## SATURDAY'S MATCHUP

Saint John's totaled 585 yards of offense, including 351 through the air, in a 49-10 win last Saturday (Oct. 15) at St. Olaf. Junior quarterback **Aaron Syverson** (Minnetonka, Minn.) ended the day 26 of 40 passing for five touchdowns, including three to senior tight end **Alex Larson** (Woodbury, Minn./East Ridge). Gustavus Adolphus broke a 7-7 tie early in the second quarter and scored 37 unanswered points to record a 44-7 road win last weekend at Hamline. Quarterback George Sandven passed for 336 yards and two touchdowns, and 10 of his passes went to running back Dalton Thelen for 98 yards. Matthew Carreon tallied six receptions for 141 yards and a touchdown. Defensive back Ezekiel Sundberg intercepted two passes and returned one 89 yards for a touchdown with 1:57 remaining.

## ZUMWINKLE TO RECEIVE BASTEN AWARD SATURDAY

Former Saint John's running back **Mike Zumwinkle '86** will receive the Bob Basten Excellence in Leadership Award at halftime of this Saturday's Family Weekend game. The award is bestowed annually upon a former Johnnie football player who has exhibited outstanding leadership traits, has been involved in his community and with his alma mater, has carried a sense of fair play beyond the football field and has demonstrated an overall commitment to excellence. It is named in honor of **Bob Basten '82**, who went to training camp with the Minnesota Vikings before embarking on a successful career as a business executive. He died in 2012 after a decade-long battle with ALS/Lou Gehrig's Disease.



Zumwinkle was a two-time All-MIAC first-team selection whose 2,327 rushing yards still rank seventh in program history. A senior program officer at the Richard M. Schulze Family Foundation since 2013, Zumwinkle works to provide financial assistance and support to organizations operating in the areas of social and human services, education and health and medicine. That includes programs like the Crisis Nursery in Minneapolis, which provides a place of refuge for mothers and children needing refuge from issues like domestic violence, drug and alcohol abuse and homelessness. It's one of a number of organizations that Zumwinkle has championed in his work.

After graduating from SJU, Zumwinkle went on to study abroad for a year in the former East Germany, then later worked for over three years as a policy officer with the U.S. State Department. He then spent nearly 15 years at Cargill, including over seven as the company's director of government relations. These days, Zumwinkle and his wife Lori, a 1987 graduate of the College of Saint Benedict, live in the Twin Cities where they have raised three daughters, all of whom went on to standout hockey careers. Grace Zumwinkle was a member of the 2022 U.S. Winter Olympic team this past February in Beijing.

## HOT HAND



Junior quarterback **Aaron Syverson (left)** ended the afternoon 26 of 40 passing for 356 yards and five touchdowns last weekend at St. Olaf. The yardage output was four shy of his career high of 360 set Oct. 1 vs. Concordia-Moorhead and the five-touchdown game was the second of the season (and career). The first was also against the Cobbers. Syverson now has a 178.88 pass-efficiency rating (62 of 98 passing for 925 yards, 12 touchdowns and two interceptions) over his last three games. He currently leads the MIAC with 13 passing touchdowns in conference play and is second, both overall and in MIAC games, in passing yards.

## BIG DAY FOR VANERP

Senior wide receiver **Nick VanErp (right)**, Battle Lake, Minn./Ottertail Central) recorded his first 100-yard receiving game thanks to career highs in catches (8) and yards (141) in last Saturday's win at St. Olaf. He caught a 58-yard touchdown pass from junior quarterback **Aaron Syverson** on the Johnnies' first offensive play from scrimmage. He had eight receptions for 132 yards over his previous three games before the trip to Northfield and is averaging 19 yards per catch so far this fall (22 receptions for 417 yards and two touchdowns). The big-play receiver also serves as SJU's holder on field goals and PAT's, and as its main punt returner. VanErp takes the field Saturday with 955 career all-purpose yards (614 receiving, 176 punt return, 165 kick return).



## 3 TOUCHDOWNS FOR THE TIGHT END



Senior tight end **Alex Larson (left)** caught three passes, all for touchdowns (17 yards in the second quarter, nine in the third and 15 in the fourth), totaling 41 yards at St. Olaf. The three-touchdown game was the 28th in program history, but just the second by a tight end. **Nick Simon '16** was the first Johnnie tight end to catch three touchdowns or more in a game in SJU's 51-7 win over Dubuque (Iowa) in the first round of the 2015 NCAA Division III playoffs in Collegetown. Simon collected four receptions for 51 yards (touchdowns of six yards in the first quarter, 13 in the second and 22 in the third).

## SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's game is the 88th meeting between SJU and Gustavus. The Johnnies are 52-32-3 all-time against the Gusties, including a 27-11-1 record in Collegeville. SJU has won 32 of the last 34 meetings overall. The 23-20, double-overtime win for Gustavus in 2013 was the first for the Gusties at home, in the series, since Oct. 11, 1986 (28-20).

## LARSON ON THE SJU LISTS

Last Saturday's three receiving touchdowns enabled senior tight end **Alex Larson** to pass **Jared Streit** '19 (14) and move into a tie with **Tom Ramboldt** '92 for second place among SJU tight ends with 15 in his career (*see chart below*). **Nate Kirschner** '01 owns the program record with 19. The three catches also lifted Larson past Ramboldt (68) and **Isaac Flenner** '05 (69) into seventh among SJU tight ends with 70. He currently leads the team with seven receiving touchdowns and is second in both receptions (35) and receiving yards (456) so far this fall. Larson caught 33 passes for 476 yards and eight scores in 11 games during his All-America season of 2021.

## TROST TOUCHDOWNS

Senior running back **Henry Trost** (*left*; Lindstrom, Minn./Chisago Lakes) rushed for 79 yards and a touchdown on 19 carries against St. Olaf. His two-yard touchdown run in the second quarter was his sixth of the season, 39th of his career and 44th overall as a Johnnie (39 rushing, five receiving). He is now one touchdown behind **Rick Bell** '83 for fourth-most in SJU history (*see charts below*). Trost's 39 rushing touchdowns are nine behind the tie between **Sam Sura** '16 and **Matt Malmberg** '95 for the program record.

Trost has scored 41 touchdowns, including 37 rushing, over his last 31 games played and has 1,851 rushing yards on 325 career attempts (5.7 avg.) and 2,453 yards from scrimmage on 365 career touches (6.7 avg.).



## FOLLOWING THE LEGEND

A 1981 SJU graduate, Fasching became the 16th head coach in the 102-year history of Saint John's University football following the 2012 season. He succeeded John Gagliardi, who announced his retirement following 60 seasons at SJU, after serving 17 seasons as an assistant football coach and recruiting coordinator at SJU. Fasching was a three-year starter for Gagliardi and the Johnnies at linebacker during the 1978 and 1980-81 seasons. A knee injury held him out of the 1979 season.

## AS AN ASSISTANT

The Johnnies posted a 164-39 record (120-22 MIAC) with 10 conference titles and 12 postseason appearances (22-11 playoff record), including the 2003 national championship, 2000 national runner-up performance and four national semifinal games during his tenure as an assistant coach. He also coached SJU's throwers as an assistant track and field coach from 1996-2011.

## AT ST. CLOUD CATHEDRAL

Prior to joining the Johnnies' coaching staff, Fasching served as the head football coach at St. Cloud Cathedral High School from 1986-95, where he led the Crusaders to the State Class B title in 1992 and 1993.

Junior wide receiver **Jimmy Buck** (right, Orono, Minn.) caught seven passes for 93 yards last Saturday at St. Olaf, a week after his stretch of consecutive 100-yard receiving games came to an end with seven receptions for 94 yards and a touchdown Oct. 8 at Augsburg. All told, Buck is averaging 16.0 yards per reception and 112 receiving yards per game over his last five contests (35 catches for 560 yards and three touchdowns).



## WHEELS



Freshman running back **Caden Wheeler** (left, Andover, Minn.) tied for the team's second-fastest, 40-yard-dash time in August and he showcased that speed last Saturday when he broke free on a 68-yard touchdown run to close out the game's scoring with 46 seconds remaining at St. Olaf. The rush was SJU's longest since senior running back **Henry Trost**, then a freshman, sprinted for an 80-yard touchdown run against...St. Olaf...on Oct. 20, 2018, in Collegeville.

## THIRD-DOWN DEFENSE

The Saint John's defense held St. Olaf to a 1-for-12 showing on third down last weekend in Northfield. The performance moved the opposition's conversion rate to 27.6 percent (24-for-87) against the Johnnies on third down, including 18.6 percent (8-for-43) over the last three games. On third-and-long (third-and-7 or farther), the Johnnie defense has allowed the opposition to convert a first down on 14.3 percent (7-for-49) of the opportunities this season, but just one of the last 23 situations and 0-for-13 over the last two games. In comparison, SJU allowed a first down on third-and-long at a 22.5-percent rate (20-for-89) in 2021, 30.5 percent (36-for-118) in 2019 and 21.1 percent (26-for-123) in 2018.

## WHOA WOZ

Senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** (New Hope, Minn./Robbinsdale Armstrong) recorded a pair of tackles (one solo) and a quarterback hurry in last Saturday's win at St. Olaf. He currently leads the MIAC in tackles for loss (9) and sacks (6.0), and has 15.5 tackles for loss and 9.5 sacks over his last eight games going back to the 2021 season. He takes the field Saturday with 27 tackles for loss and 16.5 sacks in 26 career games. Wozniak needs five sacks to tie **Phil Trier** '01 for 10th on SJU's all-time list and eight tackles for loss to join the tie between two more 2001 graduates, **Beau LaBore** '01 and **Brian Zirbes** '01 for 10th.

## A NOT SO SPOOKY OCTOBER

Saint John's is a perfect 33-0 during the month of October under the direction of head coach **Gary Fasching**. SJU is 299-118-15 (.709) all-time in October, including a 193-61-3 record (.757) in 60 seasons under the direction of **John Gagliardi**. **Joe Benda** posted a 32-19-6 record (.614) during the month across his three stints as head coach, thanks to a 18-6-6 in his first stretch from 1930-36, despite a 0-3-1 mark his first season.

## THE LAST GAME

### No. 5/8 Saint John's 49, at St. Olaf 10 (Oct. 15)

Senior wide receiver **Nick VanErp** hauled in a 58-yard touchdown pass on his team's first possession of the game, getting the Johnnies' offense going early en route to a 49-10 win at St. Olaf last Saturday (Oct. 15). VanErp finished the day with career highs in catches (8) and receiving yards (141), marking the first 100-yard receiving performance of his collegiate career. Things idled a bit as the Oles cut the gap to four on a 33-yard field goal by Collin Swan early in the second quarter. But rapid acceleration soon followed.

Senior running back **Henry Trost** scored on a 2-yard touchdown run to extend the SJU margin to 14-3 and senior tight end **Alex Larson** followed with the first of his three touchdown catches – a 17-yarder that put the Johnnies on top 21-3 at halftime.

Junior quarterback **Aaron Syverson** connected with freshman tight end **Joey Gendreau** (Shorewood, Minn./Minnetonka) on a 3-yard touchdown pass with 5:47 to go in the third quarter – marking the first catch of his collegiate career (right). Then, after St. Olaf scored on a 46-yard touchdown catch by Payton Schott to cut the gap to 28-10, Larson delivered touchdown catches of 9 and 15 yards as the Johnnies built a 42-10 lead with 11:06 remaining.



A pair of SJU defensive backs recorded their second collegiate interceptions Saturday. Freshman safety **Noah Arneson** (Independence, Minn./Orono) collected his second interception in as many games on STO's first possession of the second half, while junior safety **Mateo Cisneros** (Shoreview, Minn./Mounds View) picked off his first pass of the season in the fourth quarter. Cisneros' 39-yard interception return and Ole personal-foul penalty on the play, gave SJU the ball on the STO 17-yard line and set up Larson's third touchdown reception of the game two plays later.

#### **Gustavus Adolphus 44, at Hamline 7 (Oct. 15)**

Gustavus broke a 7-7 tie early in the second quarter and scored 37 unanswered points en route to a 44-7 win at Hamline last Saturday in St. Paul.

After the Gustie defense forced a three-and-out on the first possession of the game, the offense wasted little time taking a 7-0 lead as George Sandven tossed a 16-yard touchdown pass to Dalton Thelen up the left sideline with 10:35 on the clock. The Pipers made a goal-line stand on the second Gustie drive of the game and responded with an 18-play, 95-yard scoring drive, capped by a 10-yard touchdown pass to tie the game with 11:36 left in the second quarter.

Gustavus quickly answered with a three-play scoring drive, set up by a 39-yard kickoff return by River Wood. Sandven connected with Matthew Carreon for a 28-yard touchdown pass down the right sideline as Carreon went 22 yards after the catch into the end zone, taking the lead for good. The Gusties finished the first half with a nine-play, 75-yard scoring drive, capped by a two-yard touchdown run by Tanner Rennie, and took a 20-7 lead into halftime.

The Gusties' first drive of the second half ended with a 25-yard Andrew Abegglen (Sr., Mound) field goal, which was the only scoring play of the third. Rennie finished off a 12-play, 84-yard drive with a three-yard touchdown early in the fourth quarter, extending the lead to 30-7. David Peal found paydirt with 3:26 left in the game with a one-yard score, and Ezekiel Sundberg put a stamp on the game with an 89-yard interception return for a touchdown. Sundberg finished the game with two picks for 105 yards and was named the MIAC Football Defensive Player of the Week for his performance.

The Gusties out-gained the Pipers 536-335 in total yards. Sandven completed 27 of 38 passes for 336 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. Thelen was the top target, hauling in 10 passes for 98 yards and a score. Carreon added six catches and a career-high 141 yards. Rennie led the ground attack with 13 carries for 72 yards and two scores. Graham Nistler led the defense with 11 tackles, including two pass breakups and a tackle for loss.

## **THE LAST MEETING**

### **Saint John's 37, at Gustavus Adolphus 7 (Oct. 23, 2021)**

Quarterback **Chris Backes** '21, who served as the top backup to **Jackson Erdmann** '19 in 2019 and filled the same role behind junior **Aaron Syverson**, was called into service when Syverson was injured in the third quarter. Syverson was 14 of 19 passing for 161 yards. At the time, the Johnnies held a slim three-point lead (10-7). But Backes completed a 23-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver **Ravi Alston** '22 on his first drive under center. And then-No. 5 SJU didn't look back from there – rolling to 27 unanswered points in the game's final 20 minutes for a 37-7 victory.

The SJU defense allowed 183 yards of total offense, though the Gusties did manage to snap a streak of three-straight shutouts when Thelen hauled in a 58-yard touchdown pass from Jake Breitbart in the second quarter that cut the Johnnies' lead to 10-7. The touchdown ended SJU's shutout streak at 21:48. Linebacker **Kyle Kornovich** '22 returned a one-handed interception 50 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to end the game's scoring with 9:14 remaining.

Senior running back **Henry Trost** (right) carried the ball 19 times for 124 yards and three touchdowns – including one of 48 yards to make the score 24-7 late in the third quarter.



The Johnnies' defense posted 10 tackles for loss, six sacks and held Gustavus to 1-for-12 on third down. The Gusties entered the game ninth in NCAA Division III in rushing (260.8 ypg.) and 10th in total offense (511.7 ypg.), but were held to 97 yards on the ground and 183 yards overall. GAC committed two turnovers and gained 39 yards against SJU's starting defense in the second half.

Three of SJU's four starting defensive linemen led the Johnnies in tackles. Senior **Metoriah Faoliu** (Wildomar, Calif./Vista Murrieta) led the way with eight tackles (seven solo), including two for a loss and a quarterback sack. **Seth Morem** '21 and senior **Michael Wozniak** posted three tackles for loss each and combined for five sacks. The three-sack game from Morem was SJU's first in five years (Nathan Brinker against Augsburg on Oct. 8, 2016). **Collin Franz** '21 collected two tackles, one for a loss, and a quarterback hurry.

SJU was whistled for 15 penalties, 13 of which were accepted for 113 yards. The 13 penalties were the most for SJU since the 49-28 Homecoming win over Hamline on Oct. 4, 2014 (13 penalties for 129 yards). The Gusties, meanwhile, were called for six penalties Saturday. Of the five accepted, four were personal fouls (two roughing the passer, one facemask and one roughing the kicker).

## BIG 0 VS. THE OLES

Saint John's is now 46-14-1 all-time against St. Olaf (30-5 since 1986), including a 23-6-1 record on the Oles' home field. SJU has out-scored STO 422-54 over the last nine meetings since its last loss in the series on Sept. 29, 2012 (38-35 in Collegetown). The Johnnies totaled 500 yards of offense or more in five of the nine wins, including each of the last four.

Wozniak is the sixth Johnnie to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and the fifth in the last six seasons: quarterback **Chris Backes** '21, offensive lineman **Ben Barch** '20, quarterback **Jackson Erdmann** '19 and wide receiver **Will Gillach** '19. Defensive end **Kevin McNamara** '07 was the first SJU student-athlete to receive the honor in 2006.

A 2022 *Lindy's* Preseason All-American and a 2021 D3football.com All-America first-team selection, Wozniak started all 12 games and finished with a team-leading 15.5 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks, including 6.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks in two NCAA playoff games, last fall. He totaled 30 tackles (20 solo), five quarterback hurries, a fumble recovery and a pass breakup. He returned to the field in 2021 after suffering a season-ending hand injury on the first defensive play of the 2019 season - a tackle for loss - at UW-Stout.

Off the field, Wozniak is in his fifth year raising money for a pair of SJU football's initiatives, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and Tackle Cancer. He was also a member of the Johnnies' Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, which holds an annual Kids Fighting Hunger meal-packing event every March, for two academic years (2020-21 and 2021-22). Wozniak also helped organize a swim meet for local Special Olympians in Spring 2022 in Collegeville. Back home, Wozniak volunteered to coach 2nd- and 3rd-grade youth football for the Armstrong Cooper Youth Football Association.

## CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST



Senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** (*left*) was named one of the 156 semifinalists for the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy and is a candidate for the 2022 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete Awards, presented by Fidelity Investments. The NFF and College Football Hall of Fame made the announcement Sept. 28. Wozniak is one of 29 student-athletes from NCAA Division III and the lone nominee from the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) for the Campbell Trophy. Since 1995, 21 Johnnies have been nominated for the Campbell Trophy. SJU is the lone program out of the 672 NCAA schools to have nominated a Campbell Trophy scholar-athlete each of the past 20 seasons.

The award recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation and up to 14 of the candidates will be named recipients of a prestigious NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award. Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first-team player or significant contributor and demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is comprised of a nationally recognized group of media, members of the College Football Hall of Fame and athletics administrators. Launched in 1959, the NFF National Scholar-Athlete program awards \$18,000 scholarships that can be used for the honorees' postgraduate education. SJU has produced three NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award winners: linebackers **Carter Hanson** '17 (2016) and **Matt Hawn** '06 (2005), and wide receiver **Chris Palmer** '96 (1995).

The NFF will announce 12-14 finalists on Oct. 26 and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class Presented by Fidelity Investments. One of the finalists will be named the winner of the 33rd Campbell Trophy during the 64th NFF Annual Awards Dinner Presented by Las Vegas on Dec. 6 and have his postgraduate scholarship increased to \$25,000.

An accounting major with a 3.86 GPA, Wozniak earned College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America first-team honors last fall and will be a three-time Academic All-MIAC honoree.

## PRESEASON HONORS

Senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** and senior tight end **Alex Larson** were named to the D3football.com Preseason All-America team Aug. 15. Wozniak was named to the first team and Larson earned second-team honors. Both were named to *Lindy's* preseason All-America first team earlier this summer. The 6-foot-7 Larson played 11 of the 12 games and finished second on the team in receptions (33) and receiving touchdowns (8), and third in receiving yards (476) last fall for the Johnnies. The eight receiving touchdowns were the fourth-most by a tight end in SJU history. His biggest touchdown reception was the game-winning, three-yard score from Chris Backes '21 with one second remaining – as the Johnnies erased a 13-point deficit to win the MIAC championship with a 29-28 victory at then-No. 12 Bethel.

## FOUR ALL-REGION RETURNEES

Saint John's followed a program-record eight D3football.com All-West Region honorees in 2019 with a new mark of nine - now labeled as Region 9 - in 2021. The Johnnies have had 49 All-Region honorees over the last seven full seasons. In addition to senior tight end **Alex Larson** and senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak**, senior defensive lineman **Metoriah Faoliu** (*right*) and senior running back **Henry Trost** return out of the nine honorees in 2022.

## ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Three Saint John's football student athletes - offensive lineman **Tyler Johnson** '21, running back **Henry Trost** and defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** were named College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-Americans last winter. Johnson and Wozniak were named to the first team, while Trost earned second-team honors. The distinction was the second consecutive for Johnson, who was named to the 2020-21 Academic All-America second team in July 2021 (a timeframe due to the COVID-19 pandemic). The Johnnies have had 20 football Academic All-Americans in the last 18 seasons (34 overall). Nominees must be of a sophomore academic standing or better, with a 3.30 GPA or higher. The Academic All-District and All-America teams are voted upon and selected by registered members of CoSIDA.

## FIVE JOHNNIES ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Five Johnnies were named to the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District VI football team last fall. The honor was the third consecutive for running back **Henry Trost** and the second for both cornerback **Tommy Deters** '22 and offensive lineman **Tyler Johnson** '21. A pair of defensive linemen, **Collin Franz** '21 and **Michael Wozniak**, earned their first Academic All-District distinction. SJU has had 51 Academic All-District selections in the past 17 seasons.

## CISNEROS EARNS MIAC ELITE 22 AWARD



Junior safety **Mateo Cisneros** (*left*) earned the MIAC's Elite 22 Award for football last season. Modeled after the NCAA Elite 90 Award, the MIAC Elite 22 Award for football is presented to the individual with the highest GPA among the student-athletes who played in the MIAC Championship game. The honoree must be a sophomore, junior or senior and in at least his second season of competition with his current team. A biology major (pre-medicine emphasis) with a 3.93 GPA, Cisneros played all 12 games for the Johnnies in 2021, including starts in the last 10. He totaled 24 tackles (15 solo), an interception (Oct. 23 at Gustavus Adolphus) and a fumble recovery (Oct. 9 vs. Augsburg).

## ALL-MIAC HONORS

Nineteen Johnnies earned 2021 All-MIAC honors, including 11 on the first team, and SJU swept all three major conference awards last fall. Of the 19 honorees, 10 return to the field in 2022. Wide receiver **Ravi Alston** '22 was named the Jim Christopherson MIAC Most Valuable Player, defensive lineman **Seth Morem** '21 shared the MIAC's Mike Stam Award with Gustavus Adolphus' Zach Jakes as the conference's most outstanding lineman, and head coach **Gary Fasching** was named the MIAC John Gagliardi Coach of the Year for the fourth consecutive season, and fifth time in his nine-year tenure.

## On This Date in Johnnie Football History...

The Johnnies are 12-2 all-time on October 22: 1904 vs. St. Cloud State (W, 18-0); 1927 at Concordia (L, 0-33); 1932 vs. Augsburg (W, 31-0); 1938 vs. Gustavus Adolphus (W, 6-0); 1949 at St. Olaf (W, 15-7); 1960 vs. Minnesota-Duluth (W, 8-7); 1966 vs. Minnesota-Duluth (L, 7-22); 1977 vs. Macalester (W, 70-0); 1983 at St. Olaf (W, 17-12); 1988 at Macalester (W, 26-11); 1994 at Carleton (W, 63-20); 2005 vs. Augsburg (W, 56-16); 2011 at Gustavus Adolphus (W, 24-16); and 2016 at Gustavus Adolphus (W, 56-10).

**1938 vs. Gustavus Adolphus (W, 6-0):** SJU earned its fourth consecutive win to stay atop the conference, defeating Gustavus by a low score of 6-0 on Homecoming Day - this date 84 years ago - in Collegeville. The lone scoring drive started early in the second quarter at the SJU 37-yard line, where the Johnnies marched down the field before finishing on a touchdown from Ed Callanan. Callanan was named SJU's first All-American by the Associated Press (Little All-America) two months later.

**2011 at Gustavus Adolphus (W, 24-16):** Saint John's bounced back from a 9-0 deficit and ended its three-game losing streak with a 24-16 win at Gustavus Adolphus on this date 11 years ago in St. Peter. The Johnnies ended the first half with 17 unanswered points. Kicker Jimmie Mattson put SJU on the scoreboard by tying a school record with a 52-yard field goal at the end of the first quarter. GAC had two offensive possessions in the game's final four minutes, but the host Gusties turned the ball over on downs and threw an interception, the second for cornerback Bobby Fischer on the afternoon, to end the possibility of a comeback. Linebacker Evan Cobb totaled 3.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks, while defensive lineman Connor Grill posted two sacks himself. Four of the Johnnies' five sacks came on third down. GAC out-gained the Johnnies 328-219 and held SJU to 10 first downs. The visitors, however, won the field-position battle. The Johnnies' average starting field position was the 50-yard line, compared to GAC's own 23.

**2016 at Gustavus Adolphus (W, 56-10):** Then-No. 10 SJU scored offensive touchdowns on five of its first six, first-half possessions en route to a 56-10 win at Gustavus six years ago. The 56 points were the most by either team in the 83 meetings up to that point (48-32-3 SJU record) between the two schools, edging the 55 points scored by SJU on Oct. 2, 1993 in St. Peter (55-14). SJU forced four turnovers and out-gained the Gusties 437-129, including a 205-38 margin on the ground. All 10 points for GAC were in result of two Johnnie turnovers deep in their own territory. Quarterback Ben Alvord ended the afternoon 10 of 14 passing for 221 yards and three touchdowns. He played the first series of the second half before taking a seat. Wide receiver Evan Clark (*right*) totaled 191 all-purpose yards in the win. He returned a kickoff 75 yards to set up the Johnnies' second touchdown of the game, a 14-yard strike from Alvord to wide receiver Will Gillach, and caught four passes for 94 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown early in the second quarter to give SJU a 21-3 lead. Alvord connected with wideout Matt Miller on a 63-yard touchdown pass less than three minutes after the bomb to Clark. Four different Johnnies recorded a rushing touchdown, including two from running back Dusty Krueger.



## CONTINUING TO LEAD THE MIAC

The Johnnies' 31-7 victory at Concordia-Moorhead on Nov. 12, 2016, was the program's 450th in MIAC play. SJU ended the 2021 regular season with the MIAC's best winning percentage in conference play, .721 (480-179-22), which is even better when broken down by eras: modern history, since 1946 (.777); during John Gagliardi's tenure, 1953-2012 (.780); and during the 21st century, since 2000 (.847).

## IN THE NCAA DIVISION III PLAYOFFS

The 2021 postseason appearance was the Johnnies' 31st (27th at the NCAA Division III level) and seventh consecutive. SJU is second in NCAA Division III history in postseason appearances and third in playoff wins. The Johnnies made four other postseason appearances and have a 48-25 (.658) record overall: three in the NAIA (1963, 1965, 1982) and one showing at the Mineral Water Bowl (1969).

## NO STRANGER TO THE POSTSEASON

Trivia question: Which Johnnie has been part of each NCAA postseason appearance, dating back to 1976? The answer is **Jerry Haugen**, who is in his 47th season on the Johnnies' coaching staff. He has coached in 68 NCAA postseason football games, which accounts for nearly seven additional seasons in playoff games alone. The Johnnies have posted a 408-96-5 (.806) overall record and a 308-60-4 (.833) MIAC record with Haugen



as a defensive coach. Since 1978, his defense has finished in the top two of the MIAC in total defense 25 times, including 15 of the past 20 seasons, and in scoring defense 30 times, including 22 of the past 26 seasons. As a player (*left*), Haugen was a four-year starter and gained All-MIAC honors as a defensive back in 1975. He ranks second on the school's career interception list with 15 (first place without postseason games).

## A LOT OF GAMES, A LOT OF WINS

The Johnnies' NCAA second-round win in 2018 was also the 380th with **Jerry Haugen '76** as an assistant football coach at SJU. The late Bobby Bowden, a member of the College Football Hall of Fame and long-time head coach at Florida State (1976-2009), has the fourth-most wins in college football history with a 377-129-4 record. All told, Haugen has been a part of 1,577 wins (2,567 games) at SJU as a player and coach across four different sports, as well as 36 conference championships (including four MIAC Playoff titles in baseball) and 42 national postseason appearances.

## BLAKE ELLIOTT '03 ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

Former Saint John's award-winning student-athlete Blake Elliott '03 was named to the College Football Hall of Fame ballot for the 10th consecutive year in June. Elliott, who played wide receiver for the Johnnies from 2000-03, is one of 176 former student-athletes on the ballot, including one of 96 from the NCAA divisional and NAIA ranks. The announcement of the 2023 inductees will be made in January. Those selected will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame during the 65th NFF Annual Awards Dinner Dec. 5, 2023, and permanently enshrined at the Chick-fil-A College Football Hall of Fame in Atlanta.

Elliott (*right*) excelled at SJU for four years and ended his career as the recipient of the Gagliardi Trophy and a national championship in 2003; a season that included Gagliardi's record-breaking 409th career victory. He owns three NCAA playoff records, two MIAC records and 29 SJU receiving records. Elliott was a three-time All-American, a two-time MIAC Player of the Year, a Gagliardi Trophy finalist as a junior in 2002 and was invited to play in both the AFCA Aztec Bowl and Hula Bowl following the 2003 season. His NCAA all-divisions record for consecutive games played with a reception (47) ended in 2008.

He ended his career second all-time in all NCAA divisions in catches (327) and second in NCAA Division III in touchdown receptions (56). Elliott posted 369 receptions for 4,826 yards and 63 touchdowns in his career, as well as 744 rushing yards and eight touchdowns on 109 carries. Elliott was just as dangerous on special teams as he was on offense, totaling 3,065 yards and seven touchdowns on 195 total returns.

To be eligible for the ballot, players must have been named a first-team All-American by a major/national selector as recognized and utilized by the NCAA for its consensus All-America teams; played their last year of intercollegiate football at least 10 years prior; played within the last 50 years and cannot be currently playing professional football. From the coaching ranks, 226 individuals have achieved Hall of Fame distinction, including SJU's John Gagliardi (Class of 2006).

## LEADING IN ATTENDANCE

Saint John's attracted the second-most spectators in NCAA Division III, both overall (51,945) and per game (6,493), over eight home games in 2021. The cumulative total (51,945) was greater than 107 Football Championship Subdivision teams and all but one of the 167 Division II programs (Grand Valley State's total of 76,334). SJU finished second nationally in Division III with an average of 6,493 spectators over eight games, including two in the NCAA playoffs. The Johnnies have finished in Division III's top two in per-game attendance 19 of the last 20 seasons.

**A JOHNNIE WITH THE JAGUARS**



Offensive tackle **Ben Bartch** '20 became the 10th Johnnie to be drafted in the NFL when he was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars with the 10th pick of the fourth round (No. 116 overall) in the 2020 NFL Draft. He appeared in 13 games for the Jaguars, including one start at left guard, and totaled 219 offensive snaps (47 on special teams) in 2020. Bartch followed that with 11 starts and right guard and 704 offensive snaps (43 on special teams) in 2021. Bartch was the lone NCAA Division III attendee at the 2020 Reese's Senior Bowl in Mobile, Ala. Although he did not play in the game, Bartch received rave reviews during the three days of practices leading up to the event. He attended the 2020 NFL Scouting Combine that February, but did not participate in the drills or measurements due to the injury suffered during the final Senior Bowl practice. A D3football.com first-team and Associated Press second-team All-American in 2019, Bartch started all 14 games at left tackle in 2019. He made 27 straight starts at tackle after he switched from tight end during the 2018 preseason. Through a combination of hard work in the weight room and repeated consumption of a now-famous (or infamous) protein shake recipe (ingredients included scrambled eggs, cottage cheese, quick grits, peanut butter, bananas and Gatorade), Bartch gained over 50 pounds and started on the line's left side immediately.

## A JOHNNIE IN VIENNA

Quarterback Jackson Erdmann '19 has had quite the post-graduate path in football following his senior season in 2019. He participated in The Spring League during Fall 2020 and followed that by leading the Wild Aces to Fan Controlled Football's championship in the inaugural season. Now, Erdmann led the Vienna Vikings to a 10-2 record and defeated the Hamburg Sea Devils Sept. 25 for the European Football League's championship.



A 2019 Gagliardi Trophy finalist and the award's recipient in 2018, Erdmann earned his third consecutive All-MIAC first-team honor and led NCAA Division III in passing yards (5,040) - 28 yards shy of the Division III single-season record of 5,068 set by Joe Callahan of Wesley (Del.) in 2015 - as a senior in 2019. He owns MIAC and SJU records for passing touchdowns (139) and passing yards (11,639), as well as the school record for season pass attempts (489), season pass completions (313), career touchdowns responsible for (143), game passing yards (496), touchdown passes in a game (7), touchdown passes in a season (47), season passing yards (5,040), yards of total offense in a game (563), yards of total offense in a season (5,100), yards of total offense in a career (11,976), 300-yard passing games in a season (11) and 300-yard passing games in a career (15). Erdmann ended his career second in school history in pass attempts (1,188), career pass completions (754) and wins as a starting quarterback (37).


