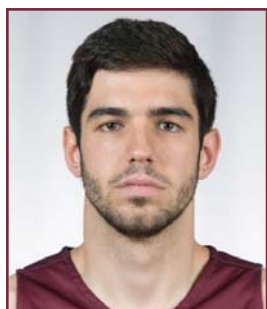

MONTANA NEVER TRAILS IN WIN OVER UC RIVERSIDE

MISSOULA, Mont. – The Montana Grizzlies jumped out to a 9-0 lead Sunday afternoon and never trailed to the visiting Highlanders, defeating UC Riverside, 77-61, at Dahlberg Arena. The win keeps Montana undefeated at home this season (4-0) and gives the Grizzlies their highest non-conference win total since 2011-12. Montana still has two non-conference games remaining, including a showdown vs. Big West favorite UC Irvine on Tuesday in Missoula.

“We needed to clean some things up offensively, so we went to some fundamental work our first few days of practice this week and I thought it showed,” head coach Travis DeCuire said. “We passed the ball a lot better, we attacked from the spots we wanted to attack from. It was a good performance.”

The Grizzlies held UC Riverside without a basket for the first 6 minutes, 20 seconds of the contest and limited the Highlanders to 21 points overall in the first half – the fewest points scored in a half this season by a Montana opponent

With a 12-point halftime lead, the Grizzlies really kicked it into high gear to begin the second half, however.

UC Riverside made its first shot attempt of the second half, but from that point forward, the next 6:23 was all Montana, as the Grizzlies used a 17-0 run to more than double up the Highlanders, 50-23. Montana would lead by as many as 29 points.

“That was an area for growth for us,” DeCuire said. “What are you going to do when you have a little bit of success? Can you compete like you’re down? One of the things I put on the board (at halftime) was ‘compete’ and ‘inspiration’. I thought we did that for longer stretches than we have.”

Junior Jamar Akoh had season highs for both points (17) and rebounds (12), recording his second double-double. He shot 4-of-5 from the floor, but more impressive, was a perfect 9-for-9 from the free-throw line.

“Jamar only had five shots, but he had a lot of touches that led to a lot of baskets,” DeCuire said.

Over the past five games, Akoh is averaging 12.8 points and 8.8 rebounds per game. On Sunday, he also added two blocked shots, two assists and a steal.

In addition to Akoh’s 17 points, junior Ahmaad Rorie was clicking all day, making 8-of-13 shots – including six of seven from inside three-point range – to tally 22 points and three steals. It marked his sixth 20-point scoring performance of the season, including third in a row

Junior Michael Oguine finished with 12 points and three blocked shots, with 11 of his points coming in the second half. Junior Bobby Moorehead scored nine points and had eight rebounds.

Early in the second half, Moorehead hit a three-pointer and then on the ensuing play, stole a ball and took it down the court for a lay-in that he converted into a three-point play when he was fouled. The six points in a 10-second span were the start of Montana’s 17-0 run

“Defensively, we were active, we were all over the place,” DeCuire said. “I thought we scrapped and we deflected a lot of balls, and that led to some points.”

The Grizzlies had 22 rebounds in the second half alone, compared to UC Riverside’s 23 for the entire contest. The Griz totaled 11 offensive boards and converted them into 16 second-chance points. Led by Akoh, Montana was once again consistent from the charity stripe, making a season-high 24 (77.4 percent). Over the past three games, the Grizzlies are shooting 79.3 percent and averaging 21.67 makes. From the floor, Montana shot 50 percent (24 of 48), marking the third consecutive home game that the Grizzlies have made at least half of their shots.

A win on Tuesday vs. UC Irvine would guarantee a winning non-conference record, also for the first time since the 2011-12 season. Prior to the game, Montana will posthumously recognize former Griz Delvon Anderson, presenting his family the Legends of the Game award that is part of Montana’s participation in the Legends Classic.

GRIZ SET TO HOST NON-CONFERENCE HOME FINALE, HONOR DELVON ANDERSON

Montana won its first conference championship in 1975, and since that point, no Big Sky team has won more conference titles (10) than the Grizzlies. Additionally, Montana has won nine tournament titles and has nine runner-up finishes – including three championships and three runner-up finishes in the past eight seasons.

Griz Hoops has a storied history with plenty of success, and while the first conference title dates back to the 1970s, when you talk with head coach Travis DeCuire, the trajectory of the program changed with one man nearly two decades later.

“As I recruit today, tradition is what we sell,” DeCuire said. “That trend, those numbers, that tradition started with Delvon.”

Delvon Anderson played two seasons for the Grizzlies, winning a pair of conference championships and playing in back-to-back NCAA tournaments. As a senior in 1991-92, Anderson averaged 14.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per game and was named the league’s MVP. Anderson was also the recipient of the 1991 John Eaheart Award – given to UM’s top defensive player – and was a two-time winner of the Naseby Rhinehart Award – given to the team’s most inspirational player.

Following his UM days, he briefly played professionally, both with the Golden State Warriors and overseas, and later went back to school to complete his undergraduate degree and obtain a master’s degree.

Anderson passed away in August at the age of 49. His family will be in attendance on Tuesday to receive the Legend of the Game award – an award that honors a former player or coach from each participating team in the 2017 Legends Classic tournament.

“He fought for respect – his own respect, his teammates’ respect, the program’s respect,” DeCuire said. “That’s who he was under the day he passed away, and to me, that’s what legends do.”

It will be special for DeCuire to celebrate his former teammate, but he’ll also have another distinct person beside him. Blaine Taylor – the former Montana head coach who both DeCuire and Anderson played for – is currently an assistant coach at UC Irvine.

Taylor coached the Griz from 1991-92 through 1997-98, and holds the school’s best winning percentage (.680). In a storied coaching tree, Taylor was the fastest Grizzly coach to reach 50 wins. Second fastest? That’d be DeCuire.

“It’s going to be a family affair,” DeCuire said. “It will be the first time coaching against Coach. It will be fun, and we’ll enjoy it, and at the end of the day, we want to come out on top.”

Prior to his coaching stint, Taylor was a standout for the Griz in the late 1970s and early 1980s. He led Montana for assists three consecutive seasons and still holds the school’s fourth-best career free-throw percentage. Eleven years before Anderson won it, Taylor was the Naseby Rhinehart Award winner as the team’s most inspirational player.

DeCuire doesn’t hold back when talking about his mentor, who gave him his first assistant coaching opportunity while Taylor was the head coach at Old Dominion. They spent five seasons together at ODU, before DeCuire spent the next six under Mike Montgomery at Cal. Montgomery, a College Bas-

ketball Hall of Famer and former Grizzly was the head coach at UM when Taylor was suiting up for the Griz. The two later reconvened as coaches at Stanford, along with current UC Irvine head coach Russell Turner.

“We’ve all got a little bit of the Mike Montgomery coaching tree in us,” DeCuire said.

Without a doubt, the pregame ceremony will be emotional, heartfelt and with plenty of pomp and circumstance. After that, though, there’s still a game to be played, and it’s a big one for Montana. The Grizzlies are coming off a solid victory over UC Riverside on Sunday night. The Griz led from start to finish, using runs of 9-0 and 17-0 to lead by as many as 29 points. On offense, they shot 50 percent from the floor while the defense limited the Highlanders to 38.5-percent shooting, the lowest by a Griz opponent this year.

The win improved Montana’s record to 6-4, its highest non-conference win total since 2011-12. A win on Tuesday would guarantee a winning non-conference mark, also for the first time in six seasons.

“We haven’t done that in quite some time,” DeCuire said. “I think it shows the progress we’re making as a program, especially with the level of competition that we’ve faced so far.”

Like Montana, UC Irvine has played a challenging pre-league schedule, including games at Arizona State, Kansas State and UCLA. The Highlanders beat Big Sky foe Northern Arizona, but are 4-9 on the year, losing four in a row.

Still, the Highlanders pose several threats, including five players who average at least 9.2 points, and have a big presence down low.

“They’re big,” DeCuire said. “Probably bigger than anyone we’ve played all year, other than maybe Stanford. They’ll be aggressive. They expect to win every night because they can score a lot. We’re going to have to come out and perform and be on our ‘A’ game.”

UC Irvine’s size will be most seen on the boards. Montana has out-rebounded its opponents in seven of the past eight games, but will get a test against a Highlanders team that averages 42.3 rebounds per game – 10th in NCAA and 7.5 more than their opponents. UC Irvine is holding its opponents to just 39.5-percent shooting on the season, the 45th-best field-goal defense in the country.

“We have to scrap a little bit more and be ready to go,” DeCuire said. “They’re an NCAA tournament team in my mind, and they’ll give us a Weber State-type matchup.”

UC Irvine went 21-15 in 2016-17, winning the Big West regular-season title and playing in the NIT. The Highlanders were picked as the league favorite to win the Big West again this year.

Tipoff is slated for 7 p.m. The game will be broadcast on SWX Montana and tickets can be purchased online or at the door.

SCOUTING UC IRVINE

- Is 4-9 on the season against a tough non-conference schedule, currently on a four-game losing streak.
- Of its 13 games, 10 have come away from home including eight in true road environments (1-7).
- Has a balanced scoring attack, featuring five players who average

between 9.2 and 10.5 points per game.

- Ranks second nationally with 550 total rebounds. The Anteaters average 42.3 rebounds per game, led by Elston Jones (6.4) and Tommy Rutherford (5.8).
- The Anteaters' defense ranks 45th nationally, limiting opponents to 39.5 percent shooting, and 46th nationally, with 4.9 blocked shots per game. Jonathan Galloway has 25 blocks this year, which ranks 32nd.
- UC Irvine averages 15.5 turnovers per game and forces just 10.54. Both figures rank among the bottom tier of NCAA Division I.
- The Anteaters are coached by Russell Turner, who is in his eighth season. A year ago, he led UC Irvine to a regular-season Big West title and NIT berth.
- UC Irvine is the preseason favorite to win the Big West.

SERIES VS. THE ANTEATERS

Montana and UC Irvine met in six consecutive seasons from 1980-86, but haven't played since. Missoula is 2-4 all-time against UC Irvine, with both wins coming at home, in 1984 and 1986. In the most-recent meeting, the Grizzlies scored 101 points.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Grizzlies hold a perfect 4-0 mark at home this season. Over the past 12 years, Montana has begun a season with four or more consecutive home wins three times, including twice in the past three seasons under Travis DeCuire.

Montana has won more than 80 percent of its contests in Dahlberg Arena over the past decade, going 108-25 (.812) since the start of the 2008-09 season. All-time, the Grizzlies boast one of the best home-court advantages, going 682-240 (.740) in their home arena.

RUNNING FROM THE START

Montana led start to finish in its most-recent win over UC Riverside (Dec. 17), using a 9-0 run to begin the game and a 17-0 run early in the second half.

The Grizzlies held the Highlanders without a basket for the first 6 minutes, 20 seconds, jumping out to a comfortable lead. After UC Riverside scored on its first shot attempt of the second half, the Grizzlies held them without a point for 6:23, going on 17-0 run. Montana led by as many as 29 points in the game and never trailed.

50-PLUS

In each of its last three homes games, Montana has made at least 50 percent of its shots, shooting 56 percent vs. Carroll (Nov. 26), 52 percent vs. CSUN (Dec. 3) and 50 percent vs. UC Riverside (Dec. 17). In the game against the Highlanders, Montana limited the visitors to 38.5-percent shooting (a season low for a UM opponent), including just 21 points in the first half (the fewest in a half this season by a UM opponent).

TRENDING

- Montana is undefeated at home this season (4-0).
- The Grizzlies are a perfect 6-0 when leading at halftime compared to 0-4 when trailing.
- Montana is 4-0 when opponents score fewer than 70 points.
- Montana is 5-1 when shooting more free throws.

ALL-AROUND RORIE

Ahmaad Rorie played in all 40 minutes vs. UC Santa Barbara and ranks 15th nationally for minutes played per game (37:06). He also ranks highly, however, for points (18.8 per game) and steals (1.9 per game). In fact, Rorie is one of nine NCAA Division I players to rank in the top 100 nationally for both points and steals.

BE LIKE MIKE

Junior guard Michael Oguine, a third-team All-Big Sky selection in 2016-17, has scored in double figures in all 10 games this season, including 29 in a win at Pitt (Nov. 13).

Oguine ranks second on the team for scoring (15.2 points per game). Despite standing at just 6-2, he also ranks second for rebounding, averaging 5.6 boards per game. He also ranks second for assists (24) and steals (14), and is tied for the team lead with 10 blocks.

AKOH TAKING OVER

The Grizzlies had high hopes for Jamar Akoh, a transfer from Cal State Fullerton who redshirted a year ago. In his first two games, however, he combined for just four points and two rebounds, being limited to 28 total minutes due to foul trouble.

Since those first two games, Akoh has begun to take over down low, averaging 11.9 points and 7.6 rebounds, shooting 59.2 percent. He has six

double-figure scoring games during that eight-game span, including two double-doubles. Most recently, he had seasons highs of 17 points (9-for-9 from the free-throw line) and 12 rebounds against UC Riverside (Dec. 17).

MORE MOOREHEAD

Bobby Moorehead struggled offensively for much of his sophomore season in 2016-17, averaging 3.9 points per game on .320 shooting. The junior has turned things around in 2017-18, however, ranking third on the team for points (9.3) and minutes (34.5) and shooting at a .400 clip.

In Montana's most-recent win over UC Riverside (Dec. 17), he scored six points in a 10-second span to spark a 17-0 Griz scoring run. In the previous game, at Georgia State (Dec. 9), Moorehead hit back-to-back three-pointers to get the Griz within a single possession. At Stanford (Nov. 29), he scored 11 consecutive UM points in the second half to give the Griz a 40-37 advantage.

He ranks second on the team for three-pointers (18), third for assists (15) and rebounding (5.1 per game) and fourth for steals (11) and blocked shots (seven).

FORCING TURNOVERS

Montana has forced more turnovers than its opponents seven times this season, also tying Penn State with 15 apiece. The Grizzlies' aggressive defense, which focuses on getting deflections, ranks 18th nationally with 17.90 turnovers forced per game and 38th nationally with a +3.7 turnover margin.

On three occasions, Montana has forced 20 or more turnovers in a game, and in a win at Pitt (Nov. 13), the Grizzlies forced the Panthers into 19 turnovers, converting them into 30 points – an average of 1.58 points per turnover.

The Grizzlies have turned the ball over more often than their opponents in each of their two games, however, and will look to reverse that trend against a UC Irvine team that ranks 345th nationally for turnovers forced and 340th for turnover margin.

CRASHING THE GLASS

Montana has out-rebounded its opponents in eight of its last nine games, which is particularly impressive considering three of those contests have come against Power-5 teams. Well over one-third of Montana's rebounds have come from the offensive end (36.3 percent). That number was 28.6 percent a year ago.

Michael Oguine, UM's second-leading rebounder, has more offensive boards (30) than defensive (26), as does freshman Karl Nicholas (18 to 11). Over their last six games, the Grizzlies have out-rebounded their opponents 83-43 on the offensive glass. They are averaging 12.90 offensive rebounds per game this season (43rd in NCAA). Nearly one-fifth of Montana's points have been second-chance opportunities (141 points; 19.4 percent).

CHARITY STRIPE

Montana shot a season-best 80.8 percent from the free-throw line at Georgia State (Dec. 9), making 21 of 26 attempts, and in its next game, vs. UC Riverside (Dec. 17), made a season-most 24 shots. Over the past three games, the Grizzlies are 65-of-82 (79.3 percent); they were shooting 62.5 percent (95-of-152) through the first seven games.

WELL CONDITIONED

Montana has three players who rank among the top 100 for minutes played. Ahmaad Rorie is averaging 37:06 per game, including all 40 vs. UC Santa Barbara (Nov. 21). Fellow juniors Michael Oguine (34:36) and Bobby Moorehead (34:30) are also among the nation's leaders. In fact, Montana is one of 10 Division-I schools nationally to have three players average 34:00 per game or better.

Montana has used a small rotation, with just eight players averaging at least 10 minutes per game and six with more than 13. Twelve different Grizzlies played at Penn State (Nov. 15), but just six played more than 7 minutes. It was the same two nights prior at Pitt (Nov. 13), as Travis DeCuire used the same five players throughout the final 7:34 of the second half and all 5 minutes of overtime.

NARROW DEFEATS

Montana has already reached its highest non-conference win total in six seasons, but the Griz can't help but wonder, 'What if?' as well. Of Montana's four losses, the Grizzlies have led or been within a single possession late in the second half in all four.

- At Penn State (Big Ten), Montana held early leads and was within a single possession, 58-55, with under 4 minutes to play.
- In the championship game of the Legends Classic Malibu Region, Montana overcame a 18-point deficit to take the lead, including 48-46 with 12:51 remaining.
- At Stanford (Pac-12), Montana held multiple second-half leads, including by as many as six points, 50-44, with under 10 minutes on the clock.
- Montana overcame a 17-point halftime deficit at Georgia State, tying the game and having the ball with under a minute to play.

STRONG NOVEMBER

The first month of the season was – all in all – a success. Montana posted a 4-3 record, marking the team's first winning November since 2011-12. For comparison, Montana was a combined 6-16 in the previous four Novembers.

Even more impressive, the Grizzlies did so against much stronger competition, with five of their seven November contests coming away from home and three coming against Power-5 competition.

"We're sitting in a good spot going into December," Travis DeCuire said at the time. "I am happy with where we're at, but we have to be a better basketball team. Two of our three losses, we walked away feeling like we should have won, and one of them we felt like we could have won. If we execute better and make fewer mistakes offensively, we have the chance to be a pretty good team."

INTO DECEMBER

The Grizzlies followed up a strong November with a win over CSUN to begin the month of December. At 5-3, it marked the program's best eight-game start since 2010-11.

STOUT DEFENSE

Montana is allowing its opponents to shoot at too high of a percentage, particularly from the three-point line. However, the Grizzlies are doing a good job of preventing teams from getting shots.

DYNAMIC DUO, PART I

Junior guards Michael Oguine and Ahmaad Rorie enter Tuesday's contest each averaging more than 15.0 points per game, both ranking in the top 300 of all NCAA Division I scorers.

Oguine has scored in double figures in all 10 games, while Rorie has accomplished the feat eight times – including 20-plus on six occasions and three in a row.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Grizzlies have already traveled more than 11,500 miles – taking two trips to the East Coast and three flights to the state of California. Through the first 30 days of the regular season, Montana was on the road for 19 of them.

- Following a season-opening win over Whitworth (Nov. 10), Montana was on a plane nine hours later for a six-day trip to the state of Pennsylvania (Nov. 11-16).
- After back-to-back games against Power-5 opponents (Pitt and Penn State), Montana had two home practices before flying to California to continue the Legends Classic (Nov. 19).
- The Grizzlies returned from California and had two practices in Missoula to prepare for Carroll (Nov. 26).
- Montana had just one day in between its game against Carroll and flying to Stanford (left on Nov. 28).
- Montana returned from its trip to Stanford and had two home practices before hosting CSUN (Dec. 3).
- Following its win over CSUN, the Grizzlies had one day at home before flying to UCLA and Georgia State for a six-day road trip (Dec. 5-10).

FINALLY A SATURDAY

Montana will play at least 11 games on Saturdays this season – more than any other day of the week. However, the Grizzlies didn't play a Saturday game until Dec. 9, a full month into the season. Only Oklahoma played more games to begin the season without a Saturday game.

BUCKING THE TREND

Penn State entered its Nov. 15 contest vs. Montana ranked seventh nationally, averaging 13.0 steals per game. The Grizzlies protected the ball, however, limiting the Nittany Lions to just three steals. A week later vs. UC Santa Barbara, Montana was going up against a Gauchos squad that ranked fifth nationally, turning the ball over just 8.0 times per game. The Griz defense was active and stingy, forcing UCSB into 21 turnovers – nearly three times its season average.

GAME CANCELED

Montana was scheduled to play five teams from Power-5 conference this season, but the Grizzlies' contest at UCLA (Dec. 6) was canceled due to wildfires that were spreading throughout the area and shut down UCLA's campus. The Griz held one practice at Pauley Pavilion and scheduled another at a nearby gym in Los Angeles, before departing for Atlanta to take on Georgia State. Ironically, there were talks of that game being canceled as well when a rare snowstorm took over the southern region of the United States and closed Georgia State's campus.

NICHOLAS FINDING HIS FORM

Travis DeCuire had high expectations for Karl Nicholas, but the freshman was limited early in the season due to foul trouble. Through his first three career games, Nicholas averaged just 7.7 minutes per game, picking up four fouls in each contest.

The Texas native had a breakout week in Malibu, Calif., however, playing 18 minutes vs. Oral Roberts (Nov. 20) and 28 minutes vs. UC Santa Barbara (Nov. 21). Nicholas averaged 10.5 points per game over the two contests, connecting on 10 of 15 shot attempts. He also added nine rebounds in the two games.

CLUTCH RORIE

Junior guard Ahmaad Rorie has scored in double figures nine times this season, averaging 18.8 points per game. The point total is impressive, but more impressive is when he is scoring. Six of Rorie's 18 points at Pitt (Nov. 13) came in the overtime period, while two nights later at Penn State (Nov. 15), he had four points, a steal and an assist during a 9-0 UM run to cut the Grizzlies' deficit to a single point, 51-50, midway through the second half.

The all-conference performer was on full display again vs. Oral Roberts (Nov. 20), scoring a team-high 18 points, in addition to six assists and three steals. Trailing 17-16 with 8 minutes to play in the first half, Montana closed the half on a 15-6 run. Rorie had nine points and two assists during that run, contributing to six of UM's eight made field goals. He was again clutch late, knocking down both free-throw attempts with 22 seconds to play to increase Montana's lead to two possessions.

Rorie was named to the Legends Classic Malibu Region All-Tournament team after playing 75 of 80 minutes and totaling 38 points, 12 assists, seven steals and six rebounds.

OGUINE RECOGNIZED BY COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS

Junior guard Michael Oguine was the College Sports Madness Big Sky Player of the Week for games played Nov. 13-19. Oguine scored a career-most 29 points in a signature victory at Pitt (Nov. 13) and then two days later at Penn State (Nov. 15), totaled 15 points and grabbed seven boards in a narrow loss to the Nittany Lions.

A SIGNATURE VICTORY

After coming close, but not close enough, multiple times against Power-5 teams, Montana finally got over the hump and knocked off Pitt on Nov. 13 in Pittsburgh. The win snapped Montana's 14-game losing streak against Power-5 schools and was the school's first since 2010. It marked Montana's first over a team currently in the ACC since 1966.

Montana led for nearly 24 minutes against Pitt, including by as many as seven points. Below are key stats that led the Grizzlies to their signature victory:

- Montana forced Pitt into 19 turnovers, turning them into 30 points. Two of the turnovers were offensive charges, one taken by Karl Nicholas and another by Fabijan Krslovic. Krslovic finished with a team-most nine rebounds, two blocked shots and two steals.
- Montana out-rebounded Pitt, 39-38, including 14-12 on the offensive glass.
- The Grizzlies held the lead for 23:46, compared to 14:07 for the Panthers.
- Montana overcame foul trouble – three players finished the game with four fouls – and a slow start at the free-throw line. The Grizzlies began the game just 4-for-11 from the charity stripe before finishing 12-of-14 down the stretch – including 10 makes in a row at one point – to put the game out of reach.
- After trailing by a game-most seven points, 28-21, with under 5 minutes to play in the first half, Montana closed the half on a 16-7 run to head into the intermission leading by two, 37-35.
- The Grizzlies started the game 0-for-7 from three-point range before Ahmaad Rorie hit back-to-back threes late in the first half. Bobby Moorehead followed with two more, giving the Grizzlies 12 consecutive points off of three-pointers and a 33-32 advantage.

- Trailing by four, 69-65, with under 3 minutes to play, Montana went on an 8-2 run over the next 2 minutes to take a 73-71 advantage. Oguine scored all eight points for the Griz.
- After alternating baskets to begin overtime, Montana scored to take a 79-77 lead and then held Pitt without a made field goal over its final three attempts.

PARTIAL ARRIVAL

Montana's win at Pitt (Nov. 13) was huge for the program. The Grizzlies knocked off an ACC team that has played in 13 of the last 16 NCAA tournaments, on its home court no less. Pitt entered the contest with a 135-5 all-time mark in non-conference games at the Petersen Events Center and had never lost a home opener in the building.

The victory, however, will mean little if the team doesn't use it as a springboard into the rest of the season, particularly in March.

"We want to win these games in November so we can win these games in March," Travis DeCuire said afterward, noting that he schedules games like these in order to prepare his team for Big Sky Conference action and, hopefully, the postseason.

BIG-GAMER OGUINE

Junior guard Michael Oguine scored a career-high 29 points in Montana's win at Pitt (Nov. 13), but more impressive than the 29 points or team-most five assists was the fact that Oguine took over when it mattered most.

He scored 16 of his points in the final 8:32 of regulation, including Montana's final 10 points overall. Trailing 67-63 with 4:32 to play, Oguine outscored Pitt's entire team, 10-4, to give Montana a two-point lead in the final minute of regulation.

"Mike's one of those guys where when he's mad he's better," Travis DeCuire said. "If he thinks it's time to put everybody on his back, he's going to get it done. He carried us when we needed him to."

100 AND COUNTING

Nov. 13 was a special night for the Montana basketball program, but for two Grizzlies in particular.

Fabijan Krslovic played in his 100th consecutive game. The senior from Australia has played in every UM game since the start of the 2014-15 season (now 108, including 91 starts). Additionally, the game against Pitt was Travis DeCuire's 100th game as head coach. The former Griz player was 59-41 following the signature victory, the fifth-best mark through 100 games out of Montana's 25 head coaches. DeCuire has led Montana to a 2014-15 regular-season conference title and back-to-back appearances in the Big Sky Conference tournament championship game (2015 and 2016).

STARTING STRONG

Montana's wins over Whitworth (Nov. 10) and Pitt (Nov. 13) gave the Grizzlies their first 2-0 start to a season since the 2009-10 squad began the year with three consecutive wins. That team finished with a 22-10 record, winning a Big Sky championship and advancing to the NCAA tournament.

WORKING OVERTIME

Montana won its first overtime game in nearly two years on Nov. 13, defeating Pitt, 83-78. Prior to that, Montana's last overtime victory was a double-overtime win at Northern Arizona on Dec. 31, 2015. The Grizzlies lost both overtime contests in 2016-17.

GOING SMALL

One of the expected strengths to Montana's roster this year is its height compared to a year ago. The Grizzlies have three players listed at 6-8 or taller compared to just one a year ago (UM also has three players 6-8 or taller who are redshirting this season).

However, several times this season Travis DeCuire has gone with a smaller lineup. The smaller unit allowed Montana to go on a second-half run in its season opener vs. Whitworth (Nov. 10) and has allowed the team to spread the ball better and quicker.

HOME-OPENING SUCCESS

With Montana's win over Whitworth (Nov. 10), the Grizzlies improved to 15-3 in home openers since the turn of the century.

DEBUTING

Montana's season opener vs. Whitworth (Nov. 10) marked collegiate and UM debuts for several Grizzlies. Junior Jamar Akoh, a transfer from Cal State Fullerton, earned the start. Also seeing consistent time were freshmen Timmy Falls and Karl Nicholas. In the final minute of the game, Travis DeCuire inserted Admir Besovic, Niko Bevens and Lars Espe.

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHPS

The offense had been clicking, but the defense needed work. That was Travis DeCuire's assessment through the first month of practices and scrimmages, leading up to Montana's exhibition contest vs. Saskatchewan (Nov. 6).

DeCuire saw his team's ability to get stops, as Montana held Saskatchewan to 26-percent shooting in an 85-44 exhibition victory at Dahlberg Arena. Leading by just two, 25-23, with under 8 minutes to play in the first half, Montana went on a 36-4 run over the next 14 minutes – extending across both periods – and did not allow a field goal during that span. The Huskies were 0-for-18 from the floor with 11 turnovers during that stretch. On the evening, Montana forced 12 steals and blocked a dozen shots.

ANDERSON SIGNED

Montana signed Mack Anderson to a National Letter of Intent on Nov. 8. The Bozeman native selected Montana over offers from Montana State and Air Force, and after visiting Boise State and Denver.

Anderson averaged nearly two blocks per game during the 2017 state tournament, helping Bozeman High School to a runner-up finish at the Montana Class 2A state tournament. After mostly talking with NAIA schools, Anderson burst onto the scene over the summer while playing for Montana Elite.

"I like his athleticism and agility," Travis DeCuire said. "Not very often do you get a 6-8 athlete who can run and jump and ball a little bit. We're excited about what he presents in the future."

LOOKING AHEAD

Montana will close the non-conference portion of its season on Friday in a game at Washington. It marks the fourth game against Power-5 competition (not including a canceled game at UCLA).

PRESEASON NOTES

RETURNING TALENT

The Grizzlies have the pieces to contend this season, returning three of their four consistent starters from 2016-17, in addition to a pair of guards – Sayeed Pridgett and Bobby Moorehead – who each started about one-third of last year’s contests.

In total, Montana returns the majority of its production in all aspects of the game, bringing back its top two scorers, and four of its top five. On the other end of the floor, Montana had six players with 90 or more rebounds a year ago; five of them are back on the court.

NEW GUYS COMING IN

While Montana returns the majority of its production from a year ago, the team also turned over roughly half of its roster, with several newcomers expected to slide in and fill roles immediately. The Grizzlies signed six freshmen, in addition to sophomore JUCO transfer Niko Bevans.

- **Admir Besovic** – Originally from Bosnia and Herzegovina, has spent the past two seasons at the Virginia Episcopal School in Lynchburg, where he averaged 11.2 points and 6.8 rebounds last year as a team captain.
- **Niko Bevans** – As a freshman at North Idaho College, led the Cardinals to an NWAC Eastern Conference championship by making 50 percent of his three-point attempts.
- **Lars Espe** – 2016-17 Young Player of the Year in the BLNO, Norway’s premier professional basketball league.
- **Timmy Falls** – 2016-17 East Bay Athletic League MVP.
- **Peter Jones** – Played in 26 games as a senior at O’Dea High School, averaging 4.8 points per game.
- **Kelby Kramer** – No. 2 prep prospect from the state of Wyoming, being named to USA Today’s All-USA Wyoming Boys Basketball Team
- **Karl Nicholas** – As the 17th-best prep prospect from the state of Texas, was named the 2016-17 Texas District 22-6A MVP.

DYNAMIC DUO, PART II

Montana boasts one of the top duos in the Big Sky with junior guards Ahmaad Rorie and Michael Oguine. The two combined to score well over one-third of the team’s points a year ago, also ranking No. 1 and 2 for minutes played.

A transfer from Oregon, Rorie made a name for himself during his first season in the league, earning second-team All-Big Sky honors. He started all 31 contest, and led the Grizzlies in minutes (32.5 per game), points (17.6), assists (97), field goals made (192), three-pointers (63) and free-throw percent-age (.833). His 1.2 assist-to-turnover ratio helped Montana have the 12th-fewest turnovers in Division I in 2016-17.

After recording the second-most points ever for a Montana freshman, Oguine followed up his debut season with an even better sophomore campaign. He averaged 11.9 points per game – including 13.3 during conference play – and shot .481 from the floor. He ranked second on the team for points, re-bounds (6.0 per game) and steals (37), and earned third-team all-conference honors.

Both players have been named to various publications’ preseason all-conference teams, with Rorie being one of six players selected to the official preseason All-Big Sky team voted on by the league’s coaches.

FABULOUS SENIOR

Montana’s lone senior is Australian Fabijan Krslovic, who entered the season having played in 100 consecutive games – starting 83. Krslovic was Montana’s top rebounder in 2016-17, with more than one-third of his boards coming on the offensive glass. He also led Montana with 15 steals and 20 blocked shots and was one of just three Big Sky players to rank in the top 15 in the conference for both categories.

Krslovic will admit he’s not the most athletic player on the court, but he’s consistent and is the glue of the team, according to the coaching staff. After being forced to be more of a center last year because of Montana’s lack of height, he will now transition into a more natural role as a 6-8 forward.

ADDED HEIGHT

A year ago, Fabijan Krslovic (6-8) was the Grizzlies’ tallest player, which forced him to play a different role

as Montana's only true post player. This year, he is one of five players at 6-8 or taller. It was a conscious effort by DeCuire, looking to add more height and depth to his team's roster.

Admir Besovic (7-0) and Kelby Kramer (6-10) are still raw as true freshmen, adjusting to the quicker style of play in the college game, but both can play a true center position. Kramer is more of a shot-blocker and rebounder, while Besovic has the ability to clog the lane and make it tough for opposing offenses to penetrate to the rim.

Montana believes it has a solid low-presence combination of Krslovic and transfer Jamar Akoh, and also has 6-8 Karl Nicholas, who can be an athletic force on both ends of the court.

MORE RETURNING TALENT

In addition to Montana's senior and pair of all-conference guards, the team returns three other players, including Sayeed Pridgett and Bobby Moorehead.

As a true freshman, Pridgett earned 11 starts and ranked ninth in the Big Sky with a .524 field-goal percentage. He was also the team's third-best rebounder (3.9 per game) and ranked fourth on the team for points (8.1 per game) and assists (44). In his second collegiate season, Moorehead started 10 games and averaged 2.8 rebounds per game while adding 3.9 points, 10 total steals and nine blocked shots. Sophomore guard Trever Spoja is also back. The Billings native saw action in eight contests as a redshirt freshman, totaling 10 points on 3-of-7 shooting.

STARTING THEM YOUNG

Montana is one of 11 NCAA Division I schools nationally to have at least nine newcomers and just one senior.

Kentucky leads the nation with 12 newcomers and zero seniors, while Auburn has a dozen newcomers and one senior. Tennessee, Toledo and Wofford each have 10 newcomers and one senior, while Montana, Bowling Green, Holy Cross, Kansas State, Louisiana Tech and Oklahoma have nine new players and one expected graduate.

DORSEY TO MISS SEASON

The Grizzlies will be without junior forward Donaven Dorsey this season. Dorsey, who redshirted in 2016-17 after transferring from the University of Washington, suffered a pair of hip injuries that require separate surgeries. The first was performed on Oct. 23. He played in 55 games over two seasons with the Huskies, earning eight starts. He totaled 166 points and 77 rebounds.

PICKED TO FINISH 3RD

Montana has high expectations for itself, and those who follow Big Sky basketball feel similar. In the preseason polls, Montana was picked to finish third by both the coaches and media. The Grizzlies were slotted to finish behind Idaho and Weber State in both polls (complete listing on Page 9).

Travis DeCuire said being picked to finish in the upper echelon is a sign of respect, but he and his team have their own set of goals, especially after winning a regular-season championship in 2015 and playing in the conference tournament title game in both 2015 and 2016.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

A year ago, Travis DeCuire believed he compiled the most-challenging schedule in program history, facing an all-Division-I slate. This year, it may

be even tougher. The Grizzlies open the season with 13 non-conference games, five of which are against Power-5 teams. The team's first road trip is at Pitt (ACC) and Penn State (Big Ten) – part of the prestigious Legends Classic. The tournament will continue the following week in Malibu, Calif., as Montana takes on Oral Roberts and either UC Santa Barbara or host Pepperdine.

The Grizzlies will get their air miles several weeks later, traveling to Georgia State, in addition to three contests against Pac-12 foes – Stanford, UCLA and Washington. The Bruins are ranked in the AP pre-season top-25 poll.

In Missoula, Montana will host Cal State Northridge, Carroll, UC Irvine, UC Riverside and Whitworth. The 18-game league schedule will begin Dec. 28 and include home-and-home contests against Montana State, North Dakota, Northern Arizona, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State and Southern Utah. Montana will also will travel to Eastern Washington and Idaho, and will host Idaho State and Weber State to close the regular season.

The Big Sky Conference tournament will be held in Reno, Nev., for the final year before moving to Boise, Idaho, next spring.

TEAM BONDING IN COSTA RICA

The Grizzlies got a head start to the basketball season, taking a foreign tour to Costa Rica in early August. The NCAA allows for teams to participate in such trips once every four years. The trip was beneficial in several facets. In addition to key bonding time – being in a foreign country with your teammates and being able to partake in several activities, including pool time and a zip line through a jungle – and service initiatives – the team spent a day at an orphanage, playing sports with the children and reading to them – the team also competed in a pair of scrimmages and was allotted 10 practices in Missoula leading up to the trip.

The tour allowed for Travis DeCuire to introduce concepts to his team – particularly the newcomers – much earlier than he usually would, and noted that the team was ahead of where they normally were early in fall camp.

SECURING THE BALL

Montana averaged just 10.8 turnovers per game a year ago, the 12th-fewest in all of NCAA Division I basketball.

PROUD HISTORY

Travis DeCuire is well aware of Montana's proud history, and has experienced it firsthand. During the 1990s, Montana won the Big Sky Conference and played in the NCAA tournament three times in a seven-year period, including DeCuire's sophomore campaign. The two-time All-Big Sky selection still holds Montana's record for career assists.

Since Montana's first conference championship in 1975, no Big Sky team has won more conference titles (10) than Montana. Additionally, the Grizzlies have won nine tournament titles and have nine runner-up finishes – including three championships and three runner-up finishes in the past eight seasons. In the league's history, Montana has won more games than any Big Sky school except for Weber State.

DECUIRE REACHES MILESTONE

Midway through last season, DeCuire's third in Missoula, the Grizzlies defeated Northern Colorado to earn the head coach his 50th victory. He is the second-fastest Griz coach to reach that milestone (84 games). The fastest to 50 was Blaine Taylor, DeCuire's head coach when he played for the Griz.

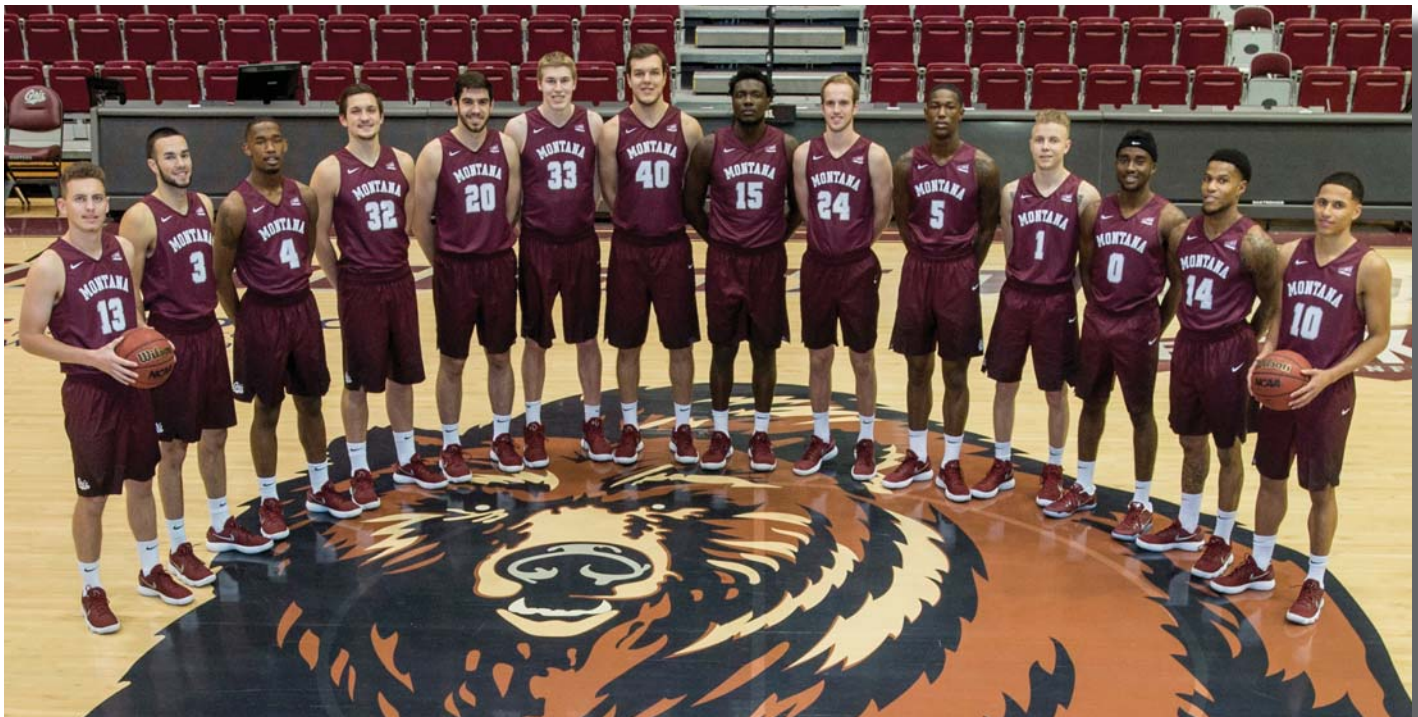

TRAVIS DECUIRE

Head Coach | Fourth Season | Montana, 1994

In his first two seasons as the University of Montana's 27th men's head basketball coach, Travis DeCuire accomplished something no other coach in UM history had: he posted two 20-win seasons in his first two seasons.

Now entering the fourth season at his alma mater, DeCuire is once again poised to put the Grizzlies back on the road to a 20-win campaign.

DeCuire (pronounced: dee-CURE) was formally introduced as the Grizzlies' head basketball coach in June 2014, at a press conference at UM's Adams Center after the initial announcement from UM's Director of Athletics Kent Haslam in May of that year.

In his first season at the helm of a program with a rich history of success, DeCuire's Griz started the year picked to finish eighth in the conference. Led by future European professional Jordan Gregory, UM would go on to defy expectations and win the Big Sky regular-season championship and advance to the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) before finishing the season 20-13 (14-4 BSC).

At the time, he became only the second coach in UM history to notch 20 victories in his first season at the helm – a feat also accomplished by Blaine Taylor in 1991-92 (27-4).

In DeCuire's second year, he followed up with another 20-win season and another trip to the Big Sky championship game, this time led by future European professional Martin Breunig. DeCuire's Grizzlies would once again advance to the postseason, competing in the first round of the CBI tournament against Nevada, finishing with a 21-12 (14-4 BSC) record.

Paced by 10 underclassmen and just two seniors who played significant time, the Grizzlies went 16-16 (11-7 BSC) in 2016-17, earning a first-round bye in the Big Sky tournament. During the season, DeCuire became the second-fastest UM head coach to reach 50 wins (doing so in 84 contests). He coached a pair of UM sophomores – both returning in 2017-18 – to All-Big Sky Conference recognition.

The 2016-17 season was also the second consecutive year in which the Grizzlies have posted a team grade-point average above 3.0, earning NABC Team Academic Excellence recognition both seasons.

Prior to returning to his alma mater as head coach, DeCuire spent six seasons (2008-09 through 2013-14) on the University of California coaching staff – including the final four as associate head coach. Regarded as one of the top tutors in the game, DeCuire helped former Montana mentor Mike Montgomery – a member of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame – transform Cal into one of the winningest programs in the Pac-12 during his time in Berkeley. The Bears reached the postseason all six years he was on the staff, including the NCAA tournament four times. The Golden Bears boasted 130 wins in his six seasons – the best six-year stretch in school history – winning the 2010 Pac-10 championship. He coached numerous all-conference selections, including conference players of the year Jerome Randle (2010) and Jorge Gutierrez (2012).

DeCuire he spent five seasons (2003-04 through 2007-08) as an assistant coach at Old Dominion, under former Griz head coach and player Blaine Taylor. There, he helped the Monarchs to a combined record of 117-53. The mark included 94 wins during his final four seasons – the most in school history over a four-year stretch. ODU reached the postseason each of those four seasons and advanced to the NCAA tournament in both 2005 and 2007 – winning a school-record 28 contests in 2005. Additionally, the Monarchs reached the NIT semifinals in 2006 and the quarterfinals of the College Basketball Invitational in 2008.

DeCuire, from Seattle, Wash., also has head coaching experience from stints at Sammamish High School and Green River Community College in Washington. At GRCC, DeCuire took over a last-place program and guided it to a conference championship and its first 20-win season in more than 20 years, earning league coach-of-the-year honors in 2003 – his second season. At Sammamish High School in Bellevue, DeCuire led his team to a pair of conference titles, a state tournament appearance and three consecutive trips to the district tournament.

As a point guard for Montana from 1992-94 DeCuire was named All-Big Sky Conference as a junior and senior. He set a school record in just three seasons with 435 career assists. He also established UM's single-season mark with 199 assists as a senior in 1993-94, when he was ranked 12th in the nation, averaging 7.1 assists a game. He was the recipient of the Grizzlies' Carl Dragstedt Award (MVP) as a junior and senior, and received the John Eheart Award (Outstanding Defensive Player) following his senior year.

As a freshman at Chaminade-Hawaii, he was a starter and team MVP in 1990. He then transferred to Montana and redshirted in 1991. DeCuire attended Mercer Island High School (Wash.), where he was a three-year starter and all-state, team MVP, and a McDonald's All-America honorable mention pick as a senior.

He has a strong commitment to community service and founded and acted as president of the Fastbreak Basketball Association – an organization that assists in teaching life lessons and building self-esteem through basketball to more than 500 students in the Seattle-Tacoma area. Additionally, he has extensive experience in counseling at the Echo Glen Children's Center in Snoqualmie, Wash., from 1996-98, and with the Ryther Children's Center in North Seattle, from 1995-97.

DeCuire graduated from Montana in 1994 with a degree in business marketing. He and his wife, Sabrina, have two daughters – Brianna (24) and Tamia (5).
