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BC FACES NC STATE IN FINAL ROAD TEST

- Boston College travels to Raleigh on Wednesday night to take on NC State at 9 p.m. at PNC Arena.
- The game will be televised by RSN/NESN and can be heard on the radio on WEEI 850 AM and bceagles.com.
- Boston College has lost its first 16 conference matchups, most recently losing to Georgia Tech on Saturday afternoon, 76-71.
- NC State has lost three of its last four, including a 75-66 setback at Syracuse on Saturday.
- Boston College snapped a six-game losing streak to the Wolfpack with a 79-63 win last season inside Conte Forum.

GEORGIA TECH NOTES

- Graduate student **Eli Carter** finished with a game-high 25 points while adding nine assists. He was 10-for-18 from the floor.
- Senior **Dennis Clifford** recorded 17 points, four rebounds and three assists.
- Freshman **Sammy Barnes-Thompkins** scored a season-high 15 points while adding three rebounds and two assists. He was 5-for-8 from beyond the arc.
- After Boston College cut its deficit to 56-54 with 10:07 remaining, Georgia Tech responded with seven-straight points to make it a 63-54 game.
- Georgia Tech was 27-for-33 from the foul line in the game while BC was just 5-for-7.

EAGLES LOSE TO GEORGIA TECH

- Graduate student **Eli Carter** finished with a game-high 25 points while adding nine assists as Boston College lost to Georgia Tech, 76-71, on Saturday at Conte Forum.
- Carter was 10-for-18 from the floor.
- Senior **Dennis Clifford** recorded 17 points, four rebounds and three assists.
- Freshman **Sammy Barnes-Thompkins** scored a season-high 15 points while adding three rebounds and two assists. He was 5-for-8 from beyond the arc.
- Georgia Tech went on a 14-3 run over 3:28 to take a 22-10 lead seven minutes into the game.
- Boston College cut the lead to seven, 28-21, but the Yellow Jackets took a 48-35 lead into halftime.
- BC started the second half with an 11-4 run in the first 3:27 to cut its deficit to 52-46. Barnes-Thompkins hit a pair of 3-pointers in that span.
- Georgia Tech led, 56-48, then the Eagles scored six-straight points to make it a 56-54 game with 10:07 left.
- The Yellow Jackets responded right back with seven unanswered to get their cushion back at 63-54.
- BC got to within a possession, 74-71, with 12 seconds left, but that is as close as it would get.

LAST TIME VS. NC STATE

- Olivier Hanlan recorded 24 points, eight rebounds and three assists as Boston College defeated NC State, 79-63, on February 28, 2015 at Conte Forum.
- He was 7-for-11 from the floor, 3-for-4 from beyond the arc and 7-for-8 from the foul line.
- Patrick Heckmann finished with 14 points, seven assists and four rebounds.
- Dimitri Batten had 11 points and a season-high eight rebounds.
- Aaron Brown scored 13 points and **Dennis Clifford** had 10 points and five boards.
- Boston College started the game on an 11-2 run in the first 3:06. Batten hit a pair of 3-pointers in that stretch.
- NC State responded by scoring the next seven points to pull within two.
- BC went on another run, this time a 10-2 one, to build a 21-11 lead with 9:39 left in the half.
- The Eagles then closed out the half by scoring eight of the final 10 points to take a 43-26 halftime lead. Brown had five of the points, including an and-one conversion as time expired.
- BC scored the first six points out of the locker room to extend its lead to 49-26, but the Wolfpack responded with seven straight of their own to make it 49-33.
- The Eagles' led by double digits the rest of the way.

THE BIG MAROON DOG

- Senior **Dennis Clifford** had the best three-game stretch of his career from February 9-17.
- He averaged 15.7 points, 9.7 rebounds and 2.0 assists against #8/9 North Carolina, Syracuse and Clemson.
- He also shot 21-for-33 (.636) from the field in those three outings.
- Prior to the North Carolina game, Clifford was shooting at a .471 clip.
- The Bridgewater, Mass., product recorded his second career double-double against the Tar Heels with 14 points and a career-high 13 rebounds.
- He then added 16 points, eight boards and four assists against Syracuse.
- Clifford kept it going with 17 points and eight rebounds at Clemson.
- He shot .600 or better in each of the above games.
- The 47 points and 29 rebounds were the most he posted in both categories in his career in a three-game span.
- Clifford picked it up again vs. Virginia Tech, securing his second double-double of the year with 13 points and 12 rebounds. He then had 17 points against Georgia Tech on Saturday.
- In the last six games, Clifford is averaging 16.7 points and 8.7 rebounds while shooting .547 from the field.

ONE OF THE YOUNGEST

- Boston College has had nine true freshmen play this season which is the second-most in the country.
- Northern Arizona has had 10 freshmen see the court this year.
- As of February 29, Boston College freshmen have accounted for 98.6 minutes per game this season which ranks seventh in the land.

TOUGHEST THREE-GAME STRETCH

- Boston College had, by far, the toughest conference road trip in the nation this year.
- The Eagles had trips at #2/1 North Carolina, #9/9 Virginia and #19/18 Louisville two weeks ago.
- The average KenPom rankings of those three teams was just 6.0 (as of 1/28).
- Seven other ACC teams have three-game road swings and the next lowest average KenPom rank was Syracuse's 48.3.
- The Pac-12's Arizona State has the second-toughest three-game road trip.

BEST DEFENSIVE EFFICIENCY IN A DECADE

- Boston College ranks 82nd in the country in adjusted defensive efficiency at 99.4, according to KenPom.
- That number is the best for an Eagles team since 2006.
- Adjusted defensive efficiency is an estimate of the defensive efficiency (points allowed per 100 possessions) a team would have against the average Division I offense.
- BC's opponents are averaging 70.0 points per game which ranks eighth in the ACC.

TOUGH START TO ACC SCHEDULE

- Boston College faced a brutal start to the ACC schedule.
- According to the KenPom rankings as of January 6, the Eagles faced five opponents in the top 10 and 10 in the top 50 in their first 11 conference matchups.
- The average KenPom ranking of the Eagles' opponents in the first 11 games was 22.9. The next closest average was Clemson's 39.1.
- Clemson had the toughest January with an average opponent rank of 24.8. Boston College's January opponents clocked in at 29.3.

CARTER IN THE LAST 20 GAMES

- Graduate student **Eli Carter** flirted with a triple-double vs. Maine and Delaware, and has put up strong numbers in the last 20 games.
- He has averaged 16.2 points, 4.1 rebounds and 4.4 assists in his last 20 outings.
- In the win against Maine, he had 16 points, nine assists and eight rebounds.
- He then had 20 points, 10 assists and eight rebounds in the victory over Delaware. He also committed just two turnovers in 36 minutes of work.
- Carter was the first Eagle to record a double-double with points and assists since Reggie Jackson in 2010.
- He is also one of just seven ACC players to record 10 assists this year.
- The Paterson, N.J., product scored 28 points in the win against New Hampshire. He scored 20 points in the second half and overtime, and had seven of the 12 points in the overtime session.
- He had 19 points against #15/12 Duke and #2/1 North Carolina.
- Carter netted a career-high 31 points to go along with four assists and four steals at #20/17 Pittsburgh.
- He notched 26 points and four assists vs. #9/8 North Carolina
- Against Georgia Tech on Saturday, he had 25 points and nine assists.
- Carter ranks 11th in the ACC in scoring (16.2), ninth in assists (4.14) and ninth in 3-pointers made (2.21).
- In ACC action, he is 12th in the league in scoring (15.5), sixth in 3-pointers made (2.44) and eighth in assists (3.88).

QUICK NOTE ABOUT BC GUARDS

- Boston College is the only team in the ACC to have a guard rank in the top 10 in scoring in each of the last three seasons. Olivier Hanlan finished in the top five in each of his three seasons at The Heights.
- Hanlan finished fifth in scoring as a freshman in 2012-13 (15.4), third in 2013-14 (18.5) and then led the ACC last season (19.5) as a junior.
- That trend could continue this year as graduate student **Eli Carter** currently ranks 11th in the league in scoring at 16.2 points per game.

SAMMY STEPS UP

- Freshman **Sammy Barnes-Thompkins** posted solid numbers on Boston College's three-game road trip.
- He led Boston College in scoring (10.3), 3-pointers made (7) and steals (5) in the three-game swing.
- The Phoenix, Ariz., product shot 11-for-24 (.458) from the field and 7-for-16 (.438) from beyond the arc.
- Barnes-Thompkins had a season-high 14 points at Virginia.
- He then scored 11 points at Louisville while adding three steals. He also had 11 second-half points against Syracuse.
- Barnes-Thompkins matched a season high with 14 points off the bench at Clemson, going 5-for-8 from the field.
- He set a new season high with 15 points, going 5-for-8 from long range, against Georgia Tech.

A HEALTHY HICKS

- Sophomore **Darryl Hicks** had a trying first two years on campus battling injuries but emerged in three games against UMass Lowell, Providence and Maine.
- Hicks had two separate ACL injuries that prevented him from stepping on the court in his first two seasons.
- He finally made his collegiate debut against St. Francis Brooklyn on November 14.
- The Louisville, Ky., product has appeared in eight games, but really made an impact in those three games listed above.
- He ranked second on the team in field goal percentage (.526), third in assists (5), third in 3-point percentage (.417) and fourth in scoring (8.7) in those three outings.
- Hicks had nine points in his first collegiate game with significant minutes against UMass Lowell. He was 3-for-4 from beyond the arc.
- He had 11 points, five assists and three rebounds against Maine.

CARTER MAKES INSTANT IMPACT

- Graduate student **Eli Carter** leads the Eagles in scoring by averaging 16.2 points per game.
- He has scored 14 or more points in 19 of the 28 games he has played. He missed the game vs. UMass Lowell with an ankle injury.
- The Paterson, N.J., product also leads the team in assists (116) and steals (32), and is second in rebounding (4.0).
- Carter ranks 11th in the ACC in scoring (16.2), ninth in assists (4.14) and ninth in 3-pointers made (2.21).
- In ACC action, he is 12th in the league in scoring (15.5), sixth in 3-pointers made (2.44) and eighth in assists (3.88).

HERE'S TO YOU

- Freshman **Jerome Robinson** has had a solid start to his collegiate career.
- Prior to his wrist injury, he led the team in steals (28), and ranked second in scoring (11.6), assists (55) and rebounding (4.0).
- The Raleigh, N.C., product had 19 points, six rebounds and five steals in his collegiate debut against St. Francis Brooklyn.
- He has also had a pair of 15-point games against Central Connecticut and UC Irvine, and scored 16 against Maine.
- Despite being sick with the norovirus, he posted 16 points, six rebounds and five assists vs. UMass Lowell.
- He tallied 19 points, six rebounds and three steals vs. Fordham.
- Robinson posted 15 points, a season-high seven rebounds, four assists and a season-best four steals vs. #15/12 Duke.
- He put up 20 points against #15/14 Miami, going 9-for-14 from the field, and had 15 points against Florida State.
- Robinson fractured his wrist late in the game against Florida State and is expected to miss 3-6 weeks.

THE BIG MAN

- Senior **Dennis Clifford** has been productive on the glass this year, securing at least nine rebounds in the first three games.
- It was the first time in his career that he had three-straight games of nine or more rebounds.
- The Bridgewater, Mass., product had a career-high 11 rebounds against Central Connecticut and then set a new career high with 12 vs. Harvard.
- He scored a season-high 17 points, two short of his career high, and had six rebounds vs. Penn State.
- Clifford recorded the second double-double of his career vs. #9/8 North Carolina with 14 points and a career-high 13 rebounds.
- He then had 16 points, eight rebounds and four assists vs. Syracuse.
- Clifford continued his great play with 17 points and eight rebounds at Clemson, going 8-for-12 from the floor.
- He posted his second double-double of the season vs. Virginia Tech with 13 points and 12 rebounds.
- Clifford added 17 points and four rebounds vs. Georgia Tech.
- Clifford ranks 11th in the ACC in rebounding (7.2).

FRESHMEN PRODUCTION

- Ten freshmen (including redshirts) have seen the court this year for Boston College.
- **Jerome Robinson** is averaging 11.6 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.4 steals per game.
- Six of the top 10 scorers on the team are freshmen or redshirt freshmen.
- Freshmen have accounted for 48 percent of the scoring, 47 percent of the rebounding and 43 percent of the assists.
- The 10 freshmen have also accounted for 54 percent of the team's minutes.

BENCH HELP

- BC has averaged 14.9 points off the bench in 29 games this season.
- The Eagles had 20 points off the bench in the season-opener against St. Francis Brooklyn, led by freshman **Sammy Barnes-Thompkins'** nine points.
- Boston College then had 31 vs. Central Connecticut with freshman **Matt Milon** adding 11 points.
- Milon and classmate **Ervin Meznies** combined for 28 of the 30 bench points against Harvard.
- The Eagles' reserves scored a season-high 35 points against Maine.
- BC averaged 26.3 off the bench in the first four games of the season.
- The Eagles averaged just 8.6 points off the bench last season. The game-high was 33 but that was on Senior Night when Olivier Hanlan came off the bench to score 19.
- The next highest number was a 20-point performance by the bench against Marist.

A CHRISTMAS SCHOLARSHIP FOR PERPIGLIA

- Boston College senior walk-on guard **Steve Perpiglia** was given a full scholarship for his final semester after the Eagles defeated Fordham on December 22 at the Barclays Center.
- Head Coach **Jim Christian** announced the scholarship to the team in the locker room following BC's third-straight victory.
- More than 100 family and friends made the trip to Brooklyn to watch Perpiglia play. Christian also announced the news to his supporters that were still in the arena.
- Perpiglia has appeared in 29 games in his career.

MILON AND MEZNIEKS SPARK BC WIN AGAINST HARVARD

- Freshmen **Matt Milon** and **Ervin Meznies** had their best games of their young careers on November 22 against Harvard.
- The two combined for 28 points off the bench, going 8-for-12 from the field and 7-for-11 from 3-point land.
- Milon scored a team-high 16 points and went 3-for-5 from long range.
- Milon is shooting .451 (51-for-113) on the year and is .481 (37-for-77) from beyond the arc.
- Meznies had 12 points and two assists vs. the Crimson, going 3-for-5 from three.

EAGLES OUTLAST UNH IN OVERTIME

- Graduate student **Eli Carter** finished with a season-high 28 points while adding five rebounds and four assists as Boston College beat New Hampshire in overtime, 72-67, on Wednesday at Conte Forum.
- He scored 20 points in the second half and overtime, and had seven of the 12 points in the overtime session.
- Freshman **Jerome Robinson** added 14 points and five rebounds.
- Senior **Dennis Clifford** posted 10 points, seven rebounds and matched a career high with four blocks.
- Freshman **Ervin Meznies** also scored 10 points.
- Boston College scored eight unanswered points over 1:54 to take a 15-6 lead at the 13:31 mark. Carter and Robinson hit 3-pointers in that stretch.
- With the Eagles on top, 17-8, New Hampshire went on a 10-2 run to cut the BC lead to 19-18 with 7:37 left in the half.
- The Wildcats closed the half with nine unanswered points to take a 29-27 lead at the break. It was their first lead of the game.
- UNH led, 50-49, when BC scored seven unanswered points to regain a 56-50 lead with 3:40 left in regulation.
- The Wildcats responded with seven of their own to take that lead back. Jaleen Smith hit a 3-pointer with eight seconds left to force overtime.
- After UNH's Jacoby Armstrong hit a jumper, Carter converted on an and-one to push BC's overtime lead to 70-67 with 16 seconds left.

EAGLES GET THIRD-STRAIGHT WIN

- Freshman **Jerome Robinson** matched season highs with 19 points and six rebounds to lead Boston College to a 64-55 win vs. Fordham on December 22 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn.
- Graduate student **Eli Carter** recorded 12 points, five rebounds, three assists, two blocks and two steals.
- Redshirt freshman **Idy Diallo** matched a season high with eight points in 20 minutes off the bench. He was 4-for-4 from the field.
- With the game tied, 8-8, Boston College went on a 10-2 run to take an 18-10 lead with 8:41 left in the half. Diallo had six of the points in that stretch.
- Fordham responded immediately with a 7-1 run of its own to cut the lead to 19-17 at the 4:25 mark.
- BC closed the half with an 8-3 stretch to take a 27-22 halftime lead. Carter closed out the half by hitting all three free throws after being fouled behind the arc with 0.8 seconds left.
- The teams traded quick runs throughout the second half. Fordham held a 40-39 lead, but the Eagles scored six-straight points to regain a 45-40 lead with 8:12 left.
- With the Eagles on top, 57-49, Fordham scored five unanswered to make it a 57-54 lead with 2:06 on the clock.
- BC pulled away in the end, getting the lead back up to six points with 30 seconds left.

EAGLES PULL AWAY FROM DELAWARE

- Graduate student **Eli Carter** flirted with a triple-double for the second-straight game as Boston College beat Delaware, 69-61, on December 19.
- He had 20 points, 10 assists and eight rebounds while committing just two turnovers.
- Freshman **Matt Milon** scored 12 points off the bench, going 3-for-4 from beyond the arc.
- Classmate **Ervins Meznieks** was the other Eagle in double figures with 10 points.
- Senior **Dennis Clifford** tallied eight points and 10 rebounds.
- Boston College went on the first run of the game, a 12-2 one to take an 18-9 lead at the 13:47 point. Five different Eagles scored in the run.
- Delaware responded with seven-straight points to cut the lead to 18-16.
- The Eagles were on top, 25-19, before the Blue Hens rattled off nine unanswered points to give them a 28-25 lead.
- That started a 14-2 run that helped give Delaware a 35-32 halftime lead.
- Boston College started the second half with a 19-7 run over the first 10:12 to build a 51-42 lead. Milon had six of the points in the run.
- The Eagles would keep control from there as the lead reached as many as 13, 65-52.

EAGLES GET BACK IN WIN COLUMN

- Graduate student **Eli Carter** finished with 16 points, nine assists and eight rebounds to lead Boston College to a 91-60 win against Maine on December 13.
- Freshman **Jerome Robinson** matched Carter with 16 points while adding four rebounds and three steals.
- Freshman **A.J. Turner** recorded 11 points and six rebounds to go along with two blocks and two steals. He was 5-for-9 from the field.
- Sophomore **Darryl Hicks** tallied 11 points, five assists and three boards off the bench. He also had a pair of steals.
- Senior **Dennis Clifford** had 10 points and six rebounds.
- Boston College started the game with a 16-3 run over the first 5:15. Robinson had seven points in the opening stretch.
- The Eagles led, 27-17, when Maine scored seven unanswered points to make it a 27-24 game with four minutes left in the half.
- BC responded with a 17-3 run over the next 2:54 to build a 44-27 lead with less than a minute left and took a 44-29 lead into the locker room.
- The Eagles scored the first 11 points of the second half to take a 55-29 lead a little over four minutes in. Clifford had four of the points.
- The lead was over 20 points the rest of the way.

NOTING THE MAINE WIN

- Boston College's 31-point win against Maine was its largest margin of victory since January 5, 2010 - a 89-32 win over NJIT.
- The Eagles assisted on 24 of its 36 baskets in the game. It was the most assists for BC since it had 25 on December 19, 2010 against Bryant.
- Boston College's 10 blocks against the Black Bears were the most since it stuffed Miami 11 times back on January 15, 2008.

SECOND HALF SURGE LEADS BC PAST HARVARD

- Freshman **Matt Milon** scored a team-high 16 points off the bench to lead BC to a 69-56 win against Harvard on November 22 at Conte Forum.
- Milon went 5-for-7 from the field and 4-for-6 from beyond the arc.
- Graduate student **Eli Carter** scored all 15 of his points in the second half. He also had five assists, three rebounds and two steals.
- Freshman **Ervins Meznieks** chipped in with 12 points and two assists off the bench. He was 3-for-5 from 3-point land.
- Senior **Dennis Clifford** had a career-high 12 rebounds.
- Boston College scored the first eight points of the game over the first 5:10. Freshmen **A.J. Turner** and Milon both hit 3-pointers in that span.
- Harvard responded with the next eight points to tie it up.
- BC led, 16-13, but the Crimson scored the final seven points of the half in the last 4:03 to take a 20-16 halftime lead.
- The Eagles started the second half with a 12-4 run to take a 28-24 lead. Carter had eight of the 12 points.
- Harvard scored the next five points to regain the lead, but a 12-2 BC run over the next 3:15 made it a 40-31 Eagle lead with 12:07 left. Milon hit a pair of 3-pointers in that spurt.
- Harvard pulled it to within five points, but the Eagles pulled away down the stretch.

CARTER, ROBINSON LEAD THE WAY AGAIN AGAINST CENTRAL CONNECTICUT

- Graduate student **Eli Carter** led Boston College with 18 points and five assists as the Eagles beat Central Connecticut, 82-57, on November 19.
- Carter scored 16 of those points in the second half.
- Freshman **Jerome Robinson** filled the stat sheet up again with 15 points, four rebounds, four assists and three steals. He was 7-for-11 from the field.
- Freshman **Matt Milon** scored 11 points, going 3-for-5 from beyond the arc.
- Senior **Dennis Clifford** recorded nine points and nine rebounds.
- Central Connecticut led for the bulk of the first 13 minutes and had a 20-17 lead at the 8:42 mark.
- Boston College then went on a 16-2 run over 4:33 to take a 33-22 lead with 3:23 left in the half. Milon capped the run with consecutive 3-pointers.
- The Eagles took a 45-33 lead into halftime, outscoring CCSU 28-13 in the final eight minutes.
- Boston College held a 55-45 lead and then went on a 21-1 run over 10 minutes to build a 76-46 advantage with 5:45 left in the game.
- CCSU was held scoreless for nearly eight minutes during that stretch.

CARTER, ROBINSON SHINE IN WIN OVER ST. FRANCIS BROOKLYN

- Graduate student **Eli Carter** had a game-high 23 points to go along with seven rebounds as Boston College won its season opener vs. St. Francis Brooklyn on November 14, 75-49.
- Carter was 10-for-19 from the field.
- Freshman **Jerome Robinson** added 19 points, six rebounds, five assists and three steals in his Boston College debut. He was 7-for-13 from the floor.
- Senior **Dennis Clifford** secured a career-high 11 rebounds and had seven points.
- Freshman **Sammy Barnes-Thompkins** scored nine points off the bench.
- Boston College started by scoring the game's first 13 points. Carter led the attack with six points. St. Francis Brooklyn missed its first 15 shots from the floor.
- With the Eagles on top, 21-8, they went on an 11-1 run over 3:21 to build a 32-9 lead with 4:02 left in the first half. Clifford scored four of those 11 points.
- BC took a 41-16 lead into the locker room.
- The Eagles' lead reached as high as 28 points early in the second half and never got below 19 the rest of the way.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- There are 10 newcomers on the Boston College team, including nine freshmen.
- **Eli Carter** is a graduate student who played at Rutgers and Florida before coming to The Heights. He is already a career 1,000-point scorer.
- The nine freshmen are the most in the ACC this season.
- Syracuse has eight freshmen on its roster while Duke has seven.

THE LEADERS

- Graduate student **Eli Carter** and senior **Dennis Clifford** are a pair of fifth-year players that bring a lot of experience to a young team.
- Carter began his career at Rutgers where he stormed onto the scene to lead the team in scoring as a freshman and sophomore.
- He averaged 13.8 points, 3.1 rebounds and 2.1 assists as a freshman and then increased his scoring to 14.9 points as a sophomore before breaking his leg.
- The Paterson, N.J., product elected to transfer to Florida after Mike Rice was fired and was eligible to play immediately. His injury nagged him, though, and he could only play seven games in Gainesville in 2013-14 before receiving a medical redshirt.
- Carter returned last year and averaged 8.8 points per game in 28 games last season for Billy Donovan.
- Clifford suffered from chronic knee issues in 2012-13 and 2013-14 which limited his time on the court, but he was fully healthy last season and played in 31 games with 28 starts.
- He averaged 6.9 points and 5.5 rebounds last year in his first healthy season since he was a freshman. Clifford received a medical redshirt in the 2013-14 season.

THE NEW GUYS

- Head Coach **Jim Christian** has welcomed seven freshmen to The Heights this season and they hail from all over the world.
- The seven freshmen are the second-most in the ACC behind Syracuse's eight. Duke also has seven freshmen on its roster.
- Guard **Sammy Barnes-Thompkins** (Phoenix, Ariz./Sunnyslope) was ranked the No. 3 shooting guard in the state of Arizona and was a first-team all-stater as a junior, averaging 23.5 points per game. A McDonald's All-America nominee, he scored 40 points in the second half of a game vs. Cesar Chavez.
- Guard/forward **Gordon Gehan** (Dallas, Texas/Episcopal School of Dallas) was named all-state as a junior and senior. He averaged 24.2 points, 9.3 rebounds and 4.5 assists as a senior.
- Forward **Ervins Meznies** (Riga, Latvia/Rigas Teikas) has plenty of international experience, playing for the U20, U18 and U16 Latvia National Teams. He played for the U20 team that finished fifth at the 2015 European Championship, averaging 8.3 points and 3.7 rebounds in 10 games.
- Guard **Matt Milon** (Oviedo, Fla./Oviedo) was the Florida Class 7A Player of the year as a junior and senior, and was a McDonald's All-America nominee. He was ranked the 23rd-best prospect in Florida and played for legendary coach Ed Kerschner.
- Forward/center **Johncarlos Reyes** (Lawrenceville, Ga./Sound Doctrine Christian Academy) averaged 18.4 points, 8.7 rebounds and 3.8 blocks in his one season at Sound Doctrine. He also averaged 20.3 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.6 blocks in the previous year at Kingdom Christian Academy and had a school record 124 blocks in his junior season.
- Guard **Jerome Robinson** (Raleigh, N.C./Needham Broughton) was named Cap-8 Conference Player of the Year as a senior after averaging 19 points and five assists. He was ranked as the sixth-best player in North Carolina and was a McDonald's All-America nominee.
- ESPN's Jeff Goodman tweeted about Robinson while at practice: "The more I watch BC frosh Jerome Robinson, the more I love him. So versatile, poised. Good size. Can't believe he got out of North Carolina."
- Forward **A.J. Turner** (Mt. Clemens, Mich./New Hampton School (NH)) was ranked as the fourth-best recruit from Michigan by ESPN. He is the first Rivals150 recruit that BC landed since Rakim Sanders in 2007. Turner transferred to New Hampton after averaging 20 points and six assists as a junior at De La Salle in Warren, Mich. He earned first team all-state honors that year. He was then named All-NEPSAC as a senior after averaging 15 points and six rebounds.

NUMBERS LOST

- While adding eight newcomers, it is also important to note what was lost from last season.
- The Eagles return just three players who saw action last season and five overall (redshirt freshman **Idy Diallo** and sophomore **Darryl Hicks** both missed the season with injuries).
- Boston College lost 84 percent of its scoring, 73 percent of its rebounds and 88 percent of its assists from last season.
- Fifth-year senior **Dennis Clifford** is the only returning starter and BC only returns a total of 30 starts of a possible 160 from last season.
- The Eagles also lost 79 percent of their minutes from a year ago.

FINALLY HEALTHY

- Fifth-year senior **Dennis Clifford** averaged 6.9 points and 5.5 rebounds in his first fully healthy year since he was a freshman in 2011-12.
- The Bridgewater, Mass., product had two 19-point games last December, which were career highs.
- He had identical games scoring in the wins over Maine and UMass Lowell. He was 9-for-11 from the free throw line in both games and 5-for-6 from the floor.
- Clifford recorded his first career double-double in the overtime win over Harvard on January 14. He had 13 points and 10 rebounds to go along with a pair of blocks.
- Clifford led the Eagles in rebounding and blocks (37) last season, and ranked second in field goal percentage (.497).

Led Page High School to the NCHSAA Class 4-A semifinals as a sophomore ... played his junior season at Montverde Academy in Florida, which won the national championship that year ... will play his senior season at High Point Christian Academy, ranked No. 12 in USA Today's Super 25 ... played AAU with the Carolina Diamonds ... chose Boston College over Virginia, Notre Dame, Virginia Tech, Harvard and others.

Kevin Schneider, Vice President/National Recruiting Director at Big Shots: "Ty Graves is one of the better gets in the 2016 class. He has been a star in our Big Shots events since he was 15. He is a top 100 talent and he is the type of guard that you compete for ACC titles with. He is a coach's son that strives to get better every day. Ty has gotten stronger and he shoots the lights out. I think he's as good as any guard out there. He is one of the biggest sleepers in the country in this class. Ty doesn't quite get the recognition he deserves nationally, but he soon will. Ty is a very confident player who will have a tremendous career at BC and beyond."

NIK POPOVIC • Forward • 6-10 • 225 • Banja Luka, Bosnia and Herzegovina • Sagemont School (FL)

Played for the U18 Serbian National Team at the 2015 European Championship ... played in six of seven games for the U17 team that won the bronze medal at the 2014 FIBA World Championships ... member of the Red Star junior team last season ... will play his senior season at The Sagemont School in Florida, which produced Syracuse's Fab Melo ... chose Boston College over Georgia, Notre Dame, Providence, Vanderbilt, Richmond and others.

Sagemont Head Coach Adam Ross: "Nik is a very skilled, dynamic power forward. He creates mismatch issues for opposing teams because at 6-10 and 225 pounds, he can step away from the basket and make threes. He can also take his man off the dribble and create for teammates. Jim Christian, who was hired as the 12th head basketball coach at Boston College on April 3, 2014, enters his second season on The Heights.

Christian was a two-time Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year and led teams to eight postseason appearances in his 12 seasons as a head coach at Ohio, TCU and Kent State. He has coached four All-Americans, three MAC Players of the Year and 31 all-conference honorees.

In his first season at Boston College, Christian guided guard Olivier Hanlan to First Team All-ACC and honorable mention All-America honors. Hanlan was the leading scorer in the ACC (19.5) which ranked 22nd in the country. He also led all major conference players in scoring average during league play (21.9). In addition, Hanlan led the ACC in 3-point percentage (.436) and ranked third in 3-pointers made (2.83), fifth in free throw percentage (.810), sixth in field goal percentage (.483) and 10th in assists (4.00) during conference action.

Hanlan was drafted by the Utah Jazz in the second round (42nd overall) of the 2015 NBA Draft.

Prior to moving to Chestnut Hill, Christian spent the previous two seasons as head coach at Ohio, leading the Bobcats to a 49-22 record in that time. In his first season at the helm, Ohio went 24-10 and earned a bid to the NIT. The Bobcats won their first regular season MAC title since 1994 and they tied a program record with 14 league wins and seven road victories. He was named the NABC District 14 Coach of the Year.

Ohio led the nation in assists per game (17.5) in 2012-13 and ranked seventh in the country in turnover margin (+4.7). Under his guidance, guard D.J. Cooper ranked seventh in the nation in assists and was the first MAC Player of the Year from Ohio since 1995.

In 2013-14, the Bobcats went 25-12 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the College Insider Tournament. It was just the third time in school history that an Ohio team reached 25 wins.

Christian, who also spent six seasons at Kent State from 2002-08, is the all-time leader in winning percentage (.700) in Mid-American Conference history and reached 20 wins in all eight of his seasons in the conference.

Prior to his time at Ohio, Christian was the head coach at TCU from 2008-12. While in Fort Worth, he had a record of 56-73 (.434) and led the Horned Frogs to their first postseason appearance since 2005 when they played in the 2012 College Basketball Invitational. He coached six All-Mountain West players while in Fort Worth.

One of those players was guard Hank Thorns, Jr., who earned first team honors after ranking in the top 12 in the country in both assists and assist/turnover ratio, the only player in the nation to accomplish that feat in 2010-11.

Christian began his head coaching career at Kent State where he compiled a record of 138-58 (.704). He led the Golden Flashes to five postseason appearances in his six seasons at the helm. He earned MAC Coach of the Year accolades in 2006 and 2008, both times leading Kent State to the conference title and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Golden Flashes earned NIT berths in each of his first three seasons.

Kent State won 20 games every year that Christian was the head coach and he guided it to its first-ever top 25 ranking in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today polls.

The 2007-08 season was one of the best in Kent State history. The Golden Flashes finished 28-7 with a school-record 25 regular-season wins and won the Mid-American Conference regular-season and tournament championships. Christian guided Kent State to a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament which was the best seed in program history.

While in Kent, Christian mentored two honorable-mention All-Americans (Antonio Gates, DeAndre Haynes), two MAC Players of the Year (DeAndre Haynes, Al Fisher), three MAC Defensive Players of the Year (Demetric Shaw, John Edwards, Haminn Quaintance), one MAC Sixth Man of the Year (Kevin Warzynski) and a total of 19 All-MAC selections, including six first teamers.

Christian served as an assistant coach for the Golden Flashes in 2001-02 when they advanced to the Elite Eight. Prior to his time in Kent, Christian was a college basketball talent evaluator at Octagon Sports Marketing and Management.

Christian served as an assistant coach at Pittsburgh from 1996-99 under Ralph Willard. He guided the development of Vonteego Cummings, a two-time All-Big East player who went on to play for the Philadelphia 76ers and Golden State Warriors.

Christian served as an assistant coach under former Miami (Ohio) and current Arizona State head coach Herb Sendek during the 1995-96 campaign. The RedHawks recorded a 21-8 overall record, including a 12-6 mark in conference action, and earned a berth in the NIT.

Christian worked at Western Kentucky for the 1994-95 season as the Hilltoppers went 27-4, including a 17-1 record in the Sun Belt Conference. That season, Western Kentucky recorded the fourth-most wins in program history and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament after winning the conference tournament.

Christian's first full-time assistant coaching position came at St. Francis (Pa.). In his two seasons with the Red Flashes, Christian guided the development of two-time All-Northeast Conference performer Deon George and Jason Roberts.
