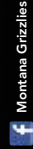

GRIZ HOOPS PREPARES TO DEFEND TITLE

About a year ago, men's basketball coaches around the Big Sky Conference looked at the Montana Grizzlies and saw a team with a new coaching staff, and only one returning starter. As such, the Griz were picked to finish eighth in the conference, and expectations in Missoula were thought to be low.

So Coach DeCuire and the Griz went out and proved the doubters wrong.

When March rolled around, the Grizzlies sat atop the Big Sky Conference with a regular season championship under its belt, and earned a trip to the NIT after falling two minutes shy of a trip to the NCAA tourney.

Coach DeCuire's Griz went 20-13, and put together only the second 20-win season for a first year head coach in Grizzly history.

"When people project the possible success of a team, they look at the individuals," reminisced Coach DeCuire of the 2014 preseason. "That's what they did with our team is look at the individuals, and they didn't fear anyone individually, and they didn't fear me as a head coach. They never took into account our ability to come together as one unit.

"It took us some time, but we were able to do that, and we're looking to do the same thing this year."

Expectations for the 2015-16 Griz are a whole different story. The media overwhelmingly chose UM to win the Big Sky with 220 first place votes, senior Martin Breunig earned a spot on the preseason All-Big Sky team, and the Montana hoops magic of yesteryear seems to be returning to Missoula.

With one of the toughest non-conference schedules in program history, featuring three preseason top-30 teams, and four defending conference champions, the Montana hoops magic is also set to face a stern test against the nation's best.

The 2015-16 edition of Grizzly men's basketball returns four starters, and six lettermen overall, with 10 newcomers to bolster the squad, many of which are expected to make an immediate impact.

The Griz lose only one starter this season, but that one starter was Jordan Gregory, a first-team All-Conference and USBWA All-Region guard that etched his name in UM's 1,000 point club with 1,234 career points, placing him just 87 points shy of a spot on the top-10 all-time scoring list at Montana.

"We need to replace 17 points a game, and they probably won't come from one guy scoring the ball the way Jordan did," says DeCuire. "But if each individual and returner can increase their production, and some new faces give us a little bit, those 17 points won't be hard to replace."

Also gone from last year's squad due to graduation are Chris Kemp and Mike Weisner, as well as Daniel Nwosu who transferred to a D-2 school in search of playing time. The three accounted for 9.9 points-per-game in '14-'15.

— RETURNERS —

Understatement of the day: Martin Breunig will play a role as a key returner for the Griz, bringing with him the 16.7 points-per-game that was sixth best in the league last year, as well as 7.3 rebounds.

The 6-8 senior transfer from Washington was the Grizzlies' leading scorer with 534 points in his first season at UM, the eighth highest all-time single season scoring total in Griz history.

His role as a versatile post man who is able to shoot with a deft touch as well as he is able to muscle and maneuver in the paint will provide leadership to a young team of big men.

"You'll see Martin slide down and allow us to play big at times. There'll be some games where we're going to have to

play big against good teams just to stay in it and compete for balls, rebounds and defend,” said DeCuire.

Joining Breunig in the post is returning sophomore Fabijan Krslovic, the 6-8, 225 pound post player from Australia who enjoyed a breakout freshman season with the second most steals on the team (36) and the second most blocked shots (19).

“He was more of a defender, hustle guy for us,” said DeCuire of Krslovic. “He’s spent a lot of time working on his game down low facing the basket. I think he’ll be more productive for us around the hoop.”

Also back to lead the Griz are junior guards Brandon Gfeller and Mario Dunn who each averaged nearly nine points-per-contest in ‘14-‘15.

The 6-4, 190 pound, hot-shooting Gfeller brings a team-best .421 three-point percentage to the floor this season on 83-197 attempts from the three-spot last year.

“Brandon provided us a lot of versatility last season. He’ll slide down to some two, and he could even slide up to some four if we want to open up the thing,” said DeCuire of the Colfax, Wash., native.

Dunn returns as one of the Grizzlies’ top defenders last year, with a team-high 59 steals, but will miss the first few weeks of the season as he recovers from off-season wrist surgery.

“Mario Dunn can defend 1-3. Even though he’s not the biggest guy on the floor, he’s got the biggest heart of all the perimeter players that we’re going to see. He’ll allow us to compete in a lot of areas,” adds DeCuire.

Adding depth to the UM backcourt is one of Coach DeCuire’s most improved players last season, Riley Bradshaw, the Corvallis native who returned to Montana after a year at Utah State. DeCuire expects a change in roles this year for the one-two man to add even more versatility to the UM attack.

“He’ll play off the ball 90 percent of the time, which I think will make him more aggressive, and hopefully his production increases as well. He’s kind of a wild card for us because he’s got the ability to create a shot for himself about as well as anyone on our team.”

— NEW FACES —

One thing that Griz fans will immediately notice this year is the bevy of new faces on the court. With only four players lost from last year, Coach DeCuire bolstered his roster with 10 newcomers of different stripes over the offseason. The additions top DeCuire’s roster off at 16 players.

After redshirting their freshman years, the Griz welcome back a pair of Montana natives with some serious physical presence down low in the 6-10, 230 pound Bryden Boehning from Glendive, and Gavin DeJong, a 6-6, 215 pound forward from Manhattan.

“Bryden changed his body, and gained weight, gained confidence with the ball in his hands on the block over the summer,” says DeCuire of his biggest player.

“Gavin provides us with athleticism and the ability to go get balls off the glass. With his athleticism, he can finish around the basket, above defenders and also shoot from mid range.



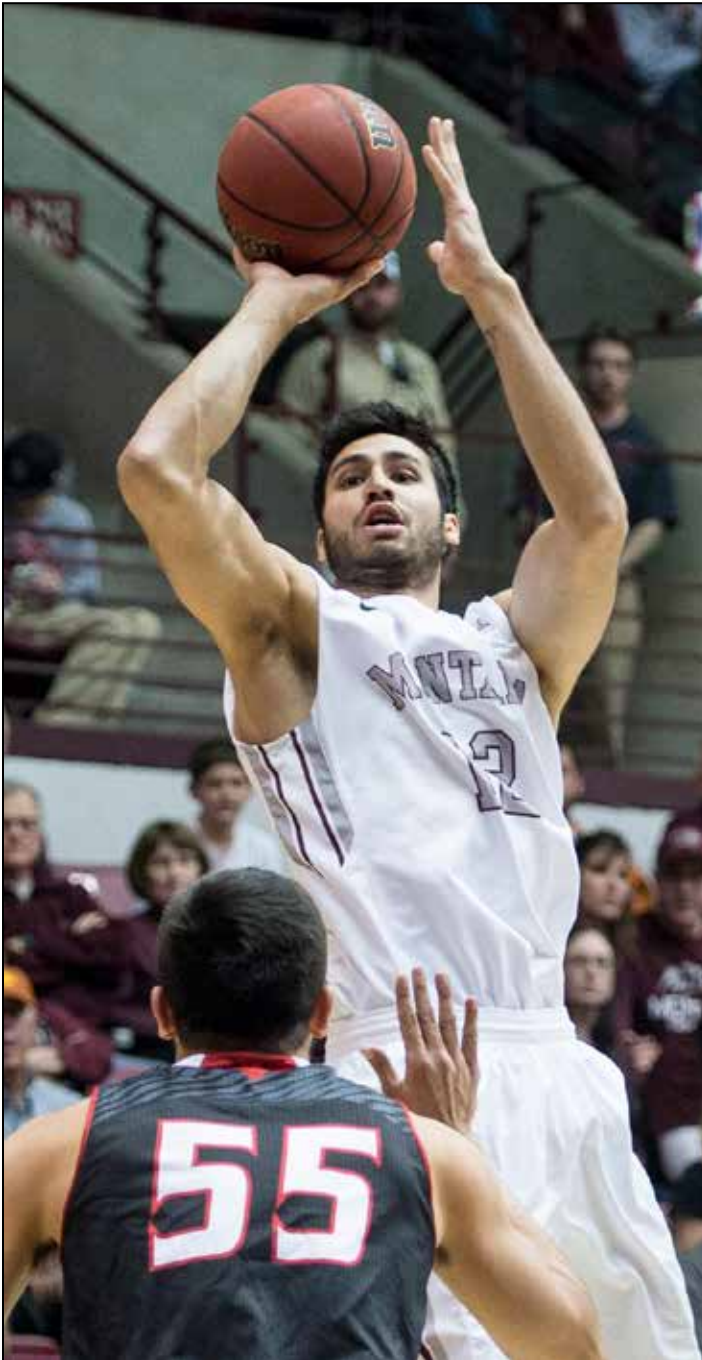

“Those three guys (Krslovic, DeJong & Boehning) will be go-to guys and low post scorers for us. They’ll provide us the ability to pound the ball and put a lot of pressure on team’s defenses. As they adjust to that, we can sub and go to a more perimeter-orientated offense.

“Diversity is going to be huge for us. We’ll be counting on the three headed posts for our offense.”

The Griz also welcome players who are expected to make an immediate impact in the backcourt in junior transfer Walter Wright (Snow College), and true freshman Michael Ogune (Porter Ranch, Calif.).

Wright set an all-time single game record at Snow College, scoring 49 points in a contest against Sheridan College last

year. He averaged 21.8 points-per-game for the Badgers and six assists. With Dunn's absence early on, Wright will give Coach DeCuire another option at point, a position where the battle for minutes is deep with talent.

Oguine, a 6-2, 175 pound, three-star recruit out of Cham-inade Prep in Canoga Park, Calif. will also vie for playing time at the point, bringing athleticism and an average of 21.3 points per game in high school.

Adding even competition and preparedness to the point position is Ahmaad Rorie, a sophomore transfer from the University of Oregon, who was ranked by ESPN as one of the top three high school players to come out of the state of Washington in 2014.

Due to NCAA transfer rules, Rorie will sit out the '15-'16 year, but according to DeCuire, will provide an X factor in practice at a position loaded with talent, and will only help the other point players improve.

"I look at it in terms of how I approached things when I was a redshirt transfer here, is every practice was my game," reminisced DeCuire, Montana's all-time assist leader as a player from '91-'94. "So we're encouraging him to do the same, is to just approach every practice as if it were a game, and make it as difficult as possible for those other guards every day, and we'll get better on both sides of the ball because of that.

"I don't know if we'll see that type of competition on a daily basis outside of practice, so it's going to be huge for our guys to improve. So at the one and the two, minutes are going to be up in the air and it's going to be competitive."

Expected to fight for minutes in the three-four spot is another true freshman, Bobby Moorehead (6-7, 190) out of Stadium High School in Tacoma, Wash. Moorehead averaged 26.5 points-per-game in high school and 11 rebounds, earning him a place on the All-State Honorable Mention team.

"Bobby Moorehead is another potential three man for us that can shoot the ball and give us a look that we kind of got from Brandon last year. He spreads the floor out and allows people to do what they do, and if they fall asleep on him he can make them pay.

"I think we need (Bobby) to play. I think that as another three point shooter we need to be able to put as many shooters on the floor as possible, and right now he's catching on offensively and he's competing, so I think he's someone who can earn enough minutes to justify playing him as a freshman."

Transferring from the JC level to play for the Griz this season is even more local talent in the form of Zachary Camel (Salish Kootenai College) and Aaron Misipeka-Ward (Wenatchee Valley JC), shooting guards who are expected to be in the mix for playing time as well.

Camel, the nephew of former Griz guard JR Camel, played for his uncle at Arlee High School, where he made four state championship appearances with the Warriors. Meanwhile, Misipeka-Ward was a two-time all-state selection at Florence-Carlton High School.

— ANSWERING THE QUESTIONS —

The '14-'15 Grizzlies answered the questions of last season in fine form. So what are this year's questions as Coach DeCuire enters his second season?

"It's about figuring out who your most productive players are and putting the ball in their hands in areas they can be affective. That's the learning curve for us right now, is who is going to be productive for us other than Martin?

Is Brandon going to be more than just a spot shooter for us? Will Walter step in and be as productive as he was in junior college last year, and then Mike Oguine, who is a freshman coming in with a ton of talent, how quickly does he transition into the division 1 game?

— THE SCHEDULE —

Undoubtedly one of the biggest highlights for Griz fans is the '15-'16 schedule, featuring one of the most difficult non-conference lineups UM has ever faced.

Out of the blocks the Griz will get a shot at redemption on the Boise State Broncos, defending Mountain West Champions, and a team the Griz nearly upset on the road last season, falling in double-overtime in Boise.

This year the Broncos come calling to Missoula on Nov. 13 for the Grizzlies' first regular season game of the year. The Griz are 2-0 over Boise in the Broncos' last two trips to Montana.

Also highlighting the schedule are two USA Today pre-season top-25 teams in perennial powerhouses Kansas and Gonzaga.

For Coach DeCuire, games against the best in non-conference action serve two purposes: prepare your team to fight, and expose the Griz name to new recruits and markets.

“Let’s go play solid competition. Let’s go on the road and play these guys in places that they probably never would have an opportunity to play. Taking a team to Kansas, taking a team into Gonzaga, those are two of the toughest places to play in their conference, not only because of their talent, but their environment. It think that’s part of a student athlete’s education, is the experience in and outside of the gym.

“The other piece for us is that it’s a huge recruiting tool. When you’re trying to convince kids that are being recruited into the Pac-12, the Mountain West, Conference USA, you have to give them a reason to say no to those conferences. For us it’s level of competition in November and December. It’s strength of schedule all around, and the opportunity to play for a championship. We’ll continue to play good teams for both reasons.”

The '15-'16 Griz will take the court on October 27 for the first time in front of Griz Nation at the annual Maroon & Silver Scrimmage, followed by a home exhibition against Whitworth on Nov. 11.

HEAD COACH TRAVIS DECUIRE

First year head coaches are generally not supposed to win the Big Sky Conference title in their inaugural season, but no one told Travis DeCuire.

Travis DeCuire (pronounced: Dee-cure) was formally introduced as the University of Montana's 27th men's head basketball in June of 2014, at a press conference in UM's Adams Center after the initial announcement from UM's Director of Athletics Kent Haslam in May of that year.

In his first season at the helm of a program with a rich history of success, Coach DeCuire's Grizzlies started the year picked to finish eighth in the Conference.

DeCuire and the 2014-15 Griz went on to surpass all expectations, leading UM to a 20-win season, a share of the Big Sky Conference regular season title, and a trip to the NIT. The Griz finished the season 20-13, completing just the nineteenth, 20-win season in program history.

Coach DeCuire was also only the second coach in UM history to put up 20 wins in his first season at the helm, a feat Blaine Taylor accomplished in the '91-'92 season when his Grizzlies went 27-4.

Before returning to Montana, DeCuire, a former standout point guard for the Grizzlies, spent six seasons on the University of California coaching staff and his second as the Golden Bears' associate head coach. Regarded as one of the top mentors in the game, DeCuire helped former Cal (and Montana) mentor Mike Montgomery transform Cal into one of the winningest programs in the Pac-12 Conference during his time in Berkeley. The Bears reached the postseason all six years he was on the staff.

Before his six-year stint at Cal, he spent five seasons as an assistant coach to former Griz head coach and player Blaine Taylor at Old Dominion, where he helped the Monarchs to a combined record of 117-53. The mark included 94 wins his final four years - the most in school history over a four-year stretch. ODU reached the postseason each of those four years as well, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in both 2005 and 2007.

In addition, the Monarchs reached the National Invitation Tournament semifinals in 2006 and the quarterfinals of the College Basketball Invitational in 2008. ODU's best overall record came in 2004-05 when the Monarchs finished 28-6 overall. They also won 24 games each of the next two seasons, posting marks of 24-10 in 2006 and 24-9 in '07.

DeCuire, from Seattle, Wash., has head coaching experience from stints at Sammamish High School and Green River Community College in Washington.

Prior to joining the staff at Old Dominion, he had two successful years as head coach at Green River Community College in Seattle. After taking over a last-place program in 2001-02, DeCuire guided the team to a conference championship and its first 20-win season in over 20 years, earning league Coach of the Year honors in 2003 to cap off his second season.

DeCuire earlier served as head coach at Sammamish High School in Bellevue, leading the school to two conference titles, a state tournament appearance and three consecutive trips to the district tournament.

As a point guard for Montana from 1992-94 DeCuire was named All-Big Sky Conference as a junior and senior. He set a school record in just three seasons with 435 career assists. He also established UM's single-season mark with 199 assists as a senior in 1993-94, when he was ranked 12th in the nation, averaging 7.1 assists a game.

He was the recipient of the Grizzlies' Carl Dragstedt Award (MVP) as a junior (he shared it with forward Matt Kempfert that season) and senior, and received the John Eaheart Award (Outstanding Defensive Player) following his senior year.

As a freshman at Chaminade-Hawaii he was a starter and team MVP in 1990. He then transferred to Montana and redshirted in 1991. He attended Mercer Island High School (Wash.), where he was a three-year starter and all-state, team MVP, and a McDonald's All-America honorable mention pick as a senior.

He has a strong commitment to community service, and founded and acted as president of the Fastbreak Basketball Association, an organization that assists in teaching life lessons and building self-esteem through basketball to more than 500 students in the Seattle-Tacoma area. In addition, he has extensive experience in counseling with the Echo Glen Children's Center in Snoqualmie, Wash., from 1996-98 and with the Ryther Children's Center in North Seattle from 1995-97.

DeCuire graduated from Montana in 1994 with a degree in business marketing. He and his wife, Sabrina, have two daughters; Brianna (22) and Tamia (4). Travis' birth date is Nov. 21, 1970





ASSISTANT COACH JONO METZGER-JONES



Jonathan Metzger-Jones enters his fifth season as an assistant coach in 2015-16 at the University of Montana.

He has been an assistant coach for the Grizzlies the previous four seasons, and enters his second under head coach Travis DeCuire.

During his stint at Montana, the Grizzlies won three Big Sky Conference regular-season and two post-season tournament championships, advanced to two NCAA Tournaments in 2011-2012 and 2012-2013, and the NIT in 2014-15.

In his first two seasons with the Griz, they registered back-to-back 25-7 regular-season records, and went 34-2 in Big Sky games. The Griz registered another 20-win season in 2014-15 under Coach DeCuire.

In his first year at Montana Jono Metzger-Jones helped the Griz to a record-breaking season. The 2011-2012 Grizzlies set the standard for consecutive wins (14), overall conference record (15-1), road record in conference (7-1), and all-conference selections (four). It was also the third consecutive postseason appearance for the Griz -- a first for the program. The 25-7 overall record was the third best in the 107-year history of Griz basketball.

Jono's duties at Montana include all aspects of recruiting, scheduling, player skill development with an emphasis on perimeter players, preparation and implementation of opponent scouting reports, game strategy, film breakdown, player academics, facility coordination, summer camps, and equipment.

On the court, Jono works primarily with the Griz perimeter players. The past four seasons he helped guards Will Cherry, Kareem Jamar, and Jordan Gregory earn first team All-Big Sky Conference honors. All three players saw their shooting percentages increase dramatically during their careers at UM.

Prior to arriving in Missoula, Jono spent four seasons on the staff of Bob Williams at UC Santa Barbara. In his time there he helped lead the Gauchos to two Big West regular-season championships and back-to-back Big West Conference Tournament titles and NCAA berths -- a first in UCSB basketball history.

In the 2007-2008 season UCSB broke the school record for wins in a season (23) on its way to capturing the Big West regular-season crown and a berth in the NIT. The 2009-2010 Gauchos broke another school record by becoming the first team in school history to win both the Big West regular-season and tournament titles in the same year, and that team won 20 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. In 2010-2011 the Gauchos captured the Big West tournament championship to earn a return trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to UCSB Jono began his coaching career as the Director of Operations at Cal State Fullerton under the guidance of head coach Bob Burton. In his one season there he helped the Titans to a 20-win season.

Jono played collegiately at the University of the Pacific where he was named co-captain of the team his senior year. He finished his career ranked in the program's top 10 all time in three-point shooting. Prior to his time at UOP he played two seasons at West Valley Junior College under Burton, whom he later worked for at CS Fullerton.

After his college career at UOP, he played three seasons in professional leagues in Italy, Switzerland, Finland, and Denmark.

A native of Oakland, California, he graduated from Bishop O'Dowd High School in 1997. He earned his B.S. in Business Administration from UOP in 2002.

Jono is married to the former Alison Keck, (B.A. Washington State '03, M.A. Gonzaga '07) who works as the Assistant Director of Development in the School of Journalism at the UM Foundation. Jono and Allison have a son Jason, who will be two in January 2016.



ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH KEN BONE



With 22 years as a head coach at the collegiate level, Ken Bone brings a wealth of experience to the University of Montana's basketball program and to second-year head coach Travis DeCuire's staff.

From 2009-2014, Coach Bone served as head coach in the Pac-12's Washington State University. During his tenure with the Cougars he took them to two postseason tournaments, including the NIT semifinals in 2010-11. He had a five-year record of 80-86 in

Pullman, and is the sixth-winningest head coach in school history.

In 2011-12 Bone became the fifth WSU head coach to take his team to two postseason tournaments, and just the third to accomplish the feat in consecutive seasons, as the Cougars made their first appearance in the CBI, reaching the championship round where they fell to Pittsburgh, two games to one. As the Cougars' second-year head coach in 2010-11, he led his squad to a 22-13 overall mark and to the semifinals.

Prior to his stint at WSU, Bone spent the previous four years as the head coach at Portland State, leading the Vikings to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 2007-08 and 2008-09. The Vikings went 23-10 during each of the last two years, the two best seasons in the 48-year history of the program. In his four seasons with the Vikings, Bone posted a 77-49 record for a winning percentage of .611 - the best by any PSU coach since basketball was reinstated in 1996-97.

Bone led PSU to its finest season in school history in 2007-08, winning a school-record 23 games en route to the Big Sky Conference regular season and tournament titles and making the school's first appearance in the NCAA Division I Tournament. As a result, Bone earned Big Sky Coach of the Year honors, becoming the first Viking basketball coach to do so.

In 2008-09 the Vikings again won 23 games on their way to a second-

place regular season finish in the Big Sky and second-straight conference tournament title. The automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament meant PSU was going dancing for the second time in program history, and the second year in a row, this time as a No. 13 seed. The season included PSU's first win over a ranked opponent when the Vikings upended No. 7 Gonzaga 77-70 in Spokane (Dec. 23, 2008). In his four years, the Vikings had 10 All-Big Sky selections.

Bone has a 361-202 record as a head coach, including 12 seasons at his alma mater, Seattle Pacific University. He registered a 253-97 (.723) record with the Falcons between 1990 and 2002. Bone's SPU teams claimed six outright or shared Pacific West Conference championships and earned eight NCAA playoff appearances. The Falcons made five trips to the NCAA Division II Sweet 16 over a span of eight years, including a semifinal appearance in 2000 that capped a 27-5 season. In 2000, Bone was recognized as both NABC District 8 Coach of the Year and PacWest Conference Co-Coach of the Year.

During Bone's final season at Seattle Pacific, the Falcons posted a 24-5 record, advanced to the second round of the NCAA playoffs and were ranked ninth in the final 2002 poll.

Between his stints at SPU and PSU, Bone spent the 2002-05 seasons as an assistant coach at Washington. In 2005 Bone helped direct Washington to the Pacific-10 Conference title as the Huskies earned a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the Sweet 16.

He began his coaching career as an assistant coach for a season at Shorewood High in 1982-83. After that he went to Stanislaus State where he was an assistant for a season (1983-84), and served as the head coach there for one year (1984-85). That was followed by one season as the head coach at Olympic Junior College in 1985-86. He then moved on to his alma mater at Seattle Pacific, where he was an assistant coach from 1986-90 and was the head mentor there from 1990-2002.

A Seattle native, Bone graduated from Seattle Pacific in 1983 and received his master's in athletic administration in 1993. He played two seasons (1980-82) at SPU after one-year stints at Shoreline and Edmonds (Wash.) Community College. He is a Shorecrest (Wash.) High School graduate. Ken and his wife Connie have three daughters, Kendra, Jenae and Chelsea.

ASSISTANT COACH CHRIS COBB



Chris Cobb is entering his second season as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for mentor Travis DeCuire in the University of Montana's basketball program.

Cobb came to Montana after a five-year stint at Chico State, which had unprecedented success during his tenure there. Cobb's Wildcats won the program's first-ever NCAA tournament game in the 2011-12 season, as well as making the team's first ever appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight during the

2013-14 season.

He was a key component in Chico State's first championship team in the California Collegiate Athletic Association in 2011-12 (the first in school history), working for head coach Greg Clink.

At Chico State he was also a key component of the team's scouting, recruiting and player development efforts and helped oversee the academic program while also assisting in the promotion of the Wildcats' clinics and summer camps.

During his tenure with the Wildcats he coached and helped to develop seven all-league players, two All-West selections, and one NCAA Division II All-American.

Cobb came to Chico after serving as an assistant to head coach Bill Treseler at San Francisco State during the 2009-10 season.

He joined the coaching ranks immediately after completing a four-year career in N.A.I.A. school Menlo College in Atherton, Calif., where he was a two-time All-California Pacific Conference first team selection and part of the Oaks' conference championship team in 2008. He's ranked second in career assists and also second in career 3-pointers made at Menlo College.

Cobb was an outstanding prep player at Bishop O'Dowd High School in Oakland and was instrumental in leading the Dragons to three straight Hayward Area Athletic League titles and a 2004 appearance in the state championship game. He was named first team all-league his junior and senior seasons and was an All-Northern California Division III first team selection as a senior.

He received his bachelor's degree in business management from Menlo College in 2009. He earned his master's degree in kinesiology with an emphasis on sports administration from Fresno Pacific University in 2012.

Chris is engaged to Alisa Benz.

DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS MARLON STEWART



Marlon Stewart is in his second season as the director of basketball operations at the University of Montana.

Under head coach Travis DeCuire, Stewart was a key member of a staff that won the Big Sky Conference regular season championship in it's first season at the helm.

Stewart came to UM after a two-year stint at the University of Virginia, where he was involved in scouting and video work. In his last season at Vir-

ginia, the Cavaliers won the ACC championship, a number one seed in the NCAA Tournament, and advanced to the Sweet 16.

A 2008 graduate of Washington State, Stewart served as a student video coordinator for the Cougars in 2006-07 and 2007-08. In both of his two seasons in Pullman the Cougars advanced to the NCAA Tournament, reaching the Sweet 16 in 2008.

He worked as the video coordinator at the University of California-Berkeley for four seasons from 2008-12, when first-year Grizzly head coach Travis DeCuire served as an assistant for mentor Mike Montgomery. During his four-year stay in Berkeley, the Bears advanced to the NCAA Tournament three times and won the Golden Bears' first Pac-10 title in 50 years.

QUOTING HEAD COACH TRAVIS DECUIRE: "Marlon is a multi-task guy who is very bright, understands the game, is very level-headed, and for me I thought it was important to have someone on the staff who knows me and has worked with me before. He was part of our (Cal's) conference championship team in 2010 and Virginia's 2014 ACC championship. We are talking about someone who knows how to win. He'll do a lot of things for us."

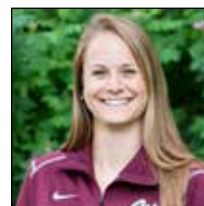

2015-16 Montana Basketball – Big Sky Conference



The Big Sky Conference celebrated 50 years of men's athletics and 25 years of women's competition during the 2013-14 academic year. The venerable and stable Division I Big Sky Conference observed its 50th birthday on July 1, 2013. To mark the historic occasion, the league honored its past by commemorating its top male and female athletes, as well as the top moments and teams.

Four of the current league members – Idaho State University, The University of Montana, Montana State and Weber State – have been with the league since its birth. Fellow charter member the University of Idaho brings the majority of its sports back to the Big Sky on July 1, 2014. Northern Arizona University enters its 45th season in the league, giving the league five members with at least 40 years of continuous membership.

The Big Sky Conference welcomed North Dakota and Southern Utah on July 1, 2013 as full members. UC Davis and Cal Poly joined as football affiliate members. Eastern Washington University, the University of Northern Colorado, Portland State University and Sacramento State round out the current membership.

The league has become one of the strongest Division I conferences in the West and is a national leader in the Football Championship Subdivision. Six times, Big Sky teams have won the Division I National Championship, including Eastern Washington in 2010. A Big Sky team has played for the national championship in three of the past five seasons. The Big Sky is one of three conferences in the western United States playing Division I football.

The Big Sky Conference was established in 1963 by six charter members – Idaho, Idaho State, Gonzaga, Montana, Montana State and Weber State. Those six schools formed the foundation of the Big Sky before the league expanded in 1970 by adding Boise State and Northern Arizona. Gonzaga left the Sky in 1979 and was

replaced by Nevada, which gave the league eight members. The conference grew to nine schools in 1987 with the addition of Eastern Washington.

The 1990s saw change in the makeup of the league, beginning in 1992 when Nevada departed and put the Big Sky back at eight teams. In 1996 Boise State and Idaho left, and at the same time the conference added Portland State, Sacramento State and Cal State Northridge. The Big Sky maintained nine teams for five years before Cal State Northridge departed in the spring of 2001.

The Big Sky now includes nine states spanning from the Pacific Ocean to the Red River Valley of North Dakota. The league is represented along the entire west coast with institutions in Washington, Oregon and California. League schools also range up and down the Rocky Mountains with institutions in Montana, Idaho, Utah, Arizona and Colorado. It is "The Heart of the American West."

On Feb 25, 1963, the name Big Sky was adopted by the six presidents of the charter members as the name of the new conference. The name Big Sky originated in a novel written by the late A.B. (Bud) Guthrie of Great Falls, Mont., in 1947 entitled "The Big Sky." Jack Hollowell, a former Montana advertising director, promoted the Big Sky theme for the Treasure State. While on a track and field trip from Pocatello, Idaho, to Missoula, Mont., legendary Dubby Holt of Idaho State saw a "Welcome to Big Sky Country" sign as his team entered Montana. Holt, and his athletes thought "Big Sky" would be a perfect name for the new conference. Harry Missildine of the Spokane Spokesman-Review called for the newly formed league to be named the Big Sky Conference in his column dated Feb. 20, 1963.

The Big Sky sponsors championships in 15 sports, including men's and women's cross coun-

try, indoor and outdoor track and field, basketball and tennis. In addition, there are also championships in football, and women's volleyball, golf and soccer. The Big Sky sponsored softball for the first time in 2013. Men's golf will return as a conference sport in 2014-15.

In 1988-89, the Big Sky Conference first began sponsoring women's sports. The former Mountain West Conference existed from 1982-88, sponsoring championships for women's sports at the same institutions the Big Sky had men's programs. The Big Sky merged with the Mountain West in 1988, forming one league for both men and women.

Doug Fullerton, the fifth commissioner of the Big Sky Conference, is in his 21st year at the helm. Fullerton took over the Big Sky on July 1, 1995, replacing longtime commissioner Ron Stephenson, who passed away in 2011. Stephenson served the league for 14 years. Steve Belko was the commissioner from 1977-81, while John Roning held the post from 1971-77. The first league commissioner was Jack Friel, who served from 1963-71.

For the first time, all 12 schools will face off for a berth in the NCAA tournament in the 2015-16 season. The basketball tournament for both the men's and the women's basketball teams will take place in Reno, Nev., March 7-12.

WEBER STATE, MONTANA PICKED NO. 1 IN BIG SKY PRESEASON MEN'S BASKETBALL POLLS

OGDEN, Utah (October 1, 2015) – The 2015-16 Big Sky Conference men's basketball preseason poll was a split decision with the Big Sky coaches choosing Weber State as their No. 1 pick by one point while the Big Sky media gave defending regular-season champion, Montana, the edge in their poll.

Weber State was picked first by the league's coaches with just one point (114) separating the Wildcats from the Montana Grizzlies (113). Both WSU and UM split the first-place votes by the league's coaches with six each. WSU was picked second in the media poll with 194 points and two first place votes. Eastern Washington and Northern Arizona were picked third and fourth respectively in both polls. NAU tied with Sacramento State for the fourth slot in the media poll.

Weber State finished last season with a 13-17 overall record and an 8-10 conference mark. The Wildcats have a strong returning cast for the 2015-16 campaign with Big Sky Second Team All-Conference selection Joel Bolomboy and Honorable Mention Jeremy Senglin returning to the squad. Bolomboy averaged a double-double last season with 13.3 points per game and 10.2 rebounds. Senglin was the Wildcats' leading scorer last season with 16.4 points per game.

Montana earned the media's top spot with 220 points and 14 firstplace votes. The Griz are coming off a 20-win season in which they earned the Big Sky Conference regular-season title and the right to host the Big Sky tournament. Montana returns six lettermen from last year's team, including several starters. Anchoring the returning cast is senior forward, Martin Breunig, who was named a unanimous First Team selection last year. Breunig averaged 16.7 points per game last season and 7.3 rebounds.

Also returning to the Grizzlies is junior guard, Mario Dunn. Dunn picked up an All-Big Sky Honorable mention last season after averaging 48.8 percent from the field (8.8 ppg) and led UM with 59 steals.

On July 26, 2013, the NCAA Committee on Infractions (COI) issued its findings regarding a NCAA investigation into the UM football program that began in February 2012. In its findings, the COI found that The University of Montana and a former head football coach failed to monitor its football program. Specifically, violations occurred as a result of the following: (A) boosters providing extra benefits to student-athletes, some of which resulted in two student-athletes competing while ineligible, (B) during one season, an undergraduate student assistant participated in coaching activities resulting in the football program exceeding the permissible limit of football coaches and (C) the institution and football coach failed to monitor these activities. As a result of the findings, UM is subject to the following penalties: (1) public reprimand and censure, (2) three years of probation from July 26, 2013, through July 25, 2016, (3) a limit of 59 football equivalency scholarships during the 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17 academic years, (4) with regard to the 2011 football season and games in which the student-athletes competed while ineligible, the vacation of wins and participation in the FCS Championship Playoffs, as well as vacation of the individual statistics for the involved student-athletes, (5) forfeiture of \$3,000 which will be donated to local charities, (6) reduction of undergraduate student assistant positions by two during the 2013-14 academic year and (7) external review of the compliance program. During the three-year probationary period, the institution will submit annual progress reports to the COI regarding compliance with all penalties and self-corrective actions.

Infrastructure and Student-Athlete Success Go Hand-In-Hand

Student-athletes know what to look for when visiting a college campus. In order to recruit the best student-athletes, focus on their academic and athletic welfare, and continue the success UM Athletics has enjoyed over the many years, the university must improve these vital “infrastructure” facilities. Upgrades for these facilities have been identified as a top priority by the athletic department and the university president.

The old academic center was undersized at 400 square-feet and only served a small number of the 300-plus total student-athletes. The weight room has limited space and is currently split between three separate rooms, making the working area difficult to supervise, unsafe, and ineffective. Meeting space is currently limited to one small room, and a student-athlete lounge doesn't exist.

The women's locker room facilities have recently been improved. The men's locker room was renovated in 1996, and a remodel is beyond over-

due. The space has become too small and there are concerns relating to the health and well-being of UM's student-athletes.

The new Grizzly Student-Athlete Academic Center opened in August of 2015.

Facility Needs for Grizzly Athletics are Not Always Visible to the Public

On the surface the University of Montana athletic venues are among the best in the Big Sky Conference and the Football Championship Sub-division. Dahlberg Arena, Washington-Grizzly Stadium, West Auxiliary Gym, South Campus Field and the new softball complex host legendary competitions in their respective sports. Without a doubt, our fans and student-athletes are in good shape come game day.

Everyone in attendance at these facilities gets to witness the pageantry and excitement that is Grizzly athletics. However, very few fans get the opportunity to go behind the scenes and see those areas that matter most in the everyday life of the student-athlete – the training, practice, and service facilities. It is the weight room, academic center, meeting rooms and locker

rooms where all student-athletes spend the vast majority of their time. It is where Montana Grizzlies are made! In these critical areas, UM is significantly lacking and pales in comparison to the image portrayed by the thundering stadium, arenas and fields.

Construction for the Washington-Grizzly Champions Center is planned to begin in the winter of 2016. A state-of-the art all-sport weight room facility, running track, and meeting rooms along with a football locker room are scheduled to be completed in the summer of 2017.
