SOUTH ALABAMA'S LAST GAME

South Alabama 88, Auburn-Montgomery 68 • November 13, 2015

MOBILE, Ala. — Down as many as 12 points late in the first half, the University of South Alabama men's basketball team outscored Auburn-Montgomery 20-3 over the next 8:24 to take control and eventually pull away for an 88-68 win Friday night at the Mitchell Center.

The Jaguars win their home opener for the 24th consecutive season and start 1-0 for the 10th time in the last 11 years. The game was an exhibition for the Warhawks.

"First off, I thought Auburn-Montgomery did an outstanding job of spreading us out and making it difficult on our ball-screen coverage," USA head coach **Matthew Graves** said. "We really struggled and weren't aggressive. At halftime, they had made eight 3s and we committed two fouls. It was our mentality; we were soft on the ball, we were soft in rotations and we were really soft rebounding the basketball; obviously that attributed to them scoring 45 points at halftime.

"In the second half I thought we made some good adjustments on ball-screen coverage, we limited their good looks and ultimately we go on to win by 20."

Junior **Nick Stover** (Los Angeles, Calif.), in his first game since the 2013-14 season after transferring from Loyola Marymount, set a new career high with 17 points and tied his personal best with nine rebounds. He shot 6-for-12 from the floor and 3-for-5 from 3-point land.

"I'm really proud of Nick, I thought he got us going," Graves said. "I certainly think this is a confidence builder for him; he hasn't played competitively in over a year after sitting out, and in the exhibition game he was in foul trouble so he didn't get a chance to get in a really great rhythm. His emotion, his passion, he brought that energy, that's what we need and he did a good job with that."

Junior **Ken Williams** (Houston, Texas) also had three 3-pointers and paced the Jags with 21 points. Junior **Tafari Whittingham** (Brooklyn, N.Y.) came off the bench to post career-high totals of 14 points and seven rebounds.

The Warhawks' **Phillip Rankin** led all players with a game-high 27 points – on 11 of 20 shooting – and added nine boards.

AUM took control midway through the first half with a 16-2 run – the final 11 unanswered on three 3-pointers – to take a 23-16 lead, then following eight straight from USA, put up nine in a row for a 32-24 advantage at the 4:43 mark.

A 10-3 burst stretched the Warhawks' lead to 42-30 with 1:28 to play, but sophomore **Taishawn Johnson** (Indianapolis, Ind.) scored the final five points of the half and the Jags went into intermission down 42-35.

Roderick Robinson scored the first two points of the second half for Auburn-Montgomery, but it was all South Alabama after that. Junior **Georgi Boyanov** (Lovech, Bulgaria) and Williams hit baskets on back-to-back trips down the floor, and after an AUM free throw, USA poured in the next 11 points while forcing 11 straight misses on defense.

The scoring rally ended up 15-3 over a span of 6:40 for a 50-45 lead with 12:35 to play.

"I thought we started attacking the basket," Graves noted. "When we got in the paint we were able to score at and around the rim — if you look at the shot chart from the first half and the second half, we had a much better emphasis on getting the ball and making paint touches. In the first half we didn't take bad shots, we took quick shots; we didn't give guys a chance to get their hands on the ball and move it to put them in scramble situations."

Auburn-Montgomery didn't allow South Alabama to pull away until the seven-minute mark when nine unanswered points gave USA a double-digit lead for the first time and a 21-6 burst put the game away.

"I feel confident we have the pieces to be very successful, there is no question this is the most talented team we've had here in the last three years," Graves stated. "We have to understand that it is very important that we learn to play together, and we are getting there. We had spurts where we looked pretty good together, but it is going to take some time."

The Warhawks shot 43.6 percent (17-39) from the floor and 47.1 percent (8-17) from 3-point land in the first half, but just 31.0 percent (9-29) from the field after halftime and missed all 13 attempts from behind the arc.

"We switched ball screens 1-4 and with our five man, instead of stepping out and trying to contain the dribbler, we just dropped him and let the guard turn the corner," said Graves. "We basically forced them to take contested floaters and eight-foot shots over our length, and they weren't able to put us in rotations with our five man out of position. It was a very good adjustment."

On the other end of the floor, the Jaguars converted 60 percent (18-30) of their field-goal attempts in the second half.

NORTH CAROLINA STATE'S LAST GAME

William & Mary 85, N.C. State 68 • November 13, 2015

RALEIGH, N.C. — The NC State men's basketball team fell in its season opener to William & Mary 85-68. **Caleb Martin** led the Wolfpack with a career-high 21 points, but it wasn't enough as the visiting Tribe gave the Pack its first season-opening loss since 1993.

OPENING TIP

- South Alabama is 1-0 for the 10th time in the last 11 seasons.
- USA is 10-37 all-time in road openers and has lost 19 of its last 21.
- The Jaguars last defeated a member of the ACC in the 2012-13 season opener, a 76-71 win at No. 25/24 Florida State.
- USA allowed AUM to shoot 43.6 percent (17-39) from the floor and 47.1 percent (8-17) from 3-point land in the first half, but just 31.0 percent (9-29) from the field after halftime and missed all 13 attempts from behind the arc.
- On the other end of the floor, the Jaguars converted 60 percent (18-30) of their field-goal attempts in the second half.
- USA has scored 81 points or more in three of its last five games dating back to the end of last year.
- Junior Nick Stover, in his first game since the 2013-14 season after transferring from Loyola Marymount, set a new career high with 17 points and tied his personal best with nine rebounds. He shot 6-for-12 from the floor and 3-for-5 from 3-point land. Stover averaged 4.2 points and 1.7 rebounds in 62 career games at LMU.
- Junior Tafari Whittingham came off the bench to post career-high totals of 14 points and seven rebounds. Twelve of those points came in the second half as he made all five of his field-goal attempts. He missed all but five games last year with a knee injury and received a medical redshirt.
- Senior Ken Williams recorded his 12th career 20-point game — 11th since the start of last season — vs. AUM with a team-best 21 points. He moved up to a tie for sixth at USA in career 3s with 145 after hitting three times from behind the arc and needs eight to tie for fifth.
- Williams was named First Team Preseason All-Sun Belt in October.
- Williams is the current holder of the school's freshman (55) and sophomore (87) 3-point record—the 87 treys are fifth-most in school history.
- Georgi Boyanov, who had three double-doubles last season, second-most on the team, just missed one in the exhibition with nine points and a game-high 12 rebounds. In the regular-season opener, he pulled down a game-best 10 rebounds. That was his fourth career double-digit rebound performance.
- In 2014-15, Barrington Stevens III became just the second player in school history to have two seasons with an assist/turnover ratio of 2.0 or greater, and first since 1981. His assist total of 104 is the highest by a Jaguar since 2007.
- Stevens had nine points and five rebounds vs. AUM, and tied his career high with three steals.
- Williams and Nikola Marijan are the only two USA freshman to start a season opener in the last five years.

Key Stats:

Martin's career-high 21 points led all scorers in the contest. He also added four steals, three rebounds, two steals and two blocks. Abdul-Malik Abu added 17 points, six rebounds and four assists. Freshman wing Maverick Rowan scored 16 points in his collegiate debut. After missing his first four attempts, Rowan shot 6-for-11. William & Mary, which won 20 games and a share of the CAA regular season title last year, shot nearly 52 percent from the floor and had six different players score at least eight points.

Turning Point:

Shortly after NC State picked up its only lead of the contest at 3-2, William & Mary shot 6-for-7 from the floor and added five free throws to build a 23-5 lead. NC State was unable to come back from the deficit.

Gott Said It:

"Let me say we're disappointed and we've got a long way to go. We learned tonight that we have a long way to go. The first thing we have to understand is that the Sweet Sixteen run is a year in the past, it's in the rearview mirror and we've got to figure out this team and how we have to play. And we better learn quick. Tonight you saw a very experienced, well-oiled machine playing against a very inexperienced team that didn't handle adversity well. They jumped out to a 23-5 lead, they're making every shot and playing very well and I think at that point we began to get really hurried. We began to try to score too much off the dribble, not trusting our offense. We had some breakdowns defensively and it's at that point in time where you have to execute even better. We were trying to make a ten point shot every trip; we were trying to get it all back. We became rushed and we dug ourselves in a deeper hole. We need to learn to have some poise, no matter the score, and respond better. I'm talking about executing your offense, making defensive adjustments. Those are the type of things that we need to learn how to do. We looked like a very inexperienced young team today. We've got to get a lot better, and we're going to get a lot better. That's a good team too; I have a hard time seeing those guys losing a lot of games in their conference. They played awfully well tonight. They play like that and they're a potential NCAA Tournament team."

HOME OPENING SUCCESS

In the 48 years of the program, the Jaguars have a history of successful home openers... USA sports a 40-8 record in its home opening contests and has won 24 in a row... The last loss was 81-75 to Southern Miss in 1991... The streak was extended earlier this year with an 88-68 win over Auburn-Montgomery... Spring Hill is the most frequent victim during the streak, losing three times... The Jaguars have defeated Abilene Christian, Alabama State, Alcorn State and Prairie View A&M twice each in season lid-lifters.

WILLIAMS NAMED TO 2014-15 ALL-SUN BELT TEAM...

Sophomore **Ken Williams** was the Jaguars' lone representative on the All-Sun Belt teams... Williams was tabbed to the second team after ranking seventh in the league in points (15.9 ppg), second in 3-pointers (2.6 pg), and eighth in 3-point percentage (.371) and free-throw percentage (.794) during the regular season.

... AND 2015-16 PRESEASON ALL-SUN BELT TEAM...

Williams joined Arkansas State's **Anthony Livingston**, Louisiana-Lafayette's **Shawn Long**, Texas State's **Emani Gant** and Troy's **Wesley Person** on the Preseason all-Sun Belt First Team.

STOVER BACK IN UNIFORM

After sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, junior **Nick Stover** returns to the court to play a big role for the Jaguars... In his first game in a South Alabama uniform he set a new career high with 17 points and three 3-pointers, and tied a personal best with nine rebounds... Stover averaged 4.2 points and 1.7 rebounds in 62 career games his freshman and sophomore seasons at Loyola Marymount.

WILLIAMS EXPERIENCES SECOND-HALF SURGE

After averaging 11.5 points and shooting 30.6 percent from the floor over the first 13 games of the season, sophomore **Ken Williams** exploded in the final 20 games—averaging 18.5 points—en route to Second Team All-Sun Belt Conference honors... Williams opened the year with 18 points vs. Carroll in the season opener, but had just 13 combined in the next two games while converting five of his 26 shots (19.2%) from the floor... While he had eight double-digit scoring games in his first 13 outings, he shot better than 40 percent just three times and was under 30 percent on seven occasions... Starting with the Jan. 8 game vs. Appalachian State, where he scored a career-high 26 points, Williams had nine 20-point outings, including five in a row, the longest by a USA player since 2007-08... Williams had at least 23 points in the first four games in that run, something not accomplished by a Jaguar since 1988-89... He set a new career high with 29 points vs. Texas-Arlington on Feb. 14, converting six 3-pointers.

THE JUICE IS LOOSE

After a slump that saw him average 9.0 points and shoot 24.4 percent from the floor over four games, **Ken "Juice" Williams** broke out of that dry spell in grand fashion by averaging 24.0 points over his next five games, including four in a row with 23 or more, becoming the first USA player since **Jeff Hodge** in 1988-89 to score 23 or more in four straight games... The streak included a then-career-high 28 at Louisiana-Lafayette (1/17) on 9 of 14 shooting from the floor and 3 of 4 from 3-point range, and a then-personal-best 26 on 8 of 12 shooting and 5 of 6 from distance vs. Appalachian State... The 23-point streak was broken against Arkansas-Little Rock (1/19) with 20, making him the first Jaguar since **Demetric Bennett** in the 2007-08 campaign to have 20 or more in five straight outings... In this five-game stretch, Williams converted 59.3 percent (35-59) of his shots overall and 66.7 percent (18-27) of his 3-point attempts, averaging 3.6 triples per contest... Prior to his outburst, he was shooting 30.6 percent overall and 31.2 percent from 3.

JOHNSON AMONG USA'S ELITE FRESHMEN

Freshman **Taishaun Johnson** found himself on South Alabama's record book for freshmen after an impressive rookie campaign... Johnson broke **Jeff Hodge's** 1988-89 school record for points by a freshman March 5 at Arkansas State and finished the year with 414 points... Johnson's 12.5 scoring average is second-best among all USA fresh-

men... Johnson was prolific at the free-throw line, leading the team in both free throws and free-throw attempts while setting new school records... Johnson made 138 free throws, besting the previous freshman record of 95 set in 2009-10, and he broke the attempts mark of 144 set in 1978-79, and ended up with 177... His free-throw percentage of .780 is third-best among all USA rookies... Johnson is also on the list of freshman 3-point shooters, ranking third in treys (40) and second in attempts (137).

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

South Alabama reached the 100-point plateau for the first time in over three seasons on Jan. 8 in its 104-95 victory over Appalachian State... It was the most points by the program since scoring 123 vs. William Carey on Feb. 25, 2003, the first 100-point game since putting up 102 vs. Alcorn State on Dec. 11, 2011, and the first 100-point game against a league opponent since a 101-76 win vs. Florida Atlantic on Jan. 6, 2007... Six players scored double-digit points—the first time that had occurred since Feb. 24, 2011 vs. UALR—led by sophomore **Ken Williams'** game- and career-high 26 points... The Jaguars shot 61.2 percent from the floor—the first 60-percent shooting game since 2008-09—and 58.8 percent (10-for-17) from 3-point land... USA also made 44 trips to the free-throw line, converting 34 times... The Jags scored 48 points in the first half and 56 in the second, season highs in both halves.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION, PART 2

Last year, South Alabama scored 90 points or more three times in a season for the first time since 2010-11, and 89 points or more five times in one year for the first time since 1994-95.

WILLIAMS TOPPLES FRESHMAN AND SOPHOMORE 3-POINT RECORDS

Ken Williams set a freshman class 3-point record with 55 in 2013-14, obliterating the previous mark of 41 set by **Emmett Thomas** in the 2000-01 season, and followed that up by breaking the sophomore record as well and currently has 84... Williams was second on the team in triples as a freshman, and ranked 10th in the Sun Belt with 1.8 per game... He led the team with a .342 long-range percentage and hit a career-high five in a game twice... Williams broke **Derek Turner's** sophomore mark of 71 Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern, and ranked second in the league with 2.6 made per game... Williams had eight games with four treys or more, including a career-best six at IUPUI (12/20) and vs. Texas-Arlington (2/14).

QUITE THE DEBUT

John Brown wasted little time in making an impact for the Jaguars in 2014-15, scoring 22 points in his USA debut against Carroll... Brown went 4-for-6 from 3-point land and 6-for-6 from the foul line... Fourteen of those points came after halftime and he made all four of his 3-point attempts in the second half... He led the team in scoring his second time out at Southern Miss with 14 points of 7 of 12 shooting.

WHITTINGHAM RECEIVES MEDICAL REDSHIRT

Junior **Tafari Whittingham** missed the final 27 games of the 2014-15 season due to injuries and received a fifth year of eligibility... The Brooklyn, N.Y. native averaged 4.6 points and 3.0 rebounds in five appearances, and did not play after Dec. 6 against Middle Tennessee... Whittingham underwent two surgeries in the offseason prior to the 2014-15 campaign and suffered an aggravation of a previous injury Nov. 28.

JAGS ON TV

The University of South Alabama men's and women's basketball teams will each be televised four times throughout the 2015-16 season as part of the league's television package... USA SBC doubleheaders at Georgia State (Jan. 9), at Arkansas State (Feb. 4), vs. Georgia Southern (Feb. 13) and at Appalachian State (Feb. 18) will all air on ESPN3... The game at N.C. State on Nov. 15 will be shown on ESPNU, and the contest at LSU on Nov. 19 will be televised on the SEC Network.

JAGUARS PICKED SEVENTH IN PRESEASON POLL

In a poll of the league's coaches, South Alabama received 56 points in the preseason poll and was voted seventh... Louisiana-Lafayette garnered 119 points and nine of 11 first-place votes, while defending champion Georgia State earned 108 points and two first-place nods.

ACCURACY IS THE KEY TO SUCCESS

South Alabama is 90-20 when compiling a higher shooting percentage than its opponent since the start of the 2008-09 campaign (55-16 vs. SBC schools) but 16-90 (8-56 vs. Sun Belt teams) when being outshot... Last season South Alabama was 9-3 when winning the shooting battle but 3-17 (1-17 vs. Division I opponents) when losing it... In 2012-13 the Jags posted a 13-1 record (11-1 vs. Sun Belt) when outshooting their opponent... In 2010-11, the Jaguars were 11-2 with the shooting advantage and 1-14 without it... South Alabama was 14-3 in 2011-12 when outshooting its opponent and 3-9 when outshot by its opponent.

Last season, South Alabama was 10-5, its lowest win percentage when scoring 70-plus in the last eight years, and was 2-15 when scoring 69 or fewer... The Jags went 12-3 (9-0 in Sun Belt play) in 2012-13... USA opened the 2009-10 season with 10 straight wins when hitting at least 70 before dropping an 86-78 decision at North Texas (1/21), and did not reach 70 the rest of the season... The Jags were 10-2 in 2011-12, with one of those losses coming in overtime.

AT HOME IN THE MITCHELL CENTER

Since the facility opened in 1999, the Jaguars have established a winning tradition on their home floor, the Mitchell Center... In 15 seasons, South Alabama has a 162-72 (.692) record and has eight seasons of 10 or more wins... Head Coach
Butler, 1998
3rd Season

From the moment he was hired in March 2013, University of South Alabama men's basketball head coach Matthew Graves made it a top priority to "change the culture" at South Alabama.

After spending 17 years at Butler University as both a student-athlete and coach, Graves set out to take the Butler philosophy and install that in the Jaguar men's basketball program.

Entering his third season, Graves is laying the foundation for success.

From revamping academics and a greater involvement in community service activities, to restructuring off-season workouts and practices to emphasize skill development, to the style of play during games, every aspect of the program has been evaluated and fine-tuned to Graves' standards.

The process aims to establish long-term prosperity both on and off the court, contending for championships while graduating student-athletes year in, and year out.

Overhauling the academic program resulted in the team's highest GPA in over five years in 2013-14, and both seniors, Antoine Allen and Augustine Rubit earned their degrees.

On the court, his first year in charge resulted in an 11-20 record with a roster that included 10 first- or second-year players, with inexperience rearing its ugly head in the 11 times the Jags let a second-half lead slip away. However, Rubit set both school and conference records for rebounds and became the first Jaguar to earn All-Sun Belt recognition four times.

Rubit finished in the top 10 in five different individual categories and ranked third in the league in rebounding (9.4 rpg) and sixth in scoring (17.0 ppg).

Graves' style of play and work on the court helped Barrington Stevens III go from a 0.7 assist-turnover ratio his freshman campaign to a 2.0 as a sophomore, the best ratio by a South Alabama player since 1988-89.

His second season may have only resulted in one more win overall, but the improvements on the court were noticeable. The Jaguars' increased conference wins from five to nine and earned the No. 6 seed in the Sun Belt Tournament, a year after failing to qualify.

After a slow start to the campaign, South Alabama finished with 10 wins over the final 21 contests and won the program's first SBC Tournament game since 2012.

In conference games, the Jags were fourth in scoring (72.4 ppg), second in field goal percentage (.454) and first in 3-point percentage (.369). The team improved by almost six points per contest in the final 22 games, and increased its field goal and 3-point percent-

ages by 5.7 and 5.8 percent, respectively.

A major driving force in that improvement was the sophomore Ken Williams, who earned all-Sun Belt distinction after averaging 15.7 points—eighth in the league—and converting 2.6 treys per outing, which was second. In league games, he was fourth in scoring average (18.0 ppg) and 3-point percentage (.403), and first in 3s per game (2.8).

Graves spent the previous 10 seasons as an assistant on the staff at Butler, where his efforts helped the Bulldogs advance to back-to-back NCAA Tournament championship games and appear in the event in six of the last seven years.

During his tenure at Butler, Graves helped the program to an overall record of 244-98 (71.3%), a berth in national postseason tournaments each of the last eight seasons and eight straight years with 20-plus victories. Following the 2009-10 campaign that saw the Bulldogs finish 33-5 after falling to Duke 61-59 in the national title contest, he was promoted to associate head coach; in his first year in that role, Butler returned to the NCAA Tournament championship game after defeating Pittsburgh, Florida and Wisconsin — the first, second and fourth seeds — in the Southeast Region while going on to post a 28-10 record.

In 2012-13, the Bulldogs' first in the Atlantic 10 Conference, they went 27-9 including an 11-5 mark in league action. In addition to advancing to the third round of the NCAA Tournament, Butler defeated two of the four No. 1 seeds in the event — Indiana and Gonzaga — during the regular season.

Graves first helped lead Butler back to postseason play in 2005-06, when the school went 20-13 after earning a first-round win in the National Invitation Tournament. The following year, the Bulldogs won the NIT Season Tip-Off and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament before falling to eventual champion Florida en route to a final record of 29-7. Butler finished 30-4 after claiming the Horizon League Tournament title and a first-round NCAA win in 2007-08, advancing to the NCAA Tournament again the next season while posting a 26-6 mark.

While on the Butler staff, Graves was listed No. 2 on CollegeInsider.com's ranking of top 25 mid-major assistants in 2009 while the previous year FoxSports.com recognized him as one of the top 10 mid-major assistants in the country.

As a player, Graves lettered four years at Butler and was part of a program that posted a 95-54 (63.8%) mark while he was in school. He was team captain each of his final two seasons, when the Bulldogs went 23-10 and 22-11, respectively, after winning the Mid-western Collegiate Conference Tournament title and advancing to the NCAA Tournament. Graves was the third-leading scorer on the team in 1996-97 when Butler made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 35 years, while as a senior he was chosen the squad's most valuable player and was named to the MCC all-tournament team after recording 18 points in the championship contest.

Off the court, he was named to the GTE Academic All-District V team his final year and was also an academic all-league selection.

Graves earned his bachelor's degree from Butler in education (chemistry) in 1998 and his master's degree from the school in 2003 in education administration. He and his wife Susan have two daughters, Abigail and Lillian.
