

MONTANA FALLS AT WASHINGTON IN FINAL SECONDS

SEATTLE, Wash. - Montana had opportunities to earn its second signature win of the season but came up just short on Friday evening, falling to the Washington Huskies, 66-63

Montana held a Husky offense that was averaging 82 points per game to a season-low 66 and out-rebounded Washington 41-27, including 20-6 on the offensive glass. Tacoma natives Ahmaad Rorie (19 points) and Bobby Moorehead (14) paced the Griz, in addition to 17 points and seven rebounds from Jamar Akoh. Rorie also had seven rebounds while Moorehead was 4-of-8 shooting from three-point range.

"Definitely a roller coaster ride for us," head coach Travis DeCuire said. "We're showing growth as a team, but we definitely would have liked to have finished that one off."

Trailing by one at the half, Montana opened the second frame with four quick points to regain the lead. Washington (10-3), though, would score the next nine and would lead for the majority of the half. Despite playing from behind, Montana always stayed within striking distance.

The Grizzlies were within single digits the entire second half and used a 7-0 run – including five points from Akoh - to take the lead, 62-61, with 4:16 to play.

"We stuck together." DeCuire said. "The conversation in the huddle was. 'Do the right things.' When we do the right things we're a better basketball team than them."

Montana held Washington to just a single made field goal down the stretch, but the Grizzlies were unable to connect, shooting 0-for-5 from the floor. Down one, the Grizzlies had five possessions over the final couple of minutes but were unable to take the lead, although they did have what would have been a go-ahead bucket waived off after junior Michael Oguine was called for an offensive foul.

Following a missed shot with 17 seconds remaining, Montana was forced to foul. UW's David Crisp made 1-of-2, giving the Griz the ball with 11.2 seconds to play and trailing by two. Looking to tie the game, Oguine was fouled, sending him to the line for two shots.

"He was banged up - knee to knee - and if he would have stayed down he would have had to come out," DeCuire said. "I prefer to have him shoot banged up than for them to pick a shooter for me."

He made the first free throw, but his second that would have tied the game with under 6 seconds to play was no good. Fabijan Krslovic got the loose ball, but his tip did not fall and Montana was forced to foul once again.

"It's hard to get quick shots against that zone," DeCuire said. "We had a couple empty possessions at the end that we needed to get something out of. We fought."

Montana had a nightmare start to the game, missing 10 consecutive shots and turning the ball over four times during a 10-0 Washington run. They quickly responded, using a 21-6 run to take the lead on back-to-back Akoh layups.

Montana only shot six free-throw attempts in the game – all over the final eight minutes - compared to 21 for Washington. Montana had a season-high-tying 20 turnovers, but also forced Washington into 18 giveaways. The Huskies rank among the nation's leaders for steals and blocked shots, and showed why on Friday, recording 12 steals and blocking 11 shots.

Oguine was held to a season-low five points – the first time this year he hasn't scored in double figures - and was limited to 24 minutes after two early fouls.

Despite the loss, the Grizzlies closed the non-conference portion of their season at 7-5, their most wins and first winning record since 2011-12. Even more impressive, Montana led or was within a single possession late in the second half in all of its defeats, showing signs of a team that has the ability to do big things come conference

"I see signs of what we're capable of, the potential of our group," DeCuire said. "We've figured out a rotation that will be good for us, and I'm excited about what's in front of us."

The team will have the next several off to enjoy the Christmas holiday before reconvening in Arizona on Dec. 26. Montana will open conference play with games at Northern Arizona on Dec. 28 and Southern Utah on Dec. 30.





MONTANA OPENS BIG SKY PLAY AT NAU

During the opening week of the season, following a program-defining win at Pitt, Travis DeCuire knew the significance of the victory, but also was cautious to make too much out of it. On one end, his team just beat an ACC school on its home court, Pitt's first home-opening loss in the history of its arena. The streak snapped Montana's 14-game losing skid to Power-5 schools – many by narrow margins. At the same time, DeCuire noted that the victory would mean very little if his team didn't build off of the victory, and use it as a building block throughout the course of the season.

Now, nearly two months later and entering the second phase of its season conference play – DeCuire likes where his team is at. Sure, there have been some possessions and stretches of play he'd like a do-over on, and his team has had a couple more narrow defeats, squashing opportunities to pick up another signature victory or two, but there have also been the unexpected positives.

For the first time in six seasons, Montana is entering Big Sky Conference action with a winning record. Against stout competition, the Grizzlies went 7-5, including a 5-0 mark at home. DeCuire's players have also picked up his revamped defensive scheme quicker and better than he expected. Opponents are averaging 69.3 points per game, and most-recently, Montana limited a Washington squad that was averaging more than 80 points per game to a season-low 66.

Montana is among the nation's elite for turnovers forced, steals, blocked shots and rebounding – and ranks in the top three in the conference for each category.

Finally, the Grizzlies are playing better today than they were on Nov. 13 when they knocked off Pitt.

"I think we've improved from November to December a lot, and I think we're a little deeper now than we were then," DeCuire said. "We learned a lot about our group. We know we're capable of competing."

The Grizzlies have won two of their last three games, with the lone loss coming in the final seconds at Washington – a game in which Montana out-rebounded the Huskies 41-27, had 12 assists to Washington's four and had more points off turnovers, but also only shot six free throws compared to the Huskies' 21.

"Our pressure has been huge," DeCuire said. "The thing that's been big for us is our ability to rebound, especially on the offensive end. It helps us create extra opportunities."

Earlier in the week, Montana shot better than 50 percent from the floor in wins over UC Riverside and UC Irvine. The Grizzlies never trailed against the Highlanders and held the Anteaters to a season-low 29 rebounds, despite UC Irvine entering the game ranked No. 2 nationally for that category.

"We've been the aggressor in most of the games we've played in," DeCuire said. "Our style of play sets the tone. If we can keep our opponents on their heels, we'll have the opportunity to strike."

The wins and accomplishments over the season's first seven weeks are nice, and are used as confidence builders and to work out kinks, but the real season begins Thursday. Montana likes where it's at, but so do a lot of teams in the Big Sky Conference. Seven teams currently have winning records, with the league posting five wins over Power-5 programs and a handful of others over high-majors. Portland State, a team picked to finish eighth in the

coaches' poll, is currently 10-3 with wins over a pair of Pac-12 teams.

"As you sit back and watch what other teams have been able to accomplish, this is probably one of the most competitive years as a conference," DeCuire said. "The team that has the fewest hiccups will win the league, and we look forward to jumping in the middle of it and trying to rise to the top."

In a league that is up for grabs, with numerous contenders but no clear-cut favorite, it will be imperative to win home games and steal as many on the road as one can. Montana is currently one of five teams unbeaten at home, including Southern Utah, which Montana will face on Saturday. Up first though, is a Northern Arizona squad that is 3-10 and the only team in the league with a losing record at home (1-2).

Despite some struggles early on, NAU did win its most-recent game – at Jacksonville – and leads the league for free-throw attempts. Additionally, two players, rank in the top five in the conference for offensive rebounding.

Following Montana's game at Washington on Dec. 22, the team dispersed and had a couple days to spend with family and friends. They reconvened on Tuesday in Phoenix, where they will practice on Arizona State's campus, before driving to Flagstaff on Wednesday and playing on Thursday. Tipoff is slated for 6:30 p.m. MT.

"We know JoJo Anderson will lead them, they've got some length and size and they're always a physical team and will crash the glass," DeCuire said of NAU. "Travel here's always hard – it's different from any other trip – so it's nice getting here a day earlier to help us adjust."

SERIES VS. THE LUMBERJACKS

Thursday will mark the 100th meeting between Montana and Northern Arizona, a series that dates back to 1970-71 and has featured two matchups most season since. The Grizzlies are 67-32 all-time, including 28-20 in Flagstaff.

Since 2008-09, the Grizzlies are 15-3 against the Lumberjacks, including 5-0 under Travis DeCuire. In last year's meeting, the Grizzlies' top-five returners combined for 43 points and 21 rebounds. Michael Oguine has scored 41 points in three career games vs. NAU, including 16 points and nine rebounds in his first meeting as a freshman.

SCOUTING NORTHERN ARIZONA

- NAU is 3-10 on the season, but is 3- since beginning the year 0-7.
- Aside from JoJo Anderson (13.1 points per game), NAU uses a balanced scoring attack.
- Brooks Debisschop (6.3) and Isaiah Thomas (5.7) are NAU's top rebounders. Both have more than 20 offensive boards. Both rank in the top five in the conference for offensive rebounding.
- Five different players have at least nine steals.
- NAU leads the Big Sky Conference for free throws made and attempted. JoJo Anderson leads the conference for attempts and makes.
- Out of 12 teams, NAU ranks 11th or 12th in the conference for scoring offense, scoring margin, field-goal percentage, defensive rebounds, assists and turnover margin.
- The Lumberjacks are coming off of a 9-23 campaign (6-12 Big Sky), and returned just one starter from that roster.
- · NAU is led by sixth-year head coach Jack Murphy.

STARTING STRONG

Montana closed its non-conference season with a winning record (7-5) for the first time in six seasons. In fact, despite a storied history that is littered





with conference championships and postseason berths, this season marks just the fifth time since the turn of the century that the Grizzlies have posted a winning non-conference mark. The other times were in 2005-06, 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2011-12 — with Montana advancing to the NCAA tournament three of those seasons and the CBI in 2011.

The feat is even more impressive considering the level of competition Montana has faced thus far. The Grizzlies have played four Power-5 opponents (Pitt, Penn State, Stanford and Washington, all on the road). The Grizzlies also played six of their first nine games away from home, with an additional road game at No. 23 UCLA being canceled once the team was already on site. In addition to the Power-5 opponents, UC Santa Barbara is off to a 10-3 start while UC Irvine was predicted to win the Big West and Georgia State was selected to finish second in the Sun Belt.

BE LIKE MIKE

Junior guard Michael Oguine, a third-team All-Big Sky selection in 2016-17, scored in double figures in the first 11 games of the season, including 29 in a win at Pitt (Nov. 13).

Oguine ranks second on the team for scoring (14.4 points per game). Despite standing at just 6-2, he also ranks second for rebounding, averaging 5.3 boards per game. He ranks second for assists (26) and steals (16) and blocked shots (11).

AKOH TAKING OVER

The Grizzlies had high hopes for Jamar Akoh, a transfer from Cal State Fullerton who redshirted a year ago. In his first two games, however, he combined for just four points and two rebounds, being limited to 28 total minutes due to foul trouble.

Since those first two games, Akoh has begun to take over down low, averaging 13.1 points and 7.6 rebounds, shooting 60.6 percent. He has eight double-figure scoring games during that 10-game span, including two double-doubles. In three games last week, he averaged 19.0 points and 8.7 rebounds per game, including a career-high 23 points vs. UC Irvine (Dec. 19) and career-high 12 rebounds vs. UC Riverside (Dec. 17).

ALL-AROUND RORIE

Ahmaad Rorie played in all 40 minutes vs. UC Santa Barbara and ranks 11th nationally for minutes played per game (37:00). He also ranks highly, how-

ever, for points (17.9 per game) and steals (1.7 per game). In fact, Rorie is one of 13 NCAA Division I players to rank in the top 150 nationally for both points and steals.

MORE MOOREHEAD

Bobby Moorehead struggled offensively for much of his sophomore season in 2016-17, averaging 3.9 points per game on .320 shooting. The junior has turned things around in 2017-18, however, ranking fourth on the team for points (9.5), second for minutes played (34.3) and shooting at a .410 clip.

In Montana's recent win over UC Riverside (Dec. 17), he scored six points in a 10-second span to spark a 17-0 Griz scoring run. In the previous game, at Georgia State (Dec. 9), Moorehead hit back-to-back three-pointers to get the Griz within a single possession. At Stanford (Nov. 29), he scored 11 consecutive UM points in the second half to give the Griz a 40-37 advantage.

He is the team leader for three-pointers (24), ranks third for assists (17), rebounding (4.8 per game) and blocked shots (nine), and fourth for steals (13).

TRENDING

- Montana is undefeated at home this season (5-0).
- The Grizzlies are a perfect 7-0 when leading at halftime compared to 0-5 when trailing.
- Montana is 5-1 when opponents score fewer than 70 points, with the exception coming in a three-point loss at Washington.
- Montana is 5-1 when shooting more free throws.

FORCING TURNOVERS

Montana has forced more turnovers than its opponents eight times this season, also tying Penn State with 15 apiece. The Grizzlies' aggressive defense, which focuses on getting deflections, ranks 16th nationally with 17.67 turnovers forced per game and 49th nationally with a +3.3 turnover margin.

On three occasions, Montana has forced 20 or more turnovers in a game, and in a win at Pitt (Nov. 13), the Grizzlies forced the Panthers into 19 turnovers, converting them into 30 points – an average of 1.58 points per turnover.

CRASHING THE GLASS

Montana has out-rebounded its opponents in 10 of its last 11 games, which

is particularly impressive considering four of those contests have come against Power-5 teams and another came against a UC Irvine team that ranked No. 2 nationally for total rebounds.

Well over one-third of Montana's rebounds have come from the offensive end (37.9 percent). That number was 28.6 percent a year ago. Michael Oguine, UM's second-leading rebounder, has more offensive boards (32) than defensive (31), as does freshman Karl Nicholas (20 to 13). Over their last eight games, the Grizzlies have out-rebounded their opponents 118-59 on the offensive glass. They are averaging 13.67 offensive rebounds per game this season (19th in NCAA). Nearly one-fifth of Montana's points have been second-chance opportunities (172 points; 19.7 percent).

STOUT DEFENSE

Montana is allowing its opponents to shoot at too high of a percentage, particularly from the three-point line. However, the Grizzlies are doing a good job of preventing teams from getting shots.

- 17.8 turnovers forced per game: 16th in NCAA (2nd in BSC)

WELL CONDITIONED

Montana has three players who average at least 33:00 minutes played per game. Ahmaad Rorie is averaging 37:00 per game, including all 40 vs. UC Santa Barbara (Nov. 21). Fellow juniors Bobby Moorehead (34:20) and Michael Oguine (33:00) are also among the nation's leaders. In fact, Montana is one of 14 Division-I schools nationally to have three players average 33:00 per game or better.

Montana has used a small rotation, with just eight players averaging at least 10 minutes per game and six with more than 13. Twelve different Grizzlies played at Penn State (Nov. 15), but just six played more than 7 minutes. It was the same two nights prior at Pitt (Nov. 13), as Travis DeCuire used the same five players throughout the final 7:34 of the second half and all 5 minutes of overtime.

NARROW DEFEATS

Montana finished non-conference play with its first winning record in six seasons, but the Griz can't help but wonder, 'What if?' as well. Of Montana's five losses, the Grizzlies have led or been within a single possession late in the second half in all five.

- At Penn State (Big Ten), Montana held early leads and was within a single possession, 58-55, with under 4 minutes to play.
- In the championship game of the Legends Classic Malibu Region, Montana overcame a 18-point deficit to take the lead, including 48-46 with 12:51 remaining.
- At Stanford (Pac-12), Montana held multiple second-half leads, including by as many as six points, 50-44, with under 10 minutes on the clock.
- Montana overcame a 17-point halftime deficit at Georgia State, tying the game and having the ball with under a minute to play.
- At Washington (Pac-12), Montana led with 4:16 to play and had the chance to tie the game with two free-throw opportunities with 5.1 seconds left on the clock.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Grizzlies have already traveled more than 12,000 miles – taking two trips to the East Coast, three flights to the state of California and one to nearby Seattle. Through the first 30 days of the regular season, Montana was on the road for 19 of them.

- Following a season-opening win over Whitworth (Nov. 10), Montana was on a plane nine hours later for a six-day trip to the state of Pennsylvania (Nov. 11-16).
- After back-to-back games against Power-5 opponents (Pitt and Penn State), Montana had two home practices before flying to California to continue the Legends Classic (Nov. 19).
- The Grizzlies returned from California and had two practices in Missoula to prepare for Carroll (Nov. 26).
- Montana had just one day in between its game against Carroll and flying to Stanford (left on Nov. 28).
- Montana returned from its trip to Stanford and had two home practices before hosting CSUN (Dec. 3).
- Following its win over CSUN, the Grizzlies had one day at home before flying to UCLA and Georgia State for a six-day road trip (Dec. 5-10).

DYNAMIC DUO, PART I

Junior guards Michael Oguine and Ahmaad Rorie enter Friday's contest each averaging more than 14.0 points per game, both ranking in the top 300 of all NCAA Division I scorers.

Oguine has scored in double figures in 11 games, while Rorie has accomplished the feat 10 times – including 20-plus on six occasions.

HEARTBREAK VS. THE HUSKIES

Montana had several chances at an additional non-conference victory over a Power-5 program, taking Washington down to the wire (Dec. 22). In the three-point loss, Montana held multiple second-half leads, including with under 4 minutes to play.

Despite the loss, Montana out-rebounded the Huskies, 41-27, including 20-6 on the offensive glass. The Grizzlies also had 12 assists compared to Washington's four, and converted 18 turnovers into 24 points. Washington, however, got to the free-throw line 21 times compared to just six for Montana.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Grizzlies hold a perfect 5-0 mark at home this season. Over the past two decades, Montana has begun a season with five or more consecutive home wins three times, including twice in the past three seasons under Travis DeCuire.

Montana has won more than 80 percent of its contests in Dahlberg Arena over the past decade, going 109-25 (.812) since the start of the 2008-09 season. All-time, the Grizzlies boast one of the best home-court advantages, going 683-240 (.740) in their home arena.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

Two nights after Montana's defense held UC Riverside to 38.5-percent shooting (a season low for a UM opponent), the Grizzlies' strong defense was on full display. In an 18-point win over UC Irvine (Dec. 19), Montana's defense forced 15 turnovers, including three shot-clock violations and two 10-second whistles. On offense, the Grizzlies shot better than 50 percent and scored a season-high-tying 86 points. Afterward, Travis DeCuire said his team's performance was the best of the season, and perhaps the best he's seen his team play in his four years as head coach.

"Tonight is the first time we've put 40 minutes together on both sides of the ball," DeCuire said after the game. "Our energy and the way we played together, and the way we executed on both sides of the ball, was incredible. I don't know that we've played this well as a group, as a unit, since I've been here."





HONORING DELVON

Prior to Montana's game vs. UC Irvine (Dec. 19), the Grizzlies recognized former player Delvon Anderson, who passed away in August at the age of 47. His family was on the court during a video ceremony and DeCuire and former head coach Blaine Taylor presented them with the Legend of the Game plague – an award given to a former player or coach from each participating team in the 2017 Legends Classic tournament.

DeCuire and Anderson played together in the early 1990s and Taylor was their coach. He is Montana's winningest coach in school history (.680 winning percentage) and is now an assistant coach at UC Irvine. During Anderson's two-year career at Montana, the Grizzlies won back-to-back Big Sky Conference championships. He was the conference MVP as a senior in 1992.

Throughout the season, players have worn No. 24 warmup jerseys, honoring Anderson. Additionally, a black stripe has been displayed on the left shoulder of all jerseys, recognizing Anderson and former head coach Jud Heathcote.

FRESHMAN FALLS

Timmy Falls scored 12 points through Montana's first 10 games of the season before breaking out vs. UC Irvine (Dec. 19). The freshman played 22 minutes off the bench and scored 14 points, including 4-for-4 shooting from three-point range. Falls also had several no-look passes and took a charge on defense

RUNNING FROM THE START

Montana led start to finish in its win over UC Riverside (Dec. 17), using a 9-0 run to begin the game and a 17-0 run early in the second half. The Grizzlies held the Highlanders without a basket for the first 6 minutes, 20 seconds, jumping out to a comfortable lead. After UC Riverside scored on its first shot attempt of the second half, the Grizzlies held them without a point for 6:23, going on 17-0 run. Montana led by as many as 29 points in the game (season high) and never trailed, holding the Highlanders to 38.5-percent shooting, a season low for a UM opponent, including 21 first-half points (the fewest in a half this

50-PLUS

In each of its last four homes games, Montana has made at least 50 percent of its shots, shooting 56 percent vs. Carroll (Nov. 26), 52 percent vs. CSUN (Dec. 3), 50 percent vs. UC Riverside (Dec. 17) and 53 percent vs. UC Irvine (Dec. 19). During those four games, the Griz are averaging 83.75 points per game and a 15.75 margin of victory.

BUCKING THE TREND

Penn State entered its Nov. 15 contest vs. Montana ranked seventh nationally, averaging 13.0 steals per game. The Grizzlies protected the ball, however, limiting the Nittany Lions to just three steals. A week later vs. UC Santa Barbara, Montana was going up against a Gauchos squad that ranked fifth nationally, turning the ball over just 8.0 times per game. The Griz defense was active and stingy, forcing UCSB into 21 turnovers - nearly three times its season average.

Montana once again bucked the trend against UC Irvine (Dec. 19), out-rebounding the Anteaters, 37-29, despite UC Irvine entering the contest ranked No. 2 nationally for rebounding (42.3 per game). It was held to its lowest total of the season.

FINALLY A SATURDAY

Montana will play at least 11 games on Saturdays this season – more than

any other day of the week. However, the Grizzlies didn't play a Saturday game until Dec. 9, a full month into the season. Only Oklahoma played more games to begin the season without a Saturday game.

GAME CANCELED

Montana was scheduled to play five teams from Power-5 conference this season, but the Grizzlies' contest at UCLA (Dec. 6) was canceled due to wildfires that were spreading throughout the area and shut down UCLA's campus. The Griz held one practice at Pauley Pavilion and scheduled another at a nearby gym in Los Angeles, before departing for Atlanta to take on Georgia State. Ironically, there were talks of that game being canceled as well when a rare snowstorm took over the southern region of the United States and closed Georgia State's campus.

NICHOLAS FINDING HIS FORM

Travis DeCuire had high expectations for Karl Nicholas, but the freshman was limited early in the season due to foul trouble. Through his first three career games, Nicholas averaged just 7.7 minutes per game, picking up four fouls in each contest.

The Texas native had a breakout week in Malibu, Calif., however, playing 18 minutes vs. Oral Roberts (Nov. 20) and 28 minutes vs. UC Santa Barbara (Nov. 21). Nicholas averaged 10.5 points per game over the two contests, connecting on 10 of 15 shot attempts. He also added nine rebounds in the two games.

CLUTCH RORIE

Junior guard Ahmaad Rorie has scored in double figures nine times this season, averaging 18.8 points per game. The point total is impressive, but more impressive is when he is scoring. Six of Rorie's 18 points at Pitt (Nov. 13) came in the overtime period, while two nights later at Penn State (Nov. 15), he had four points, a steal and an assist during a 9-0 UM run to cut the Grizzlies' deficit to a single point, 51-50, midway through the second half.

The all-conference performer was on full display again vs. Oral Roberts (Nov. 20), scoring a team-high 18 points, in addition to six assists and three steals. Trailing 17-16 with 8 minutes to play in the first half, Montana closed the half on a 15-6 run. Rorie had nine points and two assists during that run, contributing to six of UM's eight made field goals. He was again clutch late, knocking down both free-throw attempts with 22 seconds to play to increase Montana's lead to two possessions.

Rorie was named to the Legends Classic Malibu Region All-Tournament team after playing 75 of 80 minutes and totaling 38 points, 12 assists, seven steals and six rebounds.

OGUINE RECOGNIZED BY COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS

Junior guard Michael Oguine was the College Sports Madness Big Sky Player of the Week for games played Nov. 13-19. Oguine scored a career-most 29 points in a signature victory at Pitt (Nov. 13) and then two days later at Penn State (Nov. 15), totaled 15 points and grabbed seven boards in a narrow loss to the Nittany Lions.

A SIGNATURE VICTORY

After coming close, but not close enough, multiple times against Power-5 teams, Montana finally got over the hump and knocked off Pitt on Nov. 13 in Pittsburgh. The win snapped Montana's 14-game losing streak against Power-5 schools and was the school's first since 2010. It marked Montana's first over a team currently in the ACC since 1966.





Montana led for nearly 24 minutes against Pitt, including by as many as seven points. Below are key stats that led the Grizzlies to their signature victory:

- Montana forced Pitt into 19 turnovers, turning them into 30 points.
 Two of the turnovers were offensive charges, one taken by Karl Nicholas and another by Fabijan Krslovic. Krslovic finished with a team-most nine rebounds, two blocked shots and two steals.
- Montana out-rebounded Pitt, 39-38, including 14-12 on the offensive glass.
- The Grizzlies held the lead for 23:46, compared to 14:07 for the Panthers.
- Montana overcame foul trouble three players finished the game with four fouls – and a slow start at the free-throw line. The Grizzlies began the game just 4-for-11 from the charity stripe before finishing 12-of-14 down the stretch – including 10 makes in a row at one point – to put the game out of reach.
- After trailing by a game-most seven points, 28-21, with under 5 minutes to play in the first half, Montana closed the half on a 16-7 run to head into the intermission leading by two, 37-35.
- The Grizzlies started the game 0-for-7 from three-point range before Ahmaad Rorie hit back-to-back threes late in the first half. Bobby Moorehead followed with two more, giving the Grizzlies 12 consecutive points off of three-pointers and a 33-32 advantage.
- Trailing by four, 69-65, with under 3 minutes to play, Montana went on an 8-2 run over the next 2 minutes to take a 73-71 advantage. Oguine scored all eight points for the Griz.
- After alternating baskets to begin overtime, Montana scored to take a 79-77 lead and then held Pitt without a made field goal over its final three attempts.

PARTIAL ARRIVAL

Montana's win at Pitt (Nov. 13) was huge for the program. The Grizzlies knocked off an ACC team that has played in 13 of the last 16 NCAA tournaments, on its home court no less. Pitt entered the contest with a 135-5 all-time mark in non-conference games at the Petersen Events Center and had never lost a home opener in the building.

The victory, however, will mean little if the team doesn't use it as a springboard into the rest of the season, particularly in March.

"We want to win these games in November so we can win these games in March," Travis DeCuire said afterward, noting that he schedules games like these in order to prepare his team for Big Sky Conference action and, hopefully, the postseason.

BIG-GAMER OGUINE

Junior guard Michael Oguine scored a career-high 29 points in Montana's win at Pitt (Nov. 13), but more impressive than the 29 points or team-most five assists was the fact that Oguine took over when it mattered most.

He scored 16 of his points in the final 8:32 of regulation, including Montana's final 10 points overall. Trailing 67-63 with 4:32 to play, Oguine outscored Pitt's entire team, 10-4, to give Montana a two-point lead in the final minute of regulation.

"Mike's one of those guys where when he's mad he's better," Travis DeCuire said. "If he thinks it's time to put everybody on his back, he's going to get it done. He carried us when we needed him to."

100 AND COUNTING

Nov. 13 was a special night for the Montana basketball program, but for two Grizzlies in particular.

Fabijan Krslovic played in his 100th consecutive game. The senior from

Australia has played in every UM game since the start of the 2014-15 season (now 109, including 92 starts). Additionally, the game against Pitt was Travis DeCuire's 100th game as head coach. The former Griz player was 59-41 following the signature victory, the fifth-best mark through 100 games out of Montana's 25 head coaches. DeCuire has led Montana to a 2014-15 regular-season conference title and back-to-back appearances in the Big Sky Conference tournament championship game (2015 and 2016).

STARTING STRONG

Montana's wins over Whitworth (Nov. 10) and Pitt (Nov. 13) gave the Grizzlies their first 2-0 start to a season since the 2009-10 squad began the year with three consecutive wins. That team finished with a 22-10 record, winning a Big Sky championship and advancing to the NCAA tournament.

WORKING OVERTIME

Montana won its first overtime game in nearly two years on Nov. 13, defeating Pitt, 83-78. Prior to that, Montana's last overtime victory was a double-overtime win at Northern Arizona on Dec. 31, 2015. The Grizzlies lost both overtime contests in 2016-17.

GOING SMALL

One of the expected strengths to Montana's roster this year is its height compared to a year ago. The Grizzlies have three players listed at 6-8 or taller compared to just one a year ago (UM also has three players 6-8 or taller who are redshirting this season).

However, several times this season Travis DeCuire has gone with a smaller lineup. The smaller unit allowed Montana to go on a second-half run in its season opener vs. Whitworth (Nov. 10) and has allowed the team to spread the ball better and quicker.

HOME-OPENING SUCCESS

With Montana's win over Whitworth (Nov. 10), the Grizzlies improved to 15-3 in home openers since the turn of the century.

DEBUTING

Montana's season opener vs. Whitworth (Nov. 10) marked collegiate and UM debuts for several Grizzlies. Junior Jamar Akoh, a transfer from Cal State Fullerton, earned the start. Also seeing consistent time were freshmen Timmy Falls and Karl Nicholas. In the final minute of the game, Travis DeCuire inserted Admir Besovic, Niko Bevens and Lars Espe.

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHPS

The offense had been clicking, but the defense needed work. That was Travis DeCuire's assessment through the first month of practices and scrimmages, leading up to Montana's exhibition contest vs. Saskatchewan (Nov. 6).

DeCuire saw his team's ability to get stops, as Montana held Saskatchewan to 26-percent shooting in an 85-44 exhibition victory at Dahlberg Arena. Leading by just two, 25-23, with under 8 minutes to play in the first half, Montana went on a 36-4 run over the next 14 minutes – extending across both periods – and did not allow a field goal during that span. The Huskies were 0-for-18 from the floor with 11 turnovers during that stretch. On the evening, Montana forced 12 steals and blocked a dozen shots.

LOOKING AHEAD

Montana will cap its three-game road trip at Southern Utah. The Thunderbirds enter conference play with a perfect record on their home court.





PRESEASON NOTES

RETURNING TALENT

The Grizzlies have the pieces to contend this season, returning three of their four consistent starters from 2016-17, in addition to a pair of guards – Sayeed Pridgett and Bobby Moorehead – who each started about one-third of last year's contests.

In total, Montana returns the majority of its production in all aspects of the game, bringing back its top two scorers, and four of its top five. On the other end of the floor, Montana had six players with 90 or more rebounds a year ago; five of them are back on the court.

NEW GUYS COMING IN

While Montana returns the majority of its production from a year ago, the team also turned over roughly half of its roster, with several newcomers expected to slide in and fill roles immediately. The Grizzlies signed six freshmen, in addition to sophomore JUCO transfer Niko Bevens.

- Admir Besovic Originally from Bosnia and Herzegovina, has spent the past two seasons at the Virginia Episcopal School in Lynchburg, where he averaged 11.2 points and 6.8 rebounds last year as a team captain.
- Niko Bevens As a freshman at North Idaho College, led the Cardinals to an NWAC Eastern Conference championship by making 50 percent of his three-point attempts.
- Lars Espe 2016-17 Young Player of the Year in the BLNO, Norway's premier professional basketball league.
- Timmy Falls 2016-17 East Bay Athletic League MVP.
- Peter Jones Played in 26 games as a senior at O'Dea High School, averaging 4.8 points per game.
- Kelby Kramer No. 2 prep prospect from the state of Wyoming, being named to USA Today's All-USA Wyoming Boys Basketball Team
- Karl Nicholas As the 17th-best prep prospect from the state of Texas, was named the 2016-17 Texas District 22-6A MVP.

DYNAMIC DUO, PART II

Montana boasts one of the top duos in the Big Sky with junior guards Ahmaad Rorie and Michael Oguine. The two combined to score well over one-third of the team's points a year ago, also ranking No. 1 and 2 for minutes played.

A transfer from Oregon, Rorie made a name for himself during his first season in the league, earning second-team All-Big Sky honors. He started all 31 contest, and led the Grizzlies in minutes (32.5 per game), points (17.6), assists (97), field goals made (192), three-pointers (63) and free-throw percent-age (.833). His 1.2 assist-to-turnover ratio helped Montana have the 12th-fewest turnovers in Division I in 2016-17.

After recording the second-most points ever for a Montana freshman, Oguine followed up his debut season with an even better sophomore campaign. He averaged 11.9 points per game – including 13.3 during conference play – and shot .481 from the floor. He ranked second on the team for points, re-bounds (6.0 per game) and steals (37), and earned third-team all-conference honors.

Both players have been named to various publications' preseason all-conference teams, with Rorie being one of six players selected to the official preseason All-Big Sky team voted on by the league's coaches.

FABULOUS SENIOR

Montana's lone senior is Australian Fabijan Krslovic, who entered the season having played in 100 consecutive games – starting 83. Krslovic was Montana's top rebounder in 2016-17, with more than one-third of his boards coming on the offensive glass. He also led Montana with 15 steals and 20 blocked shots and was one of just three Big Sky players to rank in the top 15 in the conference for both categories.

Krslovic will admit he's not the most athletic player on the court, but he's consistent and is the glue of the team, according to the coaching staff. After being forced to be more of a center last year because of Montana's lack of height, he will now transition into a more natural role as a 6-8 forward.

ADDED HEIGHT

A year ago, Fabijan Krslovic (6-8) was the Grizzlies' tallest player, which forced him to play a different role

as Montana's only true post player. This year, he is one of five players at 6-8 or taller. It was a conscious effort by DeCuire, looking to add more height and depth to his team's roster.

Admir Besovic (7-0) and Kelby Kramer (6-10) are still raw as true freshmen, adjusting to the quicker style of play in the college game, but both can play a true center position. Kramer is more of a shot-blocker and rebounder, while Besovic has the ability to clog the lane and make it tough for opposing offenses to penetrate to the rim.

Montana believes it has a solid low-presence combination of Krslovic and transfer Jamar Akoh, and also has 6-8 Karl Nicholas, who can be an athletic force on both ends of the court.

MORE RETURNING TALENT

In addition to Montana's senior and pair of all-conference guards, the team returns three other players, including Sayeed Pridgett and Bobby Moorehead.

As a true freshman, Pridgett earned 11 starts and ranked ninth in the Big Sky with a .524 field-goal percentage. He was also the team's third-best rebounder (3.9 per game) and ranked fourth on the team for points (8.1 per game) and assists (44). In his second collegiate season, Moorehead started 10 games and averaged 2.8 rebounds per game while adding 3.9 points, 10 total steals and nine blocked shots. Sophomore guard Trever Spoja is also back. The Billings native saw action in eight contests as a redshirt freshman, totaling 10 points on 3-of-7 shooting.

STARTING THEM YOUNG

Montana is one of 11 NCAA Division I schools nationally to have at least nine newcomer and just one senior.

Kentucky leads the nation with 12 newcomers and zero seniors, while Auburn has a dozen newcomers and one senior. Tennessee, Toledo and Wofford each have 10 newcomers and one senior, while Montana, Bowling Green, Holy Cross, Kansas State, Louisiana Tech and Oklahoma have nine new players and one expected graduate.

DORSEY TO MISS SEASON

The Grizzlies will be without junior forward Donaven Dorsey this season. Dorsey, who redshirted in 2016-17 after transferring from the University of Washington, suffered a pair of hip injuries that require separate surgeries. The first was performed on Oct. 23. He played in 55 games over two seasons with the Huskies, earning eight starts. He totaled 166 points and 77 rebounds.

PICKED TO FINISH 3RD

Montana has high expectations for itself, and those who follow Big Sky basketball feel similar. In the preseason polls, Montana was picked to finish third by both the coaches and media. The Grizzlies were slotted to finish behind Idaho and Weber State in both polls (complete listing on Page 9).

Travis DeCuire said being picked to finish in the upper echelon is a sign of respect, but he and his team have their own set of goals, especially after winning a regular-season championship in 2015 and playing in the conference tournament title game in both 2015 and 2016.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

A year ago, Travis DeCuire believed he compiled the most-challenging schedule in program history, facing an all-Division-I slate. This year, it may

be even tougher. The Grizzlies open the season with 13 non-conference games, five of which are against Power-5 teams. The team's first road trip is at Pitt (ACC) and Penn State (Big Ten) – part of the prestigious Legends Classic. The tournament will continue the following week in Malibu, Calif., as Montana takes on Oral Roberts and either UC Santa Barbara or host Pepperdine.

The Grizzlies will get their air miles several weeks later, traveling to Georgia State, in addition to three contests against Pac-12 foes – Stanford, UCLA and Washington. The Bruins are ranked in the AP pre-season top-25 poll.

In Missoula, Montana will host Cal State Northridge, Carroll, UC Irvine, UC Riverside and Whitworth. The 18-game league schedule will begin Dec. 28 and include home-and-home contests against Montana State, North Dakota, Northern Arizona, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State and Southern Utah. Montana will also will travel to Eastern Washington and Idaho, and will host Idaho State and Weber State to close the regular season.

The Big Sky Conference tournament will be held in Reno, Nev., for the final year before moving to Boise, Idaho, next spring.

TEAM BONDING IN COSTA RICA

The Grizzlies got a head start to the basketball season, taking a foreign tour to Costa Rica in early Au-gust. The NCAA allows for teams to participate in such trips once every four years. The trip was beneficial in several facets. In addition to key bonding time – being in a foreign country with your teammates and being able to partake in several activities, including pool time and a zip line through a jungle – and service initiatives – the team spent a day at an orphanage, playing sports with the children and reading to them – the team also competed in a pair of scrimmages and was allotted 10 practices in Missoula leading up to the trip.

The tour allowed for Travis DeCuire to introduce concepts to his team – particularly the newcomers – much earlier than he usually would, and noted that the team was ahead of where they normally were early in fall camp.

SECURING THE BALL

Montana averaged just 10.8 turnovers per game a year ago, the 12th-fewest in all of NCAA Division I basketball.

PROUD HISTORY

Travis DeCuire is well aware of Montana's proud history, and has experienced it firsthand. During the 1990s, Montana won the Big Sky Conference and played in the NCAA tournament three times in a seven-year period, including DeCuire's sophomore campaign. The two-time All-Big Sky selection still holds Montana's record for career assists.

Since Montana's first conference championship in 1975, no Big Sky team has won more conference tiles (10) than Montana. Additionally, the Grizzlies have won nine tournament titles and have nine runner-up finishes — including three championships and three runner-up finishes in the past eight sea-sons. In the league's history, Montana has won more games than any Big Sky school except for Weber State.

DECUIRE REACHES MILESTONE

Midway through last season, DeCuire's third in Missoula, the Grizzlies defeated Northern Colorado to earn the head coach his 50th victory. He is the second-fastest Griz coach to reach that milestone (84 games). The fastest to 50 was Blaine Taylor, DeCuire's head coach when he played for the Griz.



TRAVIS DECUIRE

Head Coach | Fourth Season | Montana, 1994

In his first two seasons as the University of Montana's 27th men's head basketball coach, Travis DeCuire accomplished something no other coach in UM history had: he posted two 20-win seasons in his first two seasons.

Now entering the fourth season at his alma mater, DeCuire is once again poised to put the Grizzlies back on the road to a 20-win campaign.

DeCuire (pronounced: dee-CURE) was formally introduced as the Grizzlies' head basketball coach in June 2014, at a press conference at UM's Adams Center after the initial announcement from UM's Director of Athletics Kent Haslam in May of that year.

In his first season at the helm of a program with a rich history of success, DeCuire's Griz started the year picked to finish eighth in the conference. Led by future European professional Jordan Gregory, UM would go on to defy expectations and win the Big Sky regular-season championship and advance to the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) before finishing the season 20-13 (14-4 BSC).

At the time, he became only the second coach in UM history to notch 20 victories in his first season at the helm – a feat also accomplished by Blaine Taylor in 1991-92 (27-4).

In DeCuire's second year, he followed up with another 20-win season and another trip to the Big Sky championship game, this time led by future European professional Martin Breunig. DeCuire's Grizzlies would once again advance to the postseason, competing in the first round of the CBI tournament against Nevada, finishing with a 21-12 (14-4 BSC) record.

Paced by 10 underclassmen and just two seniors who played significant time, the Grizzlies went 16-16 (11-7 BSC) in 2016-17, earning a first-round bye in the Big Sky tournament. During the season, DeCuire became the second-fastest UM head coach to reach 50 wins (doing so in 84 contests). He coached a pair of UM sophomores – both returning in 2017-18 – to All-Big Sky Conference recognition.

The 2016-17 season was also the second consecutive year in which the Grizzlies have posted a team grade-point average above 3.0, earning NABC Team Academic Excellence recognition both seasons.

Prior to returning to his alma mater as head coach, DeCuire spent six seasons (2008-09 through 2013-14) on the University of California coaching staff – including the final four as associate head coach. Regarded as one of the top tutors in the game, DeCuire helped

former Montana mentor Mike Montgomery - a member of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame - transform Cal into one of the winningest programs in the Pac-12 during his time in Berkeley. The Bears reached the postseason all six years he was on the staff, including the NCAA tournament four times. The Golden Bears boasted 130 wins in his six seasons – the best six-year stretch in school history – winning the 2010 Pac-10 championship. He coached numerous all-conference selections, including conference players of the year Jerome Randle (2010) and Jorge Gutierrez (2012).

DeCuire he spent five seasons (2003-04 through 2007-08) as an assistant coach at Old Dominion, under former Griz head coach and player Blaine Taylor. There, he helped the Monarchs to a combined record of 117-53. The mark included 94 wins during his final four seasons – the most in school history over a four-year stretch. ODU reached the postseason each of those four seasons and advanced to the NCAA tournament in both 2005 and 2007 - winning a school-record 28 contests in 2005. Additionally, the Monarchs reached the NIT semifinals in 2006 and the quarterfinals of the College Basketball Invitational in

DeCuire, from Seattle, Wash., also has head coaching experience from stints at Sammamish High School and Green River Community College in Washington. At GRCC, DeCuire took over a last-place program and guided it to a conference championship and its first 20-win season in more than 20 years, earning league coach-of-the-year honors in 2003 – his second season. At Sammamish High School in Bellevue, DeCuire led his team to a pair of conference titles, a state tournament appearance and three consecutive trips to the district tournament.

As a point guard for Montana from 1992-94 DeCuire was named All-Big Sky Conference as a junior and senior. He set a school record in just three seasons with 435 career assists. He also established UM's single-season mark with 199 assists as a senior in 1993-94, when he was ranked 12th in the nation, averaging 7.1 assists a game. He was the recipient of the Grizzlies' Carl Dragstedt Award (MVP) as a junior and senior, and received the John Eaheart Award (Outstanding Defensive Player) following his senior year.

As a freshman at Chaminade-Hawaii, he was a starter and team MVP in 1990. He then transferred to Montana and redshirted in 1991. DeCuire attended Mercer Island High School (Wash.), where he was a three-year starter and all-state, team MVP, and a McDonald's All-America honorable mention pick as a

He has a strong commitment to community service and founded and acted as president of the Fastbreak Basketball Association – an organization that assists in teaching life lessons and building self-esteem through basketball to more than 500 students in the Seattle-Tacoma area. Additionally, he has extensive experience in counseling at the Echo Glen Children's Center in Snoqualmie, Wash., from 1996-98, and with the Ryther Children's Center in North Seattle, from

DeCuire graduated from Montana in 1994 with a degree in business marketing. He and his wife, Sabrina, have two daughters - Brianna (24) and Tamia (5).
