FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

1 Coming off a bye week, Minnesota (3-2, 1-1 B1G) returns to the field this weekend as it plays host to Nebraska (3-3, 1-2 B1G) Saturday at 11 a.m. on ESPN2.

2 Minnesota punter **Mark Crawford** was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week after a standout performance in the Gophers' 20-13 win at Purdue on Oct. 2. Crawford, who shared the honor with Jordan Stout of Penn State, continually flipped the field in a rain-soaked game against the Boilermakers, as he averaged 51.3 yards on six punts. He recorded a career-long, 60-yard punt twice, which was Minnesota's longest punt since Ryan Santoso had a 61-yarder against Illinois on Oct. 21, 2017. Crawford is the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week since holder **Casey O'Brien** was recognized on Oct. 21, 2019, and he's the first Minnesota punter to receive the honor since 2013 when **Peter Mortell** was recognized on Nov. 4 and Nov. 11. 3 The Golden Gophers have one of the strongest rush defenses in the country, ranking fifth nationally by allowing just 77.0 rushing yards per game this year. In fact, Minnesota has given up just 80 yards in the last three games combined (-19 at Colorado, 22 vs. Bowling Green, 77 at Purdue). The -19 rushing yards allowed at Colorado on Sept. 18 are the fewest by any FBS team this year with the next fewest coming when Colorado State held South Dakota State to -9 on Sept. 3. The next closest involving two Power 5 teams came Sept. 4 when Georgia limited Clemson to two yards rushing. Minnesota is fourth nationally in fewest opponent rush yards (385), fifth in opponent rush attempts (136) and 13th in opponent yards per rush (2.83) and opponent rushing touchdowns (4).

4 Not including the 2020 season that saw the schedule altered multiple times due to COVID, Minnesota is 2-2 under **P.J. Fleck** coming off a bye week. Most recently, the Golden Gophers had two bye weeks during the 2019 campaign and won both contests the following weeks. The first was a 38-31 win at Purdue on Sept. 28 and then a 31-26 victory at home against then-No. 5 Penn State on Nov. 9.

5 Minnesota's game at Purdue on Oct. 2 was the 50th game as head coach for **P.J. Fleck** at Minnesota. Of the 10 coaches in program history to have coached at least 50 games with the Gophers, only **Henry L. Williams** and **Bernie Bierman** have a better record at 50 games than Fleck's 29-21 mark (see box right). Fleck is 10th already in school history in games coached, and tied for sixth in wins. He needs one more victory to become the sixth coach in Minnesota annals to reach 30 wins. Fleck's .580 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his ninth season as a college head coach, Fleck is 59-43 overall.

FACING NEBRASKA

► Minnesota and Nebraska meet for the 62nd time on Saturday. The Golden Gophers own a 34-25-2 edge in the all-time series and have won the last two matchups, doubling up the Cornhuskers in the process, 58-24.

► The Golden Gophers are 23-13-2 all-time in the series in Minneapolis and have won the last two meetings at Huntington Bank Stadium by a combined score of 88-28.

► **P.J. Fleck** is 3-1 all-time against Nebraska. A win Saturday would match his four wins against Purdue for his most wins versus one team while at Minnesota. It would be the fourth team he's beaten four times in his career overall (also defeated Illinois and Miami (OH) four times).

► Nebraska has two players from Minnesota on its roster: redshirt freshman OL Bryce Benhart (Lakeville, Lakeville North HS) and senior wide receiver Levi Falck (Circle Pines, Centennial HS). Minnesota does not have any Nebraskans on its roster.

► Benhart and Minnesota sophomore LB **Pete Bercich** both went to Lakeville North High School in Lakeville, Minn. Gophers freshman OL **Cameron James** and Nebraska freshman WR Alante Brown both attended Simeon High School in Chicago. Gophers junior kicker **Brock Walker** and Nebraska freshman LB Randolph Kpai each attended Washington High School in Sioux Falls, S.D. Minnesota seniors **Brock Annexstad** (WR) and **Daniel Faalele** (OL), junior **Zack Annexstad** (QB) and freshman **Jaquondis Burns** (LB) all went to IMG Academy in Florida, as did Nebraska junior OL Broc Bando.

► Minnesota offensive line coach and run game coordinator **Brian Callahan** held the same title at Akron from 2005-09, while Nebraska outside linebackers coach and special teams coordinator Mike Dawson was the Zips linebackers coach from 2006-08.

► Nebraska enters the game 3-4 on the season and 1-3 in league play. All four of the Huskers' losses have been by one score, including a 23-16 loss at then-No. 3 Oklahoma on Sept. 18, a 23-20 overtime loss at then-No. 20 Michigan State on Sept. 25 and Saturday's 32-29 home defeat versus then-No. 9 Michigan.

► The Cornhuskers have the nation's No. 13 offense (493.6 yards per game) and the No. 18 rushing offense (223.6). Both rank second in the Big Ten.

► Quarterback Adrian Martinez is completing 66.3 percent of his passes this year for 1,754 yards and nine touchdowns against three interceptions. He's currently second in the country in rushing touchdowns (10), fifth in total touchdowns (10), eighth in yards per pass attempt (9.85), 10th in passing yards, 12th in passing yards per completion (14.86), 15th in total offense (314.9) and 17th in pass efficiency (162.4). Martinez also leads the team in rushes (88) and rushing yards (450).

► Martinez's top target this year has been Samori Toure, who has 26 catches for 520 yards and three touchdowns. Toure is second in the Big Ten in receiving yards, seventh in receiving touchdowns and ninth in receiving yards per game (74.3).

► Luke Reimer leads the team with 63 tackles, while Garrett Nelson has a team-best 8.0 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks. Deontai Williams has half of the team's six interceptions this season.

LAST TIME VS. NEBRASKA

► Via the AP: **Mohamed Ibrahim** ran for two touchdowns following Nebraska turnovers, and a Minnesota team that was idle for three weeks and missing nearly three dozen players to COVID-19 protocols or injuries left Lincoln with a 24-17 win on Dec. 12, 2020.

► Ibrahim scored on fourth-and-goal from the 1 to give Minnesota a 10-point lead early in the fourth quarter after Adrian Martinez fumbled at the Nebraska 39.

► Connor Culp's 30-yard field goal cut it to 24-17 with 4:42 left, but Ibrahim finished off the game with six straight carries for 59 yards before Minnesota went into victory formation at the Nebraska 6. Ibrahim recorded 108 yards on 20 carries. **Tanner Morgan** was 17 of 30 for 181 yards.

► The Gophers opened the scoring after **Tyler Nubin** intercepted a tipped pass at the Huskers' 35 in the middle of the first quarter. On fourth-and-1, a direct snap went to Ibrahim, who broke through the middle for a 26-yard score.

► Nebraska managed only 1.9 yards per play on its first three possessions before breaking through early in the second quarter, as Martinez passed 8 yards to Austin Allen for their first touchdown. Martinez later led the Huskers on a 13-play, 73-yard drive, finishing it off with a run from the 7 for a 14-10 lead.

► The Gophers took a 17-14 lead into the final quarter. They had gone ahead late in the first half after a targeting penalty on cornerback Cam Taylor-Britt kept alive a 75-yard scoring drive that started with **Cam Wiley** sprinting 61 yards down the sideline. That set up Minnesota inside the 10, and Morgan threw to tight end **Brevyn Spann-Ford** in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard touchdown.

► Leading the Minnesota defense was **Mariano Sori-Marin**, who finished with 18 tackles and a forced fumble, and ended up winning Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors for his performance.

LAST TIME IN MINNEAPOLIS

► Via the AP: **Rodney Smith** ran for 139 yards and a touchdown, helping Minnesota overpower Nebraska for a 34-7 victory on a 37-degree night with gusty winds and a rain-snow mix on Oct. 12, 2019.

► **Shannon Brooks** ran for 99 yards, **Mo Ibrahim** had 84 yards and three touchdowns, as the Gophers piled up 322 yards on the ground.

► After Nebraska turned it over on downs on its opening drive, the Gophers went the other way in five plays and 71 yards to score on a 15-yard tunnel screen pass from **Tanner Morgan** to **Chris Autman-Bell**. Ibrahim then scored on a 15-yard run in the second quarter to give Minnesota a 14-0 lead at halftime.

► On the first play of the third quarter, Morgan froze the Huskers with a hard run fake and found **Tyler Johnson** wide open for 45 yards to set up Ibrahim's second touchdown. On fourth-and-3 at their 45, trailing 21-0, the Huskers tried a fake punt, but tight end Austin Allen was stopped short after taking the snap.

► Smith and Ibrahim each scored additional 1-yard touchdowns in the third quarter, extending the lead to 34-0.

► With Nebraska quarterback Adrian Martinez sidelined by a left knee injury, Noah Vedral took over for his first career start and was under constant pressure. The Gophers had four sacks and kept the Huskers from scoring until early in the fourth quarter.

MEMORABLE GAMES VS. NEBRASKA

► Sept. 11, 2017: The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in **P.J. Fleck's** first season as head coach. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers had scored in a Big Ten game since 2006. **Rodney Smith** finished with 279 all-purpose yards, including 134 rushing yards and a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, and the Gophers racked up 409 rushing yards, the eighth best total in program history.

► Nov. 22, 2014: **Mitch Leidner** led a pair of 10-play touchdown drives in the second half as Minnesota rallied for a 28-24 win at No. 21 Nebraska. Leidner scored on a three-yard run with 3:25 to play to give the Gophers their first lead.

► Oct. 26, 2013: Minnesota snapped a 16-game losing streak against Nebraska with a 34-23 win at Huntington Bank Stadium. **David Cobb** led the Gophers on the ground with 138 rushing yards.

► Oct. 6, 1945: Behind a school-record seven interceptions, Minnesota beat Nebraska in Lincoln, 61-7. The 61 points are the most Minnesota has ever scored in a road game, while the 54-point win is the Gophers' second largest on the road behind a 58-0 victory at Shattuck in 1890.

RECAPING PURDUE

► Via the AP: **Trey Potts** ran 4 yards for the go-ahead touchdown 70 seconds into the second half, and Minnesota held on for a 20-13 victory at Purdue on Oct. 2.

► After trailing most of the first half, Minnesota wasted no time turning the game in the second half. **Tanner Morgan** found **Mike Brown-Stephens** for 54 yards on the first play, Potts ran for 17 yards on the second play and scored on the third play to erase the 13-10 halftime deficit on a wet, cool afternoon at Ross-Ade Stadium. Minnesota sealed it with a 38-yard field goal with 1:46 to go.

► Potts ran 15 times for 78 yards while Morgan was 9 of 18 with 169 yards passing. Brown-Stephens tallied 105 yards on just two receptions.

► **Chris Autman-Bell** hauled in a 32-yard TD pass to give Minnesota a 7-0 lead on its opening possession, the 50th touchdown pass of Morgan's career, but the Boilermakers answered with a short field goal and then a 7-yard TD pass from Aidan O'Connell to Milton Wright.

► And after Minnesota tied it at 10, Purdue closed out the half with a 42-yard field goal from Mitchell Fineran.

► O'Connell was 33 of 51 with 357 yards and one interception. He was sacked four times and lost a fumble.

► Purdue did not score in the second half. It was the first time Minnesota shut out a Big Ten team in a half since Oct. 19, 2019 when Rutgers did not score in the first half. It was also the first time Minnesota shut out a Big Ten team in the second half since Nov. 9, 2013 when Penn State did not score and the Gophers won 24-10 at home, and it was the first time the Gophers shut out a Big Ten team in the second half on the road since Nov. 3, 2012 at Illinois when Minnesota won 17-3.

BIG HONOR FOR CRAWFORD

► Minnesota punter **Mark Crawford** was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 4 after a standout performance in Minnesota's 20-13 win at Purdue on Oct. 2. Crawford shared the honor with Penn State's Jordan Stout.

► Crawford continually flipped the field in a rain-soaked game against the Boilermakers, as he averaged 51.3 yards on six punts. He recorded a career-long, 60-yard punt twice, which was Minnesota's longest punt since Ryan Santoso had a 61-yarder against Illinois on Oct. 21, 2017.

► Crawford's six punts traveled 60, 60, 58, 46, 45 and 39 yards with his three longest punts all ranking in the top 20 of longest punts in the Big Ten this season. He placed four punts inside the 15-yard line, which led to Purdue starting drives on its own 2, 9, 15 and 15 yard lines.

► Minnesota also allowed zero punt return yards against Purdue, which was a big reason why the Boilers, who ran 86 total plays, were limited to only 13 total points and did not score in the second half.

► Crawford also executed four successful holds (two point-after attempt and two field goals) in a driving rain.

POTTS LOST FOR SEASON

► Minnesota head coach **P.J. Fleck** announced on Oct. 11 that redshirt sophomore running back **Trey Potts** would miss the remainder of the season.

► Potts left the field in the fourth quarter of the team's Oct. 2, 2021, game at Purdue. Potts was immediately observed and treated by the team's medical staff and was then transported to a hospital for further observation. Potts was discharged from an Indiana hospital on Oct. 8 and returned to Minneapolis. Potts is doing well and will continue to receive follow-up care in Minnesota.

► The Gophers turned to Potts as their lead back with the season-ending injury to All-American **Mohamed Ibrahim**. In four games as a starter, Potts rushed for 518 yards and scored six touchdowns on 102 carries.

► In his first career start against Miami (OH) on Sept. 11, Potts ran for 178 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries, smashing personal highs in all three categories. In fact, Potts' 34 carries were the most by an FBS player this season until Sept. 25, and they now rank seventh. He followed that by rushing for 121 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 26 carries at Colorado, then tallied 141 yards on 27 rushes against Bowling Green before recording 78 yards and a score on 15 carries at Purdue.

► From Sept. 11 to Oct. 2 (his four games as a starter), Potts had the third-most rushing yards of any FBS player in the country and the second most carries.

► Overall on the season, Potts rushed 111 times for 552 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 110.4 yards per game and 5.0 yards per rush. He also caught three passes for 16 yards, returned six punts for 65 yards and brought back one kick for 17 yards.

► Through games on Oct. 2, Potts ranked ninth in the country in rushing yards, 11th in rushing yards per game, 19th in punt return average (10.8), 21st in rushing TDs and 25th in all-purpose yards per game (130.0).

RB ROOM READY

► With both Ibrahim and Potts now out for the season, Minnesota will turn once again to the running back room to fill the void.

► True freshman **Mar'Keise Irving** made his backfield debut against Colorado on Sept. 18 and had career-highs with 15 rushes for 89 yards, including a 28-yard burst in the fourth quarter. He's tallied 112 yards on 25 carries this year, averaging 4.5 yards per attempt. Irving (5'10, 190 pounds) was a four-star recruit by 247 and was the No. 10 running back, according to Rivals. His high school career consisted of 3,264 rushing yards and 587 receiving yards.

► Irving made his collegiate debut against Miami (OH) with two kick returns for 64 yards, including a 41-yarder that was the longest for Minnesota since 2018.

► The game at Colorado was the first of redshirt freshman **Ky Thomas'** career and he finished with seven carries for 66 yards, including a 14-yard touchdown run. Thomas, who did not see any action last year, was a four-star recruit and ranked the No. 25 running back in the country by 247Sports out of high school. Thomas (5'11, 205 pounds) finished his prep career with 7,703 rushing yards and 95 rushing TDs.

► **Bryce Williams** (6'0, 215 pounds) has the most experience in the running back room with 541 rushing yards and six touchdowns on 144 career carries. The majority of his production came as a freshman in 2018 with 502 yards and four scores on 117 carries, including a breakout performance against Miami (OH) with 33 carries for 141 yards.

► The biggest of the bunch at 6'2, 210 pounds, **Cam Wiley** has 46 carries for 215 yards and one touchdown in 11 career games. He had a career-high 81 yards on seven attempts last season in a win at Nebraska.

MORGAN LEADS MAROON & GOLD

► Fifth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is in his third full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's proven himself to be one of the best signal-callers to ever wear the Maroon and Gold.

- Make Minnesota 35-25-2 all-time against Nebraska and 24-13-2 against the Cornhuskers in Minneapolis
- Mark the team's third straight win over Nebraska, which would be its longest streak against the Huskers since 1951-54
- Keep Minnesota in second place in the Big Ten West
- Be P.J. Fleck's 30th as Minnesota's head coach
- Give Fleck four wins over Nebraska, matching Purdue for his most wins against one team while at Minnesota; it would also be the fourth team he's beaten four times in his career
- Put Minnesota at 3-2 under Fleck coming off a bye week
- Have the Gophers 4-2 or better through six games for the second time in the last three years

► Morgan is 21-10 as a starter and has completed 452 of 743 passes (both seventh most in school history) for 6,737 yards (fifth most) in his career. His career completion percentage of .610 ranks first in school history, as does his 152.61 pass efficiency rating, 2.50 TD-to-INT ratio and .677 win percentage as a starter.

► At Purdue on Oct. 2, Morgan became the fourth player in Gophers history to reach 50 career touchdown passes, joining **Adam Weber** (72), **Bryan Cupito** (55) and **Asad Abdul-Khaliq** (55). Of the four, Morgan did it in the fewest pass attempts with 727, edging out Abdul-Khaliq's mark of 736. Morgan also tied Weber for second fewest games to reach 50, doing so in his 34th game.

► Morgan has 11 Minnesota season and game records and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-Big Ten Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.

► This season, Morgan has completed 47-of-90 passes for 709 yards and four touchdowns against two interceptions. He opened the season interception-free over his first 51 passes.

AUTMAN-BELL NEXT WR UP

► Senior **Chris Autman-Bell** was Minnesota's No. 3 receiver two years ago behind **Tyler Johnson** and **Rashod Bateman**, and the No. 2 target last year before Bateman opted out. But with those two now on to the NFL, Autman-Bell is poised to be the team's next top target.

► After missing the first two games of 2021 due to injury, Autman-Bell made his presence felt in his 2021 debut Saturday against Colorado. He tied for the team lead with four catches on six targets and paced the Gophers with 79 yards, highlighted by catches of 33 and 32 yards.

► Autman-Bell has played in 36 career games with 85 catches (20th in program history) for 1,378 yards (16th all-time at Minnesota) and seven TDs. He boasts a career average of 16.2 yards per catch, good for ninth in team annals. He has caught at least one pass in 35 games and has made at least one catch in his past 30 games (8th longest active streak).

► In seven games last year, he caught 22 passes for 430 yards and one score. That came after recording 28 catches for 371 yards and five touchdowns in 2019 and 28 catches (fourth all-time for a Minnesota freshman) for 449 yards (third all-time for a Minnesota freshman) in 2018 (also led team with 16.03 yards/catch).

JACKSON, WRIGHT TOP TARGETS

► With **Chris Autman-Bell** missing the team's first two games due to injury, sophomore wide receivers **Daniel Jackson** and **Dylan Wright** got the chance to develop their in-game chemistry with **Tanner Morgan**, turning into his top two targets so far this year.

► Jackson leads the team with 14 receptions and 27 targets this year, while his 155 receiving yards and one touchdown reception both rank second only to Wright. Jackson has caught at least three passes in three of five games this year and also has at least 25 receiving yards in four of five contests, including a career-high 58 against Ohio State.

► As a freshman in 2020, Jackson ranked third on the team with 12 catches for 167 yards, averaging 23.9 yards/game.

► Though he did not play at Purdue, Wright still leads the team in receiving yards (169) and TD receptions (2), and remains second to Jackson in receptions (9) and targets (18).

► In the opener against Ohio State, Wright caught five passes for 57 yards and a touchdown, then followed with three catches for 73 yards and another score vs. Miami and added the 39-yard reception at Colorado.

► Wright played in eight games over two seasons at Texas A&M but did not record any stats. At 6'3, 215 pounds, Wright was an Under Armour All-American in high school and was the No. 12 wide receiver in the country by 247Sports.

BROWN-STEPHENS: PLAYMAKER

► Redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Mike Brown-Stephens** has only four catches on the year, but he's turned them into 139 receiving yards, good for an average of 34.8 yards per catch that not only leads the team but also ranks second in the nation among all players with at least three catches this year behind only Missouri's D'ionte Smith (36.8).

► At Purdue on Oct. 2, Brown-Stephens caught two passes for 105 yards, tallying catches of 51 and 54 yards, the two longest receptions by a Gopher this year. Since 2000, the only Minnesota player with more receiving yards on two or fewer receptions was **Duane Bennett**, who had 121 yards on two catches against Michigan State on Oct. 31, 2009.

► The last time a Gopher had multiple catches of 50+ yards in one game was **Rashod Bateman**, who had TD catches of both 86 and 61 yards at Illinois on Nov. 3, 2018.

O-LINE DEPTH AMONG THE BEST

► Minnesota boasts one of the deepest offensive lines in the entire country as 13 members of the unit have appeared in at least one game and 10 have started at least one contest (page 17).

► In fact, the Golden Gophers' offensive line has more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 193. The next closest squad is Miami (FL) with 184, while Michigan State (181) is third.

► In addition, the 10 individuals with starts was tied with Arkansas State for the most among all FBS squads entering the season.

► Redshirt senior **Conner Olson** leads the team by starting all 50 games he's played in, putting him one game shy of matching the school record of 51 games started by long snapper **Payton Jordahl** from 2015-18. Olson's streak is also the fifth longest active starting streak in the country.

► In addition to Olson, fellow redshirt seniors **Blaise Andries** and **Sam Schlueter** have each started 37 contests. Those three have also started at least two games at multiple positions.

► In addition, **Daniel Faalele** (24), Utah State transfer **Karter Shaw** (19) and **John Micheal Schmitz** (15) have all started double-digit games.

► Not only does the offensive line have tremendous experience, but it also has impressive versatility. The unit has at least 30 combined starts at every position, with a high of 47 at right guard, and each position features starts from at least two different players, including three at left guard, right guard and center, and four players with starts at right tackle.

► Further showcasing the depth, in the 2021 season opener the Minnesota offense opened in a jumbo package that featured seven starting offensive linemen, and it started six offensive linemen against Miami (OH) and Colorado.

LINEBACKER DUO PACING THE 'D'

► On a defense with its top nine tacklers back from last season, the linebacking duo of **Jack Gibbens** and **Mariano Sori-Marin** has paced the unit in 2021.

► Gibbens has a team-leading 30 tackles, and he's tied for the team lead in pass breakups (3, all coming at Purdue) and forced fumbles (1). Sori-Marin, who was limited to just one quarter of play at Purdue, is second only to Gibbens with 28 tackles, is third on the Gophers with 3.5 tackles for loss and has one of the team's three interceptions.

► Sori-Marin was the team's top tackler from a year ago, registering 54 stops in seven games in 2020. He also made 1.5 tackles for loss, broke up three passes and forced a fumble. His top performance last year came at Nebraska when he recorded a career-high 18 tackles and forced a fumble en route to being named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week.

► Gibbens spent the past four seasons at the FCS level with Abilene Christian where he totaled 258 tackles, 22.5 tackles for loss, seven sacks and five interceptions. He was the team's leading tackler this past season and was second in both 2019 and 2018.

MEETING AT THE QUARTERBACK

► Minnesota did not have a sack through its first two games, but the Gophers have since tallied four sacks in each of the last three games.

► **Boye Mafe** and **Thomas Rush** recorded 2.0 sacks a piece at Colorado on Sept. 18. Mafe added 2.0 more against Bowling Green on Sept. 25, while **Trill Carter** and **Rush** each had a solo sack. At Purdue, Mafe and **Jaquondis Burns** had 1.0 sack a piece, with **Rush**, **Coney Durr**, **Micah Dew-Treadway** and **Nyles Pinckney** each picking up half a sack.

► The 12 sacks in a three-game span are the most for Minnesota since recording 14 against Purdue (6), Nebraska (1) and Northwestern (7) from Nov. 5-19, 2016. The Gophers have not had a streak of three straight games with at least four sacks since Oct. 4-25, 2008, when they did so versus Indiana (4), Illinois (5) and Purdue (5).

TURNING TO'S INTO POINTS

► Minnesota's defense has forced nine turnovers this year and has capitalized on nearly all of them. The Gophers have scored on the ensuing drive on seven of the nine turnovers, turning them into 37 points.

► In the opener against Ohio State, cornerback **Terrell Smith** returned an interception 23 yards against Ohio State, resulting in a **Mohamed Ibrahim** rushing touchdown.

► Versus Miami (OH), the Gophers recovered a fumble on the RedHawks' opening drive, and **Trey Potts** cashed in with a rushing touchdown. In the fourth quarter, **Tyler Nubin's** 18-yard interception return against Miami (OH) was followed by a **Matthew Trickett** field goal.

► At Colorado, **Jack Gibbens** stripped the CU quarterback in the third quarter. **Justus Harris** recovered and seven plays later, Potts scored. Later in the fourth, a muffed Buffaloes punt was recovered by **Bishop McDonald** and Trickett hit a 33-yard field goal.

► Against Bowling Green, **Mariano Sori-Marin** notched the first interception of his career and Trickett followed with a 36-yard field goal. Later in the contest, **Braelen Oliver** forced a fumble that was recovered by Smith, but Minnesota was forced to punt.

► Purdue's opening drive ended with a strip sack by Boye Mofe with a recovery by Val Martin. Four plays later, **Tanner Morgan** hit **Chris Autman-Bell** for a score. In the fourth quarter, Nubin had an interception with less than a minute to go that didn't result in any points, but it did allow the Gophers to run out the clock.

KESICH THE KICKOFF SPECIALIST

► Kickoff specialist **Dragan Kesich** has 22 touchbacks on 26 kickoffs this year. His 84.62 percent touchback rate is ninth in the country, while his average of 64.62 yards per kickoff is 13th.

► Minnesota is tied for 10th nationally with only four opponent kick returns this year.

PITCHING A SHUTOUT

► Minnesota's 30-0 win at Colorado on Sept. 18 was its first shutout since a 62-0 shutout of Temple on Sept. 16, 2006 and its first on the road since a 44-0 triumph over Kent State on Aug. 31, 2006.

► It was the first shutout for Minnesota versus a Power 5 team since defeating Illinois 45-0 on Oct. 23, 2004. The Gophers' last shutout of a Power 5 team on the road also took place against Illinois, a 21-0 win in Champaign on Nov. 12, 1977.

► The Golden Gophers held Colorado to just 63 yards of total offense with 82 yards passing and -19 rushing yards.

► The 63 yards of total offense allowed was the third best in program history since 1960, bested only by 50 yards given up against Michigan in 1962 and a school-record 48 yards yielded to Navy also in 1962.

► According to Chris Vannini of *The Athletic*, the 63 yards were the fewest by an FBS team since Kansas had 21 yards against TCU in 2017.

► Minnesota outgained Colorado 83-0 in the first quarter (12 passing yards, -12 rushing yards) and held a 225-7 (34 passing, -27 rushing) advantage in total offense at halftime.

► The -19 rushing yards were the fourth lowest allowed since 1960 by Minnesota, trailing only -23 vs. Michigan in 1998, -31 in the aforementioned Navy contest in 1962 and the school record of -46 versus Michigan also in 1962.

► Colorado had 21 rushing attempts, the fewest by a Minnesota opponent since Miami (OH) also had 21 in 2011.

► After shutting out Colorado, Minnesota kept Bowling Green scoreless in the first quarter in its next contest. It marked the first time the Gophers had recorded five consecutive scoreless quarters since October 2004. The scoreless streak covered 87 minutes and 24 seconds, dating back to the end of the Miami (OH) game on Sept. 11.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

► Through five games, Minnesota has had an average time of possession of 33:54. That figure ranks second in the Big Ten and sixth nationally behind only Army (40:01), Air Force (37:44), Western Michigan (37:17), Wisconsin (35:40) and Mississippi State (34:22).

► At Colorado on Sept. 18, Minnesota held the ball for 40:13. It was the second time in the **P.J. Fleck** era that Minnesota had a TOP over 40 minutes, also doing so against Maryland in 2019 (42:53).

► In 50 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 38 times and gone 24-14 in those contests.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

► Among active FBS players, **Tanner Morgan** ranks 13th in career pass efficiency (154.03), 20th in passing yards (6,737), 23rd in passing TDs (50), 26th in pass yards per game (198.1), 28th in completion percentage (60.9), 29th in total offense (6,717), 34th in pass attempts (742) and TDs responsible for (52), and 36th in completions (452).

► With his years at Abilene Christian included, **Jack Gibbens** ranks 14th among FBS players with 288 career tackles and 31st in tackles per game (6.55).

► Including his career at Kent State, **Matthew Trickett** is tied for second among active FBS players with 2.00 career field goal attempts per game, and he is fourth in field goal made per game (1.61), 10th in points per game (8.1) and field goals made (53), 15th in field goal attempts (66), 22nd in PAT percentage (98.2), 23rd in points (267), 25th in field goal percentage (80.3), and 36th in extra points made and attempted (108-of-110).

► **Mohamed Ibrahim** is out for the season due to injury but he still ranks third among active FBS players in career rushes per game (18.86), fourth in rushing yards per game (103.6), sixth in rushing touchdowns (33), seventh in touchdowns scored (33), ninth in all-purpose yards per game (109.1), 10th in rushing yards (3,003) and 11th in rushes (547), 13th in yards per rush (5.49), 26th in points per game (6.8) and 29th in all-purpose yards (3,164).

NON-CON STREAK SNAPPED

► Minnesota saw its 21-game non-conference winning streak end on Sept. 25 with a 14-10 setback against Bowling Green. It was the nation's longest active streak in the country, and at that time, only three other schools in the country had non-conference win streaks longer than seven games.

► The streak was tied for the third longest in the last 25 years along with LSU, which also won 21 in a row from 2005-09. Only Alabama (26, 2009-13) and Utah (23, 2012-18) had longer streaks in that span.

► The Golden Gophers hadn't lost a non-conference game since Sept. 3, 2015, at home to then-No. 2 TCU. Included in the streak were 17 regular season wins and four bowl victories. Also in the streak were 13 straight home wins against non-B1G teams, which was tied for the 10th longest streak in the FBS. Minnesota is now 13-1 under **P.J. Fleck** in non-conference games.

IBRAHIM OUT FOR THE YEAR

- **Mohamed Ibrahim**, the Big Ten's reigning Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year, suffered a season-ending lower leg injury in Minnesota's season-opening loss to Ohio State. He had surgery on Sept. 7.
- Ibrahim has 14 career 100-yard rushing games, including a streak of nine in a row from the 2020 Outback Bowl through this year's season opener. Ibrahim's nine-game streak is the longest in program history, two more than former Gopher **Laurence Maroney**.
- Before leaving Minnesota's season opener in the third quarter with his injury, Ibrahim ran for 163 yards and two touchdowns on 30 attempts. In two career games against Ohio State, Ibrahim has run for 320 yards and four TDs on 53 carries.
- Ibrahim has 3,003 rushing yards for his career, the eighth Minnesota player to reach the 3,000-yard milestone.
- An All-Big Ten First Team honoree and AP Third-Team All-American last year, Ibrahim ran 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history). He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).
- He also set a school record with a rushing average of 153.7 yards per game and tied a school mark with four rushing scores in one game (at Maryland and at Illinois).

MAFE, FAALELE ON 'FREAKS' LIST

- Seniors **Boye Mafe** and **Daniel Faalele** both appeared on the "2021 College Football Freaks List" from The Athletic's Bruce Feldman.
- Mafe came in at No. 17 of 101 players listed. "He's put on more than 50 pounds since arriving at Minnesota and weighs 263 now, up from 260 last year," Feldman wrote. "Mafe (4.5 sacks in six games in 2020) says he did a lot of single-leg work this offseason in hopes of improving his footwork." Among Mafe's weight room numbers listed by Feldman are a vertical jump of 40.5 inches, a broad jump of 10-6, a 4.57 40 and power cleaning 400 pounds."
- Faalele was ranked No. 29. "Two years ago, Faalele ranked No. 11 on this list because of his freakish combination of enormous size and a surprisingly athletic 29-inch vertical and 8-7 broad jump, but as he's reshaped his body, he's become a lot more nimble and flexible," Feldman wrote.

- In mid-July, offensive lineman **Blaise Andries** was named to the 2020 Academic All-America Division I Football First Team selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). This honor recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom.
- Andries, who is majoring in Mathematics and is an aspiring actuary, is a repeat honoree after being named Second Team last season. He is Minnesota's first repeat selection since **Sam Renner**, who was named Second Team in both 2018 and 2019.
- Andries was named Academic All-Big Ten in 2020, 2019 and 2018 and was selected All-Big Ten Third Team in 2020 and 2019.

COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Four of Minnesota's assistant coaches have head coaching experience. **Mike Sanford Jr.** (OC/QBs) was the head coach at Western Kentucky from 2017-18, while **Paul Haynes** (Cornerbacks) led Kent State from 2013-17. **Joe Harasymiak** (Defensive Backs, Safeties and Co-DC) was the head coach at Maine from 2016-18 and was named the 2018 FCS Coach of the Year. **Clay Patterson** (Tight Ends) was the head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College from 2016-17, earning conference coach of the year honors in 2017.

HUNTINGTON BANK STADIUM

- Minnesota opened Huntington Bank Stadium with a 20-13 win against Air Force in 2009. All-time, the Gophers are 50-36 at Huntington, including an 18-12 record under Head Coach P.J. Fleck.
- Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher Hockey, MNF, an NHL game, international soccer, MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings and Minnesota United also played seasons on campus while their stadiums were being constructed.
- Upon completion, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960.
- The Gopher locker room is a state of the art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in the country. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.

HEAD COACH // FIFTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 40, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 59-43 and is 29-21 at Minnesota.

While at Minnesota, Fleck has guided Minnesota to its most wins (11 in 2019) since 1904, has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), six Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries twice, Sam Renner twice, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 194 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had eight players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962. The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962. Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history. Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999. The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same span.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck, which included a school record 3.33 cumulative team GPA after the 2020-21 academic year.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988. Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts. Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the **ONLY** thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing.
