The Holy Cross football team returns to action following its bye week with a matchup at Richmond on Saturday, Oct. 18. Kickoff is set for 2 p.m.

This will be the first matchup between the two teams since 1964, and it is the inaugural Patriot League matchup between the two programs, as the Spiders joined the conference as an associate member for football ahead of the 2025 season.

The Crusaders most recently played against No. 25 Harvard, falling by a score of 59-24. Freshmen Joseph Williams and Lincoln Fisher both had their first career touchdowns in that contest, and senior running back Nyeoti Punni rushed for a career-best 73 yards.

Senior Max Mosey was the Patriot League's Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance against the Crimson. Mosey totaled 87 yards on two punt returns. His 72-yard return in the third quarter was the seventh-longest in program history, and the longest by a Crusader since 2013. It is also the fourth-longest punt return in the nation this season and the longest in the Patriot League.

Mosey currently leads the Patriot League with 17.0 yards per punt return. Sophomore Alijah Cason is the Patriot League's leader for kick returns, averaging 33.7 yards per return.

Junior linebacker Cam Santee currently ranks third in the conference with an average of 9.7 tackles per game, while ranking second with seven tackles for loss. He totaled 13 tackles against Harvard, and has had double-digit tackles in three contests this season.

This will be Holy Cross' first game played in the state of Virginia since a 1986 matchup at William & Mary — a 31-7 win during a 10-1 season for Holy Cross. Senior linebacker Sam Boyer (Williamsburg, Va.) and freshman kicker Owen Saraceno (Leesburg, Va.) are both Virginia natives.

THE SERIES WITH RICHMOND: This will be just the second meeting between the Crusaders and the Spiders on the gridiron, and the first since 1964, when Holy Cross won by a score of 36-22.

FENWAY: On Nov. 22, Holy Cross will host Georgetown at Fenway Park in the teams' regular season finale. Kickoff is set for 4 p.m. and the game will be televised on NESN (New England Sports Network). A Crusaders home game that is being relocated from Worcester to Boston, this will mark the 37th matchup between the Patriot League opponents. The Crusaders are no strangers to Fenway Park, having played football at the ballpark 21 times between 1916 and 1956.

CAMPBELL TROPHY: Senior captain Cam Nolan has been named a semifinalist for the 2025 William V. Campbell Trophy, as announced on Wednesday, Sept. 24 by the National Football Foundation. Now in its 36th year being presented, the Campbell Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. Nolan is a team captain at Holy Cross in 2025 and earned All-Patriot League second team honors in 2024. He also earned the Crusaders' 2024 Davitt Award as Holy Cross' most outstanding offensive lineman. A political science major at Holy Cross, Nolan has earned Patriot League Academic Honor Roll laurels during his time on The Hill.

2025 PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Sophomore Alijah Cason was named the Patriot League Special Teams Player of the Week in Week 1 after totaling 187 yards on three kickoff returns at Northern Illinois and scoring on a 97-yard return to bring Holy Cross within two points late. His 187 kickoff return yards are tied for third in single-game program history; his 97-yard kickoff return is tied for the second-longest in program history and is the longest since 1979. Cason was also named an honorable mention for National Special Teams Player of the Week by Stats Perform. After a Week 4 contest against Yale, Junior linebacker Cam Santee was selected as the conference's Defensive Player of the Week, while freshman running back

Joseph Williams was named Rookie of the Week. Santee had a strong all-around performance in Holy Cross' contest against Yale on Sept. 20, tying the team high with a career-best 13 tackles on the day while also totaling 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks and forcing a fumble. Williams had a 64-yard reception to open the second half, leading the team in receiving yards. He also carried the ball five times for 18 yards on the ground while also totaling 83 yards on five kickoff returns.

2024 PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: The Crusaders earned weekly honors on 11 occasions from the Patriot League during the 2024 season...Senior running back Jordan Fuller was named the Offensive Player of the Week after rushing for 139 yards against Rhode Island on Aug. 31...senior Curtis Harris-Lopez was selected as Special Teams Player of the Week after returning a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown against Bryant on Sept. 14...senior linebacker Frankie Monte earned Defensive Player of the Week after recording a career-best 17 tackles vs. Yale on Sept. 21...senior receiver Justin Shorter (Offensive Player of the Week) and freshman wide receiver Alijah Cason (Rookie of the Week) both took home accolades after a 38-7 win in the Crusaders' Patriot League opener at Colgate...sophomore running back Jayden Clerveaux (Offensive Player of the Week) and sophomore kicker Daniel Porto (Special Teams Player of the Week) earned weekly honors after Holy Cross' comeback win vs. Fordham on Oct. 12...Clerveaux earned Offensive Player of the Week nod for the second straight

2025 HOLY CROSS FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

week after rushing for a career-best 165 yards and two touchdowns at Harvard...Porto again was named Special Teams Player of the Week after kicking a program-record 53-yard field goal at Lafayette on Oct. 26...Monte was again named Defensive Player of the Week after tallying eight tackles, an interception, one TFL and a fumble recovery vs. Bucknell on Nov. 16, while sophomore Ross Dansdill was selected as Special Teams Player of the Week after blocking a punt in the victory.

PATRIOT LEAGUE CHAMPIONS: With a 34-0 victory over Georgetown on Nov. 23, 2024, Holy Cross clinched a share of the Patriot League crown in its regular-season finale — marking an unprecedented sixth straight league championship for the Crusaders. This marks the 12th Patriot League title in Holy Cross history; no other team in league history has ever won six consecutive conference titles. Ten of Holy Cross' 12 titles are outright, the most outright titles by any Patriot League team in history.

PRESEASON POLL: Holy Cross was selected to finish third in the Patriot League's conference poll, with 78 points. Holy Cross ranked behind 2024 co-champion Lehigh (97 points, 13 first-place votes) and new Patriot League member Richmond (83, three first-place votes). A full preseason ranking follows:

Additionally, four Crusaders earned Preseason All-Patriot League honors: junior running back Jayden Clerveaux, senior wide receiver Max Mosey, senior offensive lineman Cam Nolan and junior defensive back Cam Jones.

FAMILY TIES: There are a number of family ties within the Holy Cross football program....head coach Dan Curran's son, sophomore receiver Ty Curran, enters his first season at Holy Cross...defensive coordinator Brian Vaganek's son Brian is a 2024 graduate of the College and was a starting defensive end for the Crusaders...senior defensive back Tommy Bestpitch's father, Tom (Class of 2000), played football at Holy Cross...sophomore offensive lineman Brady Earle's father Tony (Class of 1997) played football at Holy Cross...junior tight end Keating Oliver is the son of Holy Cross strength and conditioning coach Jeff Oliver; his brother Peter (Class of 2023) was an All-Patriot League running back with the Crusaders and his sister Lydia played field hockey at Holy Cross....freshman linebacker Mack Vinton's father Chris played football at Holy Cross (Class of 1997) and is a team doctor for the Crusaders; his sister Molly played field hockey at Holy Cross.

ACADEMIC HONORS: Senior tight end and long snapper John Owens is a two-time Academic All-District selection by the College Sports Communicators. Of Holy Cross' returners, 26 earned a spot on the 2024 Patriot League Academic Honor Roll.

FCS PLAYOFFS: After not winning a postseason game ever in program history until the 2021 season, the Crusaders won an FCS playoff game two seasons in a row. The Crusaders defeated New Hampshire, 35-19, in a rainy second-round matchup in 2022, to advance to the FCS quarterfinals for the first time since 1983. In the quarterfinals, the Crusaders tied with eventual national champions South Dakota State through three quarters, but the Jackrabbits pulled away late to hand Holy Cross its first loss of the season. Holy Cross made four consecutive trips to the FCS playoffs from 2019 to 2022; in 2021, the Crusaders won their first FCS playoff game in program history, after a historic touchdown reception from wide receiver Jalen Coker secured a 13-10 victory over Sacred Heart with 14 seconds left.

ALL-PATRIOT LEAGUE SELECTIONS: Six Crusaders were named to the All-Patriot League first team in 2024, while an additional six were selected as second team honorees. Linebacker Frankie Monte, running back Jayden Clerveaux, wide receiver Max Mosey, tight end Jacob Petersen, center Christo Kelly and right tackle Cam McNair were selected on the first team. Quarterback Joe Pesansky, wide receiver Justin Shorter, right guard Cam Nolan, safety Curtis Harris-Lopez, safety Jake Jarmolowich and cornerback Cam Jones earned second team laurels.

THE CURRAN FILE: Dan Curran was named the 29th head coach in the history of the Holy Cross football program in December 2023. Curran previously spent 11 seasons as the head coach at Merrimack, guiding the program through its transition to Division I. He is the all-time winningest coach in Merrimack history with 53 victories, and led the Warriors to the Northeast Conference championship game in 2022 and 2023. Curran's 2022 team also tied the school single-season record with eight victories, while posting a seven-game winning streak and receiving votes in the top 25 for four consecutive weeks in just the program's third full season at the Division I level. Throughout his career, Curran has recruited and mentored nine All-Americans, 62 all-conference players and 10 NFL free agents. Curran came to Merrimack after playing eight years of professional football. He spent time with the Seattle Seahawks and New Orleans Saints of the National Football League, as well as the New Orleans Voodoo and Georgia Force of the Arena Football League. A graduate of the University of New Hampshire, Curran earned All-Atlantic 10 honors after rushing for over 1,000 yards and scoring 16 touchdowns in his senior season for head coach Sean McDonnell and offensive coordinator Chip Kelly. The Chelmsford High School Hall of Famer was the Boston Globe Player of the Year as a senior after leading to a Super Bowl victory and its fourth consecutive Merrimack Valley Conference title.

CAPTAINS: Five Crusaders were selected by their teammates as captains for the 2025 season: senior defensive lineman Christian Ross, senior offensive lineman Cam Nolan, junior running back Jayden Clerveaux, senior offensive lineman Joe Metzger and junior cornerback Cam Jones.

CRUSADERS IN THE PROS: A total of five Crusaders appeared in an NFL contest in 2024: C.J. Hanson '24 (Kansas City Chiefs), Jalen Coker '24 (Carolina Panthers), Liam Anderson '23 (Indianapolis Colts), Benton Whitley '22 (New York Giants) and Kalif Raymond '16 (Detroit Lions)... Luke Newman was drafted by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2025 NFL Draft...Holy Cross has had offensive linemen selected in the NFL Draft in back-to-back years, after Hanson became the first Crusader drafted since 1989 when he was selected by the Kansas City Chiefs in the seventh round of the 2024 NFL Draft...Hanson, alongside Coker, became two of four Holy Cross players ever to attend the NFL Combine in February 2024...Coker was signed by the Carolina Panthers as an undrafted free agent and was elevated to the 53-man roster after beginning the season on the practice squad; he was the team's leading receiver with 68 yards vs. the Bears on Oct. 6...Kalif Raymond '16 was a two-time All-Pro selection as a punt returner for the Lions...Holy Cross had a total of six players in NFL training camps this summer...long snapper Adam Guillemette '23 was drafted by the Toronto Argonauts in the 2023 CFL Draft.

2025 OUTLOOK: The Crusaders enter the 2025 campaign after winning a share of the Patriot League crown last season — marking an unprecedented sixth straight league championship. This marks the 12th Patriot League title in Holy Cross history; no other team in league history has ever won six consecutive conference titles. The Crusaders went 5-1 in conference play, with a 6-6 record overall in 2024.

Holy Cross returns four All-Patriot League selections: junior running back Jayden Clerveaux, senior wide receiver Max Mosey, senior right guard Cam Nolan and junior defensive back Cam Jones.

Clerveaux was an All-New England and All-Patriot League first team honoree in 2024. He ranked third in the Patriot League a year ago with

942 rushing yards, while also scoring 11 touchdowns, ranking second in the conference. He is the Patriot League's returning leader in rushing touchdowns. In league action, he averaged 106 rushing yards per contest. Clerveaux had three 100+ yard games and four multi-touchdown games in 2024, including back-to-back two-touchdown games in wins over Bucknell and Georgetown. He was a two-time Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week selection last season. Clerveaux will serve as a captain for Holy Cross in 2025.

Mosey led the Patriot League and ranked ninth nationally in 2024 with 19.3 yards per reception and was tied for third with six touchdown catches en route to first team All-Patriot League laurels. He totaled eight touchdowns on the year — six receiving, two rushing — while ranking fourth in the conference with 715 receiving yards. A versatile option for the Crusaders, he also rushed for 48 yards on 15 carries and had a 21-yard pass completion. He had three games with 100+ receiving yards, and was also named the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week after scoring two touchdowns (one rushing, one receiving) in a key Patriot League win over Lafayette.

Nolan, a 2025 captain for Holy Cross, moved into a starting role in Week 4 for the Crusaders, making nine starts at right guard through the end of 2024 and appearing in all 12 games. The Holy Cross offensive line conceded just 13 sacks — their 1.08 sacks allowed per game was the best mark in the Patriot League and 11th-best nationally, and the Crusaders only conceded nine sacks total against FCS competition. He helped anchor a Crusaders offense that averaged 27.6 points per contest.

Jones, another Crusader captain this season, was named to the All-Patriot League second team in 2024. He started all 12 games at cornerback for the Crusaders after not appearing in any contests a season ago to earn All-Patriot League laurels for the first time. He led Holy Cross with nine pass breakups and tied for the team lead with a pair of interceptions; he is the Patriot League's returning leader in passes defended (11). He also tied for third on the team with 56 tackles on the season. Jones had four pass breakups in Holy Cross' win over Fordham.

Other notable returning Crusaders on offense include junior left tackle Bradford Blattner, who started five games in 2024, and senior right tackle Joe Metzger, who started eight games before a season-ending injury. Tight ends Nathan Schillinger and Mason McSweeney both saw significant playing time during the 2024 campaign. Sophomore wide receiver Alijah Cason had a productive rookie campaign for the Crusaders a year ago, playing in all 11 games as receiver and kick returner.

Holy Cross is poised to boast significant depth and experience along the defensive line — led by senior captain Christian Ross, who has started all 23 contests since the beginning of 2023. He had 29 tackles and 5.0 TFLs last season. Junior Brice Stevenson has started 16 games in his career, recording 30 tackles and 2.5 TFLs a year ago. Fifth-year Joseph Townsend led the team with five sacks last season, while fellow fifth-year Kevin Gillis totaled four sacks in 2024.

Junior linebacker Cam Santee totaled 51 tackles during the 2024 campaign. Junior cornerback Eli Thompson finished with 29 tackles and eight PBUs, ranking second on the team.

The Crusaders welcome several transfers in 2025, including quarter-

back Cal Swanson (Illinois). Left guard Jayden Joyce (Davidson) and wide receiver Ty Curran (Ball State) are also slated to see significant playing time for Holy Cross.

TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE: The 2025 campaign marks the 130th season of Holy Cross football. The Crusaders currently own an overall record of 678-556-54, good for a .548 winning percentage. Prior to the start of the 2025 season, Holy Cross' 678 all-time victories ranked as the 14th most among all FCS schools. Holy Cross has had 37 first team All-America selections, sent more than 90 players on to professional football, won five Lambert Cups, claimed 12 Patriot League championships, and was named the Division I-AA Team of the Year in 1987. The Crusaders also played in the 1946 Orange Bowl, losing to host Miami on the game's final play.

ABOUT THE PATRIOT LEAGUE: Now in its fourth decade as an all-sport conference combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors championships in 24 men and women's sports. Initially started as an NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990. Fellow football programs in the Patriot League include Bucknell, Colgate, Fordham, Georgetown, Lafayette and Lehigh. The Patriot League's mission is simple: to provide successful competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards, and to prepare its student-athletes to be leaders in society.

ABOUT HOLY CROSS: The College of the Holy Cross was founded in 1843 by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in Worcester, Massachusetts. Holy Cross is a highly selective, four-year, undergraduate, liberal arts institution and is ranked among the nation's leading four-year liberal arts colleges. Worcester (pronounced "wuss-tur," population 211,286) is located in Central Massachusetts 44 miles west of Boston and is the second-largest city in New England. Holy Cross ranks No. 3 on Money Magazine's list of "10 Best Liberal Arts Colleges for Your Money" and No. 7 on its list of best small colleges. It is also among the 50 "most beautiful college campuses" in America, according to Architectural Digest and Condé Nast. Top majors at Holy Cross include economics, psychology, political science, history and English. Holy Cross has won NCAA championships in baseball (1952) and basketball (1947). Notable Holy Cross alumni include former Boston Celtics Bob Cousy (1950) and Tommy Heinsohn (1956); Dr. Anthony Fauci (1962), head of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, National Institutes of Health; U.S. Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas (1971); sports journalist Bill Simmons (1992); and Jon Favreau (2003), former chief speechwriter for President Barack Obama.
