Facilities

Class of 1978 Stadium

Lafayette's baseball program practices and plays all of its games at Hilton Rahn '51 Field at the Class of 1978 Stadium at the Metzgar Athletic Campus in Forks Township, Pa. Recent renovations have drastically improved the site and have turned it into one of the top baseball facilities in the Patriot League.

The infield at Hilton Rahn Field underwent a complete renovation in the fall of 2007. The project included grading the subsurface of the infield, installing an irrigation system and placement of new sod and infield mix. The pitcher's mound and home plate were also rebuilt.

Prior to the 2003 season, the baseball facilities underwent significant changes. A 500-seat grandstand, with chair back seating, was added behind home plate. A

press box, equipped with a permanently installed public address system and phone lines for television, radio and newspaper use and uploading of live stats, sits atop the new grandstand. A new backstop with netting was attached to the bleacher seating. The existing team dugouts were extended by 20 feet and were completely refurbished, adding on-field storage.

The recent upgrades followed other significant additions completed prior to the 2002 season. A state of the art scoreboard was installed behind the leftfield fence.

The fence itself was also replaced with an eight-foot fence with maroon slats that adds a professional look to the field. A 15-foot crushed stone warning track now lines the outfield fence and helps define the new dimensions, 332 down the leftfield line, 403 to straightaway center and 335 down the rightfield line. The field also features permanent batting cages and four regulation bullpens, including a home bullpen shelter that was added down the third base line in 2004. Additionally, a new soil mix installed prior to the 2001 season has vastly improved the playing surface for infielders.

Mr. and Mrs. Hilton "Dutch" Rahn '51, the family and classmates of John McCombs '68 and a large anonymous donation have made all of the improvements possible.

Metzgar Fields Athletic Complex

The Metzgar Athletic Campus is located three miles northwest of the College Hill campus. The Class of 1978 Stadium is part of an 80-acre facility that also contains playing surfaces for all of the school's

outdoor sports. The site has hosted a number of NCAA, Patriot League and ECAC championship contests over the years.

During the summer of 2007, the Herb McCracken Varsity House underwent a renovation that included new locker rooms for the 11 teams that occupy the building as well as locker rooms for game officials and visiting teams. The baseball locker room, named after alumnus and former baseball player Phil Bollman '60, includes open wood lockers, a flat screen television and new furniture.

Rappolt Field/Astro Turf Surface

All of Lafayette's field sports have immediately benefited from the construction of Rappolt field, an all-weather Astro Turf XL12 surface. The baseball program uses the artificial surface at various times during the year for infield and outfield drills. Construction was made possible by a gift from College trustee, Bill Rappolt '67 and his wife, Pam.

Allan P. Kirby Sports Center

Dedicated in 2000, the \$35 million Allan P. Kirby Sports Center gives Lafayette one of the finest athletic complexes of its size in the country. It includes a new, 110,000-square foot intramural and recreational sports facility attached to the previously existing Kirby Field House. The field house itself received a \$2.5 million facelift and interior renovation.

The baseball team uses the field house for preseason practice during the winter months, taking advantage of the spacious practice area that is equipped with batting cages and pitching mounds.

The new portion of the center, featuring a distinctive atrium overlooking Fisher Stadium, houses Kamine Gymnasium, which includes three 50-by-84-foot courts for basketball and other sports and an elevated 1/10-mile jogging track. Buck Courts include six courts for racquet sports. A 6,600-square-foot fitness center and weight room includes a strength training circuit, spacious free weight area and more than 30 cardio machines. There is also a 35-foot climbing wall and aerobics and dance areas.

How to get to Metzgar Fields Athletic Complex

To reach Metzgar Fields from campus, take Cattell St. (one block east of campus) north as it winds around and turns into Sullivan Trail. The fields are located on Sullivan Trail on the left side of the road with a parking lot inside the main gate.

From Route 33, get off at the Stockertown exit onto Main St. Take Main St. eastward as it turns into Sullivan Trail. Metzgar Fields are located on the right side of Sullivan Trail, about 2.5 miles from the Stockertown exit.



Coaching Staff



Joe Kinney—Head Coach

Joe Kinney enters his ninth season as the head coach at Lafayette, a program he has built into a winner. Since taking over in 1999, Kinney has continuously raised the talent level to the point where Lafayette is consistently in contention for a Patriot League title. The 2007 season was one

for the record books, as the Leopards recorded a program-best 33 wins, including 17 Patriot League victories, and advanced to the NCAA Regional. The team's performance last season earned Kinney his first-ever Patriot League Coach of the Year honor.

The success of 2007 came on the heels of a highly successful 2006 season in which the Leopards posted 27 wins, the second-highest win total in Lafayette history.

Under Kinney, Lafayette has advanced to the Patriot League Tournament in four of the previous six seasons and boasted 41 All-Patriot League selections and two Patriot League Players of the Year (Adam Rosenberg '04, Vince D'Angelis '02).

Kinney has been instrumental in securing major renovations to Lafayette's baseball facilities. Prior to 2004, the baseball field was renamed the Class of 1978 Stadium and renovations included the addition of a grandstand with chair back seats and bleachers, a press box and expansion and refurbishment of both dugouts. Other improvements included a new scoreboard, outfield fence and warning track, new infield mix and a shelter in the Lafayette bullpen.

In 2004, Lafayette advanced past the first round of the Patriot League Tournament for the first time in program history after defeating Lehigh in the opening round and went on to face Army in the three-game Championship Series.

That season, the Leopards finished with a 23-26 mark, 11-9 in conference play. In 2002, the team had a breakthrough 23-22 record in what was then the program's first 20-win season in 10 years. The team won a then-school record 12 Patriot League games and made its first-ever appearance in the league tournament.

Prior to Lafayette, Kinney was the top assistant at Navy from 1992-99, helping guide the Midshipmen to four Patriot League titles and two NCAA Baseball Tournament East Regional appearances. His responsibilities included serving as the hitting and defensive coach, facility manager for the baseball complex, equipment manager and director of the Navy Baseball Camp.

Before Navy, Kinney was an assistant coach at Lehigh from 1990-92 where he was the hitting, defense and conditioning coach. While there, he completed his master's degree in Secondary Education. Kinney's time at Lehigh followed a stint at Columbia High School in his hometown of Maplewood, N.J. where he was the junior varsity baseball coach and freshman football coach.

Kinney graduated from Lehigh in 1998 with a degree in Economics. He enjoyed a four-year career and served as captain of the 1987 and 1988 squads. Kinney and his wife, former Susan Pitman, reside on College Hill with daughters Annelise and Alexis.



Gregg Durrah—Assistant Coach

Gregg Durrah has been with Joe Kinney every season at Lafayette. Durrah works primarily with the pitching staff, while also assisting with recruiting.

Prior to Lafayette, Durrah was an assistant coach at Easton High School from 1992-99 following stints as an assistant coach at Rutgers-Newark and Fairleigh Dickinson. Durrah graduated from Fairleigh Dickinson in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in Business Management following a four-year baseball career.

He currently works as a probation officer for Northampton County and is also in the Marine Corps Reserve where he has a rank of gunnery sergeant. He is also a high school and Division I college basketball official. Durrah and his wife, Kendra, have two children, Sydney and Trey, and reside in Palmer Township, Pa. Trey has served as the team's bat boy for several seasons.



Rick Clagett—Assistant Coach

Rick Clagett begins his second season on the Lafayette staff. He joined the Leopards from Villanova, where he spent five years as the top assistant coach. At Villanova, Clagett served as the pitching coach and recruiting and admissions coordinator. He was the director of the Wildcats' camps and assisted in the team's booster proceedings.

Prior to Villanova, he worked for his alma mater, Utah, where his tasks included recruiting and admissions duties, as well as daily efforts with the pitching staff. As an undergraduate, Clagett was a standout pitcher, serving as the team captain in 1998. As a senior, he was among the team leaders with six victories. In 1997, Clagett's 10 wins led the team, placing him one shy of tying the school record. He was instrumental in leading the Utes to the WAC Northern Division Championship that year.

A Las Vegas native, Clagett earned his bachelor's degree in Political Science from Utah in 1999. He and his wife, Jill, reside in Bethlehem.



Brandt Godshalk—Assistant Coach

Brandt Godshalk enters his first season as an assistant coach with Lafayette. Godshalk, a Bangor, Pa. native, has 13 years of coaching experience at the high school level. He served as the freshman coach at Phillipsburg (N.J.) from 2004-07, a post he also held from 1999-2001.

Godshalk was also the assistant varsity baseball coach at Phillipsburg in 2003, working primarily with the pitchers and catchers and spent 2002 as the junior varsity coach. He is in his ninth year as a health and physical education teacher at Phillipsburg. Prior to Phillipsburg, he spent three seasons (1995-98) as the junior varsity baseball coach at Belvidere High School (N.J.).

A veteran of the Blue Mountain League, Godshalk graduated from East Stroudsburg in 1995 with a degree in Sport Fitness Management and later earned his physical education certification from ESU in 1998. Godshalk resides in Bangor with his wife Christine, their daughter Maeve and son Kael.

Season Outlook

The 2008 Lafayette baseball team is primed to continue the winning tradition head coach **Joe Kinney** has established at Lafayette. Last spring, the Leopards won a program-record 33 games and advanced to the NCAA Regionals for the first time since 1990. Despite losing several key members of that team to graduation, Kinney, the reigning Patriot League Coach of the Year, has assembled another squad that seems poised for more postseason success this spring.

While several key members from last year's Patriot League Championship team graduated, Kinney and his staff enter this spring with a team that possesses the talent and depth that should lead to another winning season. The Leopards return several starters to the lineup, two to the starting rotation and have a veteran bullpen, as well.

"Our entire starting infield is back so that's our defensive strength," Kinney said. "All of the players at those positions are experienced and have performed well for us and we're certainly looking to them for leadership. We also have several key pitchers returning so our pitching staff will be another strength of our team, which is always important in college baseball."

The senior class will be looked upon to lead both on and off the field. Second baseman **Tom Hayes** and starting pitcher **Kevin Reese** were selected as captains and are two of eight seniors on the roster. All eight played significant roles last season and will provide leadership and experience to the team's underclassmen.

The outfield will have a new look as the team lost its starters from a year ago, including offensive sparkplug James Conrad. Kinney has several capable options, however, and depth should not be an issue. The veteran infield, combined with a talented corps of outfielders, indicates that the lineup should have no problems finding its stride again this season.

The starting rotation will see two starters back on the mound this season in sophomore **Jeremy Atkins** and Reese. They will be throwing to a new catcher, however, as Dave Drechsel graduated last spring. Senior **Tom Ambrosole** is ready to step into the starting role with three seasons of experience under

his belt. Ambrosole will also be catching a bullpen that should get plenty of attention this season.

"Our bullpen potentially could be as strong as its ever been," Kinney said. "I've never had this experienced a bullpen before."

Pitching Staff

The pitching staff is expected to yet again be a strength of the team with a solid mix of veterans and youth who have the ability and talent to make an impact this season. It will be a challenge to top the performance of last year's squad that finished the season with a 4.01 earned run average (ERA), but this year's group should be up to the task.

Reese and Atkins are both coming off impressive 2007 campaigns. Reese led the squad with seven wins and a 2.96 ERA while Atkins finished his All-America rookie season with six wins and a 3.50 ERA.

Following Reese and Atkins in the starting lineup will be junior righthander **Ryan Hanna** and freshman righthander **Zack Fritz**.

The team will miss the veteran arms of Matt Kamine, Ted Gjeldum, Brian Cope and John Fugett. Kamine finished his career at Lafayette with 14 wins, including seven last season. He logged a team-record 94 innings of work and 214.2 for his career. Gjeldum threw over 78 innings last season and finished his career with 12 wins and a career ERA of 3.84. He has since moved on to play professional baseball.

Cope, meanwhile, contributed four wins last season and boasted an impressive 4.01 ERA. Classmate Fugett made 22 appearances last spring en route to recording a team-high four saves in just over 35 innings of work.

"We did lose some key guys on the mound to graduation but we have some players with experience and some newcomers, including Ryan and Zach," Kinney said. "We think both of them have the ability to do some things for us this season."

Players who will compete for the midweek starting roles include junior **Mike LeClerc-Spier** and sophomore **Tyler Chromey**.

Three seniors will guide a talented bullpen, led by **Brad Woodfield**, **Jason Morytko** and **Steve Roberts**.

Woodfield posted a 3-1 record in 2007 with a 3.97 ERA in 34 innings of work. He had two saves on the season and struck out 28 batters. Morytko also had a solid year, making 23 appearances and pitching over 22 innings. Roberts made five appearances his junior season, pitching a combined eight innings.

Behind the trio of seniors is junior **Brian Mostek** who appeared in nine games last year. Freshmen **Ben Hertz**, **Corey Shea**, **Joseph Verdon** and **Adam Young** are also expected to come out of the bullpen.

Infield

Talent and experience abound in the infield this season. The Leopards return four starters from last year's Patriot League championship team in Hayes and juniors **Chris Luick**, **Daniel Bierce** and **Jeff Butler**.

"The infield will anchor our lineup because they're our most experienced players offensively and defensively," Kinney said. "Every guy there figures to be a key player."

Luick, a standout defensive player, will return at first base after a season in which he boasted a .344 batting average with three triples and four home runs. Backing him up at the position will be junior **Joe Ezekiel**

and freshman **Adam McMahon**, who could also see time in the outfield.

Second base will be anchored by Hayes, a career .292 hitter. Hayes started 47 games as a junior and tallied 59 RBI to go along with six doubles. Another freshman will serve as the backup to Hayes with **Matt Fenster** expected to be the first off the bench at the position.

Butler, who batted .349 last season, will start at third and look to improve on what was a highly successful junior campaign. He started all 45 games in which he appeared. Sophomore **Justin Shepherd** will serve as a more than capable backup player. Shepherd made four starts his rookie year and appeared in 12 games.

The shortstop position belongs to Bierce, the only player to start all 53 games last spring. Bierce is a sure-handed infielder who also possesses speed, as he swiped 17 bases in 21 attempts last year. **A.J. Pisarri** and freshman **Casey Ennis** are options to fill in at third while Ennis can also backup several other infield positions.

Ambrosiole will take over as the Leopards' starting catcher. He started 16 games last season both as a designated hitter and behind the plate. With three years of experience, Ambrosiole should have no problem catching the Lafayette pitching staff while also providing the team with another quality bat in the lineup.

Junior **Ian McCutcheon**, sophomore **Brad Weiss** and freshman **A.J. Miller** will backup Ambrosiole. McCutcheon made two starts last season while Weiss saw playing time in 20 games.

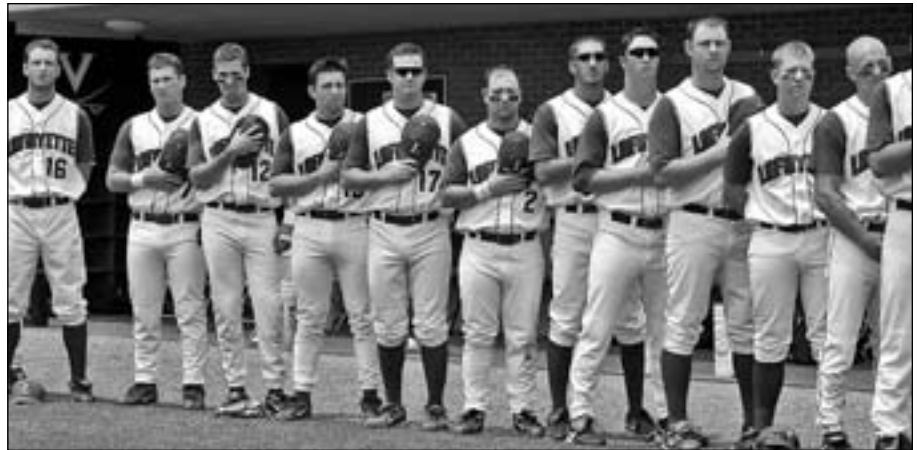
Outfield

Unlike the infield, the outfield positions will be manned entirely by new starters this spring.

"We'll have a whole host of people," Kinney said, "some who have experience and some who don't."

Senior **Ryan Roberts**, junior **Nick Tucker** and sophomores **Matt Hall** and **Brad Weiss** seem to hold the edge to see the most playing time. Roberts saw significant action last season, starting 19 of the 34 games in which he played.

After spending the majority of his Lafayette career on the mound, Tucker has



now made the switch to a full-time position player. Hall and Weiss each saw playing time last spring as Hall had 33 at-bats while Weiss recorded 11 hits in 37 at-bats. Two freshmen—**Rob Froio** and **Alex Bechta**—should push for some playing time in the outfield.

Schedule

There are 52 games on Lafayette's schedule this spring, including 18 home contests. The Leopards will again compete in the Liberty Bell Classic against a group of teams that includes St. Joseph's, Delaware, Penn, La Salle, Villanova, Temple and Lehigh. The championship game, which Lafayette won last season against Lehigh, will be played at the Philadelphia Phillies' Citizens Bank Park.

This season, there are a few rule changes to college baseball, including a national Feb. 22 start date. That will benefit teams in colder climates because for the first time, every team will open the season against squads with the same record, an important factor as Lafayette begins the season with three games at VMI from Feb. 22-24.

"This will be the first time in my coaching history we're going to play a team that has the same record we do," Kinney said. "In the past, when we've played teams from the south we've typically played teams that have already played several games, meaning it was never an entirely level playing field."

A two-game road trip follows the next weekend against Norfolk State on March 1 and 2. The home season opens on March 5 with a game against East Stroudsburg and two against St. Peter's on March 8 and 9.

Lafayette will spend spring break in

Bradenton, Fla. with four games against four teams from March 15-18. The team will then play three games against Delaware before returning home to open league play.

"Delaware will be a big weekend for us," Kinney said. "It's a talented team and it's at their place. It will get us in the competitive mode you want to be in heading into conference play."

March 25 marks the first of 12-straight home contests for Lafayette, beginning with a game against Penn as part of the Liberty Bell Classic. Patriot League play opens on March 29 when Navy visits Easton for four games. A brief break from league play takes place on April 1 when the Leopards face either St. Joe's or Delaware in the Liberty Bell Classic. Four games against league opponent Bucknell wrap-up the homestand.

A lengthy, 15-game road trip follows, including four games against archrival Lehigh on April 12-13. Other league opponents the Leopards face during the stretch include Holy Cross and Army with non-league games also scheduled against Monmouth, Villanova and Rutgers.

The regular season concludes with non-league games against Temple, Stony Brook and Rider before the Patriot League Tournament takes place from May 10-18 at the highest seed.

Ultimately, it will be the league portion of the schedule that determines whether the season is a success or not.

"We play 20 league games and it's how you do over that 20-game schedule that dictates whether we're going to be in postseason play which is our primary goal," Kinney said.

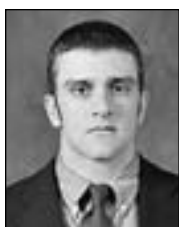

2007 Season Review

The 2007 baseball season was a record-breaking one as the Leopards won 33 games, the most in team history. Their 17 Patriot League victories were also the most ever and led to their first-ever Patriot League crown. That 17-win total also tied the conference record for conference victories in a 20-game league season. From there, Lafayette advanced to the NCAA Regionals for the first time since 1990.

Head coach **Joe Kinney** was instrumental in guiding the team to such success. His efforts and the play of his team earned Kinney Patriot League Coach of the Year honors for the first time in his eight-year career at Lafayette.

In addition, several players also received individual accolades, as nine players earned spots on All-Patriot League Teams and senior **James Conrad** was named to the *ESPN the Magazine* Academic All-America Third Team. In addition, Conrad earned Patriot League Baseball Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors after graduating with a 3.5 grade-point average in Mathematics.

Lafayette also went eight-straight weeks with at least one conference honor. Conrad led the team with three Player of the Week honors. **Mike Raible** and **Kevin Leasure** were also named Players of the Week while **Kevin Reese**, **John Fugett** and **Matt Kamine** were named Pitchers of the Week. Finally, freshman pitcher **Jeremy Atkins** earned Rookie of the Week honors. Atkins finished the season with a 6-2 record and a 3.50 ERA. He earned a spot in the weekend rotation and received Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America honors. He was also the runner-up for Patriot League Rookie of the Year.

The Leopards also saw several players finish among the nation's leaders in several statistical categories. Conrad was third in the nation in stolen bases with a 0.94 average while also ranking eighth in runs per game (1.29). His 49 stolen bases were a Lafayette single-season record and he finished his career as the program's leading base stealer with 85 over his four seasons. As a team, Lafayette was ranked second in the nation in stolen bases per game (2.64).

The season opened on Feb. 23 with a

five-game road trip against Longwood and Maryland. The Leopards began the trip with two-straight wins against Longwood, including a 5-2 decision in the second game as Kamine tossed seven innings of two-run ball. A three-game series at Maryland followed from March 2-4. Lafayette dropped the first two games but rebounded in the final game, winning a 7-2 decision thanks to two hits and three RBI from sophomore **Jeff Butler**, who would go on to record a 14-game hit streak during the season. Atkins tossed seven innings of one-run ball in the game to notch his first collegiate victory.

The Leopards were scheduled to open their home season on March 7 against East Stroudsburg but the game was postponed and the team then embarked on its annual spring training trip. Lafayette played eight games from March 10-18, beginning with

three at Davidson. The Leopards won two out of three, including a 1-0 shutout of the Wildcats as Kamine pitched eight shutout innings.

One-game trips to Furman and Wofford resulted in two losses before the team ended the road trip with three games at High Point. Lafayette won the opening game 9-5, thanks to a three-run home run from Leasure, but dropped the final two.

The next scheduled home game against Rider on March 20 was also postponed and the Leopards again left on a lengthy road trip, this time for five games against five teams. Lafayette won two of the five games, posting wins over Penn on March 21 and Villanova at the Liberty Bell Classic on March 27. Fugett earned the win against Penn after tossing two innings of scoreless relief. Hayes and Raible led the offense in

the 8-2 win over Villanova as each had two hits and two RBI.

Lafayette finally got to play on its home field as the team enjoyed a five-game homestand from March 31-April 3, a stretch that also marked the opening of Patriot League play. The Leopards welcomed Army on March 31 for four games and dealt the Black Knights four-straight losses. The games were all close, but solid pitching and timely hitting translated into four Lafayette wins. The series opened with a 3-2 win as Gjeldum allowed just two runs in 6.2 innings of work. Kamine then tossed a complete game in a 5-2 win on March 31.

The Army series concluded with a second doubleheader on April 1. The Leopards won a 5-4 decision to open the day as Reese earned his second win of the season. A 5-3 victory closed out the series with Raible leading the Leopards with four hits.

The team's win streak stretched to five with a decisive 10-2 victory over Penn on April 3 as part of the Liberty Bell Classic. Junior **Brad Woodfield** allowed just two runs on seven hits while Butler had three hits and two RBI against the Quakers. Woodfield would finish the season with a 3-1 record and two saves.

The Leopards continued Patriot League play with four games at Navy from April 8-9. Lafayette left Annapolis, Md. with three wins, including a 5-0 shutout in the second game thanks to another solid pitching performance from Kamine. Kamine went on to pitch 94 innings in 2007, a Lafayette single-season record. Reese followed Kamine's dominating performance with seven solid innings the following day as the Leopards earned a 6-3 decision. Dreschel contributed two hits and two RBI in the win.

The year's first game against archrival Lehigh took place on April 10 as Lafayette squared off against the Mountain Hawks at Citizens Bank Park, the home of the Philadelphia Phillies, in the Liberty Bell Classic championship game. It marked the second-consecutive championship appearance for the Leopards. A 7-3 victory over their rivals gave the Leopards the Classic title. Senior catcher **Dave Drechsel** put up a career night, blasting a three-run home run high off the foul pole while finishing a triple shy of hitting for the cycle.



The team continued league play with four games at Bucknell on the weekend of April 14-17. The Leopards swept all four games, scoring 37 runs in the process. Only the third game was decided by fewer than four runs as Lafayette recorded a 3-2 win.

A nine-game homestand, the longest of the season, began on April 19 and saw the Leopards win seven of nine games. Lafayette opened with a 2-1 win over Columbia with pitcher **Brian Cope** allowing just one run in five innings.

The Leopards dropped the next game, a 5-0 loss to Lehigh, but then rattled off three-straight wins, including the final three against the Mountain Hawks. Lafayette scored 22 runs in the three wins over their archrival, including a 6-3 decision on April 21. Conrad led the offense with three hits and three runs

scored. The following day opened with a 6-1 win Lafayette that came behind the arm of Reese. The series finale saw Lafayette record an 8-7 win before the team moved on to host Holy Cross.

Like in the Lehigh series, Lafayette dropped the opening game to the Crusaders on April 28 before rebounding to close out the homestand with three-straight wins. The final victory in the series was a 7-6 extra-inning victory with freshman **Justin Shepherd** drawing a bases-loaded walk to cap off a two-run rally in the bottom of the 11th. The win gave the Leopards a 17-3 record in league play and clinched their first-ever Patriot League title in addition to earning the No. 1 seed and the right to serve as Patriot League Tournament host.

Two non-league road games followed

against Temple and Rutgers. The Leopards suffered setbacks in both, dropping a 6-4 decision to Temple on May 1 and a 6-1 game to Rutgers two days later.

Those losses were quickly forgotten as Lafayette returned home to face two more non-league teams, starting with a three-game series against UMBC on May 5. Lafayette opened with a 3-2 win thanks to six-plus innings of two-run ball from **Ted Gjedlum** and two RBI from classmate Leasure. A 4-3, 10-inning loss followed before the Leopards closed out the series with a 9-1 win on Senior Day as the Leopards posted their school-record 30th win of the season.

The Patriot League Tournament opened on May 12 with a best-of-three format. Lafayette first faced Army and handed the Black Knights an 8-3 loss as Raible led the Leopards' offense with a home run, a triple and four RBI. Fugett collected a save in the game, one of his four on the season.

The following day Lafayette defeated Army 4-1 to win the team's first-ever league

title. Reese surrendered just one run in over eight innings of work while the offense was bolstered by four hits from junior **Tom Hayes**, sending the Leopards to the NCAA Regionals for the first time since 1990. Raible earned Patriot League Tournament MVP honors.

Before the NCAA tournament began, Lafayette prepared with two games against Brown. The Leopards split the series, dropping the first game before rebounding with an 11-4 win in the second.

In the NCAA Regionals, Lafayette found itself in the Charlottesville, Va. region as the No. 4 seed. Joining the Leopards were No. 1 seed Virginia, No. 2 Rutgers and No. 3 Oregon State, the eventual College World Series champions.

Lafayette opened the best-of-three series against Virginia and dropped a tough 5-1 decision. Conrad and Raible each had multi-hit games but the Cavaliers came through with clutch hitting to hand the Leopards the loss.

Lafayette then faced Rutgers in an

elimination game. It was a high-scoring affair but the Scarlet Knights came out on top of an 11-10 decision. Trailing 11-8 heading into the ninth inning, the Leopards nearly pulled off a game-winning rally when a two-run home run from Leasure brought the Leopards within one of tying the game, but the team would pull no closer. Conrad led both squads with his game-high four hits while Leasure added three and a game-best five RBI.

Conrad was selected to the Charlottesville Regional All-Tournament Team after hitting .778 in two NCAA Regional games. He totaled 75 hits and scored 67 runs his senior season, both Lafayette single-season records. Leasure, meanwhile, also set a single-season record with 16 doubles.

The two NCAA Regional losses could hardly dampen what was a historic season for the Lafayette baseball program and the team's nine seniors played key roles in guiding the team to postseason success.

History

The baseball program is perhaps the most storied of all the 23 athletic teams at Lafayette, first beginning competition in 1865, the same year that the Civil War ended. Following that initial undefeated season that included just two games in the month of November, the Lafayette baseball program has been churning our important moments in Lafayette history, including four appearances in the College World Series and nine appearances in the NCAA Regionals, with the most recent regional appearance coming in 2007.

In recent seasons, current head coach Joe Kinney has taken Lafayette beyond the level of respectability to that of a Patriot League championship program. In the last six seasons, Lafayette has made four appearances in the three-team field of the Patriot League Tournament. The 2007 season was a historic success, as the Leopards won a program-best 33 games and their first-ever Patriot League title. That championship was made possible by a 2006 season in which Lafayette won 27 games, the third-highest win total in program history. In 2004, Lafayette advanced past the first round and on to the Patriot League Tournament Championship Series. Also in 2004, Tom Soldan '04 made history by throwing the 10th no-hitter in program history, a 1-0 victory over Holy Cross.

Jeff Antolick and Jeff Mutis are recent Lafayette graduates who found a place in professional baseball. A 1993 graduate, Antolick was taken by the New York Yankees in 15th round of the 1992 draft.

In 1988, Mutis was the 27th player selected overall in the Major League draft when he was picked by the Cleveland Indians. A lefthanded pitcher, Mutis played two seasons (1991-93) with the Indians before being traded to the Florida Marlins where he played the 1994 season.

Former Lafayette baseball player Joe Maddon was the bench coach for the World Series champion Anaheim Angels and recently took over the managerial reins of the Tampa Bay Devil Rays.

Currently, the Lafayette Maroon Club Hall of Fame is comprised of 14 baseball players most of whom went on to play in the Major Leagues and two baseball coaches who are enshrined in coaching halls of fame.

Mike Gazella enjoyed perhaps the most successful run of all Lafayette graduates in the Major Leagues, playing for the New York Yankees' world championship teams in 1923 and 1928 and what is considered one of, if not the best teams of all time, the 1927 Yankees.

A host of Lafayette players from the past have made it not only to the majors, but varying levels of the minor leagues, including Dick Fitzgerald who played for the Baltimore Orioles' Triple A affiliate for several years.

Lafayette has a tradition of legendary coaches; namely Bill Coughlin and Charlie Gelbert. Coughlin came to Lafayette after a highly-successful pro baseball career with the Detroit Tigers. He had just one losing season in 23 years and ended his coaching career with a 273-134 record while coaching four Major Leaguers.

A World Series star for the St. Louis Cardinals' "Gas House Gang," Gelbert went on to coach for more than two decades at Lafayette where his teams compiled a record of 307-172 in 21 seasons. Gelbert guided teams to five District II titles and an equal number of College World Series appearances. He also molded seven student-athletes into All-American baseball players.

Other top coaches include recent Penn State coach Joe Hindelang who coached Mutis and Antolick and was head coach from 1983-90 and his predecessor Norm Gigon who coached the Leopards from 1968-82.

In its second decade of combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors 23 sports – 11 for men and 12 for women.

Initially started as a NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990 and includes American, Army, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh and Navy as full members, and Fordham and Georgetown as associate members in football.

These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation and their alumni have, and continue to play leadership roles in shaping our country. Since 1998, the Patriot League has ranked first each year among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid in the NCAA Graduation Success Rate report. In addition, the Patriot League finished as one of the nation’s leaders in the NCAA Academic Progress Report (APR) among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid. The APR is used to measure academic eligibility, retention and graduation of student-athletes.

Patriot League student-athletes and teams continue to enjoy success at the national level, with opening round victories coming in several NCAA Championships, including wins in men’s basketball during the 2005 and 2006 seasons, a championship game appearance in both football and men’s lacrosse, and a sixth-place individual finish at the NCAA Cross Country Championship. The Patriot League’s mission is simple, to provide successful, competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards, and to prepare its student-athletes to be leaders in society. During the 2006-07 year, Patriot League student-athletes and teams have accomplished the following;

- Fourteen Patriot League student-athletes were named *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-Americans including Lafayette baseball’s **James Conrad** who was selected to the third team after setting the single-season and career stolen base records at Lafayette.

- A total of 54 Patriot League student-athletes earned *ESPN The Magazine* All-District Academic All-American honors.
- The Lafayette football program won its third straight Patriot League championship and became one of just six schools in the country to reach the NCAA Playoffs each of the last three seasons.
- American field hockey spent the entire season ranked in the top-20 in the NFHC national poll.
- Colgate’s Mike Gallihugh led the Football Championship Subdivision in tackles and was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award.
- The Patriot League had two teams win a game in the NCAA Men’s Soccer Tournament for the first time in its history (Bucknell and Lehigh), with 2006 being the second year it sent multiple teams to the postseason.
- Five Patriot League student-athletes were selected in the MLB draft including Army’s Nick Hill and Milan Dinga, Bucknell’s Jason Buursma and Navy’s Mitch Harris and Jonathan Johnston.
- Navy women’s soccer owned the longest winning streak among NCAA Division I schools, posting 19-straight victories, and captured its first NCAA Tournament victory.
- The Patriot League had two post-season participants in the sport of women’s basketball for the first time since 2002 with Holy Cross playing in the NCAA Tournament and Bucknell in the WNIT.
- Holy Cross’ Keith Simmons was named All-America Honorable Mention by the *Associated Press* in the sport of men’s basketball.
- Four different men’s lacrosse teams spent time in the national polls. Navy ended the year ranked eighth in the nation.
