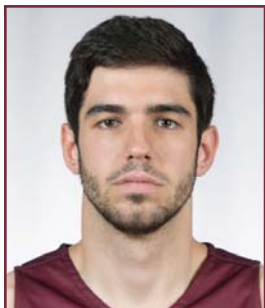

PRIDGETT RECORDS DOUBLE-DOUBLE IN VICTORY OVER CSUN

MISSOULA, Mont. – Montana played its most complete game of the season on Sunday night, defeating CSUN, 86-68, at Dahlberg Arena. Four players scored in double figures and the Grizzlies shot above 50 percent for the second time in three games, as Montana stayed unbeaten at home this season (3-0).

The Grizzlies led by as many as 22 and held a comfortable lead for most of the second half.

"I thought tonight was a really good win," head coach Travis DeCuire said. "We played together and aggressively, on both sides of the ball."

There was plenty to be excited about, especially considering Montana was coming off of a game at Stanford in which it shot just 29 percent. The Grizzlies bounced back by shooting 51.7 percent, tying a season high for points and posting its largest margin of victory on the young season.

Sophomore Sayeed Pridgett recorded his first career double-double with 20 points and a personal-best 12 rebounds, in addition to four assists, two blocked shots and a steal. He shot 8-of-14 from the floor. During a two-minute stretch early in the game – from the 15:38 through 13:37 mark – Pridgett had three baskets, a steal, an assist, a block and an offensive rebound.

After CSUN went on a 10-0 run to regain the lead, Montana answered with an 11-2 run, which included six points by Pridgett in addition to Niko Bevens' first basket as a Grizzly. Montana would lead for the remainder of the contest, including by double digits for the final 10:53.

"I moved him back to the 4, where he played most of his minutes last year, and put him in some slashing situations and let him do what he does – get to the rim, get to the paint, make some good decisions," DeCuire said about Pridgett. "He had a positive assist-to-turnover ratio and his 12 rebounds were huge. We just played him a little bit more where he's naturally comfortable and let him do what he does."

Junior Ahmaad Rorie was coming off of a game in which he scored just four points on 1-of-12 shooting. It was the second-lowest scoring output of his Grizzly career. DeCuire said the two had a talk this week about his shot selection and role on the team, and it flipped a switch.

"We had a little conversation, mostly to relieve him of stress," DeCuire said. "He's had a lot on his shoulders and sometimes that gets in the back of your mind. I told him to just be yourself and play, and look what he did."

The junior scored a season-most 27 points – two shy of his career high – on 9-of-16 shooting, including 3-of-4 from long range. Rorie has now scored 20 or more points four times on the year, including three times in Montana's last four games.

Michael Oguine had just three points through the first 30 minutes, but finished with 13 thanks to a series of plays late in the game in which he had three impressive dunks within several possessions. He has now scored in double figures in all eight games this season, also adding seven rebounds and two steals on Sunday. Jamar Akoh was the other Grizzly in double figures, totaling 11 points, four assists and three of Montana's six blocked shots.

CSUN shot 48 percent on the night, but also was forced into 16 turnovers – which Montana turned into 17 points. The Matadors entered the contest ranked eighth in the country, turning the ball over just 10.2 times per game. Montana also limited CSUN to 39-percent shooting in the second half after the Matadors shot 62 percent in the opening frame.

"We did a better job of getting ahead of them and not letting them get to the rim," DeCuire said. "We scrapped a lot more in the second half and played together as a team."

The Grizzlies were also effective from the free-throw line. Montana made a season-most 20 free throws and shot a season-best 80 percent. Pridgett and Bobby Moorehead were 4-for-4 apiece, while Rorie was 6-of-7.

Coming off their best all-around performance of the season, Montana will enter another road trip with some confidence. The Grizzlies travel to face a 7-1 UCLA squad on Wednesday before flying across the country to take on Georgia State on Saturday.

"We're in a good spot right now," DeCuire said. "We let some games get away, but those are growing pains. We're excited about where our team is headed."



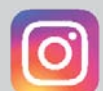

AFTER DETOUR IN L.A., MONTANA TRAVELS COUNTRY TO TAKE ON STRONG GEORGIA STATE TEAM

The Montana men's basketball team traveled 1,200 miles by air on Tuesday, anticipating a game at No. 23 UCLA on Wednesday evening. The game, however, was canceled due to nearby wildfires – including one that shut down UCLA's campus. So instead, Montana held a workout at a nearby facility, Shoot 360 LA, before traveling 2,200 miles to Atlanta.

What was expected to be a two-game road trip was cut in half to one, but not all was lost. In addition to the two practices in California – the first coming Tuesday evening at famed Pauley Pavilion – Montana also got some extra recruiting in. Assistant coaches Chris Cobb and Jay Flores were in nearby gyms on Tuesday scouting future Griz, but head coach Travis DeCuire joined them on Wednesday to get extra eyes on area prep stars. The Grizzlies' roster features four players from the state of California, including two from southern California.

That's what made the canceled game even more difficult for a few Grizzlies. In addition to missing out on a chance to play – and beat – a nationally ranked team on national television, juniors Jamar Akoh (Rancho Cucamonga) and Michael Oguine (Los Angeles) were anticipating the opportunity to play in front of friends and family.

"It took about 30 minutes for it to sink in that we weren't going to play," DeCuire said. "It was a little difficult to swallow. Our guys wanted to play UCLA, and then we had a couple guys where it was a homecoming who had family boarding flights or traveling to watch us play."

Without a game, in addition to time on the recruiting trail, Montana got an extra day to prep for Georgia State, a team it will take on Saturday afternoon (12 p.m. MT, ESPN3.com/WatchESPN app). The Panthers deserve every bit of Montana's attention, too. They'll enter this weekend's contest with an identical 5-3 record, including an 18-point win over Big Sky member Eastern Washington. The Panthers don't score a ton, but do have a scorer in D'Marcus Simmonds, who averages 20.5 points per game – 39th in the NCAA.

More impressive, though, is Georgia State's defense. The Panthers limit opponents to 61.4 points per game (17th in NCAA) on just .382 shooting (34th).

"Georgia State plays multiple defenses and very little man," DeCuire said. "Preparation is always going to be key. If you don't put time into offensive execution against their defense you're going to struggle because it's so much different than everyone else's."

Similar to Montana, Georgia State finds success by forcing turnovers. Montana ranks 13th nationally, forcing 18.6 turnovers per game. The Grizzlies have a +5.3 turnover margin (18th). It's much of the same for Georgia State, a team that enters the weekend with a +6.8 turnover margin (sixth) and averages 9.0 steals per game (23rd).

"You look at the stats, and they're pretty similar," DeCuire said. "We're similar at the free-throw line, similar for turnovers, similar assist-to-turnover ratio. I think the biggest difference for us is that we've been out-rebounding opponents. If we can continue to do that, I think that can be a difference."

Georgia State plays more of a zone-changing defense with traps, while Montana plays more of a rules defense, trying to deflect balls. The Grizzlies are averaging 34.4 rebounds per game and have out-rebounded their opponents in six of eight contests.

The Grizzlies haven't played a game since Sunday, but are coming off one of their most impressive games of the season, beating CSUN by 18 points. In the win, Montana tied a season high with 18 points on 52 percent shooting while the defense forced 16 turnovers.

The trip to Georgia was going to be a long one, even without a detour in Los Angeles. DeCuire, though, noted the importance of setting up a contract with a strong mid-major team that was willing to return to Missoula next season. The Panthers have won 20-plus games four times in the past six seasons and have advanced to a postseason tournament in three of the past four years. Most memorable, they upset No. 3-seed Baylor in the 2015 NCAA tournament.

"Without playing on Wednesday, it gives us an opportunity to talk through some stuff and actually get two good, full days of practice in," DeCuire said. "It probably makes us a little fresher, too."

SCOUTING GEORGIA STATE

- Georgia State is 5-3 on the season, picking up an 18-point win over Eastern Washington, in addition to notable victories over Rice and Tulane.
- The Panthers are coming off an overtime loss to Liberty, just their eighth home loss in the past five seasons (50-8). GSU has lost back-to-back home games just once during that span.
- GSU has three players averaging double figures for scoring, led by sophomore D'Marcus Simmonds (20.5, 39th in NCAA DI). Simmonds is also the team leader for assists and ranks second for rebounding and steals. He recorded a triple-double in the season opener.
- Simmonds was the 2016-17 Sun Belt Freshman of the Year and is on the 2017-18 Lute Olson National Player of the Year Watch List.
- Junior Malik Benlevi is averaging 12.6 points and a team-best 6.5 rebounds per game. He has a team-most 16 steals and ranks 18th nationally with a .512 three-point field-goal percentage.
- GSU is averaging just 71.0 points per game, but is limiting its opponents to 61.4 (17th in NCAA DI). Opponents are shooting just .382 against the Panthers.
- GSU's defense also forces the 23rd-most turnovers in the NCAA, averaging 9.0 per game. The Panthers rank sixth nationally with a +6.8 turnover margin.
- GSU has had plenty of recent success, playing in the postseason in three of the past four seasons. In 2015, the Panthers upset No. 3-seed Baylor in the NCAA tournament.
- The Panthers were picked to finish second in the Sun Belt preseason poll.
- Now in his seventh season, Ron Hunter has led the Panthers to a 128-77 mark, playing in four postseason tournaments and posting four 20-win seasons.

SERIES VS. THE PANTHERS

Montana and Georgia State have met just once before, back in 1984-85. The Grizzlies defeated the Panthers, 74-62, in the Champion Holiday Classic tournament in Missoula.

FINALLY A SATURDAY

Montana will play at least 11 games on Saturdays this season – more than any other day of the week. However, a full month into the season, the Grizzlies have yet to play on that day of the week. That will change this weekend at Georgia State. Prior to tipoff, Montana and Oklahoma are believed to be the only two Division-I teams to not play on a Saturday this season.

The first month of the season was – all in all – a success. Montana posted a 4-3 record, marking the team's first winning November since 2011-12. For comparison, Montana was a combined 6-16 in the previous four Novembers.

Even more impressive, the Grizzlies are having success against much stronger competition, already playing five games away from Missoula and three against Power-5 competition.

"We're sitting in a good spot going into December," Travis DeCuire said last week. "I am happy with where we're at, but we have to be a better basketball team. Two of our three losses, we walked away feeling like we should have won, and one of them we felt like we could have won. If we execute better and make fewer mistakes offensively, we have the chance to be a pretty good team."

INTO DECEMBER

The Grizzlies followed up a strong November with a win to begin the month of December. At 5-3, it is the program's best eight-game start since 2010-11. A win on Wednesday would not only be a signature victory over a ranked opponent, but it would also be the team's best nine-game start since 2009-10. The Grizzlies won 20-plus games and played in the postseason in both 2010 and 2011.

ALL-AROUND RORIE

Ahmaad Rorie played in all 40 minutes vs. UC Santa Barbara and ranks 17th nationally for minutes played per game. He also ranks highly, however, for points (18.0 per game) and steals (1.9 per game). In fact, Rorie is one of nine NCAA Division I players to average at least 18.0 points per game and total 15 or more steals.

FORCING TURNOVERS

Montana has forced more turnovers than its opponents in seven of eight games, tying Penn State with 15 turnovers apiece in the other. The advantage has led to a +5.3 turnover margin (18th in NCAA). On two occasions, Montana has forced 20 or more turnovers in a game, and in a win at Pitt (Nov. 13), the Grizzlies forced the Panthers into 19 turnovers, converting them into 30 points – an average of 1.58 points per turnover.

CRASHING THE GLASS

Montana has out-rebounded its opponents in six of its last seven games, which is particularly impressive considering three of those contests have come against Power-5 teams. Well over one-third of Montana's rebounds have come from the offensive end (37.8 percent). That number was 28.6 percent a year ago.

Michael Oguine, UM's leading rebounder, has more offensive boards (25) than defensive (22), as does freshman Karl Nicholas (13 to 12). Over their last four games, the Grizzlies have out-rebounded their opponents 58-28 on the offensive glass. They are averaging 13.0 offensive rebounds per game this season (45th in NCAA). Nearly one-fifth of Montana's points have been second-chance opportunities (108 points; 18.6 percent).

STOUT DEFENSE

Montana is allowing its opponents to shoot at too high of a percentage, particularly from the three-point line. However, the Grizzlies are doing a good job of preventing teams from getting shots.

DYNAMIC DUO, PART I

Junior guards Michael Oguine and Ahmaad Rorie enter Wednesday's contest each averaging more than 16.0 points per game, both ranking in the top 250 of all NCAA Division I scorers.

Oguine has scored in double figures in all eight games, while Rorie has accomplished the feat seven times – including 20-plus on four occasions. Montana is one of 36 Division-I teams nationally to have two scorers averaging 16.0 points or more per game.

WELL CONDITIONED

Montana has three players who rank among the top 100 for minutes played. Ahmaad Rorie is averaging 36:52 per game, including all 40 vs. UC Santa Barbara (Nov. 21). Fellow juniors Michael Oguine (35:45) and Bobby Moorehead (34:37) are also among the nation's leaders. In fact, Montana is one of 10 Division-I schools nationally to have three players average 34:00 per game or better (also: Arizona State, Duquesne, George Mason, Holy Cross, La Salle, Mt. St. Mary's, Ohio, Santa Clara and Toledo).

Twelve different Grizzlies played at Penn State (Nov. 15), but just six played more than 7 minutes. It was the same two nights prior at Pitt (Nov. 13), as Travis DeCuire used the same five players throughout the final 7:34 of the second half and all 5 minutes of overtime.

BUCKING THE TREND

Penn State entered its Nov. 15 contest vs. Montana ranked seventh nationally, averaging 13.0 steals per game. The Grizzlies protected the ball, however, limiting the Nittany Lions to just three steals. A week later vs. UC Santa Barbara, Montana was going up against a Gauchos squad that ranked fifth nationally, turning the ball over just 8.0 times per game. The Griz defense was active and stingy, forcing UCSB into 21 turnovers – nearly three times its season average.

HOME SWEET HOME

Montana has won more than 80 percent of its contests in Dahlberg Arena over the past decade, going 107-25 (.811) since the start of the 2008-09 season, including a perfect 3-0 this year. All-time, the Grizzlies boast one of the best home-court advantages, going 681-240 (.739) in their home arena.

MORE MOOREHEAD

Following Montana's game at Stanford (Nov. 29), Travis DeCuire said that the team needs to get junior Bobby Moorehead the ball more. After struggling offensively for most of his sophomore season, Moorehead is Montana's third-leading scorer, reaching double figures four times.

In addition to his 9.8 points per game, Moorehead ranks second for steals (10) and three-pointers (14), and third for rebounding (4.5 per game) and assists (10).

AKOH TAKING OVER

In 2015-16, Ahmaad Rorie had to redshirt after transferring from Oregon. During his first season suiting up for the Griz, he led the team in points, minutes and assists and was an all-conference pick. The Grizzlies are hoping the same will be true for Jamar Akoh, a transfer from Cal State Fullerton who has two years of eligibility remaining after redshirting last year.

Akoh was limited to just 28 total minutes over the first two games due to foul trouble, scoring four points. Over the next four games, however, Akoh was able to adjust to the tempo and stay on the floor longer, averaging 11.25 points and 6.75 rebounds per game, including a double-double vs. Carroll (Nov. 26).

NICHOLAS FINDING HIS FORM

Travis DeCuire had high expectations for Karl Nicholas, but the freshman was limited early in the season due to foul trouble. Through his first three career games, Nicholas averaged just 7.7 minutes per game, picking up four fouls in each contest.

The Texas native had a breakout week in Malibu, Calif., however, playing 18 minutes vs. Oral Roberts (Nov. 20) and 28 minutes vs. UC Santa Barbara (Nov. 21). Nicholas averaged 10.5 points per game over the two contests, connecting on 10 of 15 shot attempts. Nicholas also added nine rebounds in the two games.

CLUTCH RORIE

Junior guard Ahmaad Rorie has scored in double figures seven times this season, averaging 18.0 points per game. The point total is impressive, but more impressive is when he is scoring. Six of Rorie's 18 points at Pitt (Nov. 13) came in the overtime period, while two nights later at Penn State (Nov.

15), he had four points, a steal and an assist during a 9-0 UM run to cut the Grizzlies' deficit to a single point, 51-50, midway through the second half.

The all-conference performer was on full display again vs. Oral Roberts (Nov. 20), scoring a team-high 18 points, in addition to six assists and three steals. Trailing 17-16 with 8 minutes to play in the first half, Montana closed the half on a 15-6 run. Rorie had nine points and two assists during that run, contributing to six of UM's eight made field goals. He was again clutch late, knocking down both free-throw attempts with 22 seconds to play to increase Montana's lead to two possessions.

Rorie was named to the Legends Classic Malibu Region All-Tournament team after playing 75 of 80 minutes and totaling 38 points, 12 assists, seven steals and six rebounds.

OGUINE RECOGNIZED BY COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS

Junior guard Michael Oguine was the College Sports Madness Big Sky Player of the Week for games played Nov. 13-19. Oguine scored a career-most 29 points in a signature victory at Pitt (Nov. 13) and then two days later at Penn State (Nov. 15), totaled 15 points and grabbed seven boards in a narrow loss to the Nittany Lions.

Oguine has scored in double figures in all eight games and is the team leader for rebounding, despite standing at just 6-2. Oguine ranks second on the team with 21 assists, to go along with eight steals and six blocked shots.

A SIGNATURE VICTORY

After coming close, but not close enough, multiple times against Power-5 teams, Montana finally got over the hump and knocked off Pitt on Nov. 13 in Pittsburgh. The win snapped Montana's 14-game losing streak against Power-5 schools and was the school's first since 2010. It marked Montana's first over a team currently in the ACC since 1966.

Montana led for nearly 24 minutes against Pitt, including by as many as seven points. Below are key stats that led the Grizzlies to their signature victory:

- Montana forced Pitt into 19 turnovers, turning them into 30 points. Two of the turnovers were offensive charges, one taken by Karl Nicholas and another by Fabijan Krslovic. Krslovic finished with a team-most nine rebounds, two blocked shots and two steals.
- Montana out-rebounded Pitt, 39-38, including 14-12 on the offensive glass.
- The Grizzlies held the lead for 23:46, compared to 14:07 for the Panthers.
- Montana overcame foul trouble – three players finished the game with four fouls – and a slow start at the free-throw line. The Grizzlies began the game just 4-for-11 from the charity stripe before finishing 12-of-14 down the stretch – including 10 makes in a row at one point – to put the game out of reach.
- After trailing by a game-most seven points, 28-21, with under 5 minutes to play in the first half, Montana closed the half on a 16-7 run to head into the intermission leading by two, 37-35.
- The Grizzlies started the game 0-for-7 from three-point range before Ahmaad Rorie hit back-to-back threes late in the first half. Bobby Moorehead followed with two more, giving the Grizzlies 12 consecutive points off of three-pointers and a 33-32 advantage.
- Trailing by four, 69-65, with under 3 minutes to play, Montana went on an 8-2 run over the next 2 minutes to take a 73-71 advantage. Oguine scored all eight points for the Griz.
- After alternating baskets to begin overtime, Montana scored to take a 79-77 lead and then held Pitt without a made field goal over its final three attempts.

PARTIAL ARRIVAL

Montana's win at Pitt (Nov. 13) was huge for the program. The Grizzlies knocked off an ACC team that has played in 13 of the last 16 NCAA tournaments, on its home court no less. Pitt entered the contest with a 135-5 all-time mark in non-conference games at the Petersen Events Center and had never lost a home opener in the building.

The victory, however, will mean little if the team doesn't use it as a springboard into the rest of the season, particularly in March.

"We want to win these games in November so we can win these games in March," Travis DeCuire said afterward, noting that he schedules games like these in order to prepare his team for Big Sky Conference action and, hopefully, the postseason.

BIG-GAMER OGUINE

Junior guard Michael Oguine scored a career-high 29 points in Montana's win at Pitt (Nov. 13), but more impressive than the 29 points or team-most five assists was the fact that Oguine took over when it mattered most.

He scored 16 of his points in the final 8:32 of regulation, including Montana's final 10 points overall. Trailing 67-63 with 4:32 to play, Oguine out-scored Pitt's entire team, 10-4, to give Montana a two-point lead in the final minute of regulation.

"Mike's one of those guys where when he's mad he's better," Travis DeCuire said. "If he thinks it's time to put everybody on his back, he's going to get it done. He carried us when we needed him to."

100 AND COUNTING

Nov. 13 was a special night for the Montana basketball program, but for two Grizzlies in particular.

Fabijan Krslovic played in his 100th consecutive game. The senior from Australia has played in every UM game since the start of the 2014-15 season (now 106, including 89 starts). Additionally, the game against Pitt was Travis DeCuire's 100th game as head coach. The former Griz player was 59-41 following the signature victory, the fifth-best mark through 100 games out of Montana's 25 head coaches. DeCuire has led Montana to a 2014-15 regular-season conference title and back-to-back appearances in the Big Sky Conference tournament championship game (2015 and 2016).

STARTING STRONG

Montana's wins over Whitworth (Nov. 10) and Pitt (Nov. 13) gave the Grizzlies their first 2-0 start to a season since the 2009-10 squad began the year with three consecutive wins. That team finished with a 22-10 record, winning a Big Sky championship and advancing to the NCAA tournament.

WORKING OVERTIME

Montana won its first overtime game in nearly two years on Nov. 13, defeating Pitt, 83-78. Prior to that, Montana's last overtime victory was a double-overtime win at Northern Arizona on Dec. 31, 2015. The Grizzlies lost both overtime contests in 2016-17.

GOING SMALL

One of the expected strengths to Montana's roster this year is its height compared to a year ago. The Grizzlies have three players listed at 6-8 or taller compared to just one a year ago (not including UM's three players 6-8 or taller who are sitting out for the season).

However, several times this season Travis DeCuire has gone with a smaller lineup. The smaller unit allowed Montana to go on a second-half run in its season opener vs. Whitworth (Nov. 10) and has allowed the team to spread the ball better and quicker.

HOME-OPENING SUCCESS

With Montana's win over Whitworth (Nov. 10), the Grizzlies improved to 15-3 in home openers since the turn of the century.

DEBUTING

Montana's season opener vs. Whitworth (Nov. 10) marked collegiate and UM debuts for several Grizzlies. Junior Jamar Akoh, a transfer from Cal State Fullerton, earned the start. Also seeing consistent time were freshmen Timmy Falls and Karl Nicholas. In the final minute of the game, Travis DeCuire inserted Admir Besovic, Niko Bevens and Lars Espe.

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHPS

The offense had been clicking, but the defense needed work. That was Travis DeCuire's assessment through the first month of practices and scrimmages, leading up to Montana's exhibition contest vs. Saskatchewan (Nov. 6).

DeCuire saw his team's ability to get stops, as Montana held Saskatchewan to 26-percent shooting in an 85-44 exhibition victory at Dahlberg Arena. Leading by just two, 25-23, with under 8 minutes to play in the first half, Montana went on a 36-4 run over the next 14 minutes – extending across both periods – and did not allow a field goal during that span. The Huskies were 0-for-18 from the floor with 11 turnovers during that stretch. On the evening, Montana forced 12 steals and blocked a dozen shots.

ANDERSON SIGNED

Montana signed Mack Anderson to a National Letter of Intent on Nov. 8. The Bozeman native selected Montana over offers from Montana State and Air Force, and after visiting Boise State and Denver.

Anderson averaged nearly two blocks per game during the 2017 state tournament, helping Bozeman High School to a runner-up finish at the Montana Class 2A state tournament. After mostly talking with NAIA schools, Anderson burst onto the scene over the summer while playing for Montana Elite.

"I like his athleticism and agility," Travis DeCuire said. "Not very often do you get a 6-8 athlete who can run and jump and ball a little bit. We're excited about what he presents in the future."

LOOKING AHEAD

After six of its last eight games have come on the road, Montana will return home for its next two games, vs. UC Riverside (Dec. 17) and UC Irvine (Dec. 19). But first, the Grizzlies will catch up on classwork, with final exams fast approaching.

PRESEASON NOTES

RETURNING TALENT

The Grizzlies have the pieces to contend this season, returning three of their four consistent starters from 2016-17, in addition to a pair of guards – Sayeed Pridgett and Bobby Moorehead – who each started about one-third of last year's contests.

In total, Montana returns the majority of its production in all aspects of the game, bringing back its top two scorers, and four of its top five. On the other end of the floor, Montana had six players with 90 or more rebounds a year ago; five of them are back on the court.

NEW GUYS COMING IN

While Montana returns the majority of its production from a year ago, the team also turned over roughly half of its roster, with several newcomers expected to slide in and fill roles immediately. The Grizzlies signed six freshmen, in addition to sophomore JUCO transfer Niko Bevens.

- **Admir Besovic** – Originally from Bosnia and Herzegovina, has spent the past two seasons at the Virginia Episcopal School in Lynchburg, where he averaged 11.2 points and 6.8 rebounds last year as a team captain.
- **Niko Bevens** – As a freshman at North Idaho College, led the Cardinals to an NWAC Eastern Conference championship by making 50 percent of his three-point attempts.
- **Lars Espe** – 2016-17 Young Player of the Year in the BLNO, Norway's premier professional basketball league.
- **Timmy Falls** – 2016-17 East Bay Athletic League MVP.
- **Peter Jones** – Played in 26 games as a senior at O'Dea High School, averaging 4.8 points per game.
- **Kelby Kramer** – No. 2 prep prospect from the state of Wyoming, being named to USA Today's All-USA Wyoming Boys Basketball Team
- **Karl Nicholas** – As the 17th-best prep prospect from the state of Texas, was named the 2016-17 Texas District 22-6A MVP.

DYNAMIC DUO, PART II

Montana boasts one of the top duos in the Big Sky with junior guards Ahmaad Rorie and Michael Oguine. The two combined to score well over one-third of the team's points a year ago, also ranking No. 1 and 2 for minutes played.

A transfer from Oregon, Rorie made a name for himself during his first season in the league, earning second-team All-Big Sky honors. He started all 31 contest, and led the Grizzlies in minutes (32.5 per game), points (17.6), assists (97), field goals made (192), three-pointers (63) and free-throw percent-age (.833). His 1.2 assist-to-turnover ratio helped Montana have the 12th-fewest turnovers in Division I in 2016-17.

After recording the second-most points ever for a Montana freshman, Oguine followed up his debut season with an even better sophomore campaign. He averaged 11.9 points per game – including 13.3 during conference play – and shot .481 from the floor. He ranked second on the team for points, re-bounds (6.0 per game) and steals (37), and earned third-team all-conference honors.

Both players have been named to various publications' preseason all-conference teams, with Rorie being one of six players selected to the official preseason All-Big Sky team voted on by the league's coaches.

FABULOUS SENIOR

Montana's lone senior is Australian Fabijan Krslovic, who entered the season having played in 100 consecutive games – starting 83. Krslovic was Montana's top rebounder in 2016-17, with more than one-third of his boards coming on the offensive glass. He also led Montana with 15 steals and 20 blocked shots and was one of just three Big Sky players to rank in the top 15 in the conference for both categories.

Krslovic will admit he's not the most athletic player on the court, but he's consistent and is the glue of the team, according to the coaching staff. After being forced to be more of a center last year because of Montana's lack of height, he will now transition into a more natural role as a 6-8 forward.

ADDED HEIGHT

A year ago, Fabijan Krslovic (6-8) was the Grizzlies' tallest player, which forced him to play a different role

as Montana's only true post player. This year, he is one of five players at 6-8 or taller. It was a conscious effort by DeCuire, looking to add more height and depth to his team's roster.

Admir Besovic (7-0) and Kelby Kramer (6-10) are still raw as true freshmen, adjusting to the quicker style of play in the college game, but both can play a true center position. Kramer is more of a shot-blocker and rebounder, while Besovic has the ability to clog the lane and make it tough for opposing offenses to penetrate to the rim.

Montana believes it has a solid low-presence combination of Krslovic and transfer Jamar Akoh, and also has 6-8 Karl Nicholas, who can be an athletic force on both ends of the court.

MORE RETURNING TALENT

In addition to Montana's senior and pair of all-conference guards, the team returns three other players, including Sayeed Pridgett and Bobby Moorehead.

As a true freshman, Pridgett earned 11 starts and ranked ninth in the Big Sky with a .524 field-goal percentage. He was also the team's third-best rebounder (3.9 per game) and ranked fourth on the team for points (8.1 per game) and assists (4.4). In his second collegiate season, Moorehead started 10 games and averaged 2.8 rebounds per game while adding 3.9 points, 10 total steals and nine blocked shots. Sophomore guard Trever Spojka is also back. The Billings native saw action in eight contests as a redshirt freshman, totaling 10 points on 3-of-7 shooting.

STARTING THEM YOUNG

Montana is one of 11 NCAA Division I schools nationally to have at least nine newcomers and just one senior.

Kentucky leads the nation with 12 newcomers and zero seniors, while Auburn has a dozen newcomers and one senior. Tennessee, Toledo and Wofford each have 10 newcomers and one senior, while Montana, Bowling Green, Holy Cross, Kansas State, Louisiana Tech and Oklahoma have nine new players and one expected graduate.

DORSEY TO MISS SEASON

The Grizzlies will be without junior forward Donaven Dorsey this season. Dorsey, who redshirted in 2016-17 after transferring from the University of Washington, suffered a pair of hip injuries that require separate surgeries. The first was performed on Oct. 23. He played in 55 games over two seasons with the Huskies, earning eight starts. He totaled 166 points and 77 rebounds.

PICKED TO FINISH 3RD

Montana has high expectations for itself, and those who follow Big Sky basketball feel similar. In the preseason polls, Montana was picked to finish third by both the coaches and media. The Grizzlies were slotted to finish behind Idaho and Weber State in both polls (complete listing on Page 8).

Travis DeCuire said being picked to finish in the upper echelon is a sign of respect, but he and his team have their own set of goals, especially after winning a regular-season championship in 2015 and playing in the conference tournament title game in both 2015 and 2016.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

A year ago, Travis DeCuire believed he compiled the most-challenging schedule in program history, facing an all-Division-I slate. This year, it may

be even tougher. The Grizzlies open the season with 13 non-conference games, five of which are against Power-5 teams. The team's first road trip is at Pitt (ACC) and Penn State (Big Ten) – part of the prestigious Legends Classic. The tournament will continue the following week in Malibu, Calif., as Montana takes on Oral Roberts and either UC Santa Barbara or host Pepperdine.

The Grizzlies will get their air miles several weeks later, traveling to Georgia State, in addition to three contests against Pac-12 foes – Stanford, UCLA and Washington. The Bruins are ranked in the AP pre-season top-25 poll.

In Missoula, Montana will host Cal State Northridge, Carroll, UC Irvine, UC Riverside and Whitworth. The 18-game league schedule will begin Dec. 28 and include home-and-home contests against Montana State, North Dakota, Northern Arizona, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State and Southern Utah. Montana will also will travel to Eastern Washington and Idaho, and will host Idaho State and Weber State to close the regular season.

The Big Sky Conference tournament will be held in Reno, Nev., for the final year before moving to Boise, Idaho, next spring.

TEAM BONDING IN COSTA RICA

The Grizzlies got a head start to the basketball season, taking a foreign tour to Costa Rica in early August. The NCAA allows for teams to participate in such trips once every four years. The trip was beneficial in several facets. In addition to key bonding time – being in a foreign country with your teammates and being able to partake in several activities, including pool time and a zip line through a jungle – and service initiatives – the team spent a day at an orphanage, playing sports with the children and reading to them – the team also competed in a pair of scrimmages and was allotted 10 practices in Missoula leading up to the trip.

The tour allowed for Travis DeCuire to introduce concepts to his team – particularly the newcomers – much earlier than he usually would, and noted that the team was ahead of where they normally were early in fall camp.

SECURING THE BALL

Montana averaged just 10.8 turnovers per game a year ago, the 12th-fewest in all of NCAA Division I basketball.

PROUD HISTORY

Travis DeCuire is well aware of Montana's proud history, and has experienced it firsthand. During the 1990s, Montana won the Big Sky Conference and played in the NCAA tournament three times in a seven-year period, including DeCuire's sophomore campaign. The two-time All-Big Sky selection still holds Montana's record for career assists.

Since Montana's first conference championship in 1975, no Big Sky team has won more conference titles (10) than Montana. Additionally, the Grizzlies have won nine tournament titles and have nine runner-up finishes – including three championships and three runner-up finishes in the past eight seasons. In the league's history, Montana has won more games than any Big Sky school except for Weber State.

DECUIRE REACHES MILESTONE

Midway through last season, DeCuire's third in Missoula, the Grizzlies defeated Northern Colorado to earn the head coach his 50th victory. He is the second-fastest Griz coach to reach that milestone (84 games). The fastest to 50 was Blaine Taylor, DeCuire's head coach when he played for the Griz.

TRAVIS DECUIRE

Head Coach | Fourth Season | Montana, 1994

In his first two seasons as the University of Montana's 27th men's head basketball coach, Travis DeCure accomplished something no other coach in UM history had: he posted two 20-win seasons in his first two seasons.

Now entering the fourth season at his alma mater, DeCure is once again poised to put the Grizzlies back on the road to a 20-win campaign.

DeCure (pronounced: dee-CURE) was formally introduced as the Grizzlies' head basketball coach in June 2014, at a press conference at UM's Adams Center after the initial announcement from UM's Director of Athletics Kent Haslam in May of that year.

In his first season at the helm of a program with a rich history of success, DeCure's Griz started the year picked to finish eighth in the conference. Led by future European professional Jordan Gregory, UM would go on to defy expectations and win the Big Sky regular-season championship and advance to the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) before finishing the season 20-13 (14-4 BSC).

At the time, he became only the second coach in UM history to notch 20 victories in his first season at the helm – a feat also accomplished by Blaine Taylor in 1991-92 (27-4).

In DeCure's second year, he followed up with another 20-win season and another trip to the Big Sky championship game, this time led by future European professional Martin Breunig. DeCure's Grizzlies would once again advance to the postseason, competing in the first round of the CBI tournament against Nevada, finishing with a 21-12 (14-4 BSC) record.

Paced by 10 underclassmen and just two seniors who played significant time, the Grizzlies went 16-16 (11-7 BSC) in 2016-17, earning a first-round bye in the Big Sky tournament. During the season, DeCure became the second-fastest UM head coach to reach 50 wins (doing so in 84 contests). He coached a pair of UM sophomores – both returning in 2017-18 – to All-Big Sky Conference recognition.

The 2016-17 season was also the second consecutive year in which the Grizzlies have posted a team grade-point average above 3.0, earning NABC Team Academic Excellence recognition both seasons.

Prior to returning to his alma mater as head coach, DeCure spent six seasons (2008-09 through 2013-14) on the University of California coaching staff – including the final four as associate head coach. Regarded as one of the top tutors in the game, DeCure helped former Montana mentor Mike Montgomery – a member of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame – transform Cal into one of the winningest programs in the Pac-12 during his time in Berkeley. The Bears reached the postseason all six years he was on the staff, including the NCAA tournament four times. The Golden Bears boasted 130 wins in his six seasons – the best six-year stretch in school history – winning the 2010 Pac-10 championship. He coached numerous all-conference selections, including conference players of the year Jerome Randle (2010) and Jorge Gutierrez (2012).

DeCure he spent five seasons (2003-04 through 2007-08) as an assistant coach at Old Dominion, under former Griz head coach and player Blaine Taylor. There, he helped the Monarchs to a combined record of 117-53. The mark included 94 wins during his final four seasons – the most in school history over a four-year stretch. ODU reached the postseason each of those four seasons and advanced to the NCAA tournament in both 2005 and 2007 – winning a school-record 28 contests in 2005. Additionally, the Monarchs reached the NIT semifinals in 2006 and the quarterfinals of the College Basketball Invitational in 2008.

DeCure, from Seattle, Wash., also has head coaching experience from stints at Sammamish High School and Green River Community College in Washington. At GRCC, DeCure took over a last-place program and guided it to a conference championship and its first 20-win season in more than 20 years, earning league coach-of-the-year honors in 2003 – his second season. At Sammamish High School in Bellevue, DeCure led his team to a pair of conference titles, a state tournament appearance and three consecutive trips to the district tournament.

As a point guard for Montana from 1992-94 DeCure was named All-Big Sky Conference as a junior and senior. He set a school record in just three seasons with 435 career assists. He also established UM's single-season mark with 199 assists as a senior in 1993-94, when he was ranked 12th in the nation, averaging 7.1 assists a game. He was the recipient of the Grizzlies' Carl Dragstedt Award (MVP) as a junior and senior, and received the John Eahart Award (Outstanding Defensive Player) following his senior year.

As a freshman at Chaminade-Hawaii, he was a starter and team MVP in 1990. He then transferred to Montana and redshirted in 1991. DeCure attended Mercer Island High School (Wash.), where he was a three-year starter and all-state, team MVP, and a McDonald's All-America honorable mention pick as a senior.

He has a strong commitment to community service and founded and acted as president of the Fastbreak Basketball Association – an organization that assists in teaching life lessons and building self-esteem through basketball to more than 500 students in the Seattle-Tacoma area. Additionally, he has extensive experience in counseling at the Echo Glen Children's Center in Snoqualmie, Wash., from 1996-98, and with the Ryther Children's Center in North Seattle, from 1995-97.

DeCure graduated from Montana in 1994 with a degree in business marketing. He and his wife, Sabrina, have two daughters – Brianna (24) and Tamia (5).
