OPENING TIP-OFF

• No. 25 Minnesota women's basketball takes to the road for the first time this season as it visits Xavier Wednesday night. The game will be available to view online at GoXavier.com for free and can be heard on the Gophers' new radio home, 96.7 FM KFAN Plus.

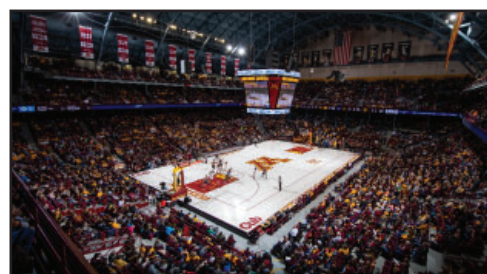
• Sitting 1-0 on the season, Minnesota enters Wednesday night's game ranked No. 25 in the AP Poll. It's the first time the Golden Gophers have been ranked since Jan. 19, 2015, when they were No. 21, and it's just the fourth time overall since the 2005-06 season. Head coach **Lindsay Whalen** is now the 39th person in women's basketball history to be ranked as both a player and a coach and the 12th do it at the same school. The Golden Gophers were ranked for the last eight weeks of Whalen's sophomore season as well her entire junior and senior years.

• Minnesota opened the 2018-19 season with a 70-47 win over New Hampshire on Nov. 9. The announced sellout crowd of 14,625 was a program record, surpassing the previous high of 14,363 set during Whalen's senior season in 2004. Four of the top five marks in team history, and eight of the top 10, have now occurred with Whalen as either a player or coach.

• A career-high 21 points from senior **Annalese Lamke** and a double-double of 14 points and 14 rebounds from junior **Taiye Bello** complemented a strong defensive effort as Minnesota captured an 80-47 win over New Hampshire in Whalen's head coaching debut last Friday. Minnesota has now won 10 straight season openers and 17 of its last 18 such games. The team has also prevailed in 19 straight home openers.

• Minnesota has won five straight road openers and is 18-27 in such games dating back to 1973-74.

• The Golden Gophers are looking to start 2-0 for the seventh straight season. A win Wednesday would also make Whalen the fifth coach in Gophers' history to win her first two games. The record belongs to Pam Borton, who won her first 12 games during the 2002-03 season, Whalen's junior season.



A record crowd of 14,625 saw the Gophers beat New Hampshire in the 2018-19 season opener.

SERIES WITH XAVIER

- Minnesota and Xavier each have one win in their series history. The Musketeers won the first ever meeting at the 2009 Junkanoo Jam in the Bahamas, while the Golden Gophers secured the win last year in Minneapolis.
- Last season, the Golden Gophers rallied from an 11-point deficit to beat Xavier 74-62 to start a season 5-0 for the first time in 10 years. Trailing 40-32 at the half, Minnesota rallied to a 57-51 lead by the end of the third quarter. The Gopher defense held the Musketeers to 22 points and forced 12 turnovers in the second half. Then-senior Carlie Wagner led the team with 24 points, while then-junior Kenisha Bell scored 20, including 15 points in the second half, and distributed seven assists.

LAMKE HAS CAREER NIGHT IN SEASON OPENER

- After scoring 18 points all of last season, senior Anna-lesse Lamke exploded for a career-high 21 in the Gophers' season-opening win over New Hampshire.

Lamke scored 17 points alone in the second half and recorded an efficient 9-of-12 shooting. In addition to career highs in points, field goals made and field goals attempted, she also added a career-high three made throws, five rebounds and two steals.

GOPHERS RECEIVE VOTES IN PRESEASON POLLS

- Minnesota received votes in both the preseason AP and USA Today Coaches Poll. The last time that happened was in 2005-06 when the Gophers began the year ranked 16th and 17th, respectively, in the polls.
- The Golden Gophers were the top team to receive votes in the AP Poll, placing them 26th in the country. It was the 8th time in program history Minnesota appeared in the AP Preseason Poll and the first since also receiving votes in 2015-16.
- Minnesota garnered 12 points in the Coaches Poll to tie Florida Gulf Coast for 33rd. Like the AP Poll, it was also the 8th time in program history Minnesota appeared in the Coaches Preseason Poll and the first since also receiving votes in 2013-14.
- Eight of the Gophers' opponents this season appeared in at least one of the two preseason polls. Maryland (9 AP/10 Coaches), Iowa (13/17) and Syracuse (18/18) were ranked in both polls. Michigan received votes in each poll, while Illinois, Michigan State, Nebraska and Ohio State received votes in one of the two polls.

MINNESOTA PICKED THIRD BY BIG TEN MEDIA

- Minnesota came in the third in the Big Ten media's preseason rankings behind No. 1 Maryland and No. 2 Iowa. The latter two teams were also picked in those same spots by the league's coaches, while Michigan was ranked third. Only the top three teams are announced.

- Bell was one off 11 student-athletes to be recognized by both the media and league's coaches on their respective Preseason All-Big Ten Teams. She was a unanimous selection by the coaches and was joined by Pitts on the media's preseason team.

- It was the first time the Gophers had multiple pre-season conference honorees since the 2014-15 season when Rachel Banham and Amanda Zahui B. did it.

BELL, PITTS LAND ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

- Kenisha Bell was one of 20 student-athletes, including one of three from the Big Ten, to be added to the watch list for the 2019 Nancy Lieberman Award, given annually to the nation's top point guard.
- Bell was also one of 50 named to the watch list for the Citizen Naismith Trophy Women's Player of the Year.
- Destiny Pitts was one of 20 student-athletes, including one of two from the Big Ten, to be added to the watch list for the 2019 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award, given annually to the nation's top shooting guard.

BELL POISED FOR STRONG SENIOR SEASON

- Kenisha Bell entered the 2018-19 season as the Gophers' top returning scorer at 20.0 points and 6.8 assists per game.
- Bell was one of the most versatile players in the country last season. She led the Big Ten in assists/game and total steals (85), ranking ninth and 28th, respectively in those categories nationally.
- In addition to ranking ninth in assists/game, Bell also ranked 28th in scoring average (20.0), making her one of only two players in the country to rank in the top 30 of each category along with Oklahoma State's Loryn Goodwin, who finished 20th in scoring average and 30th in assists per game.
- With 21 points vs. Maryland on Feb. 18 last season, Bell became the 24th player in school history to reach 1,000 points. She currently has 1,160 points as a Gopher to rank 17th in program history.

PITTS THE REIGNING BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

- Sophomore Destiny Pitts is looking to build on her tremendous debut season when she was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year.
- She was the fourth player in Minnesota history to be named Freshman of the Year by the league and the third in the last seven years along with Rachel Banham in 2012 and Amanda Zahui B. in 2014.
- Pitts was also placed on the All-Big Ten Freshman Team and earned All-Big Ten Honorable Mention recognition by the league's coaches, while the media selected her for the All-Big Ten Second Team.

- Pitts was named B1G Freshman of the Week a league-best seven times, a number that tied her with Zahui B. for the most in Minnesota history. Pitts was also one of just five players in league history to reach that number.
- The USBWA National Freshman of the Week on Feb. 13, Pitts averaged 13.3 points and a team-best 7.2 rebounds per game this year.
- Pitts' 90 made 3-pointers last year were a Minnesota freshman record and the fourth most in a season for a Gopher. She also had the fourth most 3-point attempts (231) and the eighth most defensive rebounds (190).

- Minnesota welcomes three freshmen to its roster in 2018-19 in forward Delanyie Byrne, guard Mercedes Staples and forward/center Barbora Tomancova.
- A forward from Arvada, Colo., Byrne was the No. 21 ranked forward according to ESPN. She finished her prep career at Ralston Valley High School, where she sat out one season due to transfer rules. Previously, she averaged 13.6 points and 6.7 rebounds per game as a sophomore at Broomfield High School.
- A point guard from Centerville, Utah, Staples was a four-star recruit according to ESPN.com. She was rated by the site as the No. 64 player in the 2018 class and the No. 17 point guard after she averaged 22.4 points, 4.3 assists, 3.8 rebounds and 2.8 steals per game this past season, helping Viewmont High School reach the Class 5A quarterfinals. She was named Class 5A First Team All-State by the Salt Lake Tribune and to the ALL-USA Utah Girls Basketball Team by USA Today.

- **Gadiva Hubbard:** Cousin, Briante Weber, played at VCU and has spent time with five different NBA teams
- **Palma Kaposi:** First player in Gophers history from Hungary; already graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in agriculture business and is working toward a second degree of a Bachelor of Arts in economics
- **Annalese Lamke:** Shows cows at livestock competitions in her spare time; brother, Chandler, played football at the University of St. Thomas in Saint Paul; mother, Donna, competed in basketball and track/field at UW-La Crosse
- **Destiny Pitts:** Won two state championships in high school
- **Mercedes Staples:** First player from Utah in Gophers history; A four-star recruit according to ESPN.com, rated by the site as the No. 64 player in the 2018 class and the No. 17 point guard
- **Barbora Tomancova:** First player from the Czech Republic in Gophers history
- **Danielle O'Banion:** Previously served as assistant coach for Minnesota during its best five-season run in school history from 2002-03 to 2006-07; presented the USBWA Pat Summitt Most Courageous Award for women's basketball for her fight against cancer. She was diagnosed with Stage 2 lymphoma cancer in 2014 and went through a series of chemotherapy treatments. Six months after being diagnosed, O'Banion announced on Twitter that the cancer had gone into remission. She entered the 2015-16 season cancer free and still is to this day.
- **Kelly Roysland:** Was a freshman on the 2004 Final Four team, which was Lindsay Whalen's senior season
- **Carly Thibault-DuDonis:** Father, Mike, currently coaches the Washington Mystics in the WNBA; was the head coach of the Connecticut Sun when the team drafted Lindsay Whalen in 2004

- Tomancova played domestically for Zabiny Brno in the Czech Republic's ZBL and competed on the international level for her home country. She averaged 4.9 points and 3.6 rebounds, highlighted by 16 points against Bosnia and Herzegovina and 10 points versus Sweden, to help the Czech Republic to a fourth place finish at the 2017 FIBA U18 Women's European Championship.

MEET THE ASSISTANTS: DANIELLE O'BANION

- Danielle O'Banion is in her second stint as a Gophers' assistant. She was an assistant coach for the Golden Gophers during its best five-season run in school history from 2002-03 to 2006-07, working with the backcourt that included current head coach Lindsay Whalen.
- In her previous tenure, Minnesota posted five straight winning seasons, including three 25-win campaigns. The Golden Gophers earned postseason berths all five seasons, including four-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances from 2003-06. Minnesota advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen in 2003 and 2005 and made the program's first and only Women's Final Four in 2004.
- O'Banion returns to Minnesota after the second of two stints at the University of Memphis, where she served as associate head coach. Previously, she was at Memphis from 2008-12. She was as an assistant her first two seasons, before being promoted to associate head coach following the 2009-10 campaign.
- Following the 2011-12 campaign with Memphis, O'Banion spent four seasons (2012-16) as Kent State's head coach.
- As a student-athlete, O'Banion helped lead Boston College to the program's first two NCAA Tournament berths in 1999 and 2000.

MEET THE ASSISTANTS: CARLY THIBAUT-DUDONIS

- Carly Thibault-DuDonis comes to Minnesota after spending the last two seasons on the Mississippi State coaching staff where she helped the Bulldogs to the Final Four and national title game in both of her seasons.
- Thibault-DuDonis joined the Bulldogs after two seasons on the staff at Eastern Michigan and one season as the Director of Recruiting Operations at Florida State.

MEET THE ASSISTANTS: KELLY ROYSLAND

- Kelly Roysland returns to the Golden Gophers after spending the past four seasons as the Macalester (St. Paul) head women's basketball coach. Prior to that, Roysland served as the interim head coach (2014) and an assistant coach at the University of Minnesota for four seasons (2010-14).

- While at Minnesota, Roysland worked with the Gophers' guards, as well as having responsibilities with scouting and recruiting. She helped guide the team's guards to numerous accolades, including All-Big Ten honors six times, as well as earning WBCA All-Region and WBCA Honorable Mention All-America honors.

- Prior to returning to Minnesota, Roysland was an assistant coach at North Dakota State for two years.

- A native of Fosston, Minn., Roysland was a four-year letterwinner in basketball for the Gophers from 2004-07, joining Lindsay Whalen on the team's run to the 2004 Final Four and serving as a team captain as a senior. Roysland also played one year of volleyball as a fifth-year senior in 2007.

CIAO! GOPHERS SPEND WEEK IN ITALY

- For just the second time in program history, Minnesota embarked on a foreign trip as it traveled to Italy, August 8-16, 2018. Per NCAA rules, college teams are allowed to make an international trip once every four years. Additionally, the team was allotted an extra 10 practices in preparation for the trip.

- The trip began in Rome, which included tours of the Colosseum and Vatican City. From there, the Gophers went to Florence. Among the sights seen were Michelangelo's "David" and the Old Bridge. The final stop was Venice and it's famous canals.

- The Gophers also played one game in each city. In addition to blowout wins in Rome and Venice, Minnesota got a game-winning buzzer beater from Destiny Pitts to secure a 65-63 win over German squad TK Hannover in Florence.

GOPHERS FIND NEW RADIO HOME IN 2018-19

- iHeartMedia Minneapolis announced in August that 96.7 FM has become KFAN Plus and will serve as the home of Minnesota women's basketball with Corbu Stathes and Lynnette Sjoquist returning as announcers.

- An expansion of KFAN 100.3, KFAN Plus will broadcast exclusively on HD Radio and can also be streamed digitally on iHeartRadio.

MINNEAPOLIS TO HOST FINAL FOUR IN 2022

- The NCAA announced on Sept. 24 that Minneapolis has been selected as the location for the Women's Final Four in 2022 with the University of Minnesota and Sports Minneapolis serving as co-hosts.

- Playing dates will be April 1 and 3 at Target Center. This will be the second time that Minneapolis has hosted the Women's Final Four, also doing so in 1995 at Target Center.

- The announcement adds to the list of championships held in the state in the years to come. Minnesota is also slated to host the 2018 Women's Volleyball Championship,

2017-18 RECAP

- One of the most successful seasons in program history saw Minnesota return to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in four years and reach the second round for the first time in nine seasons.

- The Golden Gophers finished 24-9, their most wins in 13 seasons. After tying for third in the conference standings at 11-5, the Gophers entered the B1G Tournament as the No. 4 seed and reached the semifinals for the second time ever.

- Kenisha Bell was named an honorable mention All-American by the Associated Press, giving the Gophers an AP All-American honoree in five of the last six seasons. Bell and Carlie Wagner were named All-Region Nominees for the 2018 WBCA NCAA Division I Coaches' All-America Team.

- Bell was also named to the All-Big Ten First Team by the league's coaches and was a unanimous selection by the media. It was the first time she received First Team honors after taking home honorable mention recognition the previous year. She was also placed on the coaches' All-Big Ten Defensive Team, the third Gopher to do so.

- Destiny Pitts was the fourth player in Minnesota history to be named B1G Freshman of the Year. Pitts was also placed on the All-Big Ten Freshman Team and earned All-Big Ten Honorable Mention recognition by the league's coaches, while the media selected her for the All-Big Ten Second Team.

HEAD COACH LINDSAY WHALEN FIRST SEASON · MINNESOTA, 2004



One of the most decorated players in women's basketball history, Lindsay Whalen returned to the University of Minnesota as the new head women's basketball coach at her alma mater on April 12, 2018.

"People talk about the 'it' factor, and that is always difficult to define, but everyone who has ever spent time around Lindsay Whalen knows she has it," said Director of Athletics Mark Coyle. "She has excelled at everything she has ever done in her life because she's unflappable, determined and has a legendary work ethic. She's played for some of the top coaches in the world, she's competed at the highest levels the sport has to offer, and I know she will be a great head coach for our women's basketball program."

"I have so many special memories at the University of Minnesota. I can't tell you how excited I am to have the opportunity to make more," said Whalen. "Becoming the head coach here at the U and being a Gopher again is a dream come true. At every level, basketball has given me so much. I've learned from so many great players, coaches and mentors, and now I have a chance to share that knowledge and help shape the new generation of Gopher stars. I'm ready to get started."

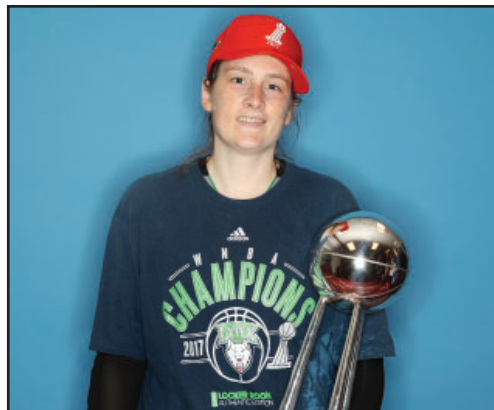
As part of Whalen's agreement to become head coach, she played one more season with the Minnesota Lynx, pulling double-duties as player and coach from April to August in 2018. Previously, Whalen announced in February that she was retiring from international competition. She had played for the U.S. National team since 2002, joining Team USA following her sophomore season with the Gophers.

Whalen returns to those same Gophers after destroying the program's record book in the early 2000s, finishing her career as Minnesota's all-time points leader, along with being second all-time in assists and third all-time in steals. A four-time all-state selection at Hutchinson High School, about an hour west of Minneapolis, Whalen went on to become the catalyst for the most successful seasons in the history of Gopher women's basketball.

She was the first three-time All-American in program history, a three-time All-Big Ten selection and a three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree. After a Sweet Sixteen appearance her junior season (2002-03), Whalen led the Gophers to their only Final Four in program history in 2004. Her jersey, No. 13, hangs in the rafters of Williams Arena.

Whalen went on to collect numerous honors and championships in the WNBA and with the U.S. National team. After playing five seasons with the Connecticut Sun, Whalen returned to her home state with the Minnesota Lynx and has since won four WNBA championships (2011, 2013, 2015, 2017). Whalen has been named All-WNBA five times and is currently third in WNBA history in assists, to go along with being in the top-20 in career points and steals. Last year, she became the winningest player in WNBA history, having now been a part of more than 300 wins in the league. She also played professionally in Turkey, Russia and the Czech Republic.

In international competition, Whalen was a key piece to dominant performances by Team USA in world championship and Olympic competition. Whalen played for two gold medal teams at the World Championships (2010, 2014) and has also won two Olympic gold medals (2012, 2016).
