FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

1 Minnesota faces Maryland at home on Saturday. Minnesota has won nine straight games (first nine game winning streak since 1941-42), which is tied for the fourth longest winning streak in the nation. Clemson has the longest winning streak at 22 games and is followed by Ohio State (13) and Appalachian State (12). Minnesota follows at nine wins and is tied with Baylor. Minnesota is ranked No. 17 in the AP Poll and No. 16 in the Coaches Poll. Minnesota entered the AP Poll at No. 20 last week and this week's ranking of No. 17 is the highest Minnesota has been ranked in the poll since it was No. 13 on Oct. 3, 2004.

2 Minnesota is 7-0 this year, 9-0 in its last nine games, 11-2 in its last 12 games and 19-13 overall under head coach P.J. Fleck. The last time Minnesota started a season 7-0 was 1960, when it finished 8-2 and were named National Champions (Gophers last started 8-0 when it won all eight games in the 1941 season and were named National Champions). The last time Minnesota won nine straight games was 1941-42, as it went 8-0 in 1941 and started 1942 season 1-0 (Gophers won 18 straight games from 1939-41. Minnesota ended 1939 1-0, went 8-0 in both 1940 and 1941 and started 1-0 in 1942). The last time Minnesota was 11-2 in 13 games was 1948-49, as it went 7-2 in 1948 and then won the first four games on 1949 (Gophers won final game of 1947 to go 12-2). Fleck's 19-13 record in his first 32 games is the best for a coach in school history since the legendary Murray Warmath started 19-11-2 from 1954 through the first five games of the 1957 season. Warmath would go on to coach Minnesota for 18 seasons and led Minnesota to a Big Ten championship and national championship in 1960.

3 The Gophers are 7-0 for the first time since 1960 and the ninth time ever (1960, 1941, 1940, 1935, 1934, 1905, 1904, 1903 and 1896). Minnesota is 4-0 in the Big Ten for the first time since 1967 (last started 5-0 in conference play in 1961) and has won five straight Big Ten games for the first time since 1969-70 when it won the final four games of 1969 and the first of 1970 (last won six straight Big Ten games in 1961).

4 Minnesota is 11-2 in its last 13 games (9 B1G games, 1 game vs. ACC and 3 nonconference games) and the Gophers have scored 450 points in that span. Minnesota scored 429 points in 12 games in 2005 and 503 in 13 games in 2003. The only other seasons Minnesota scored more than 400 points were 1905 (542 in 11 games), 1904 (725 in 13 games) and 1903 (618 in 15 games).

5 Minnesota has scored 154 points in its first four Big Ten games, which is the most it has scored in that span since 1916 when it tallied 179. Through seven games, Minnesota is averaging 36.4 points this year. The modern day school record was set in 2003 when the Gophers averaged 38.7 points in 13 games.

ROW THE BOAT

The OAR = The ENERGY! The symbol of strength and purpose. The amount one brings to their life Academically, Athletically, Socially and Spiritually! The only tool that can move the boat forward!

The BOAT = The SACRIFICE! What are you willing to give up for something that you've never had? The more you serve and give, the bigger your boat gets. The bigger your boat gets, the more people you can actually influence. Influence is about the messengers, not just the message.

Everyone, not just athletes and athletic teams can share, use and live the ROW THE BOAT lifestyle in their personal and professional lives. By applying ROW THE BOAT, one can have the proper perspective to overcome adversity and humble success by living a lifestyle dedicated to serving and giving.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. You control whether you ROW fast or slow, confident or hesitant, efficient or rushed and whether you ROW for yourself or others! If you stop rowing, you will not go anywhere. As a team, you control whether all of you want to ROW together with purpose, or ROW because you have to. If you ROW on just one side of the boat, you will go in circles. PAST: When rowing the boat, the only thing you can actually learn from, but can't change, is the horizon you are looking at. With every passing stroke you learn, but can never go back! You aren't able to change the past, only learn from it and take with you the lessons to make you better today. You must embrace and learn from your past to create your future! Changing your best daily will take you places you thought were impossible!

ABOUT THE TERRAPINS

Maryland started the season 2-0 and outscored those opponents 142-20, which included a 63-20 victory against No. 21 Syracuse.

Maryland has gone 1-4 since and lost a tough battle, 34-28, against Indiana last week. Javon Leake rushed for a career-high 158 yards with a pair of touchdowns in the loss while Tyrrel Pigrome completed 17-of-27 passes for a career-high 210 yards and a pair of touchdowns in his second straight start.

Virginia Tech transfer Josh Jackson started the first five games, but has missed the past two with an injury. Jackson is 70-of-137 for 968 yards and 10 touchdowns. He started all 13 games for the Hokies in 2017 and threw for 2,991 yards and 20 touchdowns while adding 324 yards and six rushing touchdowns. Pigrome has started the past two weeks and has played in all seven games. He is 55-of-93 for 599 yards and three touchdowns with 170 rushing yards and two touchdowns.

Leake leads the team 499 yards and seven touchdowns. Anthony McFarland has 340 yards and seven touchdowns. McFarland, who was named Second Team All-Big Ten last year, broke the school freshman rushing record with 1,034 yards and four touchdowns.

Dontay Demus is another young playmaker. He leads the team with 28 receptions for 466 yards and four touchdowns. The Terps also have big play ability on special teams. Leake has a kickoff return for a touchdown while DJ Turner has a punt return for a touchdown. Maryland has yet to make a field goal and has attempted just two.

On defense, Maryland has now forced a turnover in 19 straight games, the second-longest streak in the country. The Terps have forced a turnover in every game during the past two seasons. Linebacker Keandre Jones has been the star on that side of the ball with six sacks and 10 tackles for loss.

Michael Locksley is in his first season as Maryland's head coach. The winner of the 2018 Broyles Award, Locksley spent the last three years at Alabama. He was Maryland's offensive coordinator from 2012-15 and had been the Terps interim head coach for the final six games of the 2015 season.

HEAD COACH // THIRD SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 38, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 49-35 and is 19-13 at Minnesota.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashon Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week, and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' tenth largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually give back to the community by hosting a diaper drive, canned food drive, school supplies drive and turkey drive. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin. Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2016 (2014 as well) after leading the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

34 OR MORE

- Minnesota has scored 34 points or more in its last six games. The last time Minnesota scored 34 or more points in six straight games was 2003 when it scored 34 or more in six straight games (42 at Northwestern, 35 vs. Michigan, 38 vs. Michigan State, 36 at Illinois, 55 vs. Indiana and 37 vs. Wisconsin). Minnesota last scored 34 or more points in seven straight games (school record for scoring 34 or more points in consecutive games) in 1905, as it started the season scoring 74, 54, 42, 45, 42, 39 and 46 points.

RACE TO 28

- Minnesota has scored at least 28 points in all seven games this season, which is something it has not accomplished since the 1905 and 1904 seasons when it was still competing against high school teams. In 1905 the Gophers opened the season scoring 74, 54, 42, 45, 42, 39 and 46 points. In 1904, the Gophers scored 28 or more points in their first eight games, which is the most in school history (107, 77, 75, 65, 47, 35, 32 and 146).

20 SOMETHING

- Minnesota has won three Big Ten games this year by 20 points or more for the first time since 1935. That year, Minnesota beat Purdue 29-7, Michigan 40-0 and Wisconsin 33-7 as it went 8-0 and was named National Champions.

MINNESOTA'S MORGAN

- Minnesota entered 2018 as the only team in the nation with all freshmen quarterbacks and had only one scholarship quarterback in Tanner Morgan. They now have four. Zack Annexstad was put on scholarship last winter and Jacob Clark and Cole Kramer both joined the program in January 2019. Annexstad and Morgan combined to pass for 2,678 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2018 and were poised to battle for the starting quarterback role before Annexstad went down with a foot injury early on in camp and is out indefinitely.

- Tanner Morgan is 11-2 as a starter at Minnesota and since 1975, no Gopher quarterback has begun his career with a better record as a starter. Additionally, Morgan's career winning percentage (.846) is the highest for any Gophers quarterback with 10 or more starts during that timeframe. Through seven games this year, he has completed 101-of-152 passes (66.4 completion percentage) for 1,623 yards and 16 touchdowns (he has also rushed for a score). Morgan ranks fourth in the nation in yards per attempt (10.68), fifth in yards per completion (16.07) and 21st in completion percentage (66.4%). He is fifth in the nation in passing efficiency at 186.90 and trails only Jalen Hurts (Oklahoma), Joe Burrow (LSU), Tua Tagovailoa (Alabama) and Justin Fields (Ohio State). He is tied for 14th in the country with 16 passing touchdowns.

- Tanner Morgan, who has 16 passing touchdowns this year, passed for three or more touchdowns against Georgia Southern, Purdue and Illinois, which was the first time a Minnesota quarterback accomplished that feat dating back to at least 1990. Adam Weber (2010) was the last quarterback to have three games with three passing touchdowns in a season. The Gophers didn't pass for 16 touchdowns in 2017 (9), 2016 (9), 2015 (15), 2014 (12), 2013 (12), 2011 (10), 2009 (13) or 2008 (15).

- Tanner Morgan has thrown for 3,024 yards (15th in school history) in 16 career games. He has completed 190-of-304 passes for 25 touchdowns (all have come in his 13 starts), which ties him with Tony Dungy for ninth in school history in touchdown passes.

- Tanner Morgan played one of the best games in Big Ten history against Purdue. He completed 21-of-22 passes for 396 yards and four touchdowns. His 95.45 completion percentage is the best ever in the history of the Big Ten for any quarterback who has attempted 15 or more passes in a game. Morgan set career highs in completions (21), yards (396) and touchdowns (4). His 396 yards tied him for the seventh most in school history and they are the most passing yards by a Gopher since Adam Weber threw for 416 yards in a win against Michigan State in 2009. His 396 yards were the second most ever by a Gopher on the road behind Cory Sauter, who threw for 404 yards at Michigan State in 1995.

- Tanner Morgan's career completion percentage of 62.5% currently places him first in school history (minimum 300 attempts) ahead of Mark Carlson, who completed 57.2% of his passes from 1976-79. Morgan's career pass efficiency rating of 169.0 also currently ranks first in school history, well ahead of Bryan Cupito who had a pass efficiency rating of 138.34 from 2003-06.

COAST TO COAST

- Minnesota has already traveled coast to coast this year, as the Gophers have played game in Fresno, Calif., and Piscataway, N.J. Minnesota also made a stop in West Lafayette, Ind., and will also play games in Iowa City, Iowa and Evanston, Ill. The Gophers will travel a combined 8,992 road trip miles this year for road games.

MEMORABLE DRIVE

- Minnesota was attempting a 33-yard field goal with about six minutes remaining against Georgia Southern to go up 11 points. The field goal was blocked and returned 77 yards for a touchdown. A little more than two minutes later, Georgia Southern returned a fumble 44 yards for another score to take a 32-28 lead late in the game. Minnesota, which had zero timeouts, faced a 3rd-and-29 from its own 6-yard line. The Gophers would then march down the field and score the game-winning touchdown with 13 seconds left, showing resolve, resiliency and execution along the way. Minnesota last gave up a blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in a win at Nebraska in 2014. The last time Minnesota gave up a fumble return for a touchdown was in a loss at Northwestern in 2015.

A LOT BACK

- Minnesota returned nine starters on offense (graduated center Jared Weyler and tackle Donnell Greene) this year after posting sneaky good numbers in 2018. This year, Minnesota returned 100% of passing yards (QB Zack Annexstad is sidelined with an injury), 99% of rushing yards and 99% of receiving yards. Last year, the Gophers averaged 28.9 points per game (T7 most all time since 1955), scored 46 touchdowns (T5 in school history since 1955), totaled 4,935 yards of offense (6th most in school history since 1955), recorded 269 first downs (3rd most in school history since 1955) and threw for 2,714 yards (8th most in school history since 1955). In 2018, freshmen accounted for 98% of passing yards, 73% of rushing yards and 49% of receiving yards.

ONE POSSESSION WINS

- Minnesota won four straight one-possession games to start the season to become the fifth team in FBS history to do so.

GOPHER GREATS

- ▶ Rodney Smith and Tyler Johnson eclipsed career milestones earlier this year. Smith passed 3,000 career rushing yards and now ranks fourth in school history with 3,745 rushing yards. Smith also ranks second all-time in career all-purpose yards with 5014 yards. He is 95 yards shy of tying Darrell Thompson's (5,109 yards in 45 games from 1986-89) school record. Johnson passed 2,000 career receiving yards and is fourth in school history with 2,576 yards.

TERRIFIC TRIO

- ▶ Tyler Johnson, Rashod Bateman and Chris Autman-Bell form one of the best trios in the nation, as they have combined for 80 catches, 1,426 yards and 15 touchdowns. Those numbers stack up well against the top five teams. No. 1 Alabama's top three receivers have caught 106 passes for 1,699 yards and 20 TDs. LSU's numbers are 103 catches for 1,689 yards and 24 TDs, while Ohio State is at 69 catches for 967 yards and 13 TDs. Clemson comes in at 71 catches for 1,147 yards and 9 TDs and No. 5 Oklahoma is at 67 catches for 1,389 yards and 16 TDs.

NORTHSIDE PRIDE

- ▶ Minneapolis North product Tyler Johnson, who was named First Team All-Big Ten (first U receiver since Eric Decker in 2009), put the Big Ten on notice last year when he made 78 catches (second most in a season) for 1,169 yards (single-season school record) and 12 touchdowns (single-season school record). He had six 100-yard games, which tied for first in school history in a season and became the first Gopher ever with four straight 100-yard games in Big Ten play.
- ▶ Tyler Johnson's legacy as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold is secure, but he has a chance to leave as the school's most productive receiver ever. Johnson ranks fourth in career receiving yards with 2,576. Eric Decker is the school record holder with 3,119 career yards and is the only Gopher ever to eclipse 3,000 yards. Johnson needs 424 more yards this season to join Club 3,000. Johnson ranks fourth in school history with 166 catches and again is chasing Decker (227 career catches). Johnson is tied for second with Ernie Wheelwright in school history with 26 receiving touchdowns. Ron Johnson (no relation) is first with 31. If Johnson were to duplicate his 2018 season (78 catches, 1,169 yards and 12 touchdowns) in 2019, he would leave Minnesota as the program holder in receiving yards (3,156), touchdowns (32) and would rank second all-time in catches (205).
- ▶ Tyler Johnson has caught a pass in 30 straight games, which is the third longest streak in school history. Ron Johnson's record of 46 straight games is not reachable, but Tyler Johnson could finish second all-time (Decker and Tutu Atwell are second with a catch in 34 straight games). Tyler Johnson has played in 43 career games (missed the final two games of the 2017 season with an injury) and has 12 100-yard career games on his resume, which is a school record.
- ▶ Tyler Johnson caught three touchdowns against Georgia Southern and is the only Gopher ever to have three receiving touchdowns in three different games in a career (2019 Georgia Southern, 2018 Miami, 2017 Michigan State).

BATEMAN DELIVERS

- ▶ Rashod Bateman is one of the best receivers in the nation. He has multiple one-handed catches this year

and through seven games he has 28 catches for 605 yards (21st in nation) and five touchdowns. He is eighth in the nation with an average of 21.61 yards per catch. Bateman set freshman program records in 2018 in receptions (51) and yards (704) and six touchdowns ranked second.

- ▶ Rashod Bateman has caught at least one pass in all 20 games he has played. He caught six passes for 177 yards and two scores at Purdue. He has three 100-yard games this year and now has five for his career. In 20 career games, he has 79 catches for 1,309 yards and 11 touchdowns. He ranks third in the Big Ten with an average of 86.4 yards per game.
- ▶ Rashod Bateman crossed 1,000 career receiving yards at Purdue - which was his 17th career game - and became the second fastest Gopher to reach the milestone. The fastest was Ryan Thelwell (15 games). He played in seven games in 1994 and had 406 yards and then crossed 1,000 yards eight games into the 1995 season (notables: Ernie Wheelwright, 20 games; Eric Decker, 21; Tyler Johnson, 26). Bateman became the 26th Gopher to record 1,000 career yards.

RECORD SETTERS

- ▶ Tyler Johnson and Rashod Bateman wasted little time in etching their names into the TCF Bank Stadium record book this season. The dynamic duo each have 100-yard receiving games at home this year and in doing so have turned in two of the top seven games by a receiver at the 10-year old stadium. Johnson recorded 140 yards against Georgia Southern, while Bateman carded 132 yards - all in the first half - against South Dakota State. Johnson's 140 yards is tied for the third best performance ever at the stadium with Eric Decker, who totaled 140 against Wisconsin in 2009. Bateman's 132 yards is the seventh most at TCF Bank Stadium, which has hosted 74 games. Johnson ranks second (141 yards against Buffalo in 2017), tied for third (140 yards against Georgia Southern in 2019) and sixth (133 yards against Miami in 2018) in most receiving yards in a game at the stadium. Da'Jon McKnight is the record holder with 146 yards, which he set in 2011 versus New Mexico State.

AUTMAN-BELL, DOUGLAS

- ▶ Chris Autman-Bell made 28 catches (fourth all-time for a Minnesota freshman) for 449 yards (third all-time for a Minnesota freshman) and led the team with a 16.03 yards per catch average in 2018. He has 13 catches for 232 yards and four touchdowns this year. His first touchdown this year was the first of his career and was at Fresno State. It came on 4th-and-13 and was a 20-yard touchdown from Tanner Morgan. It also came with 46 seconds left in the game and forced overtime.
- ▶ Demetrius Douglas caught nine passes for 87 yards and one touchdown in 2018. He returned 24 kickoffs for 594 yards (24.75 average) and his long was 87 yards at Nebraska. Douglas returned seven punts for 113 yards (16.14 average), which included a 69-yard return for a touchdown at Wisconsin. The legacy Gopher (son of Omar Douglas) finished third on the team - behind Mohamed Ibrahim and Tyler Johnson - with 794 all-purpose yards (594 kick return, 113 punt return and 87 receiving). He has seven catches for 55 yards this year, but two came on the game-winning drive versus Georgia Southern.

BACKS GOTTA EAT

- ▶ Between six running backs - Rodney Smith, Shannon

Brooks, Mohamed Ibrahim, Treyson Potts, Bryce Williams and Cam Wiley - Minnesota has a combined 1,557 carries on its roster for 7,854 yards and 66 touchdowns. Those numbers do not include Seth Green's 297 yards and 10 TDs as a wildcat QB.

- ▶ RTB can stand for either Row The Boat or Run The Ball. In Minnesota's last two home games it has stood for both. The Gophers rushed for 654 yards and six touchdowns against Illinois and Nebraska. In those games, Minnesota allowed only 242 combined rushing yards and one rushing touchdown.
- ▶ Rodney Smith started the first two games of 2018, but missed the rest of the season with an injury before being granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA. This year, he leads Minnesota with 137 carries for 786 yards (9th in NCAA). He is second in Big Ten games with 576 rushing yards (J.K. Dobbins is first with 663 yards) and is averaging 144 yards in conference games. Smith has 15 career 100-yard rushing games, which is tied for third in program history. He set a career high with 211 yards against Illinois this year.
- ▶ Rodney Smith totaled 237 all-purpose yards against Illinois this year and now has three games in his career with at least 237 all-purpose yards (279 against Nebraska in 2017 and 257 against Rutgers in 2016). He is one of four players (joining Tutu Atwell, Tellis Redmon and Chris Darkins) in school history to have three games with at least 237 all-purpose yards, but is the only player to do so against three Big Ten teams. Smith's 5,014 all-purpose yards (3,745 rush, 509 receive, 760 kick return) is second in school history.
- ▶ Shannon Brooks returned from an injury sustained in February 2018 to play against Indiana on Oct. 26, 2018 last season. It was his first game action since Oct. 28, 2017 at Iowa. He rushed 22 times for 154 yards and one touchdown against the Hoosiers, but missed the rest of the season when he was injured in the fourth quarter. He returned from that injury on Sept. 28, 2019, at Purdue, where he was on a "pitch count." Brooks rushed 16 times for 111 yards and one touchdown against Illinois and then carried the ball 13 times for 99 yards against Nebraska. He has rushed for 19 career touchdowns (five are 37 yards or longer) and Minnesota is 13-2 when he scores.
- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim scored in the first two games, but then did not record a carry in the next three games as he battled a lingering injury. He returned against Nebraska and rushed for three touchdowns and also scored at Rutgers. Ibrahim has 15 career touchdowns in 15 games. He has rushed 59 times this year for 270 yards and he does not have a negative carry.
- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim rushed 202 times for 1,160 yards (second most ever for a Gopher freshman) and nine touchdowns in 2018. His 1,160 yards ranked 30th in the NCAA and were the second most by a freshman (Jermar Jefferson at Oregon State had 1,380 yards). Ibrahim averaged 116 yards per game in 2018 and rushed for more than 100 yards five times to become the first Gopher freshman to do so since Laurence Maroney (five 100-yard games) in 2003. He ended 2018 with a 5.74 yards per carry average, which ranks fifth all-time in school history. He also set a freshman single-game record with 224 yards against Georgia Tech (most by a Gopher in a single game since Maroney ran for 258 yards against Wisconsin in 2005) in the Quick Lane Bowl (12th-best rushing game in school history).

GREEN LINE

- ▶ Seth Green scored Minnesota's first touchdown of the season against South Dakota State and scored again versus Georgia Southern. After transitioning from quarterback to tight end in spring 2017 and tight end to wide receiver the following fall camp, Green has found his niche as a Wildcat QB. In 2018, he rushed 76 times for 282 yards (only one negative rush) and eight touchdowns. In addition to his two rushing scores this year, Minnesota has also scored two rushing touchdowns with Green in the backfield off direct snaps to Rodney Smith. Green has completed 4-of-5 career passes for 36 yards and two touchdowns and also threw for a successful 2-point conversion. As a receiver he caught two passes for 37 yards.

PIECE OF THE PIE

- ▶ Gopher tight ends have graded out as elite blockers, but they have also been more active in the passing game. Jake Paulson has four catches for 51 yards this year, while Brevyn Spann-Ford has two for 25 yards. (1st career catch was TD vs. Illinois).

MINNESOTA MOVERS

- ▶ Minnesota returned four offensive line starters from the Quick Lane Bowl in Blaise Andries (6-6, 325), Curtis Dunlap Jr. (6-5, 345), Daniel Faalele (6-9, 400) and Conner Olson (6-5, 305). The lone loss was Jared Weyler who is putting his double major in Accounting and Entrepreneurial Management to good use.
- ▶ Sam Schlueter (6-6, 325) starts at left tackle, which means the U's starting linemen are 6-5 or taller and combine to weigh 1,700 pounds (340 pound average).
- ▶ Daniel Faalele missed the Nebraska game with an injury and that shuffled the line. From left to right, Minnesota lined up with Schlueter, Olson, John Michael Schmitz (Coach Fleck calls him the team's sixth starter), Dunlap and Andries. Faalele was back in the starting rotation at Rutgers.

LINE IN THE SAND

- ▶ Joe Rossi took over as defensive coordinator after Minnesota's 55-31 loss at Illinois last year. Since then the Gophers are 9-1. In five of those games (2018: Purdue, Georgia Tech; 2019: Illinois, Nebraska, Rutgers) the Gophers have allowed 10 or less offensive points. Minnesota did not allow an offensive touchdown against Illinois. It was the first time the Gophers have held a Big Ten opponent without an offensive touchdown since Nov. 10, 2012 at Illinois. The Gophers did not allow an offensive touchdown against Nebraska until the fourth quarter. That touchdown stopped a stretch of 111:27 without allowing an offensive touchdown for the Minnesota defense. Rutgers did not score until the fourth quarter as well.
- ▶ The Gophers have allowed only 31 points in the past three Big Ten games (17 Illinois, 7 Nebraska, 7 Rutgers). However, only 17 of those points have been allowed by the defense, as Illinois scored two defensive touchdowns. The last time the Gophers allowed 31 or less points in three straight Big Ten games was in 1980 (6 Iowa, 18 Illinois, 7 Indiana) and the last time they gave up 17 or less offensive points was in 1967 (0 Michigan State, 15 Michigan, 0 Iowa).
- ▶ The Gophers held Fresno State to just 57 yards rushing and Illinois to 91 rushing yards. They allowed only 75 passing yards against Georgia Southern and 48 to Rutgers. Prior to this season the defense had not

allowed less than 100 yards passing in a game since 2017. The Gophers team pass efficiency of 104.66 is ranked seventh in the entire country and third in the Big Ten. They also rank No. 11 in the NCAA and second in the Big Ten with nine interceptions this season.

- ▶ The Gophers have not allowed more than 300 total yards in five straight games. Meanwhile the Gophers offense has gone four straight games with more than 400 yards.

MINNESOTA MADE

- ▶ Thomas Barber, Carter Coughlin and Kamal Martin are in their final season. Barber and Coughlin are legacy Gophers, while Martin is from Burnsville, Minn.
- ▶ Carter Coughlin has made 136 career tackles in 42 games and 34.5 of them (25.4%) have been a tackle for loss and 20.5 of them (15.1%) have been a sack. Coughlin ranks tied for fifth in school history in tackles for loss with 34.5 (Willie VanDeSteege is first with 43.5) and fifth in sacks with 20.5 (Karon Riley is first with 29.0). Coughlin has 26 tackles, four tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks this season.
- ▶ Thomas Barber has 38 tackles this season and 246 in his career. He is 54 stops shy of reaching 300 tackles. Barber (12 tackles in 2016, 115 in 2017 and 81 in 2018) would be the 11th Gopher ever to reach 300 career tackles and the first since 1999 Jim Thorpe Award winner Tyrone Carter (Carter ranks first in school history with 528 tackles from 1996-99). Barber has also recovered six career fumbles. One more will rank him tied for second in school history, while Stephen Thompson holds the school record (recovered eight career fumbles from 1967-70).
- ▶ Kamal Martin has played in only five games this year, but he leads the Gophers with 46 tackles (9.2 average per game). He made two interceptions against Purdue and led the team in tackles against Illinois, Nebraska and tied for the lead against Rutgers. He forced two fumbles against Illinois and set a career high with 15 tackles against Nebraska. He was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts against Nebraska. He now has 156 tackles in 42 career games. He has made 10.5 tackles for loss and totaled 2.5 sacks. In addition, he has four career interceptions and has forced four fumbles and recovered three.

PASS RUSH

- ▶ Eleven different players already have at least assisted on a sack and 17 have a tackle for loss this year in what has been a more spread out attack than a season ago. The Gophers have recorded 11 sacks in Big Ten play, including four against Nebraska. In 2018, the Gophers recorded 23 sacks but Carter Coughlin accounted for 9.5 (41.3%) by himself. They notched 71 tackles for loss but Coughlin and now NFL linebacker Blake Cashman accounted for 30 (42.2%).
- ▶ Sam Renner leads the team with 3.0 sacks. He also has broken up three passes at the line. The former walk-on from was named to the Pro Football Focus National Defensive Team of the Week after his game against Nebraska.
- ▶ A new wrinkle on third down by defensive coordinator Joe Rossi has grabbed early season attention. Four defensive ends – Carter Coughlin, Ezezi Otomewo, Boye Mafe and Tai'yon Devers – all come in together to rush the passer.

LAST LINE OF DEFENSE

- ▶ Three of the team's top five tacklers come out of the secondary in Antoine Winfield Jr. (40 total), Chris Williamson (38 total) and Jordan Howden (36 total). The Gophers rank No. 11 in the NCAA and second in the Big Ten with nine interceptions this season.
- ▶ Antoine Winfield Jr. may never be allowed in Fresno, Calif. for the rest of his life. In back-to-back seasons Winfield called game with an interception to take away a Bulldog touchdown. In 2018 it came in the back of the end zone at TCF Bank Stadium with an acrobatic catch in the fourth quarter to prevent a game tying touchdown. This year it came in double overtime as Winfield broke off a route and jumped in front of a Bulldog receiver in the end zone to seal the victory.
- ▶ Antoine Winfield Jr. is a fourth-year sophomore. He has proven to be an electrifying difference maker when healthy but has been plagued by early season injuries the past two years. He was granted a waiver request for a sixth year of eligibility from the NCAA and has three years of eligibility (2019, 2020 and 2021) remaining. After a breakout freshman campaign in 2016, which included an interception returned for a touchdown, he made 20 tackles in 2017, blocked a field goal and broke up two passes before missing the final eight games with an injury. Early in 2018, Winfield found himself going viral in back-to-back weeks with a highlight reel punt return for a touchdown against New Mexico State and a game-clinching interception against Fresno State. He would suffer an injury in the fourth game of the season and would miss the rest of the year. Winfield is second on the team with 40 tackles (team leading 28 solo). He leads the team with four interceptions including a pick-six, a forced fumble and two sacks this season.
- ▶ Chris Williamson is Minnesota's lone senior in the secondary. He shook off some injuries and totaled 34 tackles in 11 games last year. However, 23 of those tackles – along with one sack, one interception, one forced fumble and four pass breakups – came in the final five games. In 2019, he already has a pick-six, two pass breakups, 38 tackles, 2.5 sacks and four tackles for loss.
- ▶ Jordan Howden was a true freshman walk-on in 2018 (since awarded a scholarship) and played in all 13 games last season. He recorded 45 tackles, broke up three passes and made one interception. He led the Gophers with a career high 12 tackles against SDSU. His 36 tackles are fifth on the team and four pass breakups are tied for second.
- ▶ Coney Durr has quietly been shutting down half the field for the Gophers defense. He leads the team with seven pass breakups and is a big reason why the Gophers have allowed less than 100 yards passing in two games this season.
- ▶ Benjamin St-Juste transferred to Minnesota after graduating from Michigan and will have three seasons of eligibility remaining (2019-20, 2020-21 & 2021-22). His role has increased as the season has progressed. He made his first start in the Maroon and Gold against Illinois and did not disappoint with five tackles including one for a loss and two pass breakups.
- ▶ Kiondre Thomas and converted wide receiver Phillip Howard each have one interception this year as well.

SOMETHING SPECIAL

- The Gophers have a fresh look on special teams after the graduation of Payton Jordahl and Emmitt Carpenter. Brady Weeks was the No. 1-ranked long snapper in the nation and enrolled in January. The Gophers also signed highly ranked kicker Michael Lantz. Their first ever field goal attempt was in double overtime from 37 yards at Fresno State. Lantz, who is one of 11 true freshman starting kickers in the nation, leads the U with 43 points (4 FGs, 31 PATs).
- Grant Ryerse is Minnesota's kickoff specialist. He has kicked off 44 times and has 24 touchbacks.
- In 2018, Jacob Herbers punted 51 times (fewest for the Gophers since they punted 38 times in 2005) and averaged 41.24 yards per punt (13th most in school history). He is on pace to punt even less in 2019 with just 26 punts so far this season. He did not attempt a punt in the final 101:48 of the season (final Minnesota punt of the season came at Wisconsin with 11:48 remaining in the second quarter). His puntless streak ended during Minnesota's first possession of 2019 when he punted with 11:36 left in the first quarter. Herbers pinned Purdue at the one and two yard lines and was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week. Ten of his 26 punts this season have landed opposing teams inside the 20-yard line.
- Casey O'Brien was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week after Minnesota's 42-7 win at Rutgers. O'Brien, who is a four-time cancer survivor, saw the first game action of his career at Rutgers. He held on Minnesota's final three point-after attempts against the Scarlet Knights, as the Gophers improved to 7-0. O'Brien gave the keynote address on behalf of the Big Ten football student-athletes at the Big Ten Football Kickoff Luncheon in July. There he spoke about being thankful and about how football helped him while he was battling cancer. O'Brien, who is a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, was featured on ESPN College GameDay earlier this year and his story has inspired fans around the nation. Minnesota leads the Big Ten with six conference Player Of The Week honors this year.

SQUEAKY CLEAN

- Minnesota has been one of the least penalized teams in the nation under head Coach Fleck. In 32 games, the Gophers have been penalized a total of 120 times for 1,142 yards. They have been penalized only 30 times this season which ranks No. 4 in the NCAA and first in the Big Ten. In the 32 games before Fleck started at Minnesota, The Gophers were penalized 186 times for 1,567 yards. Under Fleck, the Gophers have taken fewer penalties than their opponents in 25 of 32 games. Minnesota is 5-2 when it takes more or the same amount of penalties as its opponent.

KEEP AWAY

- The Gophers rank 13th in the NCAA (4th in B1G) in time of possession (33:33). Minnesota has eight scoring drives this season that have taken at least 10 plays and lasted more than five minutes. Last season, the Gophers had 18 scoring drives of more than 10 plays, but just 14 used more than five minutes.

STILL YOUNG

- The Gophers had 112 players in 2018 and 58 were freshmen. Minnesota had 78 underclassmen (69.6% of the roster). This year, Minnesota is comprised of 116 players and 82 of them are underclassmen.

Minnesota has 47 freshmen, 35 sophomores, 19 juniors and 15 seniors/grad transfers on the roster.

- Minnesota welcomed a school-record 14 student-athletes in January and has 31 true freshmen on the roster this year. The Gophers also have three new coaches in Rod Chance, Joe Harasymiak and Jim Panagos.

SENIORS, GRADUATES

- The Gophers have 11 seniors and four grad transfers (Micah Dew-Treadway, Alex Melvin, Benjamin St-Juste, Michael Tarbutt). Minnesota has only three seniors on offense: Shannon Brooks, Tyler Johnson and Rodney Smith. On defense, the Gophers have seven: Thomas Barber, Carter Coughlin, Winston DeLattiboudere, Tai'yon Devers, Kamal Martin, Sam Renner and Chris Williamson. Minnesota's one other senior is punter Jacob Herbers.
- Minnesota has 12 players who have already graduated in Thomas Barber, Winston DeLattiboudere, Micah Dew-Treadway (Notre Dame), Seth Green, Jacob Herbers, Alex Melvin (SMU), Samuel Pickerign, Sam Renner, Rodney Smith, Benjamin St-Juste (Michigan), Michael Tarbutt (Connecticut) and Bryce Witham.

EXTRA POINTS

- In middle school, Rodney Smith played the tuba. He claims his teacher thought he was so good that he wouldn't let him play anything else. Smith, who is the son of a high school head football coach, plays football with type 1 diabetes.
- Tyler Johnson played hockey when he was 7 and baseball until 7th grade but the future high school basketball and football star realized neither sport was for him. He led Minneapolis North to a state title in basketball and a runner-up finish in football.
- Thomas Barber's first love is hockey. He played through high school and people said he played the game like a football player.
- Tanner Morgan embraces being follicly challenged. He knew it was his destiny, as four men in his family are bald.
- Blaise Andries is an aspiring actuary (compiles and analyzes statistics) and does math paradoxes for fun.
- Demetrius Douglas is an amateur photographer.

TCF BANK STADIUM

- TCF Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey, MNF, NHL Stadium Series, international soccer, MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings and Minnesota United also played on campus.
- Minnesota is 45-29 at TCF Bank Stadium as the Gophers celebrate 10 years at the stadium. Minnesota is 16 games over .500 at homes, which is its best mark at the stadium. The Gophers opened the facility with a 20-13 win against Air Force on Sept. 12, 2009, but then dropped to 7-13 after 20 games. Since then (Nov. 26, 2011), Minnesota is 38-16 at home (70.3% win percentage) in its last 54 games.
- In 74 games at TCF Bank Stadium, the Gophers average 27.59 points and allow 23.78. In non-conference games, Minnesota averages 30.26 points and give up 20.83. Under Fleck, Minnesota is 13-5 at home and has averaged 29.77 points and has allowed 19.44.
