SATURDAY'S MATCHUP

Saint John's suffered its first loss of the 2022 season - 28-24 - last Saturday (Sept. 24) at then-No. 20 Bethel. The Johnnies rushed for a season-high 101 yards (-31 yards on five sacks) and posted 414 total yards, but allowed 506 yards of offense to the Royals and three touchdowns of 35+ yards. SJU led 10-7 at halftime and entered the fourth quarter with a 17-14 advantage, but committed turnovers on its final two possessions. The win was the first for BU over SJU since 2013 - snapping an eight-game losing skid in the series - and the 10th in 44 meetings against the Johnnies. Concordia also received its first defeat of the season, 23-6 at home to Gustavus Adolphus, last Saturday. The Cobbers mustered only 215 yards of offense and had the ball for only 24:42. The Gusties scored the game's final 15 points, including a 30-yard interception return for a touchdown early in the fourth quarter.

WOZNIAK NAMED TO GOOD WORKS TEAM



Senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** (left, New Hope, Minn./Robbinsdale Armstrong) was one of 22 student-athletes across all divisions of college football named to the 2022 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Team on Monday (Sept. 19). This year marks the 31st anniversary of the award, which was established in 1992 to recognize a select group of college football players who have made a commitment to service and enriching the lives of others. A fan vote will run from now until Nov. 22 at www.ESPN.com/Allstate to decide this year's Allstate AFCA Good Works Team Captain. Fans may cast one vote per device each day. Wozniak is one of four honorees from the NCAA Division III level – joining Matthew Feldick of Bethel, Alan Gorny of Johns Hopkins (Md.) and Matt Lijja of Mount Union (Ohio) – and one of six defensive linemen.

Wozniak is the sixth Johnnie to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and the fifth in the last six seasons: quarterback **Chris Backes** '21, offensive lineman **Ben Barch** '20, quarterback **Jackson Erdmann** '19 and wide receiver **Will Gillach** '19. Defensive end **Kevin McNamara** '07 was the first SJU student-athlete to receive the honor in 2006.

A 2022 *Lindy's* Preseason All-American and a 2021 D3football.com All-America first-team selection, Wozniak started all 12 games and finished with a team-leading 15.5 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks, including 6.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks in two NCAA playoff games, last fall. He totaled 30 tackles (20 solo), five quarterback hurries, a fumble recovery and a pass breakup. He returned to the field in 2021 after suffering a season-ending hand injury on the first defensive play of the 2019 season - a tackle for loss - at UW-Stout.

Off the field, Wozniak is in his fifth year raising money for a pair of SJU football's initiatives, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and Tackle Cancer. He was also a member of the Johnnies' Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, which holds an annual Kids Fighting Hunger meal-packing event every March, for two academic years (2020-21 and 2021-22). Wozniak also helped organize a swim meet for local Special Olympians in Spring 2022 in Col-legeville. Back home, Wozniak volunteered to coach 2nd- and 3rd-grade youth football for the Armstrong Cooper Youth Football Association.

AND AN NFF CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST

Senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** was named one of the 156 semifinalists for the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy and is a candidate for the 2022 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete Awards, presented by Fidelity Investments. The NFF and College Football Hall of Fame made the announcement Sept. 28.

Wozniak is one of 29 student-athletes from NCAA Division III and the lone nominee from the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) for the Campbell Trophy. Since 1995, 21 Johnnies have been nominated for the Campbell Trophy. SJU is the lone program out of the 672 NCAA schools to have nominated a Campbell Trophy scholar-athlete each of the past 20 seasons.

The award recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation and up to 14 of the candidates will be named recipients of a prestigious NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award. Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first-team player or significant contributor and demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is comprised of a nationally recognized group of media, members of the College Football Hall of Fame and athletics administrators. Launched in 1959, the NFF National Scholar-Athlete program awards \$18,000 scholarships that can be used for the honorees' postgraduate education. SJU has produced three NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award winners: linebacker Carter Hanson '17 (2016), linebacker Matt Hawn '06 (2005) and wide receiver Chris Palmer '96 (1995).

The NFF will announce 12-14 finalists on Oct. 26 and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class Presented by Fidelity Investments. One of the finalists will be named the winner of the 33rd Campbell Trophy during the 64th NFF Annual Awards Dinner Presented by Las Vegas on Dec. 6 and have his postgraduate scholarship increased to \$25,000.

An accounting major with a 3.86 GPA, Wozniak earned College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America first-team honors last fall and will be a three-time Academic All-MIAC honoree.

0-1 IN THE MIAC

Last Saturday's loss was the first for Saint John's in the MIAC opener since 2014 - a 23-14 home loss to Concordia - snapping the Johnnies' streak at six. SJU is now 68-25-7 (.715) all-time in its first MIAC game of the season. It took the Johnnies until their 11th season in the MIAC to win its first conference game of the season, a 7-0 home shutout of Hamline on Oct. 3, 1931. SJU was 0-6-4 in its first 10 conference openers and is 68-19-3 (.772) since.

A BAD DAY FOR A FOOTBALL GAME

Saint John's is now 5-9 all-time in football games played on Sept. 24. The Johnnies have a losing record on only six of the 91 days between Sept. 1 and Nov. 30: Sept. 20 (6-7-1 record), Sept. 24 (5-9), Oct. 28 (6-8-1), Nov. 2 (5-7), Nov. 26 (1-3) and Nov. 28 (1-3).

A NOT SO SPOOKY OCTOBER

Saint John's is a perfect 30-0 during the month of October in **Gary Fasching's** previous nine seasons as head coach. The Johnnies are 296-118-15 (.724) all-time in October, including a 193-61-3 record (.757) in 60 seasons under the direction of John Gagliardi. Joe Benda compiled a 32-19-6 record (.614) during the month across his three stints as head coach, thanks to a 18-6-6 in his first stretch from 1930-36 despite a 0-3-1 mark his first season.

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's game is the 88th meeting between SJU and Concordia. The Johnnies are 47-34-6 (.575) all-time against the Cobbers, including a 23-15-4 record in Collegeville. SJU's 49-point margin over Concordia last season tied the series record set by SJU in 1976 (also a 49-0 score, but achieved in Collegeville).

JOHNNIE DUO AGAIN OVER 100


Senior tight end **Alex Larson** (Woodbury, Minn./East Ridge) and junior wide receiver **Jimmy Buck** (Orono, Minn.) crossed the 100-yard mark for the second consecutive game last weekend at Bethel. Larson caught nine passes for 119 yards, while Buck recorded seven receptions for 113 yards, including a 58-yard touchdown in the third quarter that put SJU on top 17-14 (*right*). Larson currently leads the team in receptions (25) and receiving touchdowns (3), while Buck has a team-best 309 receiving yards (five more than Larson) and 22 catches so far this fall. The duo has combined for 113 receptions, 1,640 receiving yards (14.5 avg.) and 19 touchdowns over the Johnnies' last 15 games.

FOLLOWING THE LEGEND

A 1981 SJU graduate, Fasching became the 16th head coach in the 102-year history of Saint John's University football following the 2012 season. He succeeded John Gagliardi, who announced his retirement following 60 seasons at SJU, after serving 17 seasons as an assistant football coach and recruiting coordinator at SJU. Fasching was a three-year starter for Gagliardi and the Johnnies at linebacker during the 1978 and 1980-81 seasons. A knee injury held him out of the 1979 season.

AS AN ASSISTANT

The Johnnies posted a 164-39 record (120-22 MIAC) with 10 conference titles and 12 postseason appearances (22-11 playoff record), including the 2003 national championship, 2000 national runner-up performance and four national semifinal games during his tenure as an assistant coach. He also coached SJU's throwers as an assistant track and field coach from 1996-2011.

AT ST. CLOUD CATHEDRAL

Prior to joining the Johnnies' coaching staff, Fasching served as the head football coach at St. Cloud Cathedral High School from 1986-95, where he led the Crusaders to the State Class B title in 1992 and 1993.



TROST TOUCHDOWNS



Senior running back **Henry Trost** (*left*, Lindstrom, Minn./Chisago Lakes) rushed for 105 yards - the sixth 100-yard rushing game of his career - and two touchdowns on 21 carries in the 28-24 loss at Bethel. The pair of rushing touchdowns enabled Trost to break his tie with **Jay Conzemius** '92 and move into second in SJU history with 36 for his career. The two scores also lifted him past **Chris Moore** '01 and **Chris Palmer** '96 into sixth place with 41 total touchdowns (36 rushing, five receiving).

Trost has scored 38 touchdowns, including 34 rushing, over his last 28 games and has 1,701 rushing yards on 286 career attempts, an average of 5.9 yards per carry, and 2,294 yards from scrimmage on 324 career touches (7.1 avg.).

ANOTHER KOHLER INT

Senior cornerback **John Kohler** (Birchwood, Wis./Rice Lake) stopped a Bethel threat - a first-and-10 play from the Johnnies' 32-yard line - in the second quarter of last Saturday's game with his second interception of the season (*right*). Kohler's first interception of the 2022 season, and as a collegiate cornerback, came on UW-Whitewater's first possession of the Sept. 3 season opener. He played all 14 games (13 starts) as a sophomore at safety in 2019, but suffered an injury prior to the 2021 season and missed all of last year.



19-PLAY SCORING DRIVE

Saint John's opened last Saturday's game at Bethel with a 19-play, 70-yard scoring drive that ended with the first of senior running back **Henry Trost's** two rushing touchdowns of the day to give SJU a 7-0 lead. THE LAST GAME

at No. 20 Bethel 28, No. 2 Saint John's 24 (Sept. 24)

Then-No. 2 Saint John's suffered its first loss of the season - a 28-24 defeat at then-No. 20 Bethel - last Saturday (Sept. 24) in the MIAC opener.

The Royals had not defeated the Johnnies since 2013 (head coach **Gary Fasching's** first season as head coach). SJU then went on to win eight-straight in the series, including two victories last season - a 31-25 victory in Collegeville and a last-second 29-28 win in the inaugural MIAC Championship Game in Arden Hills. The win was BU's 10th in 44 meetings against SJU.

But last Saturday, Bethel quarterback Jaran Roste - who returned to action for the first time since dislocating his left elbow in his team's season opener on Sept. 3 - threw for 321 yards and three touchdowns - including a 72-yarder to Micah Niewald with 9:22 remaining that put his team ahead to stay.



That touchdown came one play after a 5-yard touchdown run by senior **Henry Trost** gave the Johnnies a 24-21 lead (right).

The Johnnies got the ball back twice after Niewald's touchdown, but both drives ended in interceptions. The first came on third-and-four at the Royals' 35 with 6:53 remaining. The second came on third-and-10 at the Johnnies' 30 with just over two minutes to go.

Last Saturday marked just the second time since in Fasching's tenure as head coach that the Johnnies have lost a game they led at halftime and/or the start of the fourth quarter.

Gustavus Adolphus 23, at Concordia-Moorhead 8 (Sept. 10)

Concordia allowed 15 unanswered points in a span of 6:16 during the second half to Gustavus Adolphus in a 23-6 home loss. The Cobbers got to within two points midway through the third quarter when quarterback Cooper Mattern found senior Jake Evans for a 10-yard touchdown pass. GAC, however, found the end zone with 3:48 left in the third quarter to push the lead to nine points, and padded the lead for good at the 12:32 mark of the fourth.

Both teams recorded less than 275 yards of offense. CC limited the the Gusties to 267 yards, with only 72 on the ground, while Gustavus held the CC offense to 215 yards.

Turnovers played a key role in the game. The Cobbers' lone score on the day came after they recovered a fumble at the Gustie 37-yard line. GAC put the game away in the fourth quarter when they came up with the only interception of the day and turned it into a 30-yard "Pick 6".

Linebacker Noah Jenson finished with 14 tackles, including 1.5 for a loss. Jenson currently leads the team in tackles with 29, which is second most in the MIAC this year. Defensive end Collin Thompson posted a career-high 2.0 sacks in the game, matching his total for all of last season.

THE LAST MEETING

Saint John's 49, at Concordia-Moorhead 0 (Oct. 2, 2021)

Then-No. 5 Saint John's scored touchdowns on its first seven offensive possessions en route to a 49-0 shutout of Concordia last Oct. 2 (2021) in Moorhead. The Johnnies rolled to 518 yards of offense, including 349 and a 42-0 lead in the first half, and held the Cobbers to nearly half of their average offensive output (215 yards, averaged 425.3 per game).



Junior quarterback **Aaron Syverson** (Minnetonka, Minn.) played the first half and finished 20 of 24 passing for 289 yards and four touchdowns. He also rushed for a 2-yard touchdown.

SJU's defense held Concordia, which entered the contest ninth in NCAA Division III in passing offense (345.0 ypg.), to 163 yards through the air. The Johnnies totaled

eight tackles for a loss and two interceptions.

Three Johnnies recorded 80 receiving yards or more on the afternoon. Wide receiver **Ravi Alston '22**, the MIAC Offensive Player of the Week at the time, caught seven passes for 92 yards and a touchdown. Senior tight end **Alex Larson** posted six receptions for 91 yards and a score, while junior wideout **Jimmy Buck** recorded his second multi-touchdown game of the season with five catches for 85 yards and two scores.

Concordia quarterback Tanner Dubois entered the game averaging the third-most yards of total offense per contest, 368.0 (125 yards rushing, 979 passing), but was held to 33 yards on the ground and 149 yards through the air against SJU.

PRESEASON HONORS

Senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** and senior tight end **Alex Larson** were named to the D3football.com Preseason All-America team Aug. 15. Wozniak was named to the first team and Larson earned second-team honors. Both were named to *Lindy's* preseason All-America first team earlier this summer. Wozniak earned D3football.com All-America first-team honors last season (see *Wozniak's 2021 stats on page 2*) and Larson received fourth-team accolades.

The 6-foot-7 Larson played 11 of the 12 games and finished second on the team in receptions (33) and receiving touchdowns (8), and third in receiving yards (476) last fall for the Johnnies. The eight receiving touchdowns were the fourth-most by a tight end in SJU history. His biggest touchdown reception was the game-winning, three-yard score from Chris Backes '21 with one second remaining – as the Johnnies erased a 13-point deficit to win the MIAC championship with a 29-28 victory at then-No. 12 Bethel.

FOUR ALL-REGION RETURNEES

Saint John's followed a program-record eight D3football.com All-West Region honorees in 2019 with a new mark of nine – now labeled as Region 9 – in 2021. The Johnnies have had 49 All-Region honorees over the last seven full seasons. In addition to senior tight end **Alex Larson** and senior defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak**, senior defensive lineman **Metoriah Faoliu** and senior running back **Henry Trost** return out of the nine honorees in 2022.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Three Saint John's football student athletes – offensive lineman **Tyler Johnson '21**, running back **Henry Trost** and defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** were named College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-Americans last winter. Johnson and Wozniak were named to the first team, while Trost earned second-team honors. The distinction is the second consecutive for Johnson, who was named to the 2020-21 Academic All-America second team in July 2021 (a timeframe due to the COVID-19 pandemic). The Johnnies have now had 20 football Academic All-Americans in the last 18 seasons (34 overall). Nominees must be of a sophomore academic standing or better, with a 3.30 GPA or higher. The Academic All-District and All-America teams are voted upon and selected by registered members of CoSIDA.

FIVE JOHNNIES ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Five Johnnies were named to the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District VI football team last fall. The honor was the third consecutive for running back **Henry Trost** and the second for both cornerback **Tommy Deters '22** and offensive lineman **Tyler Johnson '21**. A pair of defensive linemen, **Collin Franz '21** and **Michael Wozniak**, earned their first Academic All-District distinction. SJU has now had 51 Academic All-District selections in the past 17 seasons.

CISNEROS EARNS MIAC ELITE 22 AWARD



Junior safety **Mateo Cisneros** (left, Shoreview, Minn./Mounds View) earned the MIAC's Elite 22 Award for football last season. Modeled after the NCAA Elite 90 Award, the MIAC Elite 22 Award for football is presented to the individual with the highest GPA among the student-athletes who played in the MIAC Championship game. The honoree must be a sophomore, junior or senior and in at least his second season of competition with his current team. A biology major (pre-medicine emphasis) with a 3.93 GPA, Cisneros played all 12 games for the Johnnies in 2021, including starts in the last 10. He totaled 24 tackles (15 solo), an interception (Oct. 23 at Gustavus Adolphus) and a fumble recovery (Oct. 9 vs. Augsburg).

ALL-MIAC HONORS

Nineteen Johnnies earned 2021 All-MIAC honors, including 11 on the first team, and SJU swept all three major conference awards last fall. Of the 19 honorees, 10 return to the field in 2022. Wide receiver **Ravi Alston** '22 was named the Jim Christopherson MIAC Most Valuable Player, defensive lineman **Seth Morem** '21 shared the MIAC's Mike Stam Award with Gustavus Adolphus' Zach Jakes as the conference's most outstanding lineman, and head coach **Gary Fasching** was named the MIAC John Gagliardi Coach of the Year for the fourth consecutive season, and fifth time in his nine-year tenure.

Senior linebacker **Erik Bjork** (right, Mahtomedi, Minn.), senior defensive lineman **Metoriah Faoliu** (Wildomar, Calif./Vista Murrieta), tight end **Alex Larson**, senior wide receiver **Matt Mohr** (Chisago City, Minn./Chisago Lakes), running back **Henry Trost** and defensive lineman **Michael Wozniak** were named to the first team. Junior wide receiver **Jimmy Buck**, senior offensive lineman **T.J. Duerr** (Buffalo, Minn./St. Michael-Albertville) and senior defensive back **Ethan Stark** (Sartell, Minn./Sartell-St. Stephen) were named to the All-MIAC second team. Sophomore kicker **Conor Murphy** (Sioux Falls, S.D./O'Gorman) was All-MIAC honorable mention.

1904 at St. Cloud H.S. (W, 48-0): Saint John's scored five times in the first half to grab an early 30-0 advantage. Led by Otto Kuklinski, a pair of Johnnies rushed for over 100 yards on the day. Kuklinski gained 217 yards on 13 carries, while James Mienes added 145 yards on 171 attempts, including three touchdowns in the third quarter.

1965 at St. Thomas (W, 10-0): SJU capped its fourth straight shutout with a 10-0 victory over St. Thomas on a Friday night game under the lights in St. Paul. Quarterback Tom Gillham scored from one yard out in the first quarter and Terry Hartman added a 27-yard field goal in the second. The second half was a defensive struggle as neither team scored for the remainder of the game. SJU held the Tommies to only six first downs and 71 yards of offense in the victory.

1988 at Augsburg (W, 62-21): The week after suffering a tough 28-7 loss to Concordia in Collegeville, the Johnnies bounced back with a 62-21 win at Augsburg. Running back Joe Henry matched the Auggies' total scoring with three touchdowns on the afternoon. The Johnnies also threw for four touchdowns, all by a different player. Tight end Dan Grant recorded eight catches for 110 yards and a touchdown, while wideout Jim Gagliardi hauled in a 15-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter. Defensive back Chris Parrington opened the Johnnies' scoring by returning an interception 46 yards for a score.

2016 at Bethel (W, 42-27): Then-No. 10/14 SJU forced five turnovers and scored 35 straight points en route to a 42-27 win at Bethel on this date in 2016. The Johnnies' backup quarterback, Ben Alvord, completed his first 14 passes and ended the day 15 of 17 passing for 211 yards and three touchdowns in his first collegiate start. He also rushed for 19 yards and left the game late in the third quarter. Wide receiver Evan Clark recorded then-career highs in receptions (8) and receiving yards (150), and added two receiving touchdowns in the win. Bethel took the opening kickoff and gained an early 7-0 lead on a 15-play, 77-yard scoring drive. SJU, however, answered with 35 consecutive points. Running back Zack Sundly scored two rushing touchdowns on the day, the first of his collegiate career.

NO STRANGER TO THE POSTSEASON

Trivia question: Which Johnnie has been part of each NCAA postseason appearance, dating back to 1976? The answer is **Jerry Haugen**, who is in his 47th season on the Johnnies' coaching staff. He has coached in 68 NCAA postseason football games, which accounts for nearly seven additional seasons in playoff games alone. The Johnnies have posted a 405-96-5 (.805) overall record and a 305-60-4 (.832) MIAC record with Haugen



as a defensive coach. Since 1978, his defense has finished in the top two of the MIAC in total defense 25 times, including 15 of the past 20 seasons, and in scoring defense 30 times, including 22 of the past 26 seasons. As a player (*left*), Haugen was a four-year starter and gained All-MIAC honors as a defensive back in 1975. He ranks second on the school's career interception list with 15 (first place without postseason games).

A LOT OF GAMES, A LOT OF WINS

The Johnnies' NCAA second-round win in 2018 was also the 380th with **Jerry Haugen '76** as an assistant football coach at SJU. The late Bobby Bowden, a member of the College Football Hall of Fame and long-time head coach at Florida State (1976-2009), has the fourth-most wins in college football history with a 377-129-4 record. All told, Haugen has been a part of 1,574 wins (2,564 games) at SJU as a player and coach across four different sports, as well as 36 conference championships (including four MIAC Playoff titles in baseball) and 42 national postseason appearances.

BLAKE ELLIOTT '03 ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

Former Saint John's award-winning student-athlete Blake Elliott '03 was named to the College Football Hall of Fame ballot for the 10th consecutive year in June. Elliott, who played wide receiver for the Johnnies from 2000-03, is one of 176 former student-athletes on the ballot, including one of 96 from the NCAA divisional and NAIA ranks. The announcement of the 2023 inductees will be made in January. Those selected will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame during the 65th NFF Annual Awards Dinner Dec. 5, 2023, and permanently enshrined at the Chick-fil-A College Football Hall of Fame in Atlanta.

Elliott (*right*) excelled at SJU for four years and ended his career as the recipient of the Gagliardi Trophy and a national championship in 2003; a season that included Gagliardi's record-breaking 409th career victory. He owns three NCAA playoff records, two MIAC records and 29 SJU receiving records. Elliott was a three-time All-American, a two-time MIAC Player of the Year, a Gagliardi Trophy finalist as a junior in 2002 and was invited to play in both the AFCA Aztec Bowl and Hula Bowl following the 2003 season. His NCAA all-divisions record for consecutive games played with a reception (47) ended in 2008.



He ended his career second all-time in all NCAA divisions in catches (327) and second in NCAA Division III in touchdown receptions (56). Elliott posted 369 receptions for 4,826 yards and 63 touchdowns in his career, as well as 744 rushing yards and eight touchdowns on 109 carries. Elliott was just as dangerous on special teams as he was on offense, totaling 3,065 yards and seven touchdowns on 195 total returns.

To be eligible for the ballot, players must have been named a first-team All-American by a major/national selector as recognized and utilized by the NCAA for its consensus All-America teams; played their last year of intercollegiate football at least 10 years prior; played within the last 50 years and cannot be currently playing professional football. From the coaching ranks, 226 individuals have achieved Hall of Fame distinction, including SJU's John Gagliardi (Class of 2006).

LEADING IN ATTENDANCE

Saint John's attracted the second-most spectators in NCAA Division III, both overall (51,945) and per game (6,493), over eight home games in 2021. The cumulative total (51,945) was greater than 107 Football Championship Subdivision teams and all but one of the 167 Division II programs (Grand Valley State's total of 76,334). SJU finished second nationally in Division III with an average of 6,493 spectators over eight games, including two in the NCAA playoffs. The Johnnies have finished in Division III's top two in per-game attendance 19 of the last 20 seasons.

A JOHNNIE WITH THE JAGUARS



Offensive tackle **Ben Bartch** '20 became the 10th Johnnie to be drafted in the NFL when he was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars with the 10th pick of the fourth round (No. 116 overall) in the 2020 NFL Draft. He appeared in 13 games for the Jaguars, including one start at left guard, and totaled 219 offensive snaps (47 on special teams) in 2020. Bartch followed that with 11 starts and right guard and 704 offensive snaps (43 on special teams) in

2021. Bartch was the lone NCAA Division III attendee at the 2020 Reese's Senior Bowl in Mobile, Ala. Although he did not play in the game, Bartch received rave reviews during the three days of practices leading up to the event. He attended the 2020 NFL Scouting Combine that February, but did not participate in the drills or measurements due to the injury suffered during the final Senior Bowl practice.

A D3football.com first-team and Associated Press second-team All-American in 2019, Bartch started all 14 games at left tackle in 2019. He made 27 straight starts at tackle after he switched from tight end during the 2018 preseason. Through a combination of hard work in the weight room and repeated consumption of a now-famous (or infamous) protein shake recipe (ingredients included scrambled eggs, cottage cheese, quick grits, peanut butter, bananas and Gatorade), Bartch gained over 50 pounds and started on the line's left side immediately.

A JOHNNIE IN VIENNA

Quarterback Jackson Erdmann '19 has had quite the post-graduate path in football following his senior season in 2019. He participated in The Spring League during Fall 2020 and followed that by leading the Wild Aces to Fan Controlled Football's championship in the inaugural season. Now, Erdmann led the Vienna Vikings to a 10-2 record and defeated the Hamburg Sea Devils Sept. 25 for the European Football League's championship.



A 2019 Gagliardi Trophy finalist and the award's recipient in 2018, Erdmann earned his third consecutive All-MIAC first-team honor and led NCAA Division III in passing yards (5,040) - 28 yards shy of the Division III single-season record of 5,068 - as a senior in 2019. He owns MIAC and SJU records for passing touchdowns (139) and passing yards (11,639), as well as 12 other school passing records.


