FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

1 Minnesota welcomes Fresno State to TCF Bank Stadium for a 6:30 p.m. game on Saturday. The Gophers and Bulldogs have never met on the football field. The last time Minnesota faced an opponent for the first time was 2016 when the Gophers beat Big Ten newcomer Rutgers 34-32 at home. Prior to Rutgers, the last time Minnesota played an opponent for the first time was 2014 when it beat Eastern Illinois 42-20. Minnesota is 12-3 all-time against Mountain West opponents, and its most recent game was a 31-24 home win against Colorado State in 2016. The Gophers will play at Fresno State on Sept. 7, 2019.

2 Minnesota beat New Mexico State 48-10 to open the season and the 38-point margin of victory was the largest ever for the Gophers at TCF Bank Stadium. Minnesota had previously beaten Iowa (2014) and New Hampshire (2012) by 37 points at TCF Bank Stadium. The 38-point win was also Minnesota's largest margin of victory since 2006, when it topped Temple 62-0 at home.

3 The Gophers have 113 players on the roster this season and 59 of those players – or 52.2 percent – are either true freshmen or redshirt freshmen. That's the highest number in college football. Virginia is next at 50 percent and is then followed by Wake Forest (49.1 percent) and UCF (48.03 percent). The Gophers have 79 underclassmen on the roster, which is 69.9 percent of the team. That percentage ranks ninth in college football behind only Illinois, Appalachian State, Cincinnati, UCLA, Wake Forest, Virginia, Western Michigan and Georgia Southern.

4 The position with the least experience on the roster is also the most important: quarterback. The Gophers entered the 2018 season with the youngest and most inexperienced quarterbacks in the country. Minnesota has four quarterbacks – all freshmen – on its roster meaning that the quarterbacks had attempted zero passes in a collegiate game. Minnesota is the only team in the nation that has all freshmen quarterbacks on the roster and is one of three teams – joining Kentucky and Nebraska – who started the season with quarterbacks who had never attempted a pass in a game.

5 Head coach P.J. Fleck named walk-on true freshman Zack Annexstad the starting quarterback for the season opener. Annexstad joined the Gophers in January after enrolling early from IMG Academy in Florida and is believed to be the second walk-on true freshman quarterback to start a season opener, joining Baker Mayfield who started his first game at Texas Tech in 2013 after walking on. Annexstad impressed in the opener, passing for 220 yards and two touchdowns. He was not sacked and did not throw an interception.

By applying ROW THE BOAT, one can have the proper perspective to overcome adversity and humble success by living a lifestyle dedicated to serving and giving.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the **ONLY** thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. You control whether you ROW fast or slow, confident or hesitant, efficient or rushed and whether you ROW for yourself or others! If you stop rowing, you will not go anywhere. As a team, you control whether all of you want to ROW together with purpose, or ROW because you have to. If you ROW on just one side of the boat, you will go in circles. ROW in unison with everyone else in the boat, no matter the circumstance (chaotic storms or calm seas), you will come out on the other end better and more experienced for never quitting. Getting everyone in the boat to ROW, no matter what circumstances life throws you, can be very difficult; however... keep ROWING!

PAST: When rowing the boat, the only thing you can actually learn from, but can't change, is the horizon you are looking at. With every passing stroke you learn, but can never go back! You aren't able to change the past, only learn from it and take with you the lessons to make you better today. You must embrace and learn from your past to create your future! Changing your best daily will take you places you thought were impossible!

ABOUT THE BULLDOGS

Fresno State started the season by setting a program record for points in an opener topping the University of Idaho Vandals 79-13.

The Bulldogs scored seven rushing touchdowns, had two blocked field goals returned for touchdowns and took a pick-six to the house in the dominant victory scoring its most points in a game since 1991. They had five interceptions in the game and used a balanced offensive approach passing for 247 yards while rushing for 239.

Senior cornerback Tank Kelly had a pair of interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, five tackles, three pass breakups and a blocked field goal. Junior defensive back Jaron Bryant scored on both of the blocked field goals with returns of 74 and 71 yards.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 19-for-26 for 207 yards. Five running backs split the load and all rushed for 35 yards or more.

Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson tallied his sixth career 100-yard receiving game going for 118 yards on six receptions while extending his consecutive games with a reception streak to a nation-leading 37 games.

The Bulldogs are coming off a 10-win season in 2017 and were picked to win the West Division in the 2018 pre-season poll released by the Mountain West. The top seven tacklers from that team including all three linebackers and all four secondary members are back this season. Five of the seven earned All-Mountain West honors a season ago. They also return eight of 11 starters on offense including 95% of their rushing yards and 83% of their receiving yards.

Fresno State is led by Jeff Tedford who helped put together one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS last season. With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the second team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season into a double-digit win season the following year. He was the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year and was a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award.

Tedford got his coaching career start at Fresno State as a volunteer assistant in 1987 and was the Bulldogs offensive coordinator from 1992-97. He was a head coach at California from 2002-12 and has had stops in both the NFL and CFL. The Bulldogs have struggled against Power Five teams as of late. They have lost its past nine games, losing seven by 30 or more points and the other two by 20 or more while Minnesota is 9-0 against Group of Five teams in the past four seasons.

HEAD COACH // SECOND SEASON

P.J. (Philip John) Fleck was named head football coach at the University of Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 36-29.

Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad in 2017, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' tenth largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980. Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and gave back to the community by hosting a diaper drive, canned food drive and turkey drive last year. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck, 37, is one the youngest and brightest minds in the game. He was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and last season he led the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh are the only Power Five conference coaches who both played and coached in the NFL. Fleck, Harbaugh and East Carolina's Scottie Montgomery are the only coaches in the FBS who have played and coached in the NFL.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

FIRST YEAR QUARTERBACKS

- For the second straight season Minnesota started the season with the most inexperienced quarterbacks in the nation. This year, Minnesota has three redshirt freshmen quarterbacks in Tanner Morgan, Samuel Pickerign and Jon Santaga (moved from defensive back to quarterback in the spring) on its roster and true freshman walk-on Zack Annexstad, who started the season opener. Annexstad is believed to be just the second ever true freshman walk-on to start a season opener, joining Baker Mayfield who did so in 2013 at Texas Tech.
- Zack Annexstad completed 16-of-33 passes for 220 yards and two touchdowns in his collegiate debut against New Mexico State. Annexstad was the first true freshman to start at quarterback for the Gophers since Tim Salem got the call in 1980 (Salem passed for 162 yards in the season opener). Dating back to 1980, only redshirt freshman Alan Holt's 275 yards passing against Michigan State in 1985 were better in a Gopher freshman's (true or redshirt) debut. Since 1980, a freshman quarterback has now appeared in a game for Minnesota 71 times. Annexstad's 220 passing yards are the third most by a true freshman since then and are the 12th most in all 71 appearances by a freshman quarterback.
- Zack Annexstad was the first true freshman to start the season at quarterback for the Gophers since 1980 when Tim Salem (passed for 162 yards) started for his father and coach Joe Salem against Ohio. Rickey Foggie (1984, 62 yards) and Max Shortell (2011, 98 yards) played as true freshmen in Minnesota's season-opening games, but as reserves after starters Brett Sadek (1984) and MarQueis Gray (2011) were injured. Redshirt freshmen Asad Abdul-Khaliq (2000, 161 yards) and Adam Weber (2007, 188 yards) also started their season-openers.
- Zack Annexstad attended IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla., and was named the starting quarterback midway through his senior season. He turned down multiple Power 5 scholarship offers to walk-on at Minnesota and enrolled at the U in January 2018. As a senior at IMG, he completed 63-of-112 passes for 940 yards and 10 touchdowns as the Ascenders completed an undefeated season. He finished his IMG career with 1,137 passing yards and 14 touchdowns. Annexstad was the starting quarterback at Mankato West as a sophomore in 2015, but was sidelined by an ankle injury. He then continued his high school career at IMG. His brother, Brock, is a redshirt freshman receiver for the Maroon and Gold and his father, Scott, played at Minnesota from 1982-83 and then saw time with Kansas City and Washington in the NFL. Annexstad's cousin is Sam Dekker, who played basketball at Wisconsin and is a member of the Cleveland Cavaliers.
- Tanner Morgan is the only scholarship quarterback on the roster. He attended Ryle High School in Union, Ken., where he played as a junior and a senior (played as a freshman and sophomore at Hazard High School in Hazard, Kentucky) before enrolling at Minnesota in January 2017. Morgan is one of only a few Kentucky high school quarterbacks to pass for more than 10,000 yards in his career. As a senior, passed for 2,747 yards and 27 touchdowns as team finished with a 12-1 record and reached the 6-A state quarterfinals. He also rushed for 320 yards and five touchdowns en route to being named a finalist for Kentucky's Mr. Football award. Morgan made his collegiate debut in the fourth quarter against New Mexico and completed his only pass attempt for seven yards. His cousin, Tim Couch, played for Kentucky from 1996-1998 and spent five seasons (1999-2003) in the NFL with the Cleveland Browns.

NUMERO UNO AND THEN FRESHMEN

- THE BALL IS THE PROGRAM! Those five words are preached daily inside the walls of the Larson Football Performance Center. This year, the ball will be in the secure hands of Minnesota's dependable running back Rodney Smith. After amassing 189 all-purpose yards (153 rushing, 21 receiving and 15 kick return) against New Mexico State, the senior from Jonesboro, Ga., now ranks seventh in program history with 4,039 all-purpose yards (2,958 rushing, 440 receiving and 641 kick return). Smith needs an additional 1,070 all-purpose yards to tie Darrell Thompson's 1989 school record of 5,109 yards, which means he needs to average 97.27 all-purpose yards a game for the next 11 games. Smith averaged 66.2 all-purpose yards as a freshman, 123.8 all-purpose yards as a sophomore and 120.6 all-purpose yards as a junior.
- Rodney Smith also keeps climbing in the record books for rushing yards. The senior has rushed 650 times (fifth all-time) for 2,958 yards (seventh all-time) in 38 career games. He is poised to become only the sixth Gopher in school history to rush for more than 3,000 career yards and would join Darrell Thompson (4,654 yards), Laurence Maroney (3,933), Thomas Hamner (3,810), Marion Barber III (3,276), Chris Darkins (3,235) and Marion Barber (3,094) in that category. Against New Mexico State, Smith tied his career high with 153 rushing yards (also rushed for 153 against Purdue in 2016). He also passed former Gopher great and friend David Cobb on Minnesota's all-time rushing list. Cobb, who was a senior in 2014 when Smith was redshirting, ended his career with 2,893 career yards, but set a single-season rushing record with 1,626 yards in 2014.
- Rodney Smith is also a weapon in the passing and return game. He has 57 career catches for 440 yards and his lone reception against New Mexico State went for 21 yards. Smith needs two more receptions to tie Marion Barber for fifth all-time in catches by a running back. He needs an additional 113 receiving yards to tie Thomas Hamner (553 yards) for fifth all-time in career receiving yards by a running back. Smith also returns kicks for Minnesota and has returned 23 career kicks for 641 yards and two touchdowns. His average of 27.9 yards per return currently ranks first in school history (Jakari Wallace is second at 27.0).
- Behind Rodney Smith - who is only one of three seniors (Greene and Weyler) on offense - is a lot of inexperience. The Gophers are without the explosive Shannon Brooks to start the season as he recovers from an injury sustained in the spring. Redshirt freshman Mohamed Ibrahim and true freshman Bryce Williams both saw action in the season opener. Ibrahim totaled 101 yards on nine carries and became the first Gopher to rush for 100 yards or more in his collegiate debut since Thomas Hamner piled up 158 yards in a 30-3 win against NE Louisiana (now ULM) in 1996. Ibrahim did most of his damage with a 74-yard gain in the fourth quarter. It was Minnesota's longest run since Shannon Brooks went 75 yards for a touchdown versus Illinois in 2015. Williams rushed nine times for 31 yards and one touchdown in his debut.

SECRETS ARE NO FUN

- ▶ The Gophers showed a new wrinkle against New Mexico State when it showcased a wildcat offense with Seth Green at quarterback. Green is going to be a dangerous man with the ball in his hands this year. He started his Gopher career as a quarterback, but changed positions late in the spring to tight end and is now transitioning to wide receiver. But against the Aggies he was back at quarterback running a wildcat offense. Green took two snaps and scored two rushing touchdowns (9 yards and 3 yards). He has the ability to run, throw or pass for a touchdown. The last Gopher to do that in one season was former running back Duane Bennett who accomplished the feat in 2010. Current Minnesota running back Shannon Brooks, who will miss the early part of the season with an injury, has also rushed, passed and thrown for a touchdown, but not in the same season.

NO SECRETS HERE

- ▶ Tyler Johnson is a certified star. The Minneapolis native exploded onto the scene last year with 35 catches for 677 yards and seven touchdowns. Against New Mexico State, he hauled in five balls for 100 yards and two scores. Johnson has 54 career catches for 918 yards and 10 touchdowns. With 82 more receiving yards, he will become the 26th Gopher to notch 1,000 career receiving yards. Johnson racks up yards in a hurry, as his career yards per reception average of 17.0 ranks sixth all-time in school history.
- ▶ Tyler Johnson's 677 receiving yards last season were the fifth most ever by a Minnesota sophomore and that was despite missing the final two games of the season with an injury. His seven receiving touchdowns were the second most ever by a sophomore.

FRESHMAN FOCUS

- ▶ After Tyler Johnson, three freshmen were next in line for most targets in Minnesota's season opener. Four-star recruit and true freshman Rashod Bateman made five catches for 52 yards in his collegiate debut. As a senior in high school, the Tifton, Ga., native broke single-season school receiving records with 83 catches for 1,539 yards and 21 touchdowns. He was named First Team All-State and finished his career with 139 catches for 2,364 receiving yards and 26 touchdowns.
- ▶ Redshirt freshman Chris Autman-Bell hauled in four passes for 43 yards. He was limited his senior season of high school due to injury but as a junior, caught 34 passes for 881 yards and 15 touchdowns as his team won the Class 3A state championship.
- ▶ Demetrius Douglas played in the first three games in 2017 before suffering an injury that kept him out the rest of the season. He was granted a medical hardship waiver from the NCAA and now has four years of eligibility remaining. He made 11 catches for 83 yards in his limited action last season and opened up the 2018 with one catch for four yards. His father, Omar, played receiver at Minnesota from 1990-93 and ranks tied for eighth in receptions (130), tied for ninth in receiving touchdowns (14) and tenth in school history in receiving yards (1,681). Omar, owns school record for touchdowns in a game with five (Oct. 9, 1993 vs. Purdue) and spent four years in the NFL with the New York Giants.

- ▶ With three freshman receivers expected to see significant playing time, let's take a quick look at freshman receiving records. The most receptions by a freshman in school history is 38 (Ron Johnson, 1998), while the most receiving yards is 654 (Ernie Wheelwright, 2004) and touchdowns is seven (Ernie Wheelwright, 2004).

ALWAYS 100

- ▶ Rodney Smith (153 yards) and Mohamed Ibrahim (101 yards) both eclipsed the 100-yard mark against New Mexico State. Tyler Johnson also had 100 yards receiving for the Gophers. It was the first time that Minnesota had two players rush for 100 yards and one player total 100 receiving yards since 2016 at Penn State. In that game, Smith (104 yards) and Shannon Brooks (100 yards) both rushed for 100 yards, while Brian Smith had 101 receiving yards.

BALANCED OFFENSE

- ▶ Minnesota passed for 227 yards and rushed for 295 yards against New Mexico State. It was the first time since Nov. 5, 2016, against Purdue (span of 16 games) that Minnesota eclipsed the 200 yard mark in both passing and rushing in the same game. Against Purdue, Minnesota passed for 231 yards and rushed for 235 as it won 44-31.

REDSHIRT?

- ▶ The new redshirt rule – where players can compete in four games and still redshirt – enabled Minnesota to play 68 players against New Mexico State. Twenty-eight of those 68 were freshmen and 16 (7 on offense and 9 on defense) of them were true freshmen. Minnesota started five freshmen on offense in true freshmen Zack Annexstad and Rashod Bateman and redshirt freshmen in Blaise Andries, Demetrius Douglas and Jake Paulson. On defense, Minnesota started true freshman Terrell Smith.

A LOT OF CHOCOLATE MILK

- ▶ Up front the Gophers feature a mix of experience and youth, as Minnesota started two upperclassmen and three underclassmen on the offensive line in the season opener. They did not allowed a sack and blocked for a rushing attack that went for 295 yards. They helped pave the way for a perfect 6-of-6 red zone (4 TDs, 2 FGs) performance from the Maroon and Gold against New Mexico State.
- ▶ As a fifth-year senior, Jared Weyler is the most tenured of the group, but Donnell Greene has actually played the most football for the Gophers. Greene, who joined Minnesota as a junior college transfer in 2016, has started 20 of his 27 career games. He started 11 of 12 games in 2017 and the final eight of 2016 and anchored an offensive line that allowed only 22 sacks and 62 tackles for loss last season en route to being named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention.
- ▶ Jared Weyler is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List for the second straight year. He started at center in the season opener, a position that he started six games for Minnesota at last season but also missed six games due to an injury. When healthy, the two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree has made a major impact for Minnesota up front.
- ▶ Conner Olson started all 12 games on the offensive line (six at center and six at right guard) last season as just a redshirt freshman. He got the nod at guard again in the season opener. The Monticello, Minn.

native was 240 pounds when he was recruited by the Gophers and has since upped his frame to 300 pounds. He gives credit to, "a lot of chocolate milk and a lot of peanut butter sandwiches."

- ▶ Two more Minnesotans in sophomore Sam Schlueter (Victoria) and redshirt freshman Blaise Andries (Marshall) started against New Mexico State. Schlueter played in 10 games and started the final six of the season last year. Andries was a touted local recruit who saw his first action against the Aggies.

COUGHLIN SHINES

- ▶ Carter Coughlin moved from linebacker to rush end at the start of last season and found immediate success. The Eden Prairie, Minn., native started all 12 games and recorded 37 tackles. He led the team with 11.5 tackles for loss, which ranked 16th in the Big Ten and was the most for a Gopher since 2013. He also totaled 6.5 sacks (sixth in the Big Ten), forced one fumble and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention. He had two tackles including one for loss that prevented a first down early in the game on third down against New Mexico State.

TOM-BOMB

- ▶ Thomas Barber emerged as a breakout star last season. The legacy Gopher started all 12 games and finished first on the team with 115 tackles to rank third in the Big Ten and tied for 20th in the nation. He made two tackles against New Mexico State and picked off his second career pass.
- ▶ Last year, 76 of Barber's 115 tackles – or 66% of his total tackles – were solo. His 76 solo stops ranked first in the Big Ten and tied for seventh nationally. Barber's 66% solo-tackle rate ranked third in the nation. He also did not take a penalty on 746 snaps last year.

IT'S T-TIME

- ▶ Everyone is talking about Minnesota's freshman on offense, but the Gophers also started a true freshman at defensive back against New Mexico State in Terrell Smith. The Snellville, Ga., native was tested as the Aggies threw 58 passes. Smith registered eight tackles and broke up three passes in his debut. The freshman brings elite speed to the Gophers, as he won the Georgia State Championship in the 100m (10.39) as a junior and the 200m (21.26) as a sophomore. His personal record in the 100m is 10.32 and in the 200m is 20.84, which makes him the fastest Big Ten corner commit since 2010.

STRAIGHT CASH HOMEY

- ▶ Blake Cashman has made his money on special teams throughout his career but made a dynamic impact in the season opener on defense for the Gophers. He made eight tackles and tied a TCF Bank Stadium record with four tackles for loss. Pro Football Focus charted him with five total quarterback hurries on just eight pass-rush snaps. Cashman also added a sack and a pass breakup and has shown the ability to be a difference maker before on the defensive side. The senior finished last season with 30 tackles including five for a loss and two sacks. As a sophomore he recorded 45 tackles with a team leading 7.5 sacks and one forced fumble. He was named the 2017 Holiday Bowl Defensive Most Valuable Player and is a two-time winner of the team's Gary Tinsley Award, as the player who best embodied the underdog spirit of the late former Gopher Gary Tinsley.

WELCOME BACK WINFIELD

- ▶ Antoine Winfield Jr. played in the first four games of last year but then missed the final eight games with an injury. He was granted a medical hardship by the NCAA and is back as a redshirt sophomore. The Gophers are glad to have him. He helped swing the game against New Mexico State by taking his first ever punt return 76 yards to the house with five broken tackles along the way. He also added five tackles on defense.
- ▶ The Gophers missed Winfield's dynamic impact last year. He notched seven tackles including a sack, made two pass breakups and blocked a field goal against Buffalo in the 2017 season opener and had another seven tackles against Middle Tennessee in the second game of the year. As a freshman he recorded 52 tackles, broke up three passes, recovered one fumble and returned one interception 82 yards for a touchdown.

POINTS HERE

- ▶ Minnesota scored 28 points in the second quarter and 35 in the first half against New Mexico State. The 28 points were the most scored in a quarter since 2015 when the Gophers rang up 28 third-quarter points at Purdue and the 35 points were the most in the first half for Minnesota since it totaled 38 in the first half against Indiana State in 2016.

NO POINTS THERE

- ▶ Minnesota held New Mexico State scoreless in the second half of its 48-10 win. It was the fourth time under Fleck that Minnesota has held an opponent scoreless in a half. Minnesota did not allow a point in the second half last season to Buffalo, Oregon State and Middle Tennessee.

A CARPENTER'S PRECISION

- ▶ Minnesota kicker Emmitt Carpenter is poised to become one of the most productive kickers in school history. The senior, who was one of 30 kickers named to the preseason watch list for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, has made 38-of-47 career field goals. His 80.8 field goal conversion rate ranks first in program history.
- ▶ Emmitt Carpenter's 38 career field goals rank tied for sixth in school history with Adam Bailey. He has made 24-of-32 field goals at TCF Bank Stadium, 13-of-14 on the road and 1-of-1 in neutral-site games. Carpenter is 32-of-41 on FieldTurf and is a perfect 6-of-6 on natural grass. In addition, he has made 80-of-81 career point-after attempts.
- ▶ Emmitt Carpenter opened his season by making all six point-after attempts and 2-of-3 field goals against New Mexico State. He now has 194 career points as he has made 80 PATs and 38 field goals. Six more points will make him the sixth kicker and 11th player overall to reach 200 career points for the Gophers. The last player to hit the 200-point mark was quarterback Mitch Leidner (33 rushing TDs and 1 2PT from 2013-16) and the last kicker to do so was Dan Nystrom (154 PATs and 71 FGs from 1999-2002). Nystrom is Minnesota's all-time leading scorer with 367 points.

- ▶ In 2017, Carpenter made 14-of-20 field goals and was a perfect 31-of-31 on point-after attempts. He led

Minnesota with 73 points and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention. In 2016, Carpenter was named the Big Ten's Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year (first Gopher to be honored with this award), after making 22-of-24 field goals. He was named All-Big Ten First Team by the media and All-Big Ten Second Team by Big Ten coaches. Carpenter totaled 109 points, which tied Dan Nystrom (109 points in 2000) for most all-time by a Minnesota kicker. Carpenter's 109 points also ranks tied for second all-time with Nystrom for any Gopher behind Gary Russell (114 points in 2005) and he finished fifth in the Big Ten scoring race that season. Carpenter made his first nine field goals (tied for sixth longest streak in school history) to start the year and ended the season with 12 consecutive made field goals (fourth longest streak in school history). He was a perfect 10-of-10 on field goals from 40 yards or greater and was the only kicker in the nation - minimum of six kicks - to accomplish that feat (8-of-8 from 40-49 yards and 2-of-2 from 50-plus yards). His career long field goal of 53 yards came against Purdue.

- ▶ Carpenter has also found success off the field, as he was named Academic All-Big Ten and CoSida Academic All-District in 2016 and 2017. He was also honored with the team's Tony Dungy Character and Community Service Award (great character on and off the field) in 2017.

HERBIE! HERBIE!

- ▶ Jacob Herbers handled the punting and holding duties for the Gophers against New Mexico State. He has been a flawless holder for the past two seasons, but against the Aggies was the first time he was the team's No. 1 punter. Herbers, who had only one career punt to his name prior to this season, averaged 41.4 yards on five punts. The lefty also booted a career long of 51 yards. Not bad for a mechanical engineering major.

SPECIAL BROTHERHOOD

- ▶ The Gophers are in the third straight season of having the same long snapper (Payton Jordahl), holder (Jacob Herbers) and kicker (Emmitt Carpenter). Jordahl has snapped 403 times in his career (224 punt, 111 point after attempts and 68 field goals) and made nine tackles. Herbers is coming off a Mortell Holder of the Year Semifinalist season and is again on the watch list for the prestigious award coming into this season.

RETURN, BLOCKED

- ▶ The Gophers found success on special teams against New Mexico State. Antoine Winfield Jr. returned a punt - the first one of his collegiate career - 76 yards for a touchdown and Sam Renner blocked a punt that led to a Gopher field goal. Winfield's score was the second of his career, as he also returned an interception 82 yards for a touchdown at Maryland in 2016. His punt return was Minnesota first for a touchdown since Marcus Jones went 65 yards at New Mexico State in 2013. Renner's blocked punt was the first for Minnesota since Eric Murray blocked a punt against Iowa in 2014.

FOURTH DOWN, GO FOR IT

- ▶ The Gophers were 1-of-1 on fourth down against New Mexico State. Last year, Minnesota went for it on fourth down 13 times and converted on 10 tries. That

76.9 conversion rate ranked first in the Big Ten and second in the nation last year. Only Alabama had a higher percentage at 83.3%.

YOU'RE ON SCHOLARSHIP

- ▶ Nobody gives away a scholarship like Minnesota coach P.J. Fleck. The effervescent Gopher coach certainly has a flair for the dramatic when it comes to scholarship surprises, but he also ensures that the moment is one that is memorable for the individual receiving the scholarship.
- ▶ Since Fleck was hired on Jan. 6, 2017, he has awarded eight scholarships to walk-ons with two coming this past fall camp and one after Minnesota's win against New Mexico State. Bailey Schoenfelder was awarded a scholarship after two Navy Seals parachuted onto the field and delivered a letter to Fleck. Brock Annexstad received a scholarship when his brother, starting quarterback Zack, pretended to reveal a tattoo to the team that showed the words, "Brock, you are on scholarship." After Minnesota beat New Mexico State, Fleck awarded scholarship to Calvin Swenson while he was addressing the team and handing out game balls.
- ▶ In addition to Schoenfelder, Annexstad and Swenson, Fleck had previously given scholarships to walk-ons Sam Renner, Blake Cashman, Emmitt Carpenter, Justin Juenemann, and Conor Rhoda.

DEGREE IN HAND

- ▶ Minnesota has eight players on its roster who have already earned their degree. Those players are Jerry Gibson, Payton Jordahl, Gary Moore, Rodney Smith, Jared Weyler, Julian Huff, Sam Renner and Alex Melvin.

SERVING AND GIVING

- ▶ Coach P.J. Fleck stresses serving and giving to others and has preached that motto since he has been at Minnesota. Fleck and the Gophers routinely visit the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital to lift the spirits of patients and staff. This year, Fleck opened up three fall practices to the public. One of those practices was a F.A.M.I.L.Y Day practice. There the Gophers hosted their second annual diaper drive and collected 15,750 diapers. In diaper drives, Minnesota has collected 29,296 diapers in an effort to better the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and turkey drive since Fleck has been at the help.

WATCH AND SEE

- ▶ The Gophers are represented on 12 watch lists for the 2018 season. Rodney Smith is on the Maxwell Award, Doak Walker Award and the Paul Hornung Award Watch Lists. Emmitt Carpenter is on the Lou Groza Watch List for his play on the field. He is also on the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List and is an Allstate AFCA Good Works Team nominee and Witten Award nominee for his work off of it. Thomas Barber is on the Butkus Award Watch List and the Bednarik Award Watch List after his breakout season last year. For the second straight year Jared Weyler is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List and he also earned a NFF National Scholar-Athlete nomination. For the second straight year Jacob Herbers has landed a spot on the coveted Mortell Holder of the Year Award Watch List.

COACHED UP

- ▶ Head coach P.J. Fleck promoted Joe Rossi from quality control assistant to defensive line coach this past offseason. He also hired Clay Patterson (tight ends), Jahmille Addae (defensive back) and Marcus West (defensive line pass rush specialist).
- ▶ Joe Rossi joined the Minnesota football staff in January 2017 and was named defensive line coach in January 2018. Rossi spent 2012-15 at Rutgers, which included two years as the defensive coordinator. Rossi was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2014 after serving in an interim role in 2013 and held the role until after the 2015 season. He was the special teams coordinator at Rutgers from 2012-13.
- ▶ Clay Patterson joined the Minnesota coaching staff in January 2018 after serving as head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M for two seasons. The Morris, Okla., native led the Norseman to a 9-3 record in 2017 after going 5-5 in 2016. In 2017, the program claimed its first Southwest Junior College Football Conference (SWJCFC) championship since 2003 and played in its first bowl game since 2012. Patterson earned conference coach of the year honors as his team averaged 524.5 yards per game (253.8 rushing and 270.6 passing) and 36.2 points per game.
- ▶ Jahmille Addae coached Arizona defensive backs in 2016-17 after working for the team as an analyst from 2013-15. At Arizona, Addae helped develop Arizona's young defensive backs into some of the team's top performers on the defensive side of the ball. Four of Arizona's leading tacklers were in the secondary in 2017 and that quartet combined for 261 tackles, 24 breakups and 12 interceptions.
- ▶ Marcus West joined the Minnesota coaching staff in February 2018 as the defensive line pass rush specialist coach. He came to Minnesota after two seasons at Austin Peay. While with the Governors, West was the assistant head coach, co-defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. In 2017, Austin Peay – which was a combined 1-45 from 2013-16 – posted an 8-4 record. The eight wins tied a program record for the Governors and the team's seven conference wins were a program record. The defense, led by West, held its opponents to 24.8 points per game (fifth-best in the OVC), which is impressive considering the Governors played at undefeated Central Florida and gave up 73 points to the Knights. Excluding Central Florida, Austin Peay gave up 20.3 points per game in 11 games and gave up only 16.6 points per game in its eight wins.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

- ▶ Minnesota has won seven national championships and 18 Big Ten titles. Minnesota's first national championship came in 1904 under the guidance of coach Henry L. Williams. The Gophers outscored their opponents 725-12 en route to a 13-0 record. The only team to score on Minnesota that year was Nebraska, as the Gophers downed the Huskers 16-12. Bernie Bierman would lead Minnesota to national titles in 1934, 1935, 1936, 1940 and 1941. The Gophers also won a national title in 1960 under Murray Warmath. Minnesota won its first-ever Big Ten title in 1900. The Gophers have a total of 18 Big Ten Championships in their history.

TCF BANK STADIUM

- ▶ When the Gophers hosted Air Force on Sept. 12, 2009, it marked the first time since Nov. 21, 1981 that college football has been played on campus at Minnesota. In addition to Minnesota college football games, TCF Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) played season at TCF Bank Stadium, while their new stadiums were being constructed.

PLAYING AT HOME

- ▶ Minnesota is 37-27 all-time at TCF Bank Stadium. Minnesota is now 10 games over .500 at TCF Bank Stadium after opening the season with a win against New Mexico State. This is the third time that Minnesota has been 10 games over .500 at TCF Bank Stadium and its current 57.8 winning percentage at home is the highest since the stadium opened. A win on Saturday would make Minnesota 11 games over .500 at TCF Bank Stadium, which is something they have never been. The Gophers opened the on-campus facility with a 20-13 win against Air Force on Sept. 12, 2009, but then dropped to 7-13 at home after 20 games at TCF Bank Stadium. Since then (Nov. 26, 2011), Minnesota has compiled a 30-14 record at home, which translates to a 68.1 winning percentage.
- ▶ Minnesota is 20-7 overall at home in non-conference games. However, the Gophers are 17-1 in their last 18 non-conference games and have won eight in a row. Minnesota's last home loss to a non-conference opponent was a 23-17 setback to No. 2 TCU on Sept. 3, 2015.
- ▶ In 64 games at TCF Bank Stadium, the Gophers average 27.5 points per game and allow an average of 24.7. In non-conference games, Minnesota averages 30.69 points per game and give up an average of 21.34. Under Fleck, Minnesota has averaged 28.5 points per game at home and has allowed an average of 18.75. In three non-conference games, those numbers are 33 points per game for and 6.67 points per game against.

SKI-U-MARCH

- ▶ Head Coach P.J. Fleck and the team will greet fans and enter the stadium along with the spirit squad and the band prior to the game. Ski-U-March will be held 2.5 hours prior to kickoff. The route brings the team into TCF Bank Stadium through the Lake of the Woods entrance on the east (closed bowl) end of the stadium, off 23rd Ave. SE near the Gold and Gopher Lots and the student entrance at Gate C.
