- The Leathernecks are also a top rebounding team among Summit League competition, as the team's total average of 39.4 per game ranks second in the league and, at 12.6, the offensive rebounding number is the top mark.
- Will Carius (16.9) and Trenton Massner (16.6) aren't just WIU's scoring leaders - they're also some of the league leaders. The combination of Iowa natives rank fourth and fifth, respectively, among Summit League players, as of Jan. 19.

GAME NOTES

Luka's Heroics

In WIU's two overtime games this season, Luka Barisic has come up clutch for the Leathernecks. Barisic's only three of the game against Denver came in overtime to help give the Leathernecks a two possession lead. Against NDSU, Barisic hit back-to-back triples to give Western a six point cushion in the first minute and ten seconds of the extra period.

Scoring Big

Western Illinois' offense continues to be one of the best scoring teams in the nation. The Leathernecks are averaging 80.5 points per game, good for the 22nd best mark in the country. Reaching 80 points has been big for the Leathernecks this season, as they're 7-2 in games where they score at least 80 points. In games where they score less than 80 points, they're just 5-4.

Dropping 30

Western Illinois has had ten players in its history score 30 plus points in a game, and fans have seen it happen from three players on the current roster. Will Carius dropped 34 points last season vs North Dakota on Jan. 29 and Colton Sandage put up 32 vs Oral Roberts on Feb. 27 of last year. Sandage surpassed his historic performance this season with a 33 point outing vs Ball State back on Dec. 1. Trenton Massner has dropped 31 points twice this season in two overtime victories vs Denver and North Dakota State.

Massner's Recognition

Trenton Massner was named Summit League Men's Basketball Player of the Week on Monday (Jan. 17), after averaging 21 points, nine rebounds, over four assists, one block and three steals across two victories against UND and NDSU.

Monday's announcement was the second time this season that Massner earned Player of the Week honors, and he also was recognized as the Summit League Male Athlete of the Month for December. The last time a Western Illinois men's basketball player won player of the week honors multiple times was the 2018-19 season, when Brandon Gilbeck won it twice, and the 2012-13 season was the last time three Player of the Week awards were given to Leathernecks in a single season.

Sandage's Steals

Colton Sandage had a game to remember on the defensive end, finishing with a career high five steals. It was the first time a Leatherneck ended a game with at least five steals since Jan. 1st, 2016, when Jabari Sandifer ended with five vs Omaha.

Big Win in Fargo

Saturday's win at North Dakota State was a big milestone for Western Illinois with North Dakota State winning 18 of the last 19 meetings heading into Saturday's game. The victory over the Bison snapped a seven game losing streak to NDSU and gave the Leathernecks their first since Feb. 22, 2018. WIU's win at Fargo gave the program its first road win vs North Dakota State since Feb. 14, 2013.

What is a Leatherneck?

Western Illinois holds the distinction of being the only non-military institution to officially have its nickname derived from a branch of the military service. The school began the use of the Marine Corps' official nickname, "The Fighting Leathernecks", in 1927 when athletic director and head baseball, basketball and football coach Ray "Rock" Hanson was granted permission by the U.S. Navy, based on his status as a Marine hero, to use the nickname.

The Hall

Nicknamed The Hall, Western Hall has been a successful home for both Western Illinois basketball teams. Western Hall is one of 11 college basketball venues in the country to have the name "Hall" in it, and the Leathernecks have played there since the 1977-78 season. The Leathernecks are currently undefeated (6-0) when playing at Western Hall this season.

HEAD COACH ROB JETER



Wherever Rob Jeter goes, success is sure to follow, and on March 30, 2020, his next stop became Western Illinois University.

Jeter was tabbed as the Leathernecks' 21st head men's basketball coach, carrying with him 25 years of coaching experience and seven NCAA Tournament appearances. His previous stops included the University of Minnesota, University of Nevada-Las Vegas, and a head coaching stint at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

At the helm of his own program, Jeter was a three-time coach of the year. Eleven seasons at Milwaukee captured five seasons with 20 or more wins, Coach of the Year honors from the Horizon League (2011) and the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association (2006,2011), and two NCAA Tournament berths. His first Panther squad registered a first-round victory over the University of Oklahoma in the 2006 NCAA Tournament.

Jeter's most recent trip to the NCAAs occurred in 2019 as an assistant at Minnesota. The Gophers ended their season in the second round but earned their first tournament win in six years to go alongside another 20-win season (22-14).

In his two-year stint, Jeter was responsible for all aspects of the program, from recruiting to skill development, and he worked extensively with the Gophers' backcourt and defense. He helped coach Amir Coffey and Marcus Carr to All-Big Ten honors in 2019 and 2020, respectively.

Coffey is currently with the NBA's Los Angeles Clippers on a two-way contract with the Agua Caliente Clippers of the NBA G League.

Prior to Minnesota, Jeter was on staff at UNLV from 2016-18. The Runnin' Rebels doubled their wins in year two to produce a 20-win season, and Jeter had a hand in recruiting the 12th-best class in the country that included McDonald's High School All-American Brandon McCoy and National Junior College Player of the Year Shakur Juiston.

Jeter left Milwaukee (2005-2016) as its all-time winningest coach (Division I era) with an overall record of 185-170. The Panthers claimed the Horizon League's regular-season titles in 2006 and 2011 and tournament titles in 2006 and 2014.

Before running his own ship, Jeter was an assistant coach under Bo Ryan at Wisconsin (2001-05), UWM (1999-01), and Wisconsin-Platteville (1994-98). He was also an assistant at Marquette (1998-99) under Mike Deane.

At Wisconsin, Jeter helped the Badgers to remarkable success with two regular season Big Ten championships and a Big Ten Tournament title. Wisconsin made four-straight NCAA Tournament appearances, including berths in the Sweet 16 in 2003 and the Elite Eight in 2005.

Jeter played college basketball for Ryan at UW-Platteville and captained his team to the NCAA Division III title in 1991. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1991 and went on to earn a master's from UWP in 2001.

Jeter was inducted into the UW-Platteville Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006 and was also inducted into the inaugural hall of fame class for the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. He became a three-time HOFer in 2013 when Platteville's 1991 national championship team received the school's highest honor.

PLRYING CRREER

Jeter's collegiate career started at UW-Platteville, where he played for Bo Ryan from 1987-91 and captained the team to the 1991 NCAA Division III title while being named to the All-Final Four team. A two-time All-WSUC selection and two-time All-Midwest Region choice, Jeter held UW-Platteville records for career field goal percentage (.601) and consecutive starts (89) and was named to the WSUC honor roll three times. He spent one season playing professional basketball overseas, playing for the Olivias Futebol Clube in 1992-93 and leading the Portuguese league in scoring.
