## SATURDAY'S MATCHUP

Saint John's out-gained St. Scholastica by a 473-263 margin and seven different Johnnies scored a touchdown in a 56-6 win last Saturday (Oct. 29) in Duluth. SJU began four drives inside the Saints' 40-yard line in the first two quarters of play. The Johnnies' average starting-field position on the afternoon, across 12 possessions, was their own 47-yard line. Senior wide receiver **Nick VanErp** (Battle Lake, Minn./Ottertail Central) led the way with six catches for 105 yards, including two touchdowns in the first half. Carleton allowed 228 rushing yards in a 28-9 road loss last Saturday at Gustavus Adolphus. The Gusties held Carleton quarterback Jonathan Singleton under a .500 completion percentage (20 of 41) and intercepted three of his passes, including one by Ezekiel Sundberg that he returned 45 yards for a touchdown with 13 seconds remaining in regulation. Linebacker Isaac Simons registered 15 tackles (nine solo), including three for a loss, and a fumble recovery (GAC's lone turnover).

## SJU'S FOURTH CAMPBELL TROPHY FINALIST



Senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** (left, New Hope, Minn./Robbinsdale Armstrong) was selected as one of the 15 finalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy on Oct. 26. Each of the 15 finalists will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the National Football Foundation (NFF) National Scholar-Athlete Class. The finalists will travel to Bellagio Resort & Casino in Las Vegas for the 64th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 6. At the Dec. 6 event, one member of the class will be declared the winner of the 33rd William V. Campbell Trophy and have his postgraduate scholarship increased to \$25,000.

Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first-team player or significant contributor and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is comprised of a nationally recognized group of media, members of the College Football Hall of Fame and athletics administrators. Since 1995, 21 Johnnies have been nominated for the Campbell Trophy. SJU is the lone program out of the 672 NCAA schools to have nominated a Campbell Trophy scholar-athlete each of the past 20 seasons.

The 15 finalists were selected from the 156 semifinalists from all divisions of play, who were nominated by their schools as the best all-around student-athletes on their respective teams. Wozniak is one of three finalists from the NCAA Division III level, joining Chicago (Ill.) running back Nicholas D'Ambrose and Johns Hopkins (Md.) offensive lineman J.R. Woods. The other 12 finalists consist of one from NCAA Division II, four from the Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Division I-AA) and seven from the Football Bowl Subdivision.

Wozniak is the fourth Johnnie to be named a Campbell Trophy finalist and first since linebacker **Carter Hanson** '17 in 2016. Linebacker **Matt Hawn** '06 earned the honor in 2005 and wide receiver **Chris Palmer** '96 achieved the distinction in 1995. Hanson and Palmer also earned the Gagliardi Trophy as seniors.

An accounting major with a 3.86 GPA, Wozniak was selected to the 22-man, 2022 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Team Sept. 19 and earned College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America first-team honors last fall. The three-time Academic All-MIAC honoree (minimum 3.5 GPA) was a 2022 *Lindy's* Preseason All-America and a 2021 D3football.com All-America first-team selection. Wozniak has 30 tackles (15 solo), including 10.5 for a loss and seven sacks, as well as two forced fumbles and four quarterback hurries in eight games this fall. Wozniak has 17 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks over his last 10 games going back to last season, and 28.5 tackles for loss and 17.5 sacks in 28 career games. Wozniak needs four sacks to tie **Phil Trier** '01 for 10th on SJU's all-time list and seven tackles for loss to join the tie between two more 2001 graduates, **Beau LaBore** '01 and **Brian Zirbes** '01 for 10th.

## AND ON THE GOOD WORKS TEAM

Senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** was one of 22 student-athletes across all divisions of college football named to the 2022 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Team on Monday (Sept. 19). This year marks the 31st anniversary of the award, which was established in 1992 to recognize a select group of college football players who have made a commitment to service and enriching the lives of others. A fan vote is running until Nov. 22 at [www.ESPN.com/Allstate](http://www.ESPN.com/Allstate) to decide this year's Allstate AFCA Good Works Team Captain. Fans may cast one vote per device each day. Wozniak is one of four honorees from the NCAA Division III level – joining Matthew Feldick of Bethel, Alan Gorny of Johns Hopkins (Md.) and Matt Lijja of Mount Union (Ohio) – and one of six defensive linemen.



Wozniak is the sixth Johnnie to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and the fifth in the last six seasons: quarterback **Chris Backes** '21, offensive lineman **Ben Barch** '20, quarterback **Jackson Erdmann** '19 and wide receiver **Will Gillach** '19. Defensive end **Kevin McNamara** '07 was the first SJU student-athlete to receive the honor in 2006.

Off the field, Wozniak is in his fifth year raising money for a pair of SJU football's initiatives, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and Tackle Cancer. He was also a member of the Johnnies' Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, which holds an annual Kids Fighting Hunger meal-packing event every March, for two academic years (2020-21 and 2021-22). Wozniak also helped organize a swim meet for local Special Olympians in Spring 2022 in Collegetown. Back home, Wozniak volunteered to coach 2nd- and 3rd-grade youth football for the Armstrong Cooper Youth Football Association.

## ANOTHER PERFECT OCTOBER

Saint John's is now a perfect 35-0 during the month of October under the direction of head coach **Gary Fasching**. SJU is 301-118-15 (.711) all-time in October, including a 193-61-3 record (.757) in 60 seasons under the direction of **John Gagliardi**. **Joe Benda** posted a 32-19-6 record (.614) during the month across his three stints as head coach, thanks to a 18-6-6 in his first stretch from 1930-36, despite a 0-3-1 mark his first season.

## BIG PLAYS vs. CARLETON

SJU has totaled 66 offensive plays of 20 yards or more in the last 11 meetings with Carleton, including 25 of 35 yards or more.

## SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's game is the 39th meeting between SJU and Carleton. The Johnnies have won each of the previous 38 matchups, including an 18-0 record in Collegeville. SJU has out-scored the Knights 1,642-339 (43.2-8.9 avg.) in the series, including a 358-23 advantage and four shutouts in the last seven meetings.

## MOVING INTO THE TOP 10



Junior quarterback **Aaron Syverson** (left, Minnetonka, Minn.)

finished 12 of 18 passing for 140 yards and two touchdowns and added a 4-yard touchdown run before making an early exit in the second quarter last Saturday at St. Scholastica. The performance enabled him to crack SJU's top-10 lists for career passing yards and passing touchdowns (see charts below). He has 291 career completions and needs only four to tie **Connor Bruns** '14 for 10th in another category.

Syverson has a 169.94 pass-efficiency rating (96 of 154 passing for 1,337 yards, 18 touchdowns and three interceptions) over his last five games. In all games, Syverson is tied for the MIAC lead in passing touchdowns (24) and his 19 passing touchdowns in conference play also lead the league.

(7-0 overall/7-0 vs. Division III); Saint John's (7-1 overall/7-1 vs. Division III); UW-La Crosse (7-1 overall/5-1 vs. Division III); UW-Platteville (4-4 overall/4-3 vs. Division III); and UW-Whitewater (6-2 overall/6-2 vs. Division III). They are not ranked. The first true ranking is slated for release next Wednesday (Nov. 9).

## 2 BLOCKED PUNTS




Junior linebacker **Cam Jackson** (left, St. Paul, Minn./Cretin-Derham Hall) blocked a pair of punts, one near the end of the first quarter and another on the first play of the fourth, in last Saturday's road win at St. Scholastica. The last time SJU blocked two punts in a game was last season - Nov. 20, 2021 vs. Lake Forest (Ill.) in the first round of the NCAA Division III Playoffs - when senior defensive lineman **Jaeden Frost** (Omro, Wis.) blocked a Forester punt in the second quarter and senior defensive lineman **Godswill Pepple**

(Hastings, Minn.) did the same in the third. The last time a Johnnie blocked two or more punts in a game occurred Oct. 21, 2006, vs. Hamline, when All-America defensive lineman **Nick Gunderson** '09 got his mitts on not two, but three punts in the 56-7 win. He blocked two punts in the second quarter and another on the Pipers' first drive of the second half, and finished with five blocked kicks on the season.

## THIRD-DOWN DEFENSE

The Saint John's defense held St. Scholastica to a 4-for-17 showing on third down last Saturday in Duluth. The performance moved the opposition's conversion rate to 28.2 percent (33-for-117) against the Johnnies on third down, including 23.3 percent (17-for-73) over the last five games. On third-and-long (third-and-7 or farther), SJU has allowed the opposition to convert a first down on 17.6 percent (12-for-68) of the opportunities this season, but just six of the last 42 situations (14.3 percent). In comparison, SJU allowed a first down on third-and-long at a 22.5-percent rate (20-for-89) in 2021, 30.5 percent (36-for-118) in 2019 and 21.1 percent (26-for-123) in 2018.

## FOLLOWING THE LEGEND

A 1981 SJU graduate, Fasching became the 16th head coach in the 102-year history of Saint John's University football following the 2012 season. He succeeded John Gagliardi, who announced his retirement following 60 seasons at SJU, after serving 17 seasons as an assistant football coach and recruiting coordinator at SJU. Fasching was a three-year starter for Gagliardi and the Johnnies at linebacker during the 1978 and 1980-81 seasons. A knee injury held him out of the 1979 season.

## AS AN ASSISTANT

The Johnnies posted a 164-39 record (120-22 MIAC) with 10 conference titles and 12 postseason appearances (22-11 playoff record), including the 2003 national championship, 2000 national runner-up performance and four national semifinal games during his tenure as an assistant coach. He also coached SJU's throwers as an assistant track and field coach from 1996-2011.

## AT ST. CLOUD CATHEDRAL

Prior to joining the Johnnies' coaching staff, Fasching served as the head football coach at St. Cloud Cathedral High School from 1986-95, where he led the Crusaders to the State Class B title in 1992 and 1993.

He is one touchdown behind **Rick Bell** '83 for fourth-most in SJU history (see charts below). **THE LAST GAME**

**then-No. 4/7 Saint John's 56, at St. Scholastica 6 (Oct. 29)**

The last time Saint John's football played a game in Duluth, Gerald Ford was President, a new show entitled NBC's Saturday Night (now Saturday Night Live) had just premiered and current defensive coordinator **Jerry Haugen** '76 was a senior defensive back for the Johnnies. Haugen was facing Minnesota-Duluth, then a member of the MIAC, on Oct. 11, 1975 (a 13-10 win for SJU over UMD). SJU posted a 19-11 record against the Bulldogs from 1936-83, including a 9-6 record in Duluth. Haugen is in his 47th season as an assistant now, and last Saturday his defense yielded just 51 yards rushing as SJU earned a 56-6 win at St. Scholastica.

In all, SJU gave up only 263 yards of total offense, and 70 of it came on St. Scholastica's lone touchdown – a 70-yard touchdown catch by Wyatt Lahr in the fourth quarter that cut the Johnnies' lead to 42-6. The offense, meanwhile, put up 473 yards en route to a season-high point total. Senior wide receiver **Nick VanErp** (right) led the way with six catches for 105 yards, including touchdown grabs of 6 and 25 yards in the first half.

Wide receiver **Ravi Alston** '22 led the Johnnies' air attack with nine catches for 124 yards and two touchdowns (*right*). He had seven catches for 117 yards in the first quarter alone, including a 63-yard touchdown on the first play of SJU's second drive. Alston's second touchdown reception of the game, a 2-yard shovel pass, gave SJU a 35-3 lead with 7:02 left in the third quarter.



Senior running back **Henry Trost** finished with 61 yards rushing and two touchdowns on 16 carries, and caught two passes for 15 yards. Senior linebacker **Erik Bjork** led the SJU defense, which totaled six tackles for loss in the victory, with nine tackles (three solo). Senior safety **Ethan Stark** (Sartell, Minn./Sartell-St. Stephen) thwarted the Knights' final chance for points with his first collegiate interception on SJU's two-yard line, which he returned 68 yards to the Carleton 30.

Carleton running back Aiden Chang rushed for 108 yards on 14 carries, including 12 carries for 103 yards in the first half. Augsburg running back Isaiah Thompson's 57 yards on Oct. 9 served as the previous high this season against the Johnnies. The 100-yard rushing performance was the first against SJU since the 2019 regular-season finale (Rose-Hulman's Garrett Wight, 117 yards on 41 carries).

## WINS IN FIRST 8 SEASONS, FIRST 104 GAMES

**Gary Fasching** is off to the best start, in regard to wins, by any head coach in program history. That history, of course, includes the likes of college football's all-time wins leader, **John Gagliardi**. Fasching also has John's number in regard to their respective first 104 games coached at SJU.

## PRESEASON HONORS

Senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** and senior tight end **Alex Larson** were named to the D3football.com Preseason All-America team Aug. 15. Wozniak was named to the first team and Larson earned second-team honors. Both were named to *Lindy's* preseason All-America first team earlier this summer. Wozniak earned D3football.com All-America first-team honors last season and Larson received fourth-team accolades.

Wozniak started all 12 games and finished with a team-leading 15.5 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks, including 6.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks in two NCAA playoff games, last fall. He totaled 30 tackles (20 solo), five quarterback hurries, a fumble recovery and a pass breakup.

The 6-foot-7 Larson played 11 of the 12 games and finished second on the team in receptions (33) and receiving touchdowns (8), and third in receiving yards (476) last fall for the Johnnies. The eight receiving touchdowns were the fourth-most by a tight end in SJU history. His biggest touchdown reception was the game-winning, three-yard score from Chris Backes '21 with one second remaining – as the Johnnies erased a 13-point deficit to win the MIAC championship with a 29-28 victory at then-No. 12 Bethel.

## FOUR ALL-REGION RETURNEES

Saint John's followed a program-record eight D3football.com All-West Region honorees in 2019 with a new mark of nine – now labeled as Region 9 – in 2021. The Johnnies have had 49 All-Region honorees over the last seven full seasons. In addition to senior tight end **Alex Larson** and senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak**, senior defensive lineman **Metoriah Faoliu** (Wildomar, Calif./Vista Murrieta) and senior running back **Henry Trost** return out of the nine honorees in 2022.

## FIVE JOHNNIES ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Five Johnnies were named to the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District VI football team last fall. The honor was the third consecutive for running back **Henry Trost** and the second for both cornerback **Tommy Deters** '22 and offensive lineman **Tyler Johnson** '21. A pair of defensive linemen, **Collin Franz** '21 and **Michael Wozniak**, earned their first Academic All-District distinction. SJU has had 51 Academic All-District selections in the past 17 seasons.

## ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Three Saint John's football student athletes - offensive lineman **Tyler Johnson** '21, running back **Henry Trost** and defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** were named College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-Americans last winter. Johnson and Wozniak were named to the first team, while Trost earned second-team honors. The distinction was the second consecutive for Johnson, who was named to the 2020-21 Academic All-America second team in July 2021 (a timeframe due to the COVID-19 pandemic). The Johnnies have had 20 football Academic All-Americans in the last 18 seasons (34 overall). Nominees must be of a sophomore academic standing or better, with a 3.30 GPA or higher. The Academic All-District and All-America teams are voted upon and selected by registered members of CoSIDA.

## CISNEROS EARNS MIAC ELITE 22 AWARD



Junior safety **Mateo Cisneros** (left, Shoreview, Minn./Mounds View) earned the MIAC's Elite 22 Award for football last season. Modeled after the NCAA Elite 90 Award, the MIAC Elite 22 Award for football is presented to the individual with the highest GPA among the student-athletes who played in the MIAC Championship game. The honoree must be a sophomore, junior or senior and in at least his second season of competition with his current team. A biology major (pre-medicine emphasis) with a 3.93 GPA, Cisneros played all 12 games for the Johnnies in 2021, including starts in the last 10. He totaled 24 tackles (15 solo), an interception (Oct. 23 at Gustavus Adolphus) and a fumble recovery (Oct. 9 vs. Augsburg).

## ALL-MIAC HONORS

Nineteen Johnnies earned 2021 All-MIAC honors, including 11 on the first team, and SJU swept all three major conference awards last fall. Of the 19 honorees, 10 return to the field in 2022. Wide receiver **Ravi Alston** '22 was named the Jim Christopherson MIAC Most Valuable Player, defensive lineman **Seth Morem** '21 shared the MIAC's Mike Stam Award with Gustavus Adolphus' Zach Jakes as the conference's most outstanding lineman, and head coach **Gary Fasching** was named the MIAC John Gagliardi Coach of the Year for the fourth consecutive season, and fifth time in his nine-year tenure.

Senior linebacker **Erik Bjork** (right), senior defensive lineman **Metoriah Faoliu**, tight end **Alex Larson**, senior wide receiver **Matt Mohr** (Chisago City, Minn./Chisago Lakes), running back **Henry Trost** and defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** were named to the first team. Junior wide receiver **Jimmy Buck**, senior offensive lineman **T.J. Durr** (Buffalo, Minn./St. Michael-Albertville) and senior defensive back **Ethan Stark** were named to the All-MIAC second team. Sophomore kicker **Conor Murphy** was All-MIAC honorable mention.



## MIAC TITLE NO. 35

The Johnnies' comeback win in the 2021 MIAC Championship game at Bethel clinched the program's MIAC-record 35th conference title and the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Division III Playoffs.



## On This Date in Johnnie Football History...

The Johnnies are 10-1 all-time on November 5: 1927 vs. St. Paul Luther (W, 14-13); 1949 vs. St. Thomas (L, 27-28); 1955 vs. UW-Eau-Claire (W, 33-6); 1960 at St. Cloud State (W, 50-0); 1966 vs. Augsburg (W, 51-8); 1977 vs. St. Olaf (W, 21-7); 1983 at Concordia (W, 17-7); 1988 at St. Olaf (W, 34-21); 1994 at Concordia (W, 35-19); 2011 vs. St. Olaf (W, 27-24); and 2016 vs. Hamline (W, 42-6).

**1955 vs. UW-Eau Claire (W, 33-6):** Halfback Jim Lehman (*right*) ran for 195 yards and three touchdowns on 13 carries in a 33-6 win over UW-Eau Claire on this date 67 years ago in Collegeville. Lehman scored on runs of 91, 34 and 44 yards. The Johnnies' Jerry Kollodge ended the scoring with a 75-yard interception return for a touchdown.



**1960 at St. Cloud State (W, 50-0):** The Johnnies got on the board early when Bernie Beckman capped a 66-yard drive with a 3-yard rushing touchdown and quarterback Jim Glowack finished the next scoring drive with a 2-yard plunge. SJU capitalized after a Husky fumble gave the visitors prime field position with a 1-yard touchdown run from Rich Chalmers. Jim Layer scored the final touchdown of the half with a 2-yard plunge. SJU held the Husky offense to just two first downs in the first half and forced four turnover-on-downs in the game.

**1983 at Concordia (W, 17-7):** Don Pribyl started the scoring with a 22-yard field goal with 6:40 remaining in the first quarter, which was set up by a 21-yard punt return and a 35-yard pass from quarterback Rick Dougherty to tight end Mike Smith. SJU struck first in the second half on another connection from Dougherty to Smith, this time from 20 yards out, to put SJU ahead 10-0. Later in the third quarter, Dougherty found tight end Chris Biggins for a 22-yard touchdown. Dana DeClouet ended the day with five punt returns for 141 yards.

**1988 at St. Olaf (W, 34-21):** Down 21-14 entering the second half, the SJU offense needed a come-from-behind victory in order to stay in the running for a MIAC championship. Jeff Olejnik scored two touchdowns to give the Johnnies a 27-23 lead. With 10 minutes remaining, St. Olaf fumbled a punt return on its own 33-yard line and quarterback John Lahti hit Mike Ramler for a 33-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the ensuing drive. STO got a touchdown and two-point conversion with seven minutes left, but was stopped on its last two possessions.

## NO STRANGER TO THE POSTSEASON

Trivia question: Which Johnnie has been part of each NCAA postseason appearance, dating back to 1976? The answer is **Jerry Haugen**, who is in his 47th season on the Johnnies' coaching staff. He has coached in 68 NCAA postseason football games, which accounts for nearly seven additional seasons in playoff games alone. The Johnnies have posted a 410-96-5 (.807) overall record and a 310-60-4 (.834) MIAC record with Haugen



as a defensive coach. Since 1978, his defense has finished in the top two of the MIAC in total defense 25 times, including 15 of the past 20 seasons, and in scoring defense 30 times, including 22 of the past 26 seasons. As a player (*left*), Haugen was a four-year starter and gained All-MIAC honors as a defensive back in 1975. He ranks second on the school's career interception list with 15 (first place without postseason games).

## A LOT OF GAMES, A LOT OF WINS

The Johnnies' NCAA second-round win in 2018 was also the 380th with **Jerry Haugen '76** as an assistant football coach at SJU. The late Bobby Bowden, a member of the College Football Hall of Fame and long-time head coach at Florida State (1976-2009), has the fourth-most wins in college football history with a 377-129-4 record. All told, Haugen has been a part of 1,579 wins (2,569 games) at SJU as a player and coach across four different sports, as well as 36 conference championships (including four MIAC Playoff titles in baseball) and 42 national postseason appearances.

## SINCE 2018

The Johnnies entered the 2022 season with a 35-4 record since 2018: 2018 (12-1), 2019 (12-2) and 2021 (11-1). All four losses were decided by three points or less. SJU is one of 11 NCAA Division III teams to record 30 wins or more during that span, 10 of which reached the mark without the use of the unpredictable, COVID-19 season of 2020-21 that SJU did not compete in.

## BLAKE ELLIOTT '03 ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

Former Saint John's student-athlete **Blake Elliott '03** was named to the College Football Hall of Fame ballot for the 10th consecutive year in June 2022. Elliott, who played wide receiver for the Johnnies from 2000-03, is one of 176 former student-athletes on the ballot, including one of 96 from the NCAA divisional and NAIA ranks. The announcement of the 2023 inductees will be made in January and those selected will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame during the 65th NFF Annual Awards Dinner Dec. 5, 2023, and enshrined at the Chick-fil-A College Football Hall of Fame in Atlanta.

Elliott (*right*) excelled for four years and ended his career as the recipient of the Gagliardi Trophy and a national championship in 2003; a season that included **John Gagliardi's** record-breaking 409th career victory. He owns three NCAA playoff records, two MIAC records and 29 SJU receiving records. Elliott was a three-time All-American, a two-time MIAC Player of the Year, a Gagliardi Trophy finalist as a junior and was invited to play in both the AFCA Aztec Bowl and Hula Bowl following the 2003 season.



He ended his career second all-time in all NCAA divisions in catches (327) and second in NCAA Division III in touchdown receptions (56). Elliott posted 369 receptions for 4,826 yards and 63 touchdowns in his career, as well as 744 rushing yards and eight touchdowns on 109 carries. Elliott was just as dangerous on special teams as he was on offense, totaling 3,065 yards and seven touchdowns on 195 total returns. His NCAA all-divisions record for consecutive games played with a reception (47) ended in 2008.

To be eligible for the ballot, players must have been named a first-team All-American as recognized and utilized by the NCAA for its consensus All-America teams; played their last year of intercollegiate football at least 10 years prior; played within the last 50 years and cannot be currently playing professional football. From the coaching ranks, 226 individuals have achieved Hall of Fame distinction, including Gagliardi (Class of 2006).

## LEADING IN ATTENDANCE

Saint John's attracted the second-most spectators in NCAA Division III, both overall (51,945) and per game (6,493), over eight home games in 2021. The cumulative total (51,945) was greater than 107 Football Championship Subdivision teams and all but one of the 167 Division II programs (Grand Valley State's total of 76,334). SJU finished second nationally in Division III with an average of 6,493 spectators over eight games, including two in the NCAA playoffs. The Johnnies have finished in Division III's top two in per-game attendance 19 of the last 20 seasons.

## A JOHNNIE WITH THE JAGUARS



Offensive tackle **Ben Barch** '20 became the 10th Johnnie to be drafted in the NFL when he was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars with the 10th pick of the fourth round (No. 116 overall) in the 2020 NFL Draft. He appeared in 13 games for the Jaguars, including one start at left guard, and totaled 219 offensive snaps (47 on special teams) in 2020. Barch followed that with 11 starts and right guard and 704 offensive snaps (43 on special teams) in

2021. Barch was the lone NCAA Division III attendee at the 2020 Reese's Senior Bowl in Mobile, Ala. Although he did not play in the game, Barch received rave reviews during the three days of practices leading up to the event. He attended the 2020 NFL Scouting Combine that February, but did not participate in the drills or measurements due to the injury suffered during the final Senior Bowl practice. A D3football.com first-team and Associated Press second-team All-American in 2019, Barch started all 14 games at left tackle in 2019. He made 27 straight starts at tackle after he switched from tight end during the 2018 preseason. Through a combination of hard work in the weight room and repeated consumption of a now-famous (or infamous) protein shake recipe (ingredients included scrambled eggs, cottage cheese, quick grits, peanut butter, bananas and Gatorade), Barch gained over 50 pounds and started on the line's left side immediately.

## A JOHNNIE IN VIENNA

Quarterback Jackson Erdmann '19 has had quite the post-graduate path in football following his senior season in 2019. He participated in The Spring League during Fall 2020 and followed that by leading the Wild Aces to Fan Controlled Football's championship in the inaugural season. Now, Erdmann led the Vienna Vikings to a 10-2 record and defeated the Hamburg Sea Devils Sept. 25 for the European Football League's championship. A 2019 Gagliardi Trophy finalist and the award's recipient in 2018, Erdmann earned his third consecutive All-MIAC first-team honor and led NCAA Division III in passing yards (5,040) - 28 yards shy of the Division III single-season record of 5,068 set by Joe Callahan of Wesley (Del.) in 2015 - as a senior in 2019. He owns MIAC and SJU records for passing touchdowns (139) and passing yards (11,639), as well as the school record for season pass attempts (489), season pass completions (313), career touchdowns responsible for (143), game passing yards (496), touchdown passes in a game (7), touchdown passes in a season (47), season passing yards (5,040), yards of total offense in a game (563), yards of total offense in a season (5,100), yards of total offense in a career (11,976), 300-yard passing games in a season (11) and 300-yard passing games in a career (15).


