FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

1 Minnesota plays its third home game of the season on Friday when it faces Purdue. The game will be the 76th all-time meeting between the schools. Minnesota leads the series 39-33-3 and is 32-12-3 at home. Minnesota is 5-0 all-time against Purdue at TCF Bank Stadium with wins in 2009, 2012, 2014, 2016 and 2018. The Gophers last home loss to Purdue was a 45-31 setback at the Metrodome in 2007.

2 One of the most memorable games ever played in the series was in 1993 when Minnesota won 59-56 at home. Minnesota's Scott Eckers made his first career start and threw for 402 yards (fifth most in school history) and six touchdowns (school record). Omar Douglas caught eight passes for 149 yards and five touchdowns (school record), while Chris Darkins rushed 30 times for 149 yards and one score. Justin Konzernius returned an interception for a touchdown, while Purdue's Mike Alstott scored five times (four rushing). The game was tied 56-56 with 2:06 left. Minnesota drove 90 yards in eight plays and Mike Charlborg kicked the only field goal of the game (18 yards) to give Minnesota the win.

3 Mohamed Ibrahim leads the nation in rushing yards per game with an average of 178.8. He ranks 13th in the nation in rushing yards (715) despite playing in only four games. The 12 people above him have all played in seven or more games and the next closest individual who has played in only four games is Greg Bell of San Diego State, who is ranked 38th with 537 yards. Ibrahim ranks tied for seventh nationally in rushing touchdowns (10) and everyone ahead of him or tied with him has played in at least six games.

4 Mohamed Ibrahim has 10 career 100-yard rushing games, which includes a current streak of five in a row (rushed for 140 yards or more in 2020 Outback Bowl and first four games of the 2020 season). Ibrahim's five-game streak is tied for the third-longest in program history with Rodney Smith (did it in 2019), Amir Pinnix, Thomas Hamner and Paul Giel. Laurence Maroney is the only Gopher ever with longer streaks, as he rushed for 100 yards in six straight games from 11/13/04 - 9/24/05 and in a school record seven straight games from 12/31/03 - 10/9/04.

5 According to ESPN Stats and Information, Mohamed Ibrahim is the first Big Ten player with 140 rushing yards in five straight games since Michigan's Mike Hart in 2004. Ibrahim is also the first Big Ten player with at least 700 rushing yards through a team's first four games of a season since Wisconsin's Michael Bennett in 2000. Ibrahim leads the Big Ten in rushing attempts (130), rushing yards (715), rushing touchdowns (10) and scoring (60). Ibrahim's 10 touchdowns have covered a collective 34 yards (16 and 5 yards against Michigan; 1, 2, 1 and 1 yards at Maryland and 1, 2, 1 and 4 at Illinois). His 26 career touchdowns (9 in 2018, 7 in 2019 and 10 in 2020) rank seventh in school history.

TCF BANK STADIUM

Minnesota is 47-32 at TCF Bank Stadium. The Gophers opened TCF with a 20-13 win against Air Force in 2009, but then dropped to 7-13. Since Nov. 26, 2011, Minnesota is 40-19 at home in its last 59 games.

Minnesota is 15-8 at TCF Bank Stadium under Coach Fleck.

TCF Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher Hockey, MNF, an NHL game, international soccer, MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings and Minnesota United also played seasons on campus while their stadiums were being constructed.



HEAD COACH // FOURTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 39, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 54-40 and is 24-18 at Minnesota.

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to unprecedented heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. This was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

Minnesota was led on offense by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was paced by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold. He ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

Off the field, Minnesota had 53 players named Academic All-Big Ten and Blaise Andries and Sam Renner were named Academic All-Americans.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota's top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week, and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' tenth largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight wins with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck, which included a school record 3.21 in the 2019 fall semester.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team

to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well. In 2016, the Broncos had Willie Beavers (121st overall to the Minnesota Vikings) and Daniel Braverman (230th overall to the Chicago Bears) taken in the NFL Draft.

In the 2017, Fleck saw three of his former players selected from Western Michigan in Corey Davis (fifth overall to the Tennessee Titans), Taylor Moton (64th overall to the Carolina Panthers) and Keion Adams (248th overall to the Pittsburgh Steelers). Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which makes him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh are the only Power Five conference coaches who both played and coached in the NFL. Fleck, Harbaugh and East Carolina's Scottie Montgomery are the only coaches in the FBS who have played and coached in the NFL.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

MINNESOTA'S MORGAN

- ▶ Tanner Morgan has thrown a touchdown pass in a school-record 18 straight games (last game without a passing touchdown was Minnesota's 2018 victory at Wisconsin) and the Gophers are 13-5 in those games. Morgan was named All-Big Ten Second Team last year after setting school records for passing yards (3,253), touchdowns (30), completion percentage (66.0%), yards per game (250.2), TD-INT ratio (4.28) and pass efficiency rating (178.7).

IT'S A START

- ▶ Tanner Morgan is 16-7 as a starter and he ranks fourth in school history in touchdown passes (43), sixth in passing yards (5,423), eighth in completions (360) and 11th in passing attempts (576).

NEAR PERFECTION

- ▶ Tanner Morgan played two of the best games in Big Ten history last year, as he completed 21-of-22 passes (95.45%) for 396 yards and four touchdowns at Purdue and 18-of-20 passes (90%) for 339 yards and three touchdowns against Penn State. Florida State's Jameis Winston was the only other quarterback to have two games with 90% completion percentage, doing so during his Heisman Trophy-winning campaign in 2013. Morgan's 95.45 completion percentage at Purdue is the best mark in Big Ten history for any quarterback who attempted 15 or more passes.

BATEMAN'S BACK

- ▶ Rashod Bateman announced on Aug. 4 that he was forgoing his remaining eligibility at Minnesota because of personal health concerns surrounding COVID-19. However, he opted back in after the Big Ten announced its safety guidelines for the 2020 season and on Sept. 30 his eligibility was restored by the NCAA.

AGENT ZERO

- ▶ Rashod Bateman set Minnesota freshman and sophomore receiving records wearing No. 13, but is wearing No. 0 in 2020. Bateman is the first Gopher ever to wear No. 0 and switched from No. 13 to No. 0 because there is zero tolerance for racism in Minnesota's culture and it is a call to action to end racism in our society.

ALL-AMERICAN RECEIVER

- ▶ Rashod Bateman has played in 30 games for Minnesota and is one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold. He has 143 career catches (6th in school history) for 2,336 yards (6th in school history) and 19 touchdowns (fifth in school history). Bateman was named Third-Team All-American, All-Big Ten First Team, Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2019. He caught 60 passes for 1,219 yards (second most in a single season) and 11 touchdowns (tied for second most in a single season) last year.

RECORD SETTER

- ▶ Rashod Bateman has caught at least one pass in all 30 games (fifth in school history) he has played in and has 10 career 100-yard receiving games (fourth in school history). He set school sophomore records for receiving yards (1,219) and touchdowns (11) and set school freshman records for receptions (51) and receiving yards (704).

BATEMAN'S BANK

- ▶ Rashod Bateman has totaled 561 receiving yards in his last four home games at TCF Bank Stadium. He opened this year with nine catches against Michigan for 101 yards and had eight catches for 111 yards against Iowa. He ended last season with 147 yards against Wisconsin and 203 yards against Penn State. His 203 yards against Penn State is a stadium record, while his 147 yards against Wisconsin is the second most ever for a Gopher at TCF Bank Stadium.

MIGHTY MO

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim ranks 10th on Minnesota's career rushing list with 2,479 yards despite playing in only 25 games. Forced into a starting role because of injuries to Rodney Smith and Shannon Brooks in 2018, Ibrahim rushed 217 times for 1,160 yards (second most ever for a Gopher freshman) and nine touchdowns. He rushed for more than 100 yards in five games in 2018 to become the first Gopher freshman to do so since Laurence Maroney (five 100-yard games) in 2003 and set a freshman single-game record with 224 yards against Georgia Tech.

LAST FIVE GAMES

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim has rushed 150 times for 855 yards (5.7 average) and 11 touchdowns in his last five games. He ended last season with 140 yards and one touchdown against Auburn and then opened this season with 140 yards and two scores versus Michigan. Ibrahim then churned out 207 yards and four scores at Maryland and 224 yards and four touchdowns at Illinois. He also notched 144 rushing yards against Iowa.

ALL-PURPOSE YARDS

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim set a career high with 282 all-purpose yards (224 rush, 31 receiving, 27 kick return) at Illinois. His 282 all-purpose yards ranks as the seventh most productive game in school history and are the most for a Gopher running back since Laurence Maroney had 333 (ranks second all-time in school history) versus Purdue in 2005.

MORE MO

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim's three career 200-yard games are tied for first in school history. Ibrahim rushed a career high 41 times for 207 yards and four touchdowns at Maryland and rushed 30 times for 224 yards and four touchdowns at Illinois. Ibrahim became the first Big Ten back to rush for 200 yards and four touchdowns in consecutive games since Larry Johnson (Penn State, 2002). Ibrahim is only the second Gopher ever to record two consecutive 200-yard rushing games (Terry Jackson II in 2002 vs. Northwestern and Michigan State) and his eight touchdowns in two consecutive games is a school record. At Maryland, Ibrahim's four touchdowns all came in the first half, making him the second Gopher ever to rush for four touchdowns in one half. Minnesota's all-time rushing leader (and radio analyst) Darrell Thomson rushed for four second-half scores against Bowling Green in 1986.

MILESTONES

- ▶ Rashod Bateman, Mohamed Ibrahim and Tanner Morgan all hit milestones this year. Bateman (receiving) and Ibrahim (rushing) eclipsed 2,000 career yards, while Morgan crossed 5,000. Bateman has 413 receiving yards this year and now has 2,336 career receiving yards, which ranks sixth all-time in school history. Ibrahim has 715 rushing yards this year and now has 2,479 career rushing yards, which ranks 10th all-time in school history. Morgan has thrown for 769 yards this season and now has 5,423 career passing yards, which ranks sixth all-time in school history.

LITTLE, BUT A LOT

- ▶ Minnesota lost only three seniors (Tyler Johnson, Rodney Smith and Shannon Brooks) on offense from last season, but all were significant contributors. Johnson is Minnesota's all-time leading receiver, while Smith is Minnesota's career record-holder for all-purpose yards and Brooks scored 22 career touchdowns.

RING THE BELL

- ▶ Chris Autman-Bell has been Minnesota's No. 3 receiver each of the past two seasons, but has a larger role this year. He has played in 30 career games and has made 65 catches for 1,006 yards (27th Gopher with 1,000 career receiving yards) and six touchdowns. He has caught at least one pass in 29 games and has made one catch in 24 straight games. He made 28 catches for 371 yards and five touchdowns in 2019 and made 28 catches (fourth all-time for a Minnesota freshman) for 449 yards (third all-time for a Minnesota freshman) in 2018. He also led the team with a 16.03 yards per catch average in 2018.

THE FIRST 100

- ▶ Chris Autman-Bell recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game at Maryland when he caught four passes for 112 yards and one touchdown. His previous high was 97 yards (last season at Purdue).

GREEN LINE

- ▶ Seth Green has played in 30 games, primarily as a Wildcat QB. He has rushed 109 times for 389 yards and 14 TDs. Green has completed 5-of-6 career passes for 37 yards (3 TDs) and has three career receptions (45 yards).

DRAFTED

- ▶ Minnesota had five players (four defense, one offense) selected in the 2020 NFL Draft. The Buccaneers took Antoine Winfield Jr. and Tyler Johnson, while the Giants picked Carter Coughlin and Chris Williamson. The Packers took Kamal Martin. The five players are the most for the Gophers in the modern-day NFL Draft, which features seven rounds. Minnesota last had five players drafted in 1990, but that is when the draft had 12 rounds.

CONSISTENT VOICE

- ▶ Joe Rossi took over as Gopher defensive coordinator after Minnesota's 55-31 loss at Illinois in 2018. Since then, the Gophers are 15-6. In 2019, the Gophers ranked tenth in the nation in total defense, allowing only 306.6 yards per game (fewest amount since 1977). Minnesota, which allowed only 22.5 points per game last year, was ninth in the nation in passing yards allowed (184.2) and 23rd in rushing defense (122.4). The Gophers were 17th in interceptions (14) and 24th in first downs defense (229).

FAMILY ROOM DEFENSE

- ▶ Minnesota's family room defense is replacing four NFL Draft picks and its top four tacklers from 2019. Minnesota's most experienced defensive position is its secondary, despite replacing All-American safety Antoine Winfield Jr. Minnesota returned Coney Durr and Benjamin St-Juste, who each totaled 10 pass breakups last season. Jordan Howden, who made 57 tackles a year ago, returns at one safety spot and lanky sophomore Tyler Nubin (team-leading 25 tackles) fills Winfield's spot. Veterans Justus Harris, Calvin Swenson, Phillip Howard (started vs Iowa) and Terrell Smith provide depth.

LINED UP

- ▶ Notre Dame grad transfer and lone returning starter Micah Dew-Treadway (1.0 TFL, 1 FF) anchors the rebuilt defensive line. Redshirt freshman DeAngelo Carter starts as well and has one sack and one interception - off of a Boye Mafe pass breakup - which he returned 21 yards at Maryland. Mafe has 16 tackles, 3.5 sacks, two pass breakups and one forced fumble, while Ezezi Otomewu has 11 tackles and one sack.

IN THE MIDDLE

- ▶ Mariano Sori-Marin leads a young group of linebackers this year. He made 42 tackles last season, as he saw extensive action in relief of an injured Kamal Martin. Sori-Marin has 20 tackles this season and has three pass breakups. Josh Aune, true freshman Cody Lindenberg and James Gordon have also started this year. Aune has played in 17 career games, but mostly on special teams. Gordon has played in eight career games and so has fellow linebacker Donald Willis, who has also seen action this year.

KICKERS, PUNTERS

- ▶ The Gophers return their starting long snapper in Brady Weeks and kicker in Michael Lantz. Lantz was second on the team in scoring last season with 71 points. Brock Walker added 15 points (3 FG, 6 PAT) when Lantz was injured and kicked for Minnesota in its first two games this year while Lantz was not available. Lantz kicked for Minnesota at Illinois and against Iowa. Middle Tennessee State grad transfer Matthew Stephenson punted in the first two games for Minnesota, while 26-year old freshman Mark Crawford from Australia was not available. Crawford punted against Illinois and Iowa.

SOMETHING SPECIAL

- ▶ Preston Jelen (5-10, 210) has turned into a special teams standout. He blocked a punt against Michigan and Minnesota scored two plays later (Morgan 14 yards to Kieft). The blocked punt was the first for the Gophers since Justus Harris did so against Indiana in 2018. Jelen also notched three tackles on special teams at Maryland.

LAST 19

- ▶ Minnesota is 14-5 in its last 19 games (wins against Auburn, Fresno State, Georgia Southern, Georgia Tech, Illinois (2X), Maryland, Nebraska, Northwestern, Penn State, Purdue, Rutgers, South Dakota State and Wisconsin). Minnesota's 14-5 mark is tied with Wisconsin and Iowa for second in the Big Ten behind Ohio State (18-1). Penn State and Indiana are both 12-7, while Michigan is 10-9. Michigan State and Northwestern are 9-10, while Nebraska is 8-11. Purdue and Illinois are both 7-12, while Maryland is 5-14 and Rutgers is 3-16.

11 WINS

- ▶ Minnesota was one of only three Big Ten teams to win at least 11 games last season. The Gophers finished 11-2 and were joined in the 11-win category by Ohio State (13-1) and Penn State (11-2). Minnesota beat Penn State 31-26 and did not play Ohio State.

FRIDAY FOOTBALL

- ▶ Minnesota plays its third and final Friday game this year when it hosts Purdue. Minnesota is 6-2 under head coach P.J. Fleck in non-Saturday games. It is 1-2 on Friday (beat Indiana in 2018, lost to Maryland and Iowa in 2020), 2-0 on Wednesday (bowl wins against Auburn and Georgia Tech) and 3-0 on Thursday (beat Buffalo, New Mexico State and South Dakota State).

NEW COACHES

- ▶ P.J. Fleck hired three new assistants prior to the 2020 season in Mike Sanford Jr. (OC / QBs), Paul Haynes (Cornerbacks) and Chad Wilt (Defensive Line).

COACHING EXPERIENCE

- ▶ Four of Minnesota's assistant coaches have head coaching experience. Mike Sanford Jr. (OC/QBs) was the head coach at Western Kentucky from 2017-18, while Paul Haynes (Cornerbacks) led Kent State from 2013-17. Joe Harasymiak (Defensive Backs, Safeties and Co-DC) was the head coach at Maine from 2016-18 and was named the 2018 FCS Coach of the Year. Clay Patterson (Tight Ends) was the head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College from 2016-17, earning conference coach of the year honors in 2017.

SPIRIT AWARD

- ▶ Multiple-time cancer survivor Casey O'Brien is back for another season. O'Brien gave the keynote address at the Big Ten Football Kickoff Luncheon in July 2019 and then played against Rutgers and Maryland last season. He received the 2019 Disney Spirit Award for being college football's most inspirational figure.

CALLING CARD

- ▶ Two hallmarks of a P.J. Fleck team have been controlling the clock and playing clean football. Minnesota ended 2019 ranked fourth in the nation in time of possession at 34:12 and tied for fifth in fewest penalties per game at 4.31. Minnesota won the time of possession battle against Michigan and at Maryland and took fewer penalties than both the Wolverines and Terrapins. However, the Gophers lost both games. Minnesota righted the ship against Illinois (37:35 possession time and only two penalties) as it won 41-14.

AWAY FROM HOME

- ▶ Minnesota is 8-2 in its last 10 games away from TCF Bank Stadium.

100 YARDS

- ▶ Minnesota is 15-5 under Coach Fleck when it has a 100-yard rusher. However, it is 1-3 this year.

SCORING FIRST

- ▶ Minnesota is 20-3 all-time under Coach Fleck when it scores first.

NONCONFERENCE WINS

- ▶ Minnesota has won a nation-leading 19-straight non-conference games. The Gophers last nonconference loss was to No. 2 TCU in 2015.
