The Starting 5 - The Top 5 Storylines For This Game**1. FIRST GLIMPSE OF THE 2015-16 WOLFPACK**

While Sunday's exhibition contest doesn't count in the official won-loss ledger, it will be the public's first glimpse at the NC State Wolfpack. Three starters return from last season's 22-14 squad that made a run to the Sweet 16. Cat Barber (12.1 points per game) is the team's returning leader, while post players Abdul-Malik Abu, Lennard Freeman and BeeJay Anya all started at least 11 games a year ago. In addition to twins Caleb and Cody Martin, the Pack has three newcomers on the perimeter. After sitting out last season, Terry Henderson is now eligible to play following his transfer to NCSU from West Virginia. Maverick Rowan is a sharp-shooting 6-7 freshman and the Pack also has an athletic 6-8 freshman in Shaun Kirk.

2. READY FOR T. HENNY

Terry Henderson made 89 shots from 3-point range in his two seasons at West Virginia. The Raleigh native, who averaged 11.7 points per game as a sophomore, sat out last season and is now primed for a significant role this season. With the Pack having to replace long-range threats Trevor Lacey and Ralston Turner, NC State will be looking to Henderson to provide perimeter scoring.

3. ON THE MARK

Head coach Mark Gottfried enters the 2015-16 season with a chance to accomplish something only one other coach in ACC basketball history has matched. Gottfried has led his program to the NCAA Tournament in each of his first four seasons, which has only been accomplished by Skip Prosser (first 4 years) and Roy Williams (first 6 years). The Wolfpack is 92-52 under Gottfried, which is the program's highest win total for a four-year span since 1972-76 (100 wins).

4. MORE ON BIG CAT

While Anthony Barber is famously known as Cat, his mother, Pamela Barber, has always called him Big Cat. He will need to be a big cat this season for the Wolfpack. Barber, a second team preseason All-ACC pick, will be counted on to play major minutes while running the team and contributing his usual standout on-the-ball defense. Barber was the 'Big Cat' down the stretch for the Pack last season, averaging 14.6 points and 4.0 assists per game over the last 14 games of the season. Included in that run was a career-best performance of 34 points in the ACC second round against Pittsburgh.

5. STARTING OFF THE SEASON RIGHT

After Sunday's exhibition contest the Wolfpack opens the regular season with two games during the first weekend, hosting a William & Mary team that won 19 games last season and a South Alabama team that figures to be much improved this season. After a home game vs. IUPUI, Mark Gottfried's team heads to Brooklyn, N.Y., for a pair of games at the Barclays Center. A win over Arizona State in the first game in New York could potentially set up a showdown with nationally-ranked LSU, who the Wolfpack edged in the NCAA Tournament last season.

- One of 4 all-time ACC coaches to lead his team to the ACC Tournament semifinal round in each of his first 3 seasons.
- Won more games in his first 2 seasons with the Pack (48) than any coach in school history except Everett Case (55) in 1947 and 1948.
- Posted 24 wins and .667% winning percentage in 2011-12, which was the best all-time in the ACC for first-year head coaches.
- Is one of 14 coaches to capture a win over a team ranked No. 1 at two different schools. (3/20/04 at Alabama and 1/12/13 at NC State).
- Only 7 active coaches have taken 3 different schools to multiple NCAA Tournament appearances
- Has signed 4 McDonald's All-Americans since coming to NC State.

11 Seasons at Alabama (210-132 overall)

- Coached Alabama to 8 postseason appearances, including 5 consecutive NCAA tourney trips (2002-06).
- Led Alabama to a No. 1 ranking during the 2002-03 season.
- Voted 2002 SEC Coach of the Year.
- His 2003-04 Alabama squad advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight, the longest tourney run in school history.

3 Seasons at Murray State (68-24 overall)

- Won an OVC title in each of his 3 seasons and was OVC Coach of the Year all 3 seasons.
- Led Murray State to 3 postseason appearances, including a pair of NCAA tourney berths.
- His 1997-98 team earned the highest NCAA seed in OVC history (#9 seed).

NC State jumped from 25th nationally in 2014 to 12th last season in average men's basketball attendance. More than 300,000 Wolfpackers crossed the turnstiles at PNC Arena last season, the highest total since the building opened for the 1999-00 season. Notably, the Pack saw the nation's largest attendance increase, jumping from an average of 15,043 to 16,299.

NATIONALLY-RANKED AT THE FINISH

After wins over LSU and Villanova landed the Wolfpack in the Sweet 16, NC State was listed in the season's final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. The Pack was ranked No. 24 in the final poll. It was the first time finishing the season ranked since the team's Sweet 16 run in 2012, which landed the Pack at No. 20 in the final ranking.

BEE-JAY AN-YA!

BeeJay Anya led the ACC with 2.53 blocks per game last season and is on pace to shatter school rejections records. He swatted 91 shots last season, which was the second-highest total in NC State history. After two seasons, Anya has blocked 137 shots, which already ranks fifth in school history.

FOUR HALL OF FAME VICTORIES

Last season, in addition to the team's run to the Sweet 16, the Wolfpack defeated four coaches who are currently members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Victories over Duke and Syracuse at home and road wins at UNC Chapel Hill and Louisville made Mark Gottfried the nation's only coach to own four wins over Hall of Fame coaches last season.

DO 'ONE MORE' WITH THE PROGRAM

This fall, the NC State men's basketball program welcomed The Program onto campus. The Program is a leadership and team building organization run by Marines. The Program spent two mentally and physically grueling days with the Wolfpack that included:

- different series of exercises and drills conducted in perfect precision
- drills involving 50-lb. sandbags and 7-foot-long poles
- fireman-carry suicides for 21-, 41- and 61-yard lengths done only with instruction
- individual and team drills in the pool beginning at 4 a.m.

double-double in the NCAA Tournament against Villanova last season. Lennard Freeman is the team's leading rebounder with 5.7 boards per game.

TOP GUN

A late addition to the roster this summer was Maverick Rowan, a 6-7 freshman from Fort Lauderdale, Fla. Rowan, whose father played college basketball at St. John's and was a fan of the Top Gun movie, was one of the top prospects in the 2016 class and decided to graduate early and reclassify to suit up for the Wolfpack this season. Rowan, who won a high school state title in both Pennsylvania and Florida, averaged 28.5 points last year as a high school junior.

NARD'S LEG

Lennard Freeman, NC State's leading rebounder, missed several weeks of the summer after undergoing successful surgery on his leg. The 6-8 junior had a 14-inch rod inserted in his lower right leg to heal a fracture. Freeman grabbed 5.6 boards per game last season and had a double-double in State's NCAA Tournament win over Villanova.
