BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

- The 38th season of Big Ten Conference women's basketball tips off Tuesday, with four conference schools in action and the remaining programs beginning their seasons later this week. All 14 Big Ten teams will also play at home at least once during the first week of the season, including three who will play host to nationally-ranked opponents (Ohio State vs. No. 22/21 USF on Tuesday, Northwestern vs. No. 21/20 Duke on Sunday live on BTN, and Penn State vs. No. 24 California, also on Sunday).
- The 2018-19 Big Ten season features 20 returning first-, second-team and honorable mention all-conference honorees from a year ago, including four first-team honorees, led by the 2017-18 Big Ten Player of the Year (as chosen by the media), Iowa's Megan Gustafson, the Big Ten Freshman of the Year in Minnesota's Destiny Pitts, and the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year in Purdue's Ae'rianna Harris, as well as three-fifths of the Big Ten All-Defensive Team.
- The Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame recently announced the preseason watch lists for its national player of the year awards at the five traditional court positions. No fewer than 13 Big Ten students from 10 different conference schools are represented on these watch lists, with the full rundown on page 2 of this release.
- Gustafson ranks third among returning Division I players (for 2018-19) in career points (1,803), while Michigan's Hallie Thome is 12th in that category (1,679). Gustafson is also second among returning Division I players in field goal percentage (.636) and Thome is sixth (.620), while Gustafson is tied for first among returning Division I players in double-doubles (55). In addition, Ohio State graduate transfer guard Carmen Grande is the nation's active leader with 697 assists.
- Eight Big Ten schools are ranked or receiving votes in the Associated Press or *USA Today*/WBCA polls, led by No. 9 (AP)/No. 10 (*USA Today*) Maryland. Iowa is also ranked in both polls at No. 13/17, while Michigan and Minnesota are receiving votes in both polls. In addition, Nebraska earned votes in the AP poll, while Illinois, Michigan State and Ohio State received votes in the coaches' balloting.
- Rutgers head coach C. Vivian Stringer begins her 48th season on the sidelines (and 24th "On The Banks" at Rutgers) in 2018-19, needing three wins to become the sixth women's basketball coach in NCAA history (and fifth Division I women's basketball coach) to record 1,000 career victories. Stringer has a 997-402 (.713) record during her Hall of Fame career, including a 477-267 (.641) record at RU.
- Minnesota begins a new era in 2018-19 under first-year head coach Lindsay Whalen. The former Golden Gopher All-America guard, 2002 Big Ten Player of the Year and three-time All-Big Ten honoree (who led Minnesota to the 2004 NCAA Women's Final Four) won four WNBA titles with the Minnesota Lynx, as well as four gold medals with the U.S. National Team (two at the Olympics, two at the World Championships). Whalen graduated from Minnesota in 2006 with her degree in Sport Studies, earning Academic All-America honors in 2003 and having been a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.
- Big Ten women's basketball programs produced 67 students that earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 2017-18, the 11th consecutive season at least 45 women's basketball students received the award.
- Big Ten schools will be featured on national television at least 78 times during the 2018-19 season. BTN will televise at least 69 games and ESPN2 will carry nine contests. In addition, for the fifth consecutive year, every Big Ten women's basketball conference game, including 126 regular-season contests and all 13 Big Ten Tournament games, will be produced and distributed by BTN, BTN Plus or an ESPN network.

The Big Ten Network also broadcast its 2018-19 B1G Women's Basketball Preview Special, an hour-long look at the upcoming Big Ten women's basketball season, which remains available at BTN2Go, the FOX Sports app and the Women's Basketball Week web page. For the third year in a row, the Big Ten was the only conference with a nationally-televised hour-long preseason women's basketball preview show.

PREMIER ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS

The Big Ten Academic Alliance is an academic consortium of all 14 Big Ten universities, which is widely considered to be the model for effective and voluntary collaboration among top research universities.

Every Big Ten Academic Alliance institution ranks among the top 70 universities in the nation according to the 2017 Academic Ranking of World Universities, including four in the top 25.

The Big Ten leads all conferences with more than 1,700 Academic All-Americans, including 34 honorees during the 2017-18 academic year.

Big Ten Academic Alliance schools annually conduct \$10 billion in funded research, \$5 billion more than any other conference.

A HISTORY OF ATHLETIC SUCCESS

Big Ten schools have won at least seven national championships in seven of the last 10 academic years and at least three in each of the last 25 years.

In the last five full academic years, current Big Ten institutions have claimed 31 team national championships in 15 different sports.

Over the last 12 full academic years, current Big Ten institutions have won 85 team national titles in 23 different sports.

BROAD-BASED PROGRAMMING

The Big Ten will administer over \$200 million in direct financial support to more than 9,800 students competing in intercollegiate athletics for more than 11,000 participation opportunities on more than 350 teams in 42 different sports.

The Big Ten leads the nation in total students competing in intercollegiate athletics and participation opportunities, and sponsors more official sports than all conferences except the Ivy League.

Almost 1,400 Big Ten competitors have participated in the Olympics, winning more than 600 medals, including nearly 300 gold. In the 2016 and 2018 Olympic Games, more than 200 representatives from Big Ten institutions including current or former students and coaches were members of Olympic teams. Big Ten Olympians collected more than 50 medals in the most recent games in Rio and PyeongChang.

PASSIONATE FOLLOWING

The Big Ten leads all conferences with 5.7 million alumni and nearly 580,000 students.

Each year more than 11 million patrons attend Big Ten home contests, as the conference has led the nation in attendance for men's basketball, ice hockey, volleyball and wrestling.

LEADERS IN INNOVATION

Took part in the nation's first bowl game, winning the 1902 Rose Bowl Game, and signed an exclusive contract with the Tournament of Roses in 1946, making it the first bowl with permanent conference affiliations.

Awarded the first Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1915, honoring outstanding seniors who demonstrated excellence in academics and athletics.

Formed the Big Ten Advisory Commission in 1972, enlisting former students that competed in conference athletics to serve as liaisons to the NCAA's Diversity and Inclusion Department, the Big Ten Student-Athlete Advisory Commission and other organizations.

Became the first conference to voluntarily adopt male and female participation goals after launching its Gender Equity Action Plan in 1992.

Implemented the first collegiate football system of instant replay in 2004, which the NCAA approved for use among all conferences in 2006.

Launched the Big Ten Network (BTN) in 2007, the first national conference-owned television network.

Began partnering with the Ivy League to study the effects of head injuries in sports in 2012.

Accepted Johns Hopkins University as the conference's first sport affiliate members in men's and women's lacrosse in 2013 and 2015, respectively, and added Notre Dame as a sport affiliate member in men's ice hockey in 2017.

EXTENSIVE TELEVISION EXPOSURE

Through the Big Ten's current media agreements with BTN, ABC/ESPN, CBS and FOX, more than 1,600 Big Ten events are produced and distributed nationally and globally on an annual basis.

BTN is in almost 60 million homes across the United States and Canada. BTN2Go is BTN's digital extension, delivering live and on-demand programming to computers, smartphones and tablets. BTN Plus within BTN2Go streams hundreds of additional events each season.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

For more than 25 years, through the Big Ten's SCORE (Success Comes Out of Reading Everyday) program, the conference has partnered with Chicago elementary schools to improve reading performance.

Surrounding the Big Ten Football Championship Game and Basketball Tournaments, the conference has held numerous community initiatives, partnered with the College Football Playoff Foundation and other events such as the Big Ten Career Expo, SaturDAY of Service and Youth Football Clinics. 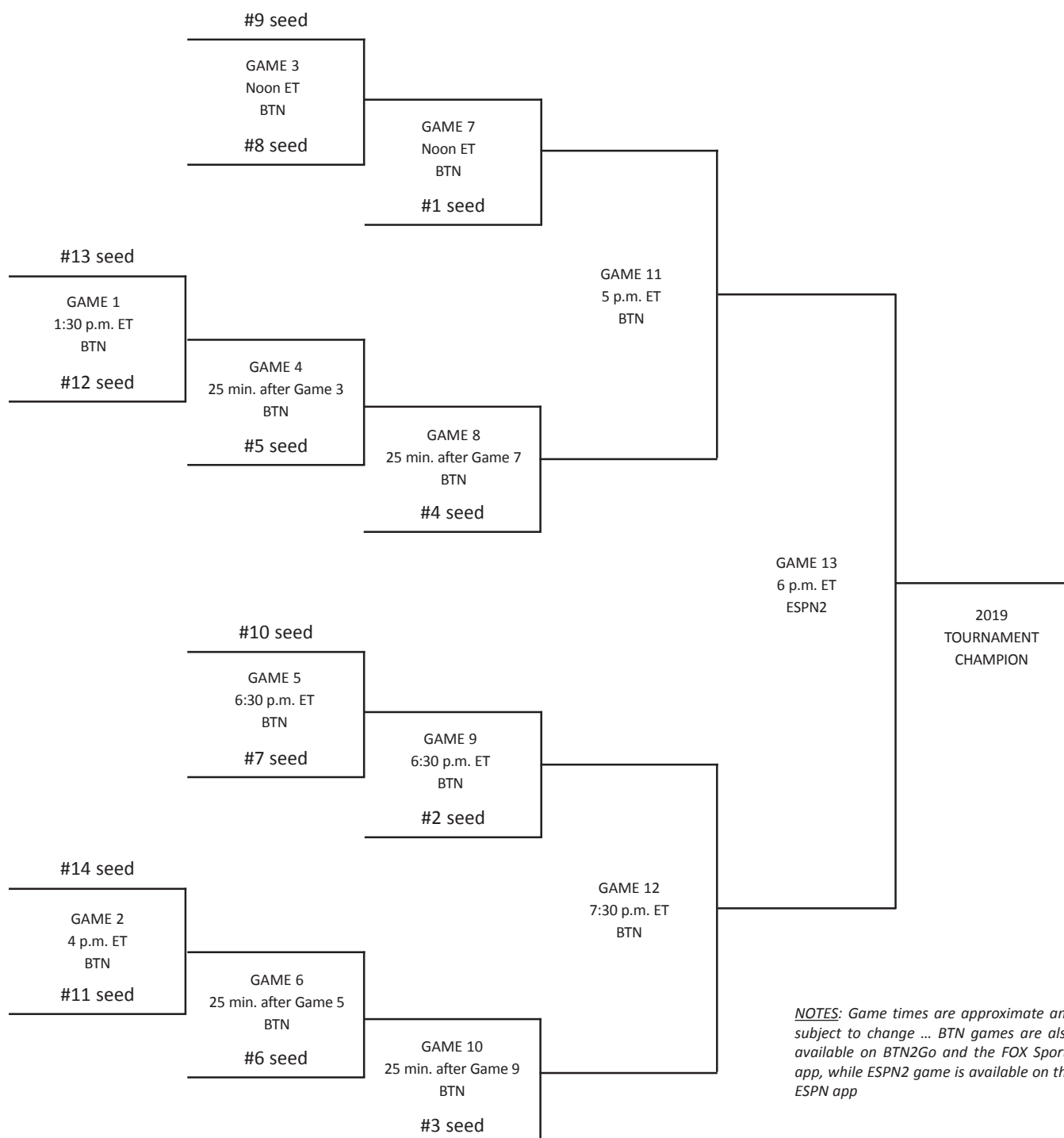
