Western won games in the regular season for the first time since 2003. The Leathernecks are also looking for their eighth-ever playoff win.

The Leathernecks are making their 11th trip all-time to the FCS Playoffs. Western has made the postseason in two of the last three years.

THE SERIES: Saturday's FCS Playoffs first-round matchup between Western Illinois and Weber State is the third meeting all-time between the schools. The Leathernecks went to Ogden in 1975 to beat the Wildcats by a final of 19-10. Western Illinois then edged Weber State 21-19 the next year in Macomb.

THE RANKINGS: Western Illinois finished the regular season ranked ninth in the STATS FCS 'Top 25' poll and 10th in the FCS Coaches poll. Weber State placed 11th in the STATS FCS 'Top 25' poll, and eighth in the FCS Coaches poll.

LEATHERNECKS RETURN TO THE POSTSEASON: Western Illinois is making its 11th all-time trip to the FCS Playoffs, where they will face Weber State in the first round. The Leathernecks' postseason appearance is their second in the last three seasons, the program's best run of success since going to three playoffs in four campaigns from 2000-03. Only 13 FCS schools can boast more postseason appearances in their history than Western Illinois. During their last trip to the FCS Playoffs in 2015, the Leathernecks knocked off Dayton 24-7 on the road before succumbing at Illinois State 36-19 in the second round. Western Illinois is 7-10 (.412) all-time in the postseason.

CHARLIE FISHER

A finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, given to the FCS Coach of the Year, **Charlie Fisher** is in his second year in charge of the storied Leatherneck Football program. The Leathernecks look to take the next step during year two and "Finish This Fight" (program's motto started during the off-season).

The Leathernecks jumped out to a 3-0 start during the 2016 season, winning all three non-conference games, including a 28-23 FBS win at Northern Illinois - the program's first since 2003 - and got off to a 6-2 mark. Western jumped to as high as seventh in the national rankings in 2016. Two players were named All-American under Fisher, wide receiver Lance Lenoir, Jr. (all-time leading receiver in WIU history and most catches in MVFC history) and

linebacker Brett Taylor, who finished seventh in the Buck Buchanan Award voting.

Western Illinois becomes the second head coaching stop for Fisher. From 1993-97 he was the head coach at West Georgia and posted a 36-17 record with a share of the 1997 Gulf South Conference championship and two postseason appearances. He coached 45 All-Gulf South Conference performers and seven All-Americans.

With more than 30 years of college coaching experience, Fisher spent time as an assistant coach at: Richmond, Penn State, Miami (Ohio), Vanderbilt, Temple, North Carolina State, West Georgia, Lenoir-Rhyne, Ole Miss and Eastern Kentucky. He was a graduate assistant on the 1982 Eastern Kentucky team that won the FCS national championship.

Fisher earned his bachelor's degree from Springfield College and a master's degree at Eastern Kentucky. He and his wife Julie have two sons: Brian and Brett.

FISHER'S 2016 START: Over the past 60 years, Charlie Fisher became the eighth head coach in Western history to win his debut. The Leathernecks' captured a 38-21 season-opening win at in-state rival Eastern Illinois... Fisher joined Don Patterson and Bill Shanahan as the only coach to win his debut when playing on the road in that same span... Having started his first year as a Leatherneck 3-0, Fisher joined three others to start their WIU career at least 3-0: Patterson (1999), Shanahan (1976, 4-0) and Wes Stevens (1954, 4-0-2).

ANOTHER UPPER DIVISION WIN: WIU head coach Charlie Fisher notched his fourth victory versus an upper-division program following Western's 2017 win at Coastal Carolina. He also has beaten Northern Illinois at WIU. While at Division II West Georgia he secured a 15-14 win over then-FCS Georgia Southern in 1994 and victory at Jacksonville State in 1996.

FISHER'S NFL CONNECTIONS: Charlie Fisher has coached numerous players that have gone onto NFL careers. Those current players include: Jordan Matthews (WR) Buffalo Bills; Christian Hackenberg (QB) NY Jets; Matt McGloin (QB) Philadelphia Eagles; Zac Dysert (QB) Dallas Cowboys (currently on IR); Jay Cutler (QB) Miami Dolphins (had as Pass Game Coordinator at Vandy); Lance Lenoir (WR) Dallas Cowboys; Brian Brown (WR) Dallas Cowboys; Tyler Ferguson (QB) Tennessee Titans...

Fisher has coached three other notable NFL players who turned in impressive pro careers, including: **Torry Holt** (WR) NC State and Rams; **Koren Robinson** (WR) NC State and Seahawks, Packers; **Earl Bennett** (WR) Vanderbilt and Bears

Charlie Fisher earned his bachelor's degree from Springfield College. Another famous alum from Springfield (Mass.) College is WIU former head coach and Athletic Director Ray 'Rock' Hanson... Western's field is named after Rock Hanson.

WHAT IS A FIGHTING LEATHERNECK?: Western Illinois holds the distinction of being the only non-military institution to officially have its nickname derived from a branch of the military service. The school began use of the Marine Corps' official nickname, "The Fighting Leathernecks," in 1927 when then-athletic director and head baseball, basketball and football coach Ray "Rock" Hanson was granted permission by the U.S. Navy, based on his status as a Marine hero, to use the Marine's official seal, bulldog mascot and nickname. He still remains third all-time at Western in victories with 56 in 16 years as head coach (56-60-12) from 1926-41. He posted a winning record six years and a .500 mark during another season. The 1939 team went 5-1-1 and won the Little 19 Conference championship.




NFL CONNECTIONS: Western Illinois continues its tradition as one of the top NCAA FCS programs with a pipeline to the NFL... Players and coaches from Leatherneck history have won 17 Super Bowl Championships.

- · Mike Wagner won four Super Bowls with the Pittsburgh Steelers and Steel Curtain era.
- Rodney Harrison won a pair of Super Bowls with the New England Patriots in three appearances all-time. He now works in-studio at NBC Sports during Sunday Night Football Night.
- **Don Beebe** is just one of three players to have played in **SIX** Super Bowls in his career. He was part of the four consecutive appearances by Buffalo and went 1-1 with the Green Bay Packers. Beebe has one of the most famous Super Bowl plays when he raced down the field and chased down Dallas Cowboys lineman Leon Lett at the 1-yard line and knocked the ball away to keep Dallas from scoring a touchdown.

From 1957-59, former WIU head coach **Lou Saban** had on his staff **Joe Collier** and standout WIU player **Robert 'Red' Miller**.

- Saban was the inaugural coach for the Boston Patriots, then later the Buffalo Bills. He was the 1964 AFL 'Coach of the Year'. Saban spent four years as coach of the Denver Broncos and would later come back and coach the Bills.
- Miller, a three-time MVP for the Leathernecks, would later coach the Denver Broncos in the 1977 Super Bowl and three consecutive playoff appearances.
- Collier joined Saban in Boston and was promoted to the Buffalo Bills head coach in 1966. He took the Bills to the AFL Championship game that season. He later worked as an assistant with the Denver Broncos, hired first by Saban then later Miller as defensive coordinator. He coached in three Super Bowls with the Broncos. Collier was the mastermind behind the Broncos defense known at the time as the 'Orange Crush Defense'.
- Former All-American **John Teerlinck** won two Super Bowls with the Denver Broncos as an assistant coach and another Super Bowl with the Indianapolis Colts as an assistant coach.
- WIU All-American **Bryan Cox** worked 11 years in the NFL as an assistant coach.
- Mike Scifres spent 13 years with San Diego as the starting punter and was recently announced as a member of the 2017 WIU Athletics Hall of Fame Class.
- Western's all-time leading wide receiver **Lance Lenoir** is currently on the practice squad with the Dallas Cowboys.
- Offensive Lineman **Frank Winters** won a Super Bowl with the Green Bay Packers and was inducted into the Packers Hall of Fame. In September 2016 he received the George Connor Lifetime Achievement Award from the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS: A very balanced team. Weber State ranks 11th in the nation in scoring defense (16.6 ppg) and 12th in scoring offense (35.7 ppg). Offensively, the Wildcats have thrived off their running attack, 196.5 rushing yards per game, which ranks 25th in the FCS. Four different Wildcats have run for at least 350 yards, with Treshawn Garrett's 671 leading the pack. He has registered 5.6 yards per carry and six touchdowns. Quarterback Stefan Cantwell has totaled 24 scores, 18 coming through the air against only five interceptions. He has completed 63 percent of his passes for 2,255 yards. His leading receiver is Andrew Vollert, who has caught 44 passes for 557 yards and three touchdowns. Weber State boasts the top rushing defense in the Sun Belt, yielding just 117.3 yards per game. LeGrand Toia is the team's leading tackler with 61 stops, 8.0 tackles for a loss and 5.0 sacks. McKay Murphy tops the Wildcats with 13.0 tackles for a loss, and Jordan Preator has picked off a team-high four passes. In the return game, Rashid Shaheed has taken two kicks back for touchdowns and is averaging 31.7 yards per kick return.

BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD FINALIST

Middle linebacker Brett Taylor is a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award, given to the National Defensive Player of the Year. He finished seventh in the voting last year, and was one of three linebackers among the top seven point total leaders - and the only one who was not a senior.

This season, Taylor leads the nation with 13.6 tackles per game, 150 total tackles and 90 assisted stops. Taylor has registered double-digit tackles in all but three games in 2017, and dating back to last year, has now at least tied for the team lead in stops in 15 of the last 16 contests, including 10 of the 11 games this season. His 90 assisted stops are the third-most in a single season in school history.

Through 11 games this year, the Macomb native has won four Missouri Valley Football Conference Defensive Player of the Week awards. The first came after he finished with a game-high eight tackles, two for a loss, with a gurterback hurry at Coastal Carolina. The very next week, he won again by tying a program record with 28 stops, 2.5 for a loss. Taylor's also earned the award after 16 tackles, two for a loss, a sack and two pass breakups against Missouri State. He then made 16 more tackles, one for a loss, to win the honor after the regular season finale against Southern Illinois.

TAYLOR MATCHES PROGRAM RECORD: During Western Illinois' contest on Sept. 30, 2017, Brett Taylor racked up 28 tackles, matching NFL great Rodney Harrison (at Western Kentucky, 1993) for the school record in tackles in a single game. Those 28 stops rank as the fifth-most in MVFC history. Taylor's 18 assisted tackles are the second-most in any game in program history.

WESTERN ILLINOIS CAREER RANKINGS: Brett Taylor is one of four Leatherneck players all-time with 400 career tackles (457). The Macomb native ranks third all-time in school history in career stops, 23 from tying Lee Russell (2000-03) for second. His 260 solo tackles are fourth all-time in WIU history. Pat Bayers (1979-82) ranks third with 261 career solo tackles.

PRESEASON HONORS FOR TAYLOR: During the off-season Brett Taylor was named to the STATS and HERO Sports Preseason All-American First Team. STATS also tabbed Taylor as one of the Top 10 FCS Players to Watch in 2017. In early August Taylor was one of 21 defensive players nationally to earn a spot on the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List.

WALTER CAMP RECOGNITION: When Brett Taylor was named to the 2016 Walter Camp Football Foundation All-America team, he became the 14th Leatherneck student-athlete all-time to earn the award. The last time a Leatherneck earned that prestigious honor was Kyle Glazier back in 2010. He was the only non-senior among the three linebackers selected.

FCS ADA ACADEMIC ALL-STAR REPEATS: Brett Taylor and senior offensive lineman Jacob Judd were two of the 44 student-athletes selected to the FCS Athletic Directors Association Academic All-Star. Both repeated as FCS ADA Academic All-Stars from the 2015 season. The Leathernecks have been represented with an Academic All-Star six times in the last seven years.

CRAZY EIGHTS: Western Illinois closed the regular year with a 28-14 win over Southern Illinois. The victory was the Leathernecks' eighth of the campaign, marking the program's most regular season wins since also securing eight in 2003. In the first round of the FCS Playoffs, Western Illinois will also be looking for their eighth postseason win in program history. A triumph would mark the Leathernecks' ninth win of the season, which would also be their first nine-win campaign since 2003.

FISHER NAMED FINALIST FOR COACH OF THE YEAR: Western Illinois head coach Charlie Fisher has been selected Monday as a finalist for the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS Coach of the Year. Fisher has led the Leathernecks to an 8-3 record and a berth in the FCS Playoffs, where Western Illinois will travel to Weber State for a first-round matchup at 3 p.m. on Saturday (Nov. 25). The Leathernecks have recorded eight regular season wins for the first time since 2003. The second-year head coach at Western Illinois has thrived on the road, posting a 10-3 record away from Macomb. The Leathernecks' six road wins this season is a program record, and Western Illinois began this campaign with three road wins in their first three contests for the very first time in program history. One of those away victories was a 52-10 throttling of Coastal Carolina on Sept. 23, which thanks to a 28-23 triumph at Northern Illinois last year, gave the Leathernecks back-to-back FBS wins for the first time since 2002-03. Western Illinois is the second head-coaching stop for Fisher, who is 14-8 during his tenure with the Leathernecks. From 1993-97, Fisher was the head coach at West Georgia, where he posted a 36-17 record with a share of the 1997 Gulf South Conference Championship and two postseason appearances.

DEFENSE AGAINST THE DARK ARTS: Western Illinois followed up a five-sack game at Illinois State, their most since recording six in the 2015 FCS Playoffs at Dayton, with five more sacks against Indiana State. A year after recording just 13 sacks, the Leathernecks have now put together a 30-sack campaign this year. Western Illinois' 2.73 sacks per game rank 24th nationally. The Leathernecks also had 11 tackles for a loss against the Sycamores, their second straight contest with double-digit TFLs and their fourth this season. Western Illinois is compiling 8.0 tackles for loss per game, 14th in the FCS.

ROAD TRIP: In the 113 prior seasons of Western Illinois football before this campaign, the Leathernecks had never won more than five road games in one season. However, Western Illinois' 45-0 shutout of Indiana State marked their program-record sixth away triumph this season. During head coach **Charlie Fisher's** tenure, the Leathernecks are now 10-3 on the road.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: Western Illinois racked up 45 points in their victory at Indiana State, marking the fourth time this season that the Leathernecks have tallied 40 or more points. It also represented the sixth occasion with at least 38 points scored. The last time Western Illinois scored 40 or more points in a game that many times in a season was during the 2010 campaign when the Leathernecks mustered five outbursts or 40-plus points.

THIRD EYE BLIND: The Leathernecks' defense has limited opponents to just 4-for-23 (17.4 percent) on third downs over the last two weeks, continuing a trend of Western Illinois being one of the best third down teams in the nation this season. The Leathernecks rank 16th nationally in third-down defense by holding opponents to a 32.2 percent success rate. Meanwhile, on offense, Western Illinois' 43.2 percent conversion rate on third down is 20th in the FCS.

TAKE IT AWAY: Western Illinois' +15 turnover margin is the best mark in the MVFC and fourth-best in the nation. The Leathernecks' 26 takeaways are sixth-highest nationally, and Western's 11 giveaways are the 10th-lowest in the FCS. In fact, the Leathernecks are outscoring opponents 96-17 in points off turnovers. Western Illinois has now forced at least one turnover in 51 of their last 58 games. They have multiple takeaways in 18 of the last 29 contests, including 29 total over the past 12 games.

POINTS OF VIEW: Backing Western Illinois' 8-3 record is a strong +146 point differential (391-245), meaning the Leathernecks have been 13.3 points per game better than their opponents this season. Interestingly enough, Western Illinois has been significantly better in the second half than the first half this year. The Leathernecks have narrowly outscored their opponents by a 146-124 in the first half this year. However, over the final 30 minutes of contests, that figure has swelled to 245-121. Thus, the Leathernecks average 22.3 points per second half, and yield just 11.0.

CATCH A STAR: Wide receiver **Jaelon Acklin** entered this season with 21 career catches for 364 yards and two receiving touchdowns. However, the senior has blown up in 2017, catching 74 balls for 1,253 yards and 10 receiving touchdowns. The Mountain View, Mo., native is fourth in the nation in receiving yards (1,253), sixth in both receiving yards per game (113.9) and total touchdowns (14), 11th in receptions per game (6.7), 12th in all-purpose yards per game (134.64) and 13th in receiving touchdowns (10). Acklin's 1,253 receiving yards are a single-season school record. His 74 receptions are fourth-most in a single season in program history, three from sole possession of second and 10 from sole possession of the top spot. Acklin's 10 touchdowns are tied for the fifth-most in a single season in WIU history, two from tying for second and four from tying for first.

WE'VE BEEN HAVING A RECORD YEAR: In addition to Jaelon Acklin, several other Leathernecks have entered single-season 'Top 10' lists. Quarterback Sean McGuire has passed for 2,650 yards, the seventh-most in a single season in school history. He is 242 away from sole possession of sixth place and 265 from passing his 2,914 yards from last season. The Franklin, Wis., native's 24 touchdown passes are tied for third in a single season in program history, three away from tying Matt Barr's 2010 record. McGuire's 198 completions place eighth and his 303 attempts rank in a tie for 10th. On defense, Brett Taylor's 90 assisted tackles are the third-most in a single season in WIU history, while Xavier Rowe's 11 breakups rank in a tie for 10th.

RED ALERT: Western Illinois has taken advantage of nearly every opportunity when bringing the ball inside the opponent's 20-yard line this season. The Leathernecks are third in the Missouri Valley Football Conference and rank 21st nationally in red zone scoring at 87.2 percent. Western Illinois has only missed in the red zone five times this season in 39 trips inside the opponents' 20-yard line. The best red zone performance of the season for the Leathernecks came at Coastal Carolina, where they finished 7-for-7 in the red zone.

McGUIRE, ACKLIN NAMED TO WATCH LIST: Western Illinois quarterback Sean McGuire and wide receiver Jaelon Acklin have each been named to the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) Midseason Watch List for the FCS National Performer of the Year Trophy. The Leathernecks are the only team to have two players on the list, which is made up of five student-athletes. McGuire ranks seventh nationally in passing efficiency (161.2), eighth in yards per attempt (8.77), 11th in completion percentage (65.2), 13th in passing touchdowns (24), 20th in passing yards (2,650), 22nd in passing yards per game (240.9) and 32nd in total offense per game (244.9). Overall, the junior quarterback has fired 24 touchdowns against six interceptions. Acklin is fourth in the nation in receiving yards (1,253), sixth in both receiving yards per game (113.9) and total touchdowns (14), 11th in receptions per game (6.7), 12th in all-purpose yards per game (134.64) and 13th in receiving touchdowns (10).

McGuire's **ON FIRE**: With 6,723 career passing yards, Western Illinois quarterback **Sean McGuire** is just 277 passing yards away from becoming just the third Leathernecks signal caller to reach 7,000 career passing yards. He is currently in fourth place in school history in that category, 254 from moving into the top three all-time. Additionally, McGuire's 220.4 yards of total offense per game is the best in program history, with his 210.1 career passing yards per contest placing second. He was named MVFC co-Offensive and Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 24 and Oct. 8, respectively. Additionally, against South Dakota, McGuire's 441 passing yards were the third-most in a single game in program history, with his 31 completions one away from tying the record.

RACK UP THE YAC: Through the first three contests of the year, Western Illinois registered 19 plays of at least 20 yards, a rate of 6.3 per game. However, over their last eight contests, the Leathernecks have compiled 73 plays of 20-plus yards, an average of 9.1 per game. Wide receiver **Jaelon Acklin** has been responsible for 29 plays of 20 or more yards, with 25 of those coming on passing plays. He has 11 touchdowns of at least 20 yards.

DEFENSE MECHANISMS: Western Illinois' historic 45-0 win at Indiana State saw the Leathernecks pitch their first shutout since 2010. In the effort, the Leathernecks held Indiana State to just 43 rushing yards on 36 carries, the third game this year that the Leathernecks have held an opponent below 50 rushing yards. Prior to this season, Western Illinois hadn't had such a contest since 2014. Western Illinois also forced Sycamores quarterback Cade Sparks to just 8-of-17 passing for just 90 yards and two interceptions, marking the first time since 2013 that Western's defense kept an opponent below 100 passing yards. The Leathernecks followed that up by holding Southern Illinois to just 62 passing yards. In total, Indiana State recorded just 133 total yards, the first time since 2010 that Western Illinois held an opponent below 200 yards of total offense. Prior to a Saluki touchdown with 6:06 left in the season finale, the Leathernecks had gone more than 150 minutes without allowing a point.

FIRST SINCE 1935: You'd have to go back all the way to 1935 to find the last time Western opened the year with three consecutive road games. That year, the Leathernecks opened at Parsons, at Knox and at Bradley. Western began 2017 at Tennessee Tech before taking a plane flight west to Northern Arizona. After a bye week, they finished their non-conference slate with a plane flight east to Coastal Carolina. The total amount of miles traveled round-trip in non-conference play was 5,730 according to Google Maps.

TORGERSON EARNS MVFC HONORS: Right tackle **James Torgerson** earned Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Lineman of the Week honors following Western Illinois' 31-14 victory at Illinois State. A native of Springfield, Ill., Torgerson graded out at 93 percent and had seven pancakes with zero sacks allowed. The senior paved the way for Western Illinois to run for 118 yards on 3.7 yards per carry, far above the season averages for Illinois State (77 rushing yards allowed per game, 2.5 yards per carry) coming in. Torgerson's efforts also helped quarterback **Sean McGuire** pass for 288 yards and two touchdowns on a 63.3 percent completion rating.

ACKLIN ENJOYS CAREER DAY: On Sept. 30 against South Dakota, Jaelon Acklin set WIU single-game records with an extraordinary 19 catches for 343 yards. The yardage set an MVFC record, and is the fourth-most of any player in a single game in FCS history. The Mountain View, Mo., native's 19 catches tied for the 11th-most in a single-game in FCS history. Acklin also scored three touchdowns, one shy of matching a program record. Acklin's scores came from 11, 41 and 62 yards out, meaning, just on those three plays alone, he racked up 114 yards receiving. In the fourth quarter alone, Acklin registered 12 catches for 172 yards and two touchdowns. Twelve catches are the fifth-most catches in a single game in Western Illinois history. Acklin's 343 all-purpose yards are also the fourth-most in a single game in program history. For his efforts, Acklin was named the STATS FCS National Player of the Week and the MVFC Offensive Player of the Week.

A FIRST IN PROGRAM HISTORY: Thanks to a 52-10 win at FBS-school Coastal Carolina, Western Illinois started the season 3-0 for the second year in a row, and the third time since 2002. However, this 3-0 beginning to the campaign was unique for the Leathernecks. It marked the first time in school history that Western had scored three straight road wins to start a season. The Leathernecks' throttling of the Chanticleers marked the most points any MVFC squad has ever scored against an FBS school. It was Western's largest margin of victory ever against an FBS team, and the 10 points they allowed were the fewest versus an FBS team since shutting out Northern Illinois in 1996.

McGUIRE, TAYLOR EARN WEEKLY MVFC HONORS: Junior quarterback Sean McGuire and senior linebacker Brett Taylor were named the Missouri Valley Football Conference co-Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week, respectively, after the Leathernecks pounded Coastal Carolina 52-10 in Conway. McGuire, who was also named CFPA National FCS Performer of the Week, went 17-for-19 for 276 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions at the Chanticleers. He also caught a 9-yard touchdown from wide receiver Isaiah LeSure. Thus, McGuire's performance marks the first time since 2010 (Matt Barr, six passing TDs, one rushing TD, 22-for-25) that a Western Illinois quarterback recorded more touchdowns than incompletions in one game. Taylor led the Leathernecks with eight tackles and tied for the team-best with two tackles for a loss at Coastal Carolina.

STRENGTH OF THE VALLEY: The 2017 season was another dominant campaign for the Missouri Valley Football Conference. The league boasted an FCS-high seven top 30 teams by the NCAA's simple rating system, 18 top-30 victories (next closest was Big Sky at seven) and not consequently, the most teams in the FCS Playoffs field with five. Against the entire field, the MVFC's 11 wins dwarf the second-place Colonial Athletic Association's five.

MOON HONORED BY MVFC: Junior linebacker **Quentin Moon** earned his first weekly award when he was selected as the Missouri Valley Football Conference Defensive Player of the Week. He recorded 10 tackles, including a career-high 3.5 for a loss, at Tennessee Tech. Moon was named as an Honorable Mention 'National Defensive Player of the Week' by STATS.

ALL-TIME AT HANSON FIELD: On September 23, 1950, Hanson Field was dedicated and became the home of Leatherneck Football. In the last 68 years, Western has compiled a 237-122-7 record at home. In 52 of those years Western finished at least .500 at home, including a perfect 6-0 record in 2010.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Having played six road games last year has really benefitted the 2017 Leathernecks. Western won its first three games on the road to begin the season for the first time ever. In addition, Western Illinois' six road wins are the most in a single campaign in program history. The seven total road games this year are the most since the 2015 squad eventually played eight road games (two in the NCAA Playoffs).

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS: Following the Leathernecks' 52-10 victory at Coastal Carolina, Western extended its streak to seven consecutive wins against non-conference opponents. Western has won eight of its last 10 non-conference games and improved to 14-1 in its last 15 games against non-FBS opponents.

BACK-TO-BACK FBS VICTORIES: Last year, Western Illinois ended a 15-game losing streak against FBS programs with a 28-23 victory at Northern Illinois. This year, the Leathernecks pounded Coastal Carolina 52-10 for their second straight FBS victory, marking the first time since 2002 and 2003 (Northern Illinois and Eastern Michigan, respectively) that Western Illinois has earned back-to-back wins over FBS opponents. The Leathernecks are now 8-29 versus the FBS, with seven of those victories coming against MAC programs.

DUAL SPORT ATHLETES: Three members of the football team are dual-sport athletes for the Leathernecks. All-MVFC running back **Steve McShane** has played in 33 career football games and 68 baseball games (44 starts). Defensive back **Justin Fitzpatrick** has 31 career football games and 53 career baseball games (32 starts). Both juniors played in each sport as a true-freshman, and both are outfielders on the baseball team. Fitzpatrick owns a career .181 average with four doubles and a triple while making 76 putouts in the outfield, including several highlight reel catches. McShane owns a .218 career average with two doubles and two triples. He has swiped 17 career bases and scored 31 runs. Sophomore transfer **Tony Tate** is also listed to compete for the track & field team this year.

CAREER STARTS LEADERS: Senior **James Torgerson** leads all active Leathernecks with 41 career starts, all consecutive. **Brett Taylor** is next with 38 starts, also all consecutive. **David Griffith** has 37 starts, 36 of those consecutive. **Jacob Judd** owns 35 straight starts. **Josh Baldus** has 35 career starts, 26 consecutive. **Xavier Rowe** has made 31 career starts, including 13 in a row.

TEAM CAPTAINS: Western Illinois announced the team captains for the 2017 season. During the spring game, head coach Charlie Fisher announced junior quarterback **Sean McGuire**, senior offensive lineman **Jacob Judd**, senior linebacker **Brett Taylor** and junior linebacker **Quentin Moon** received the honor.

GREAT ON THE FIELD AND IN THE CLASSROOM: Western set a program record with a team 3.09 cumulative GPA during the Spring 2017 season. Ten of the student-athletes earned a perfect 4.0 GPA. The department's 3.16 GPA during the Spring was the second-best semester on record. Senior offensive linemen Jacob Judd and James Torgerson were CoSIDA Academic All-District selections last year. Judd and Brett Taylor were 2 of 52 named to the FCS ADA Academic All-Start team in January. They were joined on the list by graduate transfer Lucas Holder, who earned the honor at Liberty.

HANSON FIELD TOUGH ON NON-CONFERENCE TEAMS: Playing at Hanson Field has been a tough task for non-conference teams in recent years. The Leathernecks are 33-4 against non-MVFC teams since 1999, including a current 11-game win streak following a 1-0 record during the 2015 and 2016 season. Western would have to make the NCAA Playoffs and host a non-conference team in a game to add to the record this year.

TWO NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN: Senior linebacker Brett Taylor earned several preseason All-American honors and is a unanimous First Team pick (Athlon, STATS, HERO Sports to name a couple). A First Team selection last year, Taylor is the first linebacker to earn preseason All-American honors since Kyle Glazier in 2010... Senior offensive lineman Jacob Judd earned Second Team preseason All-American honors from STATS.

LEATHERNECKS PICKED SIXTH IN MVFC PRESEASON: It's not often that a team gets picked to finish sixth in the conference preseason poll while also earning a ranking in the preseason national 'Top 25' poll, but that is what the Leathernecks saw this summer. Western, ranked 19th in the Athlon Sports preseason 'Top 25,' was picked to finish sixth in a vote by the MVFC coaches, sports information directors and select media. North Dakota State (21 first-place votes) edged South Dakota State (19 first-place votes) for first place, tallying 380 points to the Jackrabbits' 379. Youngstown State, the 2016 national runner-up, came in third with 290 points. UNI (255) and Illinois State (246) rounded out the top five. Western received 188 points for sixth place, just ahead of South Dakota (182). Southern Illinois (132) was picked eighth while Missouri State (81) and Indiana State (67) rounded out the poll.

CONGRATULATIONS GRADUATES: Western Illinois ranks among the top NCAA Division I Football programs with the number of student-athletes now with a degree. Courtesy of the National Football Foundation, Western now ranks tied for sixth nationally by boasting 12 players with a degree.

LEATHERNECK QUICK HITTERS:

- Western Illinois is 43-78-1 (.352) all-time against ranked opponents, including 29-59 (.330) in conference play. This season, the Leathernecks earned a win at then-No. 21 Northern lowa and No. 12 Illinois State. Western Illinois has lost to then-No. 10 South Dakota, No. 2 North Dakota State and No. 8 South Dakota State.
- Thanks to the efforts of Steve McShane, Western Illinois leads the conference and ranks fourth nationally with 18.4 yards per punt return. McShane, who returned a punt 81 yards for a touchdown at Indiana State, - the seventh-longest punt return in Western Illinois history, and the longest for a score since 2009 - is averaging 20.2 yards per return.
- Time of possession is a very important stat to Leathernecks head coach Charlie Fisher. Western Illinois has won the time of possession battle six times this year, holding the ball for a season-high of 39:03 at Northern Arizona. Last year's season-best was 36:50 at Missouri State. The Leathernecks rank 19th nationally in time of possession with their 31:57 average.
- Western Illinois ranks in the top 40 in scoring offense (13th, 35.5 points per game), passing offense (27th, 244.9 yards per game), third down conversion rate (20th, 43.2 percent) and total offense (39th, 405.2 per game). On defense, the Leathernecks boast a strong rush defense that ranks 24th nationally by yielding 119.9 yards per game on the ground.
- In 32 career games (26 career starts), Sean McGuire has registered 10 career 300-yard passing games. The Franklin, Wisconsin native's 50 career passing touchdowns are third in school history, just four away from passing former teammate Trenton Norvell for second place. McGuire is also tied for third place in program history for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback (eight), four away from **Steve LaFalce** in second place in school history.
- On his first career field goal attempt, Western Illinois kickoff specialist Nathan Erickson blasted a 52-varder at North Dakota State, becoming the first Leatherneck to boot a 50-plus yarder since **Taylor Rowan** connected from 54 yards in the FargoDome in 2008. Erickson, normally the kickoff specialist for the Leathernecks, has recorded 36 touchbacks this season, tied with Sacramento State for the most in the nation.
- The Leatherneck defense held the Salukis to just 62 yards passing last week, the second straight contest holding an opponent below 100 passing yards. Prior to this stretch, Western Illinois hadn't done that in any game since 2013.

MACOMB, III. – Seniors Jaelon Acklin and Brett Taylor re-wrote the Western Illinois record book on Saturday (Sept. 30), but the Leathernecks came up just short in what would have been the biggest comeback in program history, falling 38-33 to South Dakota. It was the home opener for the 13th-ranked Leathernecks (3-1 overall), as both teams opened Missouri Valley Football Conference play.

Down 38-6 with just under six minutes left in the third quarter, Acklin teamed with Sean McGuire to spur the comeback. Acklin set program records making 19 catches for 343 yards and caught three touchdowns during that span. The yardage not only set a MVFC record but finished as the fourth-highest single-game total by an NCAA FCS player.

While the offense kept rolling over the final 20 minutes, the defense blanked USD in that time, led by Taylor's career-high 28 tackles. He tied with NFL great Rodney Harrison (at Western Kentucky, 1993) for the WIU single-game record, and recorded the fifth-most in MVFC history.

FARGO, N.D. – Western Illinois held a halftime lead at the FargoDome against second-ranked North Dakota State, but a pair of third quarter Bison touchdowns Saturday afternoon (Oct. 21) were the difference in a 24-12 loss. The loss drops the 10th-ranked Leathernecks to 5-2 overall and 2-2 in the Missouri Valley Football Conference while NDSU improved to 7-0 and 4-0.

Down by two scores midway in the fourth quarter, Sean McGuire | and Jaelon Acklin connected on a 45-yard strike in double coverage | down to the Bison five. However, the nation's top-ranked defense was able to stop Western on four straight plays, forcing a turnover on downs with 6:36 left.

Western got the ball back after a stop on 3rd-and-2, but on the ensuing drive, the Bison recorded their first takeaway of the game on an interception and would eventually run out the clock.

On the ensuing drive, Easton Stick was hurried and partially hit on a throw. Quentin Moon picked off the pass and raced 43 yards for the score. NDSU blocked the extra point, making it 9-3 Leathernecks.
