SEASON RECAP

Queen's started the season off with fantastic results at the Hugh Munby Invitational Tournament. Team members won Gold and Bronze in Men's Epee; Silver in Women's Epee and Men's Foil; Silver and Bronze in Women's Foil; and Bronze in Women's Sabre. At the RMC Invitational, Queen's earned Silver in Men's Epee and a Bronze medal in Women's Foil. At Brock, rookie Emily Mason won a Silver in Junior Women's Epee. Women's Foil and Women's Sabre both earned Bronze medals at the Carleton Team Invitational in January.

At the Women's OUA Championships held at Brock, Queen's finished 7th overall. Facing tough competition in the individual events Queen's had six top 16 finishes. They rallied for the team events on the second day with all three teams finishing 5th.

The Men's team finished 5th overall at the Men's OUA Championship held by Toronto. The Men's Epee team won Silver, and Spencer McGregor came 4th overall in the individual Epee event and placed 3rd in the OUA Championship All-Star rankings for Epee. The Sabre team finished 8th, and the Foil team placed 12th. Coach Rodney Carter was presented with the Christian Vidosa Trophy for Coach of the Year.

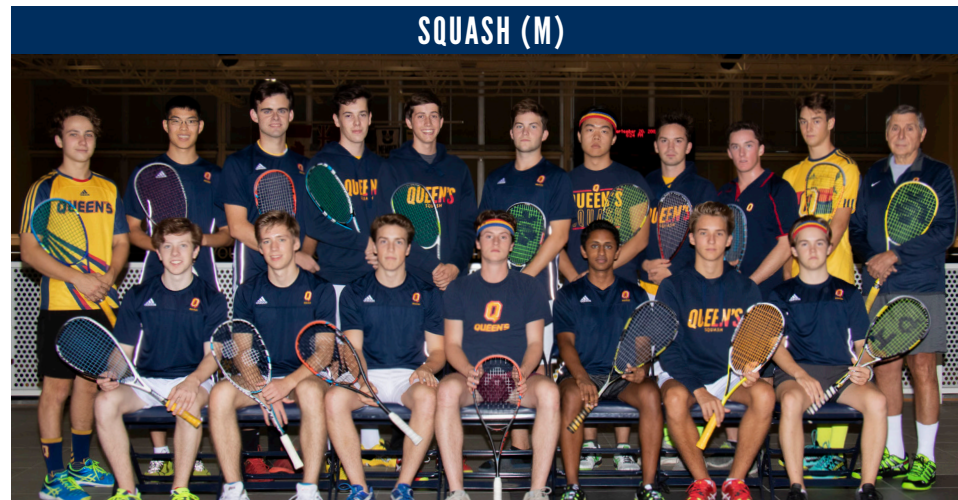

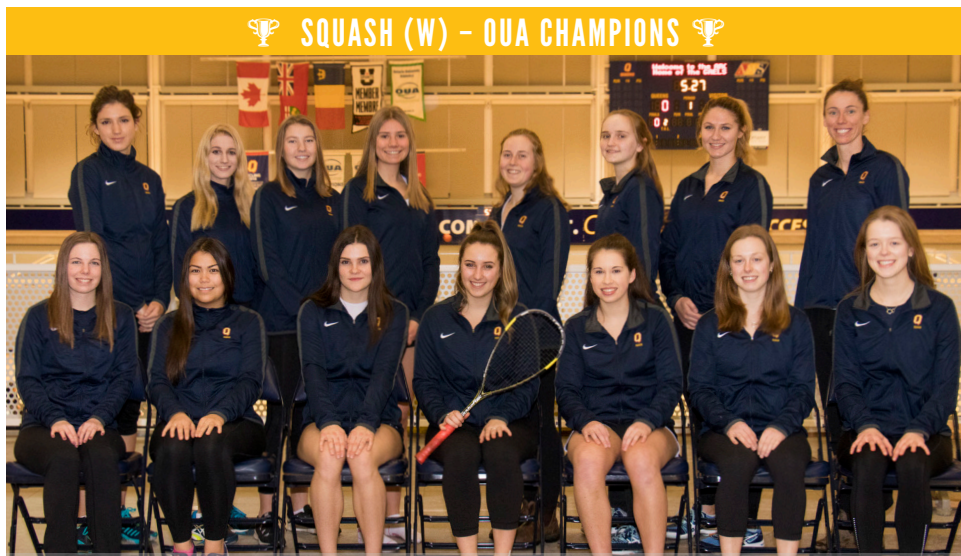

SEASON RECAP

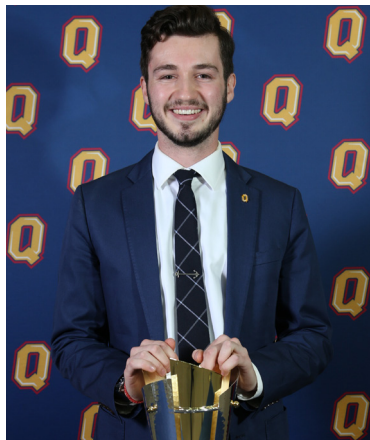
