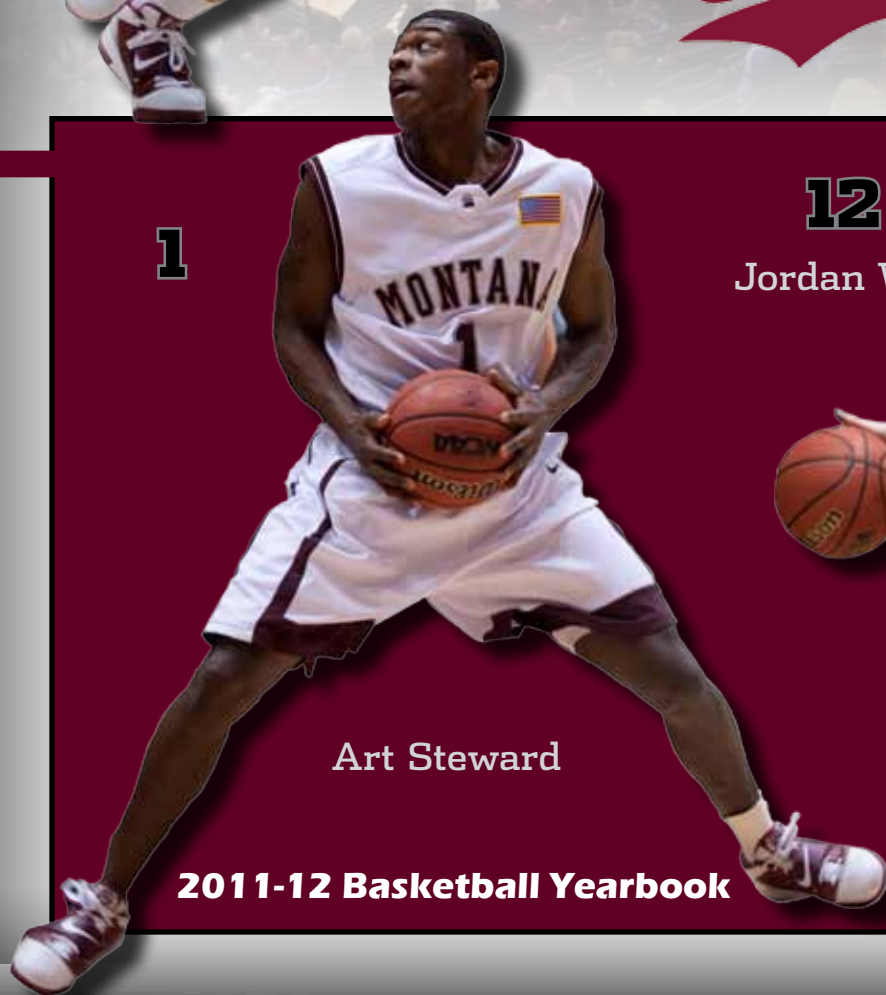

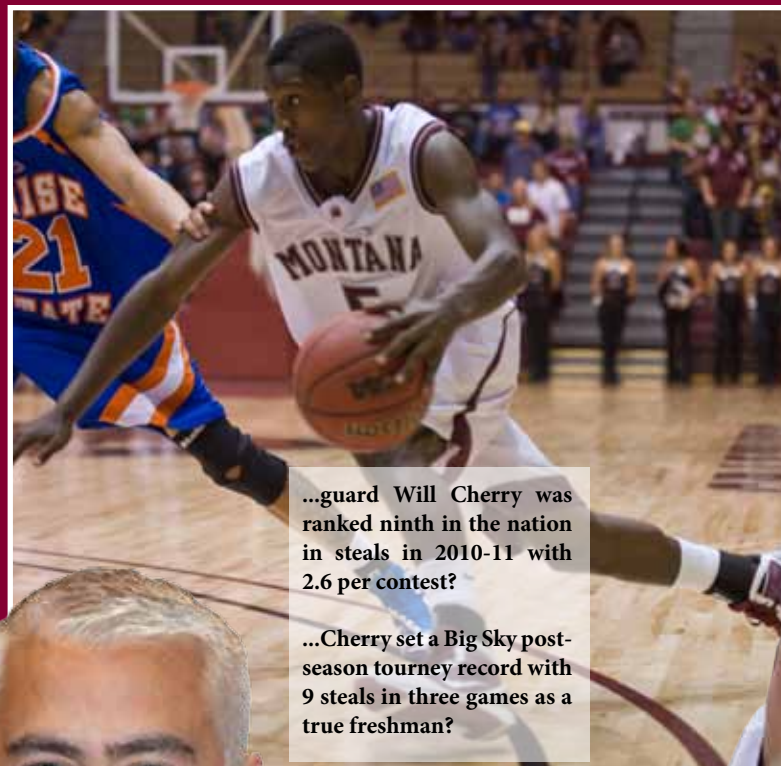

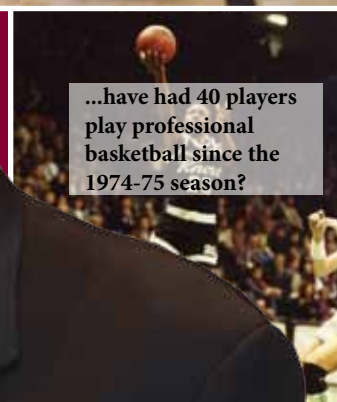

Did you know that...

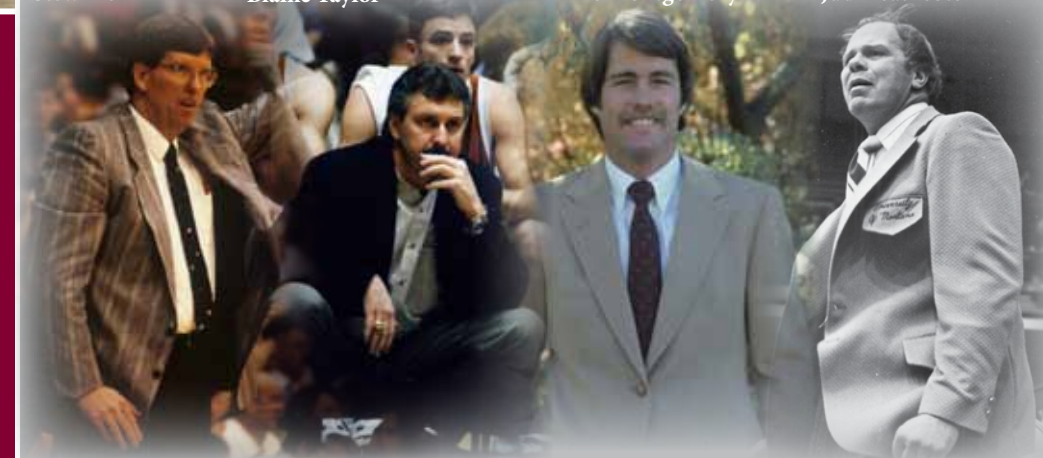

ADAMS CENTER – DAHLBERG ARENA



First opened in 1953 as the Harry Adams Field House and named after famed atheletic director, head track and field coach, and assistant football coach, the field house had a two-year renovation in 1999, opening as the Adams Events Center.

Along with being the home of The University of Montana Athletic Department, the Adams Center also hosts concerts with such famous acts as Elton John, Sting, Bob Dylan, James Taylor, and Wilco; the University and local high school graduations; trade shows, among other activities.

Dahlberg Arena, the home of the Griz and Lady Griz, has a capacity of 7,321.

Along with an expansion of facilities, concessions and rest rooms, theater style seating was added. Two new practice gyms (WAG and EAG) were added to the venue along with a 7,000 square foot weight room, 4,500 square foot athletic treatment center, academic center and meeting rooms.

The women's locker room was expanded along with the equipment room. In 2004 a wide screen Griz Vision TV was added on the north end of the arena and a central scoreboard was added above the floor.

The University of Montana also replaced its portable sports floor with a new permanent state of the art maple sports floor. The new floor is 15,000 square feet. The floor is called the FOCUS and is manufactured by Connor Sports Floors and was installed by Northern Hardwood of Deer Park, Wash. The floor is a fixed resilient sectional channel system with a plywood panel subfloor and a continuous recessed lineal padding, featuring Nike grind material.

The floor is 2001 DIN compliant, which means it meets or exceeds all athletic performance qualities as measured by DIN. DIN testing measures the floors performance in four specific categories:

- Ball rebound: Measures the basketball's response off the sports floor system as compared to the ball's response of concrete (Fast play and quick response).
- Shock Absorption: Measures the flooring system's ability to absorb impact forces normally absorbed by the athlete when landing on a hard surface (User friendly and comfortable).
- Vertical Deflection: Measures the floor system's downward movement during the impact of an athlete landing on the surface (user friendly and comfortable).
- Area Deflection: Measures the floor system's ability to contain the deflected area under an athlete's impact, measured within 20" of the impacted area (Insures resilience for all athletes).
- DIN and DIN 2001 what is the difference? For DIN compliance an Average of all test points must comply with DIN levels. For DIN 2001 compliance ALL test points must comply, guaranteeing uniformity of the flooring system.

WAYNE TINKLE - HEAD COACH

Wayne at a glance: Wayne Tinkle has an overall record of 91-64 (.587) and is 51-29 (.638) in the Big Sky, and has now won 20 or more games the past two seasons in a row.

Wayne Tinkle has an overall record of 91-64 (.587) and is 51-29 (.638) in the Big Sky, and has now won 20 or more games the past two seasons in a row.

“Tinks” is ranked fifth in school history at his alma mater with his 91 victories.

This past season Tinkle guided Montana to a 21-11 record. In 2009-10 and the Griz received a berth in the College Basketball Invitational (BCI) Tournament.

Two seasons ago, the Griz went 22-10, won the league’s post-season tourney, and advanced to their eighth NCAA tournament in history a year ago, losing 62-57 to New Mexico.

Montana now has 15 20-win seasons in school history, and four in the past 15 seasons. Just eight Griz teams have won 22 games or more in a season.

The 2009-10 NCAA tournament berth was the fourth for Coach Tinkle. He has been to the tournament three times as an assistant coach at UM and one time as the head mentor. His NCAA trips came in 2001-02 against Oregon with head coach Don Holst; in 2004-05 vs. Washington and 2005-06 (against Nevada and Boston College) with head man Larry Krystkowiak; and again this past season as the head man against New Mexico.

Tinkle, 41, was named the 26th head coach at Montana in the summer of 2006. He served as an assistant coach at UM for the previous five seasons, working with Krystkowiak for two seasons, two years with Pat Kennedy (2002-04), and one with Holst.

He was a standout forward for the Griz from 1985-89 and a three-time All-Big Sky pick his sophomore, junior and senior seasons.

He is ranked fourth in UM history in career rebounds with 836 and sixth in career points with 1,500, and is ranked among the Big Sky’s career leaders in both of those categories.

He was Montana’s Carl Dragstedt Award (MVP) winner in 1988 and 1989. He led the team in rebounding in 1987 (8.9 average), 1988 (8.4 average), and 1989 (8.7 avg.), and in scoring in 1988 (16.2 ppg) and 1989 (17.1 ppg).

He played in the professional ranks for 12 seasons, from 1990 to 2001. He played in the Continental Basketball League in Topeka, Kansas, and finished the year playing in Venezuela. In his professional career he played in the CBA and in Sweden, Spain, Italy and Greece. He played his final four seasons in Spain from 1995-99, where he ranked among the league’s top scorers and rebounders.

Wayne was born in Milwaukee, Wis., and is the youngest of 11 children (seven girls and four boys). He is a 1984 graduate of Ferris High School in Spokane, Wash. He received his degree in health and human performance from UM in 2005.

He married former Lady Griz basketball star Lisa McLeod. Wayne and Lisa have three children: daughters Joslyn and Elleson, and son Tres. Joslyn currently plays basketball at Stanford University.

BILL EVANS - ASSISTANT COACH

Bill at a glance: Bill is a veteran, well-respected coach, who is now in his fourth season at The University of Montana.

Bill is a veteran, well-respected coach, who is now in his fourth season at The University of Montana as an assistant coach.

He has been in the coaching ranks for 33 years. Before joining Wayne Tinkle's Grizzly basketball program he was the head coach at his alma mater, Southern Utah University. He was the head man for the Thunderbirds for 15 seasons from 1992 to 2007.

He was an assistant coach at Southern Utah from 1990-92 before being elevated to the head job.

His 209 career victories at Southern Utah are the most in school history. He was named the coach of the year four times during his tenure there. He guided the Thunderbirds to their first ever NCAA tournament berth in 2001, a 67-64 setback to ninth-ranked Boston College and had a record of 25-6 that season. He coached 27 all-conference players during his tenure at SUU.

Prior to coaching at SUU, he had stints at the University of Alaska-Anchorage (1986-90); an assistant at SUU (1985-86); at Idaho State (a graduate assistant from 1984-85); and a was a volunteer assistant coach at Southern Utah State College in the 1983-84 season.

Evans began his coaching career as the head mentor at Port Sulphur High School in New Orleans, from 1977-83, and had a six-year record of 112-47 there.

He earned his B.A. degree in physical education at Southern Utah in 1972. He received his master's degree in athletic administration from Idaho State in 1985.

Bill and his wife, Sunny, have five children: Quentin, Dave, Tori, Trajan, and Kansas.



FREDDIE OWENS - ASSISTANT COACH

Freddie at a glance: A former basketball standout at Wisconsin, Freddie Owens is now in his third year as an assistant coach at The University of Montana.

A former basketball standout at Wisconsin, Freddie Owens is now in his third year as an assistant coach at The University of Montana.

Prior to joining the Grizzly staff, Owens, 28, was a graduate assistant coach for the Iowa State Cyclones from 2008-09, handling film exchange, various administrative duties, and assisting in scouting.

Prior to his stint at ISU, Owens was an assistant coach at Adams State College in Alamosa, Colo., where he assisted in game day preparation, scouting, and film editing.

He played professionally in Latvia in 2005-06 and was an AAU coach for a season before joining the Adams State Grizzlies' coaching staff in 2007-08. The Grizzlies went 18-10, recording their most wins since joining the Division II ranks (1992-93) in his only season there.

A native of Milwaukee, Wis., Owens was a starter for head coach Bo Ryan and the Badgers in 2003 and 2004 and the "sixth man" as a sophomore. He scored 796 points in his four-year career (2001-04).

A 6-2 guard, Freddie was on two Big Ten regular-season championship teams (2002, 2003) and one Big Ten Tournament championship squad (2004). Wisconsin qualified for NCAA Tournament play in all four of his seasons in Madison, including a Sweet Sixteen appearance as a junior in 2003 when Owens nailed a buzzer-beating 3-pointer to defeat Tulsa.

He earned a degree in life sciences and communications from Wisconsin in 2005. Freddie is married to the former Carmen Gust. His dad is Lawrence Owens Sr. of Milwaukee.



JONATHON METZGER-JONES - ASSISTANT COACH

Jonathan Metzger-Jones is in his first season as a Grizzly basketball assistant coach.

Jonathan (he goes by Jono, which is pronounced jon-oh) Metzger-Jones is in his first season as a Grizzly basketball assistant coach.

Metzger-Jones was recently at UC Santa Barbara, where he worked for the past four seasons.

He was an assistant coach for three of those seasons with the Gauchos and served as the program's Director of Operations in his initial year in 2007-08.

While at UCSB, his duties included all aspects of on-court coaching (working with back-court players), recruiting, and scouting. His responsibilities with the Grizzlies will be the same, and he will also assist with the logistics surrounding basketball camps and other team community-oriented functions. UCSB has made back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2010 and 2011.

Prior to his stint at UCSB, Metzger-Jones spent one year as the Director of Operations at Cal State Fullerton. He played for head coach Bob Burton (now the head coach at Fullerton) at West Valley College in Saratoga, Calif., from 1997-2000. In his final season at West Valley, he was the team's Most Valuable Player and team captain.

Metzger-Jones continued his collegiate career at the University of Pacific in Stockton, Calif. He finished his career ranked among the Tigers' top-10 all-time three-point shooters.

Following his career at Pacific, Metzger-Jones played professionally in Italy, Switzerland, Denmark, and Finland. From 2000-07 he served as a Site Director/Counselor for the Golden State Warriors Youth Basketball Camps.

He graduated from Pacific in 2002 with a B.S. degree in business administration. A native of Oakland, Calif., he graduated from Bishop O'Dowd High School. Jono married Alison Keck of Pullman, Wash. last June.

Griz Return Four Starters

2011-12 UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

MISSOULA, MONTANA – Sixth-year head coach Wayne Tinkle’s University of Montana basketball team returns four starters from a 21-win team, and the goal for the 2011-12 season is to once again reach that 20-win plateau and advanced to the NCAA tournament.

Those goals are the same for every Division 1 team of course, but the Griz have had back-to-back 20-plus win seasons, and just missed another NCAA berth last season after playing in it the previous year.

Last year the Grizzlies finished 21-11 overall and second in the Big Sky Conference with a 12-4 record. Montana beat Weber State 57-40 in the semi-finals of the league’s postseason tournament, and narrowly lost to host Northern Colorado, 65-60, and a win would have propelled them to their second NCAA tourney berth in a row.

Two seasons ago Montana won three consecutive games in the Big Sky’s postseason tournament, including an improbable, 20-point come-from-behind victory (66-65) over host Weber State. The Griz then played well against New Mexico in an NCAA first-round game, losing 62-57.

“We really like the direction we’ve gone the last few years,” Tinkle said. “We’ve got the kind of players we think who will buy in to the way we want to play. They are all great character guys. That’s why the two biggest compliments that we get from our opponents is how hard we play and what great chemistry our guys have. That’s a credit to them.

“Moving forward, we want to be getting to the postseason year-in and year-out,” Tinkle said. “We’ve were close the last two seasons, and

ultimately want to get to the ‘Big Dance.’ I think some late injuries took some of our momentum. That’s all part of it and every team has to deal with that. What I like this year is we’ve got some guys who can really help us depth-wise, which we did not really have a year ago.”

Coach Tinkle and his staff of Bill Evans, Freddie Owens, and Jono Metzger-Jones have a solid nucleus returning, including four starters and a total of eight lettermen.

Montana has six players back who started at least 15 games last season. Leading the way are 6-1 junior guard Will Cherry (30 starts) and 7-foot senior center-forward Derek Selvig (32 starts), two of Montana’s three double-figure scorers last season at 14.1 and 10.1 points a game, respectively. Will was a first team all-conference selection, while Derek was an honorable mention pick.

“We’ve got a lot back and we are excited about that, and our returners have improved over the off-season,” Tinkle said. “We’ve got some good experience there and some scorers, and we’ve added some shooters.”

Other starters back, are 6-4 senior forward Art Steward (18 starts), 6-5 sophomore guard-forward Kareem Jamar, and senior guards Shawn Stockton (15 starts) and Jordan Wood (16 starts).

Last season Steward was fourth on the team in scoring (8.6 ppg), while Jamar was fifth (8.1 ppg).

“This year we have the potential to be more perimeter-oriented,” Tinkle said. “Will is shooting the ball better, and Kareem’s really shooting the ball well, and Jordan Wood worked his tail off in the off-season, and he knows we need him to shoot better. Shawn Stockton as well. Then you add the three new kids in the mix – they are all comfortable shooting the ball from behind the arc.

“That’s definitely, I think, going to be a strength, but we can’t hang our hat there,” Tinkle said. “We still have to have that tradition of Montana basketball, and the balance from inside and out. We just might have to go about it a little differently. Derek had an incredible off-season and will have to show great maturity as a senior leader for us to be successful.”

Junior Mathias Ward, a 6-7 forward, is a major contributor off the bench, was sixth on the team in scoring (4.5 ppg) a year ago, and has played in 62 career games.

“I am really excited about our six or seven guys,” Tinkle said. “Some of those guys really made progress in the off-season. I think our returning depth along with our recruiting class, and the development of those players over the off-season are really going to pay dividends. The obvious concern is that we don’t have that real presence down around the basket defensively or offensively, for that matter.

“It’s going to be a work in progress,” Tinkle said. “We really like what we have back along with the newcomers, but when you throw a really challenging schedule in there, it’s going to take some time to develop this group.”

Sophomore center Eric Hutchison (6-9), and redshirt freshmen Billy Reader (6-9 center) and Mike Weisner (6-7 forward) also return.

Coach Tinkle signed an impressive trio of players from the high school ranks in guards (6-2) Keron DeShields (Vermont Academy) and (6-2) Jordan Gregory (Pueblo East High School, Colo.), and (6-5) guard-forward Kevin Henderson (Auburn HS, Wash.). Also three of those prep signees averaged 20 or more points a game in high school their senior seasons.

“We thought that was a key, bringing in some players with some offensive fire-power,” Tinkle said. “All three of them are perimeter players. When we looked at our senior class this year, with Stockton, Wood, and Steward, and they all play primarily on the outside. We feel that when those players get used to our system and style of play here at the Division 1 level, they will really contribute on both ends.”

UM also has a pair of walk-ons on the team in 6-0 guard Morgan Young (Lustre HS, Mont.) and 6-5 forward Nick Emerson (Columbia Falls HS,

Mont.).

Montana has a huge void to fill with the graduation of record-setting center Brian Qvale. Qvale not only set Big Sky records in career blocks (247) and single-season rejections (95), but he was also named first team all-league and was tabbed the conference “Defensive Player of the Year.”

“We are certainly going to miss Brian on both ends of the floor,” Tinkle said. “The complexion of our team is going to change. We don’t have that human fly-swatter in there protecting the goal and the bull on the offensive end. We may have to do things differently. We’re going to keep our defensive fundamentals the same,” Tinkle said; “but we’re going to have to be a little more active to make up for that lack of size inside.”

“I think by committee we can maybe replace the statistics that Brian had, but the presence is something different all together,” Tinkle said. “‘Hutch’ is a guy who can run the floor and rebounds but not really polished offensively. Billy is pretty skilled down there between the blocks, but he’s lacking a little maturity and experience. We might move Derek to the center spot and pull him away from the basket. He’s really poised to have a big senior season and we’ll need that night-in and night-out to reach our potential.”

GUARD

Cherry is explosive on offense and also an outstanding defensive player. He not only averaged more than 14 points a game, but he led the Big Sky

and was ranked ninth in the nation in steals with 2.6 a game. He was third in the league in assists with 4.3 a game. He also dramatically improved his free throw shooting at 72.9% and made a team-high 121 charity shots. Two seasons ago he shot 54.7% from the line.

Cherry was a first team All-Big Sky pick last season, and named Montana’s “Defensive Player of the Year” as a freshman and sophomore. He started as a true freshman and has started in 51 games the past two seasons.

Stockton is a steady player and the one or two spot, who started at two guard the last half of the season a year ago and missed the last two games due to an injury. Wood started at two guard the first 16 games of the year, but struggled from the perimeter the line, and lost his starting job.

Wood and Stockton were seventh and eighth in scoring for the Griz last season, averaging 3.3 and 3.2 points per game, respectively.

Steward had a very solid season as a first-year player from the junior college ranks. Not only was he one of the team’s leading scorers, but he was ranked sixth in the conference in field goal percentage (49.5%, 92-of-200) and was tied for fourth (with Cherry) in rebounds at 3.6 a game.

Jamar had an outstanding season as a true freshman, and can play the two-guard position, as well as the three. He was fifth on the team in scoring at 8.1 points a game, and third in rebounding (4.8 pg).

Going into the season, Coach Tinkle said that prep newcomers DeShields, Gregory, and Henderson may all play roles in the backcourt this season.

FORWARD

Selvig was one of two players (Qvale was the other) who started all 32 games last season. He was second on the team in rebounding at 5.2 a game, and third in scoring. The 7-footer led the team in three-pointers made a year ago, making 39-of-100. He was eighth in the Big Sky in assists (3.0 apg) and 12th in three-point percentage (39.0%).

Ward is a work-horse and valuable contributor at the four position. Last year he was sixth on the squad in scoring (4.5 ppg), shot 51.4% (54-of-105) from the field and 81.0% (34-of-42) from the line. He has played in 62 games the past two seasons.

Jamar and Steward are both threats from three-point range, but because of their strength and savvy, both can contribute at the three and four spots, as well as at the big guard position. Jamar was sorely missed mid-way through the season when he was out of action in five games because of an injury.

“You put those two guys at 6-4 out on the wing, you’re pretty athletic and pretty big and strong,” Tinkle said. “You add in there that we can throw Shawn or Jordan into that line-up any time. Art is mister everything. His leadership down the stretch last year was crucial for us. Derek can play out there as well because he can shoot and passes the ball so well.”



Weisner, at 6-7, 195, is more of a three man than a four at this point, and may contribute off the bench.

Henderson, a lefty like Weisner, may see action as a true freshman. He is a definite threat from three-point range and averaged 22.0 points a game last season in high school.

CENTER

Obviously Qvale is a big loss for Montana. Not only was he a prolific defensive player, but he was also one of the most efficient scorers in the nation, finishing second in the country in field goal percentage at 62.6% (189-of-302).

He was the major reason that the Grizzlies were ranked (336 teams are ranked) 20th in Division 1 in scoring defense (allowing 60.9 ppg), 21st in field goal percentage defense (39.9%), 36th in blocked shots (4.8 pg), and 44th in field goal percentage (46.2%).

Selvig will more-than-likely have to become more of an inside-outside player to fill the void in the middle, but don't look for him to for-go the three-pointer too.

Hutchison will be looked upon to see action at center, and should help there, especially defensively. Reader saw action early a year ago and showed potential as a true freshman, but was injured and he eventually petitioned for, and was granted a medical hardship/redshirt year.

"Billy's got a good wing span and can get off the ground and 'Hutch' is very athletic, and somebody always steps up," Tinkle said. "Those guys had a good off-season, and they know now there's a sense of urgency. BQ is not there and they are going to be called upon.

"Mathias is a guy against certain teams who can play the five, and Derek can move over and play the five, so I don't think we're skinny there, we're just a little unproven in those two young guys in Hutchison and Reader."

With their returning veterans and new additions, the Grizzlies should have the capability to go with a three-guard line-up.

THE NON-LEAGUE SCHEDULE

"Our non-league schedule may not exactly jump out at you like we're playing a bunch of ranked teams, but I think if you look at the RPI of those teams from last year and what they have coming back, it's very, very challenging," Tinkle said. "We've got 15 home games and some quality teams coming in.

"San Francisco had a great year in the WCC," Tinkle said. "Nevada has really built something back again. Long Beach State has everybody returning, and that's a team that spanked us a bit in Bracketbuster last year.

"We also have some challenging road games in our non-conference schedule," Tinkle said. "I really like challenging our guys in the preseason. I think it's crucial to play that kind of schedule. If you can get your guys confident through some highs and some lows, then it really helps you build that momentum for conference play, and especially for the conference tournament in March."

THE BIG SKY SCHEDULE

"There is more and more talent in the league every year," Tinkle said. "There's some talented teams in the Big Sky right now. I've spent some time recruiting driving around with (assistant coach Bill) Coach Evans and we went down the line.

"Portland State is going to have one of the most talented teams in the league, and Eastern has a lot of their guys back, and they are both going to be dangerous," Tinkle said. "NAU lost some key guys, but coach (Mike) Adras always puts a good team together. Montana State has six new junior college players who are highly touted. Teams are really adding a lot of talent to their programs.

"Weber is probably going to be picked to win it (which they were recently) because they've got so many pieces back, with (junior guard Damian) Lillard being the big key, and Randy (Rahe) is a great coach. It's a tough, tough league. We're certainly going to prepare our best, and if we can keep progressing, we will be right in the thick of things.

Big Sky Conference



The Big Sky Conference enters its 49th year of athletic competition in 2011-12. The Big Sky is an NCAA Division I member in all sports, with member institutions classified in the Football Championship Sub-division (formally I-AA). The Big Sky returned to a nine-team format in 2006 with the addition of Northern Colorado.

The current lineup includes Eastern Washington, Idaho State, Montana, Montana State, Northern Arizona, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State and Weber State. The league has become one of the strongest Division I conferences in the West and is a national leader in the Football Championship Subdivision.

The Big Sky Conference was established in 1963 by six charter members - Idaho, Idaho State, Gonzaga, Montana, Montana State and Weber State. Those six schools formed the foundation of the Big Sky before the league expanded in 1970 by adding Boise State and Northern Arizona. Gonzaga left the Sky in 1979 and was replaced by Nevada, which gave the league eight members. The conference grew to nine schools in 1987 with the addition of Eastern Washington.

The 1990s saw change in the makeup of the league, beginning in 1992 when Nevada departed and put the Big Sky back at eight teams. In 1996 Boise State and Idaho left and at the same time the conference added Portland State, Sacramento State and Cal State Northridge. The Big Sky maintained nine teams for five years before Cal State Northridge departed in the spring of 2001.

With the addition of Northern Colorado in 2006, the Big Sky spreads across eight states spanning from the Pacific Ocean to the Rocky Mountain Front. The Big Sky is represented along the entire west coast with schools in Washington, Oregon and California. League schools also range up and down the Rocky Mountains with institutions in Montana, Idaho, Utah, Arizona, Colorado, and soon North Dakota.

On Nov. 1, 2010, the big Sky announced that North Dakota and Southern Utah will officially join the conference on July 1, 2012. The league also recently added Cal Poly and UC Davis as football-only members.

On Feb 25, 1963, the name Big Sky was adopted by the six presidents of the charter members as the name of the new conference. The name Big Sky originated in a novel written by the late A.B. (Bud) Guthrie of Great Falls, Mont., in 1947 entitled "The Big Sky." Jack Hollowell, a former Montana advertising director, promoted the Big Sky theme for the Treasure State. While on a track and field trip from Pocatello, Idaho, to Missoula, Mont., the legendary Dubby Holt of Idaho State saw a "Welcome to Big Sky Country" sign as his team entered Montana. Holt, and his athletes thought "Big Sky" would be a perfect name for the new conference. Harry Missildine of the Spokane Spokesman-Review called for the newly formed league to be named the Big Sky Conference in his column dated Feb. 20, 1963.

The Big Sky sponsors championships in 14 sports, including men's and women's cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field, basketball and tennis. In addition, there are also championships in football, and women's volleyball, golf and soccer.

The 2011-12 season will mark the 24th year that the Big Sky Conference will sponsor championships in women's sports. The former Mountain West Conference existed from 1982-88, sponsoring championships for women's sports at the same institutions the Big Sky had men's programs. The Big Sky merged with the Mountain West in 1988, forming one league for both men and women.

Doug Fullerton, the fifth commissioner of the Big Sky Conference, will enter his 17th year at the helm. Fullerton took over the Big Sky on July 1, 1995, replacing longtime commissioner Ron Stephenson. Stephenson served the league for 14 years. Steve Belko was the commissioner from 1977-81 while John Roning held the post from 1971-77. The first league commissioner was Jack Friel, who served from 1963-71.

2010-11 Season in Review: Around the Sky

Northern Colorado's Devon Beitzel and Montana's Brian Qvale were named to the United States' Basketball Writers District VIII team last week. District VIII consists of players from Wyoming, Utah, Idaho, New Mexico, Colorado, Nevada and Montana. Colorado's Alec Burks and Cory Higgins, Utah's Will Clyburn, BYU's Jackson Emery and Jimmer Fredette, Colorado State's Andy Ogide and Utah State's Tai Wesley joined Beitzel and Qvale on the team.

Qvale Sets Tournament Blocks Record: Montana's Brian Qvale set the career mark for blocks in the Big Sky Tournament. Qvale recorded five blocks in two tournament games. He broke the previous record of 18 set by Montana's Daren Engellant. Qvale recorded a championship-game record six blocks in the 2010 finale against Weber State.

Qvale Sets Single-Season Blocks Record: Montana's Brian Qvale tallied three blocks in the Grizzlies' loss to Duquesne in the first round of the CBI on March 16. Qvale finished the season with a Big Sky single-season record 95 blocks in 32 games. Qvale broke the previous mark of 93 set by Idaho State's Slim Millien in 2005-06. Qvale finished his career with a Big Sky record 247 blocks. Qvale played in 117 career games, averaging 2.11 blocks per game. His average blocks per game ranks fifth in Big Sky history. Qvale averaged 2.97 blocks per game in 2010-11, which ranks third in single-season Big Sky History.

Griz Post-Season History

The Montana Grizzlies had another outstanding season in 2010-11, narrowly missing their second NCAA tournament berth in a row.

The Griz were 21-11 overall and finished second in the Big Sky Conference with a 12-4 league record. Montana defeated Weber State 57-40 in the conference tournament semifinal game, and narrowly lost (65-60) to host Northern Colorado in the championship game.

In the loss to UNC in the title game forward Art Steward scored 16 points, while sophomore guard Will Cherry and freshman guard-forward Kareem Jamar scored 13 points each. Cherry and record-setting senior center Brian Qvale were named to the all-tournament team.

Montana received a berth in the College Basketball Invitational Tournament, losing 87-76 to Duquesne in UM’s Dahlberg Arena.

It was a record-setting season and career for Qvale. The 6-11 senior from Williston, North Dakota, set a Big Sky single-season record with 95 blocked shots. He also broke the league’s career rejections record with 247, passing former Montana center Daren Engellant (212 blocks, 1988-92). Qvale was named the league’s “Defensive Player of the Year.”

Qvale was one of the main reasons Montana was ranked 20th in the nation in scoring defense (60.9 ppg) and 21st in field goal percentage defense (39.9%). He was ranked 13th in Division 1 in blocks per game at 3.0.

Griz guard Will Cherry had an exceptional sophomore season, and was named first team All-Big Sky along with Qvale. Cherry was ranked ninth in the nation with 2.6 steals a game.

Montana junior forward Derek Selvig was an honorable mention all-conference selection.

The 2010-11 season was the second consecutive 20-win year for the Grizzlies, as they went 22-10 two seasons ago and advanced to the NCAA tourney for the eighth time in school history. The Griz were a 14th seed two years ago and gave third-seed New Mexico all they wanted, losing 62-57.

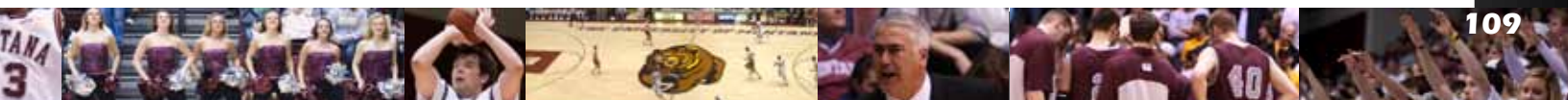

ADMINISTRATION

ROYCE ENGSTROM, PRESIDENT OF UM

Royce Engstrom became The University of Montana's 17th president on Oct. 15, 2010, after serving as UM provost and vice president for academic affairs for three years. Born in Michigan and raised in Nebraska, he came to Montana after a national search from a provost position at the University of South Dakota. He also is a chemistry professor.

Throughout his career, Engstrom has been an enthusiastic participant in undergraduate research, first as a student, then as a mentor and finally as an administrator working to develop undergraduate research programs. He is a past president of the Council on Undergraduate Research and has been active in the Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research, a federal effort to help states build research infrastructure and competitiveness.



He served as chair of the National EPSCoR Coalition and the National EPSCoR Foundation. Engstrom is interested in science policy, higher education public policy, program development and building relationships among various stakeholders in higher education.

Engstrom received his Bachelor of Science degree in chemistry from the University of Nebraska at Omaha and his doctorate in analytical chemistry from the University of Wisconsin. His wife, Mary, also is an educator and has worked at both the K-12 and university levels. They have two grown children, Tyler and Carey. In his spare time, President Engstrom enjoys building traditional wooden boats and canoeing.



JIM O'DAY, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



Jim O'Day is in his seventh year as Director of Athletics at The University of Montana. A 1980 graduate of the UM School of Journalism, O'Day returned to his alma mater in 1998 after an 18-year career in the newspaper business, first as sports editor of the Kalispell (Mont.) Daily Interlake, then in his hometown of Cut Bank, Mont., as owner/publisher of the twice-weekly Western Breeze newspaper.

O'Day served as assistant director of the Grizzly Athletic Association (now the Grizzly Scholarship Association) for three years before becoming Director of Development for UM Athletics in 2001. On June 30, 2005, he was named by former UM President George Dennison as the Director of Athletics at Montana.

O'Day currently serves on the NCAA Division I Football Issues Committee and the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoff Selection Committee. This year, O'Day will serve as chairman of that particular committee. In addition, he sits on the board of directors for the Master's of Education in Intercollegiate Athletics Leadership program with the University of Washington and is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA). In 2007, he was honored by the All-American Football Foundation by receiving the Gen. Robert R. Neyland Outstanding Athletics Director Award.

Prior to returning to UM, O'Day was a charter member of the Cut Bank Education Foundation and Alumni Association and was Cut Bank's Citizen of the Year in 1992. He organized the Golden Triangle Chapter of the GAA in 1992 and served as president until his appointment at UM in 1998. He was also actively involved in many other community service organizations. In 1991, he was the recipient of The University of Montana Service Award.

Jim and his wife Kathy have three sons: Chri, Kevin and Brian. Chris and Kevin are graduates of The University of Montana and reside in Arizona, while Brian will be a junior at UM this fall.

Several of Jim's many accomplishments during his first five years in the athletic department include UM Athletics winning the school's first Sterling Savings Bank Presidents Cup in 2007 (Montana was second in 2010 and 2009, and third in 2008); paying off a \$1 million deficit two years early; instrumental in constructing a 2,000-seat east-side expansion to Washington-Grizzly Stadium that was ready in time for the 2008 football season; and capturing conference titles in women's golf (coached by Joanne Steele) in 2006 and in women's basketball (coached by Robin Selvig) in 2007, 2008 and 2009. In addition, the men's basketball team won Big Sky Tournament titles and made NCAA appearances in 2006 and 2010. In 2006, the team under the direction of Coach Larry Krystkowiak won a first round game in the NCAA tourney vs. Nevada. The school's only other NCAA men's basketball tournament victory came in 1975 against Utah State.

Academically, UM student-athletes have their highest cumulative grade point averages (3.05) in school history, and also maintain graduation rates significantly higher than the general student population at The University of Montana. Also, the Grizzly Scholarship Association topped the \$2 million mark in annual giving the past three years – more than double the amount raised in 2000.
