The Match-Up: No. 25/RV Lafayette makes its first trip to Richmond in two decades (first as a Patriot League opponent) with a 2 p.m. Saturday matchup. Both teams are riding two-game win streaks, with the Leopards winning at Holy Cross (21-13) and at home vs. Colgate (59-42) while Richmond beat Fordham (17-14) at home and Georgetown (31-24) in D.C. Both teams also have rivalry games slated for week 12 with Lafayette hosting Lehigh in Rivalry 161 and Richmond traveling to William & Mary.

Top 25: Lafayette jumped into the Top 25 polls for the first time this season on Nov. 10 following the Colgate win. The Leopards' 2025 poll debut comes at No. 25 in the AFCA FCS Coaches Poll, while they continue to receive votes (69) in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 Poll.

Last Time Out: The Lafayette offense erupted for 533 yards and 59 points in a win over Colgate. Junior RB **Kente Edwards** had 260 yards on 20 carries for three TDs to go along with senior QB **Dean DeNobile's** day that included four passing touchdowns. **Avery Jones** registered two momentum-shifting interceptions in the first half, both resulting in points and the Leopards' largest first-half offensive output (38 points).

Monday Spoils: After the Colgate win, juniors **Kente Edwards** and **Jack Simonetta** were named the Patriot League Offensive and Special Teams Players of the Week, respectively. It's the fifth award of the season for Edwards who ran for a career-best 260 yards. For Simonetta, who was 8-8 on PAT and booted a career-long 49-yard FG, it's his first award of the season and third of his career.

A Grand Performance: **Kente Edwards'** 260-yard day vs. Colgate pushed him over 1,000 yards for the season (accomplishing the feat in seven and a half games). Edwards has 1,032 yards, marking the third straight season that Lafayette has featured a 1,000-yard rusher. He is averaging 129 yards per game and 7.8 yards per carry to go along with 15 TDs .

Getting the Point(s): With two games remaining, Lafayette has eclipsed its 2024 offensive points total (307) with 336. Colgate was the Leopards' fourth game in 2025 scoring 40-plus. Within the Patriot League, the Maroon and White boast the second-leading scoring offense, averaging 33.6 ppg (Lehigh, 33.7 ppg). Lafayette's sits 26th in the NCAA.

Patriot, Past, Present and Future: Lafayette is 5-0 in Patriot League play for the first time since 1994. The Leopards finished conference action 5-0 in 1994, 1992 and 1988, only playing five league games for the season. Lafayette is playing seven conference games in 2025 (the first time since 2003), with the addition of Richmond and will play nine league games in 2026 when Villanova and William & Mary join Richmond and Georgetown as associate members.

With a Win on Saturday, Lafayette Would:

- notch program win No. 714
- improve to 6-0 in Patriot League play for the first time in Lafayette history
- win four straight in the series vs. Richmond which dates back to 1922
- post three-straight victories for second time this season
- manage the program's second-highest season win total (8) in John Troxell's four seasons

Interviews

Media Availability: Head coach John Troxell and members of the team will be available each Tuesday at noon for weekly media luncheons in Pfenning Alumni Center.

Media members wishing to attend practice should contact Phil LaBella for availability and to pre-arrange interviews.

Cyber Lunch: Clips of the weekly media luncheon will be available on GoLeopards.com and also on social media shortly after its conclusion. Audio files are also available upon request.

Post-game Interviews: Post-game interviews will typically be held on Fisher Field. In event of inclement weather, interviews will be moved into Bourger Varsity Football House.

TD Records: Lafayette's single-season touchdowns record is 16 shared by Joe McCourt (2004), Tom Costello (1989) and Jamar Curtis (2024). With his 13th, 14th and 15th TDs of the season vs. Colgate, **Kente Edwards** moved into fourth, needing one more score to tie for first and two more to hold the record on his own.

Getting His Kicks: Junior K **Jack Simonetta** booted a career-long 49-yard field goal against Colgate, to improve to 5-of-5 on the season. It was the longest of his career by nine yards. He is also currently 45-of-46 on PAT's this season.

Edwards Nationally Ranked: Junior RB **Kente Edwards** leads the nation in rushing yards per carry (7.82), is third in the nation in rushing TDs (15) and scoring (11.3), fourth in rushing yards per game (129), sixth in all-purpose yards (137.4) and eighth in total rushing yards (1,032).

On the Sideline: **John Troxell '94** is in his fourth season at the helm of his alma mater's football program, a tenure that includes a Patriot League title and NCAA playoff berth in his second season. That 2023 campaign saw the Leopards post the most wins in a campaign in more than 40 years. The team went from 4-7 (3-3 PL) in year one (2022) to 9-3 (5-1 PL) in year two (2023). Both seasons were capped by wins over archrival Lehigh. During his time on College Hill, Troxell's teams have finished .500 or better in three of four seasons.

Troxell was named the Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2023 and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

Gadson Goin' Clubbin': Soph. CB **Ryan Gadson** has been one of the top defensive contributors, despite suffering an injury in week two that required surgery and forced him to miss two games. He has returned to the lineup with his wrist/hand taped like a club and has played in the last five games. The Fort Myers, Fla. native is second on the team in tackles (51) and has interceptions in each of his last two games. He is tied for first in the Patriot League with 11 passes defended (8 PBU and 3 INT).

Positive Trends: The Leopards are 6-1 when scoring first, when leading at halftime and when committing fewer turnovers (with Oregon State the lone outlier). Lafayette is 6-0 when rushing for 200+ yards and 5-0 when hitting for 400+ yards of total offense.

Get a Hand On It: Senior LB **Tighe Cummiskey** collected his second punt block of the season at Oregon State, pacing the Patriot League and ranking fourth in the nation.

Historically Accurate: Leopard QB **Dean DeNobile** sits third at Lafayette in career completion percentage (64.9%) trailing only Ryan O'Neil '12 (66.50%) and Drew Reed '17 (65.2%). He lands fifth in Patriot League history behind O'Neil and Reed, as Lafayette has three of the top five most accurate passers in Patriot League history.

All three seasons that DeNobile has been a starter rank in the top 15 for single-season completion percentage: 66.7 for sixth in '23, 65.1 for eighth in '24 and 63.1 for 13th in '25.

500 Club: Lafayette's win at Holy Cross guaranteed the Leopards at least a .500 record for the third-straight season. The only sub-.500 season in the **John Troxell** era was his first campaign when the team went 4-7 overall and 3-3 in PL play after inheriting a 3-8 team.

Three For 10: With his 15-yard score against Oregon State, freshman **Matthew Scerbo** made it three consecutive games with a touchdown reception. Scerbo is still second on the team in receiving touchdowns, behind **Elijah Steward** (4).

Catching Up: Senior **Eli Steward** has ascended the career receiving ranks. With a four-catch, 68-yard day vs. Oregon State, he moved into fourth place with 2,246 career receiving yards after advancing into second for career completions (172) against Bucknell. He also sits in 10th place for career receiving touchdowns (12). Steward needs 22 catches to climb past Mark Ross '14 to become the career receptions leader and 139 receiving yards to surpass Phil Yarberough '01 in third.

Record-Breaking Outing: Lafayette racked up a school-record 670 yards of total offense to dominate Bucknell 62-24 on Oct. 11. **Dean DeNobile** threw for a career-best five touchdowns on his way to 316 passing yards. The Leopards also featured two 100-yard rushers in **Ethan Weber** (136) and **Jakyre Henley** (107) to grind out 348 rushing yards. Six different players scored touchdowns with Weber, Henley and **Elijah Steward** adding two scores apiece. The Leopards had three, one-play scoring drives, as **Jason Penza** (79), Weber (67) and Henley (70) all ran in scores to start and end drives.

The 62-point eruption was the highest single-game scoring output since 1944, when the Leopards shut out Lehigh 64-0 to close out the campaign.

Bicentennial Excursion: Lafayette's trip to Oregon State was part of the school's Bicentennial, taking several Lafayette's athletic teams to non-traditional locales in 2025-26. Corvallis, Ore. is the farthest west that a Lafayette team traveled in 144 seasons. The previous western boundary game was Colorado Springs, Colo. vs. Air Force (9/4/21).

DeNobile Dialed In: Senior QB **Dean DeNobile** put together consecutive 300-yard passing games. Versus Fordham, he completed 25-of-35 for 314 yards with two touchdowns to a season-high nine targets. Against Bucknell, he hit on 26-of-34 for 316 yards (spread around to eight receivers) and a career-best five TD strikes. His Bucknell performance pushed him over 6,000 career passing yards and earned him Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week honors for the first time this season. Against Colgate, he tossed four TD passes.

Solid Starts: Lafayette has begun its last three seasons with a 3-1 mark, a solid number considering that the loss in each of those campaigns came at the hands of an FBS foe.

Third-Down Offense: The Leopards have made the most of their third-down opportunities, ranking second in the league and 13th in the country in third-down conversion rate (.471).

One-Two Punch: RBs **Kente Edwards** and **Ethan Weber** are responsible for 138 of the Leopards' 336 points. The duo has contributed 23 total TD's and 1,630 rushing yards.

Racking Up The Sacks: The Leopards' revitalized pass rush has tallied 22 sacks. **Jaylon Joseph** has set a new single-season high (7.5) while **Olivier Camerlain**, **Robert Stevens**, **Darien Riley** and **Darson Jeanty** each have at least two. Twelve Leopards have registered sacks. *(In 2024, nine players contributed for a total of 12 sacks).*

Limiting the Run: Lafayette's youthful defense, which returned just one starter, has had success limiting the run game. The Leopards have allowed 130.2 yards per game for the season (third in the PL), but just **97.5 ypg against FCS opponents**.

The Opponent: Richmond (6-4, 3-3) welcomes Lafayette after a 31-24 win over Georgetown. The Spiders are on a two-game win streak (17-14 win against Fordham on Nov. 1) and have tallied wins over Colgate (24-19), Howard (13-12), VMI (38-14) and Wofford (14-10) with losses to No. 14 Lehigh (21-14) in the season opener, FBS North Carolina (41-6), Bucknell (33-28) and Holy Cross (28-22).

Richmond often uses a pair of quarterbacks to run the offense. Kyle Wickersham has seen the majority of the snaps (105-of-159, 990 yards, 5 TD), while Ashton Snelsire (42-of-78, 705 yards, 8 TD touchdowns) also has spent time as the signal caller.

Soph. Isaiah Dawson has 35 receptions for 472 yards and four scores, both of which are team highs. Tailback Aziz Foster-Powell takes a bulk of the carries, rushing for 501 yards on 104 attempts.

LB Peyton Seelman (106 tackles) leads a Spider defense that's allowing less than 300 yards of offense.

Russ Huesman (Chattanooga '83) is in his ninth year patrolling the Richmond sideline.

6th for 6K: With 316 passing yards vs. Bucknell, **Dean DeNobile** became the sixth Leopard quarterback to surpass 6,000 yards. The senior previously eclipsed 5,000 yards against Columbia. DeNobile reached 4,000 yards in week 11 of 2024.

Under Center: **Dean DeNobile** has started 34 of 35 games the last three seasons. The Upper Saddle River, N.J. native completed 67 percent of his throws for nearly 2,000 yards with 20 touchdowns to five interceptions while helping lead the Leopards to a conference title in 2023. The former walk-on led the conference and was 13th in the nation in completion percentage and 14th in passing efficiency (154.4). DeNobile tossed three TDs and ran for another to garner game MVP honors vs. Lehigh (11/18) and secure his third Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week honor. Against Bucknell, he threw four TDs (the first Leopard to do so since 2015) in the second quarter to four different receivers in a 56-point effort.

In 2024, the captain was a preseason All-Patriot League selection. In his home state taking on Monmouth in week two, the QB completed 31-of-45 for 394 yards with two TDs, all career highs. DeNobile earned Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week honors after his performance in the Leopards' home-opener against Marist, completing 87 percent of his throws for 241 yards and a TD.

A Grand Performance: Kente Edwards hit the 1,000-yard mark for the first time in his career during the week nine matchup with Colgate. His 49-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter put him over the 1000-yard plateau. The Government and Law major finished the sun swept fall afternoon with a career-high 260 yards on 20 carries with three touchdowns.

26 On the Run to Player of the Week: Junior RB Kente Edwards piled up three straight 100-yard rushing games (the third-straight season a Leopard running back has achieved that feat) and was named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week each of those times. Edwards had a 150-yard, three-touchdown effort vs. Columbia in week four. At Georgetown (9/13), he had 255 yards with four touchdowns (both career highs). It was the 13th 200-yard game since 1990 and first since 2023, and his four-rushing-TD performance was the first since 2006. Edwards ran for 127 yards at Stonehill in his first career start. At Holy Cross, Edwards carried the ball a career-high 28 times for 146 yards and two TD's to garner his fourth weekly award. Versus Colgate, he churned out a career-best 260 yards and three TD en route to his fifth of award of the season.

National Recognition: ESPN's *College Football Final* handed out a helmet sticker to Kente Edwards following the Georgetown game (9/13). His 255-yard rushing day placed him fourth (now fifth) on the Lafayette single-game rushing chart (the first player since Ross Scheuerman in 2014 to join the list). It was the first 200-yard rushing game since 2023.

Single-Game Output: Kente Edwards' 260-yard rushing day vs. Colgate is the third-high single-game effort in Lafayette history, just surpassing his own 255-yard performance at Georgetown. It is one of just 14 200-yards games in Lafayette history.



Edwards Churns Out 100+ Games: Junior Kente Edwards has five career 100-yard rushing games (all coming in 2025). The Garden State native and Government and Law major has enjoyed a breakout season in 2025, running for 1,032 yards while scoring 15 touchdowns.

John Troxell '94 | Fred M. Kirby '42 Head Football Coach | 4th Season at Lafayette, 20th Overall



John Troxell '94 is in his fourth season as the Fred M. Kirby II '42 Head Football Coach. Troxell is the 29th coach in the program's history, third who is an alum.

The Leopards are coming off a 2024 campaign in which the program climbed as high as No. 14 in the national polls while garnering eight all-league selections and two All-America laurels.

2023 saw the Leopards progress ahead of schedule. In his second campaign, Troxell guided Lafayette to a Patriot League title. Lafayette ran to a 9-3 record, surpassing the single-season win total from the previous 40 years. The Maroon and White jumped back into the top 25 polls for the first time since 2009, entering the

rankings after a win at No. 11 Holy Cross that snapped the Crusaders' 18-game conference winning streak. Lafayette ascended as high as No. 16 and finished at No. 19 in the AFCA Poll and 21st in the Stats Perform poll.

The 2023 season saw Billy Shaeffer, Jamar Curtis, Saiku White and Ryder Langsdale garner All-America status. Shaeffer was named to the final three in the nation for the Buck Buchanan award after leading the conference with 10 sacks (the second-most ever in a season at Lafayette and 10th in the nation) and 21.5 tackles for loss (fourth in the nation). Curtis was tagged as a finalist for the Walter Payton Award, finishing second in the nation in rushing (1,460 yards) to set a new Lafayette single-season rushing record. White helped guide a defense that led the league in scoring, rushing and red-zone defense.

Shaeffer, Curtis and White were among 12 Leopards named to the All-Patriot League teams. Jaylon Joseph earned League Rookie of the Year honors (the 12th in program history) and was selected as a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award. Troxell was the Patriot League Coach of the Year and singled out as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year after the swift turnaround.

He began re-shaping the program in 2022 with a third-place conference finish, despite an offense that was significantly affected by injuries. Lafayette opened with a shutout of Sacred Heart in Troxell's debut and added league road victories over Bucknell and Colgate before wrapping the season with a victory over Lehigh. The Leopards also took NCAA quarterfinalist Holy Cross to the wire in a 24-21 final. In 2022, Troxell saw Malik Hamm earn Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year honors, as the conference's first five-time All-Patriot League selection, before signing with the Baltimore Ravens.

Troxell came to College Hill after a 16-year head coaching stint at Franklin and Marshall College where he molded the program into a consistent winner. Prior to his arrival at the Lancaster, Pa. school in 2006, F&M had managed one winning season in the previous 13 campaigns. Four years later, after a full recruiting cycle, the Diplomats finished with a 9-2 record and have continued to climb, subsequently reaching the postseason on nine occasions.

Troxell was twice named the Centennial Conference Coach of the Year, winning most recently in 2017 and 2009 when he was also a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year national award. The program's high-water mark came in 2017 when the team was 10-1 and captured its conference championship. That season kicked off a span from 2017-21 when Troxell and Franklin and Marshall posted a cumulative mark of 31-13. In his 16 seasons, Troxell posted a 92-67 overall record, ranking second in career coaching wins at the school where he coached 111 all-conference selections.

Troxell has been a key ingredient in program rebuilds at each of his stops, and his time on College Hill as an assistant coach on Frank Tavani's staff was no exception. He served various roles as the running backs coach, recruiting coordinator and special teams coach from 2001-05. His selection as the recruiting coordinator in 2003 helped kick off a stretch of three straight titles for the Leopards in 2004, 2005 and 2006 that coincided with the program's first three NCAA FCS Playoff appearances.

As an assistant at Lafayette, he mentored 2004 Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year Joe McCourt '05 to a record-setting career. McCourt, the

2001 Patriot League Rookie of the Year, concluded his career as Lafayette's and the Patriot League's all-time leader with 50 rushing touchdowns and was second on the school's all-time rushing list with 4,474 yards while earning All-America honors in 2002 and 2004. He also mentored Brandon Stanford '06 who set the current Lafayette single-season record for punt return yardage and ranks 11th in career receiving.

Prior to Lafayette, Troxell was part of a dramatic reversal at Muhlenberg College from 1997-2000 under head coach Mike Donnelly. He served multiple roles, working as the special teams coordinator (1997-99), quarterbacks coach and wide receivers coach (1997-2000) and offensive coordinator (2000). Muhlenberg progressed from a 1-9 season in 1997 to the Eastern College Athletic Conference title with a record of 9-2 in 2000.

Troxell joined the Muhlenberg staff after serving as an assistant coach for three seasons (1994-96) at Columbia under head coach Ray Tellier, beginning his career path of coaching at elite academic institutions. In 1996, Troxell oversaw a secondary that recorded the third-best passing defense in the country. The turnaround tendency first showed itself at Columbia in 1994 when the Ivy League school recorded its first winning season in 23 seasons. An 8-2 mark and the program's best finish in 15 years followed in 1996.

His first extended stint on College Hill came as a student-athlete from 1990-94, when he earned his bachelor's degree in government and law. Troxell was the starting free safety on the Leopards' 1992 Patriot League title team and received the Unsung Hero Award as a senior. He completed his master's degree in sociology and education in 1997 while on staff at Columbia.

A Phillipsburg, N.J. native, the 53-year-old Troxell and his wife, Pamela, have two daughters, Summer and Capri, both of whom attend Lafayette.

Dee Making Impact: LB **Beckham Dee's** impact has been immediate. He has a team-leading 58 tackles in 10 starts. Dee, who transferred from Penn State after one season, comes from a football family, as his father was a quarterback at Carnegie Mellon. After graduation, Dee's early career plans include working as an investment banker.

FBS Foes: For the first time since 1993 (Buffalo and Army), Lafayette faced two FBS foes (Bowling Green, Oregon State). Lafayette opened 2024 at Buffalo and faced No. 21 Duke in week two of 2023. The Leopards have sprinkled in FBS opponents intermittently over the last eight seasons, playing Army in 2016 and 2018, Air Force in 2021 and Temple in 2022. The Leopards are slated to play Connecticut, Air Force and Akron in the coming seasons.

Special Score: The Leopards' punt return/block unit made its presence known vs. Fordham. **Tighe Cummiskey** blocked a third-quarter punt which **Dylan Aguilera** collected and returned 18 yards for a touchdown (the first for the Leopards in 2025).

Safe at Safety: Soph. **Kevin Dodard** has started every game at free safety. Dodard has broken up eight passes (third in the Patriot League) and picked off two (11th in the PL).

Runaway Road Win: The Leopards rolled up 319 rushing yards at Stonehill led by junior RB **Kente Edwards** in his first career start. The Annandale, N.J. native carried the ball 12 times for 127 yards and three scores. He scored on runs of 4, 2 and 78 yards. It was the Leopards' first 70-yard running play since Nov. 11, 2023. For his work, Edwards was named the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week.

It was also the first time since Sept. 30, 2023 that Lafayette had 300-plus rushing yards (316 vs. Bucknell). Junior **Ethan Weber** had six carries for 77 and a TD, while **Jason Penza** (6-47) and **Dean DeNobile** (4-13) added rushing TD's of their own.

Strong Leg: Junior **Christian Bush** took over the punting duties in 2025 and recorded a 57-yard punt in each of the first two games. Those boots surpassed the Leopards' longest punt of 2024 (51 yards). He is currently averaging 41.0 yards per punt, recording eight punts of 50-plus yards while landing 13 inside the 20-yard line (including three vs. Fordham). His season-long effort was a 67-yarder vs. Bucknell.

Persing Performs: On a day that was dominated by the Leopards' run game at Stonehill, senior WR **Carson Persing** had five catches for a career-best 108 receiving yards. He reeled in a 52-yard catch with five minutes left in the third that set up Lafayette's final score. Against Fordham, Persing ripped off a 63-yard catch.

Hosak @ TE: Junior **Ethan Hosak** has started all but two games this season. The Economics major opened the season by reeling in two passes for 30 yards, including 24 yards after the catch. In 2024, he had nine catches for 65 yards and three touchdowns as a sophomore. In 2025, he has 13 catches for 142 yards and two TDs.

Going The Extra Mile: Lafayette will travel 4,508 miles in the 2025 campaign to face off against its opponents. The trip to Oregon State is the longest in the program's history, with 2,922 miles separating the two schools. The shortest distance Lafayette traveled for a road game was 213 miles to Georgetown.

Get To Know 15: **Jason Penza** is a sophomore QB from Crystal Lake, Ill. This past summer, Penza had an externship and performed research focusing in finance. In addition to football, Penza plays the guitar and the piano, and almost turned professional in wakeboarding.

Penza received plenty of action as a freshman when O.C. **T.J. DiMuzio** used him as a dual-threat option. In seven games, Penza ran 28 times for 171 yards, 52 of which came against Bucknell (11/2). He also completed 5-of-6 for 31 yards. In the 2025 season opener, he ran five times for 23 yards and also completed 2-of-2 for six yards and followed with an 18-yard completion at Stonehill to go along with six carries for 47 yards and a TD. Against Bucknell, Penza ripped off a 79-yard touchdown run and finished the game with 94 rushing yards.



Captains of the Ship: Seniors **Dean DeNobile, Elijah Steward, Brian Baucia** and **Phillip Peiffer** all were selected as recipients of the Chris LaPietra '89 Captain Award ahead of the 2025 slate.



For DeNobile, it's the second straight season that the QB has been named team captain. Steward earns captaincy after leading the Lafayette offense in receiving for the third straight season. Baucia returns to anchor the interior of the offensive line, a position that he's held for 33 games over three seasons. Peiffer returned to Easton for a fifth season after a season-ending injury in 2024.

700 Level: The Lafayette football program reached the 700-win plateau with the dominating victory over Lehigh in the 2023 regular-season finale. The Leopards, whose inaugural season was 1882, ranked 51st among all levels of college football with 706 wins entering the season.

— PRESEASON NOTES —

Local Flavor: Since **John Troxell** took over in 2022, he has placed an emphasis on retaining local talent from the greater Lehigh Valley region. Troxell, a Phillipsburg graduate, added his alma mater's **Matthew Scerbo** as part of the Class of '29.

Nazareth has accounted for the most recent surge in local recruiting as OL **Sean Kinney** was a member of the Class of 2028 and started 11 games in his rookie season, joining WR **Mason Kuehner** who played in every game with four starts and took over return duties. This season, Troxell welcomes WR **Caleb Newsome** from Nazareth, all of whom played for Leopard alum Tom Falzone '00. Junior **Sean Wilson** is an Easton native who started six games at right tackle in 2024, one of three players from Easton along with junior QB **Peyton Cosover** and senior LB **Jack Bayly**.

Junior **Ethan Hosak**, who started the opener at Bowling

Green at tight end, played at Allentown Central Catholic, while rookie LB **Justin Peluso** hails from Freedom High School in Bethlehem, having played for Jason Roeder, brother of current Lafayette passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach **Ryan Roeder**.

Preseason All-Patriot League: Senior WR **Elijah Steward** and junior LS **Dylan Aguilera** garnered Preseason All-Patriot League honors. For Steward, the nomination marks consecutive preseason all-conference selections. The Galloway, N.J. native followed up the honor in 2024 with a season that earned him a spot on the All-Patriot League Second-Team. Aguilera was chosen for the honor for the first time in his career after starting in all 12 games last year, joining Steward on the All-Patriot League Second-Team. In addition to serving as the long snapper, Aguilera is also playing on the kickoff unit.

The Patriot Poll: Lafayette was picked fifth in the Patriot League preseason poll announced July 23. The ballot, voted on by conference coaches and sports information directors, placed the Leopards (47) behind Lehigh (97), Richmond (83), Holy Cross (78) and Bucknell (51) and ahead of Georgetown (32), Colgate (31) and Fordham (29). In 2024, Lafayette was selected first in the preseason poll and finished fourth.

Lining Up: Lafayette used six different starting lineups on the offensive line in 2024 (due to injuries). By contrast, the Leopards employed one starting front five for all of 2023. The Leopards sent out nine linemen as starters in 2024 using Ryder Langsdale (LT), **Brian Baucia** (LG), **Sean Kinney** (C), **Reed Collins** (RG) and **Sean Wilson** (RT) as the front five in the final six games. All but Langsdale, who transferred to Rutgers, return to the fold.

Hall of Fame Weekend: The Lafayette Maroon Club will hold its annual Hall of Fame Induction Dinner on the eve of Rivalry 161. Penny (Erisman/Ferency) Bermender '91, James Conrad '07, Deanna DiCroce '13, Mike Joseph '88, Matt Lancor '88 and Bill Lawson will be inducted into the Maroon Club Hall of Fame's Class of 2025-26 during the Hall of Fame Dinner on Friday, Nov. 21 at Kirby Sports Center.

Joseph was a defensive back at Lafayette, later returning as the program's defensive backs coach and recruiting coordinator from 1992-2002. As a freshman, he was the program's rookie of the year. The Allentown, Pa. native led the Colonial League in interceptions (7) in 1986 and ranked 16th nationally. He set the fifth-best single-season mark by modern Patriot League history standards and claimed second place on Lafayette's all-time single-season interceptions list.

Over his four years, he became Lafayette's all-time leader in picks and was named the team MVP while garnering All-Colonial League First-Team honors in 1987. The Industrial Engineering major left College Hill with a 22-22 overall record. He was also a member of the Phi Gamma Delta fraternity.

Joseph then earned his master's degree from Villanova in addition to working as a football assistant coach under Andy Talley for two years. During his return tenure on the Leopard staff starting in 1992, he continued to shape the program alongside Hall of Fame head coach Bill Russo. Joseph was privileged to recruit and guide over five future Hall of Fame players as well.

In 2009, he went on to be the lead color analyst for Astound Television (formerly RCN), broadcasting local Lehigh Valley high school and Lafayette College football for the past 16 years.

Front Five: The offensive line is led by senior captain **Brian Baucia**, who started 33 games over three seasons entering 2025. Sophomore **Sean Kinney**, slots in at center after seeing time at both right and left guard in his freshman campaign and starting the final six games at center. Junior **Sean Wilson**, who played the final six games of 2024 at right tackle, slides down the line to left tackle.

Senior **Reed Collins** sticks at right tackle after starting all 12 games in 2024. Next to Collins is senior **Spencer Adams**, who appeared in nine games while making five starts. Junior **Michael Dincher** will fill in at both guard spots as a backup after action in five contests. Junior **Addison Hoffman** and sophomore **Connor Gaines** serve as the backup tackles, while rookie **Parker Moss** will be the reserve center.

Running The Ball: After producing a 1,000-yard rusher in back-to-back seasons, head coach **John Troxell** will deal with a completely revamped running back room.

Junior **Kente Edwards** steps into the role of lead back. While mainly appearing on special teams, the Annandale, N.J. native made the most of his limited snaps. Edwards averaged 8.5 yards on eight carries, racking up 68 yards on the ground.

Junior **Ethan Weber** tallied 20 attempts in the run game in 2024, collecting 97 yards in addition to 211 kick return yards. After switching from WR to RB in the spring, sophomore **Jakyre Henley** will serve as a third option in the backfield.

The D Line: The defensive line has a new look in 2025. Leading the unit is senior captain and defensive tackle **Phillip Peiffer**, who returns for a fifth season on College Hill after a season-ending injury in 2024. Prior to the injury, Peiffer racked up 10 tackles in two games.

Junior **Jaylon Joseph**, the only returning starter from last year's defense, moves to defensive end, bringing 20 tackles and seven TFLs with him. After missing nine games to injury, junior **Ahmir Crawley** takes over at nose tackle. Lining up at the other defensive end position is junior **Darien Riley** after appearing in all 12 games last season.

Junior **Michael Vaughn** and sophomores **Olivier Camerlain** and **Dominic Selvitelli** also return to the defensive line mix, and will see time at tackle. Transfers **Callahan Blair** and **Joey Shimko** join the defense with the goal of solidifying the edges.

QB Corps: Senior captain **Dean DeNobile** reprises his role as signal caller for the Maroon and White in 2025. A three-year starter and two-time captain, DeNobile entered the campaign in ninth in both career passing yards and completions. The Upper Saddle River, N.J. native reached new highs in 2024, going 226-of-347 for 2,417 yards (a career high) and 14 touchdowns. DeNobile ranked 24th in the nation in completion percentage (65.1) and 23rd in completions per game (18.8).

Soph. **Jason Penza** took over as QB2 midway through the season and made the most of his opportunities. Primarily being used as a running option, Penza carried 28 times for 171 yards, including 52 yards against Bucknell. The Crystal Lake Ill. native attempted six passes, completing five of them for 31 yards.

Junior **Daniel Lipovski** enters the fold for the Leopards after transferring from Delaware. The Burke, Va. native saw limited time at Delaware, appearing in three games over two seasons. In high school, Lipovski was a two-year starter who threw for 5,800 yards and 66 touchdowns.

In the Classroom: Lafayette athletic programs continue to excel on a national level. The Nov. 2024 release of the NCAA Division I annual Graduation Success Rate (GSR) report shined a light on those academic achievements.

Lafayette claimed a 97 percent GSR overall for its 19 sports measured while 16 Leopard teams achieved a graduation success rate of 100 percent.

In addition to those programs with perfect GSR scores, the Leopard football program had the eighth best score (93) in the country. Lafayette joined schools from the SEC, ACC, CAA, Big Ten and the Ivy League in the top 10.

It Tolls for Thee: “The Bell” has become a fixture on the Lafayette sideline. In lieu of a turnover chain, title belt, etc., head coach John Troxell supplied a bell which players ring after securing a turnover or scoring a touchdown or a field goal.

Welcome Home: The Leopards added several student-athletes from the transfer portal prior to the season. QB **Daniel Lipovski** and RB **Payton Greer** come to Easton from Delaware and Arkansas State, respectively.

Defensively, the Maroon and White welcomed DL **Joey Shimko** from Bowling Green, LB **Beckham Dee** from Penn State and DL **Callahan Blair** from Vanderbilt. All three bolster the trenches and revitalize the Leopard pass rush.

In the Top 25 in 2024: Lafayette was ranked in the top 25 in the first four weeks of 2024 before a loss at eventual Ivy League champ Columbia knocked the Leopards out of both polls. Lafayette debuted at 17th (Stats) and 18th (AFCA), rising as high as No. 14 in the AFCA FCS Coaches Poll.

In 2023, Lafayette peaked at No. 16 on Oct. 30, the highest any Leopard team had reached in the Patriot League era.

Weekly Awards: Lafayette pulled down a pair of Patriot League weekly awards following the Marist win. Junior QB **Dean DeNobile** was the Offensive Player of the Week, while freshman defensive back **Xavier Johnson** was named Rookie of the Week.

DeNobile completed his first 14 passes en route to a 20-of-23 day that included 241 yards and a touchdown. He did not play the final 27 minutes.

Johnson has played every game on special teams and in the defensive backfield. In the first quarter, Johnson recovered a blocked punt in the endzone for a TD to start off the Leopards' scoring. In the third quarter, the Muscle Shoals, Ala. native picked off his first career pass.

Senior CB **Gabe DuBois** was named Defensive POW (10/7) after posting nine tackles and five pass breakups, including three on the final drive, in a win at Fordham.

Early Scoring Frenzy: Lafayette's offense erupted for a combined 96 points against Monmouth (40) and Marist (56). The last time the Leopards scored at least 96 points over a two-game span was October 1986 when Lafayette rang up 103 points in road victories over Davidson (51) and Bucknell (52).

National Notice: WR **Elijah Steward** was named the Stats Perform FCS National Offensive Player of the Week and the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week following a performance with 15 catches (school record) for a career-high 244 yards at Monmouth (9/7). The Galloway, N.J. native had receptions of 42, 39 and 21 yards with 102 yards after the catch. In total, he reeled in seven catches of 15-plus yards. Steward snapped the previous school record for receptions in a game: 13 shared by Mark Layton (2010) and Mark Ross (2012). His performance was also the first 200+ yard receiving day for the program since 2006.

Early Returns: Then freshman **Mason Kuehner** came in hot on special teams in the home opener vs. Marist. The Nazareth, Pa. native ripped off a 58-yard punt return for a touchdown, the first punt return for a TD since CJ Amill in 2018. In 2024, the Economics major had 16 punt returns for 200 yards and a TD and three kick returns for 38 yards.

Running the Ball: Lafayette averaged 160.8 rushing yards per game in 2024 (47th in the nation). Jamar Curtis accounted for most of the yards, racking up 1,139 yards (94.9 ypg) for his second straight 1000-yard rushing season. Troy Bruce managed 390 yards as the backup, while QB Jason Penza contributed 171 yards on the ground.

Passing the Ball: Lafayette averaged 209.5 passing yards per game in 2024 (60th in the nation among 123 schools). Dean DeNobile managed all but 97 of the team's passing yards on the season, throwing for 2,417 yards while completing 65 percent (226-347) with 14 touchdowns and 12 interceptions.

— ALL-TIME NOTES —

Lafayette’s Football Inventors: Two primary elements of the game of football -- the helmet and the huddle -- were invented by former members of the Lafayette football program. **George “Rose” Barclay** from the Class of 1898, one of Lafayette’s all-time great running backs, invented the helmet when the “threat of cultivating cauliflower ears” led him to piece three thick leather straps around his head for an 1894 game against Penn.

Former Lafayette coach **Herb McCracken** (1924-35; 59-40-6) is often credited with calling the first huddle system during the 1924 season after learning the Penn football team had stolen Lafayette’s signals. Lafayette “huddled” before each play and this system was immediately adopted by other teams. (*Several other schools also claim the huddle*).

The Football Helmet: At the school credited with inventing the football helmet, a quick look at the 2025 version shows maroon player numbers on the right side of the helmet and a Leopard head with the “L” on the left with a metallic stripe down the middle.

On the back of the helmet, a decal highlights the school’s Bicentennial celebration for which the official kick-off coincides with Lafayette’s week-five matchup. Two other decals honor Tom Kirchhoff ’93 and No. 80 Brian Keller ’16.

Patriot League Titles: Lafayette has won eight Patriot League championships in the history of the league (1988, 1992, 1994, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2013, 2023). The 2004-06 titles led to three straight NCAA Playoff appearances, making Lafayette one of six teams in the country to appear in the 16-team field in three consecutive years.

At It A While: Since fielding its first college football team in the fall of 1882 (the same year that coward Robert Ford shot Jesse James in the back and that Tchaikovsky’s *1812 Overture* debuted), Lafayette has had a proud gridiron tradition on the way to a total of **713 victories (713-649-39)**. Lafayette ranked 51st among all college football teams in all-time wins entering the 2025 season, posting its first win in 1883 (25-0 vs. Rutgers). Lafayette accumulated 100 victories by 1900, 200 by 1915 and 300 by 1934. Lafayette is in its 144th season.

Patriot League Football: The Patriot League is in its 39th season as a football conference and is comprised of Bucknell, Colgate, Fordham, Georgetown, Holy Cross, Lehigh and Richmond. Fordham, Georgetown and Richmond are associate members in the 10-team all-sport conference which includes Army, Navy, American, Boston University and Loyola (Md.). American, Boston and Loyola do not field football programs and Army and Navy football compete in the FBS. Villanova and William & Mary are slated to join the conference as associate members in football in 2026.

- The league is known for its academic priority, perennially finishing at or near the top spot in the NCAA’s Graduate Rate Report and in APR rankings.
- The Patriot League presidents voted in February 2012 to begin allowing scholarships with a maximum of 15 per season until reaching a maximum of 60 equivalencies in any given year. The Class of 2017 represented the Leopards’ first class of scholarship student-athletes during the Patriot League era. Previously, financial aid was awarded based solely on financial need.
- Redshirts are granted only for medical reasons. Typically, there are only a handful of fifth-year seniors on any given squad.

World Series Champion: Lafayette's most famous football alum made his name on the diamond rather than the gridiron. **Joe Maddon '76** was a two-sport athlete at Lafayette. Wearing No. 12, he completed 14-of-17 for four touchdowns in a win over archrival Lehigh in a 1972 freshman game. That was his last football game, as the Hazleton, Pa. native chose to focus on baseball (wearing No. 22). Maddon twice was named the American League Manager of the Year, also earning the honor in the National League (one of seven managers in history to win it in both leagues).

His career-defining moment was guiding the Chicago Cubs to a 2016 World Series title. Maddon last managed the Angels from 2019-22.



Mowins on the Call: Another Lafayette athletic alum has left her mark on the broadcasting industry. On, Sept. 11, 2017, **Beth Mowins '89** became the second woman ever (and the first in 30 years) to broadcast an NFL regular-season game. Mowins joined ESPN in 1994 and has called college football since 2005. She graduated from Lafayette with a degree in English in 1989 after a playing career as a point guard on the basketball team. Mowins was Lafayette's commencement speaker in 2022.

No. 53: Prior to the Harvard game on Oct. 1, 2011, the No. 53 was retired in honor of Fred Morgan Kirby '42, the first retirement of its kind for the football program. Kirby was a member of the 1940 undefeated football team that ran through the likes of Army, Rutgers and Lehigh, while allowing just 33 points in a nine-game slate. After graduating from Lafayette, Kirby served in Europe in World War II and later earned his master's degree from Harvard. He served as the chairman of the Allegheny Corporation for 39 years and was one of the College's most prominent and dedicated alums. Kirby, who passed away in 2011, left behind a legacy of academic, athletic, military, professional, civic and charitable achievements.

No. 80: Brian Keller's No. 80 was retired before the start of the 2015 season. Keller passed away in a car accident in June 2015, just prior to the start of his senior year. No Lafayette player had worn the No. 80 until 2024 when the Keller family reached out to head coach **John Troxell** and asked that the number be put back on the roster. The roster number is empty for 2025.

Historic Fisher Stadium: Fisher Stadium has hosted the College's home football games since 1926. The facility underwent a \$35 million transformation in 2006 and the playing surface was replaced before the 2021 season. A 28' by 47' video board replaced the original 19' by 36' video board prior to the 2024 season.

The Bourger Varsity Football House includes a locker room, offices and team meeting rooms, as well as sports medicine and strength and conditioning areas. Now in its 99th season, Fisher Stadium has been host to **486** Lafayette football games with the Leopards enjoying an overall record of **277-196-13**. Of the previous 98 seasons, Lafayette has produced 13 undefeated home seasons with the most recent a 2-0 mark in the COVID-shortened 2021 spring season. Prior to that, the last team undefeated at home was the 1992 Patriot League champion Leopards who went 5-0 (the first since 1970). During the 1991, 1992 and 1993 seasons, Lafayette won 10-straight home games to tie the Fisher Stadium school record for consecutive wins first set in 1926 and 1927 in the first 10 games ever played in the stadium.

Run Like A Champion: Lafayette has won five Patriot League Championships over the last two decades and the common thread has been the program's ability to run the ball. In 2023, Lafayette averaged 189.7 yards per game led by 1,000-yard rusher Jamar Curtis. Lafayette won three straight titles under head coach Frank Tavani in 2004-06. Kicking off the run in 2004, Lafayette churned out 212.8 rushing yards per game led by **Joe McCourt** who accumulated 1,193 yards with 16 touchdowns. Quarterback **Brad Maurer** was a dual threat, scampering for 643 yards with nine rushing touchdowns. In that season, the Leopards had nine passing touchdowns and 33 scores on the ground.

In 2005, the Leopards were only 15 yards away from having their second consecutive 1,000 yard rusher. RB **Jonathan Hurt** ran for 985 yards and 13 TD on the way to Lafayette's second straight Patriot League title. The Leopards averaged 150.9 rushing yards per game and improved on that number for the 2006 title run. Hurt helped guide the Leopards to a third consecutive NCAA Playoff berth, running for 1,165 yards on 229 attempts while scoring 15 touchdowns. The Leopards averaged 165 rushing yards per game and racked up nearly 2,000 for the season.

In 2013, Lafayette wore down opponents and possessed the ball. **Ross Scheuerman** carried the load with 1,113 rushing yards and 14 touchdowns on 218 carries, guiding Lafayette to a 4-1 conference mark and a Patriot League title.

Greatest Game Never Played: The 1948 football team is enshrined in the Maroon Club Hall of Fame. The team was 7-2 with wins over Fordham, Bucknell, George Washington, Washington and Jefferson, Muhlenberg, Ohio Wesleyan and Lehigh and losses only to No. 6 Army and Rutgers. The team averaged 260.2 rushing yards per game, among the leaders in the East, led by Maroon Club Hall of Fame quarterback Frank Downing '51.

More notably, Lafayette was invited to the Sun Bowl in El Paso, Texas. The College rejected the invitation, however, after the Sun Bowl committee's decision to exclude David Showell '51 from the game because of his race, and the segregation laws in Texas. Showell, who played on offense and defense, served his country in World War II with the Tuskegee Airmen. *The Greatest Game Never Played* (as it was later referred to in a song) helped raise awareness of exclusion of African American players in college football bowl games based on their race.

National Championships: The Lafayette football program has claimed three national championships -- 1896, 1921 and 1926 -- and recorded five undefeated seasons -- 1896 (11-0-1), 1921 (9-0-0), 1926 (9-0-0), 1937 (8-0-0) and 1940 (9-0-0). Of recent note, the Leopards have won eight Patriot League championships -- 1988, 1992, 1994, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2013, 2023 -- and made five appearances in the NCAA FCS Playoffs.

A Tradition of Kicking: Lafayette boasts three of the top five kick scoring leaders in Patriot League history. The most recent addition was **Davis Rodriguez '10** (251 career points). He is fifth in the Patriot League annals for career kick scoring leaders, trailing Holy Cross' Derek Ng (323), Fordham's Michael Marando (283) and fellow Leopards **Jason McLaughlin '95** (255) and **Jim Hodson '91** (254). The trio ranks sixth (Hodson-5.91), seventh (McLaughlin-5.8) and eighth (Rodriguez-5.7) in career kicking points per game.

200+ Rushing Games: Since 1990, there have been 14 200-yard individual rushing performances for the Leopards, six of which were the work of Maroon Club Hall of Fame honoree Erik Marsh '95.

GAME 1 LAFAYETTE 7 BOWLING GREEN 26

BOWLING GREEN, Ohio - The Lafayette defense limited Bowling Green to 265 offensive yards, but the host Falcons used an opening kick-off TD return and held the Leopard run game in check to claim a 26-7 decision on Thursday, in the Leopards earliest ever season opener.

Junior **Robert Stevens** was a big part of the defensive effort, tallying a career-high 11 tackles (surpassing his previous mark of seven). Sophomore **Ryan Gadson** and freshman transfer **Beckham Dee** rang up nine and eight tackles, respectively.

After winning the toss, the Falcons chose to receive. The decision was quickly validated when freshman Cameron Pettaway returned the kickoff 98 yards to the endzone to give the hosts an early 7-0 lead.

The Maroon and White's offense put together a drive after trading three-and-outs. Facing 3rd-and-8, **Dean DeNobile** found RB **Jakyre Henley** on the screen to pick up 12 yards. Immediately after the play, Mother Nature intervened and the game was suspended due to lightning in the area. After 45 minutes, the teams re-took the field. Lafayette picked up right where it left off. DeNobile connected with **Ethan Hosak** for a 22-yard pass. The Leopards couldn't capitalize on the momentum, stopped on 4th-and-2 on the Bowling Green 37-yard line.

The Falcons used the ensuing possession to distance themselves from Lafayette. BGSU head coach, Eddie George, dialed up a 17-play, 51-yard drive that drained 9:08 of game clock, highlighted by 12 different runs. A tackle on second down by Gadson preceded an eight-yard sack on third down by Stevens to force a field goal. The hosts converted their first of four field goals to make it 10-0 early in the second half.

The score remained stagnant until 20 seconds before intermission. Pettaway scored his second touchdown of the evening, scampering four yards to take a 17-0 lead into half.

The Leopards allowed just nine points in the second half, all of which came off of field goals. Bowling Green kicker Jackson Kleather was 4-for-4 on field goal attempts, including a 56-yarder which increased the Falcons' lead by 20.

The Maroon and White continued to grind, using completions to **Carson Persing** and **Elijah Steward** to move the chains. After **Kente Edwards** picked up a first down on the ground, Persing snagged a DeNobile pass for 14 yards. The Leopards attempted to use **Jason Penza** for a fresh set of legs, but one of the QB's runs was negated by a block in the back penalty. With 11 yards to go on second down, offensive coordinator T.J. DiMuzio orchestrated a 17-yard reception to Steward for the first down.

Lafayette's offense appeared to stall after three plays within the redzone, but DeNobile had other plans. The senior stepped up to his right and hit a streaking Steward in the back of the endzone for the score. **Jack Simonetta** converted the point after to cut into the deficit to put the score at 20-7 with 3:39 left in the third quarter.

Bowling Green added two more Kleather field goals to cement the 26-7 final.

DeNobile completed the game 13-of-26 for 112 yards and one touchdown. Hosak led the Leopards with 30 receiving yards, while Steward and **Mason Kuehner** snagged three receptions. Edwards kept the ball on the ground 10 times for a team-high 27 yards, as the Leopards were held to 59 rushing yards on the day.

Defensively, Stevens recorded 11 tackles and a sack, while **Olivier Camerlain** added a sack of his own. Dee and freshman **Christian Watson** each recorded a pass breakup.

GAME 2 LAFAYETTE 42 STONEHILL 26

EASTON, Mass. - Junior **Kente Edwards** rushed for three touchdowns and his first 100-yard career rushing game in the Leopards' 42-26 win over Stonehill. The junior tailback accounted for 127 of Lafayette's 319 yards on the ground as Lafayette controlled the pace of the game from start to finish.

Edwards was one of four players to score a touchdown, joining classmate **Ethan Weber** (36-yard run), sophomore **Jason Penza** (29-yard run) and senior **Dean DeNobile** (1-yard run). Junior WR **Carson Persing** ended the day with a career-best 108 receiving yards. Sophomore S **Kevin Dodard** led the defensive effort for the Maroon and White, pacing the team with eight tackles.

Stonehill received the ball first to open the contest, using run-pass options to move the chains downfield. The Skyhawks' first drive stalled around midfield when Dodard made a diving play to swat the ball away.

Following a punt, DeNobile and company took over at their own 25-yard line. Weber got things started with a 20-yard run on the offense's first play of the game, setting the tone for the rest of the drive. Lafayette moved the ball with ease, with back-to-back runs of 10 and 11 yards from Penza and Edwards, respectively, before DeNobile connected with **Ethan Hosak** for a nine-yard gain. Shortly after, Edwards notched his first touchdown of the game on a four-yard carry and a 7-0 lead.

Ryan Gadson's interception off the hands of the receiver stopped the Skyhawks' next drive and allowed the Maroon and White to take over in the Stonehill half of the field. Edwards remained a focal point, picking up rushes of five and 11 yards. The Annandale, N.J. native found the endzone yet again, with his second score that pushed the Leopards' lead to 14 with 14:12 left in the second quarter.

Stonehill QB Jack O'Connell kept things close in the second quarter, completing an 18-yard touchdown pass to Zachary Kim that cut the Lafayette advantage to 14-6. After the score, the hosts' point after attempt was blocked by **Jalen Edwards**, who flew off the edge untouched to tip the kick.

Following the tipped PAT, Lafayette regained possession and created breathing room after Penza took the quarterback option 29 yards for the house. Near the end of the second quarter, Weber broke free for a 36-yard touchdown, pushing the lead to 28-6.

In the first half, Stonehill held a 18:08 time of possession, in comparison to the Maroon and White's 11:52. Despite the difference, the Leopard offense outgained the Skyhawks 224-146.

The Leopards opened the second half with a hand-off to Edwards, who proceeded to scamper 78 yards untouched for the hat trick. In the third quarter, Lafayette led 35-6 with 14:40 left.

Stonehill added in two late touchdowns to wrap things up in the Leopards victory.

Lafayette's 319 rushing yards marks the first time since Sep. 30, 2023 that the Maroon and White have ran for 300+ yards in a game (316 vs. Bucknell). DeNobile finished the contest by completing 11 of his 18 passes for 132 yards and an interception. The senior chipped in 13 yards on the ground and a touchdown.

Defensively, **Darien Riley**, **Ahmir Crawley** and **Dominic Selvitelli** all registered a sack with Crawley managing three tackles for loss. Linebacker **Beckham Dee** recorded seven tackles, with **Joey Shimko** following behind with six.

GAME 3 LAFAYETTE 42 GEORGETOWN 37

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Lafayette accumulated 579 yards of total offense in a 42-37 win over Georgetown. Junior RB **Kente Edwards** tallied 19 carries for 255 yards and four touchdowns, averaging 13.4 yards per carry. The tailback's 200-yard rushing day was the first since Nov. 11, 2023. Senior WR **Elijah Steward** chipped in 113 yards and a touchdown on seven receptions. QB **Dean DeNobile** completed 18-of-28 for 290 yards with two touchdowns and an interception.

Winning the toss, Lafayette deferred to the second half. Looking at a 3rd-and-17, the hosts' first drive appeared to stall. An offside penalty kept things alive, allowing Georgetown QB Danny Lauter to connect with Nicholas Dunneman for a 12-yard gain and a fresh set of downs. Lauter found WR Isaiah Grimes for a 19-yard touchdown and a 7-0 lead with 9:18 in the first. The Leopards answered with a score on their opening drive via Edwards' 70-yards scamper.

Georgetown picked up where it left off, as Lauter found five different receivers on the ensuing possession to move the chains. On 2nd-and-10 within Lafayette territory, **Jaylon Joseph** collected a sack to force third down. A **Beckham Dee** stop on third down forced a field goal attempt. The 45-yard attempt was no good, putting Lafayette back on the field with 1:23 left in the first quarter.

DeNobile's second pass of the afternoon targeted receiver **Mason Kuehner**, who promptly ran 44 yards to the Georgetown 28. DeNobile found Kuehner for a 10-yard gain before **Carson Persing** pulled in a nine-yard touchdown with 14:48 in the second, putting the Leopards on top, 14-7.

Lafayette kept the Hoyas in check defensively on the following drive, with tackles from **Paul Wideman** and **Tighe Cummiskey** forcing a three-and-out. The Maroon and White retook the field. A 48-yard touchdown pass to Steward capped off a four-play, 1:31 scoring drive.

With the score at 21-7 in favor of the Leopards on the Hoyas one-yard line, the offense looked poised to score. On 3rd-and-goal with 2:18 left to play in the first half, the hosts' defense got to DeNobile, sacking him and forcing a fumble. Naitetei Mose recovered and ran 90 yards to the endzone to cut the deficit to 21-14. Georgetown then forced Lafayette to a punt and proceeded to move the ball downfield with ease. Lauter completed passes of 19, 20, and 37 yards to set up shop in the red zone. A Savion Hart one-yard rush knotted things up with 41 seconds remaining in the half.

In the third quarter, the Leopards faced a 3rd-and-7 with 10:07 in the clock, Chigozie Oge-Evans brought down DeNobile while Cody Pham recovered. Starting on the Lafayette 45, Georgetown moved down the field to take a 24-21 advantage on a 32-yard field goal.

Lafayette's next drive started on its 25-yard line with 6:42 in the third. After picking up a first, DeNobile threaded the needle to Steward for 36 yards. Edwards rumbled 28 yards for a TD that gave Lafayette at 28-24 lead. The hosts responded with a nine-play touchdown drive ending when Hart found endzone to turn the lead back to the Hoyas, 31-28.

To start the fourth, Lafayette's offense commanded a 12-play drive, converting two of three third-down opportunities, only stopped on the one-yard line of Georgetown. Coach John Troxell kept his offense on the field and it paid off, with Edwards breaking across the goal line to complete the touchdown hat trick. Lafayette swung the lead back in its favor, 35-31, with 9:55 remaining.

The Hoyas' next drive failed resulted in a punt to the Lafayette 17. Edwards picked up 22 and 10 yards on consecutive carries. His third handoff turned into his fourth score of the afternoon, running 51 yards to the endzone to increase the advantage to 42-31.

Georgetown collected a late touchdown with 43 seconds left, but was unable to convert the two-point try. Persing recovered the onside kickoff attempt to cement the 42-37 final.

Defensively, junior **Avery Jones** made nine stops while soph. **Kevin Dodard** added eight. The Leopards held the Hoyas to 90 rushing yards on the sunny afternoon.

GAME 4 LAFAYETTE 38 COLUMBIA 14

EASTON, Pa. — Lafayette opened its four-game homestand with a 38-14 victory over Columbia in the first night game at Fisher Stadium since 2018.

Junior RB **Kente Edwards** continued his hot streak, running for 150 yards and three scores. Edwards has churned out three-straight 100-yard games, running for 127, 255 and 150 with 10 touchdowns in that same span (leading the nation in rushing touchdowns entering the weekend). Junior **Ethan Weber** added to the run game, chipping in 56 yards and two touchdowns. The Lafayette defense held Columbia to 14 points, shutting out the Lions in the second half.

The Leopards booted the opening kickoff to begin the contest. Columbia return man Cobe Crews muffed the kick, and the Lions began their drive at their own five-yard line. Lafayette's defense forced a quick three-and-out. Edwards started off Lafayette's drive with back-to-back runs of nine and five yards. With the offense moving, an illegal formation penalty stalled things. The Leopards settled for a 37-yard **Jack Simonetta** field goal for the 3-0 lead with 10:13 to go in the first quarter. It was the Leopards' first field goal of the season.

With 8:48 in the first, **Dean DeNobile** and the offense set up shop on the Leopards' 39-yard line. DeNobile connected with **Mason Kuehner** to move 40 yards downfield to the visitors' 21. Two plays later, Edwards rumbled into the endzone for a 13-yard score and a 10-0 advantage. Over his first two drives, the junior ran five times for 34 yards, averaging 6.8 yards per attempt.

The Lion offense responded, cutting into the deficit with a 11-play, 75-yard drive that spanned 5:04. Goodwin capped off the drive with a 17-yard pass, finding Hutch Crow for the touchdown. Columbia trailed 10-7 with 2:28 left in the first quarter.

On its following drive, Lafayette remained steadfast in its approach, using Weber for three straight runs, gaining 13 yards and a first. The Maroon and White continued to move the chains, using a combination of passes to **Elijah Steward** and Kuehner for nine and seven yards, respectively. The Leopards found the endzone with 12:57 in the second, relying on the fifth consecutive run from Edwards to punch it in from four yards out and push the lead to 17-7.

Callahan Blair and **Jaylon Joseph** stymied Columbia's fourth drive of the evening. On 1st-and-10 on the Lions' 45, Blair got into the backfield for an eight-yard loss. Two snaps later, Joseph forced heavy pressure, hitting Goodwin to cause an incomplete pass.

Columbia engineered another long drive before half, using 5:27 of the clock on a 12-play drive that spanned 74 yards finishing with a Johnson run for a touchdown. Lafayette held a 17-14 lead at halftime.

Coming out of halftime, offensive coordinator T.J. DiMuzio called upon Edwards once again for runs of 13 and two yards, setting up **Carson Persing** for a 16-yard reception from DeNobile to convert a 3rd-and-8. The Leopards drove a total of 75 yards on their opening possession. After DeNobile found Kuehner on 4-and-3 for an 11-yard gain, Edwards finished off the drive with his third touchdown of the day, a three-yard scamper. With 9:21 in the third, Lafayette led Columbia 24-14.

Lafayette increased the gap between its opponent with a pair of touchdown runs from Weber. On 2nd-and-1 from the Columbia one-yard line, Weber pushed his way across the goal line, making it 31-14 with 6:45 in the third quarter. The junior proceeded to ice the game in the fourth, running for another one-yard score with 3:01 remaining to push the lead to 38-14.

The Leopards out-gained the Lions 398-289. Lafayette ran for 232 yards, compared to Columbia's 91. DeNobile was 14-of-17 (82.4%) for 166 yards.

The Maroon and White's defense held Columbia to 127 yards in the second half. **Dhonte Jackson** and **Beckham Dee** led the team in tackles, with seven apiece. Sophomore **Kevin Dodard** contributed with six tackles and an interception. As a defense, the Leopards had eight pass breakups.

GAME 5 LAFAYETTE 28 PRINCETON 38

EASTON, Pa. - Princeton snapped Lafayette football's three-game win streak to claim a 38-28 decision. The Tigers turned three Leopard turnovers into 21 points, in a game that was evenly matched on the stat sheet. Lafayette managed 396 yards of total offense to Princeton's 344, but saw the Tigers holding a 12-minute advantage in time of possession.

As the game opened, Princeton forced a Lafayette punt. The Tigers' initial offensive drive lasted 14 plays and traveled 80 yards in 6:33, capped by a one-yard plunge from Ethan Clark with 4:51 left in the first quarter.

The deficit didn't last long, with junior RB **Ethan Weber** leading the charge downfield. Weber had four rushes for 26 yards, including a nine-yard touchdown run to knot the score at 7-7 with 14:40 left in the second quarter.

Princeton's following possession leaned on the run game, using carries of 12 and 11 yards from Kai Honda to set up Dareion Murphy's five-yard score. Princeton led 14-7 with 9:16 left in the first half.

Two plays later, Princeton's defense kept the momentum. Connor Cronin forced a fumble that Marco Scarano recovered deep in the Lafayette half. Princeton needed just three plays to find the endzone, with Blaine Hipa scoring on a quarterback keeper after connecting with Jackson Green on a 27-yard pass. The Maroon and White trailed 21-7 mid-way through the second quarter.

Lafayette's second turnover of the game led to another touchdown. Torian Roberts picked off a **Dean DeNobile** pass and returned it 38 yards for a 28-7 lead with 2:08 left in the half.

Having given up 21 unanswered points, Weber and the Leopard offense responded with an 80-yard drive in less than two minutes. Weber touched the ball five times on the 10-play possession, capping it with three-straight runs and his second touchdown of the day. Lafayette trailed 28-14 at half.

Princeton accounted for the only points in the third quarter, booting a 26-yard field goal with 3:40 left to stretch its lead to 31-14.

Through the end of the third quarter and into the fourth, Lafayette put together an 87-yard, 12 play drive fueled mainly by the pass. **Jakyre Henley** finished off the scoring march with a three-yard score to keep the Leopards in it by cutting the deficit to 32-21 with 12:27 left.

Immediately following, the Lafayette defense stood tall led by linebacker **Beckham Dee's** tackle for loss and subsequent three-and-out.

Mason Kuehner returned the punt 19 yards to midfield, but the first offensive play of the drive would be the last. Princeton forced and recovered a fumble after a completion.

The Tigers took advantage and put the game out of reach via a 14-play drive that chewed up nine minutes. Jackson Green reeled in a four-yard TD from Kai Colon to lead 38-21 with 3:31 left.

The Leopards added a last score in the final minute via a two-yard pass from DeNobile to rookie **Hunter Ditrano** to run the final to 38-28.

DeNobile finished the day 27-of-36 for 259 with a touchdown. Classmate **Elijah Steward** was the recipient of seven of those catches, accumulating 81 yards. Weber finished his day with 18 carries for 76 yards.

Defensively, **Darson Jeanty** led the team with nine tackles, followed by **Dhonte Jackson** with eight, **Jalen Edwards** with seven and Dee and **Christian Watson** with six apiece.

EASTON, Pa. - Quarterback **Dean DeNobile** threw for 314 yards and two touchdowns as the Leopards improved to 2-0 in Patriot League play via a 24-10 final over Fordham.

The senior completed passes to nine different receivers, with **Elijah Steward** reeling in five catches for 85 yards. **Carson Persing** (4-84) managed a 63-yard catch along with a TD, while **Matthew Scerbo** added three catches for 49 yards, including his first career TD. It was DeNobile's second career 300-yard passing game. Defensively, the Leopards rang up 13 TFL with four sacks with 25 players recording at least one tackle, led by 12 from **Ryan Gadson**.

EASTON, Pa. – The Leopards piled up nine touchdowns to dominate Bucknell 62-24 and remain undefeated in Patriot League play (3-0).

It was a day of stellar individual performances at Fisher Stadium that led to Lafayette's highest scoring output since a 64-0 win over Lehigh to close out the 1944 season. Lafayette racked up a school-record of 670 offensive yards (348 rushing, 322 passing). Junior RB **Ethan Weber** churned out his first career 100-yard rushing game (139 yards) as did **Jakyre Henley** (5-107, TD). Senior WR **Elijah Steward** reeled in two touchdown passes to finish with 116 yards. Senior QB **Dean DeNobile** was 26-of-34 for 316 yards with a career-high five touchdown passes while fellow QB **Jason Penza** ran for 94 yards, ripping off a 79-yard touchdown.

The Lafayette defense stood tall on Bucknell's opening possession, forcing a three-and-out thanks to **Jaylon Joseph**. The junior broke through the offensive line and drilled QB Chris Dietrich for a loss of six, the first of his two sacks. The Leopards ended the day with nine tackles for loss, while seven players had three or more tackles led by six apiece from **Beckham Dee** and **Robert Stevens**.

DeNobile and company used 2:22 of the game clock on a six-play, 65-yard touchdown drive. He completed passes of seven and 14 yards to **Carson Persing** and **Mason Kuehner**, respectively. Following another Kuehner reception, the Leopards opted for Weber. No. 32 broke off a 32-yard touchdown. Lafayette led 7-0 four minutes into the game.

The visitors found their way into the endzone early in the second quarter. Facing a 4th-and-5 on the Lafayette 35, Dietrich hit TJ Cadden in the endzone for the touchdown to knot the score at 7-7 with 11:58 left in the first half.

The Leopard offense quickly responded, marching 75 yards on just five plays. Henley capped the scoring drive by hauling in a 20-yard pass from DeNobile. Lafayette led 14-7. After another Bucknell punt, the Maroon and White needed just one play to score again, this time a 79-yard run from Penza. Lafayette held a 21-7 lead with 7:06 on the clock.

A 50-yard field goal by Matt Schearer, the longest in the Patriot League this season, brought the Bison within 21-10 with 1:48 left.

Lafayette added two quick scores before the end of the half to put the game out of reach. Steward reeled in touchdowns of 34 and 10 yards. DL **Michael Vaughn** intercepted a Dietrich misfire with 1:03 left to play to set up Steward's second TD. Lafayette led 34-10 at halftime, its most points in a half this season.

The Maroon and White opened the second half with a 78-yard touchdown drive that spanned 3:10. **Ethan Hosak's** 19-yard catch was the eighth and final play of the possession, concluding the drive and pushing the Leopard advantage to 41-10 with 11:50 in the third.

Lafayette added three more scores before the afternoon was over. Weber rumbled 67 yards for his second touchdown, while **Matthew Scerbo** and Henley chipped in with scores of four and 70 yards, respectively.

WORCESTER, Mass. - The Lafayette defense forced four turnovers and **Kente Edwards** ran for two touchdowns as Lafayette claimed a 21-13 victory at Holy Cross. The Leopards remain unbeaten in Patriot League play, improving to 4-0 for the first time since 2009.

Holy Cross had the ball for a final time with 3:14 left in the half, converting third downs of 15 and five yards. The Crusaders added a chip-shot field goal to run the halftime score to 7-3.

After a Leopard punt early in the third quarter, Jayden Clerveaux avoided a tackle at the line of scrimmage and tore off a 67-yard run that set up Holy Cross' second score. Gadson and **Kevin Dodard** sprinted down the field to save a touchdown. The Crusaders had the ball 4th-and-3 at the six-yard line before Luis Palenzuela converted a 29-yard field goal. The Crusaders trailed 7-6 midway through the third.

The hosts captured the lead shortly after, courtesy of returner Max Mosey. He picked up a bouncing punt and ran 59 yards untouched to the endzone. Holy Cross led 13-7 at 5:23.

The Maroon and White answered six plays later, driving 75 yards in 2:26. Sixty-two yards of the drive came on back-to-back plays. On 3rd-and-4, DeNobile connected on a 27-yard pass to **Mason Kuehner**. Scerbo pulled down a pass that he bobbled initially and then corralled as he fell to the ground for 35 more yards. Weber then punched in the score from a yard out. After a **Jack Simonetta** PAT, Lafayette reclaimed a 14-13 lead with 2:57 to go in the third.

Following a Holy Cross punt, Lafayette got the ball for a final time with seven minutes left inside Holy Cross territory. Lafayette ran 4:23 off the clock, with Edwards contributing 26 yards and the eventual three-yard TD. Weber added 24 yards on the drive.

The Crusaders made things interesting in the waning moments, advancing the ball to the 12-yard line with 25 seconds left. Holy Cross faced a 4th-and-6 when the Lafayette defense delivered the final blow. Joseph jumped on Holy Cross QB Dominic Campanile to end the game and give the Leopards their second straight win in Worcester.

GAME 10 LAFAYETTE 59
COLGATE 42

EASTON, Pa. — An explosive offensive effort propelled Lafayette to a 59-42 triumph over Colgate on at Fisher Stadium. Junior RB **Kente Edwards** ran for 260 yards and three touchdowns while senior QB **Dean DeNobile** threw for 206 yards and four touchdowns.

Edwards reached 1,000 rushing yards for the season, Lafayette's third straight season with a 1,000-yard rusher. The Leopards improve to 5-0 in Patriot League play for the first time since 1994 with games remaining at Richmond (Nov. 15) and at home vs. Lehigh (11/22) in the 161st Meeting. Defensively, **Robert Stevens** had eight tackles while **Avery Jones** added two interceptions. **Ryan Gadson** had an INT for the second-straight game and finished with seven tackles in a defensive effort that produced nine pass breakups.

The Leopards capitalized on their first drive, using a pair of 27- and 42-yard runs from Edwards to power down to the redzone. Lafayette ran identical plays consecutively for **Ethan Hosak**. Hosak pulled down the second play-action pass from DeNobile for three yards and a touchdown. The Maroon and White led 7-0 at 12:46 in the first quarter.

After punts from both teams, Edwards led an eight-play, 88-yard drive that resulted in his 13th score of the year. During the possession, the junior tailback ran four times, picking up 62 of his 176 first-half rushing yards. His fourth carry resulted in a 29-yard score and a 14-0 advantage in the first with 3:50 remaining.

Colgate's next two drives knotted up the score at 14. Colgate QB Jake Stearney connected with Matt Fogler who shed two Leopard tacklers on his way to the endzone to cut the lead to 14-7. The Raiders' defense picked off DeNobile after his pass bounced off **Jakyr Henley**. The visitors took over on the Leopard 25-yard line and scored three plays later when Zach Osborne took a QB run up the middle to level the score at 14-14.

DeNobile and company engineered a 10-play drive that used up 4:19 of the clock for their third touchdown of the first half. **Carson Persing** capped the drive by using a double move to lose two defenders before hauling in a 29-yard for his third TD of the season. Lafayette led 21-14.

The Raiders' offense delivered a 10-play drive of its own, tying the game once again at 21. Fogler pulled down his second TD, an 11-yard catch, with 5:56 in the second quarter. Two minutes and 13 seconds later, the Maroon and White scored again to lead 28-21. DeNobile connected with freshman **Zane Wooldridge** for his third passing touchdown of the game. Wooldridge's 39-yard TD was the first of his Lafayette career.

Colgate's next possession was abruptly ended by a Jones interception, the first of his career. Edwards broke across the goal line five plays later, adding a six-yard touchdown as Lafayette led 35-21 with less than a minute left. On Colgate's final possession, Jones came through again, picking off Stearney and running it back 36 yards. The Leopards added a career-long 49-yard field goal by Simonetta to run the halftime score to 38-21.

The second half opened with the teams trading punts. The Raiders blocked the Leopards' attempt and took over at the 21-yard line. Stearney hit a wide open Reed Swanson for a seven-yard touchdown. Colgate trailed 38-28 in the third quarter at 10:14.

The Leopards found a touchdown of their own shortly after, with **Mason Kuehner** getting a foot down before falling out of bounds for a 19-yard touchdown catch. Lafayette pushed the score to 45-28 at 7:45 in period three.

The two teams traded scores in the fourth quarter, with both Edwards and Fogler tallying their third touchdowns of the game. Edwards broke free for a 49-yard scoring scamper, while Fogler found a soft spot in the defense for an 18-yard touchdown catch.

Shaun Purvy chipped in with a 26-yard receiving score for the Maroon and White, while Colgate's Michael Stevenson added a touchdown to solidify the 59-42 final.
