#### **Weekend Info**

The Gophers are on the road again this weekend and will compete in the Baylor Invitational in Waco, Texas.

The Baylor Invitational began in 1981 and has since been played in 1982, 1983, 1985, 1986, 2015. Minnesota is one of two Big Ten teams to be invited to this year's invitational.

Minnesota will face Tulsa and Texas State twice each and will have one game against Baylor. All four of the Gophers games against Tulsa and Texas State will be available on FloSports Minnesota's matchup against Baylor can be streamed on Big 12 Now on ESPN+. Baylor and Tulsa are receiving votes in both major polls coming into the weekend.

Texas State swept all five games of last weekend's Bobcat Classic and is now 7-2 on the season.

Tulsa earned a bid to the NCAA Stillwater Regional last season and is 8-1 overall in 2020 after a sweep in the Mercer Invitational and strong performance in the Bulldog Kickoff Classic.

Baylor is 8-2 and is coming off a sweep through the Getterman Classic.

### Weekend Recap

Minnesota went 2-2 in the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational this past weekend. The Gophers topped No. 5 Florida State in walk-off fashion and defeated No. 19 Missouri in six innings. They fell to No. 16 Oklahoma State and Virginia Tech, who was receiving votes.

The weekend was highlighted by a walk-off victory against No. 5 Florida State. After a back-and-forth game and true team effort, freshman Sydney Strelow delivered the game-winning RBI-single. Earlier in the day, the Gophers couldn't get the bats going and fell 2-0 to Oklahoma State. The Minnesota comeback effort fell short against Virginia Tech on Saturday and lost 2-1. Big fourth and sixth innings allowed the Gophers to top Missouri 10-1 in six innings on Sunday.

Autumn Pease was an instrumental piece in the upset over No. 5 Florida State. The sophomore tossed six innings of work in the game and struck out six to pick up the victory and move to 2-0 on the season.

Through nine games, Natalie DenHartog leads the Gophers in batting average (.440), runs (7), slugging percentage (.640), and on base percentage (.600). She has also been hit by seven pitches and ranks second in the country in HBPs per game.

#### **Fiser's Finest**

Amber Fiser has already cemented herself as one of the top players in Gopher softball history and is making a case for one of the top players in all of NCAA softball. She is fifth all-time in program history in wins (75) and strikeouts (737). With UCLA's Rachel Garcia taking an Olympic redshirt, Fiser is the NCAA active leader in strikeouts.

In 2019, Fiser was named a First Team NFCA All-American, was a Honda Cup Award Finalist and was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year. She ranked third in the NCAA in wins, fifth in strikeouts and 12th in ERA. Her 31 wins on the season tied for second all-time in program history and 346 strikeouts was third all-time. She set a school record and matched a conference record with six Big Ten Pitcher of the Week awards. She also picked up two NFCA Division I Pitcher of the Week awards.

Fiser can't seem to get over the 13-strikeout mark. She has hit the impressive number seven times in her career including twice already in opening weekend. She tossed 33 strikeouts last weekend and leads the NCAA in season strikeouts. Fiser pitched four complete game one-hitters in 2019. She has thrown two no-hitters in her career, both in 2018. Her last one was a perfect game at Purdue on Apr. 27, 2018.

#### Run MaKenna, Run!

MaKenna Partain has etched her name into Gophers history and has a chance to leave as one of the most productive offensive players in team history but has done so guietly when it comes to national attention. She has already made 185 career starts with the majority of her action coming at second base. She is tied for fifth in career runs at 168 and seventh in career doubles at 46. Both records are in reach as Tyler Walker holds the record with 197 career runs and Kaitlyn Richardson has the doubles record with 64. Partain spent last season as the Gophers leadoff batter and broke the program single season record with 66 runs. She also set program and Big Ten record with five runs scored at Maryland on Mar. 23.

Partain led Minnesota in batting average (.383), runs (66), hits (72), triples (4) and on base percentage (.484) in 2019. She is a two-time All-Big Ten honoree and a three-time NFCA All-Great Lakes All-Region selection.

#### Fresh Faces

Last year the Gophers were boosted in a big way by freshman Natalie DenHartog and transfer Hope Brandner. DenHartog was an NFCA Top-3 Freshman of the Year finalist and earned First Team All-Big Ten and All-Region honors. She hit .373, with 17 doubles, two triples and 17 home runs with a team leading 64 RBIs and a .780 slugging percentage. Brandner led the team with 19 home runs which is the third highest in program single season history. She is not currently medically cleared to play and her status moving forward is not yet known.

This year the Gophers have eight new faces looking to make their mark. They brought in transfers Brooke Vander Heide (All-Region outfield honoree from BYU) and Autumn Pease (Big Sky-Co-Freshman of the Year in the circle from Idaho State). They also welcomed freshmen Sydney Strelow, Olivia Peterson, Delanie Cox, Kianna Jones, Ava Dueck and Shyann Beddow. Strelow shined in Minnesota's victory against No. 5 Florida State. She launched her first career home run and followed it up with a seventh inning, two out walk-off single to lift the Gophers to victory. Kianna Jones also showed power in her bat, blasting a solo shot to deep center against Missouri in the SPC Elite Invitational.

#### Where in the World is Carlie Brandt!?

Carlie Brandt has played seven positions in her Gophers career. She has found a home at shortstop in the early part of 2020 and has made a big impact. She finished last weekend with two doubles, a triple, three RBIs and two runs scored.



Jane Sage Cowles Stadium is in it's 21st season hosting the Minnesota softball program. In the same location as the Bierman Softball Complex, the field was reconstructed and renamed in 2000 thanks to a generous donation from Sage and John Cowles. The complex holds dimensions of 205 feet at the corners and 220 feet to straight-away center field. The facility has both grandstand (bench-back), stadium (box-chair) and with additional portable bleacher seating down the left field line Jane Sage Cowles Stadium can hold a capacity 1,450 fans.

In 2019, the Gophers became the first Big Ten team since Michigan in 2016 to advance to the Women's College World Series. They were the first team other than Michigan since Nebraska in 2013 to advance and became just the fifth Big Ten team going back to 1987 to make it to the WCWS.

Minnesota has placed themselves firmly at the top of the Big ten year-after-year with seven straight seasons in the top-3 including a regular season title in 2017. They have also made it to the Big Ten Tournament Championship game in five of the last six seasons including the last four straight and have won four titles in that span.

### **HEAD COACH » JAMIE TRACHSEL**

Jamie Trachsel enters her third season as the head coach of the University of Minnesota softball team after being named the Gophers' seventh head coach in program history on July 24, 2017.

Trachsel led the Gophers to historic heights in her second season leading the program. Minnesota finished the year with a 46-14 record and reached the Women's College World Series for the first time ever in the NCAA era. They rolled through the Minneapolis Regional with three wins, one over NDSU and two over Georgia. They followed with two victories over LSU in the first ever Minneapolis Super Regional. Trachsel coached five All-Big Ten honorees and five NFCA Great Lakes All-Region honorees. Under Trachsel's watch, Amber Fiser was also named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and a First Team All-American.

The Gophers closed out the 2019 season ranked No. 8 in both the USA Today/NFCA Top-25 Coaches Poll and the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top-25 Poll. The No. 8 ranking is the highest the Gophers have finished a season in either major poll. They also finished No. 7 in the NCAA RPI, which is not only the highest RPI to finish a season, but the highest at any point in program history. Trachsel and her staff were named the NFCA Great Lakes All-Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

The Gophers have also made history in the classroom under Trachsel. Their term GPA of 3.63 set in the spring of 2019 was the highest in program history. Eleven different players notched 2019 Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In her first season at the helm of the program, Trachsel led the Gophers to a 41-17 season, their third straight Big Ten Tournament title and sixth consecutive NCAA tournament. Four Gophers earned All-Region honors, four earned All-Big Ten and Kendyl Lindaman was named Big Ten Player of the Year while earing All-American honors. A notable win during the 2018 season was the Gophers upset win over No. 9 Arizona in Tucson Arizona on March 14. The Gophers snagged a 1-0 win in extras to mark just the second time in 30 seasons that the Gophers defeated Arizona and just the fourth win all time in the series. The Gophers closed out the season winning 21 of their final 24 games.

Trachsel came to Dinkytown from Iowa State, where she led the Cyclones for one year following six at the helm of perennial NCAA Tournament contender North Dakota State.

Trachsel arrived in Ames following 14 seasons at North Dakota State, including the final six as co-head coach. In those half-dozen seasons, NDSU compiled a 221-109 overall record (.670), a 98-19 mark (.838) in the Summit League and advanced to NCAA Regional play five times. The Bison won their conference regular-season championship and the tournament championship five times each with Trachsel as co-head coach.

North Dakota State won at least 30 games – including a school-record 45 in 2015 when it climbed as high as 41st in the NCAA Percentage Ratings Index (RPI) – for 10 straight seasons. The Bison advanced to the NCAA Regionals seven of the last eight years. The 2009 club won the Norman (Okla.) Regional to advance to the NCAA Super Regional in Tempe (Ariz.).

Her tenure with NDSU began with two seasons (2002-04) as a graduate assistant, followed by three (2005-07) as an assistant coach, three (2008-10) as associate head coach and the last six (2011-16) as co-head coach.
