THE MATCHUP

- ◆ North Carolina (15-2, 4-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) will look to extend its eight-game winning streak and continue its best ACC start under **Roy Williams** when it hosts North Carolina State (10-7, 0-4) on Saturday.
- ◆ The Tar Heels and Wolfpack will tip off just after noon in the Smith Center.
- ◆ Dave O'Brien (play-by-play), Dick Vitale (analyst) and Allison Williams (reporter) will call the game for an ESPN national television audience.
- ◆ ESPN Radio will broadcast the game nationally, with Bill Rosinski (play-by-play) and Bob Valvano (analyst) on the mic.

TAR HEEL STORYLINES

- ◆ Carolina is returning to action a week after its 84-73 win at Syracuse last Saturday night. The Tar Heels began spring semester classes and practiced this week during their time away from game action.
- ◆ The Tar Heels, off to their first 4-0 ACC start under **Roy Williams**, are trying for their ninth win in a row, their 13th win in 14 games and their 16th victory of the season.
- ◆ The last time UNC had a better ACC start than 4-0 was in 2000-01, when it started 11-0.
- ◆ UNC is ranked No. 5 in this week's Associated Press and coaches polls. N.C. State is unranked.

UP NEXT

- ◆ Wake Forest will visit the Smith Center next Wednesday.
- ◆ Carolina will play three of its next four contests at home, hosting the Wolfpack on Saturday and Wake Forest and Boston College later this month while also visiting Virginia Tech during the stretch
- ◆ After hosting BC on Jan. 30, Carolina will play three in a row on the road at Louisville, Notre Dame and Boston College between Feb. 2 and Feb. 9.

TAR HEEL TIDBITS

TEAM NOTES

- ◆ UNC scored on 16 of its final 19 possessions over the last 8:15 in its win at Syracuse. On two of the three failed possessions, UNC got an offensive rebound and scored second-chance points.
- ◆ Carolina is 4-0 in ACC play for the first time under **Roy Williams**. The last time UNC began ACC play better was 2000-01 under head coach **Matt Doherty**, when UNC won its first 11 in conference play.
- ◆ Carolina has scored 80 or more points in 13 consecutive games and in 15 of 17 outings overall this season. UNC averages 87.5 ppg in 2015-16.
- ◆ The Tar Heels are 227-28 in 13 seasons under **Roy Williams** when they score at least 80 points (14-1 this season).
- ◆ The Tar Heels have scored 90 or more points seven times this season after doing so five times all of last year.
- ◆ UNC is 49-1 under Williams when it scores 100 points or more.
- ◆ Carolina has shot 50 percent or better from the floor in 13 of 17 games this year. The Tar Heels are shooting .502 as a team in 2015-16.
- ◆ The Tar Heels have shot 50 percent or better in the second half of 22 of their last 27 games (including 13 of 17 games in 2015-16).
- ◆ No Tar Heel player scored 25 points in a game last season, but the team has had four 25-point performances already this year by three different players: Justin Jackson (25 vs. Northern Iowa), Kennedy Meeks (25 vs. Temple) and Brice Johnson twice (25 vs. Tulane and 27 vs. UCLA).
- ♦ In the NCAA stats: The Tar Heels are fourth in the nation in scoring at 87.5 points per game, third with an assist-turnover ratio of 1.78, seventh with 19.3 assists per game, 16th in rebounding margin (9.9) and eighth in field goal percentage (50.2).
- ◆ Carolina is averaging 10.8 turnovers per game in 2015-16. Last year, the Tar Heels averaged nearly 13 turnovers per contest.
- ◆ Carolina is ranked No. 7 in the nation in the KenPom.com statistical rankings. UNC leads the nation in adjusted offensive efficiency (122.4) and is 66th in adjusted defensive efficiency (97.8).
- ◆ N.C. State is No. 85 in the KenPom rankings, including 65th in offensive efficiency (108.8) and 131st in defensive efficiency (100.7).

PLAYER NOTES

- ◆ Brice Johnson enters the N.C. State game with 792 career rebounds, 19th in Carolina history. Jason Capel is 18th with 807 and Mike O'Koren is 17th with 815.
- ◆ Isaiah Hicks became the seventh different player to lead Carolina in scoring this season when he scored 21 points at Syracuse.
- \label{hicks} made five or more field goals three times in his first 84 career games (through the

Tulane game) and has made five or more field goals in six of the last seven games.

- ◆ Hicks has 220 career rebounds 100 on the offensive glass and 120 on the defensive (45 percent offensive rebounds, the highest percentage among active Tar Heels).
- ◆ Hicks has scored in double figures in eight of the last nine games (scoring eight at Florida State) and is shooting 39 for 52 (.750) from the floor in that span.
- ◆ Kennedy Meeks returned to game action on Jan. 9 in the win at Syracuse after missing seven games with a bruised bone in his left knee. He came off the bench to score eight points in 14 minutes vs. the Orange.
- ◆ Marcus Paige has scored 1,582 points entering the N.C. State game, 24th in Carolina history. Mitch Kupchak is 23rd with 1,611 and Hubert Davis is 22nd with 1,615.
- ◆ Paige has made a three-pointer in a school-record 41 consecutive games (last 30 games of last season and his first 11 games in 2015-16). The previous record was 34 games by Shammond Williams, Rashad McCants and Hubert Davis.
- ◆ Paige is the ACC's top active career scorer with 1,582 points and Brice Johnson is fourth with 1,322.
- ◆ Paige is the 12th Tar Heel to reach 500 career assists. He enters the Syracuse game with 519, 11th in school history. Jimmy Black is 10th with 525.
- ◆ Paige is the only Tar Heel and one of seven players in ACC history with at least 1,500 points, 500 assists, 150 steals and 250 three-pointers.
- ◆ Paige is one of four Tar Heels with 1,500 career points and 500 career assists (joining Phil Ford, Jeff Lebo and Kenny Smith).
- ◆ Paige made one three-pointers vs. Syracuse to extend his career school record to 250.
- ◆ Paige has 45 assists and eight turnovers in his 11 games this year (an assist/turnover ratio of 5.63).
- ◆ Paige leads the Tar Heels with a threepoint percentage of 41.7 (25 of 60). His career-best season is 39.5 percent, set last year.
- ◆ Johnson has nine double-doubles this season and is averaging a team-high 16.7 points and 10.2 rebounds per game this season. His previous career highs were 12.9 ppg and 7.8

- ◆ Johnson leads the ACC in field goal percentage (64.4) and defensive rebounding (7.82 per game) and is third in overall rebounding (10.2 per game).
- ◆ Joel Berry II has stepped into a starting role this season and improved across the board statistically, including scoring (4.2 to 12.6 ppg), field goal percentage (40.4 to 44.0), three-point percentage (35.4 to 37.0) and assists (1.5 to 4.4 per game).
- ◆ Berry has scored in double figures in 14 of 17 games this season. As a freshman he scored in double figures one time.

PREVIEWING N.C. STATE

- ◆ North Carolina State enters Saturday's game with a 10-7 record, 0-4 in ACC play. The Wolfpack is on a four-game losing streak since the start of conference action this month, including losses at Virginia Tech and Wake Forest and at home to Louisville and Florida State.
- ◆ Wolfpack guard Cat Barber is the ACC's leading scorer at 22.5 points per game. Barber also is fourth in the conference in assists at 4.88 per contest.
- ◆ In the KenPom.com adjusted efficiency ratings, N.C. State ranks 85th overall, including 65th offensively (108.8) and 131st defensively (102.9).

SERIES HISTORY

- ◆ The Tar Heels lead the all-time series with North Carolina State, 151-77, and have won 17 of the last 19 games vs. NCSU.
- ◆ Going further back, UNC also has won 23 of the last 26 and 40 of its last 50 games against N.C. State despite losing the most recent meeting (last February in Chapel Hill).
 - ◆ Carolina is 73-23 overall against N.C. State

- ◆ NCSU won in Chapel Hill last year for the first time since 2003. **Roy Williams**-coached Tar Heel teams are 11-1 against the Wolfpack in Chapel Hill.
- ◆ Carolina has won 19 of its last 23 games against the Wolfpack in Chapel Hill, losing in 2002-03, 2001-02, 1997-98 and 2014-15 since the 1991-92 season.
- ♦ Roy Williams is 28-3 as a head coach against North Carolina State, including a 5-0 record at Kansas and a 23-3 mark at Carolina. Under Williams, UNC swept the season series from the Wolfpack in 2003-04, 2004-05, 2005-06, 2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12 and 2013-14 took two of three meetings in 2006-07 (splitting in the regular season and beating the Wolfpack in the ACC Tournament



- ◆ Carolina has swept the season series with the Wolfpack nine times in **Roy Williams'** 12 years as the Tar Heel head coach.
- ◆ Last season, the Tar Heels won, 81-79, in Raleigh on Jan. 14 and the Wolfpack won, 58-46, in Chapel Hill on Feb. 24.
- ◆ In 2013-14, Carolina beat the Wolfpack in both Chapel Hill and Raleigh. The teams split a pair of meetings in 2012-13 with each squad winning at home.
- ◆ The Tar Heels won 13 in a row in the series between 2007 and 2012.
- ◆ UNC's 13-game winning streak over NCSU that ended with a loss in Raleigh on Jan. 26, 2013, was its longest in the series and its longest in the ACC era against a Big Four opponent. The Tar Heels had a 12-game streak against Wake Forest from 1982-87.

LASTYEAR IN CHAPEL HILL

- ◆ North Carolina State held Carolina to its fewest points ever in the Smith Center and beat the Tar Heels, 58-46, on Feb. 24, 2015, in Chapel Hill.
- ◆ Carolina's previous scoring low in the Smith Center was 48 in a 48-46 win over Boston College on Feb. 19, 2011.
- ◆ Carolina scored 18 first-half points, matching the fewest in any half by UNC in **Roy Williams'** 12 seasons as head coach (also 18 vs. Butler in the first half in Maui on Nov. 20, 2012). The 18 also equal UNC's fewest in a half in the Smith Center (had 18 in the first half against Wake Forest on Jan. 27, 1996).
- ◆ N.C. State won in the Smith Center for the first time since Feb. 25, 2003.
- ◆ Carolina's 19 field goals matched its season low (also 19 against lowa).
- ◆ UNC went 5 for 9 from the free throw line, both season lows.
- ◆ Kennedy Meeks had 12 points and 14 rebounds.
- ◆ Justin Jackson led all scorers with 16 points on 7 of 17 shooting from the floor. It was his highest scoring output in nine games.
- ◆ Carolina didn't score a field goal in the final 5:46 of the first half as NCSU closed the half on an 8-2 run for a 29-18 halftime lead.
- ◆ After North Carolina State started the second half on a 7-2 run to open a 16-point lead at 36-20, the Tar Heels stormed back with a 16-2 run to pull within two at 38-36. State held onto the lead, however, and the Tar Heels never got closer than four the rest of the way. N.C. State closed the game on an 8-0 run.

LASTYEAR IN RALEIGH

- ◆ Marcus Paige had his second consecutive big game at North Carolina State to lead the Tar Heels to an 81-79 win in Raleigh on Jan. 14, 2015.
- ◆ Carolina is 60-45 against the Wolfpack in Raleigh, including 12-4 in PNC Arena.
- ◆ Paige had season highs with 23 points, nine assists, five three-pointers and four steals. He did not commit a turnover and matched his

season high with 36 minutes played. It was his most assists since having a career-high 10 in the 2013 ACC Tournament vs. Florida State.

- ◆ Carolina hit 7 of 8 free throw tries in the final 30 seconds to ice the win, including 4 for 4 by Paige, 2 for 2 by Nate Britt and 1 for 2 by J.P. Tokoto.
- ◆ Paige has totaled 58 points in his last two trips to Raleigh vs. N.C. State while shooting 12 for 17 from three-point range (70.6 percent) with 11 rebounds, 14 assists and one turnover in 77 minutes.
- ◆ Paige went 5 for 5 from three-point range, which tied the second-most three-pointers in a game by a Tar Heel without a miss.
- ◆ Paige's five three-pointers were his most since he hit seven in Raleigh vs. N.C. State on Feb. 26. 2014.
 - ◆ Isaiah Hicks scored a then career-high 12 oints.
- ◆ Kennedy Meeks had his seventh double-double of the season with 15 points and a game-high 10 rebounds.
- ◆ Carolina shot better than 50 percent from the floor in both halves for the first time in ACC play and just the second time all year (also vs. East Carolina on Dec. 7).
- ◆ Roy Williams improved to 23-2 against North Carolina State as UNC's head coach and 28-2 overall. Carolina is 10-2 against N.C. State in Raleigh under Williams.
- ◆ The Tar Heel defense limited N.C. State to 33.3 percent shooting from the floor in the first half but could not take full advantage, allowing the Wolfpack out-rebound UNC 21-15 in the opening half (including a 12-2 edge on the offensive boards).
- ◆ Carolina hit 4 of its last 5 shots in the first half, closing the period on a 9-3 run to lead 32-26 at the break after the score had been tied 23-all.
- ◆ After NCSU pulled within two points at 54-52, UNC went on a 10-0 run to lead 64-52. The Wolfpack came within a point more than once in the closing minute but could not take the lead.

SIX DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORERS

- ◆ Six Tar Heels are averaging double figures in points per game this season: Brice Johnson (16.7 ppg), Marcus Paige (15.1), Justin Jackson (12.9), Joel Berry II (12.6), Kennedy Meeks (11.9) and Isaiah Hicks (10.2).
- ◆ Just one Carolina team in 105 years has had six double-figure scorers at the end of a season: the 1988-89 squad. That team had J.R. Reid (15.9), Kevin Madden (14.6), Steve Bucknall (13.1), Jeff Lebo (12.2), Rick Fox (11.5) and Scott Williams (11.4).
- ◆ Five UNC teams have boasted five double-figure scorers: 1958-59, 1971-72, 1986-87, 1994-95, 2004-05 and 2008-09.

JOHNSON NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- ◆ Senior forward **Brice Johnson** was the ACC Player of the Week for games played Jan. 4-10. The senior from Orangeburg, S.C., had 39 points and 23 rebounds at Florida State and 16 points, four rebounds and eight assists at Syracuse to win the award.
- ◆ This is the second time this season Johnson has earned ACC Player of the Week honors. He shared the award on Dec. 21st following his play against Tulane (25 points and 10 rebounds) and UCLA (27 points and nine rebounds).
- ◆ Johnson is the first Tar Heel in 24 seasons to win multiple ACC Player of the Week awards as a senior after not having won the award in his first three seasons. The last Tar Heel to accomplish that was **Hubert Davis**, who was a three-time recipient as a senior in 1992. The only other Tar Heel to do that was Kenny Smith, who won the weekly honor twice in 1987.
- ◆ Johnson followed his career-high 39-point performance at Florida State with a career-high eight assists at Syracuse. Since 1969, there have been 27 instances in which a Tar Heel scored 35 or more points in a game. Johnson is the only player in that group to have eight assists in the next game. The previous high was six assists by Charles Scott, who had 40 points against Duke in the 1969 ACC Tournament championship game and six assists in his next game against Duquesne in the 1969 NCAA Tournament.

- ◆ Williams's teams are 66-35 (.653) on the road in ACC play and have finished above .500 on the road nine times in 12 years under Williams.
- ◆ The Tar Heels are 2-0 on the ACC road this season (wins at Florida State and Syracuse).
- ◆ Williams' ACC road winning percentage of .653 is second-best in ACC history behind Vic Bubas of Duke (.667 from 1960-69). Frank McGuire of UNC and South Carolina is third at .618.
- ◆ UNC has 38 winning road records in 62 overall ACC seasons.
- ◆ Under Williams, UNC has gone 6-2 on the road in the ACC in 2004-05, 7-1 in 2005-06, 8-0 in 2007-08, 6-2 in 2008-09, 6-2 in 2010-11, 7-1 in 2011-12, 5-4 in 2012-13, 5-4 in 2013-14 and 6-3 in 2014-15.

JOHNSON, PAIGE ON WOODEN AWARD MIDSEASON TOP 25 LIST

- ◆ Seniors Brice Johnson and Marcus Paige are among 25 college basketball players on the John R. Wooden Award Mid-Season Top 25, the Los Angeles Athletic Club announced Jan. 13.
- ◆ Carolina is one of four schools (with Gonzaga, Kansas and Kentucky) to have two players on the Top 25 list.
- ◆ Johnson, a forward from Orangeburg, S.C., leads Carolina in scoring (16.7) and rebounding (10.2) and leads the ACC in field goal percentage at .644. Johnson has scored career highs in three different games this season − 39 at Florida State, 27 vs. UCLA and 25 vs. Tulane. He had a career-best 23 rebounds in the win at Florida State. Johnson is on pace to become the first Tar Heel to average a double-double and shoot at least 60 percent from the floor in 40 years.
- ◆ Paige, a guard from Marion, Iowa, missed the first six games due to a hand injury. He is second on the Tar Heels in scoring (15.1) and has 45 assists and just eight turnovers. He set the UNC record for most consecutive games with a three-pointer (41 and counting) and is one of only seven players in ACC history with 1,600 points, 500 assists, 150 steals and 250 three-point field goals. He scored a season-high 30 points at Florida State.
- ◆ The 40th annual Wooden Award, which is presented to the nation's top player, will be presented in April.

TAR HEELS WIN AT SYRACUSE FOR EIGHTH IN A ROW

- ◆ Carolina pulled away from Syracuse late and beat the Orange, 84-73, on Jan. 9 in the Carrier Dome
- ◆ UNC scored on 16 of its final 19 possessions over the last 8:15. On two of its three failed possessions, Carolina got an offensive rebound and scored second-chance points.
- ◆ Isaiah Hicks tied his career scoring high with 21 points and set his rebounding high with eight. He scored 19 of his 21 points in the second half.

- ◆ Justin Jackson had 16 points, his most in 11 games (since Kansas State). He missed shootaround on the afternoon of the game with an illness and was a gametime decision to play.

JOHNSON & PAIGE LEAD 106-90 WIN AT FLORIDA STATE

◆ Brice Johnson had 39 points and 23 rebounds and Marcus Paige scored 30 as the Tar Heels won, 106-90, at Florida State on Monday Jan. 4.

CAROLINA NOTES

- ◆ The teams combined for 196 points, most in a UNC game since Carolina beat Maryand, 108-91, on Feb. 3, 2009.
- ◆ The 106 points are the third-most by Carolina against the Seminoles, but the most since FSU joined the ACC in 1991-92. UNC scored 115 on Dec. 16, 1965, and 109 on Dec. 31, 1985.
- ◆ The 106 points are the most by UNC in Tallahassee against the Seminoles (previous was 96 in a 110-96 loss to FSU on 2/27/92).
- ◆ Carolina is 48-12 vs. Florida State with six straight wins and 18 of the last 21.
- ◆ The Tar Heels are 17-5 vs. the Seminoles in Tallahassee with wins in eight of their last nine trips to the Tucker Center.
- ◆ Carolina shot its lowest percentage for a half this season in the first (.366) and its highest percentage for a half in the second (.657).
- ◆ Carolina shot 50 percent for the game, the fourth game in a row and the 12th game this year UNC has shot at least 50 percent from the floor for a game.
- ◆ UNC's 106 points are its most in an ACC game since a 106-74 win at Boston College on Feb. 1, 2011.
- ◆ Carolina tied its season highs for both made free throws (24) and free throw attempts (32) and committed a season-high 16 turnovers.
- ◆ Carolina scored 65 points in the second half, which is the most in any half this season. It was the first time UNC scored 60 points in a half since it had 60 vs. East Carolina in the second half on 12/7/14.
- ◆ The 65 second-half points are the most by UNC in a half since it scored 67 in the second half against UAB on 12/1/12 in a 102-84 Tar Heel victory.

rebounds in the same game. Billy Cunningham is the only other Tar Heel to accomplish that. Cunningham had 48 points and 25 boards vs. Tulane on 12/10/64 and 40 points and 28 rebounds vs. Maryland on 1/13/64.

◆ According to ESPN, Johnson joins Texas's Kevin Durant and Oklahoma's Blake Griffin as the only players in the last 20 years with at least 39 and 23.

- ◆ Johnson set career highs with 39 points, 14 field goals, 11 free throws, 16 free throw attempts, seven offensive rebounds, 16 defensive rebounds, 23 rebounds, three steals (tied) and 37 minutes played.
- ◆ Johnson's 14 field goals are the most by a Tar Heel in the Roy Williams era. Previous was 13 by **Sean May** vs. Florida State and Wisconsin in 2005 and **Tyler Hansbrough** vs. Georgia Tech in 2006 and Notre Dame in 2008-09.
- ◆ Johnson's 14 field goals are the most by a Tar Heel since **Joseph Forte** made 15 en route to 36 points against Florida State on 2/22/01.
- ◆ Johnson's 23 rebounds are the most by a Tar Heel since May had 24 against Duke in 2005.
- ◆ The last Tar Heel to have at least 20 points and 20 rebounds in the same game was **Tyler Zeller** (20 points, 22 rebounds) against Ohio in the 2012 NCAA Tournament.
- ◆ Marcus Paige scored 30 points and had five assists and zero turnovers in 35 minutes.
- ◆ It was Paige's third career 30-point game (35 at NC State and 32 vs. Louisville as a sophomore).
- ◆ Paige made a season-high 10 field goals and a season-high five three-pointers. It was his first game with five 3FGs since Notre Dame in the 2015 ACC Tournament final.
- ◆ Paige had five assists and no turnovers to improve his numbers for the season to 37 assists and only six turnovers.
- ◆ It was Johnson's 10th career game with 20 or more points and the fourth this season (fourth time in his last seven games).
- ♦ It was Paige's 20th career game with 20 or more points and the third of this season.
- ◆ It was the first time UNC had two players with 30 points in the same game since 2/8/98 at Georgia Tech when **Shammond Williams** went for 42 and **Antawn Jamison** had 31 in a 107-100, double OT win.
- ◆ It was the first time UNC had two players with 25 points in the same game since 3/18/11 against Long Island University when Tyler Zeller had 32 and John Henson had 28.
- ◆ Joel Berry II had 12 points and four assists. He is the only Tar Heel to score in double figures in each of the last seven games.
- ◆ Berry II hit one three-pointer, but it was a key shot as he buried a three with 1:46 to play to push the lead back to double figures where it stayed for the rest of the game. He scored all three of his second-half field goals and seven points in the final 4:47.
- ◆ Justin Jackson tied his career high with three blocked shots.
- ◆ Kennedy Meeks missed his seventh straight game due to a bruised bone in his left knee. He is questionable for the game at Syracuse on Jan. 9th.
- ◆ Florida State's Xavier Rathan-Mayes made seven three-pointers, the most by any opposing player this season. Rathan-Mayes has scored 65 points in the last two games against the Tar Heels.

◆ The last opponent to score 30 in consecutive games against UNC was Duke's Nolan Smith who did it in the same season (34 and 30 in 2011).

BERRY LEADS SIX DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORERS IN WIN OVER YELLOW JACKETS

◆ Joel Berry II had a career-high 19 points and Joel James had an ACC-career high 11 points to lead an 86-78 win over Georgia Tech on Jan. 2 in Chapel Hill.

CAROLINA NOTES

- ◆ Carolina became just the third team to out-rebound Georgia Tech this season. The Tar Heels out-rebounded the Yellow Jackets, 39-29. Tennessee (by six) and Georgia (by one) also out-rebounded the Jackets.
- ◆ The Tar Heels came into the game allowing 7.0 points off turnovers in the last seven games. Georgia Tech scored eight points off turnovers in the first 11 minutes and 32 seconds.
- ◆ Carolina committed just two turnovers in the final 17 minutes, only one in the last 12:54 and none in the last 6:46. The Yellow Jackets score two points off UNC turnovers in the last 17 minutes, a pair of free throws by Marcus Georges-Hunt with 6:19 to play.
- ◆ Tech out-scored UNC, 14-9, in points off turnovers. It was the third time this year UNC has been out-scored in points off turnovers and the first time since Kansas State on Nov. 24.
- ◆ Carolina tied its season high with 24 made free throws (also at Texas).
- ◆ Carolina had six players score in double figures for the second time in three games and third time this year.
- ◆ This was the second time this season the Tar Heels have trailed at the half and they have won both games. The Yellow Jackets led 42-39. Kansas State led UNC, 32-30, but the Tar Heels won. 80-70.
- ◆ Carolina is now 52-49 in Smith Center history when trailing at the half.
- ◆ UNC is now 50-66 under **Roy Williams** when trailing at the half.
- ◆ Carolina is 68-24 vs. Georgia Tech, including 30-6 in Chapel Hill and 25-4 in the Smith Center.

PLAYER NOTES

- ◆ Joel Berry II scored a career-high 19 points and made a career-high eight free throws (out of nine attempts).
- ◆ Berry committed a career-high five turnovers (previous high was three), but scored six straight points to give Carolina the lead for good. Trailing by one, Berry hit a three-pointer from the right wing with 5:07 to play to give UNC a 69-67 lead. Twenty-seven seconds later, he drove for a basket, was fouled and converted the three-point play for a 72-67 lead.
- ◆ Isaiah Hicks scored 12 points and had two blocks. It was his seventh straight game scoring in double figures. Hicks is 33 for 44 (.750) from the floor in the last seven games.

- ◆ Joel James scored 11 points on 5 for 6 shooting from the floor. It was the third time he has scored in double figures in his career (113 games) and the most he has scored in an ACC game. He also scored 11 points against Florida Atlantic (in his second game as a freshman) and 11 vs. UNCG as a junior. His previous high in an ACC game was eight at NC State as a freshman.
- ◆ James made five field goals in one other game at UNCG on 12/16/14.
- ◆ Brice Johnson (15 points and a game-high 11 rebounds) had his eighth double-double of the season and the 18th of his career.

WILLIAMS IS 11TH IN CAREER WINS

- ◆ Head coach Roy Williams has won 765 games, the 11th-most Division I victories in NCAA history.
 - ◆ Lute Olson is 10th with 780.

WILLIAMS: BEST RECORD IN FIRST 200 ACC GAMES

- ◆ With the win over Georgia Tech on Jan. 2, **Roy Williams** set the ACC record for most wins by a head coach in his first 200 ACC regular-season games.
- ◆ Carolina went 143-57 in Williams' first 200 ACC regular-season games. **Dean Smith** held the previous mark at 142-58.
- ◆ Only three other coaches have won as many as 142 ACC regular-season games. Frank McGuire was 137-63, Mike Krzyzewski was 122-78 and Gary Williams was 110-90 in their first 200 ACC regular-season games.
- ◆ Williams is 765-204 in 28 seasons as a head coach, including 347-103 in 13 seasons at Carolina.

BRICE'S BIG GAME

- ◆ Brice Johnson had 39 points and 23 rebounds against Florida State on Jan. 4, 2016. He scored 28 points in the second half (he played all 20 minutes in the half), which was one point more than he scored in any of his previous 123 games as a Tar Heel (previous career high was 27 vs. UCLA on 12/19/15).
- ◆ This was the 24th time a Tar Heel has scored 39 or more points and his 39 points tie the 18th-highest total in a game in UNC history.
- ◆ It was the 35th time a Tar Heel has grabbed 20 or more rebounds and the 23 boards tie the 11th-highest single-game total in UNC history.
- ◆ It was the 11th time a Tar Heel had at least 30 points and 20 rebounds in the same game. That lists includes:
- ◆ Johnson is one of five Tar Heels to ever have at least 30 points and 20 rebounds in the same game, joining 1957 National and ACC Player of the Year Lennie Rosenbluth, 1965 ACC Player of the Year Billy Cunningham, 1958 ACC Player of the Year Pete Brennan and 1976 ACC Player of the Year Mitch Kupchak.
- ◆ Johnson is the first Tar Heel to have 30 points and 20 rebounds in 40 years, since Kupchak in 1976 did it against Tulane in a quadruple overtime game in New Orleans. It was just the second 30/20 and the first in a regulation-length game by a Tar Heel in 52 years.
- ◆ Johnson joined Cunningham as the only players in Carolina history to ever have at least 39 points and 23 rebounds in a game. Cunningham did that twice in 1964.
- ◆ Johnson established career highs in points (39), field goals made (14), free throws made (11), free throw attempts (16), offensive rebounds (7), defensive rebounds (16), rebounds (23), steals (tied, 3) and minutes played (37).
- ◆ Carolina players have accomplished 40/20 three times, 30/20 eight times and 20/20 another 12 times.
- ◆ Rusty Clark is the only Tar Heel with a 20-point, 30-rebound game. Clark scored 27 and grabbed a UNC record (that still stands today) 30 boards against Maryland on Feb. 21, 1968.

- ◆ He set the Carolina record with his 234th on Dec. 12 at Texas, passing **Shammond Williams** (233) for the most in Carolina history.

TAR HEELS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- ◆ The Tar Heels are 2-0 this season against AP-ranked ranked teams with wins over No. 2 Maryland (on Dec. 1) and No. 22 UCLA (Dec. 19).
- ◆ Carolina is 65-51 vs. opponents ranked in the AP poll in 13 seasons under **Roy Williams**.
- ◆ That includes a 12-26 record vs. top-five opponents and a 27-35 mark against top-10 foes.

◆ James serves on the NCAA's National Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, serving as the Atlantic Coast Conference's lone representative. He attended the NCAA Leadership Forum in Florida in April. James also is a member of the advisory committees for UNC's Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) and the ACC's Student-Athlete Advisory Council.

TAR HEELS SIGN THREE FOR 2016-17

- ◆ North Carolina signed three high school seniors to National Letters of Intent in November to attend UNC and play men's basketball for the Tar Heels.
- ◆ The three signees include: Tony Bradley, a 6-10 forward from Bartow, Fla.; Brandon Robinson, 6-5 guard from Lithia Springs, Ga., and

Seventh Woods, a 6-2 guard from Columbia,

- ◆ "Tony is a wonderful kid," says Carolina head coach Roy Williams. "His mom and dad have done a great job raising him. He has the values that we will appreciate a great deal and is the kind of kid that you will enjoy watching. As a basketball player I know he will work really hard every single day to get better. He's a little bit of a cross between Sean May as a junior and Tyler Zeller in the way he runs the floor. He runs extremely well, maybe not as well as Zeller, but he's in the top two or three for big guys for runners that we've ever had. We're really excited about having him both as an individual and as a basketball player."
- ◆ "Brandon is a unique young man who reminds me a lot of Jackie Manuel," says Williams. "The players used to think Jackie was my son because of how much I bragged on Jackie. Brandon has the same kind of build, maybe even thinner right now at this stage than Jackie was, but he's going to be able to put on weight. He's a 6-5 swing player who can be really good defensively, shoot the ball from the outside, get some offensive rebounds, and come up with some steals and loose balls. He also comes from a wonderful family. Both his mom and dad care about what he does in the classroom. When I would go by his high school all the teachers came out and wanted to say hello to me and tell me what a great youngster he is and what a quality student and a quality person we were getting. He fits right in with the kind of young men that we like to have."
- ◆ "Seventh is a very explosive player," says Williams. "With his speed he can play aggressively and outrageously, but he's so shy and quiet as a person, it's almost two personalities that he has (on and off the court). Again, his mom and dad have done a great job of raising him. The Hammond School is a very good school in Columbia, S.C. The teachers and principals just love him to death. But he's got some explosiveness as a player that we have not seen here since **Tv Lawson**. He has that ability to go full speed in an instant and push the ball up other people's backs even after a made field goal and put a lot of pressure on the defense. His shot is getting a lot better. He's made as many as eight threes in a game. But his strength is taking the ball to the basket and on the defensive side of the ball. We are really excited to have Seventh part of our program."
- ◆ Bradley plays for Coach Terrence Mc-Griff at Bartow Senior High School; Robinson is coached by Hollis Bethea at Douglas County High School in Douglasville, Ga.; and Woods plays for Coach Mark McClam at Hammond School in Columbia, S.C.

#1 IN PRESEASON AP POLL

◆ North Carolina was ranked No. 1 in the nation in the Associated Press's 2015-16 preseason poll, topping the preseason AP poll for a 10th time (and the first time since the 2011-12 season).

- ◆ Roy Williams is in his 13th season as UNC's head coach. This is the fourth time his teams have opened the season No. 1 in the AP noll.
- ◆ Carolina has been No. 1 in the preseason AP poll in 1977-78, 1981-82, 1983-84, 1986-87 and 1993-94 under head coach **Dean Smith** and 2007-08, 2008-09, 2011-12 and 2015-16 under Williams.

TAR HEELS SHARE #1 IN PRESEASON COACHES' POLL

- ◆ North Carolina shared the top spot in the 2015-16 preseason USA Today Coaches' Poll, the fourth time in the last nine years the Tar Heels started the season ranked No. 1 in the nation by the coaches.
- ◆ Kentucky was also tied for No. 1. The Tar Heels received 12 of the 32 first-place votes, one more than the Wildcats. Three other schools received first-place votes including No. 3 Maryland (five), No. 4 Duke (three) and No. 5 Kansas (one).
- ◆ The coaches' pre-season poll began in 1994-95. The Tar Heels previously were No. 1 in the preseason in 2007-08, 2008-09 and 2011-12
- ◆ The 2008 team finished No. 3 in the final poll after reaching the Final Four; the 2009 team finished No. 1 after winning the national championship; and the 2012 team finished No. 6 after reaching the NCAA East Regional championship game.
- ◆ The Tar Heels were 12th in the final coaches' poll a season ago.

TAR HEELS PICKED ATOP ACC PRESEASON POLL

- ◆ North Carolina entered the 2015-16 season as the Atlantic Coast Conference favorite, according to a vote of media in attendance at the league's annual Operation Basketball in late October.
- ◆ The Tar Heels received 60 of 89 first-place votes in the preseason poll.
- ◆ Carolina was picked as the ACC preseason favorite for a league-high 21st time (20 times outright, one tie) in the 47-year history of the poll, and the sixth time under current head coach Roy Williams. Media voters tabbed Duke as the preseason favorite each of the previous two seasons.

SEAN MAY JOINS UNC STAFF

- ◆ Sean May, the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament's Most Outstanding Player, has joined the University of North Carolina men's basketball staff as assistant to the director of player development.
- ♦ Sports Illustrated named May the National Player of the Year in 2005. He averaged 22.3 points and 10.7 rebounds in the 2005 NCAA Tournament, including 26 points and 10 rebounds in UNC's championship game victory over Illinois and 29 points and 12 boards vs. Wisconsin in the East Regional final. He averaged 17.5 points and 10.7 rebounds as a ju-

nior and was a first-team All-ACC selection that year. He is one of seven Tar Heels to average a double-double for his college career (15.8 points and 10.0 rebounds). He was a first-round draft pick by the Charlotte Bobcats in 2005 and played five seasons in the NBA.

TOBY EGBUNA JOINS ROSTER

- ◆ Head coach Roy Williams added Toby Egbuna to the men's basketball roster for the 2015-16 season.
- ◆ Egbuna (pronounced egg-BOO-nuh) is a 6-4, 225-pound senior forward from Clemmons, N.C. He attended West Forsyth High School. He played two seasons on the UNC junior varsity team (2013-14 and 2014-15).

16 TAR HEELS IN THE NBA

- ◆ There are 16 former North Carolina players on 2015-16 NBA rosters.
- ◆ Kentucky had the most players on 2015-16 opening-day NBA rosters this season with 21. Kansas was second with 19, followed by Duke (18), North Carolina (15), UCLA (14) and Arizona (13).
- ◆ Carolina's **Kendall Marshall**, who began the season on the injured list for Philadelphia but was promoted to the active roster in early December, is a 16th Tar Heel in the NBA this season.

CHARLES SCOTT INDUCTED INTO COLLEGE BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME

- ◆ Former Tar Heel All-America **Charles Scott** (UNC '70) was inducted into the College Basketball Hall of Fame in Kansas City on Nov. 20.
- ◆ Scott, the first African-American scholarship athlete at Carolina, was joined in this year's class by Kansas State's Rolando Blackman, Indiana's Quinn Buckner, Ohio State's John Havlicek and Long Beach State's Ed Ratleff.
- ◆ Scott was a key player on **Dean Smith's** first two ACC championship and Final Four teams in 1968 and 1969, earning first-team All-America honors twice and All-ACC honors three times in his career. He remains sixth in Tar Heel history in scoring with 2,007 points and third with a scoring average of 22.1 points per game. Scott also earned Academic All-America honors and won a gold medal at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City before playing 10 seasons in the ABA and NBA. He won an NBA title with the Boston Celtics in 1976.

TENURE: Roy Williams is in his 28th season as a college head coach, including 13 at his alma mater, the University of North Carolina. Williams spent 15 years at Kansas as head coach, 10 years as an assistant at UNC under head coach Dean Smith and five years as head coach at Owen High School in

Asheville, N.C.

BEST RECORD FIRST 200 ACC GAMES: Carolina's 86-78 win over Georgia Tech on Jan. 2nd was Roy Williams' 200th ACC regular-season game as UNC's head coach. The Tar Heels are 143-57 in ACC regular-season play under Williams. With the win over the Yellow Jackets. Williams surpassed Dean Smith for the best record in ACC history for the first 200 games. Smith held the previous mark at 142-58. Only five coaches have ever won at least 142 ACC regular season games (Roy Williams, Dean Smith, Frank McGuire, Mike Krzyzewski and Gary Williams). In addition to Smith, McGuire was 137-63, Krzyzewski was 122-78 and Gary Williams was 110-90 in their first 200 ACC regular-season games, respectively.

ACC PERCENTAGE: Williams has the third-best winning percentage alltime in ACC regular-season games with a record of 145-57 (.768 by Duke's Vic Bubas, .728 by Dean Smith, .718 by Williams and .713 by Duke's Mike Krzyzewski).

ROAD WARRIOR: Roy Williams has the second-highest winning percentage (.654) in history in ACC road games with a record of 66-35 behind Duke's Vic Bubas (.667). The Tar Heels went 6-3 in ACC road games in 2014-15, giving UNC a winning record in ACC road games for the ninth time in his first 12 seasons. Carolina is 2-0 in ACC road games thus far this season.

ALLTIME D-I WINS: Williams has won 765 games, the 11th-most Division I victories in NCAA history. Lute Olson is 10th with 780.

Lefty Driesell (Maryland) is fifth with 348 and Bobby Cremins (Bobby Cremins) is fourth with 354. UNC's win at Florida State on 2/17/14 was Williams' 300th at Carolina, setting an ACC record for 300 wins in fewer games than any coach in ACC history (previous fastest to 300 was Dean Smith in 406 games).

WINS OVER #1: Roy Williams is tied with Gary Williams for the most wins over the #1 team in the Associated Press rankings. UNC's win at Michigan State on 12/4/13 was the seventh time his teams have defeated the #1 ranked team in the country.

MORE WINS: Williams won 700 games in fewer seasons than any coach in history (25). He won more games than any coach after nine, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27 and 28 seasons.

30 WINS: Williams has won 30 games in a season 10 times, the secondmost all-time behind Duke's Mike Krzyzewski. He won 30 games five times at Kansas and five times at Carolina (33 in 2005, 31 in 2007, 36 in 2008, 34 in 2009 and 32 in 2012).

20 WINS: Williams has won 20 or more games 25 times – in 14 of 15 seasons at Kansas and in 11 of his first 12 seasons at Carolina. His first KU team went 19-12 and his first UNC team went 19-11. Carolina has won 20 or more games in 11 straight seasons under Williams, at least 25 wins eight times, at least 13 ACC games six times and at least 11 ACC wins 10 times.

WIN PERCENTAGE: Williams is first among active coaches with 20 or more seasons in winning percentage (.789) and sixth all-time behind only Clair Bee, Adolph Rupp, John Wooden, Mark Few and John Kresse.

HOME DOMINANCE: Williams's teams have compiled a **home record of 379-43** (177-26 Dean E. Smith Center, 201-17 at Allen Fieldhouse and 1-0 at Carmichael Arena).

RANKINGS: His teams have been **ranked No. 1** in the nation in **12** seasons and at least No. 2 in the country in 17 seasons.

LEAGUE TITLES: Williams's teams have **won 15 regular-season conference titles**, including nine at Kansas and 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011 and 2012 at Carolina. He has **won six conference tournaments** – four at KU and two (2007, 2008) at Carolina. Six other times his teams advanced to the championship game – twice at KU and four times at UNC.

HONORS: Williams was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2007; was named the Coach of the Decade for 2000-2009 by ESPN, Sports Illustrated, The Sporting News and FoxSports; received the John Wooden Legends of Coaching Award in 2003; has won national coach of the year honors in 1990, 1991, 1992, 1997, 2005, 2006, 2009; and was named the conference coach of the year 1990, 1992, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2011.

PLAYER AWARDS: Williams has coached four national players of the year (Drew Gooden, Nick Collison, Sean May and Tyler Hansbrough), 12 first-team All-Americas, nine conference player or athletes of the year and 29 first-team all-conference players. He coached Tyler Hansbrough, named

college basketball's player of the decade (2000s) by *Sports Illustrated* and *The Sporting News*, coached three Bob Cousy Award winners (best point guard) – Tar Heels Raymond Felton, Ty Lawson and Kendall Marshall. Has coached 26 first-round NBA Draft picks, including 2008 NBA Finals MVP Paul Pierce, and 15 Tar Heels.

ACADEMIC AWARDS: His players have won 39 academic all-conference selections and two Academic All-Americas of the Year (Jacque Vaughn at KU, Tyler Zeller at UNC). Tar Heels have won the Skip Prosser Award which is given to the ACC Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year three times in the last five years (Marcus Paige in 2015, Zeller in 2011 and 2012).

NCAA TOURNAMENT TIDBITS:

ACC TELECONFERENCE: Coach Williams is available most Mondays once ACC plays begins for 10 minutes on the ACC teleconference. Coaches do not participate on the Monday call if their teams play that evening (Jan. 4, Feb. 1 and Feb. 29 for UNC).

Williams is scheduled to participate on the Monday calls on: Jan. 11 (12:40 p.m.), Jan. 18 (12:20 p.m.), Jan. 25 (12:10 p.m.), Feb. 8 (Noon), Feb. 15 (12:30 p.m.) and Feb. 22 (12:30 p.m.).

ATHLETIC COMMUNICATIONS OFFICE: Located at the front of Koury Natatorium, which is situated between the Smith Center and the Ernie Williamson Athletic Center (which houses the Carolina Basketball Museum).

CREDENTIALS: All season and single-game requests for credentials and/or parking passes must be made online at www.SportsSystems.com/UNCBasketball

Credentials may be mailed if time permits or available for pickup on game day at media will call, which is located at Entrance B of the Smith Center.

Media with season credentials will receive an email from Steve Kirschner several days prior to each game to secure a press row seat or photo spot. Season credentials do not automatically reserve a seat for individual games.

Kirschner will submit a media credential list to most away games unless noted. Please submit requests for games at Duke and NC State to their respective basketball contacts.

(from Greensboro or Raleigh): I-40 to exit 270 for NC Highway 15-101. Take 15-501 towards Chapel Hill. Turn right on Manning Drive. Turn left at the traffic light onto Bowles Drive. The Bowles Lot will be on your right at the bottom of the hill.

(alternate route from points west): NC Highway 54 Bypass toward Chapel Hill. Turn left onto Manning Drive. Turn left at the traffic light onto Bowles Drive. The Bowles Lot will be on your right at the bottom of the hill.

(from points north): I-85 south to exit 174, NC Highway 15-501 south. Follow 15-501 toward Chapel Hill. Turn right on Manning Drive. Turn left at the traffic light onto Bowles Drive. The Bowles Lot will be on your right at the bottom of the hill.

(from points south): I-85 north. At exit 163, stay to the right for I-40 East. Follow I-40 to exit 270, NC 15-501. Turn right onto 15-501 and follow to Chapel Hill. Turn right on Manning Drive. Turn left at the traffic light onto Bowles Drive. The Bowles Lot will be on your right at the bottom of the hill.

LIVE VIDEO STREAMING APPLICATIONS: Live video streaming applications, such as Periscope and Meerkat, is not permitted at UNC men's basketball media functions, including practices, press conferences and coach and player interviews. ACC contracts prohibit the use of such applications during games.

MEALS: A light meal and beverages are provided for credentialed media before most games. Food and dining seats are located in the visiting team hallway.

MEDIA SEATING: Located in section 116 (three baseline rows near the UNC bench) or in the press boxes at the back of sections 110 and 111.

MEDIA WORKROOM: Located in the home tunnel just off the entrance to the court. Media must have a credential to enter. Most seats are reserved. Additional seating for some games is located in the visiting team hallway.

The workroom is also the location of the postgame press conferences with Coach Williams and ACC visiting head coaches. Some non-conference opponents may choose to conduct interviews with their head coach in the hallway by their locker room.

Restrooms for the media are located in the media workroom. Game notes, rosters and statistics are available in the workroom.

NON-GAMEDAY INTERVIEWS: Interview requests must be made through the athletic communications office. Contact Steve Kirschner with interview requests for Roy Williams. Media are encouraged to reach Williams through the ACC teleconference and UNCs weekly press conferences.

Williams is, by contract, unable to participate in live radio call-in shows. Media should make player interview requests to Matt Bowers. Player inter-

views typically occur before practice. Freshmen are available for interviews once they've played in a regular-season game.

Players are not available for interviews on game day or on non-practice days. Players will not participate in call-in shows, but are available to tape radio interviews.

PARKING: Media gameday parking is located in the Bowles Lot on Skipper Bowles Drive, adjacent to the driveway for the Kenan-Flagler Business School. Most spaces are not reserved and are first-come, first-served.

Media parking for weekly press conferences is located in the Manning Lot off Tar Heel Boulevard.

PHOTOGRAPHER/VIDEOGRAPHER GUIDELINES

- please shoot from your assigned location and hold extra cameras and lenses in your lap; check with Kirschner if you wish to move to another seat
- un-manned floor remotes are not permitted; the use of floor remote cameras is subject to Kirschner's approval for safety reasons
- you must obtain permission from Steve Kirschner or Jeffrey Camarati before you mount cameras to the basket support and/or backboard
 - lenses (particularly closer distance ones must have protective rubber hoods)
 - bags and hard-edged chairs are not permitted
- check with Camarati before setting up remotes or using Pocket Wizard radio channels
- cameras mounted on the basket support must be mounted above the blue padding and must not cover the logos on the basket support

PHOTO SPOTS: Shooting locations around the court are assigned at all games. Specific requests for locations and special camera placements should be made in advance to Kirschner. Floor remotes must be removable. They may not be fixed to the floor and will only be allowed if a photographer is seated with the camera.

PHOTO WORKROOM: Photographers work in the "Orange" locker room in the visiting team hallway. Wireless Internet and ethernet lines are available. Statistics are brought to the photo compound at halftime and after the game.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS: Coach Williams holds his postgame press conference in the media room. Players are available in the lounge adjacent to the locker room for 20 minutes following each home game.

SMITH CENTER ENTRANCE: The media entrance to the Smith Center is located at Entrance B, up the stairs from the Bowles parking lot. All briefcases, computer bags and photo equipment are subject to search.

SOCIAL MEDIA: Carolina's official website is GoHeels.com, which features the team yearbook, statistics, game notes, roster, schedule, past season archives and other information. Video feeds of the weekly and postgame press conferences are posted to the site.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCES: Coach Williams and at least one player will meet with the media in the Smith Center work room most weeks throughout the season. These press conferences begin at 2 p.m. unless noted. Media parking for the press conferences is located in the Manning Lot off Tar Heel Boulevard. Out-of-town media may submit questions to Kirschner and watch live at GoHeels.com. WiFi: High-speed, wireless Internet access is available in the arena, media work room and photo compound. In-game statistics are available online (address will be posted). Instructions for logging on are posted in the media room.

VISITING RADIO: Radio network rights-holders for opposing teams are provided three (3) seats at the scorer's table adjacent to the visiting team bench. A stat monitor is available and printed stats are provided at each media timeout. UNC provides two ISDN lines and two analog lines. The visiting team radio network is expected to pay for any calls on the lines that are provided.

National radio broadcasts originate from booth 111 located at the back of section 111.
