FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

1 Winners of three in a row and five of its last six, RV/NR Minnesota (5-2, 3-1 B1G) looks to stay unbeaten on the road and remain in first place in the Big Ten West this weekend as it visits Northwestern (3-4, 1-3 B1G) Saturday at 2:30 p.m. on Big Ten Network.

2 The Golden Gophers have one of the strongest rush defenses in the country, ranking fifth nationally and second in the Big Ten by allowing just 85.7 rushing yards per game this year. The national average for rushing yards per game through Oct. 23 is 164.9 yards per game; only one Gopher opponent has gone above 136 yards rushing this year and only two have had more than 104 rushing yards. In fact, Minnesota had a two-game stretch of just 3 yards allowed (-19 at Colorado, 22 vs. Bowling Green). The -19 rushing yards allowed at Colorado on Sept. 18 are the fewest by any FBS team this year with the next fewest coming when Wisconsin held Purdue to -13 on Oct. 23. Minnesota is second nationally in fewest opponent rush attempts (190) and fourth in opponent rush yards (600).

3 Minnesota is 2-0 on the road this year, shutting out Colorado, 30-0, in Boulder on Sept. 18 and winning at Purdue, 20-13, on Oct. 2. A win Saturday would mark the fourth time since 1961 that Minnesota has won its first three road games of a season, also winning its first three in 1919 and its first four in 2003 and 1999. The Golden Gophers are 11-3 in their last 14 games away from home, including bowl games, beginning with a 37-15 victory at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018. During that stretch, only Ohio State (15-2) has a better mark away from home among Big Ten teams. More on Page 6.

4 Saturday against Maryland, redshirt freshman RB **Ky Thomas** set career highs in both rushes (21) and rushing yards (139), while true freshman **Mar'Keise Irving** added a career-best 105 rushing yards on 15 carries. Their performances, which included rushing TDs for each, marked the first time since at least 1942 that two Minnesota freshmen both ran for at least 100 yards in the same game. In addition, they became the fourth and fifth individuals to run for 100 yards this year for the Gophers (see box right). Going back to at least 1942 again, Minnesota has never had five individuals record 100-yard rushing games in the same season. In fact, Minnesota is the only FBS team this season to have five different individuals reach 100 yards.

5 Minnesota's 34-16 win over Maryland Saturday improved **P.J. Fleck's** record at Minnesota to 31-21. In his fifth season, Fleck is 10th already in school history in games coached (52) and sixth in wins. Fleck's .596 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only **Henry L. Williams** (.786, 1900-21) and **Bernie Bierman** (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his ninth season as a college head coach, Fleck is 61-43 overall.

A WIN SATURDAY WOULD...

- Improve Minnesota to 55-36-5 all-time against Northwestern, including a 25-21-2 mark in Evanston
- Be the Gophers' second straight win in the series and second straight at Northwestern
- Make the Golden Gophers bowl eligible at 6-2
- Either keep Minnesota tied for first in the Big Ten West or give the Gophers sole possession of first place if Iowa loses earlier in the day to Wisconsin
- Give the Gophers their first four-game winning streak since winning the first nine games of the 2019 season
- Mark the fourth time since 1961 that Minnesota has won its first three road games of a season (2019, 2003 and 1999)

FACING NORTHWESTERN

► Minnesota and Northwestern meet for the 96th time on Saturday. The Golden Gophers lead the all-time series, 54-36-5. The only teams Minnesota has beaten more than the Wildcats are Iowa (62) and Wisconsin (60).

► Excluding Rutgers, whom Minnesota has only faced twice, the Gophers' .595 win percentage against Northwestern is its second best against Big Ten schools behind only a .596 mark versus Indiana (39-26-3).

► In Evanston, Minnesota holds a 24-21-2 record. The 24 wins are the most for the Gophers on the road against one opponent, while the .532 win percentage at Northwestern is their highest against all Big Ten schools (aside from a 1-0 mark at Rutgers) and versus any current FBS team where they've played at least five road games.

► The teams were supposed to play last year on Dec. 5 in Minneapolis but the game was cancelled due to COVID-19. It was the first time Minnesota and Northwestern did not play one another since the 2006 season. As a result, Saturday marks the first time since 1982-83 that consecutive games in the series are being played in Evanston.

► After Minnesota (31 players), Illinois (13) is the No. 2 state from where the Gophers call home.

► Minnesota's 13 Illinois natives are: senior WR **Chris Autman-Bell** (Kankakee), seventh-year DL **Micah Dew-Treadway** (Bolingbrook), freshman TE **Jameson Geers** (Channahon), redshirt sophomore OL **JJ Guedet** (Washington), freshman DL **Jack Hawkinson** (Frankford), freshman RB **Mar'Keise Irving** and freshman OL **Cameron James** (both Chicago), freshman QB **Athan Kaliakmanis** and freshman WR **Dino Kaliakmanis** (both Antioch), freshman DB **Jordan Nubin** and junior DB **Tyler Nubin** (both Saint Charles), senior LB **Mariano Sori-Marin** (Mokena) and redshirt senior OL **John Michael Schmitz** (Flossmoor).

► Northwestern has one Minnesotan on its roster in sophomore RB **Evan Hull** (Maple Grove).

► Minnesota head coach **P.J. Fleck** was the head coach at Western Michigan from 2013-17, while Northwestern linebackers coach **Tim McGarigle** was the Broncos' linebackers coach from 2012-13 and linebackers coach/run game coordinator from 2014-15. Also on the WMU staff during that time were current Gophers' offensive line coach/run game coordinator **Brian Callahan** (OL coach, 2013-17), co-offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach **Matt Simon** (WR coach, 2014-17) and special teams coordinator/rush ends coach **Rob Wenger** (Special teams coordinator, 2013-17)

► Northwestern enters the game 3-4 on the season and 1-3 in league play. The Wildcats have alternated losses and wins the entire season, starting with a season-opening setback against Michigan State on Sept. 3. Their Big Ten win came against Rutgers, 21-7, on Oct. 16. Most recently, Northwestern lost at Michigan, 33-7, last Saturday.

► Minnesota and Northwestern have one common opponent this year in Nebraska. Minnesota defeated the Huskers in Minneapolis, 30-23, on Oct. 16, while the Wildcats dropped their matchup in Lincoln, 56-7, on Oct. 2.

► Evan Hull is Northwestern's leading rusher at 91.9 yards per game, which ranks sixth in the Big Ten and 29th nationally. He's rushed 101 times for 643 yards and five touchdowns, while his average of 6.37 yards per carry is fourth in the Big Ten and 16th in the nation.

► Four different QBs have played this year for the Wildcats, though Ryan Hilinski has gotten the majority of snaps as of late. He's completed 55.5 percent of his passes for 759 yards, three touchdowns and one interception. Stephon Robinson, Jr., leads Northwestern in receptions (30) and receiving yards (425) and is tied with three others for the lead in TD catches (2).

► Defensively, Chris Bergin has 79 tackles on the season, ranking him second in the nation with 11.3 stops per game. He has at least eight tackles in every game, including a season-high 16 Saturday at Michigan. Adetomiwa Adebawore has a team-high 7.0 tackles for loss, while Jeremy Meiser leads Northwestern with 4.0 sacks. Three players have one interception for the Wildcats.

LAST TIME VS. NORTHWESTERN

► Via the AP: **Tanner Morgan** led No. 11 Minnesota to scores on its first three possessions and finished with four TD passes as the Gophers beat Northwestern, 38-22, when the teams last met on Nov. 23, 2019, in Evanston.

► Morgan, who set the Minnesota single-season passing touchdown record, threw three touchdowns passes to **Rashod Bateman** and one to **Tyler Johnson**.

► Morgan zipped a 19-yard TD pass to Bateman in the corner of the end zone to end a 10-play, 56-yard drive on Minnesota's first possession. After **Shannon Brooks** ran in from 9 yards, Morgan hit Bateman for a 10-yard TD and 21-0 lead. Bateman's other TD catch was a 7-yarder in the third quarter.

► With quarterback Aidan Smith sidelined (hand), Northwestern turned to Hunter Johnson, who hadn't started since the 2019 season opener. Andrew Marty entered early in the second quarter after Johnson went 0 for 2 and was sacked three times. Marty threw a TD pass to Jace James and ran for two scores.

► Joe Gaziano sacked Morgan for a safety early in the second quarter to get Northwestern on the board after Minnesota took a 21-0 lead. The Wildcats would get as close as 12 points twice at 21-9 and 28-16.

► Defensively, Minnesota was led by **Antoine Winfield, Jr.'s** 11 tackles, including a sack and forced fumble. **Kamal Martin** and **Sam Renner** also recorded sacks in the win.

MEMORABLE GAMES VS. NORTHWESTERN

► Oct. 11, 2014: Tied at 17-17 with 7:32 remaining, **Jalen Myrick** returned a kickoff 100 yards to give Minnesota the 24-17 win. The return is one of five 100-yarders in school history.

► Oct. 4, 2003: **Asad Abdul-Khaliq** connected with **Jared Ellerson** on a school-record 96 yard touchdown pass in a 42-17 win for the No. 21 Gophers. Abdul-Khaliq was 12-17 for 331 yards and four touchdown passes, finishing with an efficiency rating of 311.8, the best by a Minnesota QB since at least 1980. Ellerson recorded 189 yards on four catches, the sixth best mark in school annals.

► Oct. 10, 2002: **Terry Jackson II** ran for a career-high 239 yards, the sixth highest total in program history, in a 45-42 win. **Thomas Tapeh** added 176 yards on the ground.

► Oct. 4, 1980: In one of only two known instances in team history, three Gophers rush for 100 yards in one game as **Garry White** (129), **Duane Gregory** (128) and **Marion Barber** (118) accomplish the feat in a 49-21 win. Coincidentally, the other instance also came against Northwestern in 1972 when **John King** (188), **Doug Beaudoin** (157) and **Bob Morgan** (133) did it in a 35-29 victory.

RECAPING MARYLAND

► Via the AP: Freshmen **Ky Thomas** and **Mar'Keise Irving** became the fourth and fifth different 100-yard rushers for Minnesota this season, as the Gophers gained 326 yards on the ground in a 34-16 trampling of Maryland on Saturday for their third straight victory.

► Thomas (21 carries, 139 yards) and Irving (15 carries, 105 yards) each had one of four rushing touchdowns for Minnesota, which moved into a first-place tie with Iowa in the Big Ten West Division.

► Taulia Tagovailoa lost a fumble on the opening drive and completed 17 of 27 passes for 189 yards and a late touchdown to Marcus Fleming for the Terrapins.

► Thomas, Irving and **Bryce Williams**, who rushed for 48 yards and a score, are the only healthy scholarship running backs left on the roster for the Gophers, who lost star **Mohamed Ibrahim** in the opener and backup **Trey Potts** three weeks ago to season-ending injuries.

► Williams took the lead last week in a win over Nebraska, becoming the third player to top the 100-yard rushing mark this year. Thomas and Irving gave the Gophers the first pair of 100-yard rushers in the same games since **Rodney Smith** and **Shannon Brooks** on Oct. 5, 2019, against Illinois.

► **Tanner Morgan** went 8 for 12 for 125 yards passing, and backup quarterback Cole Kramer rushed for 30 yards and a touchdown. The Gophers didn't punt until 5:09 remained in the game.

► The Gophers held Maryland to just 268 total yards, including 79 rushing yards and 189 passing yards. The Terrapins had been averaging 311.0 passing yards per game and nearly 450 yards of total offense per contest.

BACK IN THE RANKINGS

► Thanks to a three-game win streak and having won five of its past six games, Minnesota has returned to the latest AP Poll (Full polls on Page 5).

► The Gophers are among 12 teams receiving votes in the Oct. 24 poll. Their appearance comes almost exactly one year to the date of the last time they were in the AP Poll, when they received votes in the Oct. 25, 2020 poll.

MORGAN LEADS MAROON & GOLD

► Fifth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is in his third full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's proven himself to be one of the best signal-callers to ever wear the Maroon and Gold.

► Morgan is 23-10 as a starter and has completed 480 (sixth most in school history) of 779 passes (seventh most) for 7,071 yards (fourth most) in his career. His career completion percentage of .616 ranks first in school history, as does his 154.24 pass efficiency rating, 2.36 TD-to-INT ratio and .697 win percentage as a starter.

► At Purdue on Oct. 2, Morgan became the fourth player in Gophers history to reach 50 career touchdown passes, joining **Adam Weber** (72), **Bryan Cupito** (55) and **Asad Abdul-Khalik** (55). Of the four, Morgan did it in the fewest pass attempts with 727, edging out Abdul-Khalik's mark of 736. Morgan also tied Weber for second fewest games to reach 50, doing so in his 34th game.

► Against Nebraska on Oct. 16, Morgan finished 20-of-24 for 209 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. His completion percentage of 83.3 percent ranks tied for fourth in school annals since 1980. He also owns the No. 1 (21-22 at Purdue in 2019) and No. 2 (18-20 vs. Penn State in 2019) spots on the list.

► Morgan was 14-of-15 (93.3 percent) for 171 yards and two touchdowns in the first half against the Huskers. He completed 16 straight passes in one span between the first and third quarters, breaking the school record for consecutive completions of 14 done four times previously, including once by himself. The 16 straight completions tied for the third longest streak in a conference game in B1G history.

► Morgan has 11 Minnesota season and game records and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-Big Ten Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.

► This season, Morgan has completed 75-of-125 passes for 1,043 yards and six touchdowns against four interceptions for an efficiency rating of 139.5. He ranks fourth in the Big Ten in both yards per completion (13.91) and yards per pass attempt (8.34), marks that put him 20th and 33rd in the country, respectively.

RB ROOM READY

► With both **Mohamed Ibrahim** and **Trey Potts** out for the season with injuries, Minnesota has turned once again to the running back room to fill the void and they've answered the call.

► In the first game without Ibrahim or Potts, it was redshirt junior **Bryce Williams** (6'0, 215 pounds) who got the start against Nebraska on Oct. 16. It was the third start of his career and his first since Oct. 26, 2018. Williams finished with 127 rushing yards on 17 carries, highlighted by a career-long touchdown run of 56 yards that gave Minnesota a 30-16 lead with just over two minutes to play. The 56-yard run tied Ibrahim for the longest rush by a Gopher this year.

► As mentioned on Page 1 and in the Maryland recap, **Ky Thomas** and **Mar'Keise Irving** came through with 139 and 105 yards, respectively, and each scored a touchdown in last week's win against the Terrapins.

► Williams has the most experience in the running back room with 716 rushing yards and eight touchdowns on 174 career carries. The majority of his production came as a freshman in 2018 with 502 yards and four scores on 117 carries, including a breakout performance against Miami (OH) with 33 carries for 141 yards.

► Irving, who made his backfield debut against Colorado on Sept. 18 with 15 rushes for 89 yards, has tallied 245 yards and a touchdown on 47 carries this year, averaging 5.2 yards per attempt. Irving (5'10, 190 pounds) was a four-star recruit by 247Sports and was the No. 10 running back, according to Rivals. His high school career consisted of 3,264 rushing yards and 587 receiving yards.

► Irving and Williams have served as the team's primary kick returners this year with six kick returns for Irving and five for Williams. Irving has recorded 173 yards, while Williams has totaled 60 yards on his five returns. Irving's 28.8 yards per return would rank 11th nationally if he had two more returns to qualify.

► Thomas has played in three games this year and has 35 carries for 228 yards and two scores. His 6.5 yards per carry leads the team. Thomas, who did not see any action last year, was a four-star recruit and ranked the No. 25 running back in the country by 247Sports out of high school. Thomas (5'11, 205 pounds) finished his prep career with 7,703 rushing yards and 95 rushing TDs.

AUTMAN-BELL NEXT WR UP

► Senior **Chris Autman-Bell** was Minnesota's No. 3 receiver two years ago behind **Tyler Johnson** and **Rashod Bateman**, and the No. 2 target last year before Bateman opted out. But with those two now on to the NFL, Autman-Bell is poised to be the team's next top target.

► Despite missing the first two games of the season and most of the Bowling Green contest due to injury, Autman-Bell leads the team in receptions (22), receiving yards (266), receiving yards per game (53.2), targets (29), and targets per game (5.8) and is tied for the lead in receiving TDs (2).

► Autman-Bell posted a career-high 11 receptions for 103 yards against Nebraska on Oct. 16, his third career 100-yard game. His reception total was the highest by a Gopher since **Tyler Johnson** had 12 vs. Auburn in the 2020 Outback Bowl and ranks tied for 10th in program single-game history. Autman-Bell, whose previous career high for receptions was five, caught nine passes for 100 yards and a score in the first half alone against the Huskers.

► With four catches against Maryland Saturday, Autman-Bell became the 17th player in program history to record 100 career receptions. Reaching the mark in 38 games, he was the 11th quickest to get there.

► Autman-Bell has played in 38 career games with 100 catches (17th in program history) for 1,516 yards (15th all-time at Minnesota) and eight TDs. He has caught at least one pass in 37 games and has made at least one catch in his past 32 games (fifth in school history and seventh longest active streak in the country).

► In seven games last year, he caught 22 passes for 430 yards and one score. That came after recording 28 catches for 371 yards and five touchdowns in 2019 and 28 catches (fourth all-time for a Minnesota freshman) for 449 yards (third all-time for a Minnesota freshman) in 2018 (also led team with 16.03 yards/catch).

BROWN-STEPHENS: PLAYMAKER

► Redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Mike Brown-Stephens** has eight catches on the year and has turned them into 232 receiving yards, which ranks second on the team. His 29.0 yards per catch average leads the team and ranks third in the nation among all players with at least seven catches this year behind only Louisville's Tyler Harrell (34.0) and FIU's Tyrese Chambers (29.7).

► At Purdue on Oct. 2, Brown-Stephens caught two passes for 105 yards, tallying catches of 51 and 54 yards, the two longest receptions by a Gopher this year. Since 2000, the only Minnesota player with more receiving yards on two or fewer receptions was **Duane Bennett**, with 121 yards on two catches vs. Michigan State on Oct. 31, 2009.

► The last time a Gopher had multiple catches of 50+ yards in one game was **Rashod Bateman**, who had TD catches of both 86 and 61 yards at Illinois on Nov. 3, 2018.

► He followed that performance at Purdue with a career-high three receptions for 58 yards on Oct. 16 against Nebraska. His 28-yard TD reception was the second of his career and his first of the season.

► Brown-Stephens added a 35-yard catch Saturday against Maryland. His receptions of 54, 51, and 35 yards this year give him three of Minnesota's five longest.

JACKSON, WRIGHT GETTING LOOKS

► With **Chris Autman-Bell** missing the team's first two games due to injury, sophomore wide receivers **Daniel Jackson** and **Dylan Wright** got the chance to develop their in-game chemistry with **Tanner Morgan**, turning into two of his top targets so far this year.

► Even though he did not play at Purdue, Wright is tied for the team lead in TD receptions (2), is second in receiving yards per game (31.0) and yards per catch (16.9) and third in receptions (11), receiving yards (186), targets (23) and targets per game (3.8).

► In the opener against Ohio State, Wright caught five passes for 57 yards and a touchdown, then followed with three catches for 73 yards and another TD vs. Miami (OH).

► Wright played in eight games over two seasons at Texas A&M but did not record any stats. At 6'3, 215 pounds, Wright was an Under Armour All-American in high school and the No. 12 WR in the country by 247Sports.

► Jackson, who has missed the last two games, ranks second on the team with 14 receptions, 27 targets and targets per game (5.4). Jackson has caught at least three passes in three of five games this year and also has at least 25 receiving yards in four of five contests, including a career-high 58 against Ohio State.

► As a freshman in 2020, Jackson was third on the team with 12 catches for 167 yards, averaging 23.9 yards/game.

KRAMER AT WILDCAT QB

► Redshirt sophomore QB **Cole Kramer** has entrenched himself over the last four games as the Minnesota wildcat quarterback.

► He made his season debut against Bowling Green, rushing twice for 22 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown run. He followed that with eight carries for 32 yards at Purdue, including five carries on one drive late in the fourth quarter that ended in a Minnesota field goal.

► Against Nebraska, he rushed six times for 20 yards, plus a 5-yard TD pass (the first of his career), while Saturday vs. Maryland he carried five times for 30 yards and another score.

► On the season, Kramer has rushed 21 times for 104 yards and two TDs, averaging 5.0 yards per carry.

► Of his 21 carries, 11 have come on third down and he's turned seven of them into first downs. Of the four he didn't convert, one was on a 3rd-and-5 and another was 3rd-and-10. A 3rd-and-3 rush against Nebraska went for 2 yards, but he followed with his 5-yard TD pass.

OLSON SETS STARTS RECORD

► With his start Saturday against Maryland, Minnesota redshirt senior offensive lineman **Conner Olson** set the Golden Gophers program record with his 52nd career start. He broke the mark of 51 set by former long snapper **Payton Jordahl** from 2015-18. Olson is three games away from tying the Big Ten record of 55 starts by Ohio State's Billy Price (2014-17).

► Olson has started every Minnesota game since the beginning of the 2017 season, which is the entire **P.J. Fleck** era. Olson has started 23 games at left guard, 15 at center and 14 at right guard. Olson currently holds the fifth longest active starting streak in the country.

O-LINE DEPTH AMONG THE BEST

► Minnesota boasts one of the deepest offensive lines in the entire country as 12 members of the unit have appeared in at least one game and nine have started at least one contest (page 17).

► In fact, the Golden Gophers' offensive line has more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 204. The next closest squad is Miami (FL) with 194, while Michigan State (191) is third.

► Redshirt senior **Conner Olson** leads the team with his school-record 52 starts. Fellow redshirt seniors **Blaise Andries** and **Sam Schlueter** have each started 40 contests. Those three have also started at least two games at multiple positions.

► Additionally, **Daniel Faalele** (25), Utah State transfer **Karter Shaw** (19) and **John Micheal Schmitz** (17) have all started double-digit games in their careers.

► Not only does the offensive line have tremendous experience, but it also has impressive versatility. The unit has at least 32 combined starts at every position, with a high of 49 at right guard, and each position features starts from at least two different players, including four players with starts at right guard and right tackle, and three players with starts left guard and center.

► Further showcasing the depth, in the 2021 season opener the Minnesota offense opened in a jumbo package that featured seven starting o-linemen, and it started six linemen against Miami (OH), Colorado and Nebraska.

GOPHERS BOAST TOP-20 DEFENSE

► Minnesota enters Saturday's game with the No. 17 total defense in the country, allowing just 312.0 yards per game. That's on pace to be the second-best mark the program has had since 1977, bested only by the 2019 squad that gave up 306.6 yards per game and finished 10th nationally.

► Not including the season opener, Minnesota has held four of its six opponents this season below what their season total offense average was entering the contest.

► In addition to the rush defense notes on page 1, Minnesota has held each of its last six opponents below its rushing average entering the game, including four opponents more than 50 yards below their average. The most dominant performance came at Colorado, which entered the Sept. 18 game with 226.0 rush yards per game. The Gophers ended up holding the Buffaloes to -19 yards rushing, 245 yards below average.

► Against Nebraska on Oct. 16, Minnesota limited Nebraska QB Adrian Martinez, a 2,000-yard rusher in his career with seven games over 100 yards, -17 rushing yards on eight carries. The -17 rushing yards were his fewest in 36 career games to that point.

► The Gophers are holding opponents to 19.6 points per game. The unit is looking to post a scoring defense below 20 points per game for the season for the first time since 1999 (16.3). The last time before that was 1977 (15.5).

► Minnesota has held its last five opponents to 23 points or fewer, the team's longest such streak since the last four games of 2013 and the 2014 opener. The last time it was done in one season was the first five games of 2004, and the last such streak of six games came in the first six games of 2003.

4TH-DOWN SUCCESS

► Minnesota has been one of the most successful teams this season on fourth downs. The offense ranks ninth in the country by converting 75 percent of its attempts (3-4), while the defense ranks 18th by holding opponents to just a 33.3 percent conversion rate (3-9)

► Offensively, **Mohamed Ibrahim** turned a 4th-and-1 at the MN29 against Ohio State into a 56-yard run that set up a touchdown pass. At Colorado, **Trey Potts** gained 5 yards on a 4th-and-1 at the CU8 and scored on the next play.

After getting stopped on a 4th-and-1 at the MN29 versus Bowling Green, the Gophers came back against Nebraska and passed for a touchdown on 4th-and-1 at the NEB5.

► The defense has stopped opponents' last four fourth-down tries. After Purdue started 2-2 on Oct. 2, Minnesota stopped the Boilermakers on 4th-and-5 at the MN43. The Gophers then held Nebraska to 0-2 on its tries on Oct. 16, and Maryland was 0-1 last week.

LINEBACKER DUO PACING THE 'D'

► On a defense with its top nine tacklers back from last season, the linebacking duo of **Jack Gibbens** and **Mariano Sori-Marin** has paced the unit in 2021.

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

Dating back to a 37-15 win at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018, Minnesota has gone 11-3 away from home, including two bowl wins. The only better 14-game stretches in program history were 11-2-1 periods from 1900-1907 and again from 1913-19. ► Gibbens has a team-leading 48 tackles and one forced fumble, and he's tied for second in pass breakups (3, all coming at Purdue). After two tackles in the season opener, Gibbens has at least six stops in each of the last five contests, including four games with eight tackles, with a season-high 10 coming Saturday vs. Maryland.

► Gibbens spent the past four seasons at the FCS level with Abilene Christian where he totaled 258 tackles, 22.5 tackles for loss, seven sacks and five interceptions. He was the team's leading tackler this past season and was second in both 2019 and 2018.

► Sori-Marin, who was limited to less than one quarter of play at Purdue, is second only to Gibbens with 42 tackles. Sori-Marin also has 2.0 tackles for loss this year, two pass breakups and one of the team's four interceptions.

► Sori-Marin was the team's top tackler from a year ago, registering 54 stops in seven games in 2020. He also made 1.5 tackles for loss, broke up three passes and forced a fumble. His top performance last year came at Nebraska when he recorded a career-high 18 tackles and forced a fumble en route to being named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week.

MEETING AT THE QUARTERBACK

► Minnesota did not have a sack through its first two games, but the Gophers have since tallied 16 sacks over the last five games.

► **Boye Mafe** and **Thomas Rush** recorded 2.0 sacks a piece at Colorado on Sept. 18. It was the first time Minnesota had two players with 2.0 sacks in a game since **Blake Cashman** and **Steven Richardson** each had 2.0 against Northwestern on Nov. 19, 2016.

► Mafe added 2.0 more against Bowling Green on Sept. 25, while **Trill Carter** and **Rush** each had a solo sack. At Purdue, Mafe and **Jaquondis Burns** had 1.0 sack a piece, with **Rush**, **Coney Durr**, **Micah Dew-Treadway** and **Nyles Pinckney** each picking up half a sack. Pinckney and **Ezezi Otomewo** both had 1.0 sacks against Nebraska, as did **Rush** and **Coney Durr** versus Maryland.

► The 12 sacks (four in each game) against Colorado, Bowling Green and Purdue were the most for Minnesota in a three-game span since recording 14 against Purdue (6), Nebraska (1) and Northwestern (7) from Nov. 5-19, 2016.

► The Gophers had not had a streak of three straight games with at least four sacks since Oct. 4-25, 2008, when they did so versus Indiana (4), Illinois (5) and Purdue (5).

TURNING TO'S INTO POINTS

► Minnesota's defense has forced 10 turnovers this year and has capitalized on nearly all of them. The Gophers have scored on the ensuing drive on seven of the nine turnovers, turning them into 37 points.

► In the opener against Ohio State, cornerback **Terrell Smith** returned an interception 23 yards against Ohio State, resulting in a **Mohamed Ibrahim** rushing touchdown.

► Versus Miami (OH), the Gophers recovered a fumble on the RedHawks' opening drive, and **Trey Potts** cashed in with a rushing touchdown. In the fourth quarter, **Tyler Nubin's** 18-yard interception return against Miami (OH) was followed by a **Matthew Trickett** field goal.

► At Colorado, **Jack Gibbens** stripped the CU quarterback in the third quarter, **Justus Harris** recovered and seven plays later, **Potts** scored. Later in the fourth, a muffed Buffaloes punt was recovered by **Bishop McDonald** and **Trickett** hit a 33-yard field goal.

► Against Bowling Green, **Mariano Sori-Marin** notched the first interception of his career and **Trickett** followed with a 36-yard field goal. Later in the contest, **Braelen Oliver** forced a fumble that was recovered by **Smith**, but Minnesota was forced to punt.

► Purdue's opening drive ended with a strip sack by **Boye Mafe** with a recovery by **Val Martin**. Four plays later, **Tanner Morgan** hit **Chris Autman-Bell** for a score. In the fourth quarter, **Nubin** had an interception with less than a minute to go that didn't result in any points, but it did allow the Gophers to run out the clock.

BIG HONOR FOR CRAWFORD

► Minnesota punter **Mark Crawford** was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 4 after a standout performance in Minnesota's 20-13 win at Purdue on Oct. 2. **Crawford** shared the honor with Penn State's **Jordan Stout**.

► **Crawford** continually flipped the field in a rain-soaked game against the Boilermakers, as he averaged 51.3 yards on six punts. He recorded a career-long, 60-yard punt twice, which was Minnesota's longest punt since **Ryan Santos** had a 61-yarder against Illinois on Oct. 21, 2017.

► **Crawford's** six punts traveled 60, 60, 58, 46, 45 and 39 yards with his three longest punts all ranking in the top 20 of longest punts in the Big Ten this season. He placed four punts inside the 15-yard line, which led to Purdue starting drives on its own 2, 9, 15 and 15 yard lines.

► Minnesota also allowed zero punt return yards against Purdue, which was a big reason why the Boilers, who ran 86 total plays, were limited to only 13 total points and did not score in the second half.

► **Crawford** also executed four successful holds (two point-after attempt and two field goals) in a driving rain.

► He was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week since holder **Casey O'Brien** was recognized on Oct. 21, 2019, and he's the first Minnesota punter to receive the honor since 2013 when **Peter Mortell** was recognized on Nov. 4 and Nov. 11.

KESICH THE KICKOFF SPECIALIST

► Kickoff specialist **Dragan Kesich** has 32 touchbacks on 38 kickoffs this year. He ranks 11th in the country with his 84.21 percent touchback rate and 15th with his 64.42 average yardage on kickoffs.

► Saturday against Maryland he set a career high with six touchbacks and tied a career high with seven kickoffs.

► Minnesota is sixth nationally with only 73 kickoff return yards allowed and an holding opponents to 14.6 yards per return. The Gophers are also tied for eighth nationally with only five opponent kick returns this year.

PITCHING A SHUTOUT

► Minnesota's 30-0 win at Colorado on Sept. 18 was its first shutout since a 62-0 shutout of Temple on Sept. 16, 2006 and its first on the road since a 44-0 triumph over Kent State on Aug. 31, 2006.

► It was the first shutout for Minnesota versus a Power 5 team since defeating Illinois 45-0 on Oct. 23, 2004. The Gophers' last shutout of a Power 5 team on the road also took place against Illinois, a 21-0 win in Champaign on Nov. 12, 1977.

► The Golden Gophers held Colorado to just 63 yards of total offense with 82 yards passing and -19 rushing yards.

► The 63 yards of total offense allowed was the third best in program history since 1960, bested only by 50 yards given up against Michigan in 1962 and a school-record 48 yards yielded to Navy also in 1962.

► According to Chris Vannini of *The Athletic*, the 63 yards were the fewest by an FBS team since Kansas had 21 yards against TCU in 2017.

► Minnesota outgained Colorado 83-0 in the first quarter (12 passing yards, -12 rushing yards) and held a 225-7 (34 passing, -27 rushing) advantage in total offense at halftime.

► The -19 rushing yards were the fourth lowest allowed since 1960 by Minnesota, trailing only -23 vs. Michigan in 1998, -31 in the aforementioned Navy contest in 1962 and the school record of -46 versus Michigan also in 1962.

► Colorado had 21 rushing attempts, the fewest by a Minnesota opponent since Miami (OH) also had 21 in 2011.

► After shutting out Colorado, Minnesota kept Bowling Green scoreless in the first quarter in its next contest. It marked the first time the Gophers had recorded five consecutive scoreless quarters since October 2004. The scoreless streak covered 87 minutes and 24 seconds, dating back to the end of the Miami (OH) game on Sept. 11.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

► Minnesota has had an average time of possession of 35:01 this year. That figure leads the Big Ten and ranks fifth nationally behind only Army (38:50), Western Michigan (36:38), Air Force (36:31) and Navy (35:15).

► At Colorado on Sept. 18, Minnesota held the ball for 40:13. It was the second time in the **P.J. Fleck** era that Minnesota had a TOP over 40 minutes, also doing so against Maryland in 2019 (42:53).

► In 52 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 40 times and gone 26-14 in those contests.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

► Among active FBS players, **Tanner Morgan** ranks 14th in career pass efficiency (154.44), 20th in pass yards (7,071) and passing TDs (52), 24th in completion percentage (61.7), 30th in pass yards per game (196.4), 30th in total offense (7,048), 32nd in pass attempts (778), 32nd in completions (480) and 35th in TDs responsible for (54).

► With his years at Abilene Christian included, **Jack Gibbens** ranks 14th among FBS players with 306 career tackles and 27th in tackles per game (6.65).

► Including his career at Kent State, **Matthew Trickett** is third among active FBS players with 2.03 career field goal attempts per game, and he is fourth in field goal made per game (1.57), ninth in field goals made (55) and points per game (8.0), 11th in field goal attempts (71), 21st in PAT percentage (98.3), 23rd in points (281), 35th in field goal percentage (77.5), and 33rd in extra points made and attempted (116-of-118).

► **Mohamed Ibrahim** is out for the season due to injury but he still ranks third among active FBS players in career rushes per game (18.86), fourth in rushing yards per game (103.6), sixth in rushing touchdowns (33), ninth in touchdowns scored (33), 10th in rushing yards (3,003), 11th in all-purpose yards per game (109.1), 13th in rushes (547), 14th in yards per rush (5.49), 27th in points per game (6.8) and 36th in all-purpose yards (3,164).

NON-CON STREAK SNAPPED

► Minnesota saw its 21-game non-conference winning streak end on Sept. 25 with a 14-10 setback against Bowling Green. It was the nation's longest active streak in the country, and at that time, only three other schools in the country had non-conference win streaks longer than seven games.

► The streak was tied for the third longest in the last 25 years along with LSU, which also won 21 in a row from 2005-09. Only Alabama (26, 2009-13) and Utah (23, 2012-18) had longer streaks in that span.

► The Golden Gophers hadn't lost a non-conference game since Sept. 3, 2015, at home to then-No. 2 TCU. Included in the streak were 17 regular season wins and four bowl victories. Also in the streak were 13 straight home wins against non-B1G teams, which was tied for the 10th longest streak in the FBS. Minnesota is now 13-1 under **P.J. Fleck** in non-conference games.

IBRAHIM OUT FOR THE YEAR

► **Mohamed Ibrahim**, the Big Ten's reigning Amec-Dayne Running Back of the Year, suffered a season-ending lower leg injury in Minnesota's season-opening loss to Ohio State. He had surgery on Sept. 7.

► Ibrahim has 14 career 100-yard rushing games, including a streak of nine in a row from the 2020 Outback Bowl through this year's season opener. Ibrahim's nine-game streak is the longest in program history, two more than former Gopher **Laurence Maroney**.

► Before leaving Minnesota's season opener in the third quarter with his injury, Ibrahim ran for 163 yards and two touchdowns on 30 attempts. In two career games against Ohio State, Ibrahim has run for 320 yards and four TDs on 53 carries.

► Ibrahim has 3,003 rushing yards for his career, the eighth Minnesota player to reach the 3,000-yard milestone.

► An All-Big Ten First Team honoree and AP Third-Team All-American last year, Ibrahim ran 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history). He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

► He also set a school record with a rushing average of 153.7 yards per game and tied a school mark with four rushing scores in one game (at Maryland and at Illinois).

POTTS ALSO LOST FOR SEASON

- ▶ Minnesota head coach **P.J. Fleck** announced on Oct. 11 that redshirt sophomore running back **Trey Potts** would miss the remainder of the season.
- ▶ Potts left the field in the fourth quarter of the team's Oct. 2, 2021, game at Purdue. Potts was immediately observed and treated by the team's medical staff and was then transported to a hospital for further observation. Potts was discharged from an Indiana hospital on Oct. 8 and returned to Minneapolis.
- ▶ The Gophers turned to Potts as their lead back with the season-ending injury to All-American **Mohamed Ibrahim**. In four games as a starter, Potts rushed for 518 yards and scored six touchdowns on 102 carries.
- ▶ In his first career start against Miami (OH) on Sept. 11, Potts ran for 178 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries, smashing personal highs in all three categories. In fact, Potts' 34 carries were the most by an FBS player this season until Sept. 25, and they now rank eighth. He followed that by rushing for 121 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 26 carries at Colorado, then tallied 141 yards on 27 rushes against Bowling Green before recording 78 yards and a score on 15 carries at Purdue.
- ▶ From Sept. 11 to Oct. 2 (his four games as a starter), Potts had the third-most rushing yards of any FBS player in the country and the second most carries.
- ▶ Overall on the season, Potts rushed 111 times for 552 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 110.4 yards per game and 5.0 yards per rush. He also caught three passes for 16 yards, returned six punts for 65 yards and brought back one kick for 17 yards.
- ▶ Through games on Oct. 2, Potts ranked ninth in the country in rushing yards, 11th in rushing yards per game, 19th in punt return average (10.8), 21st in rushing TDs and 25th in all-purpose yards per game (130.0).

MAFE, FAALELE ON 'FREAKS' LIST

- ▶ Seniors **Boye Mafe** and **Daniel Faalele** both appeared on the "2021 College Football Freaks List" from *The Athletic's* Bruce Feldman.
- ▶ Mafe came in at No. 17 of 101 players listed. "He's put on more than 50 pounds since arriving at Minnesota and weighs 263 now, up from 260 last year," Feldman wrote. "Mafe (4.5 sacks in six games in 2020) says he did a lot of single-leg work this offseason in hopes of improving his footwork." Among Mafe's weight room numbers listed by Feldman are a vertical jump of 40.5 inches, a broad jump of 10-6, a 4.57 40 and power cleaning 400 pounds."
- ▶ Faalele was ranked No. 29. "Two years ago, Faalele ranked No. 11 on this list because of his freakish combination of enormous size and a surprisingly athletic 29-inch vertical and 8-7 broad jump, but as he's reshaped his body, he's become a lot more nimble and flexible," Feldman wrote.

- ▶ Andries, who is majoring in Mathematics and is an aspiring actuary, is a repeat honoree after being named Second Team last season. He is Minnesota's first repeat selection since **Sam Renner**, who was named Second Team in both 2018 and 2019.
- ▶ Andries was named Academic All-Big Ten in 2020, 2019 and 2018 and was selected All-Big Ten Third Team in 2020 and 2019.

COACHING EXPERIENCE

- ▶ Four of Minnesota's assistant coaches have head coaching experience. **Mike Sanford** (OC/QBs) was the head coach at Western Kentucky from 2017-18, while **Paul Haynes** (Cornerbacks) led Kent State from 2013-17. **Joe Harasymiak** (Defensive Backs, Safeties and Co-DC) was the head coach at Maine from 2016-18 and was named the 2018 FCS Coach of the Year. **Clay Patterson** (Tight Ends) was the head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College from 2016-17, earning conference coach of the year honors in 2017.

HUNTINGTON BANK STADIUM

- Minnesota opened Huntington Bank Stadium with a 20-13 win against Air Force in 2009. All-time, the Gophers are 52-36 at Huntington, including a 20-12 record under Head Coach P.J. Fleck.
- Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher Hockey, MNF, an NHL game, international soccer, MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings and Minnesota United also played seasons on campus while their stadiums were being constructed.
- Upon completion, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960.
- The Gopher locker room is a state of the art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in the country. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.

HEAD COACH // FIFTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 40, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 61-43 and is 31-21 at Minnesota.

While at Minnesota, Fleck has guided Minnesota to its most wins (11 in 2019) since 1904, has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), six Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries twice, Sam Renner twice, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 194 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had eight players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962. The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962. Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history. Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999. The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same span.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck, which included a school record 3.33 cumulative team GPA after the 2020-21 academic year.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988. Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts. Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

Everyone, not just athletes and athletic teams can share, use and live the ROW THE BOAT lifestyle in their personal and professional lives. By applying ROW THE BOAT, one can have the proper perspective to overcome adversity and humble success by living a lifestyle dedicated to serving and giving.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing.
