It marks the 29th all-time meeting between the former Southern Conference counterparts. The meeting is just the third between the programs since 1969 and the first since 2007. For the ninth time in the last 10 years, W&M opens the season on the road. W&M is coming off back-to-back 20-win seasons under head coach Tony Shaver. Over the last two seasons, W&M leads the CAA in victories with 40. The Tribe has won 20 or more games in three of its last six seasons under Shaver, the most in the CAA. The Tribe returns four starters from last season's CAA Regular Season Championship team, its first since 1998. W&M is one of eight CAA teams to return at least four starters. Senior Terry Tarpey was named a Preseason First Team All-CAA selection in October after being a second-team pick in 2015 as well as the league's defensive player of the year. In August, <i>Bleacher Report</i> ranked Tarpey as the sixth most complete player in Division I. The Green and Gold is one of three programs in the country to rank among the top 30 nationally in field goal percentage each of the last three years. W&M has averaged better than 73 points per game each of the last two years. It marks the first time since 1959-60 and 1960-61 the Tribe average 73 or more points per game in back-to-back seasons.

SCOUTING N.C. STATE

N.C. State opens its fifth season under head coach Mark Gottfried on Friday against the Tribe. The Wolfpack, which was picked eighth in the challenging ACC this season, has advanced to the NCAA Tournament during each of its previous four campaigns under Gottfried with two Sweet 16 appearance, including last season. After finishing 2014-15 at 22-14, the Wolfpack is listed among the also receiving votes category in both the *USA Today* Coaches Poll and the *Associated Press* Top 25.

N.C. State defeated Cal State Los Angeles, 71-54, in its lone exhibition of the year on Nov. 8. Anthony Barber topped the Wolfpack with 21 points and six assists, while Abdul-Malik Abu added 17 points, nine rebound and four blocked shots. N.C. State had 21 fastbreak points and outrebounding CSLA, 50-38, while shooting 40 percent (24-of-60) from the field, 29.2 percent (7-of-24) from 3-point range and 64 percent (16-of-25) from the free throw line. Defensively, the Wolfpack limited CSLA to 32.3 percent (20-of-62) from the field and 29.4 percent (5-of-17) from 3-point range.

Barber is N.C. State's top returning scorer from a season ago at 12.1 points per game to go along with a team-best 130 assists (3.7 apg). Junior Lennard Freeman was the Wolfpack's top rebounder at 5.6 per game in 2014-15. Abu averaged 6.4 points per game and chipped in 4.8 rebounds per contest, which ranked second on the team.

As a team, the Wolfpack ranked 22nd in adjusted offensive efficiency (112.2) and 87th in adjusted defensive efficiency (98.3) according to KenPom.com in 2014-15. In the NCAA rankings, N.C. State was 18th in blocked shots per game (5.1) and 17th in fewest turnovers per game (10.4).

W&M and N.C. State were both members of the Southern Conference from 1936-53, before the Wolfpack left for the ACC. Friday will be just the third meeting between the programs since 1969. N.C. State, which leads the all-time series 23-5, won the last meeting, 66-47, in 2007. The Wolfpack leads the series in Raleigh as well at 15-2. The Tribe will look for its first win in the series since a 70-61 triumph in Williamsburg in 1952. The last W&M victory in Raleigh was a 54-50 upset of the then-No. 8 Wolfpack in 1950.

Success vs. the Power Five

Under head coach Tony Shaver, W&M has enjoyed success against Power Five opponents, including a trio of wins. Here is a look at some of the Tribe's success against the Power Five since the 2009-10 season:

- In 2014, W&M rallied from a 12-point first-half deficit to pick up a 72-62 win at current Big Ten team Rutgers. Marcus Thornton led all scorers with 28 points for W&M, while Terry Tarpey and Omar Prewitt chipped in 11 and nine points, respectively.

- During the 2012-13 season, the Tribe suffered a pair of narrow losses against two Power Five opponents, despite halftime leads. The Green and Gold fell at ACC foe Wake Forest, 63-57, but led 30-23 at the half. Later in the season, W&M led Purdue of the Big Ten, 40-39, at the half, but could not hold on before falling to the Boilermakers, 73-66.

- In 2010-11, W&M nearly upset No. 10-ranked Syracuse in the Carrier Dome. The Tribe led by four points with five minutes to go, but the Orange rallied by scoring the game's final seven points to pull out a 63-60 win. Syracuse finished the year ranked No. 12 nationally after going 27-8 and advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

- The Tribe upset a pair of ACC foes who went on to the NCAA Tournament in 2009-10. W&M became the first team to win at Joel Coliseum in November, knocking off Wake Forest, 78-68. Later in the season, the Tribe posted an 83-77 win at Maryland. The Terps went on to earn a share of the ACC regular season title. It marked the first time in the history of the CAA that a team won the road at two ACC opponents in the same season.

TRIBE SUCCESS UNDER TONY SHAVER

W&M has enjoyed a significant amount of success under head coach Tony Shaver, including the program's first CAA Regular Season Championship since 1998. In three of the last six seasons, the Green and Gold produced 20-win seasons, the most in the CAA. By contrast, W&M produced only two seasons with 20 or more wins in the 50 years prior to Shaver's arrival in Williamsburg. Shaver owns three of the Tribe's eight all-time 20-win seasons. The Tribe's back-to-back 20-win seasons in 2013-14 and 2014-15 were a first for the Green and Gold in 64 years. The Tribe has also advanced to the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) on two occasions in the last six seasons, including 2015. W&M had just one NIT appearance (in 1982-83) prior to the Tribe's recent string of success. W&M also owns four CAA Championship game appearances in the last eight years and 10 CAA Tournament wins since 2008. Prior to Shaver's arrival, W&M had never advanced to the CAA Championship Game and only won two CAA Tournament games. The Green and Gold's four title game appearances and total league tournament wins are the most in the CAA since 2008.

RETURNING FOUR STARTERS

W&M returns four starters from last season's CAA Regular Season Championship team, including two seniors (Terry Tarpey and Sean Sheldon) and two juniors (Omar Prewitt and Daniel Dixon). The Tribe is one of eight teams in the CAA with at least four starters returning this season. It marks the second time in the last three years that W&M returns four starters. The Green and Gold returned four in 2013-14 (three seniors and a junior) on the way to finishing the year at 20-12 and advancing to the CAA Championship Game. Under Shaver, the Tribe also returned four starters in 2007-08 and advanced to the CAA title game for the first time in school history. The Tribe finished 2008 at 17-16, its first winning season in a decade.

DIFFICULT SCHEDULE

The Tribe's 2015-16 schedule is loaded from top to bottom with more than half of its 29 games coming against teams that played in the postseason a season ago. W&M will have 10 games against programs that won 20 or more games in 2014-15. Along with the four CAA teams that played in the post season last year, the Tribe's 11-game non-conference schedule contains seven contests against teams that played in the post season, including four NCAA Tournament teams. The Tribe's home non-conference slate boasted four postseason teams, including three 20-win teams. The Green and Gold's non-conference ledger features games with NCAA Sweet 16 participant N.C. State (Nov. 13) and two other NCAA Tournament teams in Dayton (Nov. 21) and Virginia (Dec. 5). The Tribe's home schedule includes tilts with NIT participants Old Dominion (Dec. 1) and Central Michigan (Dec. 29).

CHALLENGING NON-CONFERENCE SLATE

While the Tribe was picked fourth in the preseason CAA poll, six of the Tribe's 11 non-conference games will be against teams picked first or second in their respective preseason conference polls. Dayton (Atlantic 10), High Point (Big South) and Central Michigan (Mid-American) were selected as the preseason favorite in their leagues, while Hampton (Mid-Eastern Athletic), Old Dominion (Conference USA) and Virginia (Atlantic Coast) were pick second.

ELITE SHOOTING

Over the last three seasons, W&M is one of three teams nationally to rank among the top 30 in field goal percentage, shooting 47.6 percent over the stretch. The Green and Gold finished 14th in the country at 48.3 percent in 2015, 25th at 47.6 percent in 2014 and 30th at 46.7 percent in 2013. Along with the Tribe, both Belmont and Gonzaga have ranked among the top 30 nationally each of the last three years. In total, only nine teams (including Utah, Northern Colorado, Colgate, SMU, Murray State and Iowa) have ranked among the top 30 nationally in the last two seasons. It marks the first time in 23 years that W&M shot 45 percent or better from the field in three straight seasons. W&M last accomplished the feat during the 1989-90 through the 1991-92 seasons. The Tribe's back-to-back seasons of better than 47 percent shooting in 2013-14 and 2014-15 mark the first time that has occurred since the 1983-84 and 1984-85 campaigns.

CAA PRESEASON RANKINGS AND AWARDS

Returning four starters from the program's first CAA regular season championship team since 1998, the Tribe was picked fourth in the preseason league standing and placed a pair of players on the preseason All-CAA teams for the third straight season. The Tribe was picked fourth by vote of the league coaches, SIDs and media behind preseason favorite Hofstra, James Madison and 2015 CAA Tournament Champion Northeastern. After the Tribe, Delaware was fifth followed by UNCW, Towson, Drexel, Charleston and Elon. Over the last two seasons, W&M owns more wins than any other CAA program, posting back-to-back 20-win campaigns. Senior Terry Tarpey, the reigning CAA Defensive Player of the Year, was among five players selected to the All-CAA first team, while junior Omar Prewitt garnered second-team accolades for the second-straight season.

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT OFFENSE

Over the last three years, the Tribe possesses one of the most effective and efficient offenses in the country according to the statistical website KenPom.com. W&M ranked among the top 25 nationally in effective field goal percentage in each of the last three seasons, including back-to-back years ranking sixth in the country. Effective field goal percentage is the same as regular field goal percentage, but gives teams more credit for made 3-point field goals. W&M's effective field goal percentage in 2014-15 was 56.3 percent after shooting 55.9 percent in 2013-14. The Tribe was 23rd in the category nationally in 2012-13. Last season, the Green and Gold enjoyed its best national offensive efficiency ranking, coming in 27th in the country (111.7). It marked the second straight year W&M was among the top 50 after ranking 41st (112.0) in 2013-14. Adjusted offensive efficiency is the number of points scored by a team per 100 possessions and is a tempo free stat, meaning the pace at which a team plays does not factor into the stat. Over the last three seasons according to KenPom.com, the Tribe ranked in the top 30 nationally in field goal percentage inside the 3-point arc. In 2014-15, W&M ranked eighth nationally in two-point field goal percentage at 54.8 percent.

HIGH PERCENTAGE 3

The Tribe has been one of the top 3-point shooting teams in the country over the last two years. In fact, W&M has not only led the CAA in 3-point percentage each of the last two years, but is one of only six teams in the country to rank among the top 15 nationally. Along with the Tribe, the five schools to rank in the top 15 each of the last two seasons in 3-point percentage are Gonzaga, Utah State, Lafayette, Drake and Iona. After shooting 39.9 percent from long range and ranking sixth nationally in 2014, the Tribe ranked 12th in 2015, connecting on 39.8 percent in 2015. Since the 2010 season, the Tribe is shooting 36.7 percent (1560-of-4246) as a team from long range, hitting 260 3-pointers per season.

RECEIVING VOTES

In the first CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 of the 2015-16 season, the Tribe was among the others receiving votes category, coming in with seven votes. W&M was one of five CAA teams highlighted in the Mid-Major top 25, including No. 22 Hofstra. James Madison (31), Northeastern (31) and UNCW (9) joined the Tribe in the also receiving votes category. Along with the conference foes, W&M will play two other teams in the rankings, including No. 10 Central Michigan and High Point, who is also receiving votes.

TARPEY EARNING PRESEASON HYPE

After a standout 2014-15 campaign, which included Second Team All-CAA and NABC All-District accolades as well as the CAA Defensive Player of the Year honor, senior Terry Tarpey earned some preseason notoriety. In August, *Bleacher Report* released a top-20 list ranking the Most Complete Players for the 2015-16 College Basketball Season and had Tarpey rated No. 6. The list, developed and written by Brian Pedersen, graded players based on their ability to perform well as a scorer, shooter, rebounder, distributor and defender at the Division I level. In October, NCAA.com writer Brian Mull listed Tarpey among his others worth a look in a column about under-the-radar seniors in college hoops that fans should know. *College Sports Madness* selected Tarpey to its preseason All-High Major fourth team. The classification included players from the Atlantic-10, CAA, C-USA, Horizon League, Mid-American, Missouri Valley, Mountain West and West Coast Conferences, meaning Tarpey is one of the top 20 players in the top mid-major conferences nationally.

SHOOTING 50 PERCENT

A forerunner for Tribe victory during head coach Tony Shaver's tenure, but especially over the last two seasons, has been its ability to shoot 50 percent or better from the field. On 28 occasions over the last two seasons, W&M connected on 50 percent or better from the field, amassing a record of 25-3 (.893) in those contests. During Shaver's 12 seasons, the Green and Gold is 70-11 (.864) when shooting 50 percent or better. Last season, W&M connected on a 50.7 percent clip in CAA play.

TARPEY DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Senior Terry Tarpey recorded 10 double-doubles last season, the most for a Tribe player since 1992-93. His 11 career double-doubles rank seventh in program history since 1970. His 10 double-doubles in 2014-15 ranked second in the CAA and 51st nationally. Tarpey produced a pair of 20-point, 10-rebound double-doubles with 24 points and 13 rebounds against Towson and tallied 22 points and 13 rebounds at Elon. In an 81-73 win over JMU last season, Tarpey became the first player in W&M history with a triple-double, tallying 18 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists. All 10 of his double-doubles in 2014-15 were during CAA play. In fact, Tarpey averaged nearly a double-double in league action at 14.4 points and 9.3 rebounds per game in 2015. Overall, he turned in season averages of 11.8 points and 8.4 rebounds per game as a junior.

3-POINTER SHOOTING

A staple of the Tribe offense over the last decade has been its propensity to not only shoot a lot of 3-pointers, but connected on a large amount as well. During each of the last nine seasons, W&M has hit 200 or more 3-pointers, averaging 247 3-pointers per year. W&M owns three of the top five single-season 3-point field goal totals in Colonial Athletic Association history, including 295 in 2009-10 and 293 in 2014-15. According to KenPom.com, W&M has ranked among the top teams in the country in percentage of field goal attempts from 3-point range and in percentage of points scored from 3-point range. In seven of the last eight years, W&M has ranked among the top 30 nationally in percentage of field goal attempts coming from 3-point range. The Green and Gold was also among the top 50 in percentage of points from 3-pointers in each of the last eight seasons, including five campaigns among the top 25 in the country. Last season, W&M ranked 23rd in percentage (42.8) of field goals coming from 3-point range and 25th in percentage (36.1) of points from 3-point range.

HELPING HAND

An important characteristic of the Tribe's offense under head coach Tony Shaver has been its ability to share the basketball. In seven of the last eight years, the Tribe has dished out at least 400 assists, and twice in the last three seasons, W&M led the CAA in assists at more than 14 per game. Each of the last three seasons, W&M has ranked among the top 100 nationally in assists per game, including 39th in 2014-15 at 14.8. In 10 of Shaver's 12 seasons, W&M has ranked among the top 100 in the country in assist percentage, according to KenPom.com. In fact, the Tribe has been among the top 50 in five of the last eight seasons. Assist percentage measures the percentage of made field goals assisted on by a team. Seven of the top eight assist totals in W&M history have come from Shaver-coached teams, including 487 last season which ranked second in program annals.

70 POINTS THE MARK

The 70-point mark has been an important one both offensively and defensively for W&M. Over the last two seasons, W&M is 32-8 (.800) when scoring better than 70 points in a game. Defensively, W&M is 25-2 over the last two seasons when holding foes below 70 points. During head coach Tony Shaver's 12 seasons, the Tribe is 105-39 (.729) when scoring better than 70 points. Under Shaver, W&M is 123-84 (.594) when holding opponent under 70 points.

PREWITT SCORING

After averaging 11.4 points per game as a freshman in earning CAA Rookie of the Year honors, junior Omar Prewitt upped his scoring production to 13.5 points per game last season and is among the top returning scorers in the CAA. His scoring average from a season ago is fourth among returning players in the league. Prewitt got stronger as a season progressed last season, producing a 14.6 ppg average in CAA play. He culminated his sophomore campaign with a career-high 33 points in the Tribe's CAA semifinal win over Hofstra on his way to earning CAA All-Tournament honors. Prewitt is W&M's active career leader with 809 points, which ranks as the sixth-best total through a player's sophomore season in school history. He is only 191 points away from becoming the 38th player in program annals with 1,000 career points and the 11th under head coach Tony Shaver, which is the most for a W&M head coach.

DIXON AMONG THE NATION'S BEST 3-POINT SHOOTERS

Junior Daniel Dixon broke onto the scene in 2014-15 with his long-range marksmanship and ranks as one of the top 3-point shooters in the country. During his sophomore campaign, the Great Falls, Va., native ranked fifth nationally, shooting 45.1 percent from 3-point range. He connected on 73 3-pointers last season, a number that ranked fourth in the CAA and fifth on the Tribe's single-season list. Dixon's career 3-point percentage of 43.2, entering his junior campaign, ranks 10th among active Division I players and would establish a new W&M school record. He currently ranks eighth in Tribe history in 3-pointers made per game (1.81) and 21st in 3-pointers made (98). In 2015, Dixon established a program record connecting on a perfect 6-of-6 from 3-point range in the Tribe's 100-79 win over Hofstra.

HIGH SCORING OFFENSE

In each of the last two seasons, the Tribe established new school records for points scored in a season. W&M has also ranked among the CAA and national leaders during each campaign as well. W&M averaged 73.1 points per game in 2013-14, which ranked second in the CAA, before following it up with a 73.2 per game average last season, which ranked 43rd nationally. It marked the first time since the 1959-60 and 1960-61 seasons that the Tribe produced back-to-back seasons with scoring averages of better than 73 points per game. In 2014-15, the Green and Gold upped its scoring average to 75.6 points per game in CAA play, which ranked second in the league.

DOUBLE-DIGIT 3-POINTERS

Under head coach Tony Shaver, W&M has made it a habit of hitting 10 or more 3-pointers in a game. Last season, the Tribe knocked down double-digit 3-pointers on 17 occasions, including each of the last five games in 2015. Over the last seven seasons, W&M is averaging 12 games of double-digit 3-pointers per campaign, meaning it hits 10 or more 3-pointers in a more than a third of its games each year. During head coach Tony Shaver's tenure, W&M connected on double-digit treys 94 times. The Tribe is 54-40 under Shaver when accomplishing the feat, including a 12-3 mark last season. Of those 94 games, 85 have come over the last seven years with W&M posting a 49-36 record.

TARPEY 100/100

Senior Terry Tarpey is known as a stat-sheet stuffer and is on track to become the first player in W&M history with 100 career steals and 100 career blocked shots. He currently ranks ninth in W&M history in career blocked shots (80) and 14th in career steals (109). Last season, Tarpey led the CAA at 1.8 steals per game and his 58 swipes were the most in program history since steals became an official NCAA statistic in 1986. He also ranked second in the league at 1.3 blocked shots per game a season ago on the way to CAA Defensive Player of the Year honors.

TRIBE EXCELS IN THE CLASSROOM

Along with its work on the court, the men's hoops program continues to demonstrate why Tribe Athletics personifies the term student-athlete with its efforts in the classroom. The men's basketball team currently possesses a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.9 at the 'Public Ivy' institution. Under head coach Tony Shaver, the Tribe has had 38 CAA All-Academic team honorees, the most in the CAA since 2004. On four occasions over the last six years, W&M placed three of its five starters on the CAA All-Academic team. The College ranked sixth on America's Top Public Colleges list according to Forbes in 2015 and the 34th-best university on the Best Colleges list according to U.S. News and World Report in 2016. During Shaver's 12 years, a W&M player has garnered the CAA Men's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year five times, including three of the last four seasons. In five of the last six seasons, including 2015 with Tom Schalk, the CAA's Dean Ehlers Leadership Award winner has gone to a Tribe athlete. The award is given to the student-athlete who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity and sportsmanship in conjunction with his academic athletic achievement."

CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARDS

Senior Terry Tarpey was not only the Tribe's top rebounder last season, but also topped the Colonial Athletic Association. Despite standing just 6-foot-5, the Stamford, Conn., native pulled down 8.4 rebounds per game. His rebounding average ranked 51st nationally and was the seventh-best in W&M history since 1973. Tarpey's 574 career rebounds ranks second among active CAA players and 43rd nationally. His career total is also 21st in W&M history. Last season, Tarpey topped W&M in rebounding in 26 of his 32 games, including 12 games of double-digit boards. He finished last season with 268 rebounds, which was the second most for a W&M player since 1973. Tarpey also closed out the campaign 12th nationally in defensive rebounds at 7.1 per game.

KNIGHT, PIERCE SIGN WITH THE TRIBE

W&M announced the signing of 6-9 forward Nathan Knight (Syracuse, N.Y./ Nottingham/Kimball Union Academy) and 6-6 guard/forward Justin Pierce (Glen Ellyn, Ill./Glenbard West) to National Letters of Intent (NLI) on Nov. 11.

Played AAU for Mercury Elite ... Chose W&M from a group of 14 offers, including Toledo, Belmont and Boston University.

MARCUS THORNTON NBA DRAFT PICK

2015 graduate and All-American Marcus Thornton was selected in the second round of the 2015 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics in June. He was the ninth Tribe player drafted into the NBA, the first since 1985 and the highest W&M selection since 1961, when Jeff Cohen was the 23rd overall pick in the second round by the Chicago Packers. Thornton graduated from W&M as the program's all-time leading scorer and was the first CAA Player of the Year in Tribe history. Thornton, whose rights are still owned by the Celtics, signed with the Sydney Kings of the Australian National Basketball League for the 2015-16 season. He currently ranks 10th in the NBL in scoring at 16.1 points per game.

When Tony Shaver accepted the head coaching position at William & Mary in May of 2003, he set his sights on making the Tribe a championship-contending program. Fast-forward to the present, the two-time CAA Coach of the Year and National Mid-Major Coach of the Year finalist has led a revival of the Green and Gold program, including the Tribe's first CAA regular season Championship in 17 years during the 2014-15 campaign.

Over the last eight seasons under Shaver, W&M has produced three of its eight 20-win seasons and advanced to the CAA Championship game on four occasions, a first in program history. Twice in the last six seasons, he led the program to berths in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT), only the second and third postseason bids in program history. Shaver is W&M's all-time winningest head coach with 156 victories over his 12 seasons on the Green and Gold sidelines.

In his 29 years as a collegiate head coach, he is one of the winningest active coaches in college basketball. Over his career, Shaver-coached teams have won 20 or more games during 15 seasons and advanced to the post season on 13 occasions. Shaver entered 2015-16 ranked 20th among active Division I head coach with 514 career victories. He became the 86th Division I head coach to win 500 games in 2014. Shaver possesses four of the top nine single-season win totals in Tribe history and two of the top three road win totals.

In 2014-15, W&M won 20 games for the second straight season, marking the first time in 64 years that the Tribe produced back-to-back 20-win campaigns. The Tribe was also seeded No. 1 in the CAA Tournament for the first time in school history last season. One of the greatest players in W&M history, Marcus Thornton wrapped up his decorated Tribe career in 2015. He became the first CAA Player of the Year in program lore along with being named an Associated Press All-American. Thornton, who became the school's all-time leading scorer, topping the oldest mark in Division I, was a second round pick (45th overall) of the Boston Celtics in the 2015 NBA Draft.

Thornton was one of a school-record three Tribe players to earn All-CAA honors in 2015, along with Terry Tarpey and Omar Prewitt. W&M players have received a total of 16 All-CAA under Shaver, while another eight have been named to the CAA All-Rookie Team. Along with the first CAA Player of the Year in 2015, Tarpey became the program's first CAA Defensive Player of the Year, making W&M the fifth school in CAA history to win both awards in the same season.

Along with the team's success on the court, Shaver was recognized for his integrity off it. He was named a finalist by CollegelInsider.com for the 2015 Skip Prosser Man of the Year, presented annually to those who not only achieve success on the basketball court but who also display moral integrity off of it as well.

In five of the last six years, a W&M student-athlete received the CAA's prestigious Dean Ehlers Leadership Award, which is given to the student-athlete who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity and sportsmanship in conjunction with his academic athletic achievement." David Schneider won the award in 2010, while Quinn McDowell became the first-ever two-time winner of the honor in 2011 and 2012. In 2014, Tim Rusthoven earned the distinction to go along with being an NABC Allstate Good Works Team nominee. Last season, Tom Schalk added the program's fifth award. In 2012, McDowell became the first CAA men's basketball student-athlete to be named one of 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award on his way to Lowe's Senior CLASS Second-Team All-America honors.

The Shaver-led Tribe posted a 20-win season in 2013-14, coming to the brink of a CAA Championship once again. During the year, W&M picked up a road win at American Athletic Conference (AAC) foe Rutgers along with knocking off in-state rival Old Dominion for the third straight time, the longest win streak in the series history for W&M.

Shaver's offense has been running at a high-level, ranking among the best in the country. W&M is one of only three schools (along with Gonzaga and Belmont) to rank among the top 30 nationally in field goal percentage, including ranking 14th in 2014-15, each of the last three seasons. In both 2013-14 and 2014-15, W&M shot nearly 40 percent from 3-point range and is one of only six schools to rank among the top 15 in the country during both campaigns. According to the website KenPom.com, the Tribe's effective field goal percentage ranked sixth in the country in both 2013-14 and 2014-15. Effective field goal percentage is the same as regular field goal percentage, but gives a team more credit for made 3-point field goals.

The Tribe has developed a reputation under Shaver as a team that shares the ball well with a propensity to shoot from 3-point range. During each of the last nine seasons, the Tribe connected on 200 or more 3-pointers and is averaging 247 per year. In fact, the Green and Gold produced three of the top five 3-point totals in CAA history in 2010 (295), 2014 (281) and 2015 (293). According to KenPom.com, W&M has ranked among the top 53 nationally in both percentage of points from 3-pointers and percentage of field goal attempts coming from 3-point range during each of the last eight years. On five occasions over that stretch, W&M has ranked among the top 25 nationally in percentage of points coming from 3-pointers, including ranking 15th in 2013-14.

In 2013, Shaver became the Tribe's all-time wins leader, following the Green and Gold's 74-62 win at Old Dominion on Feb. 16. During the 2012-13 campaign, the Green and Gold swept Hampton Roads rival Old Dominion, which marked the first time since 1998 and just the third time that W&M won both games of a season series from the Monarchs.

Under Shaver, the Tribe has peaked at the right time of year during the conference tournament. Prior to his arrival in 2004, W&M had just two CAA Tournament wins in 18 years as a member of the league. During Shaver's 12 seasons, the Tribe owns 11 CAA Tournament victories and the program's first four championship game appearances. In fact, since 2008, W&M leads all CAA programs with 10 league tournament victories.

For the second time in the three seasons, Shaver was named the CAA Coach of the Year in 2010 by a vote of the league coaches, SIDs and media, while also being named a finalist for the CollegelInsider.com Hugh Durham Mid-Major Coach of the Year. Shaver received National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 10 and Virginia Sports Information Directors (VaSID) State Coach of the Year honors as well, while leading the Tribe to an impressive 22-11 record and the program's second CAA Championship Game appearance in three seasons.

Under Shaver's direction, the Tribe set or equaled a number of school records in 2009-10 and achieved milestones that few Mid-Major programs in America have accomplished. W&M ranked ninth nationally with a school-record 10 road wins. The College also tied program bests with a 10-game winning streak, the longest at the institution since 1929-30, and the best start in school history at 14-3. W&M received votes in both the ESPN/USA Today and Associated Press National Top 25 polls for seven straight weeks, marking the first votes for the Tribe in more than 30 years. The Tribe became the first team ever to win a November game at Joel Coliseum over Wake Forest, 78-68, on Nov. 28 and the first unranked non-BCS school to win at the facility. W&M was also the only team to win at ACC regular season co-champion Maryland in 2009-10, downing the Terps, 83-77, on Dec. 30. The Tribe became the first CAA team since the league was established to win two ACC road games in the same season. The Tribe also became just the sixth non-BCS school to win two ACC road games in the same season since the ACC was established in 1953.

Along with its success on the court, Tribe players have done their work in the classroom as well under Shaver. In three of the last four seasons, W&M posted a cumulative team grade point average of better than 3.0 at one of the toughest academic institutions in the country. Three of the Tribe's five starters were named to the CAA All-Academic team during four of the last six seasons. The Tribe set a program and CAA record with seven CAA All-Academic Team honorees in 2012-13 and over Shaver's 12 seasons, the Tribe leads the CAA with 38 All-Academic honorees. Five times under Shaver a Tribe player has been named the CAA Scholar-Athlete of the Year (Adam Hess in 2004, David Schneider in 2008, Quinn McDowell in 2012, Kyle Gaillard in 2013 and Tim Rusthoven in 2014).

In 2013, 2014 and 2015, the men's basketball program earned NCAA Public Recognition for its perfect four-year Academic Progress Rate of 1,000, ranking among the top 10 percent nationally. The Tribe has produced five straight years of perfect 1,000 APR scores.
