LEAD ON: Values in Action further enhances TCU's excellence in student-centered growth, research, scholarship and creative activities, athletics and community engagement.

Chancellor Pullin is an energetic leader committed to serving TCU's broad array of students, faculty, staff, alumni and supporters and advancing TCU's excellence both nationally and internationally. In 2024, he established the university's inaugural Office of University Strategy and Innovation to foster TCU's forward-thinking strategies, culture of innovation and ensure TCU remains competitive in a rapidly changing educational landscape. Through his leadership and executive team, TCU has seen significant increases in student success outcomes, research and creative activity expenditures, athletic success and engagement with the Fort Worth community and

beyond. In addition to serving as Chancellor, Pullin remains in the classroom as a professor of entrepreneurship and innovation.

Pullin first joined TCU in 2019 as the John V. Roach Dean of the Neeley School of Business. Throughout his tenure, Neeley experienced dynamic faculty and staff growth and curriculum innovation, earned increased national visibility and rankings, realized development success and implemented a commitment to community excellence. Before joining TCU, Pullin was the Dean of the Price College of Business at the University of Oklahoma and served as university vice president. Before transitioning to higher education, Pullin worked for global consultancy McKinsey & Company and the private equity firm Hicks Muse Tate & Furst and its portfolio companies.

Honored as one of Fort Worth, Inc.'s 500 Most Influential People in Fort Worth and D CEO Magazine's 500 Most Influential Business Leaders in North Texas, Pullin has won several awards for teaching, innovation in business and academic integrity. He is committed to civic and higher education leadership, serving on the Fort Worth Economic Development Partnership Executive Council, Fort Worth Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors, Dallas Regional Chamber Board of Advisors and is a member of Valliance Bank Board. He actively engages with higher education leadership groups, including Big 12 Conference presidents, Independent Colleges and Universities of Texas (ICUT), the Association of Governing Boards of Universities and Colleges (AGB), the Education Advisory Board (EAB) University Presidents Roundtable and the CCI University Presidents Roundtable.

Pullin earned his undergraduate degrees from the University of Oklahoma and an MBA from Harvard Business School before returning to OU to earn a Juris Doctor. Chancellor Pullin and his wife, Ann Bluntzer Pullin, Ph.D., are avid sports fans and enjoy attending TCU fine arts and athletic events with their children.

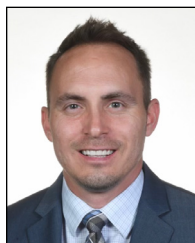
