Weekend Info

For the second straight year the Gophers will compete at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational, The Invitational is one of the most prestigious softball tournaments in the entire country with every game presented on one of the ESPN Family of Networks.

All four of the Gophers game will be available on ESPN3. Minnesota is just one of two Big Ten teams invited and the only Big Ten team to be invited in both seasons of the SPC Invite. They will face three top-20 teams in No. 16/16 Oklahoma State, No. 5/5 Florida State and No.19/18 Missouri. The fourth team Minnesota will play is Virginia Tech who is receiving votes in both major polls.

Oklahoma State made the WCWS last season and are 2-2 to start the 2020 season.

Florida State began 2020 with a perfect 5-0 record. most notably knocking off No. 1 Alabama in both meetings (8-7 in eight innings, 8-0 in five innings).

Virginia Tech is coming off an ACC regular season title and are 4-1 to start the year.

Mizzou was a perfect 5-0 at the NFCA Division I Leadoff Classic and handed Minnesota their first loss of the season.

Weekend Recap

The Gophers went 3-2 at the NFCA Div. I Leadoff Classic to open the season. They picked up victories over Missouri State, NC State and South Alabama and fell to Missouri and No. 15/14 at the time Kentucky.

The Gophers won in different ways on opening day. They topped Missouri State 1-0 in a pitcher's duel and used timely hitting to outscore NC State, 13-7. The Gophers fought back to force extra inning against Missouri but lost 7-4 in the eighth. They used eight runs in the seventh inning to cruise past South Alabama 10-0. A Sunday tradition was snapped against Kentucky when the Gophers fell 7-0. Last season, Minnesota went 14-0 on Sunday games.

In the circle, sophomore transfer Autumn Pease impressed in her Minnesota debut. She made two starts and a total of four appearances. She finished the weekend 1-0 with 13 innings pitched and 19 strikeouts. All-American Amber Fiser led the entire tournament with 38 strikeouts on the weekend.

MaKenna Partain was named to the NFCA D1 Leadoff All-Tournament Team after an outstanding performance. The senior finished the weekend with three doubles, a triple, five RBIs and drew four walks to finish with a .389 batting average and a .500 on base percentage.

Fiser's Finest

Amber Fiser has already cemented herself as one of the top players in Gopher softball history and is making a case for one of the top players in all of NCAA softball. She is fifth all-time in program history in wins (74) and strikeouts (704). With UCLA's Rachel Garcia taking an Olympic redshirt, Fiser is the NCAA active leader in strikeouts.

In 2019, Fiser was named a First Team NFCA All-American, was a Honda Cup Award Finalist and was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year. She ranked third in the NCAA in wins, fifth in strike-outs and 12th in ERA. Her 31 wins on the season tied for second all-time in program history and 346 strikeouts was third all-time. She set a school record and matched a conference record with six Big Ten Pitcher of the Week awards. She also picked up two NFCA Division I Pitcher of the Week awards.

Fiser can't seem to get over the 13 strikeout mark. She has hit the impressive number seven times in her career including twice already in opening weekend. She tossed 38 strikeouts last weekend and leads the NCAA in season strikeouts. Fiser pitched four complete game one-hitters in 2019. She has thrown two no-hitters in her career, both in 2018. Her last one was a perfect game at Purdue on Apr. 27, 2018.

The Van Horne, lowa native opened the season as the No. 7 ranked player on Softball America's Top-100 list. She is also a Softball America Preseason All-American and was named to the USA Softball Top-50 Collegiate Player of the Year Watch List.

Run MaKenna, Run!

MaKenna Partain has etched her name into Gophers history and has a chance to leave as one of the most productive offensive players in team history but has done so quietly when it comes to national attention. She has already made 180 career starts with the majority of her action coming at second base. She is tied for fifth in career runs at 165 and seventh in career doubles at 45. Both records are in reach as Tyler Walker holds the record with 197 career runs and Kaitlyn Richardson has the doubles record with 64. Partain spent last season as the Gophers leadoff batter and broke the program single season record with 66 runs. She also set program and Big Ten record with five runs scored at Maryland on Mar. 23.

Partain led Minnesota in batting average (.383), runs (66), hits (72), triples (4) and on base percentage (.484) in 2019. She is a two-time All-Big Ten honoree and a three-time NFCA All-Great Lakes All-Region selection. She was named a Preseason All-American by Softball America and earned NFCA D1 Leadoff All-Tournament honors a week ago.

Fresh Faces

Last year the Gophers were boosted in a big way by freshman Natalie DenHartog and transfer Hope Brandner. DenHartog was an NFCA Top-3 Freshman of the Year finalist and earned First Team All-Big Ten and All-Region honors. She hit .373, with 17 doubles, two triples and 17 home runs with a team leading 64 RBIs and a .780 slugging percentage. Brandner led team with 19 home runs which is the third highest in program single season history. She is not currently medically cleared to play and her status moving forward is not yet known.

This year the Gophers have eight new faces looking to make their mark. They brought in transfers Brooke Vander Heide (All-Region outfield honoree from BYU) and Autumn Pease (Big Sky-Co-Freshman of the Year in the circle from Idaho State). They also welcome freshmen Sydney Strelow, Olivia Peterson, Delanie Cox, Kianna Jones, Ava Dueck and Shyann Beddow. Strelow and Peterson split time as the team's starting catcher a week ago. Peterson scored the game winning run against Missouri State while Strelow led the team with a .615 on base percentage.



Jane Sage Cowles Stadium is in it's 21st season hosting the Minnesota softball program. In the same location as the Bierman Softball Complex, the field was reconstructed and renamed in 2000 thanks to a generous donation from Sage and John Cowles. The complex holds dimensions of 205 feet at the corners and 220 feet to straight-away center field. In 2019, the Gophers became the first Big Ten team since Michigan in 2016 to advance to the Women's College World Series. They were the first team other than Michigan since Nebraska in 2013 to advance and became just the fifth Big Ten team going back to 1987 to make it to the WCWS.

Minnesota has placed themselves firmly at the top of the Big ten year-after-year with seven straight seasons in the top-3 including a regular season title in 2017. They have also made it to the Big Ten Tournament Championship game in five of the last six seasons including the last four straight and have won four titles in that span.

HEAD COACH » JAMIE TRACHSEL

Jamie Trachsel enters her third season as the head coach of the University of Minnesota softball team after being named the Gophers' seventh head coach in program history on July 24, 2017.

Trachsel led the Gophers to historic heights in her second season leading the program. Minnesota finished the year with a 46-14 record and reached the Women's College World Series for the first time ever in the NCAA era. They rolled through the Minneapolis Regional with three wins, one over NDSU and two over Georgia. They followed with two victories over LSU in the first ever Minneapolis Super Regional. Trachsel coached five All-Big Ten honorees and five NFCA Great Lakes All-Region honorees. Under Trachsel's watch, Amber Fiser was also named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and a First Team All-American.

The Gophers closed out the 2019 season ranked No. 8 in both the USA Today/NFCA Top-25 Coaches Poll and the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top-25 Poll. The No. 8 ranking is the highest the Gophers have finished a season in either major poll. They also finished No. 7 in the NCAA RPI, which is not only the highest RPI to finish a season, but the highest at any point in program history. Trachsel and her staff were named the NFCA Great Lakes All-Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

The Gophers have also made history in the classroom under Trachsel. Their term GPA of 3.63 set in the spring of 2019 was the highest in program history. Eleven different players notched 2019 Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In her first season at the helm of the program, Trachsel led the Gophers to a 41-17 season, their third straight Big Ten Tournament title and sixth consecutive NCAA tournament. Four Gophers earned All-Region honors, four earned All-Big Ten and Kendyl Lindaman was named Big Ten Player of the Year while earing All-American honors. A notable win during the 2018 season was the Gophers upset win over No. 9 Arizona in Tucson Arizona on March 14. The Gophers snagged a 1-0 win in extras to mark just the second time in 30 seasons that the Gophers defeated Arizona and just the fourth win all time in the series. The Gophers closed out the season winning 21 of their final 24 games.

Trachsel came to Dinkytown from Iowa State, where she led the Cyclones for one year following six at the helm of perennial NCAA Tournament contender North Dakota State.

Trachsel arrived in Ames following 14 seasons at North Dakota State, including the final six as co-head coach. In those half-dozen seasons, NDSU compiled a 221-109 overall record (.670), a 98-19 mark (.838) in the Summit League and advanced to NCAA Regional play five times. The Bison won their conference regular-season championship and the tournament championship five times each with Trachsel as co-head coach.

North Dakota State won at least 30 games – including a school-record 45 in 2015 when it climbed as high as 41st in the NCAA Percentage Ratings Index (RPI) – for 10 straight seasons. The Bison advanced to the NCAA Regionals seven of the last eight years. The 2009 club won the Norman (Okla.) Regional to advance to the NCAA Super Regional in Tempe (Ariz.).

Her tenure with NDSU began with two seasons (2002-04) as a graduate assistant, followed by three (2005-07) as an assistant coach, three (2008-10) as associate head coach and the last six (2011-16) as co-head coach.




