FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

The Gophers take to the road this week for the second time this season when they visit No. 3 Ohio State. Minnesota is 7-44 all-time against Ohio State and the Buckeyes have won the last 10 meetings. The Gophers most recent win in the series was a 29-17 victory on the road on Oct. 14, 2000. That game, which was 18 years ago this weekend, featured a quick start by the Gophers as they jumped out to a 17-3 lead in the first quarter. Travis Cole passed for 243 yards and two scores, while Ron Johnson caught eight balls for 163 yards and one score. Tellis Redmon scored once and grinded out 118 yards on 30 carries, and kicker Dan Nystrom connected on field goals from 23, 32 and 42 yards.

The injury bug has bitten Minnesota hard this year, as the Gophers will be without standouts Shannon Brooks, Rodney Smith and Antoine Winfield Jr., on Saturday. Smith and Winfield are Winfield are out for the season, while Brooks is still recovering from an injury sustained prior to spring practice. Smith, who also is Minnesota's starting kick returner, suffered a season-ending injury in the first quarter of the second game of the season against Fresno State. Smith ranks seventh all-time in career rushing vards with 2,959 and seventh in all-purpose vards with 4,073. Winfield Jr., who is Minnesota' starting punt returner, suffered a season-ending injury in the first quarter at Maryland. Winfield made 17 tackles this year and recovered one fumble. He also made a game-clinching interception against Fresno State and turned the game against New Mexico State with a 76-yard punt return. Minnesota will file a waiver to receive a sixth year of eligibility for both Smith and Winfield. Brooks was hurt prior to spring practice and his return to the field is not yet known. He ranks 27th in school history with 1,728 rushing yards and has rushed

for 17 touchdowns in 28 career games.

Minnesotans have led the way for the Gophers this year. Zack Annexstad (924 passing yards, 8 TDs), Tyler Johnson (402 receiving yards, 6 TDs), Seth Green (5 rushing TDs, 1 passing TD, 1 two-point conversion pass), Blake Cashman (34 tackles, 6.5 TFLs), Carter Coughlin (5.0 sacks), Thomas Barber (33 tackles, 1 INT, 1 fumble recovery). Kamal Martin (23 tackles) and offensive lineman Conner Olson, Sam Schlueter and Blaise Andries all hail from Minnesota.

The Gophers have 112 players on the roster and 58 of those players - or 51.7 percent - are freshmen. That's the highest number in the nation. Virginia is next at 50 percent and is followed by Wake Forest (49.1 percent) and UCF (48.03 percent). The Gophers have 78 underclassmen (69.6% of the roster), which ranks tenth in college football.

Minnesota has combined for 2,689 passing, rushing and receiving yards and 1,949 - or 72 percent - have been produced by freshmen. The Gophers have passed for 982 yards and 959 (97%) have come from the arm of a freshman. They have rushed for 725 yards and 471 (65%) are from freshmen. Minnesota has 982 receiving yards and 517 (52%) are the result of a freshman catching the ball.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. ABOUT THE BUCKEYES

The Golden Gophers travel to Columbus, Ohio to take on No. 3 Ohio State. The Buckeyes have the second longest winning streak in FBS with 11 straight wins. They are 6-0 this season and 3-0 in the Big Ten.

Last Saturday, Ohio State beat Indiana 49-26 led by a record day from quarterback Dwayne Haskins. Haskins' 33 completions, six passing touchdowns and 455 passing yards marked career highs. The six touchdowns and 33 completions tied Ohio State single-game records and the 455 yards were the second-most in a game in program history. Haskins has at least two touchdown passes in each game this season and at least three in five of six contests. He has 25 scoring strikes on the year against just four interceptions. His 25 touchdown passes leads the country while his 1,919 passing ranks third in the NCAA.

All three fifth-year senior wide receiver captains – Parris Campbell, Johnnie Dixon and Terry McLaurin – have double-digit touchdown receptions for their career. McLaurin has 14, Dixon 11 and Campbell 10. All three scored against Indiana. Junior receiver K.J. Hill extended his streak of games with a reception to 26 contests. Hill has at least four receptions in every game this season.

The Buckeyes offense has surpassed the 500-yard mark five times this season. They average 565.7 yards per game which is ranked fifth in the nation and first in the Big Ten. They are sixth in the nation in scoring, as they average 49 points per game.

Defensively the Buckeyes have gotten to the quarterback, as they have 18 sacks (fourth in the nation) this year. Junior defensive tackle Dre-Mont Jones and junior defensive end Nick Bosa both have four sacks each this season. The Buckeyes' defense has also recorded at least six tackles-for-loss in every game this season. Jones has notched 7.5 for loss, sophomore defensive end Chase Young has recorded 7.0 for loss and Bosa has added 6.5 for loss.

The Buckeyes lead the all-time series, 44-7, against Minnesota and have won 10 consecutive meetings dating back to 2001. Ohio State owns an all-time record of 23-3 against Minnesota in Columbus and has won 20 of the last 21 meetings inside Ohio Stadium.



HEAD COACH // SECOND SEASON

P.J. (Philip John) Fleck was named head football coach at the University of Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 38-31.

Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad in 2017, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' tenth largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980. Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and gave back to the community by hosting a diaper drive, canned food drive and turkey drive last year. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck, 37, is one the youngest and brightest minds in the game. He was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and last season he led the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh are the only Power Five conference coaches who both played and coached in the NFL. Fleck, Harbaugh and East Carolina's Scottie Montgomery are the only coaches in the FBS who have played and coached in the NFL.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

Minnesota, 2015-present Mike Nugent, 81.8% (72-88) 3 Ohio State, 2001-04

FIRST YEAR OUARTERBACKS

- For the second straight season Minnesota started the year with the most inexperienced quarterbacks in the nation. This year, Minnesota has three redshirt freshmen quarterbacks in Tanner Morgan, Samuel Pickerign and Jon Santaga (moved from defensive back to quarterback in the spring) on its roster and true freshman walk-on Zack Annexstad, who has started the first three games. Annexstad is believed to be just the second ever true freshman walk-on to start a season opener, joining Baker Mayfield who did so in 2013 at Texas Tech. Minnesota is the only team in the nation that has all freshmen quarterbacks on the roster and is one of three teams - joining Kentucky and Nebraska - who started the season with guarterbacks who had never attempted a pass in a game.
- Through five games, Zack Annexstad has completed 75-of-144 passes (52.08%) for 924 yards and eight touchdowns. Five of Annexstad's touchdowns have gone to Tyler Johnson and the other three were caught by Rashod Bateman. Annexstad started the season 3-0 and was the first Gopher freshman quarterback ever to win his first three career starts having not played previously. Freshmen became eligible to compete in 1972.
- Zack Annexstad is quickly climbing the Minnesota record book with regard to freshmen quarterbacks. Annexstad has passed for 924 yards in five games and needs 112 more to tie Rickey Foggie for third all-time for a Minnesota freshman quarterback. Annexstad's eight passing touchdowns tie him for third all-time for a Gopher freshman quarterback. Two more passing touchdowns will tie him with Foggie for second with 10.
- Zack Annexstad was the first true freshman to start a season-opening game at quarterback for the Gophers since Tim Salem got the call in 1980 (Salem passed for 162 yards in the season opener). Dating back to 1980, only redshirt freshman Alan Holt's 275 yards passing against Michigan State in 1985 were better in a Gopher freshman's (true or redshirt) debut than Annexstad's 220 yards against New Mexico State. Since 1980, a freshman quarterback has now appeared in a game for Minnesota 76 times. Annexstad's 220 yards against the Aggies were the third most by a true freshman since 1980 are the 12th most in all 76 appearances.
- Zack Annexstad (220 passing yards in first career start) was the first true freshman to start the season at quarterback for the Gophers since 1980 when Tim Salem (passed for 162 yards) started for his father and coach Joe Salem against Ohio. Rickey Foggie (1984, 62 yards) and Max Shortell (2011, 98 yards) played as true freshmen in season-opening games, but as reserves because of injuries. Redshirt freshmen Asad Abdul-Khaliq (2000, 161 yards) and Adam Weber (2007, 188 yards) also started their season-openers.
- Zack Annexstad attended IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla., and was named the starting quarterback midway through his senior season. He turned down multiple Power 5 scholarship offers to walk-on at Minnesota and enrolled at the U in January 2018. As a senior at IMG, he completed 63-of-112 passes for 940 yards and 10 touchdowns as the Ascenders completed an undefeated season. He finished his IMG career with 1,137 passing yards and 14 touchdowns. Annexstad was the starting quarterback at Mankato West (Mankato, Minn.) as a sophomore in 2015, but was sidelined by an ankle injury. He then continued his high school career at IMG. His brother, Brock, is a redshirt freshman receiver for the Gophers and his father, Scott, played at Minnesota from 1982-83 before playing with Kansas City and Washington in the NFL. Annexstad's cousin Sam Dekker plays basketball for the Cleveland Cavaliers.
- Tanner Morgan is the only scholarship quarterback on the roster. He attended Ryle High School in Union, Ken., where he played as a junior and a senior (played as a freshman and sophomore at Hazard High School in Hazard, Kentucky) before enrolling at Minnesota in January 2017. Morgan is one of only a few Kentucky high school quarterbacks to pass for more than 10,000 yards in his career. As a senior, he passed for 2,747 yards and 27 touchdowns as team finished with a 12-1 record and reached the 6-A state quarterfinals. Morgan was named a finalist for Kentucky's Mr. Football award. Morgan made his collegiate debut against New Mexico State and also played against Miami. Morgan's cousin Tim Couch played for Kentucky and spent five seasons with the Cleveland Browns.

RUNNING BACKS

- Senior running back Rodney Smith sustained an injury in the first quarter of the Fresno State game that will sideline him for the rest of the season. Minnesota will file a waiver for a sixth year of eligibility for Smith with the NCAA at the conclusion of the season. In two games this year, Smith rushed for 154 yards on 25 carries and also added 32 receiving yards and 37 kick return yards. Smith is one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold. In 39 career games, he has rushed 651 times (fifth all-time in school history) for 2,959 yards (seventh all-time in school history) and scored 21 career rushing touchdowns (tied for ninth in school history). His 4,073 all-purpose yards (2,959 rushing, 451 receiving and 663 kick return) ranks seventh in school history.
- The injury to Rodney Smith means there are only two healthy seniors on offense in linemen Donnell Greene and Jared Weyler. Smith joins the electric Shannon Brooks on the sideline, as Brooks is recovering from an injury sustained in February. Redshirt freshman Mohamed Ibrahim missed the Fresno State and Miami games with an injury. Ibrahim returned at Maryland and gained 95 yards on 26 carries. He also rushed for 101 yards on nine carries against New Mexico State to become the first Gopher to rush for 100 yards or more in his collegiate debut since Thomas Hamner piled up 158 yards in a 30-3 win against NE Louisiana (now ULM) in 1996.
- True freshman Bryce Williams, who may have redshirted this season if Rodney Smith and Shannon Brooks were healthy, has played in all five games this year. Williams has rushed 79 times for 311 yards and has scored one touchdown. He carried the ball 33 times for 141 yards against Miami and also caught one pass for 35 yards to total 176 all-purpose yards. His 141 rushing yards were the most by a Gopher freshman since Brooks rushed for 174 yards and three touchdowns against Illinois in 2015.

WILDCAT SUCCESS

The Gophers have utilized Seth Green as a Wildcat quarterback this year and he has rushed for five touchdowns out of the formation so far. Green also converted a two-point try to Ko Kieft against Fresno State and tossed his first career touchdown - a 7-yard strike to Tyler Johnson - against Miami. Green started his Gopher career as a quarterback, but changed positions late in spring 2018 to tight end and is now transitioning to wide receiver. He has the ability to run, throw or catch a touchdown. The last Gopher to do that in one season was running back Duane Bennett who accomplished the feat in 2010. Current Minnesota running back Shannon Brooks, who will miss the early part of the season with an injury, has also rushed, passed and thrown for a touchdown, but not in the same season.

STAR POWER

- ▶ Tyler Johnson is a star. The Minneapolis native exploded onto the scene last year with 35 catches for 677 yards and seven touchdowns. Through five games this season, he has hauled in 28 (fifth in B1G) balls for 402 yards (tied for fourth in B1G) and six scores (second in B1G). Johnson has 77 career catches for 1,220 yards (19th in school history) and 14 touchdowns (tied for ninth all-time). His six career 100-yard games are tied for fourth in school history. He has three 100-yard receiving games this year and the last Gopher to have four 100-yard games in a season was Eric Decker in 2009.
- ▶ Tyler Johnson's 677 receiving yards last season were the fifth most ever by a Minnesota sophomore and that was despite missing the final two games with an injury. His seven receiving touchdowns were the second most ever by a sophomore. To crack the top five as a junior he will need 60 catches and 822 yards. Ron Johnson's 11 touchdowns as a junior is first in school history.
- Tyler Johnson caught three touchdowns against Miami tying his career high. He also caught three (all in fourth quarter) last year against Michigan State. Johnson is the second Gopher to catch three touchdowns in a game twice, joining Da'Jon McKnight (2010 vs. Penn State and 2011 at Michigan State).

CATCHING ON

- After Tyler Johnson, three freshman highlight the receiving game for Minnesota. Four-star recruit and true freshman Rashod Bateman has 27 catches for 257 yards and three touchdowns. He caught his first career touchdown - a 17-yard completion from Zack Annexstad at Maryland - to become the first Gopher receiver not named Tyler Johnson to catch a touchdown since Drew Wolitarsky did so against Wisconsin in 2016 (span of 16 games). Bateman added to touchdowns against Iowa. Redshirt freshman Chris Autman-Bell is a sure-handed target who has made 14 catches for 220 vards. He redshirted last season after suffering an injury in training camp, but is now finding his footing. He leads the receivers with a 15.71 average per catch. Demetrius Douglas played in the first three games in 2017 before suffering an injury that kept him out the rest of the season. He was granted a medical hardship waiver from the NCAA and including this year has four years of eligibility remaining. He made 11 catches for 83 yards in his limited action last season and has one catch for four yards this year. His father, Omar, played at Minnesota from 1990-93 and ranks tied for eighth in receptions (130), tied for ninth in receiving touchdowns (14) and tenth in school history in receiving yards (1,681). Omar, owns school record for touchdowns in a game with five (Oct. 9, 1993 vs. Purdue) and spent four years in the NFL with the New York Giants.
- ▶ With three freshman receivers expected to see significant playing time, let's take a quick look at freshman receiving records. The most receptions by a freshman in school history is 38 (Ron Johnson, 1998), while the most receiving yards is 654 (Ernie Wheelwright, 2004) and touchdowns is seven (Ernie Wheelwright, 2004).

KEEP AWAY

► The ball is the program. Minnesota ranks third in the Big Ten in time of possession at 33:11.

BALANCE

- ▶ Rodney Smith (153 yards) and Mohamed Ibrahim (101 yards) both eclipsed the 100-yard mark against New Mexico State. Tyler Johnson also had 100 yards receiving for the Gophers. It was the first time that Minnesota had two players rush for 100 yards and one player total 100 receiving yards since 2016 at Penn State. In that game, Smith (104 yards) and Shannon Brooks (100 yards) both rushed for 100 yards, while Brian Smith had 101 receiving yards.
- Minnesota passed for 227 yards and rushed for 295 against New Mexico State. It was the first time since Nov. 5, 2016, against Purdue (span of 16 games) that Minnesota eclipsed the 200 yard mark in both passing and rushing in the same game. Versus Purdue, Minnesota passed for 231 yards and rushed for 235.

A LOT OF CHOCOLATE MILK

- ▶ Up front the Gophers feature a mix of experience and youth, as Minnesota has started two upperclassmen and three underclassmen on the offensive line.
- As a fifth-year senior, Jared Weyler is the most tenured of the group, but Donnell Greene has actually played the most football for the Gophers. Greene, who joined Minnesota as a junior college transfer in 2016, has started 24 of his 30 career games. He started 11 of 12 games in 2017 and the final eight of 2016. He was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention last season and has started all five games this year.
- ▶ Jared Weyler is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List for the second straight year. He has started at center in all five games this year, a position that he started six games for Minnesota at last season but also missed six games due to an injury. Weyler has already earned a minor in Leadership and his undergraduate degree, as he double majored in Accounting and Entrepreneurial Management. He is prepping for an upcoming CPA exam.
- Conner Olson started all 12 games (six at center, six at right guard) last season as a redshirt freshman, but s playing guard this year. The Monticello, Minn. native was 240 pounds when he was recruited and has since upped his frame to 300 pounds. He credits his weight gain to chocolate milk and peanut butter sandwiches.
- ➤ Two more Minnesotans in sophomore Sam Schlueter (Victoria) and redshirt freshman Blaise Andries (Marshall) have started all five games this year. Schlueter played in 10 games and started the final six last year. Andries, who is an aspiring actuary, was a touted recruit and made his collegiate debut this year.
- ▶ Daniel Faalele, who is 6-8 and 400 pounds, replaced Schlueter at tackle to start the second half against lowa. The massive true freshman from Australia has now played in two games this year. He is still quite new to American football. Faalele attended IMG Academy in Orlando in 2016 and 2017. He only practiced in 2016, but then played in 2017 so this season is his second year of playing football. Ever.

FRESHMEN FOCUS

The new redshirt rule – where players can compete in four games and still redshirt – enabled Minnesota to play 68 players in its season-opening game against New Mexico State. Twenty-eight of those 68 were freshmen and 16 (7 on offense and 9 on defense) were true freshmen. The following eight true freshmen have played in five games and will not redshirt: Zack Annexstad, Rashod Bateman, Jordan Howden, Max Janes, Thomas Rush, Benny Sapp, Terell Smith and Bryce Williams. Minnesota started six freshmen on offense against Iowa in Blaise Andries (OL), Zack Annexstad (QB), Chris Autman-Bell (WR), Rashod Bateman (WR), Demetrius Douglas (WR) and Mohamed Ibrahim (RB). On defense, Minnesota started true freshman Terell Smith (DB).

SQUEAKY CLEAN

- Minnesota was whistled for just two penalties against lowa. That has been a staple of Coach Fleck's teams and this season is no different. The Gophers rank No. 6 in the country with only 20 penalties this season. They rank No. 11 in the NCAA with just 199 penalty yards. The Gophers were called for nine penalties against New Mexico State, but have since been penalized only 11 times in the last four games.
- ► The Gophers ranked first in the nation last season Fleck's first as coach in fewest penalties (39), fewest penalties per game (3.25), fewest penalty yards (340) and fewest penalty yards per game (28.33). It was a sharp contrast from 2016 when Minnesota ranked 91st in fewest penalties (88), 89th in fewest penalties per game (6.77), 86th in fewest penalty yards (743) and 80th in fewest penalty yards per game (57.15). Minnesota committed 49 fewer penalties in 2017 than 2016 and the difference in yards penalized was 403.
- Nobody has been more impressive in that area than Thomas Barber. He does not have a single defensive penalty in his entire career despite seeing almost every single defensive snap as the "Mike" linebacker the past two seasons. According to Pro Football Focus, he has played 1,014 defensive snaps (24 in 2016, 747 in 2017 and 243 in 2018) in college. The only penalty of his career came on a special teams play when he was called for holding against Northwestern as a freshman in 2016.

POINTS

- Minnesota scored 28 points in the second quarter and 35 in the first half against New Mexico State. The 28 points were the most scored in a quarter since 2015 when the Gophers rang up 28 third-quarter points at Purdue and the 35 points were the most in the first half for Minnesota since it totaled 38 in the first half against Indiana State in 2016.
- Minnesota's 38-point margin of victory (won 48-10) against New Mexico State was the largest ever for the Gophers at TCF Bank Stadium. Minnesota had previously beaten lowa (2014) and New Hampshire (2012) by 37 points at TCF Bank Stadium. The 38-point win was also Minnesota's largest margin of victory since 2006, when it topped Temple 62-0 at home.
- Minnesota scored 31 points against lowa in a loss this year. The 31 points were the most by Minnesota is a loss since it fell 40-35 at No. 8 lowa in 2015.

SALTY AND STINGY

Minnesota allowed only three points to Miami and did not allow a point in the second half. It was the third time this year that Minnesota held an opponent scoreless in a half. The Gophers did not allow a point to Fresno State in the first half. The last time that happened was Nov. 19, 2016, against Northwestern. Minnesota also did not allow a point to New Mexico State in the second half. Between its first two games, the Gophers did not allow a point for 88 minutes and 50 seconds. New Mexico State scored a touchdown with 14:10 remaining in the second quarter and Fresno State scored with 20 seconds left in the third. Minnesota has now held an opponent scoreless six times in a half in 17 games under Coach Fleck.

- ► The Gophers rank No. 21 in NCAA and No. 3 in the Big Ten in total defense (324.2 yards per game). Minnesota is also 35th in team passing efficiency defense (116.7) and No. 3 in the Big Ten.
- Minnesota did not allow 100 yards rushing in any nonconference game. The Gophers held Miami to 91 rushing yards after stifling Fresno State (87 rushing yards) and New Mexico State (38 rushing yards). They also held an Iowa team that was averaging 167.3 yards rushing per game to 106 yards allowing an average of just 2.7 yards per carry.

TOM-BOMB

Thomas Barber emerged as a breakout star last season. The legacy Gopher started all 12 games and finished first on the team with 115 tackles to rank third in the Big Ten and tied for 20th in the nation. The junior linebacker is well on his way to another strong season in 2018. He had eight tackles including a team leading seven solo tackles against Miami. He also notched one for a loss that resulted in a safety. He recorded another seven tackles against Maryland and hit double digits with 10 tackles including one for a loss against lowa. On top of that he scooped up a fumble and took it down to the seven-yard line. He has 33 tackles, one interception and one fumble recovery so far this year. Thomas Barber does not have a single defensive penalty in his entire career despite seeing almost every single defensive snap as the "Mike" linebacker the past two season (See Squeaky Clean note above for more info). Last year, 76 of Barber's 115 tackles - or 66% of his total tackles were solo. His 76 solo stops ranked first in the Big Ten and tied for seventh nationally. Baber's 66% solo tackle rate ranked third in the nation.

SACKED BY COUGHLIN

Carter Coughlin has five sacks (tied for first in the Big Ten) this season after recording a team leading 6.5 last year. He also has 6.5 tackles for loss after recording a team leading 11.5 last season. His sack against lowa caused a fumble in the red zone that Minnesota would turn into a touchdown. Coughlin has nine sacks in his last 11 games. He may be undersized at 245 pounds, but his speed has caused fits for offensive lineman since he transitioned from linebacker to a rush end role last season. His 13.5 career sacks have him 9th all-time in Gophers history. He also has 22 tackles for loss in his career.

IT'S T-TIME

True freshman Terell Smith has 27 tackles, six pass breakups and one interception this year. His six pass breakups is already more than any Gopher had in 2017. Smith brings elite speed to the team, as he won the Georgia State Championship in the 100m (10.39) as a junior and the 200m (21.26) as a sophomore. His personal record in the 100m is 10.32 and in the 200m is 20.84, which made him the fastest Big Ten corner commit since 2010.

STRAIGHT CASH HOMEY

▶ Blake Cashman has made his money on special teams throughout his career but he has been a dynamic playmaker on defense for the Gophers this year. He leads the team with 34 tackles and is tied for a team leading 6.5 tackles for loss. He tied a TCF Bank Stadium record with four tackles for loss against New Mexico State. Pro Football Focus charted him with five total quarterback hurries on just eight passrush snaps. Cashman would add a sack and a pass breakup and then notched 10 tackles against Fresno State. The senior finished last season with 30 tackles including five for a loss and two sacks. As a sophomore he recorded 45 tackles with a team leading 7.5 sacks and one forced fumble. He was named the 2017 Holiday Bowl Defensive Most Valuable Player and is a two-time winner of the team's Gary Tinsley Award, as the player who best embodied the underdog spirit of the late Gary Tinsley. He has 10.5 career sacks and 22.5 tackles for loss, both of which are closing in on top-10 marks in school history.

REPLACING WINFIELD

- Antoine Winfield Jr. was granted a medical hardship by the NCAA in 2017 and was off to a spectacular 2018 season before suffering an injury on the first drive of the game against Maryland. He started the season with two viral moments. He helped swing the game against New Mexico State by taking his first ever punt return 76 yards to the house and made an interception in the end zone to beat Fresno State.
- ▶ Senior defensive back Antonio Shenault moved to safety against while fellow senior Jacob Huff holds down the other safety spot. Shenault and Huff both have 38 games of experience under their belts. Shenault has 22 tackles this year and 1.5 tackles for loss, one forced fumble and one interception. Huff leads the team with 22 solo stops and is third on the team with 32 tackles. He also helped Minnesota score late in the first half against lowa by returning an interception 21 yards to the 6-yard line. He also has two pass breakups and one forced fumble.

A CARPENTER'S PRECISION

- Emmit Carpenter's 44 career field goals ranks tied for third in school history with Paul Rogind. He has made 44-of-53 career field goals and his 83.0 field goal conversion rate ranks first in program history. Carpenter has made 28-of-36 field goals at TCF Bank Stadium, 15-of-16 on the road and 1-of-1 in neutral-site games. Carpenter is 38-of-47 on FieldTurf and is a perfect 6of-6 on natural grass. In addition, he has made 89-of-90 career point-after attempts, which includes a current streak of 52. Two more made point-after attempts will tie Carpenter with former Gopher Ryan Santoso at third all-time with 54 straight point-after attempt. Rogind is second (57), while Dan Nystrom is first (83).
- ▶ Emmit Carpenter has made 83 percent of his career field goals (44-of-53), which ranks second all-time in Big Ten history. Northwestern's Jeff Budzien, who played from 2010-13, is first at 87.3 percent. Budzien made 48-of-55 career field goals. Ohio State's Mike Nugent, who played from 2001-04, is third at 81.8 percent. Nugent made 72-of-88 field goals.

- Through five games, Emmit Carpenter has made 8-of-9 field goal and all 17 point-after attempts. He now has 221 career points as he has made 89 PATs and 44 field goals. Carpenter's 221 points ranks him third among kickers all time and fourth among all players.
- ▶ Entering this week's Ohio State game, Carpenter has made six straight field goals (53, 50, 44, 33, 41, 49) and if he makes his next one he will become only the second Gopher in history to have three streaks of consecutive made field goals of seven or more. In 2016, Carpenter had made streaks of 12 and nine. Dan Nystrom is currently the only Gopher with three streaks of seven-straight made field goals. He ended his career with streaks of 16, 14 and 13.
 - Against Fresno State, Emmit Carpenter connected on field goals from 50 and 53 yards. The 53-yard kick tied his career-long, as he also made a 53-yarder during the second half of the 44-31 win against Purdue in 2016. It was the second time in his career he's made two field goals greater than 50 yards. He was good from 52 and 53 versus Purdue in 2016. Adam Bailey is the only other Minnesota kicker with two field goals from 50-plus yards (52, 50) in the same game (vs. Pen State in 1997 indoors at the Metrodome).
 - In 2017, Carpenter made 14-of-20 field goals and was a perfect 31-of-31 on point-after attempts. He led Minnesota with 73 points and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention. In 2016, Carpenter was named the Big Ten's Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year (first Gopher to be honored with this award), after making 22-of-24 field goals. He was named All-Big Ten First Team (media) and All-Big Ten Second Team (coaches). Carpenter totaled 109 points, which tied Dan Nystrom (109 points in 2000) for most all-time by a Minnesota kicker. Carpenter's 109 points also ranks tied for second all-time with Nystrom for any Gopher behind Gary Russell (114 points in 2005) and he finished fifth in the Big Ten scoring race that season. Carpenter made his first nine field goals (tied for sixth longest streak in school history) to start the year and ended the season with 12 consecutive made field goals (fourth longest streak in school history). He was a perfect 10-of-10 on field goals from 40 yards or greater and was the only kicker in the nation - minimum six kicks - to do that (8-of-8 from 40-49 yards and 2-of-2 from 50-plus yards).
- Emmit Carpenter is one of 30 kickers on the watch list for the Lou Groza Award and is one of 30 semifinalists for the Senior Class Award. He has also been named CoSida Academic All-District twice and has received the team's Tony Dungy Character and Community Service Award.

SPECIAL BROTHERHOOD

The Gophers are in the third straight season of having the same long snapper (Payton Jordahl), holder (Jacob Herbers) and kicker (Emmit Carpenter). Jordahl has snapped 439 times in his career (245 punt, 120 PATs and 74 FGs) and has made 10 tackles. Herbers is on the Mortell Holder of the Year watch list. He is averaging 41.54 yards on 26 punts and has placed 10 inside the 20. Minnesota has yielded only 12 punt return yards this year. Not bad for an Eagle Scout and mechanical engineering major. Carpenter, as previously mentioned, is an amazing person and kicker.

YOU'RE ON SCHOLARSHIP

- Nobody gives away a scholarship like Minnesota coach P.J. Fleck. The effervescent Gopher coach certainly has a flair for the dramatic when it comes to scholarship surprises, but he also ensures that the moment is one that is memorable for the individual receiving the scholarship.
- Since Fleck was hired on Jan. 6, 2017, he has awarded eight scholarships to walk-ons with two coming this past fall camp and one after Minnesota's win against New Mexico State. Bailey Schoenfelder was awarded a scholarship after two Navy Seals parachuted onto the field and delivered a letter to Fleck. Brock Annexstad received a scholarship when his brother. starting guarterback Zack, pretended to reveal a tattoo to the team that showed the words, "Brock, you are on scholarship." After Minnesota beat New Mexico State, Fleck awarded scholarship to Calvin Swenson while he was addressing the team in the locker room. In addition to Schoenfelder, Annexstad and Swenson, Fleck had previously given scholarships to walk-ons Sam Renner, Blake Cashman, Emmit Carpenter, Justin Juenemann, and Conor Rhoda.

DEGREE IN HAND

Minnesota has eight players who have already earned their degree. They are Jerry Gibson, Payton Jordahl, Gary Moore, Rodney Smith, Jared Weyler, Julian Huff, Sam Renner and Alex Melvin.

SERVING AND GIVING

▶ P.J. Fleck and the Gophers routinely visit the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital to lift the spirits of patients and staff. This year, Fleck opened up three fall practices to the public. One of those practices was a F.A.M.I.L.Y Day practice. There the Gophers hosted their second annual diaper drive and collected 15,750 diapers. In two years, Minnesota has collected 29,296 diapers. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and turkey drive.

NEW COACHES

- Head coach P.J. Fleck promoted Joe Rossi from quality control assistant to defensive line coach this past offseason. He also hired Clay Patterson (tight ends), Jahmile Addae (defensive back) and Marcus West (defensive line pass rush specialist).
- Joe Rossi joined the staff in January 2017 and was named defensive line coach in January 2018. Rossi spent 2012-15 at Rutgers, which included two years as defensive coordinator. Rossi was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2014 after serving in an interim role in 2013 and held the role until after 2015.
- ➤ Clay Patterson joined the Minnesota coaching staff in January 2018 after serving as head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M for two seasons. The Morris, Okla., native led the Norseman to a 9-3 record in 2017 after going 5-5 in 2016. In 2017, the program claimed its first Southwest Junior College Football Conference (SWJCFC) championship since 2003 and played in its first bowl game since 2012. Patterson earned conference coach of the year honors as his team averaged 524.5 yards per game (253.8 rushing and 270.6 passing) and 36.2 points per game.
- Jahmile Addae coached Arizona defensive backs in

2016-17 after working for the team as an analyst from 2013-15. At Arizona, Addae helped develop Arizona's young defensive backs into top performers. Four of Arizona's leading tacklers were in the secondary in 2017 and that quartet combined for 261 tackles, 24 breakups and 12 interceptions.

Marcus West joined the Minnesota coaching staff in February 2018. He came to Minnesota after two seasons at Austin Peay. While with the Governors, West was the assistant head coach, co-defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. In 2017, Austin Peay – which was a combined 1-45 from 2013-16 – posted an 8-4 record. The eight wins tied a program record and the team's seven conference wins were a program record. The defense, led by West, held its opponents to 24.8 points per game (fifth-best in the OVC), which is impressive considering the Governors gave up 73 points at UCF. Excluding UCF, Austin Peay gave up 20.3 points per game in 11 games and gave up only 16.6 points per game in its eight wins.

TCF BANK STADIUM

▶ In addition to college football, TCF Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) played season at TCF Bank Stadium, while their new stadiums were being constructed.

PLAYING AT HOME

- Minnesota is 39-28 all-time at TCF Bank Stadium. Minnesota is 11 games over .500 at TCF Bank Stadium, which is its second best mark at the stadium. The Gophers were 12 games over .500 at the stadium prior to losing to lowa this year. The Gophers opened the on-campus facility with a 20-13 win against Air Force on Sept. 12, 2009, but then dropped to 7-13 at home after 20 games. Since then (Nov. 26, 2011), Minnesota has compiled a 32-15 record at home, which translates to a 68.1 winning percentage.
- Minnesota is 22-7 at TCF Bank Stadium in non-conference games. However, the Gophers are 19-1 in their last 20 non-conference games and have won nine in a row. Minnesota's last home loss to a non-conference opponent was to No. 2 TCU in 2015.
- ▶ In 67 games at TCF Bank Stadium, the Gophers average 27.0 points per game and allow an average of 24.2. In non-conference games, Minnesota averages 29.1 points per game and give up an average of 19.7. Under Fleck, Minnesota is 7-4 at home and has averaged 27.8 points per game and has allowed an average of 19.5. In five non-conference games, those numbers are 29.2 points per game for and 7.4 points per game against.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

Minnesota has won seven national championships and 18 Big Ten titles. Minnesota's first national championship came in 1904 when it outscored the opposition 725-12 en route to a 13-0 record. Bernie Bierman would lead Minnesota to national titles in 1934, 1935, 1936, 1940 and 1941. The Gophers also won a national title in 1960 under Murray Warmath.
