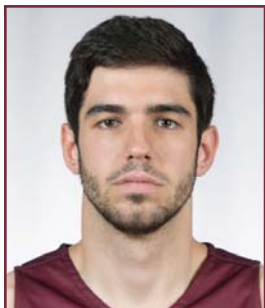

MONTANA'S FURIOUS RALLY COMES UP SHORT AT GEORGIA STATE

ATLANTA, Ga. – Montana overcame a 17-point halftime deficit to tie Georgia State, 68-68, with 70 seconds to play on Saturday afternoon. The Grizzlies had three chances in the closing seconds to take the lead or tie the game, but were unable to do so, falling to the Panthers, 71-68.

As has been the case several times this season, Saturday was a tale of two halves. The Grizzlies out-rebounded the Panthers 30-13 in the second frame while limiting the home squad to just eight made field goals over the final 20 minutes (29.6 percent).

Montana, though, gave up a 19-3 run to close the first half and were out-shot 54 to 32 percent.

"They were playing harder than us," head coach Travis DeCuire said about the first half. "That should never happen. We should never let someone play harder than us."

The Grizzlies trailed by 17 at the half, but began the second period on a 6-0 run to cut the deficit to 11. They would get within six, but no closer, until the Grizzlies made three consecutive three-pointers during a 9-0 Montana run to get within four, 61-57, with 5:40 to play.

Up to that point, Montana was just 2-of-17 from beyond the arc, but Ahmaad Rorie hit a triple, followed by back-to-back treys from Bobby Moorehead.

"Our issue is our issue, and at some point it's got to get solved or it will be a long season," DeCuire said. "The effort, the energy that we brought when we were down 17 needs to be brought at the beginning of the game. We did not mentally prepare ourselves to compete."

Following three points from Georgia State, Montana would score five in a row to get within two points, 64-62. The two teams would alternate baskets over the next several possessions before a Jamar Akoh tip-in tied the score at 68-68 with 1:10 to play.

It marked the closest Montana had been since 8:06 in the first half, the beginning of Georgia State's 19-3 run to close the opening frame.

With the game tied and under a minute to play, Rorie forced a steal to give Montana a chance to take the lead, but his breakaway dunk attempt was blocked. Still with the ball, Montana called timeout and drew up a play. Moorehead took a three-point attempt that looked true but was just long, and Jamar Akoh was called for a foul on the rebound.

"We ran a double-high ball screen, we knew they'd react to that," DeCuire said. The idea was for Rorie to either lob it to Michael Oguine or kick it out to Moorehead, who spun to the opposite side of the floor. "We got a good shot, just ended up getting called for a foul on the rebound."

Georgia State hit both free throws and following a Montana turnover trying to tie the game, the Grizzlies were forced to foul again. The Panthers were one-of-two, giving Rorie a long three-point chance at the buzzer, but it was heavily contested and a little left.

Rorie led all players with 22 points. He also had seven rebounds and four assists. Akoh scored 14 points on 5-of-7 shooting, adding a team-most nine rebounds. All but three of his points came in the second half. Oguine had 11 points and five steals.

The Grizzlies will now have eight days before their next competition, giving them a chance to focus on their studies and prepare for their final three non-conference games.

"We're going to go compete," DeCuire said. "We're going to go compete all week. Our competitiveness needs to be sustained at a high level."

Additional Notes:

- Montana shot a season-best 80.8 percent from the free-throw line, making 21 of 26 attempts. Over the past two games, the Grizzlies are 41-of-51 (80.4 percent); they were shooting 62.5 percent (95-of-152) through the first seven games.
- After being out-rebounded 20-10 in the first half, Montana finished the game plus-seven on the boards (40-33), including 14-9 on the offensive glass.
- Georgia State's D'Marcus Simmonds entered the game ranked 39th nationally, averaging 20.5 points per game. The Grizzlies held him to 12 points, including zero in the second half.
- The Grizzlies led for 5:08 of the contest, jumping out to a 4-0 lead and leading as late as 19-17 with 8:19 to play in the first half.
- Georgia State, a team that has played in postseason tournaments in three of the past four seasons, improved to 51-8 on its home court over the past five seasons.
- Montana missed several scoring opportunities, missing 17 layup or dunk attempts.
- Montana was just the third team this season to score 68 points on Georgia State in regulation. The Panthers entered the game ranked 17th, allowing just 61.4 points per game.
- For the first time this season, Montana turned the ball over more times than its opponent (15-14). The Grizzlies did force the Panthers into 2.5 more turnovers than their season average, however (38th in NCAA).

FINALLY AT HOME, MONTANA LOOKS FOR CONSISTENT INTENSITY DURING TWO-GAME HOME STRETCH

At times, the Montana men's basketball team has shown defensive tenacity and solid production on offense. Other times, the Grizzlies have gone through lapses, allowing opponents to go on large scoring runs. Montana has potential, but is searching for consistency as it enters the final week of non-conference play.

After beginning the year with back-to-back wins over Whitworth and Pitt, Montana has alternated wins and losses in its following games. It's hard to blame the Grizzlies for being out of synch at times. The Grizzlies have already traveled more than 11,500 miles – taking two trips to the East Coast and three flights to the state of California. On their last trip, they had one game canceled due to wildfires, only to have its next game nearly canceled due to snow.

This week, Montana finally has the opportunity to play back-to-back home games for the first time all season, hosting UC Riverside on Sunday afternoon and UC Irvine on Tuesday. The Grizzlies are unbeaten at home this season, and are relishing the opportunity to get into a routine and play on their home floor.

"It's an opportunity to get in front of our fans, play at home, sleep in our own beds," head coach Travis DeCuire said. "We just haven't had a lot of those opportunities with so many games being on the road. And you want to go into conference with some momentum. If we can get a little streak going, or get two out of three or something like that, I'd feel pretty good about it."

After returning from Atlanta on Sunday, the team was able to take three full days off to rest, rehab and prepare for final exams. The team got back onto the court on Wednesday and is in the midst of four consecutive days of practice before hosting the Highlanders on Sunday.

How rare has the full week at home been for the Grizzlies? During the first 30 days of the season, Montana was on the road for 19 of them.

Following their season opener on Nov. 10, they were on an airplane nine hours later flying to the state of Pennsylvania for a six-day trip. After back-to-back games against Power-5 teams, the Grizzlies had two practices at home before flying to California to continue the Legends Classic.

The Grizzlies then had two practices in Missoula to prepare for Carroll, but just one the following day before traveling to Stanford. After getting home from that trip, it was two quick practices before hosting CSUN, then one more before hitting the road for six days again.

DeCuire won't let his team use the chaotic schedule as an excuse, but is excited to see how his team responds after having some regularity this week.

"We should see some growth," he said. "When your day isn't consistent, sometimes your play isn't consistent. We've seen a lot of intensity this week, so I'm excited to see them put it on the floor under the lights."

The words consistency and intensity come up frequently when talking with DeCuire, which is why it comes as no surprise that the biggest need for his team, according to the head coach, is "consistent intensity."

"When we compete for 40 minutes and we play hard for 40 minutes, we're a really good basketball team," he said.

UC Riverside's trip to Missoula is a return trip from a year ago, when Montana defeated the Highlanders in Riverside. Ahmaad Rorie had 25 points in the eight-point win, while Sayeed Pridgett had 10 points and three blocked shots. The Grizzlies shot 65 percent in the second half, and their defense limited the Highlanders to 36 percent shooting overall and forced them into 22 turnovers.

More so, it began a stretch of seven wins in an eight-game period, including a 5-1 start to conference play.

UC Riverside is 3-6 on the season, most-recently snapping a four-game skid with a win over Air Force. The Highlanders have three players in double figures, led by Dikymbe Martin, who averages 12.7 points. In last year's meeting, Chance Murray had 15 points for UC Riverside. He's UCR's second-leading scorer (10.8), and ranks first for steals and second for rebounds and assists.

DeCuire also noted 6-10 senior Alex Larsson, the team's leading rebounder (7.0) who adds 10.8 points per game on .563 shooting.

"They'll be physical in the middle," DeCuire said. "He'll (Larsson) be physical and tough to defend in the paint. He's a good scorer around the basket."

UC Riverside has played 40 minutes of zone the last three games, so it will be important to play at a quick pace.

"We need to find ways to get in transition, attack the zones and get down the floor before they get set," DeCuire said.

Two strengths of Montana have been rebounding and forcing turnovers. The Highlanders rank 327th nationally with 16.3 turnovers per game and a -3.4 turnover margin, compared to a +4.6 for Montana. UC Riverside collects boards – 39.1 per game, compared to 35.0 for Montana – but is also allowing 40.5.

One area to keep an eye on will be three-point shooting. Both teams have struggled from long range this season. However, while UC Riverside has struggled offensively, its opponents are shooting just .283 from beyond the arc (14th in NCAA).

Sunday's game is Youth Day, with all children 12 and under admitted for free with an accompanied adult. There will also be free photos with Santa Monte at halftime.

SERIES VS. THE HIGHLANDERS

Sunday will mark the sixth meeting in the past 13 seasons between Montana and UC Riverside. The Grizzlies hold a 4-1 mark, winning the last two in the series. Montana is also unbeaten at home vs. the Highlanders, winning in 2006-07 and 2009-10.

In last year's win at Riverside, Ahmaad Rorie led all players with 25 points. Sayeed Pridgett was also in double figures with 10 points and three blocks. Montana shot 65 percent in the second half and held the Highlanders to 36 percent overall, also forcing 22 turnovers. The victory started a stretch of seven wins in an eight-game period for the Grizzlies.

While playing at Cal State Fullerton, Jamar Akoh played against UC Riverside several times, including a season-best 12 points and eight boards as a freshman in 2015 and 10 points and five boards in the Big West quarterfinals.

AKOH TAKING OVER

The Grizzlies had high hopes for Jamar Akoh, a transfer from Cal State Fullerton who redshirted a year ago. In his first two games, however, he combined for just four points and two rebounds, being limited to 28 total minutes due to foul trouble.

Since those first two games, Akoh has begun to take over down low, averaging 11.1 points and 7.0 rebounds, shooting 59.2 percent. He has five double-figure scoring games during that seven-game span, including a double-double with 16 points and 10 boards vs. Carroll (Nov. 26).

CHARITY STRIPE

Montana shot a season-best 80.8 percent from the free-throw line at Georgia State (Dec. 9), making 21 of 26 attempts. Over the past two games, the Grizzlies are 41-of-51 (80.4 percent); they were shooting 62.5 percent (95-of-152) through the first seven games.

NARROW DEFEATS

Montana holds a winning record, but also feels as if it has let some other games slip away. Of Montana's four losses, it has led or been within a possession late in the second half.

- At Penn State (Big Ten), Montana held early leads and was within a single possession, 58-55, with under 4 minutes to play.
- In the championship game of the Legends Classic Malibu Region, Montana overcame a slow start to take second-half leads, including 48-46 with 12:51 remaining.
- At Stanford (Pac-12), Montana held multiple second-half leads, including by as many as six points, 50-44, with under 10 minutes left on the clock.
- Montana overcame a 17-point halftime deficit to tie the game and have the ball with under a minute to play at Georgia State.

HOME SWEET HOME

Montana has won more than 80 percent of its contests in Dahlberg Arena over the past decade, going 107-25 (.811) since the start of the 2008-09 season, including a perfect 3-0 this year. All-time, the Grizzlies boast one of the best home-court advantages, going 681-240 (.739) in their home arena.

STRONG NOVEMBER

The first month of the season was – all in all – a success. Montana posted a 4-3 record, marking the team's first winning November since 2011-12. For

comparison, Montana was a combined 6-16 in the previous four Novembers.

Even more impressive, the Grizzlies are having success against much stronger competition, already playing five games away from Missoula and three against Power-5 competition.

"We're sitting in a good spot going into December," Travis DeCuire said at the time. "I am happy with where we're at, but we have to be a better basketball team. Two of our three losses, we walked away feeling like we should have won, and one of them we felt like we could have won. If we execute better and make fewer mistakes offensively, we have the chance to be a pretty good team."

INTO DECEMBER

The Grizzlies followed up a strong November with a win to begin the month of December. At 5-3, it was the program's best eight-game start since 2010-11. A win on Wednesday would not only be a signature victory over a ranked opponent, but it would also be the team's best nine-game start since 2009-10. The Grizzlies won 20-plus games and played in the postseason in both 2010 and 2011.

ALL-AROUND RORIE

Ahmaad Rorie played in all 40 minutes vs. UC Santa Barbara and ranks 18th nationally for minutes played per game. He also ranks highly, however, for points (18.4 per game) and steals (1.8 per game). In fact, Rorie is one of 13 NCAA Division I players to average at least 18.0 points per game and total 16 or more steals.

FORCING TURNOVERS

Montana has forced more turnovers than its opponents in seven of nine games, tying Penn State with 15 turnovers apiece in another. The advantage has led to a +5.3 turnover margin (24th in NCAA). On two occasions, Montana has forced 20 or more turnovers in a game, and in a win at Pitt (Nov. 13), the Grizzlies forced the Panthers into 19 turnovers, converting them into 30 points – an average of 1.58 points per turnover.

CRASHING THE GLASS

Montana has out-rebounded its opponents in seven of its last eight games, which is particularly impressive considering three of those contests have come against Power-5 teams. Well over one-third of Montana's rebounds have come from the offensive end (37.4 percent). That number was 28.6

percent a year ago.

Michael Oguine, tied for UM's leading rebounder, has more offensive boards (27) than defensive (24), as does freshman Karl Nicholas (16 to nine). Over their last five games, the Grizzlies have out-rebounded their opponents 72-37 on the offensive glass. They are averaging 13.11 offensive rebounds per game this season (35th in NCAA). Nearly one-fifth of Montana's points have been second-chance opportunities (125 points; 19.3 percent).

STOUT DEFENSE

Montana is allowing its opponents to shoot at too high of a percentage, particularly from the three-point line. However, the Grizzlies are doing a good job of preventing teams from getting shots.

DYNAMIC DUO, PART I

Junior guards Michael Oguine and Ahmaad Rorie enter Sunday's contest each averaging more than 16.0 points per game, both ranking in the top 250 of all NCAA Division I scorers.

Oguine has scored in double figures in all nine games, while Rorie has accomplished the feat eight times – including 20-plus on four occasions. Montana is one of 32 Division-I teams nationally to have two scorers averaging 16.0 points or more per game.

WELL CONDITIONED

Montana has three players who rank among the top 75 for minutes played. Ahmaad Rorie is averaging 37:00 per game, including all 40 vs. UC Santa Barbara (Nov. 21). Fellow juniors Michael Oguine (35:13) and Bobby Moorehead (34:53) are also among the nation's leaders. In fact, Montana is one of 10 Division-I schools nationally to have three players average 34:00 per game or better (also: Arizona State, Duquesne, George Mason, Holy Cross, La Salle, Mt. St. Mary's, Ohio, Santa Clara and Toledo).

Twelve different Grizzlies played at Penn State (Nov. 15), but just six played more than 7 minutes. It was the same two nights prior at Pitt (Nov. 13), as Travis DeCuire used the same five players throughout the final 7:34 of the second half and all 5 minutes of overtime.

BUCKING THE TREND

Penn State entered its Nov. 15 contest vs. Montana ranked seventh nationally, averaging 13.0 steals per game. The Grizzlies protected the ball, however, limiting the Nittany Lions to just three steals. A week later vs. UC Santa Barbara, Montana was going up against a Gauchos squad that ranked fifth nationally, turning the ball over just 8.0 times per game. The Griz defense was active and stingy, forcing UCSB into 21 turnovers – nearly three times its season average.

MORE MOOREHEAD

Following Montana's game at Stanford (Nov. 29), Travis DeCuire said that the team needs to get junior Bobby Moorehead the ball more. After struggling offensively for most of his sophomore season, Moorehead is Montana's third-leading scorer, reaching double figures four times.

In addition to his 9.3 points per game, Moorehead ranks second for three-pointers (16) and third for steals (11), rebounding (4.8 per game) and assists (13).

NICHOLAS FINDING HIS FORM

Travis DeCuire had high expectations for Karl Nicholas, but the freshman was limited early in the season due to foul trouble. Through his first three career games, Nicholas averaged just 7.7 minutes per game, picking up four fouls in each contest.

The Texas native had a breakout week in Malibu, Calif., however, playing 18 minutes vs. Oral Roberts (Nov. 20) and 28 minutes vs. UC Santa Barbara (Nov. 21). Nicholas averaged 10.5 points per game over the two contests, connecting on 10 of 15 shot attempts. Nicholas also added nine rebounds in the two games.

CLUTCH RORIE

Junior guard Ahmaad Rorie has scored in double figures seven times this season, averaging 18.0 points per game. The point total is impressive, but more impressive is when he is scoring. Six of Rorie's 18 points at Pitt (Nov. 13) came in the overtime period, while two nights later at Penn State (Nov. 15), he had four points, a steal and an assist during a 9-0 UM run to cut the Grizzlies' deficit to a single point, 51-50, midway through the second half.

The all-conference performer was on full display again vs. Oral Roberts (Nov. 20), scoring a team-high 18 points, in addition to six assists and three steals. Trailing 17-16 with 8 minutes to play in the first half, Montana closed the half on a 15-6 run. Rorie had nine points and two assists during that run, contributing to six of UM's eight made field goals. He was again clutch late, knocking down both free-throw attempts with 22 seconds to play to increase Montana's lead to two possessions.

Rorie was named to the Legends Classic Malibu Region All-Tournament team after playing 75 of 80 minutes and totaling 38 points, 12 assists, seven steals and six rebounds.

OGUINE RECOGNIZED BY COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS

Junior guard Michael Oguine was the College Sports Madness Big Sky Player of the Week for games played Nov. 13-19. Oguine scored a career-most 29 points in a signature victory at Pitt (Nov. 13) and then two days later at Penn State (Nov. 15), totaled 15 points and grabbed seven boards in a narrow loss to the Nittany Lions.

Oguine has scored in double figures in all eight games and is the team leader for rebounding, despite standing at just 6-2. Oguine ranks second on the team with 21 assists, to go along with eight steals and six blocked shots.

A SIGNATURE VICTORY

After coming close, but not close enough, multiple times against Power-5 teams, Montana finally got over the hump and knocked off Pitt on Nov. 13 in Pittsburgh. The win snapped Montana's 14-game losing streak against Power-5 schools and was the school's first since 2010. It marked Montana's first over a team currently in the ACC since 1966.

Montana led for nearly 24 minutes against Pitt, including by as many as seven points. Below are key stats that led the Grizzlies to their signature victory:

- Montana forced Pitt into 19 turnovers, turning them into 30 points. Two of the turnovers were offensive charges, one taken by Karl Nicholas and another by Fabijan Krslovic. Krslovic finished with a team-most nine rebounds, two blocked shots and two steals.
- Montana out-rebounded Pitt, 39-38, including 14-12 on the offensive glass.
- The Grizzlies held the lead for 23:46, compared to 14:07 for the Panthers.
- Montana overcame foul trouble – three players finished the game with

four fouls – and a slow start at the free-throw line. The Grizzlies began the game just 4-for-11 from the charity stripe before finishing 12-of-14 down the stretch – including 10 makes in a row at one point – to put the game out of reach.

- After trailing by a game-most seven points, 28-21, with under 5 minutes to play in the first half, Montana closed the half on a 16-7 run to head into the intermission leading by two, 37-35.
- The Grizzlies started the game 0-for-7 from three-point range before Ahmaad Rorie hit back-to-back threes late in the first half. Bobby Moorehead followed with two more, giving the Grizzlies 12 consecutive points off of three-pointers and a 33-32 advantage.
- Trailing by four, 69-65, with under 3 minutes to play, Montana went on an 8-2 run over the next 2 minutes to take a 73-71 advantage. Oguine scored all eight points for the Griz.
- After alternating baskets to begin overtime, Montana scored to take a 79-77 lead and then held Pitt without a made field goal over its final three attempts.

PARTIAL ARRIVAL

Montana's win at Pitt (Nov. 13) was huge for the program. The Grizzlies knocked off an ACC team that has played in 13 of the last 16 NCAA tournaments, on its home court no less. Pitt entered the contest with a 135-5 all-time mark in non-conference games at the Petersen Events Center and had never lost a home opener in the building.

The victory, however, will mean little if the team doesn't use it as a springboard into the rest of the season, particularly in March.

"We want to win these games in November so we can win these games in March," Travis DeCuire said afterward, noting that he schedules games like these in order to prepare his team for Big Sky Conference action and, hopefully, the postseason.

BIG-GAMER OGUINE

Junior guard Michael Oguine scored a career-high 29 points in Montana's win at Pitt (Nov. 13), but more impressive than the 29 points or team-most five assists was the fact that Oguine took over when it mattered most.

He scored 16 of his points in the final 8:32 of regulation, including Montana's final 10 points overall. Trailing 67-63 with 4:32 to play, Oguine outscored Pitt's entire team, 10-4, to give Montana a two-point lead in the final minute of regulation.

"Mike's one of those guys where when he's mad he's better," Travis DeCuire said. "If he thinks it's time to put everybody on his back, he's going to get it done. He carried us when we needed him to."

100 AND COUNTING

Nov. 13 was a special night for the Montana basketball program, but for two Grizzlies in particular.

Fabijan Krslovic played in his 100th consecutive game. The senior from Australia has played in every UM game since the start of the 2014-15 season (now 107, including 90 starts). Additionally, the game against Pitt was Travis DeCuire's 100th game as head coach. The former Griz player was 59-41 following the signature victory, the fifth-best mark through 100 games out of Montana's 25 head coaches. DeCuire has led Montana to a 2014-15 regular-season conference title and back-to-back appearances in the Big Sky Conference tournament championship game (2015 and 2016).

STARTING STRONG

Montana's wins over Whitworth (Nov. 10) and Pitt (Nov. 13) gave the Grizzlies their first 2-0 start to a season since the 2009-10 squad began the year with three consecutive wins. That team finished with a 22-10 record, winning a Big Sky championship and advancing to the NCAA tournament.

WORKING OVERTIME

Montana won its first overtime game in nearly two years on Nov. 13, defeating Pitt, 83-78. Prior to that, Montana's last overtime victory was a double-overtime win at Northern Arizona on Dec. 31, 2015. The Grizzlies lost both overtime contests in 2016-17.

GOING SMALL

One of the expected strengths to Montana's roster this year is its height compared to a year ago. The Grizzlies have three players listed at 6-8 or taller compared to just one a year ago (not including UM's three players 6-8 or taller who are sitting out for the season).

However, several times this season Travis DeCuire has gone with a smaller lineup. The smaller unit allowed Montana to go on a second-half run in its season opener vs. Whitworth (Nov. 10) and has allowed the team to spread the ball better and quicker.

HOME-OPENING SUCCESS

With Montana's win over Whitworth (Nov. 10), the Grizzlies improved to 15-3 in home openers since the turn of the century.

DEBUTING

Montana's season opener vs. Whitworth (Nov. 10) marked collegiate and UM debuts for several Grizzlies. Junior Jamar Akoh, a transfer from Cal State Fullerton, earned the start. Also seeing consistent time were freshmen Timmy Falls and Karl Nicholas. In the final minute of the game, Travis DeCuire inserted Admir Besovic, Niko Bevens and Lars Espe.

ANDERSON SIGNED

Montana signed Mack Anderson to a National Letter of Intent on Nov. 8. The Bozeman native selected Montana over offers from Montana State and Air Force, and after visiting Boise State and Denver.

Anderson averaged nearly two blocks per game during the 2017 state tournament, helping Bozeman High School to a runner-up finish at the Montana Class 2A state tournament. After mostly talking with NAIA schools, Anderson burst onto the scene over the summer while playing for Montana Elite.

"I like his athleticism and agility," Travis DeCuire said. "Not very often do you get a 6-8 athlete who can run and jump and ball a little bit. We're excited about what he presents in the future."

LOOKING AHEAD

For the first time this season, Montana will play back-to-back home games. The Grizzlies will host UC Irvine on Tuesday evening, before traveling to Washington to close the non-conference portion of their season.

Prior to Tuesday's game, Montana will celebrate former Griz Delvon Anderson, who passed away in August. His family will be in attendance and will receive an award on his behalf.

PRESEASON NOTES

RETURNING TALENT

The Grizzlies have the pieces to contend this season, returning three of their four consistent starters from 2016-17, in addition to a pair of guards – Sayeed Pridgett and Bobby Moorehead – who each started about one-third of last year's contests.

In total, Montana returns the majority of its production in all aspects of the game, bringing back its top two scorers, and four of its top five. On the other end of the floor, Montana had six players with 90 or more rebounds a year ago; five of them are back on the court.

NEW GUYS COMING IN

While Montana returns the majority of its production from a year ago, the team also turned over roughly half of its roster, with several newcomers expected to slide in and fill roles immediately. The Grizzlies signed six freshmen, in addition to sophomore JUCO transfer Niko Bevens.

- **Admir Besovic** – Originally from Bosnia and Herzegovina, has spent the past two seasons at the Virginia Episcopal School in Lynchburg, where he averaged 11.2 points and 6.8 rebounds last year as a team captain.
- **Niko Bevens** – As a freshman at North Idaho College, led the Cardinals to an NWAC Eastern Conference championship by making 50 percent of his three-point attempts.
- **Lars Espe** – 2016-17 Young Player of the Year in the BLNO, Norway's premier professional basketball league.
- **Timmy Falls** – 2016-17 East Bay Athletic League MVP.
- **Peter Jones** – Played in 26 games as a senior at O'Dea High School, averaging 4.8 points per game.
- **Kelby Kramer** – No. 2 prep prospect from the state of Wyoming, being named to USA Today's All-USA Wyoming Boys Basketball Team
- **Karl Nicholas** – As the 17th-best prep prospect from the state of Texas, was named the 2016-17 Texas District 22-6A MVP.

DYNAMIC DUO, PART II

Montana boasts one of the top duos in the Big Sky with junior guards Ahmaad Rorie and Michael Oguine. The two combined to score well over one-third of the team's points a year ago, also ranking No. 1 and 2 for minutes played.

A transfer from Oregon, Rorie made a name for himself during his first season in the league, earning second-team All-Big Sky honors. He started all 31 contest, and led the Grizzlies in minutes (32.5 per game), points (17.6), assists (97), field goals made (192), three-pointers (63) and free-throw percent-age (.833). His 1.2 assist-to-turnover ratio helped Montana have the 12th-fewest turnovers in Division I in 2016-17.

After recording the second-most points ever for a Montana freshman, Oguine followed up his debut season with an even better sophomore campaign. He averaged 11.9 points per game – including 13.3 during conference play – and shot .481 from the floor. He ranked second on the team for points, re-bounds (6.0 per game) and steals (37), and earned third-team all-conference honors.

Both players have been named to various publications' preseason all-conference teams, with Rorie being one of six players selected to the official preseason All-Big Sky team voted on by the league's coaches.

FABULOUS SENIOR

Montana's lone senior is Australian Fabijan Krslovic, who entered the season having played in 100 consecutive games – starting 83. Krslovic was Montana's top rebounder in 2016-17, with more than one-third of his boards coming on the offensive glass. He also led Montana with 15 steals and 20 blocked shots and was one of just three Big Sky players to rank in the top 15 in the conference for both categories.

Krslovic will admit he's not the most athletic player on the court, but he's consistent and is the glue of the team, according to the coaching staff. After being forced to be more of a center last year because of Montana's lack of height, he will now transition into a more natural role as a 6-8 forward.

ADDED HEIGHT

A year ago, Fabijan Krslovic (6-8) was the Grizzlies' tallest player, which forced him to play a different role

as Montana's only true post player. This year, he is one of five players at 6-8 or taller. It was a conscious effort by DeCuire, looking to add more height and depth to his team's roster.

Admir Besovic (7-0) and Kelby Kramer (6-10) are still raw as true freshmen, adjusting to the quicker style of play in the college game, but both can play a true center position. Kramer is more of a shot-blocker and rebounder, while Besovic has the ability to clog the lane and make it tough for opposing offenses to penetrate to the rim.

Montana believes it has a solid low-presence combination of Krslovic and transfer Jamar Akoh, and also has 6-8 Karl Nicholas, who can be an athletic force on both ends of the court.

MORE RETURNING TALENT

In addition to Montana's senior and pair of all-conference guards, the team returns three other players, including Sayeed Pridgett and Bobby Moorehead.

As a true freshman, Pridgett earned 11 starts and ranked ninth in the Big Sky with a .524 field-goal percentage. He was also the team's third-best rebounder (3.9 per game) and ranked fourth on the team for points (8.1 per game) and assists (44). In his second collegiate season, Moorehead started 10 games and averaged 2.8 rebounds per game while adding 3.9 points, 10 total steals and nine blocked shots. Sophomore guard Trever Spojka is also back. The Billings native saw action in eight contests as a redshirt freshman, totaling 10 points on 3-of-7 shooting.

STARTING THEM YOUNG

Montana is one of 11 NCAA Division I schools nationally to have at least nine newcomer and just one senior.

Kentucky leads the nation with 12 newcomers and zero seniors, while Auburn has a dozen newcomers and one senior. Tennessee, Toledo and Wofford each have 10 newcomers and one senior, while Montana, Bowling Green, Holy Cross, Kansas State, Louisiana Tech and Oklahoma have nine new players and one expected graduate.

DORSEY TO MISS SEASON

The Grizzlies will be without junior forward Donaven Dorsey this season. Dorsey, who redshirted in 2016-17 after transferring from the University of Washington, suffered a pair of hip injuries that require separate surgeries. The first was performed on Oct. 23. He played in 55 games over two seasons with the Huskies, earning eight starts. He totaled 166 points and 77 rebounds.

PICKED TO FINISH 3RD

Montana has high expectations for itself, and those who follow Big Sky basketball feel similar. In the preseason polls, Montana was picked to finish third by both the coaches and media. The Grizzlies were slotted to finish behind Idaho and Weber State in both polls (complete listing on Page 8).

Travis DeCuire said being picked to finish in the upper echelon is a sign of respect, but he and his team have their own set of goals, especially after winning a regular-season championship in 2015 and playing in the conference tournament title game in both 2015 and 2016.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

A year ago, Travis DeCuire believed he compiled the most-challenging schedule in program history, facing an all-Division-I slate. This year, it may

be even tougher. The Grizzlies open the season with 13 non-conference games, five of which are against Power-5 teams. The team's first road trip is at Pitt (ACC) and Penn State (Big Ten) – part of the prestigious Legends Classic. The tournament will continue the following week in Malibu, Calif., as Montana takes on Oral Roberts and either UC Santa Barbara or host Pepperdine.

The Grizzlies will get their air miles several weeks later, traveling to Georgia State, in addition to three contests against Pac-12 foes – Stanford, UCLA and Washington. The Bruins are ranked in the AP pre-season top-25 poll.

In Missoula, Montana will host Cal State Northridge, Carroll, UC Irvine, UC Riverside and Whitworth. The 18-game league schedule will begin Dec. 28 and include home-and-home contests against Montana State, North Dakota, Northern Arizona, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State and Southern Utah. Montana will also will travel to Eastern Washington and Idaho, and will host Idaho State and Weber State to close the regular season.

The Big Sky Conference tournament will be held in Reno, Nev., for the final year before moving to Boise, Idaho, next spring.

TEAM BONDING IN COSTA RICA

The Grizzlies got a head start to the basketball season, taking a foreign tour to Costa Rica in early August. The NCAA allows for teams to participate in such trips once every four years. The trip was beneficial in several facets. In addition to key bonding time – being in a foreign country with your teammates and being able to partake in several activities, including pool time and a zip line through a jungle – and service initiatives – the team spent a day at an orphanage, playing sports with the children and reading to them – the team also competed in a pair of scrimmages and was allotted 10 practices in Missoula leading up to the trip.

The tour allowed for Travis DeCuire to introduce concepts to his team – particularly the newcomers – much earlier than he usually would, and noted that the team was ahead of where they normally were early in fall camp.

SECURING THE BALL

Montana averaged just 10.8 turnovers per game a year ago, the 12th-fewest in all of NCAA Division I basketball.

PROUD HISTORY

Travis DeCuire is well aware of Montana's proud history, and has experienced it firsthand. During the 1990s, Montana won the Big Sky Conference and played in the NCAA tournament three times in a seven-year period, including DeCuire's sophomore campaign. The two-time All-Big Sky selection still holds Montana's record for career assists.

Since Montana's first conference championship in 1975, no Big Sky team has won more conference titles (10) than Montana. Additionally, the Grizzlies have won nine tournament titles and have nine runner-up finishes – including three championships and three runner-up finishes in the past eight seasons. In the league's history, Montana has won more games than any Big Sky school except for Weber State.

DECUIRE REACHES MILESTONE

Midway through last season, DeCuire's third in Missoula, the Grizzlies defeated Northern Colorado to earn the head coach his 50th victory. He is the second-fastest Griz coach to reach that milestone (84 games). The fastest to 50 was Blaine Taylor, DeCuire's head coach when he played for the Griz.

TRAVIS DECUIRE

Head Coach | Fourth Season | Montana, 1994

In his first two seasons as the University of Montana's 27th men's head basketball coach, Travis DeCure accomplished something no other coach in UM history had: he posted two 20-win seasons in his first two seasons.

Now entering the fourth season at his alma mater, DeCure is once again poised to put the Grizzlies back on the road to a 20-win campaign.

DeCure (pronounced: dee-CURE) was formally introduced as the Grizzlies' head basketball coach in June 2014, at a press conference at UM's Adams Center after the initial announcement from UM's Director of Athletics Kent Haslam in May of that year.

In his first season at the helm of a program with a rich history of success, DeCure's Griz started the year picked to finish eighth in the conference. Led by future European professional Jordan Gregory, UM would go on to defy expectations and win the Big Sky regular-season championship and advance to the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) before finishing the season 20-13 (14-4 BSC).

At the time, he became only the second coach in UM history to notch 20 victories in his first season at the helm – a feat also accomplished by Blaine Taylor in 1991-92 (27-4).

In DeCure's second year, he followed up with another 20-win season and another trip to the Big Sky championship game, this time led by future European professional Martin Breunig. DeCure's Grizzlies would once again advance to the postseason, competing in the first round of the CBI tournament against Nevada, finishing with a 21-12 (14-4 BSC) record.

Paced by 10 underclassmen and just two seniors who played significant time, the Grizzlies went 16-16 (11-7 BSC) in 2016-17, earning a first-round bye in the Big Sky tournament. During the season, DeCure became the second-fastest UM head coach to reach 50 wins (doing so in 84 contests). He coached a pair of UM sophomores – both returning in 2017-18 – to All-Big Sky Conference recognition.

The 2016-17 season was also the second consecutive year in which the Grizzlies have posted a team grade-point average above 3.0, earning NABC Team Academic Excellence recognition both seasons.

Prior to returning to his alma mater as head coach, DeCure spent six seasons (2008-09 through 2013-14) on the University of California coaching staff – including the final four as associate head coach. Regarded as one of the top tutors in the game, DeCure helped former Montana mentor Mike Montgomery – a member of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame – transform Cal into one of the winningest programs in the Pac-12 during his time in Berkeley. The Bears reached the postseason all six years he was on the staff, including the NCAA tournament four times. The Golden Bears boasted 130 wins in his six seasons – the best six-year stretch in school history – winning the 2010 Pac-10 championship. He coached numerous all-conference selections, including conference players of the year Jerome Randle (2010) and Jorge Gutierrez (2012).

DeCure he spent five seasons (2003-04 through 2007-08) as an assistant coach at Old Dominion, under former Griz head coach and player Blaine Taylor. There, he helped the Monarchs to a combined record of 117-53. The mark included 94 wins during his final four seasons – the most in school history over a four-year stretch. ODU reached the postseason each of those four seasons and advanced to the NCAA tournament in both 2005 and 2007 – winning a school-record 28 contests in 2005. Additionally, the Monarchs reached the NIT semifinals in 2006 and the quarterfinals of the College Basketball Invitational in 2008.

DeCure, from Seattle, Wash., also has head coaching experience from stints at Sammamish High School and Green River Community College in Washington. At GRCC, DeCure took over a last-place program and guided it to a conference championship and its first 20-win season in more than 20 years, earning league coach-of-the-year honors in 2003 – his second season. At Sammamish High School in Bellevue, DeCure led his team to a pair of conference titles, a state tournament appearance and three consecutive trips to the district tournament.

As a point guard for Montana from 1992-94 DeCure was named All-Big Sky Conference as a junior and senior. He set a school record in just three seasons with 435 career assists. He also established UM's single-season mark with 199 assists as a senior in 1993-94, when he was ranked 12th in the nation, averaging 7.1 assists a game. He was the recipient of the Grizzlies' Carl Dragstedt Award (MVP) as a junior and senior, and received the John Eahheart Award (Outstanding Defensive Player) following his senior year.

As a freshman at Chaminade-Hawaii, he was a starter and team MVP in 1990. He then transferred to Montana and redshirted in 1991. DeCure attended Mercer Island High School (Wash.), where he was a three-year starter and all-state, team MVP, and a McDonald's All-America honorable mention pick as a senior.

He has a strong commitment to community service and founded and acted as president of the Fastbreak Basketball Association – an organization that assists in teaching life lessons and building self-esteem through basketball to more than 500 students in the Seattle-Tacoma area. Additionally, he has extensive experience in counseling at the Echo Glen Children's Center in Snoqualmie, Wash., from 1996-98, and with the Ryther Children's Center in North Seattle, from 1995-97.

DeCure graduated from Montana in 1994 with a degree in business marketing. He and his wife, Sabrina, have two daughters – Brianna (24) and Tamia (5).
