OPENING TIP

- TCU has notched back-to-back Sweet 16 appearances after having never reached the second weekend of the NCAA Tournament prior to last season.
- The Horned Frogs are one of 10 remaining teams that reached the Sweet 16 in both 2024-25 and 2025-26.
- TCU and Virginia both are in the Sweet 16 after finishing in last place in the Big 12 and ACC, respectively, four seasons ago.
- The Horned Frogs and Cavaliers are colliding on the hardwood for only the second time. TCU and Virginia first squared off on Nov. 27, 2010 in the Paradise Jam, with the Cavaliers earning a 59-55 victory.
- TCU is 5-0 vs. the ACC under head coach Mark Campbell, having bounced Notre Dame and Louisville from the 2025 NCAA Tournament.

FROG FOCUS

- TCU is the only team remaining in the NCAA Tournament that finished in last place in conference play in back-to-back seasons within the last five years.
- The Horned Frogs are the only repeat undisputed Power Conference regular season champions in college basketball.
- Under head coach Mark Campbell, TCU has quickly rebranded itself as a brand name in the sport. With its opening round victory over UC San Diego on March 20, the Horned Frogs joined 2025 NCAA Final Four participants UConn, UCLA, Texas and South Carolina as the only Power Conference programs to post consecutive 30-win campaigns.
- Behind Campbell, TCU has tallied the seventh-most victories (86) of any Division I program and notched 20 AP Top 10 rankings over the last three seasons. In the three seasons preceding his arrival in Funky Town, TCU competed to a 24-60 overall record and went entirely unranked.
- Campbell's win-loss percentage since 2023-24 (.804) ranks ninth among all head coaches and sixth at the Power Conference level
- Strictly looking at the last two seasons, TCU ranks fifth among all Division I programs in wins (65) and win-loss percentage (.878).
- In his introductory press conference on March 23, 2023, Campbell made a promise to Jeremiah Donati, TCU's athletic director at the time, that he would transform TCU into the top basketball program in the Big 12 and one of the best in the country. Within two seasons of his hire, Campbell led TCU to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2010 and the university's first Big 12 basketball championships. The Horned Frogs swept the Big 12 regular season and tournament titles in 2024-25 and went on to reach the Elite Eight, becoming the first TCU basketball team to win multiple games in March Madness.
- Campbell has quickly developed a championship pedigree. He has won five conference titles in as many seasons as a head coach.
- Though TCU will play its Sweet 16 game more than 1,700 miles from campus in Fort Worth, the Horned Frogs may well be the adopted home team in Sacramento. Campbell served as the head coach at Sacramento State for two seasons from 2021-23. Just as he did at TCU, Campbell led the institution to its first conference regular season and tournament championships and its first NCAA Tournament appearance in men's or women's basketball in his second-and-final season at the helm.
- Speaking of Campbell, he is one of only five coaches in the NCAA Tournament field that has spent five years or less as a head coach and notched at least three berths in the Big Dance. The others are Kim Caldwell (Tennessee), Nicki Collen (Baylor), Shea Ralph (Vanderbilt) and Carly Thibault (Fairfield).

FROG FOCUS CONTINUED

- Playing for Campbell, especially as his starting point guard, might as well be a cheat code for claiming conference player of the year honors at this point. TCU's Olivia Miles was crowned Big 12 Player of the Year and is the fourth one-and-done transfer point guard to be named a league's top player in Campbell's five seasons as a head coach. Hailey Van Lith was tabbed the Big 12's best in 2024-25 while Sacramento State's Lianna Tillman and Kahlaiah Dean won Big Sky Player of the Year in 2022 and 2023. All four players averaged better than 17 points and five assists per game in Campbell's offense.
- Miles was also a unanimous choice for Big 12 Newcomer of the Year. TCU has swept Big 12 Player and Newcomer of the Year in consecutive seasons. No program has won both awards in back-to-back years.
- Five of TCU's eight All-Big 12 first team honorees have come under Campbell's tutelage in the last calendar year. Marta Suarez joined Miles as a unanimous choice on the all-conference first team mantle. Van Lith, Sedona Prince and Madison Conner all garnered first team accolades in 2024-25.
- With Miles and Suarez's selections as All-Americans by The Associated Press, four of the seven All-Americans in program history have been recruited and developed by Campbell.
- TCU and top-ranked UConn are the only teams in college basketball shooting at least 47 percent from the field and 35 percent from downtown while averaging nine 3-pointers per game.
- The Horned Frogs have knocked down at least nine 3-pointers in half of their games (18-36) this season and on 40 occasions since 2024-25. TCU is 39-1 when knocking down at least nine deep balls.
- TCU has averaged 10 threes per game at home (599 total) over the last three seasons.
- TCU needs 11 threes to become only the eighth program to make 1,000 over a three-season span.
- The Horned Frogs top the Power Conference ranks in total 3-pointers over the last three seasons (989) by a sizeable margin. The next closest Power Conference team to matching TCU's 3-point output is Utah at 934 threes. After that, it's Iowa with 901.
- TCU's 323 threes this season are the sixth-most of any team.
- Since 2023-24 only Richmond (1,000) has connected from distance more times than TCU. The Horned Frogs are one of only two programs ranking in the top-10 nationally since 2023-24 in 3-point field goals (2nd, 989), 3-point field goals per game (6th, 9.3) and 3-point percentage (7th, .366).
- TCU is the only team in the country with four players who have each made 55 threes in Suarez (79), Olivia Miles (69), Taylor Bigby (61) and Donovan Hunter (59).
- Those four players are responsible for 82 percent (265-323) of TCU's 3-point offense.
- TCU boasts the fifth highest-scoring starting lineup in college basketball, as Miles, Suarez, Hunter, Bigby and Clara Silva average a combined 64.2 points per game. Only South Carolina (70.6 ppg), Oklahoma (68.5 ppg), UCLA (67.6 ppg) and Notre Dame (67.9 ppg) have higher-scoring starting fives.
- Bigby and Silva have both scored in double figures and are averaging 35.5 combined points per game in TCU's pair of NCAA Tournament victories. In TCU's five defeats, the two players and Hunter have been limited to 21.8 points per game.
- Miles (19.4 ppg) and Suarez (16.8 pg) are the country's fifth-highest scoring duo and one of only three pairs of teammates among NCAA Tournament teams averaging at least 16.5 points per game.
- Miles and Suarez are also one of the only duo nationwide averaging at least 15.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and two assists per game.
- Miles and Suarez are the only pair of teammates in college basketball with at least 600 points and 200 rebounds to their names.
- Either player has finished with a double-double or a triple-double in 16 ballgames.
- TCU has benefitted from a 20-point performance by Miles, Suarez or hunter in 23 instances.
- The Horned Frogs continue to lead the country in field goal percentage defense (.334).
- Three-quarters of the Power Conference teams TCU has faced (18-24) have shot under 40 percent from the field vs. the Frogs' defense.
- TCU has limited an NCAA-leading 15 teams below 30 percent shooting.
- The Frogs have held 11 opponents to their lowest scoring outputs of the season.
- Washington became the 23rd opponent TCU has held under 60 points in the 2025-26 campaign in Sunday's overtime victory. The Frogs are unbeaten when their opponent fails to break the threshold.
- TCU, UConn and Texas are the only teams in the nation scoring at least 75 points per game while holding opponents to 56 points per game or less.
- TCU and South Carolina are the only squads in the country shooting at least 47 percent from the floor and holding opponents below a 35 percent clip.
- TCU has limited opponents to 50 points or less in 15 games, the second-most of any team in the nation. Only UConn has prevented its opponent from exceeding 50 points more times than TCU (19).
- TCU allowed just 60.3 points per game in Big 12 action, the third-fewest among all Power Conference teams in league affairs. Duke (56.1 ppg) and UCLA (59 ppg) were the only teams with better scoring defenses than the Horned Frogs in conference play.
- The Horned Frogs' length and rim protection has given opponents fits at the defensive end all year. TCU is the tallest team in the country, with an average height of 6'2 1/2". Eight of TCU's 14 players stand 6-2 or taller while 11 are at least 6-0.
- Silva (1.8 bpg) and Kennedy Basham (1.7 bpg) are arguably the top shot-blocking duo in the country. They rank second and third among all Big 12 players in blocks per game and are the only pair of teammates in college basketball who have each recorded 50 blocks this season.
- Either Basham or Silva has finished with three-or-more blocks in 17 games.
- TCU's 46 games with at least six blocks are the sixth-most of any D1 team over the last three seasons. Only South Carolina (66), USC (55), Kentucky (50), Virginia (48) and Duke (47) have more six-block performances in that span. The Horned Frogs have sent back at least six shots in 16 games in 2025-26.
- The Frogs have recorded the third-most blocks of any team nationwide since 2023-24 with 570.
- TCU has shot at least 43 percent from the floor in 25 of its wins. Conversely, only eight opposing teams have connected above a 36 percent clip from the field in any game.
- Last season, TCU led at halftime in 34 games, a rate that ranked second only to eventual national champion UConn. The Horned Frogs consistently find themselves atop the scoreboard at the intermission, still, having assumed a halftime edge in 25 games in the 205-26 campaign. Recently, though, the opposite has proven true. TCU has found itself down at the half in three of its last four ballgames and six of its last 10 dating back to its 59-50 home triumph over West Virginia. Despite the unfamiliar territory, the Horned Frogs routinely rally. TCU is 6-1 this season when trailing at the break.
- TCU is 4-1 this season and 13-5 overall under Campbell in neutral site affairs.

LEADS ALL D1 PLAYERS IN 15-POINT, 5-ASSIST GAMES

- Olivia Miles is the only player in college basketball who has tallied at least 600 points, 200 rebounds, 200 assists and 50 steals.
- Miles is on pace to become the first player in NCAA history and first this century to average at least 19 points, seven rebounds, six assists and 1.5 steals per game while shooting 48 percent from the field.
- She is one of only two Division I players and the only Nancy Lieberman Award finalist averaging at least 19 points, six rebounds, six assists and 1.5 steals per game.
- Miles increased her scoring average to 21.2 points per game in Big 12 play and finished as TCU's leading scorer in 14-of-18 conference games.
- Miles set an NCAA record for consecutive games with 15 points and five assists to begin a season by a Power Conference player (12) during nonconference action. She has notched an NCAA-leading 24 games with at least 15 points and five assists and ranks ninth in NCAA history for career '15-and-5' games (54).

- The New Jersey native recorded four triple-doubles in a five-game span in December, joining three-time Lieberman Award winner Sabrina Ionescu as one of only two players in NCAA history to post four triple-doubles in a single month.
- Miles is responsible for 45 percent of TCU's cumulative offensive output (698 points + 553 points generated via assists).
- She scored a career-high 40 points on 10-20 shooting from behind the arc in a win at No. 12 Baylor on Feb. 12, becoming the first player in NCAA history to knock down 10 threes vs. a ranked team on the road. Her 40 points were the most by any D1 player in any game vs. a ranked team in 2025-26.
- Miles became the fourth player in NCAA history to tally 2,000 career points, 800 rebounds and 800 assists in February.

INDIVIDUAL NOTABLES

Olivia Miles

- Is responsible for one-quarter of all triple-doubles recorded in NCAA D1 (6-of-24) in 2025-26.
- Recorded her sixth career triple-double the last time she faced Virginia on Dec. 29, 2024; finished with 14 assists, 11 points and 10 rebounds to lead Notre Dame to a 95-54 victory.
- For her career, has averaged 11.5 points, 8.4 assists and 7.3 rebounds per game in the NCAA Tournament.
- Has dished out eight-plus assists in five of her eight career outings in the Big Dance.
- Racked up a combined 30 points, 26 rebounds and 22 assists in TCU's opening weekend wins over UC San Diego and Washington, marking the first 30-20-20 two-game run in the NCAA Tournament since Nicole Powell did so at Stanford in 2002.
- Joined Powell and Sabrina Ionescu as one of only three players in NCAA history to record multiple triple-doubles in the NCAA Tournament.
- Finished with 16 rebounds, 14 assists and 12 points vs. the Tritons, breaking TCU's all-time single-game assists record and NCAA Tournament single-game rebounding record.
- Became the first player to put at least 14 rebounds and 14 assists on the board in an NCAA Tournament game.
- Is the only player in NCAA history who has tallied at least 2,100 career points, 875 assists, 850 rebounds and 225 steals.
- Enters Saturday's ballgame needing two points to reach 700 and two assists to net 240 for the season; will join Ionescu (Oregon, 2017-19), Caitlin Clark (Iowa, 2021-24), Courtney Vandersloot (Gonzaga, 2010-11) and Katie Dinnebie (Drake, 2024-25) as one of five players in NCAA history to post the cumulative stat line in a season.
- Leads all Division I players in season and career triple-doubles (12), career 15-point, 5-assist games (54) and career assist per game average (6.5) and all Division I guards in career double-doubles (36).

Marta Suarez

- Powered home a 16-point, 10-rebound double-double vs. Virginia in her most recent encounter with the Cavaliers on March 6, 2025 in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament, pacing Cal in a 75-58 win.
- Is one of only 12 players in the country averaging at least 16.5 points, seven rebounds and two assists per game while shooting 45 percent or better from the field.
- Averaging career-highs in points per game (16.8), rebounds per game (7.4), field goal percentage (.459) and 3-point percentage (.373).
- One of 13 players alongside Miles who has recorded at least 600 points and 250 rebounds in 2025-26.
- Has racked up the fifth-most points in a season by a TCU player.
- Has finished with at least 15 points and five rebounds in 20 games.
- Has drilled the most 3-pointers ever in a season by a Big 12 forward (79).
- Ranks sixth in the country among players 6-3-or-taller in 3-point percentage
- Has connected at least three times from distance in 15 contests.
- Scored in double figures in 14 straight games from Feb. 1 through TCU's first round victory over UC San Diego on March 20
- Has finished as TCU's leading scorer in seven of its last 10 games.

Clara Silva

Three Horned Frogs scored in double figures, led by 14 points from Emily Carter.
- Among active TCU players, Olivia Miles and Marta Suarez have faced the Cavaliers. Miles is averaging 11.5 points, 10.5 assists and seven rebounds vs. Virginia while Suarez sports a stat line of 11.5 points, 9.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists.
- Miles became the first ACC player to post a triple-double in consecutive games with her 14-assist, 11-point and 10-rebound performance against the Cavaliers on Dec. 29, 2024.
- Both TCU and Virginia reached the second round of the Women's Basketball Invitational Tournament (WBIT) in 2023-24.
- The Horned Frogs and Cavaliers share a common opponent in NC State, which bowed out of the NCAA Tournament in the round of 32. TCU defeated NC State 69-59 on Nov. 16 in Raleigh while Virginia fell victim to a 78-76 overtime victory at the hands of the Wolfpack on Jan. 24 in Charlottesville.
- Miles and Virginia guard Kymora Johnson are two of only three players in college basketball averaging at least 19 points, 5.5 assists, 4.5 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game.

12 TCU has topped the Big 12 in the evaluation tool for the entirety of the 2025-26 campaign. The Horned Frogs achieved a season-best ranking of No. 7 following their 14-0 start to the year. TCU is a combined 15-5 in Quad 1 and Quad 2 games.

Massey Ratings

TCU soared to sixth in the Massey Ratings - tied for its highest placement in the metric in program history - after starting the season 14-0 and has maintained the top billing among Big 12 teams since its 83-67 win at then-No. 12 Baylor on Feb. 12.

The Associated Press Poll

14 TCU notched its 34th top 15 ranking in the last two seasons on March 16. The Horned Frogs dropped four spots following their loss to West Virginia in the Big 12 Tournament championship. TCU has been the Big 12's highest-ranked team in 13-of-19 polls this season.

USA Today Sports Coaches' Poll

The Horned Frogs have maintained a top 15 ranking all season and matched its preseason ranking in the latest coaches' poll. The Horned Frogs were slotted seventh in six straight polls from Nov. 18-Jan. 6 and have been the Big 12's top-rated team all year.

POWER IN THE PORTAL

- For the third consecutive year, TCU is the only team across the Power Conference ranks whose primary starting lineup is comprised exclusively of first or second-year transfer players.
- TCU has started five transfer players in 81 percent of its games (81-100) in the Mark Campbell era. The Horned Frogs starting lineup was built entirely through the transfer portal in all-but-one game (37-38) in 2024-25.
- In 2023-24, TCU was one of just three teams alongside Utah State and Mercer that started five transfers on a nightly basis during nonconference play.

TCU in the NCAA Tournament

NCAA TOURNAMENT NOTABLES

- TCU went 19 years without an NCAA Tournament victory prior to last season's 73-51 opening round win over No. 15 seed Fairleigh Dickinson.
- The Horned Frogs snapped a 15-year NCAA Tournament drought in 2025. TCU's decade and a half without a berth in the Big Dance was the fourth-longest of any team in last season's field.
- The Frogs are one of 10 teams in the field that earned a top 16 seed in both 2025 and 2026.
- TCU won an NCAA Tournament game in consecutive seasons for the first time in 22 years via its 86-40 triumph over UC San Diego on March 20.
- TCU became only the seventh team in NCAA history to have three teammates post a double-double or a triple-double in an NCAA Tournament game in its opening round victory over the Tritons.
- A TCU player has finished with a double-double or a triple-double in four of the program's six NCAA Tournament games under head coach Mark Campbell.
- Campbell-led teams are responsible for five of TCU's 10 all-time NCAA Tournament victories.
- The Frogs are holding teams to 56.6 points per game in March Madness over the last two seasons.
- TCU is averaging nine 3-pointers per game in the NCAA Tournament in the Campbell era.

'THREE-POINT U'

TCU women's basketball has become college basketball's most consistent and efficient 3-point shooting team over the last three seasons.

- TCU has drilled the second-most 3-pointers of any D1 program and most at the Power Conference level since 2023-24, knocking down 989 in that span. Only Richmond (1,000) has more.
- The Horned Frogs' 3-pointers per game average of 9.3 ranks sixth nationally over the last three seasons. TCU is one of just 11 teams and one of three at the Power Conference level averaging at least nine makes from distance per night in that span.
- The Horned Frogs and Spiders are the only programs ranking in the top-10 nationally in 3-point field goals (2nd, 989), 3-point field goals per game (6th, 9.3) and 3-point percentage (6th, .366) since 2023-24.

THREE-OR-MORE FROM THREE

- Last season, a TCU player made at least three 3-pointers 47 times, the second most of any team in college basketball behind only Cal (57).
- Since Mark Campbell took over as head coach in March of 2023, the Horned Frogs have benefited from an individual three 3-pointer game on an NCAA-leading 128 occasions.

WE GOT SHOOTERS, AGAIN

For the second straight season, TCU leads college basketball in returning 3-point offense.

- Among qualified players, TCU's roster averaged 11.4 threes per game in 2024-25. Four Horned Frogs drained at least 1.5 three's per night last season; Olivia Miles (2.1), Taylor Bigby (1.9) Aaliyah Roberson (2.4) and Taliyah Parker (1.6).

3-POINT MILESTONES IN THE MARK CAMPBELL ERA

- TCU led the nation in 3-pointers in 2024-25 with 354.
- The Horned Frogs net total of 666 three-pointers from 2023-25 were the most ever by a Big 12 team in a two-year period.
- TCU drained a Campbell era record 17 long balls in its 122-39 drubbing of Tennessee State on Nov. 12. The 17 threes were the second-most in a game in program history, trailing only the 18 TCU knocked down on Dec. 10, 2017 vs. Southeastern Louisiana
- Against UCF on Jan. 14, the Frogs set a TCU Big 12 single-game record for 3-pointers with 15 and matched the mark at No. 12 Baylor on Feb. 12.
- TCU set a Big 12 single-game record for first half 3-pointers (10) on their way to a 91-56 win over Houston on Feb. 26.

- In nonconference play, the Horned Frogs have finished with 20-plus assists in 23-of-37 games (62 percent) in the Mark Campbell era.
- Among Big 12 teams, only Iowa State (48) and Kansas State (42) have more 20-assist games than the Horned Frogs over the last three seasons.

KEEP THAT ASSIST RATE HIGH

- TCU is 18-3 since 2023-24 when finishing with an assist rate of 75 percent-or-better. The Horned Frogs have assisted on at least 75 percent of their field goals on five occasions this season, most recently in their 69-61 win vs. Oklahoma State on Jan. 7, when they dished out 20 dimes on 26 makes from the field.
- The Horned Frogs produced their highest single-game assist rate in their Big 12 era vs. Kansas on Feb. 3, 2024, assisting on 23 of 25 field goals. TCU nearly matched the percentage against UCF on Jan. 14, producing a 91 percent (29-32) assist rate.
- TCU has twice finished with a Mark Campbell era single-game record 29 assists. The Frogs last did so in a 90-81 home victory over UCF on Jan. 14. The 29 dimes were the second most in a game in program history.
- TCU assisted on 65 percent of its field goals (696-1,063) last season.
- TCU has produced an assist rate greater than 70 percent six times in 2025-26.
- The Horned Frogs assisted on 27 of 33 field goals vs. UTEP on Dec. 6, good for their highest assist rate of the 2025-26 campaign (82 percent).

Spread Pick-n-Roll: More TCU Offensive Notables

IT'S ALL ABOUT BALANCE

A staple of Mark Campbell and associate head coach Xavier Lopez's spread pick-n-roll offense is a balanced scoring breakdown and prioritizing layups and 3-pointers.

- Thus far in 2025-26, 95 percent of TCU's total points scored have come via 3-pointers, points in the paint and free throws.
- The Horned Frogs have maintained a near-even points distribution from behind the arc and in the paint in the Campbell era. TCU has generated 41 percent of its points in the paint and 38 percent via the long ball.
- 94 percent of TCU's total offensive output since 2023 has come via 3-pointers, paint touches or free throws.
- The Frogs are 68-7 in the Campbell era when generating more points in the paint than their opponent. TCU was 26-1 in 2024-25 when finishing with the advantage.
- TCU has outscored its opponent in the paint and from behind the arc in 48 games overall and 23 times vs. Big 12 opponents since 2024-25. The Frogs have finished with the edge in both categories in 26-of-36 games this season.

NINE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

The Horned Frogs reach double figures in deep balls with regularity, but often, nine are all that's needed to cinch a win.

- TCU is 54-6 when knocking down at least nine 3-pointers over the last two seasons. The Horned Frogs have connected nine-or-more times from distance in 56 percent (60-107) of their games under Mark Campbell and in 18-of-36 this season.
- TCU converted nine-plus 3-point attempts in 12 of its first 13 games in 2023-24 on its way to finishing undefeated in nonconference play.

DOUBLE DIGIT DEEP BALLS

- TCU ranks fourth nationally in games with at least 10 three-pointers since 2023 with 45.
- The Frogs went 19-0 last season when reaching double figures from behind the arc.
- Upping the ante further, TCU has connected from distance at least 14 times in 13 games since the Campbell era began in 2023, the fifth-most such games in that span.
- TCU is 41-4 under Campbell and has won 29 straight ballgames when reaching double digits in 3-pointers.
- TCU reached double figures in deep balls in 18 games in 2024-25 - the second-most of any team in America.

'20-AND-10' GAMES: ALLOW US TO EXPLAIN

- Since 2023, the Horned Frogs have tallied at least 20 assists and 10 three-pointers in 24 games, competing to a 24-1 record in that span.
- TCU's 25 such '20-and-10' games are the fifth-most of any team in college basketball, trailing only UConn (30), Utah (28), Fairfield (26) and Iowa (26) for the national lead.
 - TCU went 11-0 last season when dishing out 20 dimes and draining 10 deep balls.

FROGS BY 90

- Thirteen of the 38 all-time 90-point performances in TCU women's basketball history have come in the Mark Campbell era, including five already in 2025-26.
- TCU delivered a single-season program record seven 90-point games in the 2024-25 campaign, tied for the second-most of any Big 12 team and a top-20 mark nationally.

- TCU has won 42 straight games when scoring at least 80 points, good for the highest winning percentage in 80-point games of any team in America over the last three seasons.

SIXTY-FOUR-OR-MORE

- The Horned Frogs are 77-6 overall and 33-5 in Big 12 action since 2023-24 when scoring at least 64 points.
- TCU has surpassed the 64-point threshold in 36 of its 37 nonconference victories under Mark Campbell.

GET IT TO UNDER 5:00

- TCU is 84-7 under Mark Campbell when leading with less than five minutes remaining in regulation.
- The Horned Frogs are 82-2 when holding a multi-possession advantage under the 5:00 mark in the fourth quarter in the Campbell era.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE TROUBLE

TCU has yet to lose in the Mark Campbell era when two-or-more players finish with a double double in the same game.

- The Horned Frogs are a perfect 14-0 since 2023-24 when multiple double-doubles canvas a game's final box score.

FOUR FROGS IN DOUBLE FIGURES

TCU has had four players score in double figures 38 times over the last two seasons.

- The Frogs are 36-2 in the Mark Campbell era when four players tally at least 10 points in the same game.
- TCU has benefitted from four double-digit scorers in 14 games in 2025-26.
- TCU went 15-0 in 2024-25 when four players reached double digits.
- Prior to their overtime loss at Utah on Jan. 3, the Horned Frogs had won 26 straight games when four players meet or eclipse the 10-point threshold. TCU is 30-1 dating back to March of 2024 when four of its players score 10-plus.

WHEN A FROG DROPS SEVEN-PLUS DIMES...

TCU has had at least one player finish with seven-or-more assists 50 times since Mark Campbell took the reins in 2023.

- In those games, the Horned Frogs are 43-4 overall, 37-2 since 2024-25 and 17-2 this season.
- Olivia Miles (17), Hailey Van Lith (14) and Jaden Owens (8) top the TCU statistical ranks in the Campbell era in career seven-assist games.

A review of the top performing Horned Frogs alumnae, who are currently playing basketball professionally.

Last updated on March 18

Lauren Heard currently plays professionally in Finland. In the recent game, despite her outstanding performance, Heard couldn't prevent Kotka Peli-Karhut (18-6) from suffering a heavy defeat of 96-74 on the road against the lower-ranked (#7) ToPo, who dominated the league leader PeKa. During the game, Heard showcased her skills by achieving a double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds. Additionally, she contributed 6 assists and 5 steals in 37 minutes of play. Unfortunately, this loss marked Kotka Peli-Karhut's third consecutive defeat, adding pressure as there are only three games remaining in the Regular Season. Heard has had an impressive individual season, boasting high statistics. She currently holds averages of 19.5 points per game (the second best in the league), 7.2 rebounds per game, 5.3 assists per game (the second best in the league), and 2.8 steals per game (the third best in the league) across the 24 games she has played so far. With each remaining game being crucial, Heard's skills and leadership will be vital as the team aims to bounce back from their recent losses.

Madison Conner is currently playing professionally in Spain. In the recent game, despite Conner's notable performance, Estepona (9-15) suffered a 72-80 defeat at home against the higher-ranked (#9) Estudiantes. Conner showcased her skills by contributing 12 points, 9 rebounds, and 7 assists, impressively going 7 for 7 at the free-throw line, all within 32 minutes of play. This marks Conner's debut season with the team, where she has maintained solid statistics, averaging 13.5 points, 2.7 rebounds, and 2.6 assists per game across the 23 games she has participated in so far.

Amy Okonkwo currently competes professionally in Turkey. Despite her efforts, Okonkwo could not lead Besiktas (11-9) to victory against Mersin (14-6) in the Turkish Herbalife KBSL. She managed to score 8 points in just 8 minutes of play. Besiktas suffered an 83-91 loss on the road to the higher-ranked (#4) Mersin team. Throughout the season, Okonkwo has been delivering impressive performances, boasting averages of 15.8 points, 5.5 rebounds, 1.1 assists, and 1.8 steals per game in the eight games she has participated in so far. It is worth noting that Okonkwo has become a naturalized Nigerian.

Though known for its offensive prowess, TCU has steadily morphed into a stout defensive outfit under head coach Mark Campbell

A HORNED FROGS BLOCK PARTY

- TCU has benefitted from elite rim protection throughout the Mark Campbell era.
- The Horned Frogs have finished with six-or-more blocks in 43 percent of their games (46-107) over the last three seasons and eight in 2025-26. They are 4-3 overall when sending back at least seven shots. TCU was 17-0 in 2024-25 when hitting the marker.
 - TCU's 46 games with at least six blocks are the sixth-most of any D1 team over the last three seasons. Only South Carolina (66), USC (55), Kentucky (49), Virginia (49) and Duke (48) have more six-block performances in that span.
 - TCU has tallied a Campbell era record 12 blocks on three occasions, most recently in an 82-43 victory over North Carolina A&T to open the 2025-26 season.
 - TCU's 570 blocks over the last three seasons are the third-most of any team nationwide.
 - The Frogs have reached double figures in blocks seven times under Campbell.

GETTING IT DONE ON BOTH SIDES

- TCU is among of a handful of outfits in the country getting it done at an elite level on both sides of the ball. TCU is one of two teams in the country connecting at a 47 percent clip or better from the field while holding its opponents below 35 percent shooting. The other is South Carolina.
- Through 36 games in 2025-26, TCU is one of three teams alongside UConn and Texas scoring at least 75 points per game while allowing 56 points or fewer per game.
- TCU has shot at least 43 percent from the floor in 25 of its wins. Conversely, only nine opposing teams have connected above a 36 percent clip from the field in any game.
- The Horned Frogs have kept their opponent at-or-below 30 percent shooting in 15 games, the most of any team nationwide this season.
- TCU ranks sixth in the country in scoring margin (+21.4). All-but-six of the Horned Frogs' wins have been by double figures.
- Last season, TCU was one of only seven teams at the D1 level that scored at least 77 points per game and surrendered 58-or-fewer. The others were No. 1 UConn, No. 2 South Carolina, No. 3 UCLA, No. 4 Texas, No. 5 USC and No. 13 Kansas State.
- TCU's end-of-season scoring margin in 2024-25 (+20.2) was the eighth-best mark nationally. Fourteen of the Frogs' 34 wins were by at least 27 points.
- The Frogs shot 40 percent or better in 33-of-34 wins last season.
- TCU reached double figures in 3-pointers in 47 percent of its contests (18-38) in its second year under Mark Campbell. On the other end, 26 opponents made five-or-fewer deep balls.
- Also last year, the Horned Frogs averaged 20

points scored in the second, third and fourth quarters of a game. Defensively, TCU held teams to less than 20 points in a half a school record 13 times.

SUB-40 TEMPERATURES

- Keeping teams at or below a 40 percent clip from the floor is a near-certain indicator of a TCU victory.
- Under Mark Campbell, TCU is 69-5 when teams fail to shoot better than 40 percent vs. the Horned Frogs' defense.
 - Inside Schollmaier Arena, Campbell-led teams have kept 49 of 61 opponents at-or-below a 40 percent clip from the field.
 - TCU set a Big 12 era single-game record for field goal percentage defense in its 69-43 win over Texas Tech on Jan. 11, holding the Lady Raiders to 22 percent shooting (13-57).
 - The Frogs stifled No. 17 Baylor into its worst field goal percentage in 15 years in last season's winner-take all game for the Big 12 regular season championship. TCU limited the Bears to a 27.7 clip (18-65) from the field - their seventh-lowest single game percentage in program history - in a 51-48 win on March 2 in Waco.

THREE'S AND D

- In the Mark Campbell era, the Horned Frogs have held 72 opponents at or below a 33 percent clip from distance, including 23-of-38 last season and 25 thus far in 2025-26.
- TCU is allowing just 5.1 threes per game after giving up 4.9 per night in 2024-25. Last year, the Horned Frogs held 25 teams to five-or-fewer triples.
- TCU is 63-12 when limiting teams to six-or-fewer threes over the past three seasons.
- TCU has kept 29 opponents at or below 20 percent from behind the arc in the Campbell era.
- In 2023-24, the Horned Frogs were one of only two teams in the country alongside No. 1 South Carolina ranking in the top-25 in 3-point percentage offense and defense at the conclusion of the regular season.
- TCU allowed 5.4 threes per game in 2023-24.

WE SCORE, YOU DON'T

- Under Mark Campbell, TCU has held 85.5 percent of its opponents (89-104) under their season scoring average, including 32-of-36 this year.
- Inside Schollmaier Arena, the Horned Frogs are allowing just 53.9 points per game (3,293 points) in the Campbell era.
- The Horned Frogs have limited 64 teams to 60-or-fewer points since Campbell took the reins. Just eight opponents have exceeded 75 points vs. TCU in regulation since 2023.
- The Frogs have prevented 45 teams from reaching 55-or-more points since 2023-24.
- TCU ranked third in points per game differential (+39.4) leading into Big 12 play in 2025-26. TCU was 11th nationally in the category ahead of the start of conference play in both 2023-24 and 2024-25. The Horned Frogs capped nonconference play in 2023-24 with a 27.1 scoring margin and increased the figure to 31.8 last season.
- Forty-seven opponents have failed to shoot 33 percent or-better from the field vs. TCU over the last three years. Nineteen opposing teams have been unable to eclipse the 33 percent threshold against TCU's defense in 2025-26, among them West Virginia (2x), BYU (2x), Houston (2x), Texas Tech, Arizona State and UCF.

THE 20/20 RULE

- TCU prevented its opponent from scoring 20 points or less in a half a school record 13

times in 2024-25 and has done so 24 times total in the Mark Campbell era.

KEEP IT 50 MPH

- The Horned Frogs have won 69 straight games when they have limited the opponent to 50 points or less.
- The last time a TCU team lost to an opponent when allowing 50-or-fewer points came in the Jeff Mittie era, when the Horned Frogs dropped a 49-48 decision to Oklahoma State on Jan. 29, 2014.
- Head coach Mark Campbell's TCU and Sacramento State teams are a combined 43-0 when preventing opposing teams from eclipsing 50 points.
- Fourteen teams failed to score 50 points vs. the Horned Frogs last season, among them 11 visitors to Schollmaier Arena and five Big 12 foes; Baylor, West Virginia, Colorado, BYU and Texas Tech.

BASH 'EM, BASHAM

- TCU counted on the combination of Clara Silva and **Kennedy Basham** to replace the rim protection afforded by former All-American center Sedona Prince, and Basham certainly has met the moment.
- The 6-7 Basham is among the leading returning shot blockers in college basketball. Basham ranks third among all returning players in total blocks (83) and blocks per game (2.6) from 2024-25. She finished sixth in all of Division I in both categories last season.
 - Basham ranks fifth among all active D1 players in career blocks (209) and ninth in blocks per game average (1.83).
 - Basham has finished with at least three blocks in 20 games vs. Big 12 opposition.
 - Her 53 blocks in Big 12 play last season were the third most of any player.
 - Basham has seven games with at least five blocks to her name and has stuffed four-plus shots 20 times.
 - Basham has finished with multiple rejections in 42 percent of her games played over the last three seasons (39-94).
 - Basham finished with a career-high seven blocks vs. San Francisco on Dec. 17, 2024.

THE STARTERS: OLIVIA MILES, MARTA SUAREZ, DONOVYN HUNTER, CLARA SILVA AND TAYLOR BIGBY

SOMETIMES YOU, SOMETIMES ME, ALWAYS THESE THREE

- TCU's **Marta Suarez, Olivia Miles** and **Donovyn Hunter** are the nation's fifth highest-scoring trio. They collectively are averaging 46.8 points per game. Only Western Illinois, Murray State, Notre Dame and South Carolina have higher-scoring trifectas than the Horned Frogs.
- The TCU threesome has combined to score 50-plus in 15 games. All three players have reached double figures in 16 tilts, leading TCU to a 13-3 record in those games.
- Miles, Suarez and Hunter scored 60-plus points collectively in three straight games from Feb. 4-12; vs. Houston (64), at Colorado (68) and at No. 12 Baylor (73). They have put 60 points on the board together five times.
- Moreover, Suarez and Miles are the highest-scoring duo in the Big 12, averaging a combined 36.2 points per game. They are the one of two sets of teammates in the conference each averaging more than 15 points per game.
- Suarez and Miles are also the only duo nationwide averaging at least 16 points, 6.5 rebounds and two assists per game.
- Suarez and Miles have teamed up to score at least 40 in 13 games, leading TCU to 11 victories when doing so.

THE 3-POINT QUINTUPLET

- TCU is the only team in the country with four players who have knocked down at least 55 threes this season; Marta Suarez (79), Olivia Miles (69), Taylor Bigby (61) and Donovan Hunter (59).
- The four players are responsible for 82 percent of TCU's total 3-point offense (265-323). The quartet is averaging 7.4 threes per game.
- In 19 of TCU's 36 games, Suarez, Hunter, Miles, Bigby and Maddie Scherr have combined to connect at least eight times from distance. Scherr drained 28 threes prior to being sidelined with an injury in February.
- Miles, Suarez and Hunter collectively shot 15-29 from distance in TCU's 83-67 win at No. 12 Baylor on Feb. 12, with Miles single-handedly accounting for 10 of TCU's long balls. The 15 threes tied TCU's Big 12 single-game record.
- Including Scherr, the fivesome hit 14 threes in three of TCU's victories; Tennessee State (Nov. 12), UTRGV (Nov. 23) and UTEP (Dec. 6).
- The group has been responsible for all of TCU's made 3-pointers in 15 games.

IT'S GIVING BATMAN AND ROBIN

- Olivia Miles has assisted on 51 percent of Donovan Hunter's 3-pointers (30-59).

SO, HOW VALUABLE EXACTLY IS THIS GROUP?

- Miles, Suarez and Hunter are the one of six teammate trios with at least 5.5 win shares to their names. Texas, South Carolina, UCLA, LSU and UConn are the only other teams with three-or-more players who have contributed at least 5.5 win shares to their team's net total.
- The trio's 23.1 combined win shares are the third-most of any teammate tandem in the country. Only and UConn's Sarah Strong, KK Arnold and Azzi Fudd (27.8) and Texas' Madison Booker, Jordan Lee and Rori Harmon (23.9) have greater combined totals.

- Miles and Suarez are the country's second-most valuable defensive duo when evaluating win shares contributed at that end of the floor. Their 6.6 combined defensive win shares trail only Booker and Harmon (6.7) for the most by any pair of teammates.
- TCU is also one of three teams in college basketball with four players who have accrued at least 2.5 defensive win shares. The others are UConn and South Carolina.

MILES AND MILES OF TRIPLE-DOUBLES

Olivia Miles and triple-doubles at this point are synonymous.

- Miles recorded three straight triple-doubles in TCU's victories over UTEP, Jacksonville and Arkansas-Pine Bluff from Dec. 6-16. She became only the third player in NCAA history to notch a triple-double in back-to-back-to-back games. Danielle Carson of Youngstown State was the first hooper to achieve the feat circa 1985 and Lamar's Chastadie Barrs did so in 2019.
- Miles posted her fourth triple-double in a five-game span at BYU on Dec. 31. Her run of four triple-doubles in a 25-day span from Dec. 6-31 overtook Brittney Griner (Baylor) and Shalee Lehning (Kansas State) for the most triple-doubles by a Big 12 player in a single season. She also joined Sabrina Ionescu as one of only two players in NCAA history to tally four triple-doubles in the same month.
- She notched her sixth triple-double of the season against UC San Diego on March 20. It was the 12th of her career. The only players with more triple-doubles than Miles are Ionescu (26) and Caitlin Clark (17). She overtook Griner and Lehning for the most triple doubles of any Big 12 player in a career.
- Notably, Miles has recorded two 25-point triple-doubles this season. She is one of only five players this century to achieve the feat twice in a season, joining Clark (2023-24), Victoria McGowan (Stetson, 2011-12), Louella Tomlinson (St. Mary's, 2008-09) and Amie Williams (Jackson State, 2003-04) in exclusive company.
- Miles is also the only player ACC history to post consecutive triple-doubles, having done so in consecutive games in December of 2024 during her final season at Notre Dame.
- Miles is responsible for more than 60 percent (6-10 of the all-time triple-doubles in the history of TCU women's basketball. Prior to Miles' triple-double on Dec. 6 vs. UTEP, TCU last bore witness to such a feat in 2011.

NOT ONE, BUT TWO TRIPLE-DOUBLES

- Schollmaier Arena was the site of a sight previously unseen in NCAA Division I women's basketball history on Dec. 16, 2025, when Olivia Miles and Marta Suarez each recorded triple-doubles in TCU's 109-54 takedown of Arkansas-Pine Bluff.
- The duo became the first pair of teammates to post a triple-double in the same game vs. a Division I opponent.
 - Miles and Suarez also became the first players to record 20-point triple-doubles in the same game at any level of play.
 - Collectively, the duo tallied four triple-doubles over the course of TCU's trio of wins over UTEP, Jacksonville and Arkansas-Pine Bluff, with Miles accounting for three. Miles and Suarez made TCU the first NBA, WNBA or Division I men's or women's team with four triple-doubles in a three-game span since the Los Angeles Lakers from Dec. 28-31, 2021, when LeBron James and Russell Westbrook posted a quartet.

- Notably, at the time of her triple-double in 2005, Sandora Irvin was one of only eight players in NCAA history to notch a triple-double including 10-plus blocks.

ORDER UP 15-AND-5 FOR MILES

By the time the 2025-26 season reaches its final stop, there's a strong likelihood **Olivia Miles** will feature in the top-10 of the NCAA record books for career 15-point, five-assist performances for years to come.

- Miles leads all active Division I players in career 15-and-5 games (54). The next closest player to matching her mark is Texas A&M's Ny'Ceara Pryor (43).
- Her 54 games with at least 15 points and five assists are the ninth-most of any player in D1 women's basketball history.
- Miles is also the first Power Conference player to begin a season with 12 consecutive games of at least 15 points and five assists. She broke Kristi Tolliver's 2007-08 record of eight straight 15-and-5 games to start a season on Dec. 3.
- Before TCU's loss at Utah, Miles-led teams had won 29 straight games when she finished with at least 15 points and five assists. Her teams are 48-5 across her four-and-a-half seasons on the collegiate hardwood when she ticks both boxes.

MORE TCU INDIVIDUAL SPOTLIGHTS

THE SPANISH SNIPER

Marta Suarez is on pace to go down as one of the sport's greatest shooting forwards as her final collegiate season hits its stride.

- Over the course of her career, Suarez has knocked down 172 threes, the 16th-most of any NCAAW player 6-3-or-taller.
- Suarez trails only Indiana's Yarden Garzon (308), Kansas' Elle Evans (247) and Vanderbilt's Justine Pissott (172) among all active players at least 6-3 in career 3-pointers. The Spaniard ranks fifth in 2025-26 for total threes by players 6-3-or-taller with 79.
- With an eye toward the Big 12 record book, Suarez's 79 threes the most in a season by a Big 12 player with an equal or greater height.
- Suarez needs one 3-pointer to crack the top-15 of the NCAA all-time rankings for career 3-pointers among players at least 6-3.

DONO DROPPIN' DIMES

When it comes to floor generals, few players are as efficient at creating scoring opportunities for teammates than **Donovyn Hunter**.

- The six-foot guard posted an assist-to-turnover ratio of 3.0-or-better 11 times in 2024-25. Dating back to February of 2025, Hunter has finished with an assist-to-turnover ratio of at least 3.0 in 12 starts overall and nine in 2025-26.
- Hunter averaged nearly four assists per game (50 assists) over her final 13 outings last season, dishing out at least five in six games.
- Hunter produced an 11-1 assist-to-turnover ratio in TCU's first three games in 2024-25.
- In 2023-24, Hunter led all D1 freshmen and ranked 21st nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.39) in her lone season at Oregon State.
- She has finished with an assist-to-turnover ratio of 4-1-or-better in 19 times in her career, including 12 outings in 2023-24.
- Hunter's career assist-to-turnover ratio stands at 2-1 (307-154).
- Hunter dropped five-plus assists nine times her freshman season and has netted at least five in 18 games across her three collegiate seasons.
- She started all-but-one game at point guard during the Beavers' Elite Eight run last season. She became the first freshman since WNBA first round draft pick and Sydney Wiese in 2013-14 to start at point guard for the Beavers. Of note, Wiese was recruited to Oregon State by TCU head coach Mark Campbell during his assistant coaching tenure in Corvallis.

HUNTER'S OFFENSIVE TRANSFORMATION

Donovyn Hunter was pulled from the rotation and played just seven minutes in TCU's 59-50 loss at No. 12 Kansas State on Feb. 5, 2025. It proved to be a turning point in her college career.

- Since that game, Hunter has increased her scoring average to 9.6 points per game (480 total) across her last 50 outings. Prior to that, Hunter averaged 5.2 points per night.
- Hunter's shooting percentages have also drastically improved in the aftermath of TCU's visit to the Little Apple. She is connecting at a 46 percent clip from the field (180-389) and is knocking down 35 percent of her attempts from behind the arc (73-213).
- Hunter scored in double figures in nine consecutive games to open the 2025-26 campaign. She never scored 10-plus in multiple games at any point during her freshman or sophomore seasons.
- Hunter was reinserted into TCU's starting lineup on Feb. 19 at Arizona State. Since her return to the starting five, she has more than

doubled her points and assists per game averages. As a permanent starter, Hunter has averaged 9.9 points per game (467) across 47 outings. Before rejoining the starting five for good, Hunter was averaging 5.2 points per game as a Frog.

BIGBY'S BIG-TIME IMPACT

Taylor Bigby has had a knack for delivering in key moments for TCU since arriving in Fort Worth in June of 2024.

- Bigby started 24 of TCU's first 26 ballgames in 2024-25 to help set the table for what became the greatest season in school history.
- TCU is 23-2 overall and 14-1 this season when Bigby scores in double figures.
- She put at least 10 points on the board in seven games vs. Big 12 foes in road or neutral site affairs.
- Bigby reached double digits in three straight ballgames for the first time ever in TCU's wins over New Orleans, Texas State and No. 13 NC State from Nov. 10-17, 2024. She went 18-24 from the field and averaged 14.3 points per night in the trio of wins.
- Bigby netted a TCU career-high 19 points across 21 minutes of action in the Frogs' 82-69 road win over Iowa State on Feb. 2. She shot 7-11 from the floor.
- Bigby poured in 18 points in 21 minutes vs. Tarleton State on Nov. 20.
- Bigby poured in 11 first quarter points in TCU's 63-46 victory over BYU on March 6 in the Big 12 Tournament quarterfinals, staking the Frogs to an early 21-5 lead. She finished with 13 for the game.
- She scored eight points in the fourth quarter of the Frogs' 80-73 win at Kansas on Jan. 8 and finished with 12 for the game.
- Bigby has shot 50 percent or better from the field and scored at least eight points in 23 games. The Horned Frogs are 21-2 overall and 13-1 in 2025-26 when she does so.
- She has knocked down four-or-more 3-pointers on nine occasions in a TCU uniform.
- Bigby is averaging 7.9 points per game at home for her career as a Horned Frog and 9.9 per night this season.

SILVA SAYS 'NO'

Sophomore center **Clara Silva** was one of only three first-year players in 2024-25 to finish with five-or-more blocks in at least two games.

- Silva sent back six shots in her collegiate debut vs. USC Upstate, then followed with five more against Northern Kentucky five days later.
- Silva's six blocks vs. the Spartans were the third-most in a game by a freshman last season.
- Silva has finished with three-plus blocks 13 times and on 10 occasions as a Frog.

SCHEER THE SWIPER

Maddie Scherr has proven to be one of the best on-ball defenders in college basketball across her four seasons on the court.

- Scherr has finished with three-plus steals in 25 games. She tallied 11 three-steal games as a junior at Kentucky in 2022-23.
- She has five career five-steal games to her credit.

"MIRROR MIRROR ON THE WALL, WHO IS THE TALLEST OF THEM ALL?"

Standing 6'8 1/2", **Sarah Portlock** is a historically huge presence in TCU's frontcourt.

- Portlock is the third-tallest player in all of college basketball, trailing only 6-10 Nicole Dominguez of Middle Tennessee and Eastern

Illinois' Abbie Boutlier (6-9).

- Portlock is also the second-tallest freshman in the nation and the tallest in the Big 12.
- She is the tallest player to suit up for TCU. Portlock surpassed Lindsey Prewitt, who stood 6-8 while playing for the Horned Frogs from 2001-03, as TCU's tallest ever.

WD-40 IN THE BACKCOURT

Back in an interview in August, TCU head coach Mark Campbell likened **Maddie Scherr** to WD-40, because "she makes everything go smoother on both sides of the ball." A closer look at the numbers supports the analogy.

- Scherr is one of only 10 active Division I players with at least 400 career assists and 190 career steals.
- The Kentucky native has finished with at least five assists and three steals on 12 occasions.
- Scherr has tallied 10-or-more points and five-plus assists in 20 career games.
- Scherr has continuously been a stat sheet stuffer. She has delivered 23 "5-5-5" games across her five seasons on the court.
- Scherr sports a career 1.62 assist-to-turnover ratio (410-252). She dished out 227 assists against 131 giveaways, good for a 1.73 assist-to-turnover ratio over her sophomore and junior seasons from 2021-23.

RONI RUNNING THE SHOW

Veronica Sheffey was the final transfer player to sign with TCU in April, and her arrival has bolstered the Horned Frogs' backcourt.

- Sheffey led San Diego State in assists in 26-of-31 games in 2024-25.
- She scored in double figures 21 times last season.
- Sheffey increased her scoring average to 13 points per game and was a 44 percent shooter from behind the arc during conference play last winter.
- Since 2023, Sheffey has finished with at least 10 points and five assists in 22 games.

GET WELL SOON, AALIYAH

Aaliyah Roberson was lost for the season after suffering a torn ACL in May while competing at the USA Basketball 3x Nationals.

- The 6-2 forward underwent successful surgery in June and intends to play her final collegiate season in 2026-27.
- Roberson led all Division I post players in effective field goal percentage (.677) and connected at a team-leading 48.3 percent clip from behind the arc in 2024-25. She knocked down 56.5 percent (43-76) of her field goals during conference and postseason play. She was one of only five players to appear in all 38 games last season during TCU's run to the Elite Eight.

FROM EUGENE TO FUNKY TOWN

Taylor Bigby and **Maddie Scherr** are entering their first season as teammates on the courts in 2025-26, but their swan song to college basketball will not be their first time playing alongside one another.

- Both players were recruited to Oregon by Mark Campbell and Xavier Lopez over their final two years on the bench in Eugene. The duo shared the court at Oregon in 2021-22, helping the Ducks earn a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Tournament.
- Scherr was one of five members of Campbell's No. 1 ranked recruiting class in 2020.
- Oregon was 7-2 in games when both Scherr and Bigby touched the floor.

Frogs Gone Global

The 2025-26 TCU women's basketball team reach all corners of the U.S. and the world

COLLEGE BASKETBALL'S MOST DIVERSE TEAM

All 14 players on TCU's 2025-26 roster represent a different state or country outside North America, making the Horned Frogs' locker room as diverse as any.

- TCU has 10 U.S. states and four countries represented on its roster. No other program features to as many state residencies and nationalities.
- The Horned Frogs' 10 home state heritages are tied with Belmont, Delaware and Tennessee for the second-most in all of Division I basketball. Brown leads the way with 11 states.
- TCU is tied with Yale and USC Upstate for the D1 lead in nationalities represented (five) when including the United States.

A QUARTET OF CONFERENCES

When it comes to declaring which Power Conference reigns supreme, **Marta Suarez** might have the most learned perspective in all of college basketball.

- Suarez is the only men's or women's player who has played in four Power Conferences when including the Pac-12. She played two seasons in the SEC at Tennessee, then double-dipped in the Pac-12 and ACC with Cal from 2023-25. Now a graduate student, Suarez's final chapter sent her to the Big 12 following her decision to transfer to TCU.
- Suarez is one of six D1 women's players to spend time in four different leagues at any level. The others are Amirah Abdur-Rahim (Houston), Sophie Benharouga (Wichita State), Kamaria Gipson (UNC Asheville), Luka Malinka (Tarleton State) and Treasure Thompson (Wichita State).
- The distinction of "college basketball's most traveled player" ultimately belongs to Gipson, who is competing in her fifth conference in as many seasons with UNC Asheville.

THE FIRST OF THEIR KIND

Clara Bielefeld (Germany), **Clara Silva** (Portugal) and **Marta Suarez** (Spain) are the first players to ever suit up for TCU women's basketball from their respective home countries.

- Bielefeld is one of only two German student-athletes at TCU. The other is Maya Drozd of Horned Frog women's tennis.
- TCU is home to the top-rated Portuguese amateur women's basketball player and women's golfer. Silva and Sofia Barroso Sá, a senior on the TCU women's golf team, share a nationality and strong backing from their home sport federations. Silva is widely

regarded as Portugal's top amateur basketball prospect in years. Barroso Sá is the highest-rated Portuguese player in the World Amateur Golf Rankings and has been ranked as high as No. 135 in the world.

BUDDIES ON THE IBERIAN PENINSULA

TCU is one of only three Division I programs with a player from Portugal and a player from Spain on its 2025-26 roster in **Marta Suarez** (Oviedo, Spain) and **Clara Silva** (Faro, Portugal).

- The other teams sharing the distinction are UAlbany and New Mexico. Precisely one-third of the Great Danes' roster hails from the Iberian Peninsula. UAlbany features three players from Spain and one from Portugal. The Lobos have two Portugal natives and one Spaniard on their roster.
- Also of note, TCU and UAlbany are especially unique in that they are the lone pair of D1 programs rostering at least one player from Spain, Portugal and Germany. Clara Bielefeld gives TCU its German representation.

"AUSSIE AUSSIE AUSSIE, OI OI OI"

TCU and head coach Mark Campbell continue to actively recruit the Australian basketball pipeline.

- With the addition of freshman **Sarah Portlock**, TCU has had at least one Australian player on its roster for 10 consecutive seasons.
- Portlock is the sixth Aussie to compete for the Horned Frogs since 2016, joining Agnes Emma-Nnopus (2023-25), Tara Manumaleuga (2021-24), Emily Fisher (2022-23), Madi Puli (2019-21) and Ella Hellesey (2016-20).
- That number recently grew to seven. TCU signed Sydney, Australia native Jessie-May Hall to its 2026-27 roster during the early signing period. Hall averaged 22 points, 6.6 rebounds, 4.7 assists and 4.7 steals per game for the Hornsby Spiders in the 2025 NBL1 East Women's Conference.
- Campbell, who coached NBA guards Patty Mills and Matthew Dellavedova at Saint Mary's from 2008-10, has always made Oceania a priority in recruiting. Now in his 15th season coaching on the women's side, Campbell has recruited or coached 10 Australian players when including Hall. He mentored six Aussies during his tenure as associate head coach at Oregon from 2014-21, including 2024 WNBA draft pick Jaz Shelley.

The Tallest Team in the Country

A SIZEABLE CHALLENGE FOR OPPONENTS

Adding size was an imperative for Mark Campbell ahead of the 2025-26 campaign, and the third-year head coach certainly delivered.

- Four of the nine newcomers on TCU's roster are 6-7-or-taller. TCU is the only team in college basketball with four players standing at least 6-7.
- The Horned Frogs' average height of 6'2 1/2" (74.5 inches) also tops the national ranks.
- Sarah Portlock, who towers over her peers at 6'8 1/2", along with 6-7 centers Kennedy

Basham, Emily Hunter and Clara Silva, are four of only nine players 6-6-or-taller to don the purple and white.

- Precisely 57 percent of TCU's roster stands at least 6-2. Clara Bielefeld (6-4), Marta Suarez (6-3), Aaliyah Roberson (6-2) and Natalie Mazurek (6-2) give TCU eight players eclipsing the threshold.
- In total, 11 of the 14 players on the Frogs' roster are at least six feet tall. TCU's "shortest" player is 5-9 guard Veronica Sheffey

Detailing the Digits

Notes about the Horned Frogs' jersey numbers

#0 Kennedy Basham is the fifth player in program history to wear No. 0 and first since 2024 Olympian Tomi Taiwo ('23).

#1 Taylor Bigby switched from her original No. 3 to No. 1 following her transfer to USC from Oregon in 2021 and stuck with it upon arriving in Fort Worth.

#2 Veronica Sheffey is only the sixth TCU player to wear No. 2.

- In Sheffey's own words, her jersey number means, "God first, I'm second."

#4 Donovan Hunter wore No. 2 in high school but switched to No. 4 her freshman year at Oregon State in 2023-24. She kept it upon transferring to TCU.

- In Hunter's own words, her jersey number means "4 Him", remembering that I'm playing the game for the Lord and no one else's validation."

#5 Olivia Miles has sported No. 5 since she first received it from USA Basketball in high school. She wore No. 5 at the FIBA AmeriCup this summer and all four years at Notre Dame from 2021-25.

#7 Marta Suarez is the first TCU women's basketball player to wear No. 7. Suarez wore the No. 33 while at Tennessee from 2020-23.

- Suarez dubs her jersey number as "Lucky No. 7." She was born on May 7 and noted the seven colors of the rainbow and game seven in sports.

#14 Natalie Mazurek chose No. 14 because her birthday is April 14. She wore No. 23 at South Dakota from 2020-24.

#15 Sarah Portlock selected No. 15 because it's the number she wore while competing for Basketball Australia.

#16 Clara Bielefeld is the first TCU women's player to wear No. 16. It is her mother's favorite number.

#17 Clara Silva is the first Horned Frogs' men's or women's basketball player to wear No. 17.

#21 Taliyah Parker picked No. 21 in high school in honor of her parents, who both wore the number.

#22 Maddie Scherr's No. 22 jersey is the second most-worn number in TCU women's basketball history.

#23 Aaliyah Roberson is one of five members in her family to play Division I basketball but is the first to wear No. 23.

- Roberson wore No. 24 throughout high school and club basketball. But the number was taken when she arrived at TCU in 2021, so she switched to No. 23.

#44 Emily Hunter is the 11th Horned Frog to wear No. 44 but the first in a decade. The last TCU player to don the digits was Claire Ferguson in 2015-16.

- Hunter selected the jersey number in honor of her first basketball role model, a senior player, Zoe Piller who wore the No. 44 when Hunter was a high school freshman.

TCU IN THE AP TOP 25

FROM UNRANKED TO BEST-EVER RANKINGS

- The Horned Frogs began the 2024-25 campaign unranked and concluded the season tabbed No. 6 in the final AP Top 25. The No. 6 overall ranking is the highest in TCU men's and women's basketball history.
- Prior to last season, TCU's previous all-time high AP Top 25 ranking was No. 13, achieved on Feb. 23, 2004.
- Under Mark Campbell, TCU has garnered 20 top-10 rankings and 34 top-15 placements. TCU cracked the top 15 just twice in its first 47 seasons of existence.

BACK IN THE PRESEASON AP TOP 25

- TCU debuted at No. 17 in the preseason Associated Press poll to begin the 2025-26 season.
- It was the highest preseason ranking in program history and marks the first time TCU has featured in the inaugural poll in 22 years. TCU started the 2002-03 campaign ranked No. 19 and was tabbed 24th the following season.

POLLING NUMBERS

- TCU maintained a top 15 ranking in a program record 17 straight polls in 2024-25.
- The Frogs have cracked the top-20 in 45 polls.
- TCU debuted in The Associated Press poll for the first time in three years in Mark Campbell's inaugural season on Dec. 18, 2023, attaining the No. 25 national ranking.
- TCU boasts a 116-44 career record when ranked, including a 69-8 mark in home games. TCU is 31-24 all-time on the road with a number next to its name.
- Campbell led TCU to its earliest AP Top 25 ranking in 13 seasons in 2023-24.
- TCU has been ranked for 96 weeks in the AP Top 25 and appeared in 80 polls.

- The Frogs' run of 37 straight AP Top 25 features is the longest streak in TCU basketball history, surpassing the 2003-04 women's basketball team's run of 21 rankings.

TCU WOMEN'S BASKETBALL AT HOME UNDER MARK CAMPBELL

CAMPBELL'S HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

- Schollmaier Arena has transformed into one of the toughest venues to steal a win in all of college basketball.
- TCU will carry the longest home winning streak in college basketball - men's or women's - into the 2026-27 season. The Horned Frogs have won 44 straight titles inside Schollmaier Arena, an unbeaten run that began on Feb. 24, 2024.
 - The Horned Frogs ran the table and notched 20-plus wins at home in both 2024-25 and 2025-26.
 - TCU's average margin of victory at home in 2025-26 was 31.3 points (+626).
 - TCU outscored opponents by an average of 29 points at home in 2024-25.
 - Campbell's Horned Frog squads have produced a +25.4 points per game differential (1,552 points) across 61 home contests.
 - TCU is surrendering just 53.9 points per game (3,293 points) at home in the Campbell era.
 - TCU has notched 36 victories of 20 points or more at home under Campbell.
 - The Frogs are undefeated at 34-0 inside Schollmaier Arena in nonleague action since Campbell took the reins.
 - The Horned Frogs are unbeaten at 53-0 over the last three seasons when entering the intermission ahead at home.
 - Campbell's teams have notched 15 home victories of at least 40 points, including eight in 2025-26.

PACK THE 'SCHOLL

- Ticket demands and community interest in TCU women's basketball have blossomed since Mark Campbell headed up the program in March 2023.
- TCU drew the largest home crowd to ever attend a TCU women's sporting event (7,494 fans) in its second round NCAA Tournament victory over Louisville. The Frogs also set a TCU women's basketball student attendance record (969 fans).
 - TCU inspired a 65.5 percent increase in total

fan attendance from the 2023-24 season. The Frogs increased their cumulative attendance figure by 29,332 fans. A total of 74,138 fans flocked to Schollmaier Arena compared to 44,806 in 2023-24

- Campbell's first season at the helm culminated in a 55 percent increase in total fan attendance from 2022-23.

- TCU is an impressive 76-7 (.915) overall in all non-conference games played inside Schollmaier Arena since the venue reopened in December 2015.
- TCU is 37-0 in nonleague affairs dating back to December of 2022 when including postseason play.
- TCU is undefeated at home in postseason contests with a mark of 12-0.
- TCU's career record since the venue reopened in December 2015 stands at 147-53.
- The Horned Frogs are 57-4 inside Schollmaier Arena under Campbell.

FROGS ON THE BIG SCREEN

In another testament to its emergence as a national power, TCU women's basketball is again featuring prominently on the national airwaves.

- TCU received a program-record and Big 12 leading **eight national telecasts** ahead of the 2025-26 regular season.
- The Frogs' 14 linear broadcasts in 2025-26 swell TCU's total number of appearances on the big screen in the Mark Campbell era to 24. TCU played on national television 12 times in 2024-25.
- TCU competed to a 10-2 record on national television in 2024-25 and are 19-5 on the big screen over the past two years.

- TCU's neutral site affair vs. Ohio State on Jan. 19 on FOX was the first over-the-air telecast for a regular season game in program history. The Horned Frogs played their first-ever game on an over-air network in the Sweet 16 of the 2025 NCAA Tournament when they defeated seed Notre Dame, 71-62, on March 29 on ABC.

- Additionally, Campbell-led teams are undefeated at 8-0 over the last three seasons in Thanksgiving hoops affairs. Campbell's 2022-23 Sacramento State squad won the Holiday Beach Classic, defeating UTEP and Cal Poly in the San Luis Obispo-based affair.
- Campbell's career head coaching record in neutral site games stands at a robust 15-5
- TCU's average margin of victory in neutral site affairs in the Campbell era is 13.7 points.

WELL-RESTED, WELL-PREPARED

- Teams can struggle to reacclimate to game action following an extended stretch of time off, but the opposite has proven true for TCU.
- With its 86-40 win over UC San Diego on March 20 in the first round of the 2026 NCAA Tournament, the Horned Frogs improved to 14-1 under Mark Campbell when playing a game following a break of six days or more.
- The Horned Frogs are 4-0 vs. Big 12 opponents and 4-0 in postseason play under Campbell when off for at least six days.

HORNED FROGS UP AT THE HALF

- TCU led at halftime in 34 games last season, second only to national champion UConn across the D1 ranks.
- TCU topped the scoreboard in all 19 of its games vs. Big 12 opponents last season.
- The Horned Frogs have won 35 of their last 38 games when leading at the intermission.
- TCU is 77-6 when up at the break in the Mark Campbell era.
- Dating back to TCU's 92-41 romp over Louisiana Tech on Dec. 15, 2024, the Horned Frogs have led at the half in 53 of their last 63 games and in 28 contests this season.

FREAKY FAST FROGS

- A fast start by Mark Campbell-led and TCU teams as a whole over the last three seasons has been as close to a surefire foreshadowing of a Horned Frog victory.
- Since 2021-22, the Horned Frogs are 73-9 when leading after the first quarter and 88-8 when taking a lead into halftime.
 - Campbell's Sac State and TCU teams have combined to give the head coach career records of 101-13 when in possession of a first quarter lead and 107-11 when entering the intermission atop the scoreboard.

TCU WINS ITS FIRST BIG 12 BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS

FROM WORST TO FIRST

- By winning its first Big 12 Championship in March of 2025, TCU became just the second team in Big 12 Conference history to win a regular season championship within two seasons of finishing in last place. Kansas State won the 2008 Big 12 regular season title after finishing in the cellar the previous season.
- TCU's increase of 10 conference wins from last season was the biggest year-over win improvement in conference play by a Big 12 team since Nebraska's identical win increase from 2008-09 to 2009-10.
- TCU's repeat Big 12 titles signified the 15th and 16th regular season conference championship in TCU basketball history when including the men's program.

OOPS, WE DID IT AGAIN

- One week later, TCU again beat Baylor for a Big 12 Championship, this time for the conference tournament title.
- The Horned Frogs became the 18th team in the history of the Big 12 to sweep the conference regular season and tournament championships.
 - TCU is the 10th school in league history to capture a Big 12 tournament championship.
 - The 2024-25 TCU women's basketball team is also the only squad in Big 12 history to twice beat Baylor in a conference championship game.

CAMPBELL CROWNED BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR

- Mark Campbell became the first TCU head basketball coach to be receive Big 12 Coach of the Year honors in 2024-25. He is the only coach in the history of the Big 12 to garner Conference Coach of the Year honors within two seasons of joining the league.
- Campbell joined TCU all-time wins leader Jeff Mittie as one of two coaches in program history to receive a Conference Coach of the Year accolade. Mittie was honored as the 2001 WAC Coach of the Year, 2002 Conference USA Coach of the Year and 2010 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year over his 15-year run in Fort Worth.

COLLEGE BASKETBALL'S SENIOR CITIZENS

- TCU fielded the oldest roster in all of college basketball in 2024-25, and the Horned Frogs are again among the elder stateswomen in Division I this season.
- At the time of TCU's season-opener, the Horned Frogs' mean age was 21.07 years. The 2025-26 Horned Frogs are only four one-hundredths of a year younger than last season's squad. The 2024-25 TCU team's average age was 21.11 years on opening night.
 - Like last season, six of TCU's 14 players are 22.5 years or older.
 - Three Horned Frogs – **Maddie Scherr**, **Marta Suarez** and **Natalie Mazurek** – will turn 24 before TCU's spring commencement ceremony in May. Scherr celebrated her 24th birthday on Christmas Day.
 - By the time March Madness rolls around, TCU's roster will feature five players age-23 or older. **Olivia Miles** and **Taylor Bigby** were both born in 2003.
 - Only four Horned Frogs – freshmen **Clara Bielefeld**, **Emily Hunter** and **Sarah Portlock** and sophomore **Clara Silva** – are younger than 20 years old.

ACTUALLY, YOU CAN PUT A PRICE TAG ON EXPERIENCE

- The Horned Frogs rank first among all Power Four conference programs in career minutes played and games played.
- The 13 members of TCU's roster who have played at least one collegiate season and/or in one game have logged **26,551 minutes** on the court and have collectively appeared in **1,227 games**.
 - Six Horned Frogs have accrued more than 2,000 career minutes: Olivia Miles (4,464), Marta Suarez (3,453), Maddie Scherr (3,433), Donovan Hunter (3,087), Taylor Bigby (3,001) and Veronica Sheffey (2,715).
 - The next-closest team to matching TCU's experience is Texas Tech. The Lady Raiders have collectively racked up 24,304 minutes of game action.

ALL EYES ON THE ALL-BIG 12 AWARDS

FIRST FROM START TO FINISH

TCU won the undisputed Big 12 championship after being picked first in both the Big 12 Preseason Coaches Poll and Media Poll for the first time ever.

- The preseason honors marked only the third time the Horned Frogs entered a season as the betting favorite to cut down the conference championship nets.
- TCU's first place prediction was its first in 15 years. The last time TCU was picked first in a preseason coaches poll was in 2010, when the Frogs were tabbed first in the Mountain West Preseason Coaches Poll in their final season of membership before joining the Big 12.
- TCU was first picked to win a conference championship in 2003-04 in its penultimate season as a Conference USA affiliate.

COME HERE, WIN PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Olivia Miles' selection as Big 12 Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year is giving déjà vu, as TCU has now rostered the award recipient in consecutive seasons. Hailey Van Lith was swept both awards in 2024-25. Notably, both players were also tabbed Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year as well.

- The two transfer guards made TCU the first program in Big 12 history to produce the league's Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year in the consecutive seasons.

COACH CAMPBELL'S POINT GUARD FACTORY

Olivia Miles is the fourth transfer point guard in five years to win conference player and/or newcomer of the year accolades under Mark Campbell's mentorship.

- Campbell has coached the conference player of the year in four of his five completed seasons as a head coach, and all four winners have been one-and-done transfer point guards.
- Campbell's Sacramento State squads claimed Big Sky MVP accolades in both of his seasons in the state capital. Lianna Tillman received the recognition in 2021-22, becoming first Hornet to win the award in the program's history, while Kahlajah Dean won in 2022-23. Tillman transferred to Sac State following a four-year run at Pacific. Dean played her first four collegiate seasons at Oakland.
- Hailey Van Lith became Campbell's third point guard to win conference player of the year after spending her first four college seasons at separate schools.

- Of note, Dean, Van Lith and Miles all swept conference Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year accolades in their lone season under Campbell's mentorship. Van Lith and Miles are the only players in Big 12 history to win both awards in the same season.

- Dean, Tillman, Van Lith and Miles all averaged better than 17 points and five assists per game in Campbell's system.
- While she would not have won Big 12 Player of the Year, Campbell's fifth transfer point guard, Jaden Owens, was on her way to enjoying a spectacular senior season of her own before a torn ACL and meniscus ended her career. Owens ranked second in the country in assists (115) and averaged 6.8 assists per game before suffering her injury on Jan. 13, 2024, in TCU's fifth conference game.

MILESTONE VICTORIES FOR COACH CAMPBELL

1 Nov. 14, 2021 vs. San Jose State (W, 75-65)

*Campbell entered the win column as a head coach in his second game at the helm at Sac State. The Hornets erased a 13-point second half deficit in the win, outscoring the Spartans 30-7 in the fourth quarter.

25 Jan. 5, 2023 vs. Idaho (W, 71-56)

*Win No. 25 in Campbell's career placed the Hornets on a trajectory to earn the institution's first NCAA Tournament berth in men's or women's basketball. The home triumph over the Vandals punctuated a 2-0 start to conference play. Sac State went on to finish 13-5 in Big Sky action and earned a share of its first league title, then won the conference tournament to book its ticket to the Big Dance.

50 Dec. 17, 2023 vs. Lamar (W, 68-51)

*Campbell's 50th career victory was the 11th installment of a TCU women's basketball record 14-game winning streak to begin his inaugural season as the Horned Frogs' head man. The 2023-24 squad is the only team in program history to run the table in nonconference play.

75 Jan. 4, 2025 vs. Cincinnati (W, 81-66)

*Campbell and the Horned Frogs broke their own program record for the best start to a season in program history in a wire-to-wire takedown of the Bearcats. In addition to being Campbell's 75th career win, the victory staked TCU to a 15-1 start to the 2024-25 campaign, trumping their 14-1 record from the previous season.

100 Nov. 23, 2025 vs. UTRGV (W, 93-57)

*Campbell picked up his 100th career head coaching win in TCU's 36-point home takedown of the Vaqueros. He needed only 140 games to reach triple figures and became the third-fastest active Big 12 head coach to win 100 games at the Division I level.

125 March 22, 2026 vs. Washinton (W, 62-59)

*The 125th victory of Campbell's coaching career came in the second round of the 2026 NCAA Tournament. TCU erased a 10-point first half deficit vs. Washington and rallied for a 62-59 overtime victory at Schollmaier Arena. Campbell led the Horned Frogs to their second straight Sweet 16 appearance with the win.
