FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Minnesota is back at TCF Bank Stadium this week for a Friday night game against the Indiana Hoosiers. Indiana is making its first-ever visit to TCF Bank Stadium, which opened in 2009, and the Hoosiers are the final Big Ten team to visit Minnesota's on-campus stadium (includes Maryland and Rutgers). Indiana is however the last team that Minnesota beat at the Metrodome (16-7 in 2008) before moving to TCF Bank Stadium.
- The Gophers are 38-26-3 all-time against Indiana and have won two straight against the Hoosiers and four of the last five meetings. These teams do not play often though, as Minnesota's two straight wins came in 2013 (42-39 on the road) and 2008 (16-7 at home). Minnesota is 31-9-1 in home games against Indiana and have won five straight home games in the series (2008, 2006, 2003, 1999 and 1997) and it's 76.8 home winning percentage against Indiana is the highest for Minnesota against any Big Ten team (not including Rutgers or Maryland). The last time Minnesota lost at home to Indiana was in 1993 when the Hoosiers prevailed 23-19. Minnesota also hosts Purdue and Northwestern this year to close out its home schedule. The Gophers are 31-12-3 (70.6 home winning percentage) at home against Purdue and 30-14-3 (67.0 home winning percentage) against Northwestern. Those home winning percentages rank second and fourth all-time for Minnesota (Iowa is third as Minnesota has won 68.1 percent of its home games against the Hawkeyes).
- The Gophers have 112 players on the roster and 58 of those players – or 51.7 percent – are freshmen. That's the highest number in the nation. Virginia is next at 50 percent and is followed by Wake Forest (49.1 percent) and UCF (48.03 percent). The Gophers have 78 underclassmen (69.6 percent of the roster), which ranks tenth in college football.

4 Minnesota threw for a total of 349 yards at Nebraska, as Zack Annexstad completed nine passes for 135 yards in the first half and Tanner Morgan completed 11 passes for 214 yards in the second half (Morgan replaced an injured Annexstad to start the second half). The 349 passing yards were the most for the Gophers since Adam Weber threw for 373 yards against Northern Illinois in 2010. The 349 yards were the most for the Gophers in a Big Ten game since Weber threw for 416 yards against Michigan State in 2009 and were the most in a Big Ten road game since Asad-Abdul-Khaliq threw for 388 yards at Iowa in 2003.

5 Minnesota has 16 receptions of at least 25 yards and receivers Tyler Johnson (8), Rashod Bateman (3), Chris Autman-Bell (3) and Seth Green (1) all have at least one catch of more than 25 yards. Last year, Minnesota had 14 total receptions of 25 yards or more in 12 games. Minnesota had 18 receptions of 25 yards or more in 13 games in 2016 and 25 in 13 games in 2015. Autman-Bell's 69-yard catch at Nebraska is the team's longest of the year and longest since 2008 (71 yards, Adam Weber to Brandon Green).

ROW THE BOAT

The OAR = The ENERGY! The symbol of strength and purpose. The amount one brings to their life Academically, Athletically, Socially and Spiritually! The only tool that can move the boat forward!

The BOAT = The SACRIFICE! What are you willing to give up for something that you've never had? The more you serve and give, the bigger your boat gets. The bigger your boat gets, the more people you can actually influence. Influence is about the messengers, not just the message.

Everyone, not just athletes and athletic teams can share, use and live the ROW THE BOAT lifestyle in their personal and professional lives. By applying ROW THE BOAT, one can have the proper perspective to overcome adversity and humble success by living a lifestyle dedicated to serving and giving.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the **ONLY** thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. You control whether you ROW fast or slow, confident or hesitant, efficient or rushed and whether you ROW for yourself or others! If you stop rowing, you will not go anywhere. Getting everyone in the boat to ROW, no matter what circumstances life throws you, can be very difficult; however... keep ROWING!

PAST: When rowing the boat, the only thing you can actually learn from, but can't change, is the horizon you are looking at. With every passing stroke you learn, but can never go back! You aren't able to change the past, only learn from it and take with you the lessons to make you better today. You must embrace and learn from your past to create your future! Changing your best daily will take you places you thought were impossible!

ABOUT THE HOOSIERS

Indiana (4-4 overall, 1-4 B1G) visits TCF Bank Stadium for the first time ever on Friday night.

Indiana fell 33-28 to No. 18 Penn State on Saturday, but put forth a gallant offensive performance. The Hoosiers outgained Penn State by a significant chunk of real estate, 554-417, and amassed 32 first downs. Indiana took 100 offensive snaps, which was the third most in program history. The Hoosiers defense held Trace McSorley without a touchdown pass for the first time in his 34 career starts, but allowed 170 return yards on five kickoffs.

Indiana's offense has been led by freshman running back Stevie Scott. He has 695 rushing yards (fifth most by a freshman running back in school history) and six rushing touchdowns (second most by a freshman running back in school history). He has been named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week twice.

Sophomore Peyton Ramsey has completed 198-of-289 passes for 1,860 and 13 touchdowns. Freshman Michael Penix Jr. has played in three games at quarterback and was heavily involved against Penn State.

Senior J-Shun Harris II leads the team with 28 receptions for 261 yards and two touchdowns. He has also taken a punt return to the house. Redshirt junior wide receiver Donovan Hale has a team leading four touchdown receptions.

The Hoosiers lead the Big Ten in takeaways with 15. Eight different players have at least one interception and six different players have recovered at least one fumble. Under head coach Tom Allen, Indiana's defenses have reached heights not seen in a generation in Bloomington. Since his arrival, Indiana is the most improved team nationally in total defense (-169.4 ypg) and passing defense (-134.1 ypg), the sixth-most improved in third down defense (-12.2 percent) and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed (-12.3 ypg).

Like the Gophers, Indiana is one of the most youthful teams in the country. They are the 19th youngest team in the country and the fourth youngest in the Big Ten. Seventy-seven of the 116 (66.4 percent) Hoosiers are underclassmen. They are led by Allen who was named head coach on Dec. 1, 2016.

HEAD COACH // SECOND SEASON

P.J. (Philip John) Fleck was named head football coach at the University of Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 38-33.

Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad in 2017, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' tenth largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980. Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and gave back to the community by hosting a diaper drive, canned food drive and turkey drive last year. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck, 37, is one the youngest and brightest minds in the game. He was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and last season he led the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh are the only Power Five conference coaches who both played and coached in the NFL. Fleck, Harbaugh and East Carolina's Scottie Montgomery are the only coaches in the FBS who have played and coached in the NFL.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

FIRST YEAR QUARTERBACKS

- For the second straight season Minnesota started the year with the most inexperienced quarterbacks in the nation. This year, Minnesota has three redshirt freshmen quarterbacks in Tanner Morgan, Samuel Pickerign and Jon Santaga (moved from defensive back to quarterback in the spring) on its roster and true freshman walk-on Zack Annexstad, who has started the first seven games. Annexstad is believed to be just the second ever true freshman walk-on to start a season opener, joining Baker Mayfield who did so in 2013 at Texas Tech. Minnesota is the only team in the nation that has all freshmen quarterbacks on the roster.
- Through seven games, Zack Annexstad has completed 97-of-187 passes for 1,277 yards (second most ever for a Gopher freshman) and nine touchdowns (third all-time for a Gopher freshman). Five of Annexstad's touchdowns have gone to Tyler Johnson, while three have been caught by Rashod Bateman and one by Demetrius Douglas. Annexstad started the season 3-0 and was the first Gopher freshman quarterback ever to win his first three career starts having not played previously. Freshmen became eligible in 1972.
- Zack Annexstad was the first true freshman to start a season-opening game at quarterback for the Gophers since Tim Salem got the call in 1980 (Salem passed for 162 yards in the season opener) playing for his father and coach Joe Salem. Dating back to 1980, only redshirt freshman Alan Holt's 275 yards passing against Michigan State in 1985 were better in a Gopher freshman's (true or redshirt) debut than Annexstad's 220 yards against New Mexico State. Rickey Foggie (1984, 62 yards) and Max Shortell (2011, 98 yards) played as true freshmen in season-opening games, but as reserves because of injuries. Redshirt freshmen Asad Abdul-Khaliq (2000, 161 yards) and Adam Weber (2007, 188 yards) also started their season-openers.
- Zack Annexstad attended IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla., and was named the starting quarterback midway through his senior season. He turned down multiple Power 5 scholarship offers to walk-on at Minnesota and enrolled at the U in January 2018. As a senior at IMG, he completed 63-of-112 passes for 940 yards and 10 touchdowns as the Ascenders completed an undefeated season. He finished his IMG career with 1,137 passing yards and 14 touchdowns. Annexstad was the starting quarterback at Mankato West (Mankato, Minn.) as a sophomore in 2015, but was sidelined by an ankle injury. He then continued his high school career at IMG. His brother, Brock, is a redshirt freshman receiver for the Gophers and his father, Scott, played at Minnesota from 1982-83 before playing with Kansas City and Washington in the NFL. Annexstad's cousin Sam Dekker plays basketball for the Cleveland Cavaliers.
- Tanner Morgan is the only scholarship quarterback on the team. He attended Ryle High School in Kentucky where he played as a junior and a senior (played first two years at Hazard HS) before enrolling at Minnesota in January 2017. Morgan is one of only a few Kentucky high school quarterbacks to pass for more than 10,000 career yards. As a senior, he passed for 2,747 yards and 27 touchdowns as Ryle finished 12-1. Morgan was named a finalist for Kentucky's Mr. Football award. Morgan has played in three games this season and played the second half at Nebraska. At Nebraska, he completed 11-of-16 passes for 214 yards and he also rushed four times for 35 yards and one score. Morgan's cousin Tim Couch played at Kentucky and spent five seasons with the Cleveland Browns.

RUNNING BACKS

- Senior Rodney Smith was injured in the first quarter against Fresno State and will miss the rest of the season. Minnesota will file a waiver for a sixth year of eligibility for Smith with the NCAA at the conclusion of the season. In two games this year, Smith rushed for 154 yards on 25 carries and also added 32 receiving yards and 37 kick return yards. In 39 career games, he has rushed 651 times (fifth all-time in school history) for 2,959 yards (seventh all-time in school history) and scored 21 career rushing touchdowns (tied for ninth in school history). His 4,073 all-purpose yards (2,959 rushing, 451 receiving and 663 kick return) ranks seventh in school history.
- The injury to Rodney Smith means there are only two healthy seniors on offense in linemen Donnell Greene and Jared Weyler. Shannon Brooks was recently medically cleared to play this year after sustaining an injury in February. Coach Fleck has indicated that he would like to play Brooks in four games this year, so he could still redshirt. Brooks has rushed 336 times for 1,728 yards (27th in program history) in 28 career games. He has rushed for 17 career touchdowns (five career touchdowns are 37 yards or longer), caught two touchdown passes and passed for one (42 yards to Drew Wolitarsky at Iowa in 2015). Minnesota is 11-2 when he scores.
- Redshirt freshman Mohamed Ibrahim has carried the load for Minnesota this year. He started his career with 101 yards on nine carries against New Mexico State to become the first Gopher to rush for 100 yards or more in his collegiate debut since Thomas Hamner piled up 158 yards in a 30-3 win against NE Louisiana (now ULM) in 1996. Ibrahim missed the Fresno State and Miami games with an injury, but then rushed 26 times for 95 yards at Maryland. He rushed for a career high 157 yards on 23 carries and scored two touchdowns at Ohio State. His 157 yards were the most by a freshman running back against Ohio State since Penn State's Saquan Barkley rushed for 194 yards in 2015 against the Buckeyes.
- Minnesota has had three running backs rush for more than 100 yards in a game this year in Mohamed Ibrahim (101 vs. New Mexico State and 157 at Ohio State), Rodney Smith (153 vs. New Mexico State) and Bryce Williams (141 vs. Miami). It's the third straight year that Minnesota has had three running backs rush for more than 100 yards, but it is the first year since 2005 that the team has had three different running backs total at least 140 yards. In 2005, Laurence Maroney ran for 140 yards or more four times. He was joined by Gary Russell who did it twice and Amir Pinnix who did so once. Minnesota has a chance to have four running backs eclipse the 100-yard mark in a game this season. That is something that has never been done dating back to 1942. Four different players have rushed for 100 yards in a season before, but one was always the quarterback.

WILDCAT SUCCESS

- The Gophers have utilized Seth Green as a Wildcat quarterback this year and he has rushed for six touchdowns. Green also converted a two-point try to Ko Kieft against Fresno State and tossed his first career touchdown - a 7-yard strike to Tyler Johnson - against Miami. On the season, he has rushed 38 times for 130 yards and he has also caught one pass for 31 yards. Green started his Gopher career as a quarterback, but changed positions late in spring 2018 to tight end and is now transitioning to wide receiver. He has the ability to run, throw or catch a touchdown. The last Gopher to do that in one season was running back Duane Bennett who accomplished the feat in 2010. Current Minnesota running back Shannon Brooks has also rushed, passed and thrown for a touchdown, but not in the same season.

MINNESOTA MADE

- ▶ Minnesotans have led the way for the Gophers this year. Zack Annexstad (1,277 passing yards, 9 TDs), Tyler Johnson (705 receiving yards, 6 TDs), Seth Green (6 rushing TDs, 1 passing TD, 1 two-point conversion pass), Blake Cashman (58 tackles, 10.5 TFLs), Carter Coughlin (8.0 sacks), Thomas Barber (49 tackles, 1 INT, 1 fumble rec.), Kamal Martin (39 tackles) and offensive linemen Conner Olson, Sam Schlueter and Blaise Andries all hail from Minnesota.

FRESHMEN FOCUS

- ▶ The following true freshmen have played in more than four games and will not redshirt: Zack Annexstad, Rashod Bateman, Jordan Howden, Max Janes, Thomas Rush, Benny Sapp, Terell Smith and Bryce Williams. Minnesota starts seven freshmen on offense, which is the most in the nation (BYU has started six freshmen on offense this year), in Blaise Andries (OL), Daniel Faalele (OL), Zack Annexstad (QB), Chris Autman-Bell (WR), Rashod Bateman (WR), Jake Paulson (TE) and Mohamed Ibrahim (RB). On defense, Minnesota has starts freshman Terell Smith (DB).
- ▶ Minnesota has combined for 4,126 passing, rushing and receiving yards and 2,929 - or 70.8 percent - have been produced by freshmen. The Gophers have passed for 1,549 yards and 1,526 (98.5%) have come from the arm of a freshman. They have rushed for 1,028 yards and 728 (70.8%) are from freshmen. Minnesota has 1,549 receiving yards and 675 (43.5%) are the result of a freshman catching the ball.

STAR POWER

- ▶ Tyler Johnson exploded onto the scene last year with 35 catches for 677 yards and seven touchdowns. Through seven games this season, he has hauled in 47 (sixth in B1G) balls for 705 yards (13th in NCAA, 2nd in B1G) and six scores. Johnson has 96 career catches (16th in school history) for 1,523 yards (13th in school history) and 14 touchdowns (tied for ninth all-time). The Minnesota single season receiving record is 1,125 yards set by Ron Johnson in 2000. Tyler Johnson is 420 yards shy of Ron Johnson's record and needs to average 84 yards in the remaining five games to tie the record.
- ▶ Tyler Johnson has eight career 100-yard games, which tied for fourth in school history. He is averaging 100.7 yards per game, which ranks 11th in the NCAA and is second in the Big Ten. He has five 100-yard games this year, which is tied for second all-time in school history. The last Gopher to have five 100-yard games in a season was Aaron Hosack (2003) and the last to have six (school record) was Ryan Thelwell (1996). Johnson enters the Indiana game with back-to-back-to-back 100-yard games (107 vs. Iowa; 119 at Ohio State and 184 at Nebraska). The last Gopher to have three straight 100-yard receiving games in the Big Ten was Ron Johnson, who did it against Penn State (114), Ohio State (163) and Indiana (177) in 2000. The last and only Gopher to have four straight 100-yard receiving games (school record) was Eric Decker who did so from 12/31/08 to 9/18/09 (vs. Kansas, at Syracuse, vs. Air Force and vs. California).
- ▶ Tyler Johnson had a career day against Nebraska. He caught 11 passes (third-most ever for a Gopher) for 184 yards (seventh most in a single game for a

Gopher and most since Eric Decker had 190 yards against Indiana in 2008). He has 303 receiving yards in his last two games (119 at Ohio State and 184 at Nebraska). The school record for most receiving yards in consecutive games is 340 set by Ron Johnson in 2000 (163 at Ohio State and 177 at Indiana). Tyler Johnson needs 156 yards versus Indiana to tie Ron Johnson's record.

- ▶ Tyler Johnson's 677 receiving yards in 2017 were the fifth most ever by a Gopher sophomore and that was despite missing the final two games with an injury. His seven receiving touchdowns were the second most ever by a sophomore. To crack the top five as a junior he will need 60 catches and 822 yards. Ron Johnson's 11 TDs as a junior is first in school history.
- ▶ In 17 games with receiver coach Matt Simon, Tyler Johnson has caught 82 passes for 1,382 yards and 13 touchdowns. Those numbers alone would rank him 19th in career receptions, 14th in career yards and tied for 11th in touchdowns. The 16.85 average yards per catch would rank sixth.
- ▶ Tyler Johnson caught three touchdowns this year against Miami to tie his career high. He also caught three (all in fourth quarter) last year against Michigan State. Johnson is the second Gopher to catch three touchdowns in a game twice, joining Da'Jon McKnight (2010 vs. Penn State and 2011 at Michigan State).

BATEMAN, BELL, DOUGLAS

- ▶ After Tyler Johnson, three freshmen highlight the receiving game for Minnesota. Rashod Bateman has 31 catches for 295 yards and three touchdowns. He caught his first career touchdown - a 17-yard pass from Zack Annexstad at Maryland - to become the first Gopher receiver not named Tyler Johnson to catch a touchdown since Drew Wolitarsky did so against Wisconsin in 2016 (span of 16 games). Bateman added two touchdowns against Iowa. Chris Autman-Bell is a sure-handed target who has made 16 catches for 295 yards. He leads the Gophers with an 18.44 average per catch (minimum five catches). Demetrius Douglas was granted a medical hardship waiver from the NCAA after playing in three games last season. He has four catches for 35 yards and one touchdown, but notched three catches for 31 yards and one touchdown at Nebraska. His father, Omar, played at Minnesota from 1990-93 and is tied for eighth in receptions (130), for ninth in receiving touchdowns (14) and tenth in school history in receiving yards (1,681). Omar, owns school record for touchdowns in a game with five (Oct. 9, 1993 vs. Purdue) and spent four years in the NFL with the New York Giants.
- ▶ With Bateman, Autman-Bell and Douglas seeing significant playing time, let's take a look at freshman receiving records. The most receptions by a freshman in school history is 38 (Ron Johnson, 1998), while the most receiving yards is 654 (Ernie Wheelwright, 2004) and touchdowns is seven (Ernie Wheelwright, 2004).

A LOT OF CHOCOLATE MILK

- ▶ Up front the Gophers feature a mix of experience and youth, as Minnesota has started two upperclassmen and three underclassmen on the offensive line.
- ▶ As a fifth-year senior, Jared Weyler is the most tenured of the group, but Donnell Greene has played

the most football for the Gophers. Greene, who joined Minnesota as a junior college transfer in 2016, has started 26 of his 32 career games. He started 11 of 12 games in 2017 and the final eight of 2016. He was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention last season and has started all seven games this year.

- ▶ Jared Weyler has started at center in all seven games this year, a position that he started six games for Minnesota at last season but also missed six games due to an injury. Weyler has already earned a minor in Leadership and his undergraduate degree, as he double majored in Accounting and Entrepreneurial Management. He is prepping for the CPA exam.
- ▶ Conner Olson started all 12 games (six at center, six at right guard) last season as a redshirt freshman, but is playing guard this year. The Monticello, Minn. native was 240 pounds when he was recruited and has since upped his frame to 300 pounds. He credits his weight gain to chocolate milk and peanut butter sandwiches.
- ▶ Two more Minnesotans in sophomore Sam Schlueter (Victoria) and redshirt freshman Blaise Andries (Marshall) have seen extended action this year. Andries has started all seven games, while Schlueter started the first five of the season. Andries, who is an aspiring actuary, made his collegiate debut this year.
- ▶ Daniel Faalele, who is 6-8 and 400 pounds, replaced Schlueter at tackle to start the second half against Iowa and started at Ohio State and at Nebraska. The massive true freshman from Australia has now played in four games this year. He is still quite new to American football. Faalele attended IMG Academy in Orlando in 2016 and 2017. He only practiced in 2016, but then played in 2017 so this season is his second year of playing football. Ever.

SQUEAKY CLEAN

- ▶ Clean football has been a staple of Coach Fleck's teams and this season is no different. The Gophers rank No. 10 in the country in fewest penalties per game at 4.57 and tied for No. 12 in fewest penalties at 32. The Gophers were called for nine penalties against New Mexico State, but have since been penalized only 23 times in the last six games.
- ▶ The Gophers ranked first in the nation last season - Fleck's first as coach - in fewest penalties (39), fewest penalties per game (3.25), fewest penalty yards (340) and fewest penalty yards per game (28.33). It was a sharp contrast from 2016 when Minnesota ranked 91st in fewest penalties (88), 89th in fewest penalties per game (6.77), 86th in fewest penalty yards (743) and 80th in fewest penalty yards per game (57.15). Minnesota committed 49 fewer penalties in 2017 than 2016 and the difference in yards penalized was 403.

POINTS

- ▶ Minnesota scored 28 points in the second quarter and 35 in the first half against New Mexico State. The 28 points were the most scored in a quarter since 2015 when the Gophers rang up 28 third-quarter points at Purdue and the 35 points were the most in the first half for Minnesota since it totaled 38 in the first half against Indiana State in 2016.
- ▶ Minnesota's 38-point margin of victory (won 48-10) against New Mexico State was the largest ever for the

Gophers at TCF Bank Stadium. Minnesota had previously beaten Iowa (2014) and New Hampshire (2012) by 37 points at TCF Bank Stadium. The 38-point win was also Minnesota's largest margin of victory since 2006, when it topped Temple 62-0 at home.

- Minnesota scored 31 points against Iowa in a loss this year. The 31 points were the most by Minnesota in a loss since it fell 40-35 at No. 8 Iowa in 2015.

TOM-BOMB

- Thomas Barber emerged as a breakout star last season. The legacy Gopher started all 12 games and finished first on the team with 115 tackles to rank third in the Big Ten and tied for 20th in the nation. The junior linebacker is well on his way to another strong season in 2018. He had eight tackles including a team leading seven solo tackles against Miami. He also notched one for a loss that resulted in a safety. He recorded another seven tackles against Maryland and hit double digits with 10 tackles including one for a loss against Iowa. On top of that he scooped up a fumble and took it down to the seven-yard line. Against Ohio State, he recorded nine tackles and added another seven against Nebraska. He has 49 tackles, one interception and one fumble recovery so far this year. Thomas Barber does not have a single defensive penalty in his entire career despite seeing almost every single defensive snap as the "Mike" linebacker the past two seasons. According to Pro Football Focus, he has played 1,157 defensive snaps (24 in 2016, 747 in 2017 and 386 in 2018) in college. The only penalty of his career came on a special teams play when he was called for holding against Northwestern as a freshman in 2016. Last year, 76 of Barber's 115 tackles – or 66% of his total tackles were solo. His 76 solo stops ranked first in the Big Ten and tied for seventh nationally. Barber's 66% solo tackle rate ranked third in the nation.

SACKED BY COUGHLIN

- Carter Coughlin has eight sacks (No. 7 in the NCAA, first in B1G) this season after recording a team leading 6.5 last year. Coughlin's speed has caused fits for offensive linemen since he transitioned from linebacker to a rush end role last season. He has been on an absolute tear with 12 sacks in his last 13 games.
- Carter Coughlin's sack against Nebraska tied him for eighth all-time in school history for sacks in a season. He is on his way to a double-digit sack season, which has been done only six times at Minnesota and not since 2008 when Willie VanDeSteege had 10.5 sacks. Coughlin's 16.5 career sacks has him in fifth all-time for career sacks in Gophers history. Willie VanDeSteege is fourth with 21.5 career sacks and Karon Riley holds the school record with 29 career sacks. Coughlin has done the majority of his damage against Big Ten foes with 10.5 of his career sacks coming in Big Ten play. He has four multi-sack games in his career including three against Big Ten teams.
- Carter Coughlin has 10.5 tackles for loss after recording a team-best 11.5 in 2017. His 10.5 tackles for loss have resulted in a loss of 49 yards. He has 26 career tackles for loss which is closing on the top-10 all-time in Gophers history. One more tackle for loss and he would tie three former Gophers for ninth all-time.

STRAIGHT CASH HOMEY

- Blake Cashman has made his money on special teams throughout his career but he has been a dynamic playmaker on defense for the Gophers this year. He leads the team with 58 tackles, a team leading 33 solo tackles and is tied for first on the team with 10.5 tackles for loss. He was named to the Pro Football Focus midseason All-Big Ten First Team. He has been the top graded Gopher by PFF in four games this season. He tied a TCF Bank Stadium record with four tackles for loss against New Mexico State. PFF charted him with five total quarterback hurries on just eight pass rush snaps. Cashman would add a sack and a pass breakup and then notched 10 tackles against Fresno State. He set a new career high against now No. 2 Ohio State with 13 tackles including two for a loss and one pass breakup. He also came up with a big stop on a fourth-and-one for Ohio State deep in Minnesota territory.

- Blake Cashman finished last season with 30 tackles including five for a loss and two sacks. As a sophomore he recorded 45 tackles with a team leading 7.5 sacks and one forced fumble. He was named the 2017 Holiday Bowl Defensive Most Valuable Player and is a two-time winner of the team's Gary Tinsley Award, as the player who best embodied the underdog spirit of the late Gary Tinsley. He has 10.5 career sacks and 26.5 tackles for loss, both of which are closing in on top-10 marks in school history. He needs just a half a tackle for loss to tie for ninth all-time in Minnesota history with three former Gophers.

- Off the field Blake Cashman runs his own nonprofit called "Athletes Answer to Hunger." It's a nonprofit that brings athletes together to pack meals and send to people struggling with food insecurity. Cashman started it going into his senior year of high school. He has worked with teams across the state and ran a Minnesota athletics department wide drive his freshman year. The football team plans to take part in one more drive together before Cashman graduates.

ANOTHER MINNESOTA LB

- On top of Coughlin (Eden Prairie), Cashman (Eden Prairie), Barber (Plymouth), the Gophers have another standout linebacker from Minnesota in Kamal Martin out of Burnsville. Martin is fifth on the team with 39 tackles including 2.5 for loss and has two pass breakups this season. He has 91 career tackles in 32 games of action including 10.5 for loss in his career. He had a career high ten tackles against Nebraska last time out.

REPLACING WINFIELD

- Antoine Winfield Jr. was granted a medical hardship by the NCAA in 2017 and was off to a spectacular 2018 season before suffering an injury on the first drive of the game against Maryland. He started the season with two viral moments. He helped swing the game against New Mexico State by taking his first ever punt return 76 yards to the house and made an interception in the end zone to beat Fresno State.
- Senior defensive back Antonio Shenault moved to safety against Iowa while fellow senior Jacob Huff holds down the other safety spot. Shenault and Huff both have played in 40 career games. Shenault has 42 tackles this year and 2.5 tackles for loss, one

forced fumble and one interception. He set a new career high with 13 tackles including one for a loss against Ohio State. Ten of those 13 tackles were solo stops. Huff has 30 solo stops and is second on the team with 49 tackles. He also helped Minnesota score late in the first half against Iowa by returning an interception 21 yards to the 6-yard line. He also has two pass breakups and one forced fumble.

- Freshman walk-on Jordan Howden has been the next man up in the safety position. He recorded a career-high eight tackles (four solo) against Nebraska. As a senior in high school, Howden out of Las Vegas, Nev., notched 45 tackles and three interceptions while earning All-Conference honors. He also won the NIAA 3A State Championship in the long jump (21-05.00) and was on the relay teams that took first in the 4x100 (42.70) and 4x200 (1:28.87).

T-TIME

- True freshman Terell Smith has 31 tackles, six pass breakups and one interception this year. His six pass breakups is already more than any Gopher had in 2017. Smith brings elite speed to the team, as he won the Georgia State Championship in the 100m (10.39) as a junior and the 200m (21.26) as a sophomore. His personal record in the 100m is 10.32 and in the 200m is 20.84, which made him the fastest Big Ten corner commit since 2010.

A CARPENTER'S PRECISION

- Emmitt Carpenter's 44 career field goals ranks tied for third in school history with Paul Rogind. He has made 44-of-55 career field goals and his 80.0 field goal conversion rate ranks first in program history. Carpenter has made 28-of-36 field goals at TCF Bank Stadium, 15-of-18 on the road and 1-of-1 in neutral-site games. Carpenter is 38-of-49 on FieldTurf and is a perfect 6-of-6 on natural grass. He has made 93-of-94 career point-after attempts, which includes a current streak of 56. He is third all-time with 54 straight point-after attempts. Rogind is second (57), while Dan Nystrom is first (83).

- Through seven games, Emmitt Carpenter has made 8-of-11 field goal and all 21 point-after attempts. He now has 225 career points as he has made 93 PATs and 44 field goals. Carpenter's 225 points ranks him third among kickers all time and fourth among all players.

- Entering the Ohio State game, Emmitt Carpenter had made six straight field goals (53, 50, 44, 33, 41, 49). His streak ended when he missed from 32 yards in the third quarter (would also miss from 49 yards in the fourth quarter) at Ohio State. In 2016, Carpenter had made streaks of 12 and nine. Dan Nystrom is the only Gopher with three streaks of seven-straight made field goals (ended career with streaks of 16, 14 and 13).

- Against Fresno State, Emmitt Carpenter connected on field goals from 50 and 53 yards. The 53-yard kick tied his career-long, as he also made a 53-yarder during the second half of the 44-31 win against Purdue in 2016. It was the second time in his career he's made two field goals greater than 50 yards. He was good from 52 and 53 versus Purdue in 2016. Adam Bailey is the only other Minnesota kicker with two field goals from 50-plus yards (52, 50) in the same game (vs. Penn State in 1997 indoors at the Metrodome).

► In 2017, Carpenter made 14-of-20 field goals and was a perfect 31-of-31 on point-after attempts. He led Minnesota with 73 points and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention. In 2016, Carpenter was named the Big Ten's Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year (first Gopher to be honored with this award), after making 22-of-24 field goals. He was named All-Big Ten First Team (media) and All-Big Ten Second Team (coaches). Carpenter totaled 109 points, which tied Dan Nystrom (109 points in 2000) for most all-time by a Minnesota kicker. Carpenter's 109 points also ranks tied for second all-time with Nystrom for any Gopher behind Gary Russell (114 points in 2005) and he finished fifth in the Big Ten scoring race that season. He was a perfect 10-of-10 on field goals from 40 yards or greater and was the only kicker in the nation - minimum six kicks - to do that (8-of-8 from 40-49 yards and 2-of-2 from 50-plus yards).

► Emmitt Carpenter is on the watch list for the Lou Groza Award and is one of 30 semifinalists for the Senior Class Award. He is a two-time CoSida Academic All-District honoree and has received the team's Tony Dungy Character and Community Service Award.

SPECIAL BROTHERHOOD

► The Gophers are in the third straight season of having the same long snapper (Payton Jordahl), holder (Jacob Herbers) and kicker (Emmitt Carpenter). Jordahl has snapped 452 times in his career (252 punt, 124 PATs and 76 FGs) and has made 10 tackles. Herbers is on the Mortell Holder of the Year watch list. He is averaging 41.62 yards on 33 punts and has placed 15 inside the 20. Minnesota has yielded only 11 punt return yards this year. Not bad for an Eagle Scout and mechanical engineering major. As mentioned, Carpenter is an amazing person and kicker.

YOU'RE ON SCHOLARSHIP

► Nobody gives away a scholarship like Minnesota coach P.J. Fleck. He certainly has a flair for the dramatic when it comes to scholarship surprises, as he ensures that the moment is one that is memorable. Since Fleck was hired on Jan. 6, 2017, he has awarded eight scholarships to walk-ons, with three coming in the last few months. Bailey Schoenfelder was awarded a scholarship after two Navy Seals parachuted onto the field and delivered a letter to Fleck. Brock Annexstad received a scholarship when his brother, starting quarterback Zack, pretended to reveal a tattoo to the team that showed the words, "Brock, you are on scholarship." After Minnesota beat New Mexico State, Fleck awarded a scholarship to Calvin Swenson while he was addressing the team in the locker room. Fleck had previously given scholarships to walk-ons Sam Renner, Blake Cashman, Emmitt Carpenter, Justin Juenemann, and Conor Rhoda.

DEGREE IN HAND

► Minnesota has eight players who have already earned their degree. They are Jerry Gibson, Payton Jordahl, Gary Moore, Rodney Smith, Jared Weyler, Julian Huff, Sam Renner and Alex Melvin.

NEW COACHES

► Head coach P.J. Fleck promoted Joe Rossi from quality control assistant to defensive line coach this past offseason. He also hired Clay Patterson (tight ends), Jahmile Addae (defensive back) and Marcus West (defensive line pass rush specialist).

► Joe Rossi joined the staff in January 2017 and was named defensive line coach in January 2018. Rossi spent 2012-15 at Rutgers, which included two years as defensive coordinator. Rossi was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2014 after serving in an interim role in 2013 and held the role until after 2015.

► Clay Patterson joined the Minnesota coaching staff in January 2018 after serving as head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M for two seasons. The Morris, Okla., native led the Norseman to a 9-3 record in 2017 after going 5-5 in 2016. In 2017, the program claimed its first Southwest Junior College Football Conference (SWJCFC) championship since 2003 and played in its first bowl game since 2012. Patterson earned conference coach of the year honors as his team averaged 524.5 yards per game (253.8 rushing and 270.6 passing) and 36.2 points per game.

► Jahmile Addae coached Arizona defensive backs in 2016-17 after working for the team as an analyst from 2013-15. At Arizona, Addae helped develop Arizona's young defensive backs into top performers. Four of Arizona's leading tacklers were in the secondary in 2017 and that quartet combined for 261 tackles, 24 breakups and 12 interceptions.

► Marcus West came to Minnesota after two seasons at Austin Peay. While with the Governors, West was the assistant head coach, co-defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. In 2017, Austin Peay - which was a combined 1-45 from 2013-16 - posted an 8-4 record. The eight wins tied a program record and the team's seven conference wins were a program record. The defense, led by West, held its opponents to 24.8 points per game (fifth-best in the OVC), which is impressive considering the Governors gave up 73 points at UCF. Excluding UCF, Austin Peay gave up 20.3 points per game in 11 games and gave up only 16.6 points per game in its eight wins.

TCF BANK STADIUM

► TCF Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) played season at TCF Bank Stadium, while their new stadiums were being constructed.

PLAYING AT HOME

► Minnesota is 39-28 all-time at TCF Bank Stadium. Minnesota is 11 games over .500 at TCF Bank Stadium, which is its second best mark at the stadium. The Gophers were 12 games over .500 at the stadium prior to losing to Iowa this year. The Gophers opened the on-campus facility with a 20-13 win against Air Force on Sept. 12, 2009, but then dropped to 7-13 at home after 20 games. Since then (Nov. 26, 2011), Minnesota has compiled a 32-15 record at home, which translates to a 68.1 winning percentage.

► Minnesota is 22-7 at TCF Bank Stadium in non-conference games. However, the Gophers are 19-1 in their last 20 non-conference games and have won nine in a row. Minnesota's last home loss to a non-conference opponent was to No. 2 TCU in 2015.
