Championship History at Grayhawk Golf Club

NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Golf Championship

Grayhawk is the host of the NCAA Golf Championships for three years, 2021-2023

- 2020 – (Cancelled)
- 2021 – Women's May 21-26, Men's May 28-June 2
- 2022 – Women's May 20-25, Men's May 27-June 1
- 2023 – Women's May 19-24, Men's May 26-31

Frys.com Open

Held on par-70 Raptor Course, Grayhawk joined TPC Scottsdale as one of two Arizona golf courses to host a PGA TOUR event.

- 2008 – Cameron Beckman (-18) topped Kevin Sutherland in a playoff
- 2007 – Mike Weir (-14) outlasted Mark Hensby

Thunderbird International Junior

Considered among the top invitationals on the American Junior Golf Association's (AJGA) schedule, the [Thunderbird International Junior](#) took place on Raptor for 20 years, 2000-2019 (2020 cancelled). Past notable champions include William Mouw (2019), Sam Burns (2015), Brad Dalke (2011), Brian Harman (2003) and Ryan Moore (2001). On the girl's side Ariya Jutanugarn (2012), Morgan Pressel (2005), Belen Mozo (2004) and Brittany Lang (2002).

PGA Junior League Championship

Hosted on Raptor in November 2016-2022 teams comprised of boys and girls ages 13 and under make their way through local and regional qualifiers to compete match-play style for the championship in a nine-hole, two-person scramble format. Eight teams from all over the United States make the finals at Grayhawk Golf Club.

Tommy Bahama Challenge

Played on Raptor, the Tommy Bahama Challenge was a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event that featured four "young guns" from the United States in match-play competition against an international team.

- 2004 – Americans Hank Kuehne, Chad Campbell, Zach Johnson and Chris Riley edged out the international team of Paul Casey, Ian Poulter, David Howell and Kevin Na.
- 2005 – Geoff Ogilvy, Justin Rose and Tim Clark outdid their American opponents Ryan Moore, Arron Oberholser, Zach Johnson and Ben Crane.

Williams World Challenge

Hosted in its inaugural year on the Raptor course, the Williams World Challenge – now known as the Hero World Challenge – was a nationally televised tournament benefiting the Tiger Woods Foundation that featured 12 of the top professionals in the world.

- 1999 – Tom Lehman (-13) won by three strokes over David Duval.

Andersen Consulting World Championship of Golf

Hosted for three years at Grayhawk, this event developed into the World Golf Championships-Dell Match Play.

- 1995 – Barry Lane edged out David Frost on the 36th hole to win on Talon.
- 1997 – Greg Norman sank a birdie putt on the 36th hole to defeat Scott Hoch on Talon.
- 1998 – Colin Montgomerie held off hard-charging Davis Love III for the win on Raptor.

Waste Management Phoenix Open Pro-Am

Grayhawk Golf Club has hosted pro-am golf events as part of the Waste Management Phoenix Open on both the Talon and Raptor courses from 1996 to 2012.

Ambassadors

Phil Mickelson

A Valley of the Sun fan-favorite since his Sun Devil days ('89-'92), Phil Mickelson's relationships with the club dates back to the beginning of his World Golf Hall of Fame career.

"Grayhawk is a special place for me," he said in a [video](#) welcoming the participants of the 2021 NCAA Men's Golf Championship. "It was the first deal I signed right out of college in 1992, the course just opened, I just turned pro, and we've had a handshake deal ever since – 30 years now."

In addition to Grayhawk's logo embroidered on his bag, the club's grill is named after him, and features memorabilia spanning his career from a Persimmons driver he swung during his junior golf days to various items chronicling his five major championships.

Phil was a three-time NCAA Champion at Arizona State and shares the record for most collegiate wins with Ben Crenshaw. In 1991, Mickelson won the Northern Telecom Open, which was the last time an amateur claimed a victory on the PGA TOUR.

Mickelson also has a strong commitment to giving back through the Phil and Amy Mickelson Foundation, which, for example, joined with The Thunderbirds and Under Armour for a 20-year sponsorship of the Thunderbird International Junior.

Heather Farr

Heather was a longtime friend of Grayhawk and the club's first ambassador. We loved her infectious spirit, tireless enthusiasm, and we admired her integrity and courage. She was tough. A real fighter both on and off the golf course. Talon's first hole, "Farrview," and the forward tees on both courses, the "Heather" tees, are named in her honor.

Best known as an exceptional junior golfer, All-American at Arizona State University and a rising star on the LPGA Tour, it was during her fight with breast cancer that her inspiring character shone the brightest. Heather ultimately lost her struggle, but her grace, strength and charisma live on to encourage golfers to strive for excellence.

The Morning Joint (a.k.a. Mojo) coffee bar and eatery offers indoor-outdoor space to fuel up for the day with a coffee drink, breakfast item or just relax and socialize with family and friends.

Golf Shop and Trading Company is one of the most impressive golf shopping venues in the country.
