## COACH NIELSON IN THE MEDIA

**WHAT IS A FIGHTING LEATHERNECK?:** Western Illinois holds the distinction of being the only non-military institution to officially have its nickname derived from a branch of the military service. The school began use of the Marine Corps' official nickname, "The Fighting Leathernecks," in 1927 when then-athletic director and head baseball, basketball and football coach **Ray "Rock" Hanson** was granted permission by the U.S. Navy, based on his status as a Marine hero, to use the Marine's official seal, bulldog mascot and nickname. He still remains third all-time at Western in victories with 56 in 16 years as head coach (56-60-12) from 1926-41. He posted a winning record six years and a .500 mark during another season. The 1939 team went 5-1-1 and won the Little 19 Conference championship.



**NFL PIPELINE:** Western Illinois continues its tradition as one of the top NCAA FCS programs with a pipeline to the NFL... Players and coaches from Leatherneck history have won 17 Super Bowl Championships.

- **Mike Wagner** won four Super Bowls with the Pittsburgh Steelers and Steel Curtain era.
- **Rodney Harrison** won a pair of Super Bowls with the New England Patriots in three appearances all-time. He now works in-studio at NBC Sports during Sunday Night Football Night. From 1957-59, former WIU head coach **Lou Saban** had on his staff **Joe Collier** and standout WIU player **Robert 'Red' Miller**.
- Saban was the inaugural coach for the Boston Patriots, then later the Buffalo Bills. He was the 1964 AFL 'Coach of the Year'. Saban spent four years as coach of the Denver Broncos and would later come back and coach the Bills.
- Miller, a three-time MVP for the Leathernecks, would later coach the Denver Broncos in the 1977 Super Bowl and three consecutive playoff appearances.
- Collier joined Saban in Boston and was promoted to the Buffalo Bills head coach in 1966. He took the Bills to the AFL Championship game that season. He later worked as an assistant with the Denver Broncos, hired first by Saban then later Miller as defensive coordinator. He coached in three Super Bowls with the Broncos. Collier was the mastermind behind the Broncos defense known at the time as the 'Orange Crush Defense'.
- Former All-American **John Teerlinck** won two Super Bowls with the Denver Broncos as an assistant coach and another Super Bowl with the Indianapolis Colts as an assistant coach.
- WIU All-American **Bryan Cox** enters his ninth year in the NFL as an assistant coach. He is the defensive line coach for the Atlanta Falcons.
- San Diego Chargers punter **Mike Scifres** begins his 12th year as the team's punter. One of the top players in the NFL, Scifres has a net punt average of 39 yards or better in six of the last seven years.
- Carolina Panthers linebacker **Jason Williams** begins his seventh year in the NFL and fifth with the Panthers. He played in 11 games last season.

**ALL-TIME AT HANSON FIELD:** On September 23, 1950, Hanson Field was dedicated and became the home of Leatherneck Football... Now in the 64th year, Western has compiled a 227-113-7 record at home. In 49 of those years Western finished at least .500 at home, including a perfect 6-0 record at home in 2010.

**HANSON FIELD TOUGH ON NON-CONFERENCE TEAMS:** Playing at Hanson Field has been a tough thing for non-conference teams in recent years... The Leathernecks are 30-4 against non-MVFC teams since 1999, including a current eight-game win streak following a 2-0 mark in 2013 and season-opening win over Valparaiso this season.

**NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE:** The Leathernecks will face four teams from two conferences during the non-conference slate - Valparaiso/Drake from the Pioneer League, and Wisconsin/Northwestern from the Big Ten... Western improved to 7-0 versus the Pioneer, with half of those wins coming since 2010... The Leathernecks are 0-6 all-time versus the Big Ten, including two losses versus the Badgers (1991, 2006).

**SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS AGAINST FCS:** The Leathernecks have had great success in season-opening games against Football Championship Subdivision opponents... Western's 45-6 victory over Valparaiso marked the 10th win in the last 11 opportunities (only loss 20-6 at Sam Houston State in 2011).

**DAVIS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN:** Senior defensive back **Martinez Davis** picked up a preseason honor, being named The Sports Network Third Team All-American. It's the first time since 2010 that a Leatherneck received a preseason national accolade... Davis leads all Leathernecks with eight career interceptions and holds the all-time record with three INT returns for a touchdown. He's also tied for the WIU season record with two returns for a score (2012 season).

**SEVENTEEN STARTERS, 36 LETTERWINNERS RETURN:** Second year head coach Bob Nielson returns 36 letterwinners and 17 starters for the 2014 campaign... Eight starters are back on both sides of the ball in addition to punter/placekicker **Nathan Knuffman**... Save for quarterback, every position group returns at least two starters.

**WIU PLAY 26 FIRST-TIMERS:** Twenty-six Leathernecks in the Valpo game took the field for the first time in a WIU uniform. Of those 26, 13 were freshmen (including four true-freshmen)... The true-freshmen were defensive backs **Aaron Diggs** (4 tackles), and **David Griffith** (5 tackles), kicker **Luke Otto** (63 yd avg on 5 kick-offs) and long snapper **Gabe Burkhardt**.

**TWO NAMED PRESEASON ALL-MVFC, WIU PICKED NINTH:** In a vote by the Missouri Valley Football Conference coaches, media and sports information directors, two Leathernecks earned Preseason All-MVFC honors. **Martinez Davis** (Sr/DB) was voted to the pre-season squad while **Kevin Kintzel** (Sr/LB) was chosen Honorable Mention... Davis earned Second Team All-MVFC honors last year while Kintzel was Honorable Mention... Kintzel has the active lead with 16.0 tackles for a loss, three forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries... Davis leads all Leathernecks with 14 pass break-ups and eight interceptions... Western was picked to finish ninth in the preseason poll.

**TOP 10 DEFENSE RETURNS KEY PLAYERS:** Western Illinois made a significant jump from year one under defensive coordinator Brian Ward to year two, going from the 100s in total defense to seventh last year. Western also led the Missouri Valley Football Conference with a 149.0 pass yards allowed average, good for third in the nation... In all, eight starters are back from last season and key returners in every position.

**NATIONS BEST AGAIN:** After week one, Western stands among the 'Top 30' nationally in rushing defense (29th/103 ypg), scoring defense (8th/6.0), turnover margin (12th/1.0), total defense (25th/277.0), and passing efficiency defense (30th/96.05).

**SECONDARY RETURNS IN TACT:** One of the most experienced position groups will be the defensive backs, with likely all four starters being seniors with extensive game experience... Cornerback **Martinez Davis** (30 GP/104 tackles/8 INT) and safety **Jonathon Rollins** (34 GP/167 tackles) return at their position... **David McDaniel** (35 GP/150 tackles/7 INT) moved from the other safety position to opposite cornerback... **Dallas Nichols** (13 GP/59 tackles) set a WIU record with a 97-yard interception return for a touchdown in the 2013 season-opener... Two more seniors could see significant playing time in the secondary - **Richard Chungong** (13 GP/3 pass break-ups) and **Marquette Privott** (9 GP/5 tackles)... The secondary has accounted for 16 career interceptions.

**LEATHERNECK LINEBACKERS:** With the return of a healthy **J.J. Raffelson**, all three linebackers return to the starting lineup in 2014. The three starters were all part of the 2011 signing class... Senior **Kevin Kintzel** was a preseason All-MVFC selection. He set a WIU mark with three defensive touchdowns scored in a year. He tied for the team lead in tackles (74) and interceptions (3) while pacing the defense in tackles for a loss (11.0)... Fellow senior **Luke Venegoni**, like Kintzel, played as a true-freshman. He's made 106 tackles in 34 career games... Raffelson was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award (nation's top freshman) in 2012. He averaged just under 10 tackles per game in his six contests last year, and is the career active leader with 171 total tackles... The Leathernecks were able to redshirt **Brett Taylor**, **Adam Brott** and **Demetrius Allen**.

**RAFFELSON POPS THE QUESTION:** Not only was **J.J. Raffelson** able to celebrate a team victory following the Valparaiso game, he had another reason to celebrate post-game... The junior linebacker proposed to his girlfriend Heather Smith (four-year letterwinner for the WIU Volleyball team) on the field after the game, and she said yes.

**DEFENSIVE LINE FAMILIAR AND NEW FACES:** Several returning WIU players are back along the defensive line... **Chip Holtschlag** (24 GP/7.5TFL), **Eddy Holtschlag** (21 GP/8.0 TFL), **Jeremy Curry** (24 GP/2 FR) and **Gino Durley, Jr.** all saw significant playing time during their career, and Eddy is the only non-senior in the group... In the interior, transfer **Kris Harley** (Virginia Tech) joined in the spring as did JUCO transfer **John LaChapelle**... Juniors **Gavin Ricketts** (24 GP) and **Jean-Marc Charles** (16 GP) both played as true-freshmen... The Leathernecks were able to redshirt four freshmen last year: **Mick Nelson**, **Hollis Henry**, **Jordan Veloz** and **Colin Olson**.

**100 CAREER TACKLES:** Six current Leathernecks have eclipsed 100 career tackles and are on the verge of 200-plus... Junior **J.J. Raffelson** took over the career active lead with 171 tackles... Senior **Jonathon Rollins** is next with 167 stops in 34 games... Seniors **David McDaniel** (150), **Kevin Kintzel** (125) and **Martinez Davis** (104) are next... Senior **Luke Venegoni** joined the group after the Valparaiso game, now with 106 all-time.

**TURNOVERS THE KEY:** Western picked up where it left off last year in the turnover margin category... The Leathernecks recorded an interception while not committing a miscue in the opener... Last year Western ranked 16th nationally in turnover margin and was 12th in turnovers gained... Since the start of 2013, when the team commits fewer turnovers than the opponent Western is 5-2. However, when the turnovers were equal (0-2) or WIU made more miscues (0-4) the squad went winless... On four occasions Western has not committed a turnover, and the team owns a 3-1 in those games.

**TRIO SELECTED TO CFPA WATCH LIST:** Three Leathernecks earned a spot on the preseason College Football Performance Awards watch list at their respective position... **Kevin Kintzel** was selected at linebacker. The senior, a six-time weekly CFPA Honorable Mention pick, was the 2013 recipient of the CFPA Linebacker award... Defensive back preseason All-American **Martinez Davis** was named by the CFPA, as was **J.C. Baker** at running back.

**DEPTH AT RUNNING BACK:** One of the strengths this year will be the talent returning at running back... JUCO transfer **J.C. Baker** made an immediate impact, stepping in to start the final six games. He rushed for the 10th-most yards in program history - 1,149 yards and was runner-up as MVFC 'Newcomer of the Year'. He enters his senior year on the CFPA Watch List for Running Backs... Fellow senior **Nikko Watson** is approaching 2,000 career rushing yards and the career 'Top 10' list in that category... They have combined for 13 career 100-yard rushing games... Junior **Kyle Hammonds** is a threat rushing the ball and should also see time with kickoff returns... Sophomore **Devon Moore** did not see any game action last year due to an injury... **Devon Sanders** redshirted last year.

**WATSON FOR 100:** **Nikko Watson** enters his senior year ranked 10th all-time in Western history with his six 100-yard rushing game... He is two shy of teammate **J.C. Baker**, and one away former teammate Caulton Ray and Brian Knuckles for a tie for eighth place.

**DEBUT HAS BEEN KEY FOR WATSON:** For **Nikko Watson**, his first game played of a season has been a success as three of his six 100-yard rushing games occurred in a debut... After burning his redshirt year late in 2011, Watson's debut at Youngstown State resulted in 149 yards on a career-high 30 carries... The 2012 season opener against Butler saw Watson run for 109 yards on 25 attempts... Watson opened the 2013 season against Hampton with 108 yards on 27 attempts.

**WATSON NEARING 'TOP 10':** **Nikko Watson** has rushed for 1,680 yards in his three-year career. The senior remains 247 yards shy of tying Dre Gibbs for 10th place in the Leatherneck history books.

**BAKER MAKES IMMEDIATE IMPACT:** Senior **J.C. Baker** made an immediate impact for the Leathernecks last season after transferring from Arizona Western CC... He tied for sixth among the Western season 'Top 10' leaders for most 100-yard rushing games... Baker recorded yet another 100-yard game, 137 versus Valparaiso in the opener... He moved into a tie for fifth place all-time with eight in 13 career games.

**FIFTH FASTEST TO 1,000: J.C. Baker** rushed for five yards in his first attempt at Indiana State in game 11 of the 2013 season. That moved him past 1,000 yards in his inaugural season with the Leathernecks... Needing just 177 attempts to reach that milestone put Baker as the fifth-fastest in program history to record 1,000 yards... No other first-year Division I player in the program's history ran for 1,000 yards in a season.

**BAKER CAN CATCH THE BALL TOO: J.C. Baker** showed his versatility last season by catching 32 passes (tied for third on the team) totaling 183 yards. He ended the year ninth on the WIU season 'Top 10' for most receiving yards by a running back... Baker caught one pass in the Valpo game, and it went for a 40-yard touchdown, a career-long reception.

**NORVELL RETURNS AT QUARTERBACK: Sophomore Trenton Norvell** was the only freshman in the MVFC to start every game at quarterback. He set three WIU freshman records - touchdowns, completions, and attempts - and ranked among the 'Top 50' nationally in TD passes.

**NORVELL SETS CAREER-HIGHS:** In the Valpo opener, **Trenton Norvell** set career-highs in passing - completion percentage (.714), yards (320) and tied a high in touchdown passes (4)... He completed 20-of-28 passes for his first-ever 300-yard passing game... It marked the first time in three years a Leatherneck QB threw for 300 yards, and Norvell's yardage was the most since Matt Barr at Southern Illinois four years ago.

**QB NAMED CFPA HONORABLE MENTION:** For his efforts in the Valparaiso game, quarterback **Trenton Norvell** was an Honorable Mention selection by the College Football Performance Awards. It marks the first time in his career receiving the CFPA weekly accolade.

**SOPHOMORE LEADING THE MVFC: Trenton Norvell** is leading or sharing the Missouri Valley Football Conference lead in four categories after week one... Norvell is tied for first thanks to a mistake-free effort against Valpo... His 214.6 passing efficiency (2nd), four passing touchdowns (6th), and 24 points responsible for (8th) lead the MVFC... Norvell stands second in the Valley in passing yards.

**MORE DEPTH AT WIDE RECEIVER:** WIU returns the top four reception leaders from 2013, and four of the top five in yards (including RB J.C. Baker)... **Joey Borsellino** set a WIU freshman record with 41 catches, and had the second-most yards by a rookie with 465. He caught three TDs... **Lance Lenoir, Jr.** was the one who beat Borsellino for the freshman yardage record, totaling 489, and he finished second in freshman receptions for a season (39). Lenoir's seven TD receptions tied for ninth in WIU history, and on a national level he was second in the country in TD catches. On those lines however, no other true-freshman caught more TDs than Lenoir... **Borsellino and Lenoir were the only two true-freshmen to play for Western in 2013...** Senior **Hi-C Scott** averaged a team-best 14.3 yards per catch (32 rec/458 yards) while hauling in three TDs... They are the only three wide receivers returning with a catch from 2013... **J'Vaughn Williams** moved from quarterback to wide receiver in the spring... **Cleveland Clark, Jason Townsend,** QB turned WR **Nick Schroeder** and **Adam Hoogerwerf** all redshirted.

**TRIO JOIN RECORD BOOKS:** Western Illinois accomplished a rare feat in 2013, as three different receivers finished a game with 100-plus yards... It's the fifth time in program history that feat was accomplished, and first occurrence since 2009... **Lance Lenoir, Jr., Hi-C Scott** and **Joey Borsellino** accomplished the feat... Lenoir caught seven passes for 105 yards and two scores at Illinois State... Borsellino had 110 yards on 10 catches versus Southern Illinois... Scott totaled 104 yards on four catches with two TDs against Missouri State. He also finished five yards shy of 100 against Quincy in week two.

**SCOTT MATCHES CAREER-HIGH:** Senior **Hi-C Scott** caught three touchdown passes last year, two coming in the Missouri State game. He matched his personal-high when he hauled in a 17-yard and 38-yard TD reception versus Valpo... Scott averaged 16.8 yards on his four catches.

**LEATHERNECK TIGHT ENDS:** Western added four tight ends during the recruiting season... They join juniors **Taylor Hill** and **Larry Harris** as returners with game experience... Hill started 10 games last year, finishing with 52 yards on seven receptions. His first receptions did not come until game seven. Hill made a 7-yard catch in the opener versus Valpo... Harris started once in his 11 games played last year... He caught a career-high two passes against Valpo, one went for his first collegiate touchdown... **Cole Griffin** joined the team for spring drills after spending the last two years at Santa Ana CC. He will have two years of eligibility remaining... **Ben Arnold** joined the team over the summer after transferring from Western Michigan. He redshirted last year and will have four years of playing eligibility.

**JUMP IN NATIONAL RANKINGS:** Following the 2012 campaign, Western ranked 75th in sacks allowed and last of 121 teams in total offense. The '13 season saw Western jump up to 46th in sacks allowed and 92nd in total offense... The passing offense numbers jumped up nearly 30 spots while the rushing offense increased by 34 spots nationally.

**RETURNERS ON THE O-LINE:** Western returns four players with starting experience along the offensive line... Junior guard **Brandon De La Cruz** leads the offense with 19 starts in his career. He moved to center during the off-season... Fellow junior **Ryan Ricketts** (11 starts) moved from center to guard... Another junior, **Sean Sullivan**, made four starts last year at guard... Senior **Sam Kachanuk** started nine times last year and 12 in his three-year career. He has played mainly at guard in his career... Sophomores **Eddie Atkinson** and **Matt Zobrist** both lettered as redshirt-freshmen... JUCO transfer **Tyler Bode** joined the team at the spring semester and he is slated as a starter at tackle... Fellow JUCO transfer **Nick Ziegenbein** is the tallest Leatherneck on the roster at 6-9, 345... Western redshirted six players last year: **Josh Baldus**, **Jordan Detweiler**, **Jacob Judd**, **Joe Pyszka**, **James Torgerson** and **Mitchell Wallin**.

**KNUFFMAN RETURNS IN DUAL ROLE:** Sophomore **Nathan Knuffman** took over last year as the starting punter and place kicker... He converted 3-of-8 field goals, two coming in the finale at Northern Iowa, and made 30-of-34 extra points... Knuffman punted 74 times for a 35.2 average. He placed 21 inside the 20-yard line and kicked seven that went 50 or more yards... He had eight touchbacks on his 50 kickoff attempts... **Ryan Mulhern** redshirted last year. He can work at either punter or place kick... True-freshman punter **Luke Otto** signed with the program.

**KNUFFMAN SETS CAREER-HIGH:** **Nathan Knuffman** kicked a career-high six extra points in the opening win versus Valpo... His previous high was four last season... Knuffman booted a 24-yard field goal and on his only punt attempt had a 41-yarder (net yards).

**ALL IN THE FAMILY:** Western has two sets of brothers on this year's roster... Senior **Chip Holtschlag** and junior **Eddy** are twins. Chip was forced to burn his redshirt late in 2011 due to injuries along the defensive line. Eddy made his first-ever start in the season-opener... Redshirt-freshman **Josh Smith** was joined this fall by his younger brother **Timothy**. Josh made four tackles in his first game while Timothy is expected to redshirt.

**MACOMB, Ill.** – A lightning delay to start the game did not dampen Western Illinois in its season-opener. WIU scored on its opening drive and cruised to a 45-6 season-opening football win over Valparaiso at Hanson Field. The Fighting Leathernecks won their season-opener for the third straight season and fifth time in their last six.

**Trenton Norvell** set a career-high throwing for 320 yards on 20-of-28 passing. He matched a career-high throwing four touchdowns. It marked the first time in three years that a Leatherneck quarterback threw for more than 300 yards in a game.

**J.C. Baker** registered his eighth career 100-yard rushing game, totaling 137 yards on 17 attempts. His two total TDs (1 rushing/1 receiving) matched a personal-best.

**Hi-C Scott** also matched a career-high with two touchdown receptions, netting 67 yards on four catches. Norvell completed a pass to nine different receivers. **Joey Borsellino** also caught four passes for 59 yards. **Lance Lenoir** had 53 yards and **Adam Hoogerwerf** recorded 40 yards.

**David McDaniel** added a team-high nine tackles with his interception. **Luke Venegoni** had eight tackles while **J.J. Raffelson** and **Brett Taylor** added seven stops. Taylor, in his first collegiate game, also forced a fumble.
