- Have advanced to the NCAA Tournament 10 times?
- Have been in the NCAA Tournament three of the last four years?
- Have had back-to-back 25-win teams in 2011-12 and 2012-13, going 25-7 overall both seasons?
- Montana finished ranked 14th in the *CollegeInsider.com* Mid-Major Top 25 in 2012-13?

- Senior guard Will Cherry was named the Big Sky's Defensive Player of the Year as a junior and senior, and was a three-time first team all-league selection?
- Cherry had a school-record 265 career steals, ranking him second in Big Sky history?
- Cherry was named to Lou Henson's 25-player, Mid-Major All-American team and to Lefty Driesel's Defensive All-America team following the 2012-13 season?
- The Griz had three All-Big Sky selections in 2012-13 – Cherry, Kareem Jamar, and Mathias Ward, while Jordan Gregory was an honorable mention all-conference pick?
- That Cherry, Jamar, and Ward were all named to the NABC's All-District 6 team – the first time in Big Sky history three players from one team received that recognition?
- Have had players named Academic All-American 10 times since the 1980 season, and the Big Sky has had 22 total players receive that honor since that time?

Grizzly Basketball Quick Facts:

Head Coach Wayne Tinkle

- Head Coach Tinkle has been named the league's Coach of the Year the past two seasons – the first Montana coach to ever be so-honored? (He was also a finalist for the Hugh Durham Award, presented annually to the mid-major coach of the year).
- Coach Tinkle is ranked first in school history with 85 Big Sky victories?
- Coach Tinkle is one of 14 Division 1 head coaches who scored 1,500 points in their college careers?
- Have won a UM-record 93 games in the past four seasons?
- Have had 42 players play professional basketball since the 1974-75 season?



Sr. Guard/Forward Kareem Jamar

- Jamar became the third player in Big Sky history to be named the league tournament's MVP two consecutive years (2011-12 and 2012-13)?
- Were ranked (345 teams ranked) fifth in the nation in free throw percentage at a school-record 76.7% (499-of-651) last season?
- Were 35th in Division 1 a year ago in field goal percentage 46.5% (760-of-1635) in 2012-13, and 45th in three-point percentage at 37.2% (219-of-589)?
- Have qualified for the Big Sky Conference's post-season tournament 33 times?
- Have three of the top eight shot blockers in league history in all-time leaders in Brian Qvale (first, 247), Daren Engellant (second, 212), and Larry McBride (fifth, 162)?



First opened in 1953 as the Harry Adams Field House and named after famed athletic director, head track and field coach, and assistant football coach, the field house had a two-year renovation in 1999, opening as the Adams Events Center.

Along with being the home of The University of Montana Athletic Department, the Adams Center also hosts concerts with such famous acts as Elton John, Sting, Bob Dylan, James Taylor, Pearl Jam, and Wilco; the University and local high school graduations; trade shows, among other activities. Dahlberg Arena, the home of the Griz and Lady Griz, has a capacity of 7,321.

Along with an expansion of facilities, concessions and rest rooms, theater style seating was added. Two new practice gyms (WAG and EAG) were added to the venue along with a 7,000 square foot weight room, 4,500 square foot athletic treatment center, academic center and meeting rooms.

The women's locker room was expanded along with the equipment room. In 2004 a wide screen Griz Vision TV was added on the north end of the arena and a central scoreboard was added above the floor.

The University of Montana also replaced its portable sports floor with a new permanent state of the art maple sports floor. The new floor is 15,000 square feet. The floor is called the FOCUS and is manufactured by Connor Sports Floors and was installed by Northern Hardwood of Deer Park, Wash. The floor is a fixed

resilient sectional channel system with a plywood panel subfloor and a continuous recessed lineal padding, featuring Nike grind material.

The floor is 2001 DIN compliant, which means it meets or exceeds all athletic performance qualities as measured by DIN. DIN testing measures the floors performance in some specific categories:

- Ball rebound: Measures the basketball's response off the sports floor system as compared to the ball's response of concrete (Fast play and quick response).
- Shock Absorption: Measures the flooring system's ability to absorb impact forces normally absorbed by the athlete when landing on a hard surface (User friendly and comfortable).

**Intercollegiate Athletics
New Academic Center**

With support from the university administration and private donors, the athletic facility improvement plan includes the following:

- Construct an academic center, meeting rooms and additional offices in the open space between the current athletic complex and the student recreation center. (See artist rendition on left.) Lower level will remain a lobby to accommo-

date fire code restrictions and the Adams Center.

- Relocate the current weight room to a site to be finalized. The new strength and conditioning center would feature approximately 10,000 square feet of training space to serve all student-athletes.

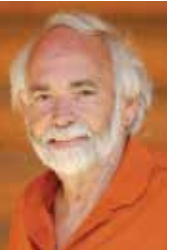

On July 26, 2013, the NCAA Committee on Infractions (COI) issued its findings regarding a NCAA investigation into the UM football program that began in February 2012. In its findings, the COI found that The University of Montana and a former head football coach failed to monitor its football program. Specifically, violations occurred as a result of the following: (A) boosters providing extra benefits to student-athletes, some of which resulted in two student-athletes competing while ineligible, (B) during one season, an undergraduate student assistant participated in coaching activities resulting in the football program exceeding the permissible limit of football coaches and (C) the institution and football coach failed to monitor these activities. As a result of the findings, UM is subject to the following penalties: (1) public reprimand and censure, (2) three years of probation from July 26, 2013, through July 25, 2016, (3) a limit of 59 football equivalency scholarships during the 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17 academic years, (4) with regard to the 2011 football season and games in which the student-athletes competed while ineligible, the vacation of wins and participation in the FCS Championship Playoffs, as well as vacation of the individual statistics for the involved student-athletes, (5) forfeiture of \$3,000 which will be donated to local charities, (6) reduction of undergraduate student assistant positions by two during the 2013-14 academic year and (7) external review of the compliance program. During the three-year probationary period, the institution will submit annual progress reports to the COI regarding compliance with all penalties and self-corrective actions.

TWO-TIME DEFENDING LEAGUE CHAMPS RETURN THREE STARTERS

MISSOULA, MONTANA (9/20/13) – A three-peat is a daunting task for any team at any level, but that's the goal for the two-time defending Big Sky Conference University of Montana Grizzlies' basketball team for the 2013-14 season.

That's the way it works when you are coming off back-to-back 25-7 regular-season records, and have gone 34-2 in Big Sky games the past two years. The Griz are coming off their fourth straight 20-win season and second straight NCAA tournament berth. Montana has gone 93-35 overall and 56-12 in the Big Sky over the past four seasons.

Eighth-year head coach Wayne Tinkle, the league's coach of the year the past two seasons, returns three starters and eight letterman from his record-setting squad of a year ago.

Montana was one of the top shooting teams in the country a year ago, starting from the free throw line where it set a school record of 76.7% (499-of-651), which ranked them fifth in Division 1. The Grizzlies were ranked (out of 345 teams) 35th in the nation in field goal percentage (46.5%, 760-of-1635) and 45th in three-point percentage (37.2%, 219-of-589).

Leading the returnees is 6-5 senior guard-forward Kareem Jamar, who was the Big Sky Conference MVP last season and an *Associated Press* honorable mention All-America selection. Other returning starters are 6-9 senior center Eric Hutchison (27 starts), and 6-2 junior guard Jordan Gregory (21 starts).

Last season Jamar led UM in rebounding (5.9 rpg), assists (4.0 apg), and blocks (tie, 0.7 pg), was second in scoring (14.2 ppg), and was the only player to start all 32 games.

Gregory was fourth in scoring at 8.2 points a game and was an all-league honorable mention selection. Hutchison averaged 3.3 points and 2.1 rebounds a game last year.

"It's certainly his (Jamar) turn to be a leader," Tinkle said. "He's kind of been waiting in the wings as far as that leadership goes. We've had a lot of great talks about being a senior and really having to step it up on and off the court. He's learned from others in the past who maybe didn't do things the right way, or did things the right way. He's got no excuses not to lead us in the right way, and I know that he is ready for that challenge."

Hutchison started most of last season and missed some action because of an injury. He is a solid defensive contributor and shot 54.8% (40-of-73) from the field. Andy Martin, a sophomore center, showed very good athleticism for a 7-footer, and may push the senior for the starting job.

Also back are 6-2 junior guard Keron DeShields, 6-5 sophomore forward Nick Emerson, Martin, 6-7 junior forward Mike Weisner, and 6-0 sophomore guard Morgan Young.

DeShields was sixth in scoring (6.6 ppg) and started in nine games. Weisner was seventh in scoring (6.0 ppg), second in the league at 45.6% from three-point range, and one of just three players who played in all 32 games. Martin led the Griz in blocks (.75 a game), and started four times as a true freshman.

"We've got guys with good experience in Jordan Gregory, Keron and Hutch," Tinkle said. "Hutch has logged a lot of minutes and he's played with some of the best bigs our school's ever had in (Derek) Selvig and (Brian) Qvale. He's had an unbelievable off-season, and I think that Hutch is as ready as anybody to come back for his senior year."

"Mike did a lot of good things for us last year, and he's a guy that you can't take for granted because he's made big plays and hit big shots," Tinkle said. "The thing that impressed us the most about Mike is that we told him that he'd have to defend and rebound in his spot for us to play him, and he



did that. I can think back to the Weber State regular-season game, and we were playing him and Spencer at the four and five, and Mike was holding guys off the glass and did a nice job defensively. He's geared up and ready to take on more as a junior.

"Then you look at some of the guys who have had limited rolls," Tinkle said. "Andy Martin had his moments (last season), and he's going to vie for playing time and should vie for the starting spot."

The Griz lost two veteran starters in guard Will Cherry and forward Mathias Ward, both seniors, while forward Spencer Coleman, who will not be returning for his senior season, had 18 starts a year ago. Ward (24 starts), who was lost for the season due to an injury, led UM in scoring (14.8 ppg), while Cherry (21 starts) was third (13.3 ppg), and Coleman was fifth (7.6 ppg).

Cherry was a three-time first team all-league pick, and was twice named the Big Sky's defensive player of the year. He is Montana's all-time leader with 104 career starts and 265 career steals, and is seventh in school history with 1,484 points.

Ward was a second team all-conference selection last season. He played in 118 career games and scored 933 points.

Tinkle and his staff of Kurt Paulson, Jono Metzger-Jones, and Kerry Rupp also added four preps, a junior college transfer, and have one red-shirt returning.

The high school additions are 6-0 guard Mario Dunn (Salesian HS, Oakland, Calif.), 6-4 guard Brandon Gfeller (Colfax HS, Wash.), 6-5

guard-forward Jack Lopez (Jannali HS, Bankstown Australia), and 6-4 guard-forward Daine Muller (Billings Skyview HS, Mont.).

Chris Kemp, a 6-7, 238-pound JC transfer from Baltimore, who played at West Texas College, should compete for a starting berth. Also back is 6-2 guard Riley Bradshaw (Corvallis HS, Mont.), who redshirted last year after transferring from Utah State.

Also new to the program is 6-8 junior center Martin Breunig from the University of Washington, who will not be able to play until next season due to NCAA transfer rules.

"We do have a lot of new additions to the team," Tinkle said. "We love the returners and the experience that we've got, but we're going to need some of these new guys to contribute."

"We've got to combine those veterans and returning guys with the incoming players," he said. "It's going to take some time. We've got a tough preseason in a while. It's going to be a fun ride, and we just hope to get everything lined up by the time we roll into conference play."

"Mario is going to have to play minutes right away, much like Keron when he was a freshman backing up Will," Tinkle said. "We're expecting him, by the time he gets four or five games under his belt, that he's ready to go. He has to understand what it takes strength and conditioning-wise at this level."

“Brandon Gfeller, I’m not sure if he will be ready this year,” Tinkle continued. “He works hard and can shoot it from anywhere. He’s worked on his game off the dribble and his mid-range game. We’ve got to see if he can defend and rebound in his spot. He might be competing for some back-up time at the two or at the three.

“Chris Kemp is a very powerful post player,” Tinkle said. “He’s a wide body at around 6-6, 240, and he gets off the floor well. He has really strong hands and is just a tireless worker. He’s got a ways to go, as far as footwork and learning our concepts on both ends. But we think the battle at the four spot, with Mike, and Jake, and Chris – there’s going to be some battles.

“Jack Lopez, the Australian, is 6-5, a good athlete, and probably a two-three,” Tinkle said. “We hope that he can back up Kareem at the three spot

right away. He’s a good shooter and can really run the floor, although we’ve got to work on his skill level a little.

“The big guy, Mark Breunig who transferred from UW, he’s going to be a load,” he said. “He’s got good hops and he works his tail off. Obviously he’s got to sit this year out.”

COACH TINKLE TALKS POSITION-BY-POSITION

POINT GUARD

“We feel pretty good about the guard spot, although some of the players may be a bit unproven. We’re going to have to fill a pretty big void. Will Cherry had a great impact on our program the past four years. Keron DeShields got some invaluable experience last year with Will’s injuries, and performed well for us. We are very excited about what Mario Dunn is going to bring to our point guard position.

“We’ve also got Kareem Jamar who played minutes there (point guard) last year and he played very well, as did Jordan Gregory. We feel pretty confident about what we have, we just need a couple of them to emerge as our leaders, and that will give us a lot more flexibility with the other positions.

“Jack Lopez we think will be able to play the two and the three. He can really shoot it and needs to work on his skills a little bit. Moran Young is a guy who just gets better and better – who knows where he will figure in. So we feel pretty comfortable with those two guard positions and the depth that we have.”

TWO GUARD

“Jordan really stepped up for us and played really big down the stretch. We are excited about him playing off the ball because of his shooting ability. Then we’ve got Brandon Gfeller, who is as good of a shooter as I’ve



seen. He works hard and has good size and length. Riley Bradshaw will also be in the mix when he becomes eligible around Christmas, and he can play both of those positions. We like his play-making ability and size.”

THREE POSITION

“At the three we’ll start Kareem there, but we like the fact he has some versatility. We can move Kareem to the point or the two, or the four. We’ve got a couple of guys, especially in league, like Gfeller at almost 6-4 can play the three spot. Jack Lopez can play there, as can Nick Emerson, who has gotten better.

“We’ve played Mike exclusively at the four, but he’s really worked on his athleticism and conditioning and strength, so we feel now that he’s closer to being able to defend at the three. So we could go big and put Kareem at the two and Mike at the three, and really have some shooters and some play-makers at that position. That’s going to be a key position for us.”

POWER FORWARD

“At power forward we have Chris Kemp, who is big and strong. He’s

athletic and a very good rebounder, and finishes around the rim. Jake Wiley had a great off-season, and he’s added some size and strength. I know he’s one of our better post players we have as far as athleticism goes.

“Mike can slide in there as well. So at the four spot I think we have more solid strength and toughness there than we did a year ago, where it was just mostly Mathias. Mike got some great experience too, when Mathias went down.”

"Hutch also had a great off-season, and he's really excited about his senior year. We threw so much at Andrew and he got better and better. We really had hoped to redshirt him, but I think the fact that he got some playing time and had to play in some big games will help him this year. He had a very good off-season. Somehow we've got to get his metabolism slowed down so he can start to put on some bulk, but he and Hutch – that combination is going to be good for us.

"We also have the flexibility to go small and put Chris Kemp there against some teams. I am excited about our front court, because we do have some interchangeable parts, and we have more strength and toughness than maybe a year ago."

THE SCHEDULE

The Griz have several difficult road contests, and they open their regular-season on the road at Minnesota (Nov. 12) and at South Dakota State (Nov. 14). The Gophers were 21-13 last season. SDSU was 25-10 last year, including a 68-67 double overtime win over the Grizzlies in Missoula.

"It's a very challenging schedule, especially early," said Tinkle, who sports a 141-78 career record at his alma mater. "But we like it that way. We're going to be tested. We're going to be able to develop some toughness. Our guys are going to have to be ready to answer the challenge.

"It's gotten more and more difficult to get teams to come to Missoula," said Tinkle who has been named the league's "Coach of the Year" the past two seasons. "Our non-league schedule will be a great experience for us in terms of preparing for the Big Sky race."

Montana's home opener is Friday, Nov. 22, against the University of San Francisco Dons, a team that beat the Griz 78-68 a year ago. The Grizzlies have three other non-conference home games against Idaho, St. Martin's and UM-Western.

The Griz are on the road again after the USF contest, playing at Washington (Nov. 26) and at Hawaii (Nov. 29). UM's other non-league road game is at Idaho on Dec. 28.

Montana starts its Big Sky slate hosting Northern Arizona and Sacramento State, Thursday and Saturday, Jan. 2 & 4. UM's home games will start at 7:05 p.m.

"There are some Big Sky teams that return a lot of talent with a ton of experience," Tinkle said. "Weber lost a couple of key guys, but they've got big pieces back. Northern Colorado and North Dakota are two teams that were playing their best basketball at the end of the year, and they've got everybody back.

"Probably the top four teams along with us will be Weber, Northern Colorado, and North Dakota, as far as the coaches and media voting goes in the pre-season polls," Tinkle said. "But, I know the rest of the teams have worked hard and are going to be better. Sacramento State is very improved, and I know that Bill (Evans) at Idaho State will have those guys playing a lot better. Northern Arizona did a nice job last season, and Eastern Washington and Portland State always seem to have good talent. Southern Utah lost a lot of good players, but coach (Nick) Robinson does a good job, and I am sure he will have them geared up.

"I think this could be as competitive a league as we've seen in awhile," Tinkle said. "The past couple of years there have been a couple of us who have ran away from the pack, and I am not sure if that's going to happen this year."

The University of Montana’s Wayne Tinkle is one of the winningest coaches in school history, boasting an overall record of 141-78. He is now in his eighth season as the head coach at his alma mater.

Coach Tinkle is the first mentor at Montana to take his team to the NCAA Tournament three times. His 141 career victories are the fourth most ever at Montana. He is 85-31 in Big Sky Conference games, which are the most league wins by any coach at UM.

Last season he led the Grizzlies to their second straight trip to the NCAA tournament, as UM played 19th ranked Syracuse in a second round contest in San Jose, Calif. Montana’s NCAA tournament berth last season was its third trip to the Big Dance in the last four seasons, and its 10th in school history.

With its NCAA berth a year ago, Montana has now advanced to post-season play a school-record four straight seasons.

Montana went 19-1 last season en route to winning the conference’s regular-season title, and those 19 victories are a Big Sky record.

He was tabbed the Big Sky’s “Coach of the Year” in the 2012-13 and 2011-12 seasons.

He is the first coach in Montana history to be named the Big Sky’s coach of the year twice. Last season he was a finalist for the Hugh Durham Award, presented annually to the mid-major coach of the year.



In 2011-12 “Tinks” guided the Griz to the NCAAs, as the 13th-seeded Grizzlies played the fourth-seeded and 14th-ranked (Associated Press) Wisconsin Badgers in a second round NCAA Tournament game in Albuquerque, N.M.

The Grizzlies were 25-7 last year, and tied a school record with their fourth 20-win seasons (UM has gone 25-7, 25-7, 21-11, and 22-10 during that span) in a row. The Grizzlies were ranked 14th in the final Mid-Major Top 25 Poll following the 2012-13 season.

Montana’s 25 wins last season tied Tinkle’s 20-11-12 team for the second most ever in school history. (UM’s 1991-92 and 1949-50 squads are tied for the most victories ever at UM).

When the Grizzlies defeated Weber State on March 16, 2013, it was their 93rd win over the last four seasons – a school record.

He was recognized for the Grizzlies’ success in 2012, as he was named the NABC Division I All-District 6 “Coach of the Year” by NABC.

In 2010-11, Tinkle guided Montana to a 21-11 record and a berth in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) Tournament. In 2009-10, the Griz went 22-10, won the league’s post-season tourney, and advanced to the NCAAs, narrowly losing (62-57) to New Mexico.

Coach Tinkle has now been to the NCAA tournament a total of six times – three as the head man and three times as an assistant coach at Montana.

As an assistant coach he was with the Grizzlies on three NCAA tourney teams: 2001-02 against Oregon (head coach Don Holst); and also in 2004-05 vs. Washington and the 2005-06 season against Nevada and Boston College with mentor Larry Krystkowiak.

Tinkle, 48, was named the 26th head men’s basketball coach in the summer of 2006. He served as an assistant coach at UM for the previous five seasons, working with Krystkowiak, Pat Kennedy (2002-04), and Holst.

He was a standout forward for the Griz from 1985-89 and a three-time All-Big Sky pick his sophomore, junior and senior seasons. He is ranked fourth in UM history in career rebounds with 836 and sixth in career points with 1,500. He was Montana’s Carl Dragstedt Award (MVP) winner in 1988 and 1989. He led the team in rebounding in 1987 (8.9 average), 1988 (8.4 average), and 1989 (8.7 avg.), and in scoring in 1988 (16.2 ppg) and 1989 (17.1 ppg).



He played in the pro ranks for 12 seasons (1990 to 2001). In his professional career he played in the CBA, as well as in Sweden, Spain, Italy and Greece. He played his final four seasons in Spain from 1995-99, where he was ranked among the league’s top scorers and rebounders.

Wayne was born in Milwaukee, Wis., and is the youngest of 11 children (seven girls and four boys). He is a 1984 graduate of Ferris High School in Spokane, Wash. He received his degree in health and human performance from UM in 2005.

He is married to former Lady Griz star Lisa McLeod, who was inducted into the Grizzly Sports Hall of Fame in 2011. Wayne and Lisa have three children: daughters Joslyn and Elleson, and son Tres.

Joslyn was a two-year starter and four-time letter-winner at Stanford in 2012 and 2013, while Elle, a sophomore, plays hoops at Gonzaga. Tres’ Hellgate High School team won Montana’s “AA” state title, and he was named the tournament MVP as a sophomore, and he was also an all-state selection.

ASSISTANT COACH THIRD SEASON AT MONTANA

Jonathan Metzger-Jones is in his third season as an assistant coach at the University of Montana.

In his first year at Montana Jono Metzger-Jones helped the Griz to a record- breaking season. The 2011-2012 Grizzlies set the standard for consecutive wins (14), overall conference record (15-1), road record in conference (7-1), and all-conference selections (four). It was also the third consecutive postseason appearance for the Griz -- a first for the program. The 25-7 overall record was the third best in the 107-year history of Griz basketball.

Jono's duties at Montana include all aspects of recruiting, scheduling, player skill development with an emphasis on perimeter players, preparation and implementation of opponent scouting reports, game strategy, film breakdown, player academics, facility coordination, summer camps, and equipment.

On the court, Jono works primarily with the Griz perimeter players. This past year he helped guards Will Cherry and Kareem Jamar earn first team All-Big Sky Conference honors. Both players saw their shooting percentages increase dramatically this past season, as Cherry upped his three-point shooting from 22% in the 2010-11 season to 38% this year, including a 41% clip in conference. Jamar increased his three-point percentage from 38% in 2010-11 to over 44% in 2011-12. Both players also saw increases in their overall field goal and free throw percentages.

Prior to arriving in Missoula, Jono spent four seasons on the staff of Bob Williams at UC Santa Barbara. In his time there he helped lead the Gauchos to two Big West regular-season championships and back-to-back Big West Conference Tournament titles and NCAA berths -- a first in UCSB basketball history.

In the 2007-2008 season UCSB broke the school record for wins in a season (23) on its way to capturing the Big West regular-season crown and a berth in the NIT. The 2009-2010 Gauchos broke another school record by becoming the first team in school history to win both the Big West regular-season and tournament titles in the same year. That team also won 20 games while advancing to the NCAA Tournament. The 2010-2011 Gauchos also captured the Big West tournament championship to earn a return trip to the NCAA Tournament. Prior to UCSB Jono began his coaching career as the Director of Operations at Cal State Fullerton under the guidance of head coach Bob Burton. In his one season there he helped the Titans to a 20-win season.

In his six years as an assistant coach Jono has helped to develop two guards that were named their conference's player of the year (Alex Harris, 2008 and Orlando Johnson, 2010), as well as 16 players that have been honored as all-conference performers. Jono played collegiately at the University of the Pacific where he was named co-captain of the team his senior year. He finished his career ranked in the program's top 10 all time in three-point shooting. Prior to his time at UOP he played two seasons at West Valley Junior College under Burton, whom he later worked for at CS Fullerton.

After his college days were over Jono spent time playing professionally in Europe. Over the course of three seasons he played in professional leagues in Italy, Switzerland, Finland, and Denmark.

A native of Oakland, California, he graduated from Bishop O'Dowd High School in 1997. He earned his B.S. in Business Administration from UOP in 2002.

Jono is married to the former Alison Keck, (B.A. Washington State '03, M.A. Gonzaga '07) who works as the Assistant Director of Development, School of Journalism, for the University of Montana Foundation.

ASSISTANT COACH SECOND SEASON AT MONTANA

Kerry Rupp is in his second season as an assistant coach at Montana.

He came to UM from Hawaii, where he was the director of basketball operations for the 2011-12 season.

Prior to joining the staff at Hawaii, Rupp was the head coach at Louisiana Tech for four season (2007-11). In his time at Tech, Rupp took the program to new heights, including a 24-11 record in 2009-10 when the Bulldogs advanced to the second round of the CollegeInsider.com tournament.

Rupp was named the 2009-10 Louisiana Association of Basketball Coaches and Louisiana Sports Writers Association coach of the year after leading Tech to its best record since 1985.

Prior to coaching at Louisiana Tech, Rupp had stints at Alabama-Birmingham, Indiana and Utah. He worked two seasons at Indiana (2004-06) under former coach Mike Davis. The Hoosiers advanced to the NIT in 2005.

From 2000-2004 Rupp coached under Rick Majerus at Utah. The Utes amassed a four-year record of 70-26, went to three NCAA tournaments and one NIT and twice advanced to the Mountain West Conference championship game.

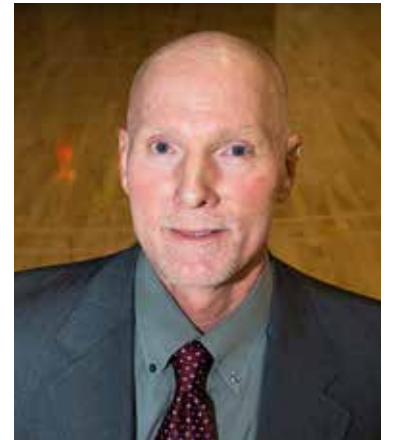
Rupp recruited Andrew Bogut to Utah. Bogut would become the national player of the year and the top pick in the 2005 NBA draft.

Rupp joined Majerus's staff after a successful 24-year high school coaching career. He served as an assistant coach (1986-90) and head coach (1990-2000) at Salt Lake City's East High School, leading the Leopards to four region titles and two state title game appearances.

He was named the 1999 coach of the year by the Utah High School Activities Association. Rupp was the head boys' basketball coach at Unitah (1978-79) and Murray (1979-82) high schools.

A 1972 graduate of Cyprus High School, where he was an all-state performer in football and basketball, Rupp played two years at Utah State before transferring to Southern Utah. He was named the Thunderbirds' team MVP and earned all-district and all-conference honors as a senior in 1977.

Rupp earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Southern Utah in 1977. He and his wife, Lori, have five daughters (Alie, Lindsey, Shelby, Billie and Randie) and six grandchildren.



Kurt Paulson

ASSISTANT COACH FIRST YEAR AT MONTANA



Kurt, who served as a graduate assistant coach in basketball for the Grizzlies in 2009-10 and 2010-11, joined the University of Montana's staff as a full-time assistant coach in the summer of 2013.

Paulson, a 2001 graduate of Whitefish High, was a five-year member (2001-02 to 2005-06) of the Carroll basketball team. He led the Saints to the 2005 NAIA semifinals and 2006 quarterfinals and finished third in the nation in assists as a junior. As a senior he helped Carroll set a school record for wins with 30.

He spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Carroll (2007-08 to 2008-09) following his playing days before breaking into the Division I ranks. Montana advanced to the NCAA tournament in Paulson's first season as a graduate assistant, the College Basketball Invitational in his second.

Paulson, who earned his undergraduate degree in business administration and health and physical education from Carroll in 2006 and a master's degree in education from Montana in 2011, spent the last two years as the activities director and boys' basketball coach at Bigfork High, where he led the Vikings to 39 wins in two seasons and to the semifinals of the Class B state tournament in March.

"We're excited to be bringing Kurt on board, because it's really going to make for a smooth transition," Head Coach Wayne Tinkle said. "He's familiar with our style of play and the kind of kids that we want to recruit, so he's going to be able to hit the ground running."

Paulson's first year will be one of transition for the Grizzlies, who will need to replace three players who started at least 18 games on last season's NCAA tournament team. Among those is Will Cherry, a three-time first-team All-Big Sky Conference selection and twice the league's Defensive Player of the Year.

A little more than three months before the opening day of practice, it's a mix of players with more youth than experience, a group that generates more questions than there are currently answers, but Paulson isn't concerned. He knows what he's getting into.

"Coach Tinkle has really built this into a program now, where the team just reloads each year," he said. "It's to the point now where it's about winning championships each year and trying to win NCAA games."

Paulson is the son of Kent Paulson, the commissioner of the Frontier Conference, and the nephew of Kraig Paulson. The latter was the progenitor of the No. 37 tradition at Montana and a longtime assistant coach for the Griz football team. He is now the assistant head coach under Bobby Hauck at UNLV.

Kurt is single.

MONTANA: Kareem is one of the most prolific players in Grizzly basketball history. He has a chance to be ranked in the top 10 at UM in scoring, rebounding, and assists. Last season he became the 28th player in school history to score 1,000 or more career points, and begins his senior season ranked 18th, with 1,108 points. He’s played in 91 career games with 82 starts. He has scored in double figures in 60 games and has recorded seven double-doubles, and also had a rare triple double as a sophomore.

2012-13: He had a dynamic season and was named the Big Sky Conference’s regular-season and post-season tournament MVP. He was fourth in the league in assists (4.0 pg), eighth in the league in scoring (14.2 ppg) and field goal percentage (49.4%), and 11th (tie, 5.0 rpg) in rebounding. 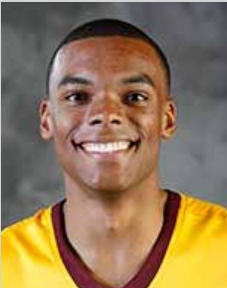

The Big Sky Conference celebrates 50 years of men's athletics and 25 years of women's competition during the 2013-14 academic year.

The venerable and stable Division I Big Sky Conference observed its 50th birthday on July 1, 2013. To mark the historic occasion, the league will honor its past by commemorating its top male and female athletics, as well as the top moments and teams.

Four of the current league members – Idaho State University, The University of Montana, Montana State and Weber State – have been with the league since its birth. Fellow charter member the University of Idaho will bring the majority of its sports back to the Big Sky on July 1, 2014. Northern Arizona University enters its 45th season in the league, giving the league five members with at least 40 years of continuous membership.

The Big Sky Conference welcomed North Dakota and Southern Utah on July 1, 2013 as full members. UC Davis and Cal Poly joined as football affiliate members. Eastern Washington University, the University of Northern Colorado, Portland State University and Sacramento State round out the current membership.

The league has become one of the strongest Division I conferences in the West and is a national leader in the Football Championship Subdivi-

sion. Six times, Big Sky teams have won the Division I National Championship, including Eastern Washington in 2010. A Big Sky team has played for the national championship in three of the past five seasons. The Big Sky is one of three conferences in the western United States playing Division I football.

The Big Sky Conference was established in 1963 by six charter members – Idaho, Idaho State, Gonzaga, Montana, Montana State and Weber State. Those six schools formed the foundation of the Big Sky before the league expanded in 1970 by adding Boise State and Northern Arizona. Gonzaga left the Sky in 1979 and was replaced by Nevada, which gave the league eight members. The conference grew to nine schools in 1987 with the addition of Eastern Washington.

The 1990s saw change in the makeup of the league, beginning in 1992 when Nevada departed and put the Big Sky back at eight teams. In 1996 Boise State and Idaho left and at the same time the conference added Portland State, Sacramento State and Cal State Northridge. The Big Sky maintained nine teams for five years before Cal State Northridge departed in the spring of 2001.

The Big Sky now includes nine states spanning from the Pacific Ocean to the Red River Valley of North Dakota. The league is represented along the entire west coast with institutions in Washington, Oregon and California. League schools also range up and down the Rocky Mountains with institutions in Montana, Idaho, Utah, Arizona and Colorado. It is “The Heart of the American West.”

On Feb 25, 1963, the name Big Sky was adopted by the six presidents of the charter members as the name of the new conference. The name Big Sky originated in a novel written by the late A.B. (Bud) Guthrie of Great Falls, Mont., in 1947 entitled “The Big Sky.” Jack Hollowell, a former Montana advertising director, promoted the Big Sky theme for the Treasure State. While on

a track and field trip from Pocatello, Idaho, to Missoula, Mont., legendary Dubby Holt of Idaho State saw a “Welcome to Big Sky Country” sign as his team entered Montana. Holt, and his athletes thought “Big Sky” would be a perfect name for the new conference. Harry Missildine of the Spokane Spokesman-Review called for the newly formed league to be named the Big Sky Conference in his column dated Feb. 20, 1963.

The Big Sky sponsors championships in 15 sports, including men's and women's cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field, basketball and tennis. In addition, there are also championships in football, and women's volleyball, golf and soccer. The Big Sky sponsored softball for the first time in 2013. Men's golf will return as a conference sport in 2014-15.

In 1988-89, the Big Sky Conference first began sponsoring women's sports. The former Mountain West Conference existed from 1982-88, sponsoring championships for women's sports at the same institutions the Big Sky had men's programs. The Big Sky merged with the Mountain West in 1988, forming one league for both men and women.

Doug Fullerton, the fifth commissioner of the Big Sky Conference, is in his 19th year at the helm. Fullerton took over the Big Sky on July 1, 1995, replacing longtime commissioner Ron Stephenson, who passed away in 2011. Stephenson served the league for 14 years. Steve Belko was the commissioner from 1977-81, while John Roning held the post from 1971-77. The first league commissioner was Jack Friel, who served from 1963-71.

Montana’s Tinkle Named Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year

OGDEN, Utah (March 18, 2013) - For the second consecutive season, Montana’s Wayne Tinkle has been selected as the Big Sky Conference Men’s Basketball Coach of the Year by his peers.

Tinkle guided Montana to 19-1 conference record and the program’s second consecutive regular-season conference title. The Grizzlies won their second straight Big Sky Championship last week, downing Weber State 67-64 in the title game. Montana will took a 25-6 record into the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2013 as the Grizzlies faced Syracuse of the Big East Conference.

Tinkle and the Grizzlies won 25 games despite missing All-Conference guard Will Cherry for 10 games. Cherry, the two-time Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year, missed the first seven games of the season as he recovered from a broken foot. He missed three more games late in the season with a foot injury. Senior forward Mathias Ward also missed the final seven games with a foot injury. Montana’s 19 regular-season conference wins were the most in league history. The Grizzlies set conference records for most consecutive regular season conference victories with 25, a streak that started during the 2011-12 season. Montana has won 28 straight regular-season conference home games, and 31 in a row overall at home against Big Sky teams.

Over the past two seasons, Tinkle’s Grizzlies have gone a combined 34-2 in conference regular-season games, and 38-2 overall against conference foes including postseason games. Montana’s combined overall record the past two seasons is 50-13. Tinkle, now in his seventh season at his alma mater, has amassed an overall record of 141-77. He is 85-31 in regular-season conference games. He ranks seventh in conference history in league victories. He is 11th on the Big Sky’s all-time career victories list.

Tinkle has led Montana to at least 20 victories in each of the past four seasons. Over the past four seasons, his teams are a combined 93-34 with three Big Sky Championships. He is the first coach at Montana to lead the

Grizzlies to the NCAA Tournament three times.

This marks just the sixth time a Grizzly coach has been honored by the Big Sky. Tinkle is the first Grizzly coach to win the honor twice. He is the eighth coach in league history to win the award in back-to-back seasons.

Montana junior Kareem Jamar was named the Big Sky’s Most Valuable Player, while Cherry was named the Defensive Player of the Year. Cherry was named to the All-Conference First Team for the third straight season, while Jamar was tabbed for the second straight season. Ward was a Second Team All-Conference pick. Sophomore guard Jordan Gregory was named Honorable Mention All-Conference. Tinkle was assisted by Jonathan Metzger-Jones, Freddie Owens and Kerry Rupp. Matt Erickson is the Director of Basketball Operations.



Montana’s Tinkle a Finalist for Hugh Durham Award

Montana’s Wayne Tinkle was a finalist for the Hugh Durham Award. The Durham

Award is presented annually to the top mid-major coach. Tinkle led UM to a 19-1 conference record, the program’s second straight Big Sky Championship, and a 25-7 overall record. “This is as good of a list of candidates that we have had,” said Hugh Durham. “It will be difficult to select one winner from this group.”

Stephen F. Austin head coach Danny Kaspar won the honor.

Big Sky Notes:

Montana set the Big Sky standard with 25 straight regular-season conference wins. The streak started during the 2011-12 season when UM won its final 11 regular-season conference games. UM started this season by winning its first 14 conference games. The previous record was 24 set by Weber State from 1967-68 to 1969-70. Counting postseason victories, Montana won 26 in a row over Big Sky teams.

Montana enters the 2013-14 season looking to expand on its conference record of 26 straight regular-season home conference wins. The previous record was 23 set by Idaho from 1980-81 to 1982- 83. Montana went 10-0 at home in regular-season conference games this past season. Counting postseason games, UM has won 31 straight over Big Sky teams

at Dahlberg Arena.

Montana set the Big Sky single-season record for regular-season conference wins with 19. This marked the first time the Big Sky had played 20 conference games in a season. UM went 19-1. Weber State was 18-2. The previous record for conference wins in a season was 15 by Weber State in 1968-69 and 2008- 09, and Montana in 2011-12.

Montana received a vote in the *Associated Press* Top 25 poll prior to the start of the NCAA Tournament.

Montana finished ranked 14th in the *CollegeInsider.com* Mid-Major Top 25. Weber State was 15th.

GRIZ HAVE ADVANCED TO NCAA TOURNEY THREE OF THE LAST FOUR YEARS



MISSOULA, MONTANA – The 2013-14 Montana Grizzlies had an outstanding season, making their third trip to the NCAA Tournament in the past four seasons to the “Big Dance.” It was Montana’s 10th NCAA tourney berth in school history, and sixth since the 2001-02 season.

The Grizzlies earned a 13 seed for the second year in a row, and had the misfortune to draw No. 4-seed and 19th-ranked Syracuse in a second round of an East Region game played in San Jose, Calif. The result was an 81-34 win by the Orange, who advanced to the Final Four, losing 61-56 to Michigan.

The road to the their second NCAA berth in a row was a memorable one, as the Grizzlies set a Big Sky Conference record with a 19-1 mark en route to the regular-season championship. Montana also registered an overall record of 25-7 for the second straight season.

Montana’s 19 league wins not only set a Big Sky record, but also its 25 regular-season victories tie the record for the second most in school history.

The Grizzlies set a Big Sky record with 25 straight regular-season conference wins. The streak started during the 2011-12 season and ended Feb. 14, 2013. Montana will begin the 2013-14 season looking to expand on its league record of 26 straight regular-season home conference wins.

Because it won the league’s regular-season title, UM earned the right to host the Big Sky’s post-season tournament. Thanks to a game-high 21 points by senior point guard Will Cherry and a 19-point, 10 rebound effort by junior guard/forward Kareem Jamar, the Griz defeated Northern Colorado 70-56 in the semifinals.

For the second consecutive year Montana squared off against long-time hoops rival Weber State for the Big Sky’s tourney crown and an NCAA berth, and once again the Grizzlies prevailed, defeating the Wildcats 67-64. Jamar and Cherry led the way with 20 and 18 points, respectively.

Jamar was named post-season tournament MVP for the second year in a row, and was joined on the all-tournament team by Cherry and sophomore guard Jordan Gregory. Jamar became the third player in Big Sky history to earn back-to-back tourney MVP awards.

Montana, which finished 14th (and a final RPI of 82) in the final Mid-Major Top 25 Poll, had four players receive all-league recognition. Cherry and Jamar were first team selections, while senior forward Mathias Ward was a second team pick, and Gregory was named honorable mention.

Cherry was tabbed the league’s “Defensive Player of the Year,” for the

second season in a row, while Jamar was voted the MVP. The Griz had three players named to the All-District 6 squad in Cherry, Jamar, and Ward – the most from one team in Big Sky history. Ward was also named to the Capital One Academic All-America Division 1 team.

Cherry, who finished ranked among UM’s all-time leaders in steals (first, 265), starts (first, 104), assists (fourth, 397), and scoring (seventh, 1,484), was named to the Lou Henson Mid-Major All-America team and to the Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American team.

Jamar, who begins his senior year ranked 18th in career scoring, was an Associated Press All-American last season.

Griz head coach Wayne Tinkle was voted the Big Sky’s “Coach of the

Year” for the second straight season, and is the only coach in school history to be so-honored.

“Tinks” starts his eighth season as head coach with a school-record 85 conference win, and is fourth in UM history with 141 career victories.

The 2011-12 Montana Grizzlies made their second NCAA appearance in three seasons and ninth overall trip to “The Big Dance.”

The Grizzlies earned a 13 seed and an opportunity to play fourth-seeded Wisconsin.

The Badger’s top-ranked scoring defense in the nation gave few open baskets and held the Griz to just 18-of-47 from the field on the way to a 73-49 win.

Junior guard Ryan Evans scored 18 points and All-American point guard Jordan Taylor added 17 to pace the Badgers.

Senior forward Art Steward had a big game on the national stage, he scored 18 points, but it

wasn’t enough to get the Griz into the game.

The trip to the tournament was a great ride.

Coach Wayne Tinkle’s squad rode the momentum of a 14-game win streak to a 15-1 Big Sky record and regular season championship, Montana’s first in a decade. The Grizzlies capitalized on home court advantage in the tournament and defeated Eastern Washington 74-66 in the semifinals.

In the championship game Montana faced Weber State and NBA lottery pick Damian Lillard, but the Grizzlies rolled to an 85-66 win.

Sophomore guard Kareem Jamar scored 23 points and seven assists on his way to the championship MVP. Junior forward Mathias Ward also scored 23 and eight rebounds to earn a spot on the all-tournament team.

Junior guard Will Cherry played all 80 minutes of the two Big Sky Tournament games. Cherry played a huge role defensively in the championship game. He matched up against Lillard and still contributed 13 points and six assists and was also named to the all-tourney team.

UM offers 15 intercollegiate programs in men's and women's basketball, cross country, tennis, indoor track and field and outdoor track and field; football, women's golf, soccer, softball and volleyball. Women's softball begins its inaugural season in the spring of 2015.

The Grizzlies/Lady Griz compete at the NCAA Division I level and are eligible for postseason competition, except for football, which competes in the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (formerly called Division I-AA), which employs a playoff system.

Montana is a charter (1963) member of the Big Sky Conference (celebrating its 50th anniversary this year), headquartered in Ogden, Utah. There are now 11 schools in the Big Sky Conference plus two football only schools, Cal Poly and UC Davis. The 11 schools are: Eastern Washington, Idaho State, Montana, Montana State, Northern Arizona, Portland State, Sacramento State, Weber State, Northern Colorado and entering into the conference for the 2011-12 season, North Dakota and Southern Utah.

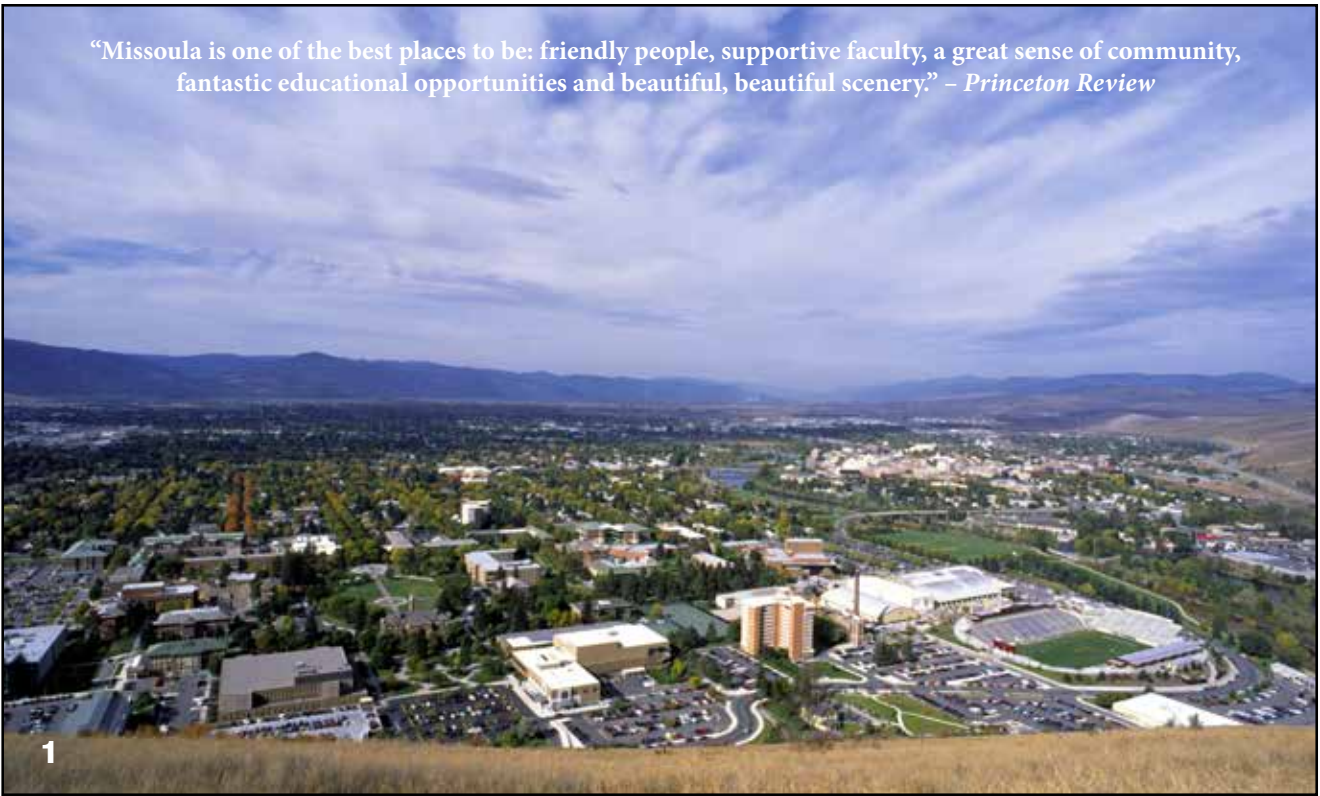
