PREVIEW

The Montana men's basketball team will have no time to rest on a solid performance at Oregon, as the Grizzlies return home on Sunday for the start of the Basketball Travelers Mike Montgomery Classic Sunday evening.

The Grizzlies will take on UC Davis in the opener of the multi-team event. The Aggies will then play North Dakota State on Tuesday before the Grizzlies and Bison wrap up the event on Thursday night at 8:00 p.m.

Mike Montgomery coached at the University of Montana from 1978-86 and is an integral branch of the legendary Montana coaching tree. In his time at UM Montgomery won 155 games with a .669 winning percentage. He's fourth in all-time wins at Montana and third in winning percentage.

While in Missoula, Montgomery coached several Grizzly legends. He mentored Big Sky MVP Derrick Pope and three-time league MVP and Big Sky Hall of Famer Larry Krystkowiak. In fact, four of Montana's seven all-time league MVP awards came during Montgomery's eight seasons.

"Monty" would go on to have a Hall of Fame career following his time in Montana. He took the head coaching position at Stanford in 1986 and led the Cardinal to a Final Four, Elite Eight, and 11 total tournament appearances. He would serve briefly as head coach of the Golden State Warriors in the NBA before returning to the college ranks for six seasons at Cal.

He once again found success, winning 20 games in five of his six years and taking the Golden Bears to four NCAA Tournaments. While there, he hired current Grizzly head coach Travis DeCuire.

Montgomery will be in attendance on Thursday evening. He called Montana's game Friday night against Oregon for the Pac-12 Network.

The game saw Montana compete very well for 30 minutes but come up short of the upset as the Ducks pulled away late in the contest. Montana were led by 17 points from Aanen Moody and 13 from freshman Money Williams.

The Grizzlies had 37 points at halftime and were outshooting the Ducks, but the size and a hot-shooting streak for the hosts proved too much to overcome. Montana played a clean game, turning the ball over just six times in a rowdy environment inside Matthew Knight Arena. There were 7,141 fans in attendance.

The shots from deep just wouldn't fall for Montana, as they connected on 4-of-15 (.267) threes in the game and just a single one in the second half. Still, the game featured 13 ties and 11 lead changes, including a Montana lead in the second half.

A quick flight home gives Montana just one day to prepare for the 2-0 Aggies of UC Davis. They are coming off an emotional win at home on Nov. 9, beating Pepperdine on a last-second shot 79-78. UC Davis, members of the Big West, went 18-14 last year and return most of their top contributors from that team.

OPPONENT PREVIEW

SCOUTING UC DAVIS (2-0)

- The Aggies enter Sunday's contest undefeated with an emotional win their last time out. UC Davis erased a 17-point halftime deficit against Pepperdine to win 79-78 on a buzzer beater from Ty Johnson.
- Johnson scored 28 points in the win. He scored 24 in the second half to lead the comeback.
- UC Davis play at a fast pace all game long, often forcing opposing offenses into mistakes and quick judgements. It will be a clash of styles as Montana plays a methodical brand of basketball in search of great shots.
- The Aggies won 18 games in 2022-23, its most in a season since a 22-11 record in 2017-18 that ended in an NIT appearance. They last played in the NCAA Tournament in 2017.
- As a team, UC Davis averages 82.5 points per game and are shooting 49.1 percent from the floor. They are outrebounding opponents 34.0-31.0 and average over five assists more per game. They also force 24 turnovers per game, which is the 6th-most in the NCAA.
- They get to the line often, attempting 24 free throws per contest. It's the 11th most in the country through the opening week of games.
- Elijah Pepper is averaging 22.5 points per game through the first two contests. It's the 3rd most in the Big West and 41st most in the country.

SERIES HISTORY

This is the first-ever meeting between Montana and UC Davis.

OPPONENT PREVIEW

SCOUTING NORTH DAKOTA STATE ()

- Head coach David Richman has a very similar story to Grizzly head coach Travis DeCuire. Both are in the 10th year in charge of their alma maters, as Richman graduated from NDSU in 2002. They also have nearly identical records (Richman 177-114, DeCuire 178-113) with five combined NCAA Tournament appearances.
- The Bison finished 16-17 overall in 2022-23, but caught fire late similar to Montana. They made a run all the way to the championship game in the Summit League, where they fell to a very talented Oral Roberts team.
- NDSU returns four starters and nine letterwinners from last year's team. They did lose First Team All-Summit League player Grant Nelson, who transferred to Alabama where he is averaging 22 points and 7.5 rebounds through two games.
- March has been a good month for NDSU under Richman. The championship game appearance was the fifth in a row for NDSU in the Summit League, and they have three NCAA Tournament appearances. They won a First Round tournament game in 2014.
- Boden Skunberg leads the Bison with 21.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. He is shooting over 50 percent from three with seven makes through two games.
- Andrew Morgan is averaging a near double-double this year with 11.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game.
- The Bison have been outscored 79-78 in the first half of games, but are ahead 86-58 in the second half.

THE DECUIRE DOWNLOAD

Head coach Travis DeCuire enters his 10th season at the University of Montana with a 177-112 overall record, and a 113-52 record in Big Sky play. He's one of the winningest coaches in university and league history.

DeCuire's teams have been .500 or better in all nine seasons and he's had four 20-win years. In a lineage of great coaches, he shares to program lead in 20-win seasons with Mike Montgomery, Blaine Taylor, and Wayne Tinkle.

He begins 2023-24 third in Big Sky history with 113 league wins, trailing only Weber State's Randy Rahe (198) and Montana State's Mick Durham (123). He's also sixth in league history in overall wins with a chance to move into the top five this year.

He is just the third coach in Grizzly history to coach for 10 seasons, joining all-time wins leader George "Jiggs" Dahlberg (16 season) and J.W. Stewart (10 seasons).

The 177 wins by Montana over the previous nine seasons are the 77th most in the NCAA during that stretch, tied with notable programs Seton Hall and Texas A&M and ahead of legendary schools like Indiana (176) and Florida (175).

MORE MOODY

Aanen Moody returns in 2023-24 for his 7th season of collegiate basketball, and he does so with some very high goals and expectations. Moody led Montana with 16.1 points per game last year, leading the second half comeback and earning both Second Team All-Big Sky honors and a spot on the All-Tournament Team.

He is averaging over 20 points per game this year to again lead Montana.

The Big Sky Conference coaches and media named him to the Preseason All-Conference Team in October.

He scored his 1,000th career point last season and enters this year with 1,116 points. He's an elite shooter, making 39.8 percent of his 600 career attempts. He's one of just four players in the entire NCAA to enter the season with that many career attempts and at least a 39 percent make rate.

His playmaking and showmanship delighted Montana fans in his first season, and you can expect plenty more "MOOOOOODY" chants to ring throughout Dahlberg Arena this season.

WHITNEY IK WATCH

Senior guard Brandon Whitney has averaged at least 10.0 points per game in all three seasons at Montana. He's on the verge of becoming the 36th player in program history to reach 1,000 points, entering the season just 57 points away.

He would be the 7th player in Montana's 1,000-point club coached by Travis DeCuire. Aanen Moody has also reached 1,000 points, but scored 682 of those for other schools.

DOWNTOWN DT

Dischon Thomas proved a valuable scorer and floor spacer last season with his three-point shooting ability. Thomas averaged 11.2 points per game and shot 37.0 percent from deep with 50 total makes. His scoring should be key to Montana's success again this

year.

After spending his first three seasons at Colorado State, Thomas is on pace to reach 1,000 career points during the season. He enters with 778 career points and scored 347 total last season in an expanded role with Montana.

Thomas is averaging 8.0 points and 7.0 rebounds so far this year.

SHOW ME THE MONEY

True freshman Money Williams has made an instant impact for Montana in his first two games at the collegiate level. He is second on Montana with 16.0 points per game and is the third-leading rebounded at 5.0.

Williams kept Montana in the game in the second half against Oregon, scoring eight points and grabbing five rebounds in the final period.

He is the first Grizzly freshman to score in double-figures in his first two career games since Michael Ogune in 2015.

PRESEASON POLLS

The Grizzlies were picked to finish 2nd/3rd in the Big Sky Preseason Polls. The Coaches' Poll slotted Montana in at No. 2 trailing only Weber State. The Wildcats received the maximum nine first-place votes. Montana received Weber State's vote as coaches are not allowed to select their own team.

In the Media Poll, Montana again trailed Weber State and fell in behind defending regular-season champ Eastern Washington. The Wildcats return Preseason MVP Dillon Jones, while the Eagles lost last year's league MVP Steele Venters to Gonzaga over the off-season.

A LOOK AT THE NON-CONFERENCE

Montana will face a difficult non-conference schedule this season. They have 13 total games with 10 D-1 opponents and three lower division opponents. Includ-

ing only D-1 opposition, Montana play seven games against teams with winning records in 2022-23.

Houston ended last season No. 1 in the NET Rankings and begin the year No. 6 in the Preseason Coaches' Poll.

Oregon and Nevada were both 20-win teams a year ago that finished inside the top 50 in the NET Rankings. They also take on San Jose State, a 20-14 squad last season that finished in the top 100, twice.

The Grizzlies will try to generate some success on the road, a task that has been challenging in previous years. They often play up against Power 5 opponents on the road, and will do so again this year. Since DeCuire took over, Montana is 6-41 in away non-conference games and have never won multiple road non-conference games in the same season.

DECEMBER TO REMEMBER

This will be a unique December for Montana with three home games in the first eight days followed by a very long road trip. The Grizzlies won't return home to Missoula until January 6, making it 28 full days without a home game.

It's the first time since 2016-17 that Montana will play five straight regular season games away from home, and the first time since 2012-13 that they will play five straight true road games. They played a Bracket-Busters game against Davidson on the road that year, which was added in between two conference road trips.

The 28-day gap between home games is the longest since 2006-07, when Montana also played five straight road games over the holiday break. They went from Dec. 13 to Jan. 13 without a home game that year.

CALIFORNIA LOVE

Montana has a long history of successful players from California and a good connection with coaches and recruits in the state. This year there are seven total players from California on the Montana roster, which

matches the second-highest total in Travis DeCuire's tenure.

The Griz also had seven Californians in 2020-21. The most on a single roster is nine on the 2019-20 team.

Some of the best players in program history hail from The Golden State, including Kareem Jamar (Venice) and Will Cherry (West Oakland). Many of the best players of the DeCuire era are also Californians. Michael Oguine (Los Angeles), Sayeed Pridgett (Oakland), Jamar Akoh (Rancho Cucamonga), Mario Dunn (Oakland), and Timmy Falls (Dublin).

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

Montana have quite a collection of players that were coached by their fathers.

Dischon Thomas was coached by his father Howard Thomas at Hillcrest Prep in Arizona. Rhett Reynolds played at Shelby HS for his father Tom Reynolds. The most recent addition is Chase Henderson, who was coached by his father Courtney Henderson at Hoover HS in Des Moines.

Brandon Whitney's father Emad also coached at the high school level.

GRIZ FROM DOWN UNDER

Montana have made quite the connection down under with many Australian players contributing over the past several years. Blake Jones is the latest in a long line of Aussies to suit up for the Griz. Since 2013, there has only been one season where Montana didn't have an Australian on the roster.

Jones looks to be the fifth Grizzly letterman in that time, joining Josh Bannan (Melbourne), Ben Carter (Adelaide), Fabijan Krslovic (Abbotsbury), and Jack Lopez (Woronora).

COACHING TREE CONNECTIONS

The Montana coaching tree is historic, including several College Basketball Hall of Famers and many more that have coached at the very highest levels.

There is a connection in the tree this weekend as former Griz head coach Mike Montgomery will be on the Pac-12 Network broadcast as the analyst.

Montgomery coached at Montana from 1978-86 before a long, successful career at Stanford and Cal, as well as a stop with the NBA's Golden State Warriors.

At Montana, Montgomery had a 155-76 record (.669). He had four 20-win seasons, which is tied with current head coach Travis DeCuire, along with Blaine Taylor and Wayne Tinkle, for the most in program history.

GRIZ NOTES

- Montana went 10-7 in Big Sky play last season. It's the 14th time in the previous 15 seasons that the Griz have won at least 10 conference games.
- Montana were picked to finish 2nd/3rd in the Big Sky this year in the Preseason Coaches' Poll and Media Poll. The Grizzlies finished 4th in the league last year with a 10-7 record.
- The Grizzlies have broken the school record for free throw percentage in three straight seasons. Montana shot 78.8 percent last season. It broke the previous record of 78.5 percent in 2021-22, which broke the prior year's record of 78.2 percent. Montana ranked 6th in the NCAA last year.
- Montana returns 58.1 percent of its starts, 61.3 percent of its minutes and 69.2 percent of its points from last seasons team. They lose over half their rebounding, but an expanded role for Laolu Oke plus newcomers Blake Jones and Te'Jon Sawyer should help replace

those stats.

- A traditional power in the Big Sky Conference, Montana has 12 Big Sky regular season titles and 11 tournament titles. They won both in 2019, marking the most recent championship for Griz Hoops.
- Travis DeCuire is .500 or better against every team in the Big Sky Conference entering the 2023-24 season.
- Aanen Moody earned a spot on the Preseason All-Big Sky Conference team following a sensational debut season at Montana. The graduate guard was named Second Team All-Big Sky last year and also played his way onto a spot on the All-Tournament Team in Boise.
- The Grizzlies return three starters from last year's team. Dischon Thomas and Brandon Whitney join Moody in returning to Missoula, while several key rotation players are also back.
- Blake Jones, Giordan Williams, and Te'Jon Sawyer all transfer in with D-I experience. Combined, the trio has 161 games of experience at this level. Williams has the most with 78 appearances at Santa Clara, followed by Jones (51, George Mason) and Sawyer (32, Cal Baptist).
- The Grizzlies will play three schools for the first time this year; Northwest Indian College, Houston, and UC Davis.
- Travis DeCuire is 1-14 in his career against Pac-12 opponents, including an 0-3 record against Oregon. The Ducks have been ranked for two of the matchups. The lone win came in 2020 against Washington, as Montana picked up a 66-58 win in Seattle.

- The Grizzlies were elite from beyond the arc on 2022-23 on both offense and defense. Montana made 37.2 percent of its three-point attempts on the year, the 34th-best mark in the entire country. They also held opponents to 32.3 percent, the 82nd-best in the NCAA.
- The tempo of Montana limited opponents chances last year. The Griz allowed just over 52 field goal attempts per game to its opponents, the 19th fewest of any team in the country.
- The Grizzlies enter Sunday averaging 34.5 rebounds per game, which is the best mark in the Big Sky and 30th in the NCAA.
- Montana has been very good with the ball this year, giving it away just 10.5 times per game. It will be important against a UC Davis team that's game is based upon takeaways.
- The Grizzlies are ranked 70th in the country in both field goal percentage (51.2 percent) and field goal percentage defense (35.7 percent).
- Three true freshmen played in Montana's game against Oregon. Money Williams, Chase Henderson, and Connor Dick could all see minutes in the Grizzly rotation in their first year in Missoula.
- Aanen Moody leads Montana in scoring with 21.0 points per game. He also led the Grizzlies in 2022-23, averaging 16.1 points.
- This is the first time in program history that Montana will play three non-conference opponents in home-and-home series. The last time they did it against a single opponent was Wyoming in 2016-17, and the only other time they've had multiple series in the Big Sky era was in 1970-71 when they played Washington and Puget Sound.
- New NCAA rules allowed DeCuire to expand his coaching staff for the upcoming season. Associate head coach Chris Cobb and assistant Jay Flores return in their roles. Anderson Clarke and DJ Broome are back with the program but both have been elevated to assistant coaching roles. Reuben Williams is in his first season at Montana as an assistant.

BEER SALES IN DAHLBERG ARENA

Fans attending home games in Dahlberg Arena will be able to bring beers to their seats in the 2023-24 season. Beers will be allowed throughout the arena with

a few exceptions. The students' section and court-side seating areas, along with sections 201 and 211, will not allow beer.

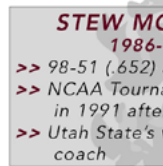

WINNING WAYS

- Entering 2023-24, Montana is one of 15 schools nationally to post a .500 or better record in 14 consecutive seasons (Arizona, Baylor, Belmont, Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Memphis, Michigan State, Montana, Saint Mary's, San Diego State, Vermont, VCU and Xavier). Head Coach Travis DeCuire has never had a losing season at Montana.
- From 2012-13 through 2021-22, the Grizzlies were one of 40 programs nationally to win at least 65 percent of their games (202-118, .612). During a two-year span from 2017-18 through 2018-19, Montana went to back-to-back NCAA tournaments and won 75.4 percent of its games (52-17, 24th nationally).
- Since 2010-11, Montana have won a total of 265 games. It's the 57th most in the NCAA during the span, ahead of notable schools like Indiana, Butler, Iowa State, and NC State. It's also the most wins by a Big Sky school during the stretch.
- Montana won 82.3 percent of its home games (121-26) from 2011-12 through 2020-21, the nation's 37th-best home winning percentage during that span.
- The Griz have won 177 games since Travis DeCuire took over in 2014, the 77th-most total wins in the NCAA during the stretch.
- All-time, Montana is 1,557-1,288-1 (.547).

CHAMPIONSHIP CULTURE

- Montana has won more Big Sky tournament titles than any other school (11). The Grizzlies also have won the regular-season title 12 times.
- Dating back to 1991, every four-year player has won a conference championship at Montana.
- Montana has won five regular-season Big Sky titles in the past 11 seasons, and has finished in the top three all but twice dating back to 2008-09.
- In the last six complete seasons, Montana has played in the Big Sky

Conference championship game four times, trailing only Gonzaga, Iona, Villanova, Buffalo and San Diego State nationally. In the last 11 years, Montana has played in the Big Sky Conference championship game eight times, trailing only Gonzaga, New Mexico State and San Diego State.

DANCING IN MARCH

- Montana has played in the NCAA Tournament 12 times, including in both 2018 and 2019.
- The Grizzlies' first NCAA Tournament appearance came in 1975, earning a win over Utah State in the Round-of-32 before narrowly falling to John Wooden's final national championship team at UCLA. Montana also earned an NCAA Tournament win in 2006, knocking off No. 5 seed Nevada.
- Montana has played in the NCAA Tournament five times in the past 11 seasons; compared to Pac-12 programs, Montana ranks ahead of Arizona State, Cal, Colorado, Oregon State, Stanford, USC, Utah, Washington and Washington State during that span.
- The Grizzlies have played in the NIT four times and CBI once.

GRIZ HISTORY

- Notable former head coaches include College Basketball Hall of Famers Jud Heathcote and Mike Montgomery, in addition to Montana alums Blaine Taylor, Larry Krystkowiak and Wayne Tinkle.
- Krystkowiak is Montana's all-time leading scorer (2,017) and rebounder (1,105). He is one of 123 Division-I players in NCAA history with more than 2,000 career points and 1,000 career rebounds.
- Montana has had seven NBA Draft picks, including first-round selections Michael Ray Richardson and Lee Johnson. Currently, more than a dozen former players are playing professionally overseas. At least 75 players total have continued their playing careers after college.
- The 2020-21 team had 100-percent voter registration during the 2020 election.

Now entering his 10th season as head coach of the Montana men's basketball program, Travis DeCure continues to etch his name into the Grizzlies' record book. DeCure has led Montana to three Big Sky Conference regular-season championships (2015, 2018, 2019), two Big Sky tournament titles (2018, 2019) and two NCAA tournament berths (2018, 2019).

In a lineage of historic coaches, DeCure (pronounced: duh-CURE) is the only one to lead Montana to three Big Sky regular-season titles, winning in 2015 – his first season – despite Montana being picked eighth in the preseason poll, and going back-to-back in 2018 and 2019. That dominant two-year stretch saw the Grizzlies win regular-season and tournament titles both years, winning a school-record 52 games over the two seasons. He was named coach of the year by the Big Sky and NABC District 6 in 2018.

DeCure's 177-112 record (.612 winning percentage) entering the 2023-24 season is historic on many levels. In January 2022, DeCure passed College Basketball Hall of Famer Mike Montgomery and his predecessor, Wayne Tinkle, on the school's all-time wins lists. Only George 'Jiggs' Dahlberg, who won 221 games across two stints and whom the arena is named after, has more wins than DeCure.

On a conference level, DeCure is the Big Sky's active leader for wins, owning a 113-52 league mark (.685 winning percentage), including a .500 or better record against every Big Sky opponent. His 177 overall wins rank sixth in Big Sky history. His 113 Big Sky wins rank third all-time. DeCure was the fastest coach in league history to win 50 Big Sky games, needing just 65 games to do so, and the second-fastest to 100 wins.

Montana has had a winning record each season under DeCure, including four 20-win seasons and four postseason berths (2018 NCAA, 2019 NCAA, 2015 NIT, 2016 CBI). At the Big Sky tournament, DeCure has produced an impressive 13-6 record, including four appearances in the title game and a league-record eight straight wins from 2018 through 2021.

DeCure has coached eight first-team All-Big Sky selections, in addition to five second-team honorees, plus the Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year, Freshman of the Year, Newcomer of the Year (twice), Top Reserve (twice) and tournament MVP (twice). He has developed three of the top-eight scorers in school history in Sayeed Pridgett, Ahmaad Rorie and Michael Oguine.

Rorie, the 2019 Big Sky tournament MVP, reached 1,500 career points faster than any player in Montana history, doing so in his third season with the program. Oguine was the 2018 tournament MVP and league's top defender, and finished his career ranked in the top 10 for scoring, steals and games started.

Pridgett was a two-time All-Big Sky first-team selection who finished his career ranked fourth for career scoring, sixth for steals and in the top 15 for assists and rebounds. DeCure also coached big man Martin Breunig, a two-time first-team all-league pick, and Jordan Gregory, who earned first-team honors in 2015.

Josh Bannan is the most recent All-Conference player developed by DeCure, earning first-team honors in 2023 and second-team in 2022.

Off the court, DeCure proudly boasts a 100-percent graduation rate, in addition to earning the NABC Team Academic Award six times (2016, 2017, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023). Montana has obtained a 3.0 cumulative grade-point average for eight consecutive semesters, and in 2020-21, Montana earned a 3.30 team grade-point average, with 10 student-athletes earning Academic All-Big Sky recognition and zero falling below a 2.0 GPA. DeCure has mentored two of Montana's eight Academic All-Americans in Gregory (2015) and Josh Bannan (2022, 2023).

Also off the court, multiple team conversations about social and racial injustices led to action in 2020, including 100-percent voter registration, a solidarity message on the backs of each jersey and the launch of a Free Little Library on campus. The library, which was funded and established by the men's basketball program, features minority-themed literature that the community can freely take from or add to.

2022-23: The Griz won 17 games and reached the semifinals of the Big Sky Conference tournament. After a slow start to Big Sky play, Montana turned things around by winning seven of the final eight games of the regular season. The Grizzlies set school record for the third year in a row with a .788 percentage, which ranked 6th in the NCAA. Bannan and transfer Aanen Moody both reached 1,000 career points during the season. Montana were elite from beyond the arc offensively (.372 percentage, 32nd nationally) and defensively (.322 percentage, 81st nationally).

2021-22: Montana earned 18 wins, including a 7-4 mark in non-conference play, which saw the Grizzlies win the Zootown Classic tournament title. Paced by Bannan, Montana then started 8-2 in Big Sky play, helping DeCure become the fourth coach in Big Sky history to win 100 league games. Montana set a school record from the free-throw line for the second year in a row (.782, 10th in NCAA in 2021-22) and was among the nation's leaders for turnovers per game (10.2, 20th), turnover margin (+2.9, 35th) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.28, 46th).

2020-21: Montana continued to develop young talent, with a trio of freshmen setting school re-

cords for scoring, minutes played and starts by a freshman class. Montana was the only school in the nation to have three true freshmen average at least 25.0 minute per game and was one of only two schools to have its freshman class total 2,000 minutes played. Despite all of that, Montana earned a Pac-12 road win over Washington before peaking at the right time and winning its final four games of the regular season, followed by a pair of victories in the Big Sky tournament, including an upset win over No. 3-seed Weber State. Montana set a then-school record from the charity stripe, making 78.2 percent of its free-throw attempts.

2019-20: Following back-to-back championship seasons, Montana began developing its next wave of talent, with true freshmen – including the Big Sky Freshman of the Year – accounting for a then-school-record 40 starts. The Grizzlies ranked 21st nationally for shooting (.498) and led the Big Sky for field-goal percentage, 3-point field-goal percentage and turnover margin, also ranking in the top three for seven additional categories. Led by Pridgett, an MVP candidate, Montana entered the final week of the regular season in first place and would have been a legitimate Big Sky tournament contender had the tournament and postseason not been wiped out due to the emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic.

2018-19: After graduating just one senior from the 2018 championship team, Montana was an overwhelming favorite to repeat as champions in 2019. The Grizzlies, led by Rorie and Oguine, didn't disappoint, winning 26 games, tied for the third-most in school history. During non-conference, the Grizzlies beat a pair of NCAA tournament teams in Georgia State and North Dakota State, and snapped South Dakota State's nation-leading 26-game home winning streak. After beginning Big Sky play just 3-2, Montana then won 16 of its next 18 games to repeat as Big Sky regular-season and tournament champions.

Montana was one of 20 schools nationally to rank in the top 100 for both scoring offense and defense, and was incredible efficient, making 49.2 percent of its shots (10th in the nation), including 37.6 percent from beyond the arc (38th.).

2017-18: The 2017-18 season was historic on many levels, with the Grizzlies winning 26 games and winning both the Big Sky regular-season and tournament titles to advance to the NCAA tournament. The team's record included a road win at Pitt of the ACC and a perfect 14-0 mark on its home court.

Montana won its first 13 Big Sky games, the third-longest winning streak in school history and the third-longest active streak in the NCAA at that time, including a program-record seven consecutive road victories. Montana used the same starting lineup in all 34 contests and led the Big Sky in five statistical categories while ranking in the top 30 nationally for turnovers forced, steals and turnover margin.

2016-17: Paced by 10 underclassmen and just two seniors who played significant time, the Grizzlies earned a .500 record and a first-round bye in the Big Sky tournament. The 2016-17 season was also the second consecutive year in which the Grizzlies posted a team grade-point average above 3.0, earning NABC Team Academic Excellence recognition.

2015-16: In DeCuire's second season, he posted another 20-win season and another trip to the Big Sky championship game, this time led by Breunig. DeCuire's Grizzlies would once again advance to the postseason, competing in the first round of the CBI tournament against Nevada, finishing with a 21-12 record. DeCuire is the only coach in Montana history to win at least 20 games in each of his

first two seasons.

2014-15: In his first season at the helm of a program with a rich history of success, DeCuire's Grizzlies started the year picked to finish eighth in the conference. Led by Gregory, Montana would go on to defy expectations and win the Big Sky regular-season championship and advance to play Texas A&M in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). At the time, DeCuire became only the second coach in Montana history to notch 20 victories in his first season – a feat also accomplished by his former coach Blaine Taylor, in 1991-92 when DeCuire was a player for the Griz.

Prior to returning to his alma mater as head coach, DeCuire spent six seasons (2008-09 through 2013-14) on the University of California coaching staff – including the final four as associate head coach. Regarded as one of the top tutors in the game, DeCuire helped former Montana mentor Mike Montgomery – a member of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame – transform Cal into one of the winningest programs in the Pac-12 during his time in Berkeley. The Golden Bears reached the postseason all six years he was on staff, including the NCAA tournament four times. They boasted 130 wins in his six seasons – the best six-year stretch in school history – winning the 2010 Pac-10 championship. He coached numerous all-conference selections, including conference players of the year Jerome Randle (2010) and Jorge Gutierrez (2012).

DeCuire spent five seasons (2003-04 through 2007-08) as an assistant coach at Old Dominion, under former Griz head coach and player Blaine Taylor. There, he helped the Monarchs to a combined record of 117-53. The mark included 94 wins during his final four seasons – the most in school history over a four-year period. Old Dominion reached the postseason each of those four seasons and advanced to the NCAA tournament in both 2005 and 2007 – winning a school-record 28 contests in 2005. Additionally, the Monarchs reached the NIT semifinals in 2006 and the quarterfinals of the College Basketball Invitational in 2008.

In 18 seasons as an assistant or head coach at the Division-I level, DeCuire is 407-224, a .645 winning percentage.

DeCuire's roots remain in the Seattle area, where he grew up, started his non-profit and broke into the coaching profession. He served as the head coach at both Sammamish High School and Green River Community College. At GRCC, DeCuire took over a last-place program and guided it to a conference championship and its first 20-win season in more than 20 years, earning league coach-of-the-year honors in 2003 – his second season. At Sammamish High School in Bellevue, DeCuire led his team to a pair of conference titles, a state tournament appearance and three consecutive trips to the district tournament.

As a point guard for Montana from 1992-94 DeCuire was named All-Big Sky as a junior and senior. He set a school record, despite playing just three seasons, with 435 career assists – a mark which still stands today. He also established Montana's single-season record with 199 assists as a senior in 1993-94, when he ranked 12th in the nation, averaging 7.1 assists per game. He was the recipient of the Grizzlies' Carl Dragstedt Award (MVP) as a junior and senior, and received the John Eheart Award (Outstanding Defensive Player) following his senior year. Montana won a pair of Big Sky championships during his Griz career, advancing to the NCAA tournament in both 1991 and 1992.
