NOTING THE HORNED FROGS

- TCU is in its fifth season under the direction of **head coach Sonny Dykes** in 2026. The 2022 National Coach of the Year led TCU to 36 wins in his first four seasons, the most by a TCU head coach since Francis Schmidt won 37 from 1929-32.
- Dykes has also led programs at SMU (2018-21), Cal (2013-16), and Louisiana Tech (2010-12). In all four stops, Dykes has guided the program to the postseason, making him **one of four active head coaches** to take four different schools to a bowl game, joining Butch Jones, Lane Kiffin, and Rich Rodriguez.
- Dykes is also **one of eight active head coaches** to have appeared in the CFP National Championship game, along with Kirby Smart, Dabo Swinney, Ryan Day, Marcus Freeman, Kalen DeBoer, Mario Cristobal, and Curt Cignetti. Dykes and Cignetti are **the only two coaches** in CFP history to take over a losing program and direct them to the CFP in their first season.
- For the first time in three seasons, TCU has a new starting quarterback directing the offense as Harvard transfer **Jaden Craig** takes the reins. With the Crimson, he became the most accomplished quarterback in program history and left Cambridge with multiple **school records**. Through three games, Craig has posted numbers that are not only at the top of the conference, but the country. He leads the Big 12 in **passing yards (903)**, **300-yard passing performances (2)** and **passing average per game (301.0)**. He has also been successful in passes over 20-yards, leading P4 quarterbacks in **passing grade (97.9)**, **completions (11)** and **passing yards (392)**.
- The Horned Frogs also have a new offensive play caller in **Gordon Sammis**. For the past two seasons, Sammis ran the offense at UConn, helping the Huskies post consecutive nine-win seasons for the first time in program history while **producing one of the nation's most efficient and explosive offenses**. During that span, UConn achieved the program's first-ever 3,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season.
- Conversely, the defense returns a host of familiar names. Along with defensive coordinator **Andy Avalos**, now in year three, **Jamel Johnson** enjoyed a breakout campaign as a junior, totaling **96 tackles** (second on the team) while posting **five interceptions**. The interception figure for Johnson ranked **first the Big 12** and seventh in the country, while his near triple-digit tackle number was the ninth most in the conference. Up front, **Markis Deal**, **Ansel Din-Mbuh** and **Paul Oyewale** bring a combined 89 games played and 43 starts into the year.

NOTING THE GAME

- In its opening Big 12 contest of the 2026 season, TCU heads to the Acrisure Bounce House to face UCF in the first trip to the Sunshine State for the Horned Frogs since 2003.
- Entering Saturday's game, TCU has won five of its last six Big 12 road openers with three of the last four being double-digit victories for the Frogs.
- This will be the Frogs' first ever trip to UCF and just the second meeting between the two teams all time. With the trip to Orlando, TCU has now played on the road against every member of the current Big 12.
- UCF has just six players on its roster from the state of Texas, with three coming from the DFW Metroplex.

Media INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS: To request credentials, submit a request at GoFrogs.com/FootballMedia. All requests should be made as early as possible and should be limited to working press only. Requests made on game day will not be approved. Credentials are issued to the individual.

MEDIA/SCOUTS WILL CALL AND PARKING: Due to ease of pick up at Amon G. Carter Stadium, credentials are not mailed. Credential pick up is available at the media entrance in the northwest corner of the stadium and begins three hours prior to kick off.

Parking passes will also be delivered digitally to media and scouts to the phone number listed on the credential application. Parking passes will be sent during game week.

MEDIA ELEVATOR: An elevator is available for use throughout the game to allow media to travel between the field level and press box. The elevator may also be held for coaches of either team in the final minutes of each half, and media members are encouraged to use the stairwell if they are physically able to do so.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCE: After a cooling off period and conversation with the team, head coach Sonny Dykes and select players will be available to credentialed media in the Four Sevens Team Meeting Room for home games. Post-game video is available by request.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Credentials for photographers will be issued on the basis of circulation, with priority granted to agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis. Credentials will not be issued to freelance photographers unless they are employed by a reputable publication or the communications office of the participating schools. Credentials are issued to photographers for the purpose of media coverage only, and images of the game may not be used for commercial purposes without the expressed, written permission of TCU Athletics.

SIDELINE AREAS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive without proper equipment will not be granted sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area. This includes during pre-game activities.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS: TCU's locker room is closed at all times.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rule, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their visit (official or unofficial) to campus, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. Contact includes in-person conversations, phone calls, text messages, e-mails, etc. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE: Each Tuesday during the season, with the exception of the first two weeks (Wednesday) and the second bye week (no press conference), head coach Sonny Dykes holds his weekly press conference beginning at 11:30 a.m. Video will be available of the full availability courtesy of TCU Athletics.

PRACTICES: Practices are closed to the media. Media members should submit post-practice interview requests for student-athletes a day prior to the interview.

FORT WORTH, Texas - UCF rallied for a 35-34 victory over TCU in the Big 12 Conference opener for both teams Saturday night in Amon G. Carter Stadium.

The Horned Frogs started fast. TCU scored on its opening three possessions, converting all seven third-down opportunities in the process, to take a 21-7 lead with 10:10 left in the second quarter.

TCU extended its margin to 28-7 on a 50-yard scoring pass from Josh Hoover to Jack Bech just 1:32 into the second half. Bech had a career day with nine receptions for 200 yards.

Hoover tied a personal-best with four touchdown passes, two to Savion Williams, while recording his third career 400-yard game with 402 yards. He completed 35-of-52 attempts.

TCU had a chance to win at the end, taking possession at its 25-yard line with 36 seconds remaining. The Horned Frogs drove to the UCF 40. On the game's final play, Kyle Lemmermann's 58-yard field-goal attempt had the distance but was wide.

TCU special teams played a big role with three blocked kicks. Caleb Fox and LaMareon James blocked field goals with Bud Clark having his hands on an extra-point attempt.

The Indians were held to 86 rushing yards on 43 attempts. Jonathan Adams rushed for 93 yards on 23 carries.

Sonny Dykes, an offensive innovator, Texas native, and National Coach of the Year, was named TCU's head football coach on Nov. 30, 2021.

Since his arrival in Fort Worth, he has overseen one of the most successful stretches in recent program history, leading the Horned Frogs to 36 victories in his first four seasons. That total ranks as the most by a TCU head coach through four years since Francis Schmidt won 37 games from 1929-32.

Under Dykes, TCU has consistently competed near the top of the Big 12 Conference. His 2024 and 2025 teams posted consecutive nine-win seasons for the first time in more than a decade and only the second time since the Horned Frogs joined the Big 12. The program has produced seven All-Americans, 57 All-Big 12 selections, and 13 NFL Draft picks during his tenure while earning two finishes in the Associated Press final top 25 rankings.

Since 2017, TCU has posted four nine-win or better seasons, and Dykes has either served on staff as an analyst or as head coach for all four campaigns. His teams have helped reestablish the Horned Frogs among the Big 12's top programs, combining consistent on-field success with strong player development and NFL Draft production.

Dykes' first season in 2022 quickly became one of the most memorable years in college football. Picked to finish seventh in the Big 12 preseason poll, TCU exceeded expectations by reaching the College Football Playoff and advancing to the CFP National Championship Game. The Horned Frogs became the first program from the state of Texas to qualify for the CFP and the first Big 12 team to play for a national championship in the playoff era.

TCU finished the 2022 season with a 13-2 record, tying a school record for victories. The Horned Frogs completed the regular season undefeated at 12-0 and recorded six wins over ranked opponents, including a victory over No. 2 Michigan in the CFP Semifinal at the Fiesta Bowl. TCU finished No. 2 in the final Associated Press poll, while Dykes became just the third head coach in the CFP era to guide a team to the playoff in his first season.

The remarkable campaign brought widespread national recognition. Dykes received 10 National Coach of the Year awards and was the unanimous Big 12 Coach of the Year. Under his leadership, quarterback Max Duggan won the Davey O'Brien Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award while finishing second in Heisman Trophy voting. Cornerback Tre'Vius Hodges-Tomlinson won the Jim Thorpe Award, return specialist Derius Davis captured the Jet Award, and offensive guard Steve Avila earned Consensus All-America honors.

Dykes is one of just four active FBS head coaches to take four different schools—Louisiana Tech, Cal, SMU, and TCU—to a bowl game. He is also one of a select group of active head coaches to guide a team to the College Football Playoff National Championship Game, highlighting a career marked by success across multiple programs and conferences.

Before returning to TCU, Dykes spent four seasons as head coach at SMU, where he engineered one of the nation's most notable turnarounds. He led the Mustangs to three consecutive winning seasons, a 10-win campaign in 2019, and 19 weeks in the national rankings. Dykes compiled a 30-18 record at SMU and was recognized as a finalist for both the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award and the Paul "Bear" Bryant Award.

His impact at SMU extended beyond offense. In 2019, the Mustangs led the FBS in sacks per game and ranked third nationally in tackles for loss, setting school records with 51 sacks and 111 tackles for loss. Prior to becoming SMU's head coach, Dykes also served as an analyst on TCU's staff, helping the Horned Frogs to an 11-3 record, a Big 12 Championship Game appearance, and a top-10 national finish.

Prior to SMU, Dykes served as head coach at Cal and Louisiana Tech. At Cal, he developed quarterback Jared Goff into the No. 1 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft and guided the Golden Bears to their highest win total since 2009. Under his leadership, Cal's offense set numerous school records and became the first college football team in history to feature six players with at least 40 receptions and three 500-yard rushers in the same season.

At Louisiana Tech, Dykes led the Bulldogs to the 2011 Western Athletic Conference championship and earned WAC Coach of the Year honors. In his final season, Louisiana Tech led the nation in both scoring offense and total offense, further establishing Dykes' reputation as one of college football's premier offensive minds.

Before becoming a head coach, Dykes worked as an assistant in the Pac-12, Big 12, and SEC under Mike Stoops, Mike Leach, and Hal Mumme. A graduate of Texas Tech with a degree in history and a former Red Raiders baseball player, Dykes also teaches a leadership course in TCU's Neeley School of Business.

The son of legendary Texas Tech coach Spike Dykes, he and his wife, Kate, have two daughters, Ally and Charlie, and a son, Daniel.

TIGHT END PRODUCTIVITY

TCU has had a high level of productivity from its tight ends in the past three seasons, and their role is only set to increase under new offensive coordinator Gordon Sammis. The Horned Frogs tight end group last year was in the top three of three major stat categories for the program since 1996.

Under Sammis' guidance last season, UConn's tight ends room ranked in the top 25 of the FBS in receptions (25th), receiving yards (17th) and receiving touchdowns (t-9th).

Against Grambling, the tight end production was evident as Kari Ashley posted 119 yards and two scores. He is one of eight FBS tight ends to have a 100-yard receiving game this season.

TCU currently boasts 25 former players in the NFL across active rosters, practice squads, and injured reserve designations. The newest Frogs to join the NFL ranks from the 2025 squad include: CB Channing Canada (UDFA, New England Patriots) and LB Kaleb Elarms-Orr (4th Round, Buffalo Bills).

TCU enters the 2026 season with 29 players on NFL rosters, the second-most in the Big 12 behind Utah (30), and ahead of Texas Tech (22), Oklahoma State (21), BYU (19), Cincinnati (19) and Iowa State (19).

Cheerleader Chad Schrotel '82 helped our gesture of unity catch on with the crowds in 1980. Appropriately, it's like a peace sign with slightly curled fingers, symbolizing the horns of our tiny, mighty mascot, the horned frog.



» WON'T YOU TAKE ME TO FUNKY TOWN?

Since the 1980s, denizens of Fort Worth have leaned into calling their home **Funky Town**. The nickname stems from the popular 1980s song "Funkytown" by Lipps Inc. and the promotion of the city by the local soul radio station KKDA (K-104) as a place to "get down" and "get funky".

"For awhile, cheerleaders didn't even do it, they thought it was beneath their dignity," according to Young, who cheered for TCU in the 1960s and later served as the squad adviser. "But back in 1975, they let alumni cheerleaders come back, and we kept it alive."

TCU's 2025 recruiting class was No. 1 in the Big 12 by 247Sports.com for the first time in program history. Boasting six four-star and 25 three-star recruits, the class figures to be a high-impact group for years to come.

ALL IN

With the settlement of the House v. NCAA class-action lawsuit, TCU has announced that it will fully participate at the maximum level in the permissible revenue sharing plan with its student-athletes.

THE GIFT

In August 2024, Sonny Dykes and his wife Kate made a \$1 million donation to TCU Athletics which was split between honoring former TCU offensive lineman Jamal Powell with his name in the weight room in the new Mike and Brenda Harrison Football Performance Center as well as recognizing Shirley Enis, late wife of TCU Trustee Hunter Enis, with an endowment in her name to support women's athletics at TCU.

Powell was a three-year letterman (2000-02) for the Horned Frogs, earning First-Team All-Conference USA honors his senior year. He then began a collegiate coaching career with Dykes hiring Powell as his offensive line coach at SMU in 2018. They worked together for three years until Powell's passing in April 2021 at the age of 39.



THE STREAK

STEPPING UP

In defensive coordinator **Andy Avalos'** first season with the Frogs (2024), TCU enjoyed a defensive revival of sorts, allowing 62.7 fewer yards in 2024 than in 2023. It represented the **18th largest margin of improvement** in the country last season and second largest improvement among Big 12 schools (BYU).

It was also the first time since 2020 that TCU posted a top-50 defensive ranking. The success continued in 2025, as TCU posted consecutive seasons holding opponents under 400 yards per game for the first time since the 2019-20 seasons.

THE TURNOVER STORY

In the Sonny Dykes era, TCU is **29-5** when ahead or even in turnover margin and **9-13** when on the negative side.

TCU is also **7-0 when generating three or more turnovers** under Dykes, those games being wins over North Carolina, Colorado, and Baylor in 2025, Oklahoma State and Cincinnati in 2024, and Iowa State (2022) and the 2022 College Football Playoff victory against Michigan.

Since joining the Big 12, TCU is **88-25 when ahead (56-12) or even (32-13)** in turnover margin and **24-44** when on the negative side.

TCU running back Jeremy Payne is remembered best for his heroics to win the Alamo Bowl, however he quietly had a very productive conclusion to the 2025 season.	
Payne finished the year with at least 70 rushing yards and 40 receiving yards in each of his last two games. No other TCU player in the last 30 seasons has recorded back-to-back such outings.	
He also averaged 8.3 yards per carry in the fourth quarter last season, 13th best in the FBS (min. 20 carries) and second best in the Big 12 (ASU's Raleek Brown, 8.5). It was the fifth-best average of any Big 12 player since 2020.	
Picking up right where he left off, the running back had 25 rushes and five receptions for 169 total scrimmage yards against UNC. He is the first Big 12 player to ever record at least 25 rushes, five receptions and 150 scrimmage yards in a season opener.

MAKING THE JUMP

Quarterbacks like **Jaden Craig** to have dominant FCS campaigns and then move to an FBS program the following season have fared well over the past 30 years.

There have been five quarterbacks, including Craig, to post 25-plus passing touchdowns and a 150.0-or-better quarterback rating at their FCS school who then moved up to the FBS.

These four players combined to average a 66.2 completion percentage, 2580 pass yards, 21 passing touchdowns and a 149.3 QB rating in the first year after the FCS to FBS transition. Sanders, Ward, and Adams Jr. all finished within the Top 35 in FBS in passing touchdowns that first season.

SAMMIS SIDENOTES

UConn's offense saw an impressive uptick in production following Gordon Sammis' arrival in Storrs, running the offensive line his first two seasons (2022-23) and coordinating the offense in his final two (2024-25). TCU will look for a similar transition here in Fort Worth.

» Since 2022, among schools with at least 1,500 pass attempts, the Huskies' 60 sacks allowed were the second fewest behind Oregon (50).

» Was one of six FBS teams to allow no more than 20 sacks in any of the last four seasons (Air Force, Army, BYU, Kansas, Northern Illinois)

» One of only seven FBS teams to have 1000+ more passing yards last season than in 2024. One of only two schools to do it with the same quarterback - along with Vanderbilt and Diego Pavia.

The success relating to big plays was not limited to the offense, as TCU's defense did a very good job last season preventing explosive runs. The Horned Frogs **allowed just 3.0 percent of runs** to go for 15-plus yards, which was the fourth-fewest in the FBS behind Georgia, Notre Dame and Texas Tech.

AMON G. CARTER STADIUM

Capacity: 46,000

The 2012 season opener against Grambling State marked the re-opening of TCU's Amon G. Carter Stadium after a \$164 million rebuild to the site completely funded through donor support.

On Aug. 16, 2010, TCU announced an initial \$105 million renovation of the west side and north end zone of Amon G. Carter Stadium to better enhance the football fan experience, upgrade amenities and transform the historic Fort Worth icon into the "Camden Yards" of collegiate football stadiums. With the addition of the east side renovation one year later, the total cost of the project rose to \$164 million.

Construction began immediately following TCU's final 2010 home game versus San Diego State on Nov. 13, 2010. The historic south tower structure was first removed prior to the implosion of the iconic west side upper deck of the stadium during the morning of Dec. 5, 2010. Following construction, Amon G. Carter Stadium's seating capacity stood at 45,000.

TCU began examining the possibility of renovating its football stadium in 2006 when Luther King, chairman of TCU's Board of Trustees, appointed Clarence Scharbauer, vice chair of the board, to lead a stadium renovation committee. The committee's invaluable work, along with that of TCU administrators, led to a stadium renovation that lifted the historical icon to a level of national visibility on par with the University's championship-winning football team.

It was the first major renovation to Amon G. Carter Stadium, built in 1930, since the upper deck was added in 1956.

2026 RULE CHANGES

Each offseason, college football's rules and regulations are reviewed. The below are three changes that will be in place for the 2026 season.

Fair Catch Kick

The Fair Catch Kick will now allow a receiving team to attempt an uncontested field goal after making a fair catch on an opponent's kick. The head coach must select the Fair Catch Kick before the ball is ready for play, and the decision cannot be changed. The kick will be taken from the spot of the fair catch, with the opposing team lined up 10 yards away. If the kick goes through the uprights, three points will be awarded. If the fair catch occurs as time expires, the team may still attempt the kick as an untimed down.

Targeting Penalties

All targeting fouls that are upheld will include a disqualification for the current game, but the rule will now eliminate the carryover disqualification for fouls in the second half. If a player receives a second targeting foul within the same season, that player is disqualified for the remainder of that game and the first half of the team's next scheduled game within that season. If a player receives a third or subsequent targeting foul within the same season, disqualification for the remainder of the game and that player will receive an automatic one-game suspension in their team's next scheduled game of that season.

Offensive Pass Interference

The penalty for offensive pass interference is being adjusted from 15 yards to 10 yards. The rules reserve 15-yard penalties primarily for Personal Fouls and Unsportsmanlike Conduct. Defensive pass interference will remain a spot foul, with a maximum of a 15-yard penalty.

Unsportsmanlike Conduct Rule

The Unsportsmanlike Conduct rule is being adjusted to give officials more flexibility while continuing to penalize actions that interfere with game administration, taunt opponents, or are abusive, threatening, or demeaning to the game. The list of automatic unsportsmanlike conduct fouls will be reduced to five actions that will be consistently penalized, including gun-violence gestures, throat-slashing or nose-wipe signals, removing a helmet after the ball is dead (with exceptions), dead-ball contact fouls that are unrelated to the game action, and forcibly pushing or pulling an opponent off a pile after the ball is dead.

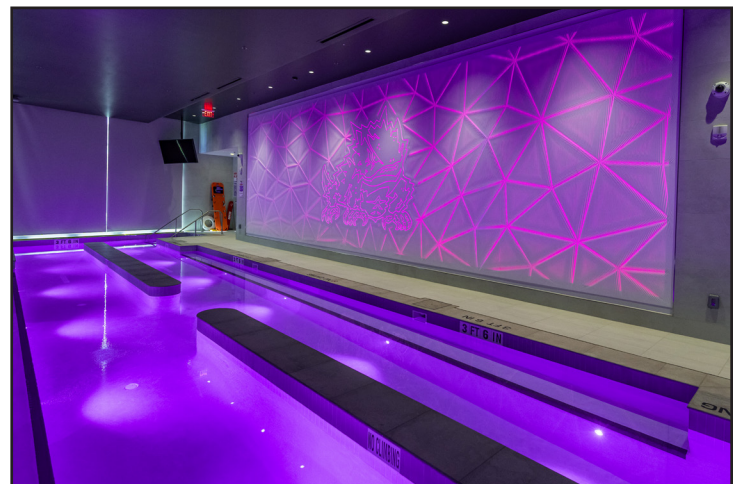

FORT WORTH – In the final matchup before Big 12 play, TCU pulled away in the second half en route to a 31-7 win in front of a soldout crowd at Amon G. Carter Stadium on Saturday night.

Jaden Craig was consistent once again, going 21-of-29 for 337 yards and three scores. His favorite target was Ed Small, who had a career-high 164 yards and a score. Kari Ashley also had a productive day, getting 87 yards on five receptions.

On the ground, Jeremy Payne led the way with 86 yards on 24 carries. Joe Pitchford added 26 rushing yards.

The Horned Frogs played defense by committee on Saturday, with Jamel Johnson, Hudson Hooper and Ansel Din-Mbuh all posting seven tackles.

After stopping the Red Wolves on their first possession, TCU marched right down the field to score on its opening possession once again to take a 7-0 lead.

From there, the offenses became stagnant, and the scoreboard wouldn't see action until late in the second quarter when a couple of big plays to Small extended the home-team lead to two touchdowns.

Arkansas State's offense was able to make some noise for the first time all game right after the two-minute warning, utilizing a pair of big pass plays to make the score 14-7 at the half.

Following a goal line stand, TCU embarked on a 99-yard drive that ate up eight minutes of game time to extend the lead back up to two scores.

Following the score, TCU was able to seize control of the game and run out the clock while adding some scores.

- The Horned Frogs have scored on the opening possession in every game this season.
- A 99-yard scoring drive in the third quarter is the first 99-yard TD drive for the Frogs since they did so against Kansas in 2021.
- TCU has allowed just 29 points through three games, the lowest opponent point total in the first three games since 2014 (21 points).

- Jaden Craig posted his second consecutive 300-yard passing game, going 21-29 for 337 yards and three scores.
- Koron Hayward posted a sack for the second straight game.
- Hudson Hooper had a career-high seven tackles, the first time he has led TCU in tackles.
- Nate McCashland made his first field goal attempt of the season, a 29-yarder, in the fourth quarter.
- Jeremy Payne scored his first touchdown of the season by way of a three-yard rush in the first quarter.
- Ka'Morreun Pimpton Found the end zone for the second straight game and the second time this season thanks to a nine-yard pass from Craig.
- Ed Small had 164 yards receiving, which is a career high. The mark is the most since Eric McAlister had 254 against SMU last season.game.
