FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

Minnesota (6-3, 4-2 B1G) looks to snap a two-game losing streak Saturday as it visits Indiana (2-8, 0-7 B1G) at 2:30 p.m. on Big Ten Network. It'll be the Gophers' first game in Bloomington since 2013 and just their second since 2007.

The Golden Gophers have one of the strongest rush defenses in the country, ranking ninth nationally and second in the Big Ten by allowing 99.9 rushing yards per game this year. The national average for rushing yards per game through Nov. 13 is 163.3 yards per game; only two Gopher opponents have gone above 144 yards rushing this year and five have been held to less than 100 rushing yards. In fact, Minnesota had a two-game stretch of just 3 rush yards allowed (-19 at Colorado, 22 vs. Bowling Green). The -19 has started 55 games in his career, a Minnesota rushing yards allowed at Colorado on Sept. 18 are tied for the fewest record and tied for the most in Big Ten history.



by any FBS team this year along with Clemson holding UConn to the same total on Nov. 13. The next fewest among Power 5 teams came on Oct. 23 when Wisconsin held Purdue to -13. Minnesota is fourth in the country in fewest opponent rush attempts (294), ninth in opponent rush yards (999), 17th in opponent rushing touchdowns (9) and 20th in opponent yards per carry (3.40).

Minnesota is 3-1 on the road this year, shutting out Colorado, 30-0, in Boulder on Sept. 18, winning at Purdue, 20-13, on Oct. 2 and beating Northwestern in Evanston, 41-14, on Oct. 30, before losing Saturday at Iowa, 27-22. It was the fourth time since 1961 that Minnesota had won its first three road games of a season, also winning its first three

in 2019 and its first four in 2003 and 1999. The Golden Gophers are 12-4 in their last 16 games away from home, including bowl games, beginning with a 37-15 victory at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018. During that timespan, only Ohio State (16-2) has a better mark away from home among Big Ten teams. More on Page 6.

With his start against Maryland on Oct. 23, Minnesota redshirt senior offensive lineman Conner Olson set the Golden Gophers program record with his 52nd career start. He broke the mark of 51 set by former long snapper Payton Jordahl from 2015-18. Now up to 55 starts, Olson has tied the Big Ten record of 55 starts set by Ohio State's Billy Price (2014-17). Olson, who should break the mark Saturday at Indiana, has started every Minnesota

game since the beginning of the 2017 season, which is the entire P.J. Fleck era. Olson has started 26 games at left guard, 15 at center and 14 at right guard. He currently holds the fifth longest active starting streak in the country.

Minnesota's loss Saturday at lowa dropped P.J. Fleck's record with the Golden Gophers to 32-23. In his fifth season, Fleck is already sixth in program history in overall wins and Big Ten wins (19), and tied for eighth in games coached (55). Fleck's .582 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his ninth season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 62-45 (.579).

A WIN SATURDAY WOULD...

- · Snap a two-game losing streak and avoid the team's first three-game losing skid since dropping four in a row in 2018
- · Improve Minnesota to 40-26-3 all-time against Indiana, including an 8-17-2 mark in Bloomington
- · Be the fourth straight win for Minnesota over Indiana, tying for the longest ever win streak in the series for either team
- · Mark a second straight win at Indiana, something Minnesota has only done one other time (1919 and 1922)
- Keep P.J. Fleck undefeated versus Indiana in two meetings
- Make Fleck 8-10 all-time in November at Minnesota
- Boost Minnesota's road record to 4-1 this year and 12-12 all-time under Fleck
- · Go down as Tanner Morgan's 25th career win as starting QB, the most by a Gopher signal-caller since at least 1959

FACING INDIANA

- Minnesota and Indiana meet for the 69th time on Saturday with the Golden Gophers leading the all-time series, 39-26-3. The Gophers' .596 win percentage against the Hoosiers is its second best against Big Ten teams (excluding a 2-0 record vs. Rutgers), behind only a .599 mark against Northwestern.
- The Gophers have won three straight in the series, though the three wins have come by a total of 19 points, or an 6.3 margin of victory.
- In Bloomington, Minnesota trails 7-17-2 in the series, but it has won two of the last three contests there.
- As a result of scheduling quirks, Minnesota and Indiana have only faced each other twice since the 2008 season: once in Bloomington in 2013 and once in Minneapolis in 2018.
- ▶ P.J Fleck is 1-0 all-time against Indiana. The Hoosiers are one of 14 teams Fleck is undefeated against while at Minnesota and one of 19 overall in his coaching career.
- Minnesota has three Indiana natives on its roster: freshman DL Austin Booker (Greenwood), redshirt freshman OL Martes Lewis (Merrillville), redshirt senior DL Esezi Otomewo (Indianapolis). Indiana has no Minnesotans on its roster.

- Minnesota cornerbacks coach Paul Haynes was the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach at Arkansas in 2012, while Indiana's Kevin Peoples was the Razorbacks' defensive line coach that same season.
- Gopher assistant head coach and running backs coach Kenni Burns is a 2006 graduate of Indiana. He played running back from 2003-06 and was a three-year letterwinner for the Hoosiers. He served as a liaison between student government and the athletic department.
- Indiana tight ends coach Kevin Wright was the head coach at IMG Academy in Florida from 2015-19, coaching current Gophers Brock Annexstad, Zack Annexstad, Jagwondis Burns and Daniel Faalele.
- Indiana enters the game 2-8 on the season and 0-7 in league play. The Hoosiers were 2-2 through four games, but have since lost six straight, including last week's 38-3 loss at home to Rutgers. During the six-game losing streak, the Hoosiers have been outscored 203-67.
- Minnesota and Indiana have three common opponents so far this year in Iowa, Maryland and Ohio State. The Gophers beat Maryland but lost to Iowa and Ohio State, while the Hoosiers were defeated by all three.
- Stephen Carr is Indiana's leading rusher at 66.7 yards per game, which ranks 10th in the Big Ten. He's rushed 155 times for 600 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 3.9
- Starting quarterback Michael Penix went down with an injury on Oct. 2 and the Hoosiers have used three different QBs as they look to replace his production.

- Jack Tuttle and Donaven McCulley have taken most of the snaps in Penix's stead. Tuttle is 45-of-87 for 423 yards with two touchdowns and five interceptions (88.66 rating), while McCulley is 32-of-75 for 458 yards and two TDs with no picks (102.76).
- Ty Fryfogle and Peyton Hendershot have been the top targets for Hoosier QBs. Fryfogle has 43 grabs for 496 vards and a touchdown, while Hendershot has caught 40 passes for 492 yards and four scores.
- ▶ Defensively, Micah McFadden leads the team with 62 tackles, 15.0 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks. His TFL total ranks 14th in the country and third in the Big Ten, while his sack numbers are 30th nationally and sixth in the conference. Five different players have an interception, while Jaylin Williams has a team-best 10 pass breakups.

LAST TIME VS. INDIANA

- With assistance from the AP: Tanner Morgan passed for 302 yards and three touchdowns in his first career start, including the tiebreaking 67-yard scoring toss to Rashod Bateman with 1:34 remaining that gave Minnesota a 38-31 victory on a rainy Friday night in 2018 after Indiana rallied with 22 straight fourth-quarter points.
- Morgan, a redshirt freshman who replaced injured true freshman Zack Annexstad, completed 17 of 24 attempts for the Gophers. With Annexstad held out with ankle and abdominal injuries, Morgan looked like a seasoned senior with an array of crisply thrown slant and post patterns while leading the Gophers on first-half touchdown drives of 77, 75 and 99 yards. Tyler Johnson caught two scoring passes and finished with 102 yards on five receptions, before leaving in the second half with an apparent injury.
- Peyton Ramsey went 29 for 44 for 232 yards, two scores and two interceptions. He ran eight times for 57 yards, and Stevie Scott had 18 carries for 96 yards and a touchdown. After Ramsey capped a third fourth-quarter touchdown drive for the Hoosiers with a 2-point conversion pass to Donavan Hale, the teams traded punts.
- When Minnesota regained possession, Morgan dropped back on the first play and hit Bateman in stride on a go route up the hashmark. Indiana took over at its 25, but Ramsey fumbled it and Minnesota ran out the clock.
- Shannon Brooks had 154 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries. He was about to cross the goal line again with the Gophers leading 31-9 late in the third quarter after true freshman Jordan Howden picked off Ramsey. But Brooks lost his second fumble of the game, one of four Minnesota turnovers, and the Hoosiers recovered it at the 2.
- While Ramsey and Scott helped spark the Indiana rally, Minnesota had six possessions that ended in three punts, two fumbles and an interception to give Indiana space and time to tie it.

LAST TIME IN BLOOMINGTON

- ► With assistance from the AP: Aaron Hill recovered a fumble by Indiana's Tevin Coleman with 25 seconds remaining and Minnesota held on to beat the Hoosiers 42-39 when the teams last met in Bloomington in 2013.
- ► Minnesota led 35-13 midway through the third quarter before the Hoosiers stormed back for a 39-35 lead on Nate Sudfeld's 30-yard touchdown pass to Cody Latimer with 5:33 remaining. But Philip Nelson found Maxx Williams open down the middle for a 50-yard scoring pass on Minnesota's ensuing possession.
- Indiana then drove to the Gophers' 9-yard line before Sudfeld threw a lateral on second-and-goal that Coleman juggled and Hill scooped up the bouncing football.
- Nelson went 16 of 23 for 298 yards and four touchdowns. David Cobb rushed 29 times for 188 yards and a score for Minnesota. Coleman ran 14 times for 108 yards and a touchdown for Indiana before his fateful mistake.

► The Hoosiers were down 35-13 after Cobb exploded for a 27-yard touchdown run with 6:24 left in the third quarter. But touchdowns on four straight possessions, combined with three consecutive defensive stops, allowed Indiana to improbably take a late lead.

MEMORABLE GAMES VS. INDIANA

- ▶ Oct. 4, 2008: **Eric Decker** tied a program record with 13 receptions and recorded 190 receiving yards (third-highest total at Minnesota then, fifth-highest now) in the Gophers' 16-7 win over Indiana.
- Nov. 4, 2006: Bryan Cupito completed 22-of-33 passes for 378 yards and four touchdowns in a 63-26 Minnesota win, its highest scoring Big Ten game since 1916. Logan Payne caught six passes for 137 yards, while Ernie Wheelwright made three receptions for 116 yards and two scores. On the ground Jay Thomas ran for 79 yards and two touchdowns, while the defense picked off three passes, including a pick-six for Dom Barber.
- Nov. 18, 1967: Quarterback **Curtis Wilson** established a school record with four rushing touchdowns and gained 118 yards in a 33-7 win over Indiana. The record has since been tied seven times by six different individuals.

RECAPPING IOWA

- ▶ With assistance from the AP: Alex Padilla threw for two touchdowns and ran for another, and No. 19 lowa withstood three fourth-quarter comeback attempts Saturday to beat Minnesota 27-22 and keep the Floyd of Rosedale trophy for the seventh year in a row.
- ▶ Padilla completed 11 of 24 passes for 206 yards. He had a 1-yard touchdown dive in the second quarter, then had touchdown passes of 72 yards to Charlie Jones in the third quarter and 27 yards to Keagan Johnson in the fourth.
- ► The Hawkeyes led 24-16 before Minnesota's **Tanner Morgan** threw a 68-yard touchdown pass to **Chris Autman-Bell** with 5:28 to play. The Gophers went for the two-point conversion, but Morgan's pass was tipped by lowa safety Dane Belton and fell incomplete.
- ▶ The Gophers got the ball back at their own 10-yard line with 3:08 left. Morgan was sacked for a 7-yard loss on second down, and his fourth-down pass was broken up by lowa's Matt Hankins. Caleb Shudak's 29-yard field goal provided the final margin, and then the Hawkeyes' defense bowed up one more time when Minnesota drove to the lowa 39. The game ended with Joe Evans sacking Morgan.
- ▶ Minnesota had a chance to take the lead down 17-16 to start the fourth quarter, but **Dragan Kesich's** 53-yard field-goal attempt was blocked by Logan Lee. Five plays later, Johnson took a short pass from Padilla and turned it into a 27-yard touchdown.
- ▶ The Gophers, who had the ball for 40 minutes, had 189 rushing yards. That was the most this season against the Hawkeyes, who came into the game ranked eighth nationally in rushing defense at 98.6 yards per game. **Ky Thomas** rushed for 126 yards to lead the Gophers, who haven't won in Iowa City since 1999.
- ► Matthew Trickett had three field goals for the Gophers. Minnesota's other touchdown came in the second quarter on backup quarterback Cole Kramer's 37-yard pass to tight end Ko Kieft.

MORGAN LEADS MAROON & GOLD

- ► Fifth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is in his third full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's proven himself to be one of the best signal-callers to ever wear the Maroon and Gold.
- ▶ Morgan is 24-12 as a starter and has completed 521 (fourth most in school history) of 854 passes (sixth most) for 7,568 yards (second most) and 53 touchdowns (fourth most) in his career.

- ► His career completion percentage of .610 is first in school history, as is his 150.07 efficiency rating, .667 starter win percentage and 24 wins as a starter (since 1959).
- ▶ At Purdue on Oct. 2, Morgan became the fourth player in Gophers history to reach 50 career touchdown passes, joining Adam Weber (72), Bryan Cupito (55) and Asad Abdul-Khaliq (55). Of the four, Morgan did it in the fewest pass attempts with 727, edging out Abdul-Khaliq's mark of 736. Morgan also tied Weber for second fewest games to reach 50, doing so in his 34th game.

- Against Nebraska on Oct. 16, Morgan finished 20-of-24 for 209 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. His completion percentage of 83.3 percent ranks tied for fourth in school annals since 1979. He also owns the No. 1 (21-22 at Purdue in 2019) and No. 2 (18-20 vs. Penn State in 2019) spots on the list.
- ▶ Morgan was 14-of-15 (93.3 percent) for 171 yards and two touchdowns in the first half against the Huskers. He completed 16 straight passes in one span between the first and third quarters, breaking the school record for consecutive completions of 14 done four times previously, including once by himself. The 16 straight completions tied for the third longest streak in a conference game in B1G history.
- ▶ Morgan has 11 Minnesota season and game records and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-Big Ten Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.
- ▶ This season, Morgan has completed 116-of-200 passes for 1,540 yards and seven touchdowns against seven interceptions for an efficiency rating of 127.2, and he's added two rushing touchdowns. He ranks fourth in the Big Ten in yards per completion (13.28) and sixth in yards per pass attempt (7.70).

Freshmen RB DUO CALLED UPON

- ▶ With Mohamed Ibrahim, Trey Potts, Bryce Williams and Preston Jelen out for the season with injuries, the Minnesota running game now rests on the shoulders of true freshman Mar'Keise Irving and redshirt freshman Ky Thomas. Both have answered the call as each ran for over 100 yards against Maryland on Oct. 23 and at Northwestern on Oct. 30, while Thomas added another 100-yard game at lowa on Oct. 13.
- ▶ Against the Terrapins, Irving went for 105 yards and a TD, while Thomas had a career-high 139 yards and a score. Versus the Wildcats, Irving ran for a career-high 110 yards and two touchdowns on 19 attempts and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week, while Thomas had 106 yards on 21 carries at Northwestern.
- ▶ Until the duo did it against Maryland, no Minnesota freshmen had run for at least 100 yards in the same game since at least 1942. Irving and Thomas then became the first Minnesota duo to go for 100 yards in consecutive weeks since Laurence Maroney and Gary Russell did so at Michigan (10/8/05) and versus Wisconsin (10/15/05).
- ▶ Saturday at Iowa, Thomas ran a career-high 29 times for 126 yards. It's the most rushing yards the Hawkeyes, who were allowing just 98.6 rush yards per game entering the contest, had allowed to an individual this year. In fact, it was highest rushing total given up by Iowa since Ibrahim had 144 yards in last year's meeting, a span of 14 games.
- ▶ Over the last three weeks, Thomas has run for 431 yards and a score on 87 carries (5.0 avg), while Irving has 321 rushing yards on 56 carries (5.7 avg) with three TDs.
- ▶ Overall, Thomas has played in six games this year and has 101 carries for 520 yards and two scores. His 5.1 yards per carry is second on the team to Irving.

- ► Thomas, who did not see any action last year, was a four-star recruit and ranked the No. 25 running back in the country by 247Sports out of high school. Thomas (5'11, 205 pounds) finished his prep career with 7,703 rushing yards and 95 rushing TDs.
- ▶ Irving, who made his backfield debut against Colorado on Sept. 18, has tallied 471 yards and three touchdowns on 88 carries this year, averaging a team-best 5.2 yards per attempt. Irving (5'10, 190 pounds) was a four-star recruit by 247Sports and was the No. 10 running back, according to Rivals. His high school career consisted of 3,264 rushing yards and 587 receiving yards.
- Irving has also been the team's top kick returner this year with six returns for 173 yards, including a 41-yarder against Miami (OH) that was the longest by a Gopher since 2018. Irving's 28.8 yards per return would rank seventh in the nation if he had five more returns to qualify.
- ► At Northwestern. Minnesota also turned to redshirt sophomore linebacker Derik LeCaptain, and all he did was run three times for 31 yards, including a 24-yard touchdown run. LeCaptain was a two-way player in high school at Southern Door in Wisconsin, winning 2019 Wisconsin High School Male Athlete of the Year honors. LeCaptain recorded the most yards from scrimmage (passing, rushing and receiving) in Wisconsin high school football history, posting 5,199 career rushing yards and 100 career touchdowns. A former walk-on and 2019 Special Teams Scout Player of the Year, LeCaptain was awarded a scholarship in August.
- ► Minnesota has had five individuals run for 100 yards this year for the Gophers, something the Gophers have not had since at least 1942. In fact, Minnesota is the only FBS team this season to have five different individuals reach 100 yards.

Eight different players have also scored a rushing touchdown this year: Potts (6), Irving (3), Williams (3), Cole Kramer (2), Ibrahim (2), Thomas (2), Tanner Morgan (2) and LeCaptain (1). That's the most individuals with a rushing touchdown in one season for the Gophers since 10 different players did so in 1985.

AUTMAN-BELL NEXT WR UP

- ► Senior Chris Autman-Bell was Minnesota's No. 3 receiver two years ago behind Tyler Johnson and Rashod Bateman, and the No. 2 target last year before Bateman opted out. But with those two now on to the NFL, Autman-Bell is poised to be the team's next top target.
- Despite missing the first two games of the season. most of the Bowling Green contest and most of the second half against Illinois all due to injury, Autman-Bell still leads the team this year in receptions (29), receiving yards (409), receiving yards per game (51.1), receiving touchdowns (3), targets (45) and targets per game (5.6). In addition, his catch percentage of 64.4 is second-highest on the team of anyone with at least 10 targets.
- Saturday at Iowa, Autman-Bell caught a team-high five passes for 109 yards, including a 68-yard TD in the fourth quarter. The 109 yards mark the most by a Gopher this year, and it was his second 100-yard game this season (fourth of his career)

- Autman-Bell posted a career-high 11 receptions for 103 yards against Nebraska on Oct. 16. His reception total was the highest by a Gopher since Tyler Johnson had 12 vs. Auburn in the 2020 Outback Bowl and ranks tied for 10th in program single-game history. Autman-Bell, whose previous career high for receptions was five, caught nine passes for 100 yards and a score in the first half alone against the Huskers.
- With four catches against Maryland on Oct. 23, Autman-Bell became the 17th player in program history to record 100 career receptions. Reaching the mark in 38 games, he was the 11th quickest to get there.
- ► Autman-Bell has played in 41 career games with 107 catches (T-16th in program history) for 1,659 yards (13th all-time at Minnesota) and nine TDs (T-20th). He has caught at least one pass in 40 games and has made at least one catch in his past 35 games (third longest streak in school history and sixth longest active streak nationally).

▶ In seven games last year, he caught 22 passes for 430 yards and one score. That came after recording 28 catches for 371 yards and five touchdowns in 2019 and 28 catches (fourth all-time for a Minnesota freshman) for 449 yards (third all-time for a Minnesota freshman) in 2018 (also led team with 16.03 yards/catch).

BROWN-STEPHENS: PLAYMAKER

- ▶ Redshirt sophomore wide receiver Mike Brown-Stephens has 19 catches on the year and has turned them into 369 receiving yards, the second-highest total on the team. His 19.4 yards per catch average leads the team, ranks second in the Big Ten and sits 15th in the nation among all players with at least 19 catches this year.
- ▶ At Purdue on Oct. 2, Brown-Stephens caught two passes for 105 yards, tallying catches of 51 and 54 yards, the two second and third longest receptions by a Gopher this year. Since 2000, the only Minnesota player with more receiving yards on two or fewer receptions was **Duane**Bennett, with 121 yards on two catches vs. Michigan State on Oct. 31, 2009.
- ► The last time a Gopher had multiple catches of 50+ yards in one game was **Rashod Bateman**, who had TD catches of both 86 and 61 yards at Illinois on Nov. 3, 2018.
- ▶ Brown-Stephens followed that performance at Purdue with three receptions for 58 yards on Oct. 16 against Nebraska, a 35-yard grab vs. Maryland on Oct. 23 and a career-high four receptions for 63 yards at Northwestern on Oct. 30. Saturday at lowa, he matched his career high with four catches for 52 yards.

JACKSON, WRIGHT GETTING LOOKS

- ▶ With Chris Autman-Bell missing the team's first two games due to injury, sophomore wide receivers Daniel Jackson and Dylan Wright got the chance to develop their in-game chemistry with Tanner Morgan, and they've turned into two of his top targets so far this year.
- ▶ Jackson, who has also missed two games this year, ranks second on the team in targets (41) and targets per game (5.1) and is third in receptions (18). He had a careerhigh 58 receiving yards versus Ohio State in the opener.
- ► As a freshman in 2020, Jackson was third on the team with 12 catches for 167 yards, averaging 23.9 yards/game.
- ► Though he missed the game at Purdue, Wright is second on the team in TD receptions (2), yards per catch (17.6) and third in receiving yards (246) and yards per game (27.3).
- ▶ In the opener against Ohio State, Wright caught five passes for 57 yards and a touchdown, then followed with three catches for 73 yards and another TD vs. Miami (OH).
- ▶ Wright played in eight games over two seasons at Texas A&M but did not record any stats. At 6'3, 215 pounds, Wright was an Under Armour All-American in high school and the No. 12 WR in the country by 247Sports.

RELIABLE TIGHT END TARGETS

- ► Gopher tight ends **Brevyn Spann-Ford** and **Ko Kieft** have seen their production grow over the last few weeks, serving as reliable targets in the Gopher passing attack.
- ▶ Of Spann-Ford's 23 targets this year, 11 have come in the last three weeks, including a season-high six targets versus Illinois and four at Iowa. He has caught 17 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown this year, ranking fourth on the team for receptions.
- Additionally, Spann-Ford's 78.3 percent catch rate is the best of any Gopher with at least seven targets this year.
- ► Kieft has seven catches for 101 yards and a touchdown this year, and his 14.4 yards per catch ranks third on the team among those with more than one catch.
- ► Four of Kieft's seven catches have come in the last four games, including two for a career-high 48 yards Saturday at lowa, highlighted by a 37-yard TD catch. He has a catch rate of 77.8 percent, trailing only Spann-Ford.

KRAMER AT WILDCAT OB

- ▶ Redshirt sophomore QB **Cole Kramer** has entrenched himself over the last seven games as the Minnesota wildcat quarterback.
- ► He made his season debut against Bowling Green, rushing twice for 22 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown run. He followed that with eight carries for 32 yards at Purdue, including five carries on one drive late in the fourth quarter that ended in a Minnesota field goal.
- Against Nebraska, he rushed six times for 20 yards, plus a 5-yard TD pass (the first of his career), while against Maryland he carried five times for 30 yards and another score, and he had five rushes for 23 yards at Northwestern along with four rushes for 20 yards against Illinois. Saturday at lowa, Kramer only ran once for four yards, but he did throw a 37-yard touchdown pass on a 4th-and-2.
- ▶ On the season, Kramer has rushed 31 times for 151 yards and two TDs, averaging 4.9 yards per carry. He's also completed all three of his pass attempts for 62 yards and two touchdowns. Kramer is one of two players in the country this year, and the only one in the FBS, with two touchdown passes on three or fewer attempts. Over the last five years, Kramer is one of 10 to accomplish the feat.
- ▶ Of his 31 carries, 15 have come on third down and he's turned 10 of them into first downs. Of the five he didn't convert, three were on plays of 3rd-and-5 or longer. A 3rd-and-3 rush against Nebraska went for 2 yards, but he followed with a 5-yard TD pass on 4th down.

O-LINE DEPTH AMONG THE BEST

- ▶ Minnesota boasts one of the deepest offensive lines in the entire country as 12 members of the unit have appeared in at least one game and nine have started at least one contest (page 17).
- ▶ In fact, the Golden Gophers' offensive line has more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 220. The next closest squad is Miami (FL) with 209, while Michigan State (206) is third.
- ▶ Redshirt senior Conner Olson leads the team with his Big Ten-record 55 starts. Fellow redshirt seniors Blaise Andries and Sam Schlueter have each started 43 contests. Those three have also started at least two games at multiple positions.
- Additionally, Daniel Faalele (28), John Micheal Schmitz (20) and Utah State transfer Karter Shaw (19) and have all started double-digit games in their careers.

- Not only does the offensive line have tremendous experience, but it also has impressive versatility. The unit has at least 35 combined starts at every position, with a high of 52 at right guard, and each position features starts from at least two different players, including four players with starts at right guard and right tackle, and three players with starts left guard and center.
- ▶ Further showcasing the depth, in the 2021 season opener the Minnesota offense opened in a jumbo package that featured seven starting offensive linemen, and it started six lineman against Miami (OH), Colorado, Nebraska and Northwestern.

IRVING NAMED B1G F.O.W.

- ► Running back Mar'Keise Irving was named co-Big Ten Freshman of the Week after his standout performance at Northwestern; sharing with Michigan's Andrel Anthony.
- ► Irving rushed 19 times for a career-high 110 yards and two touchdowns to help lead Minnesota to a 41-14 road win. Irving scored on runs of three and 41 yards.
- ▶ Irving is the second Gopher to be named a Big Ten Player of the Week this season, joining punter Mark Crawford who was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 4 (more on Page 7). Irving is the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week since Rashod Bateman was honored on Nov. 5, 2018.

GOPHERS BOAST TOP-20 DEFENSE

- ▶ Minnesota enters Saturday's game with the No. 7 total defense in the country, allowing just 296.7 yards per game. That's on pace to be the best mark the program has had since 1977 when it allowed 292.8 yards per game.
- ▶ Not including the season opener, Minnesota has held seven of its nine opponents this season below what their season total offense average was entering the contest.

- ▶ In addition to the rush defense notes on page 1, the most dominant performance came at Colorado, which entered the Sept. 18 contest with 226.0 rush yards per game. The Gophers held CU to -19 yards rushing, meaning the Buffaloes were held 245 yards below their average.
- ▶ Against Nebraska on Oct. 16, Minnesota limited Nebraska QB Adrian Martinez, a 2,000-yard rusher in his career with seven games over 100 yards, -17 rushing yards on eight carries. The -17 rushing yards were his fewest in 36 career games to that point.
- ► The Gophers are holding opponents to 19.2 points per game. The unit is looking to post a scoring defense below 20 points per game for the season for the first time since 1999 (16.3). The last time before that was 1977 (15.5).
- ▶ Prior to giving up 27 Saturday at lowa, Minnesota had held its previous seven opponents to 23 points or fewer, the team's longest such streak since a seven-game stretch from the 2002 Music City Bowl through the first six games of 2003. The last seven-game streak to occur in one season was the first seven games of 1999, while that streak actually grows to nine games when the last two contests of 1998 are included.

4TH-DOWN SUCCESS

- ▶ Minnesota has been one of the more successful teams this season on fourth downs on both sides of the ball. The defense ranks 20th in the country by holding opponents to just a 38.5 percent conversion rate (5-13), while the offense is 33rd by converting 63.6 percent of its attempts (7-11).
- ▶ The Gophers have stopped opponents on six of their past eight fourth-down attempts. After Purdue started 2-2 on Oct. 2, Minnesota stopped the Boilermakers on 4th-and-5 at the MN43. The Gophers then held Nebraska to 0-2 on its tries on Oct. 16, and Maryland was 0-1 the following week.

- ► At Northwestern, the Wildcats picked up a 4th-and-1 at the NU49 in the third quarter, but on the same drive a 4th-and-3 at the MN28 was incomplete. In the fourth quarter, a pass on 4th-and-8 at the NU43 also was incomplete. Last week, lowa was 1-1, gaining one yard on a 4th-and-1.
- ▶ Offensively, Minnesota started the year 3-4 in 4th-down attempts, before going 1-3 vs. Illinois on Nov. 6. Saturday at lowa they bounced back by going 3-4, their most fourth-down conversions in one game since going 3-3 at Wisconsin in 2018.
- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim turned a 4th-and-1 at the MN29 against Ohio State into a 56-yard run that set up a touchdown pass. At Colorado, Trey Potts gained 5 yards on a 4th-and-1 at the CU8 and scored on the next play. After getting stopped on a 4th-and-1 at the MN29 versus Bowling Green, the Gophers came back against Nebraska and passed for a touchdown on 4th-and-1 at the NEB5.
- Against the Hawkeyes, the Gophers turned a 4th-and-2 into a 37-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter. Later in the fourth, **Ky Thomas** had a three-yard run on 4th-and-1, and after an incompletion on a 4th-and-17, the Gophers converted a 4th-and-10.

LINEBACKER DUO PACING THE 'D'

- ▶ On a defense with its top nine tacklers back from last season, the linebacking duo of **Mariano Sori-Marin** and **Jack Gibbens** has paced the unit in 2021.
- ▶ Sori-Marin, who has started all 10 games but was limited to less than one quarter of play at Purdue, leads the team with 71 tackles, including 29 over the last three games. After 11 at Northwestern, he had 12 against Illinois, which is the most by a Gopher this year. Sori-Marin also has 3.5 tackles for loss this year, three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and one of the team's four interceptions.

Ski-U-Mah // Row The Boat

- Sori-Marin was the team's top tackler from a year ago. registering 54 stops in seven games in 2020. He also made 1.5 tackles for loss, broke up three passes and forced a fumble. His top performance last year came at Nebraska when he recorded a career-high 18 tackles and forced a fumble en route to being named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week.
- Gibbens is right behind Sori-Marin with 68 tackles. He also has one forced fumble, and he's tied for second in pass breakups (3. all coming at Purdue). After two tackles in the season opener, Gibbens has at least six stops in eight of the last nine contests, including six games with eight tackles, with a season-high 10 against Maryland on Oct. 23.
- Gibbens spent the past four seasons at the FCS level with Abilene Christian where he totaled 258 tackles, 22.5 tackles for loss, seven sacks and five interceptions. He was the team's leading tackler this past season and was second in both 2019 and 2018.

SACK TOTALS GOING UP

- Minnesota did not have a sack through its first two games, but the Gophers have since tallied 19 sacks over the last eight games.
- Boye Mafe and Thomas Rush recorded 2.0 sacks a piece at Colorado on Sept. 18. It was the first time Minnesota had two players with 2.0 sacks in a game since Blake Cashman and Steven Richardson each had 2.0 against Northwestern on Nov. 19, 2016.
- Mafe added 2.0 more against Bowling Green on Sept. 25, while Trill Carter and Rush each had a solo sack. At Purdue, Mafe and Jaqwondis Burns had 1.0 sack a piece, with Rush, Coney Durr, Micah Dew-Treadway and Nyles Pinckney each picking up half a sack.
- Pinckney and Esezi Otomewo both had 1.0 sacks against Nebraska, as did Rush and Coney Durr versus Maryland. At Northwestern, Mafe had another sack, while MJ Anderson recorded the first of his career. Rush added another sack against Illinois.
- The 12 sacks (four in each game) against Colorado, Bowling Green and Purdue were the most for Minnesota in a three-game span since recording 14 against Purdue (6), Nebraska (1) and Northwestern (7) from Nov. 5-19, 2016.
- ► The Gophers had not had a streak of three straight games with at least four sacks since Oct. 4-25, 2008, when they did so versus Indiana (4), Illinois (5) and Purdue (5).
- Mafe's 6.0 sacks this year are tied for 43rd nationally and rank eighth in the Big Ten. He already has the most by a Gopher since Carter Coughlin had 9.5 in 2018. Mafe also leads the team with 8.0 tackles for loss this year.
- With Rush at 5.5 sacks this year, he and Mafe are the first Gopher duo with at least 5.5 sacks in the same season since Cashman (7.5) and Richardson (7.0) in 2016.

TURNING TO'S INTO POINTS

- ▶ Minnesota's defense has forced 12 turnovers this year and has capitalized on nearly all of them. The Gophers have scored on the ensuing drive on eight of the 12 turnovers and added a fumble return for a touchdown, turning them into 47 points.
- In the opener against Ohio State, cornerback Terrell Smith returned an interception 23 yards against Ohio State, resulting in a Mohamed Ibrahim rushing touchdown.
- Versus Miami (OH), the Gophers recovered a fumble on the RedHawks' opening drive, and Trey Potts cashed in with a rushing touchdown. In the fourth quarter, Tyler Nubin's 18-yard interception return against Miami (OH) was followed by a Matthew Trickett field goal.
- ► At Colorado, Jack Gibbens stripped the CU quarterback in the third quarter, Justus Harris recovered and seven plays later, Potts scored. Later in the fourth, a muffed Buffaloes punt was recovered by Bishop McDonald and Trickett hit a 33-yard field goal.

- Against Bowling Green, Mariano Sori-Marin notched the first interception of his career and Trickett followed with a 36-yard field goal. Later in the contest, Braelen Oliver forced a fumble that was recovered by Smith, but Minnesota was forced to punt.
- Purdue's opening drive ended with a strip sack by Boye Mafe with a recovery by Val Martin. Four plays later, Tanner Morgan hit Chris Autman-Bell for a score. In the fourth guarter. Nubin had an interception with less than a minute to go that didn't result in any points, but it did allow the Gophers to run out the clock.
- At Northwestern, Sori-Marin forced a fumble in the first guarter and Justin Walley returned it 25 yards for a touchdown. It was the first fumble return for a touchdown for Minnesota since Blake Cashman did so against Purdue in 2018.
- At lowa, Walley forced and recovered a fumble late in the second quarter, and Trickett made a 31-yard field goal.

KESICH THE KICKOFF SPECIALIST

- ► Kickoff specialist **Dragan Kesich**, who did not play against Illinois, has 34 touchbacks on 51 kickoffs this year. He ranks 27th in the country with his 66.67 percent touchback rate and 31st with his 63.51 average vardage on kickoffs.
- Against Maryland, he set a career high with six touchbacks and tied a career high with seven kickoffs.
- Minnesota is 10th nationally by holding opponents to 16.42 yards per return and 19th with only 197 kickoff return yards allowed. The Gophers are also tied for 26th in the country with only 12 opponent kick returns this year.

B1G HONOR FOR CRAWFORD

- ▶ Minnesota punter Mark Crawford was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 4 after a standout performance in Minnesota's 20-13 win at Purdue on Oct. 2. Crawford shared the honor with Penn State's Jordan Stout.
- Crawford continually flipped the field in a rainsoaked game, as he averaged 51.3 yards on six punts. He recorded a career-long, 60-yard punt twice, which was Minnesota's longest punt since Ryan Santoso had a 61-yarder against Illinois on Oct. 21, 2017.
- Crawford's six punts traveled 60, 60, 58, 46, 45 and 39 yards with his three longest punts all ranking in the top 20 of longest punts in the Big Ten at the time. He placed four punts inside the 15-yard line, which led to Purdue starting drives on its own 2, 9, 15 and 15 yard lines.
- Minnesota also allowed zero punt return yards against Purdue, which was a big reason why the Boilermakers, who ran 86 total plays, were limited to only 13 total points and did not score in the second half.
- Crawford also executed four successful holds (two point-after attempts and two field goals) in a driving rain.
- He was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week since holder Casey O'Brien was recognized on Oct. 21, 2019, and he's the first Minnesota punter to receive the honor since 2013 when Peter Mortell was recognized on Nov. 4 and Nov. 11.

PITCHING A SHUTOUT

- Minnesota's 30-0 win at Colorado on Sept. 18 was its first shutout since a 62-0 shutout of Temple on Sept. 16, 2006, and its first on the road since a 44-0 triumph over Kent State on Aug. 31, 2006.
- It was the first shutout for Minnesota versus a Power 5 team since defeating Illinois 45-0 on Oct. 23, 2004. The Gophers' last shutout of a Power 5 team on the road also took place against Illinois, a 21-0 win in Champaign on Nov. 12, 1977.

- ► The Golden Gophers held Colorado to just 63 yards of total offense with 82 yards passing and -19 rush yards.
- ► The 63 yards of total offense allowed was the third best in program history since 1960, bested only by 50 yards given up against Michigan in 1962 and a school-record 48 yards yielded to Navy also in 1962.
- According to Chris Vannini of *The Athletic*, the 63 yards were the fewest by an FBS team since Kansas had 21 yards against TCU in 2017.
- Minnesota outgained Colorado 83-0 in the first quarter (12 passing yards, -12 rushing yards) and held a 225-7 (34 passing, -27 rushing) advantage in total offense at halftime.
- ► The -19 rushing yards were the fourth lowest allowed since 1960 by Minnesota, trailing only -23 vs. Michigan in 1998, -31 in the aforementioned Navy contest in 1962 and the school record of -46 versus Michigan also in 1962.
- ► Colorado had 21 rushing attempts, the fewest by a Minnesota foe since Miami (OH) also had 21 in 2011.
- After shutting out Colorado, Minnesota kept Bowling Green scoreless in the first quarter in its next contest. It marked the first time the Gophers had recorded five consecutive scoreless quarters since October 2004. The scoreless streak covered 87 minutes and 24 seconds, dating back to the end of the Miami (OH) game on Sept. 11.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

- ▶ Minnesota has had an average time of possession of 35:30 this year. That figure leads the Big Ten and ranks fourth nationally behind only Army (37:15), Air Force (36:10) and Western Michigan (35:33).
- ▶ Four times in the **P.J. Fleck** era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game. Most recently, the Gophers held the ball for 40:02 at lowa on Nov. 13, while they had it for 40:09 at Northwestern on Oct. 30 and at Colorado on Sept. 18, Minnesota had it for 40:13. The only larger time of possession came against Maryland in 2019 (42:53).
- ▶ In 54 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 42 times and gone 27-15 in those contests.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

- Among active FBS players, **Tanner Morgan** ranks 20th in career pass efficiency (150.25), 21st in pass yards (7,568), 27th in pass TDs (53), 28th in total offense (7,536), 33rd in pass attempts (853), 34th in completions (521), 35th in pass yards/game (194.1), 36th in TDs responsible for (57) and 37th in completion percentage (61.1).
- ▶ With his years at Abilene Christian included, **Jack Gibbens** ranks 12th among FBS players with 326 career tackles and 37th in tackles per game (6.65).
- ▶ Including his career at Kent State, **Matthew Trickett** is third among active FBS players with 2.03 career field goal attempts per game, fourth in field goal made per game (1.58), ninth in field goals made (60), 10th in points per game (7.9), 10th in field goal attempts (77), 22nd in points (302), 26th in PAT percentage (97.6), 33rd in extra points made and attempted (122-of-125) and 35th in field goal percentage (77.9).
- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim is out for the season due to injury but he still ranks third among active FBS players in career rushes per game (18.86), sixth in rushing yards per game (103.6), ninth in rushing touchdowns (33), 12th in touchdowns scored (33), 13th in rushing yards (3,003), 13th in all-purpose yards per game (109.1), 17th in yards per rush (5.49), 19th in rushes (547), 27th in points per game (6.8) and 45th in all-purpose yards (3,164).

FLECK SIGNS 7-YEAR CONTRACT

- ▶ The University of Minnesota and head football coach P.J. Fleck have agreed to a new seven-year contract, it was announced on Nov. 3. This agreement, pending Board of Regents approval, will keep Fleck in Maroon and Gold through the 2028 season.
- ▶ "This is home," said Fleck. "Our family loves it here and we are excited to continue this journey at the University of Minnesota. From day one, we talked about cultural sustainability and how important it is to building a successful football program and life program. Today is another step in that process, and this new contract is a commitment to our elite staff and the entire state of Minnesota. Heather and I are so thankful to our staff, Mark Coyle, President Joan Gabel and the Board of Regents for trusting us to lead this program. Our goal is to recruit and coach at an elite level and to have our young people achieve academic, athletic, social and spiritual excellence. It's a tremendous honor to lead this program, and we will continue to work to build a culture that connects the entire state."
- ▶ "P.J. and Heather continue to do everything the right way," said Director of Athletics Mark Coyle. "He continues to build a program that fans can take great pride in, and his student-athletes compete at a high level academically, athletically and socially. He is a tremendous recruiter and has elevated the stature of our program by an immeasurable amount. I am grateful to President Gabel and the Board of Regents for their continued support, and I look forward to Coach Fleck continuing to lead the Gophers."

NON-CON STREAK SNAPPED

- ▶ Minnesota saw its 21-game non-conference win streak end on Sept. 25 with a 14-10 setback against Bowling Green. It was the nation's longest active streak in the country, and at that time, only three other schools in the country had non-conference win streaks longer than seven games.
- ► The streak was tied for the third longest in the last 25 years along with LSU, which also won 21 in a row from 2005-09. Only Alabama (26, 2009-13) and Utah (23, 2012-18) had longer streaks in that span.
- ▶ The Golden Gophers hadn't lost a non-conference game since Sept. 3, 2015, at home to then-No. 2 TCU. Included in the streak were 17 regular season wins and four bowl victories. Also in the streak were 13 straight home wins against non-B1G teams, which was tied for the 10th longest streak in the FBS. Minnesota is 13-1 under P.J. Fleck in non-conference games.

IBRAHIM OUT FOR THE YEAR

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim, the Big Ten's reigning Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year, suffered a season-ending lower leg injury in Minnesota's season-opening loss to Ohio State. He had surgery on Sept. 7.
- ▶ Ibrahim has 14 career 100-yard rushing games, including a streak of nine in a row from the 2020 Outback Bowl through this year's season opener. Ibrahim's ninegame streak is the longest in program history, two more than former Gopher Laurence Maroney.
- ▶ Before leaving in the third quarter with his injury, Ibrahim ran for 163 yards and two touchdowns on 30 attempts. In two career games against Ohio State, Ibrahim has run for 320 yards and four TDs on 53 carries.
- ▶ Ibrahim has 3,003 rushing yards for his career, the eighth Minnesota player to reach the 3,000-yard milestone.

- ▶ An All-Big Ten First Team honoree and AP Third-Team All-American last year, Ibrahim ran 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history). He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).
- ► He also set a school record with a rushing average of 153.7 yards per game and tied a school mark with four rushing scores in one game (at Maryland and at Illinois).

POTTS ALSO LOST FOR SEASON

- ▶ Minnesota head coach **P.J. Fleck** announced on Oct. 11 that redshirt sophomore running back **Trey Potts** would miss the remainder of the season.
- ▶ Potts left the field in the fourth quarter of the team's Oct. 2, 2021, game at Purdue. Potts was immediately observed and treated by the team's medical staff and was then transported to a hospital for further observation. Potts was discharged from an Indiana hospital on Oct. 8 and returned to Minneapolis.
- ▶ The Gophers turned to Potts as their lead back with the season-ending injury to All-American **Mohamed Ibrahim**. In four games as a starter, Potts rushed for 518 yards and scored six touchdowns on 102 carries.
- ▶ In his first career start against Miami (OH) on Sept. 11, Potts ran for 178 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries, smashing personal highs in all three categories. In fact, Potts' 34 carries were the most by an FBS player this season until Sept. 25, and they now rank eighth. He followed that by rushing for 121 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 26 carries at Colorado, then tallied 141 yards on 27 rushes against Bowling Green before recording 78 yards and a score on 15 carries at Purdue.
- ▶ Overall on the season, Potts rushed 111 times for 552 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 110.4 yards per game and 5.0 yards per rush. He also caught three passes for 16 yards, returned six punts for 65 yards and brought back one kick for 17 yards.
- ► From Sept. 11 to Oct. 2 (his four games as a starter), Potts had the third-most rushing yards of any FBS player in the country and the second most carries.

► Through games on Oct. 2, Potts ranked ninth in the country in rushing yards, 11th in rushing yards per game, 19th in punt return average (10.8), 21st in rushing TDs and 25th in all-purpose yards per game (130.0).

WILLIAMS OUT FOR YEAR, TOO

- ► Head coach **P.J. Fleck** announced Nov. 1 that redshirt junior running back **Bryce Williams** suffered a season-ending injury at Northwestern.
- ▶ In eight games this year, Williams ran for 186 yards and three touchdowns on 37 carries. Most of his production came in the last three weeks, running for 184 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries since Oct. 16. Williams was also second on the team in kick returns (5) and kick return yards (60).

Minnesota at Indiana // Nov. 20, 2021

▶ In the first game without Ibrahim or Potts, it was Williams who got the start against Nebraska on Oct. 16. It was the third start of his career and his first since Oct. 26, 2018. Williams finished with 127 rushing yards on 17 carries, highlighted by a career-long touchdown run of 56 yards that gave Minnesota a 30-16 lead with just over two minutes to play. The 56-yard run tied Ibrahim for the longest rush by a Gopher this year.

MAFE, FAALELE ON 'FREAKS' LIST

- Seniors Boye Mafe and Daniel Faalele both appeared on the "2021 College Football Freaks List" from *The Athletic's* Bruce Feldman.
- ▶ Mafe came in at No. 17 of 101 players listed. "He's put on more than 50 pounds since arriving at Minnesota and weighs 263 now, up from 260 last year," Feldman wrote. "Mafe says he did a lot of single-leg work this offseason in hopes of improving his footwork." Among Mafe's weight room numbers listed by Feldman are a vertical jump of 40.5 inches, a broad jump of 10-6, a 4.57 40 and power cleaning 400 pounds."
- Faalele was ranked No. 29. "Two years ago, Faalele ranked No. 11 on this list because of his freakish combination of enormous size and a surprisingly athletic 29-inch vertical and 8-7 broad jump, but as he's reshaped his body, he's become a lot more nimble and flexible," Feldman said.

2X ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

- ▶ In mid-July, offensive lineman Blaise Andries was named to the 2020 Academic All-America Division I Football First Team selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). This honor recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom.
- Andries, who is majoring in Mathematics and is an aspiring actuary, is a repeat honoree after being named Second Team last season. He is Minnesota's first repeat selection since Sam Renner, who was named Second Team in both 2018 and 2019.
- ▶ Andries was named Academic All-Big Ten in 2020, 2019 and 2018 and was selected All-Big Ten Third Team in 2020 and 2019.

COACHING EXPERIENCE

Four Minnesota assistant coaches have head coaching experience. Mike Sanford (OC/QBs) was the head coach at Western Kentucky from 2017-18, while Paul Haynes (CBs) led Kent State from 2013-17. Joe Harasymiak (DBs, Safeties and Co-DC) was the head coach at Maine from 2016-18 and was named the 2018 FCS Coach of the Year. Clay Patterson (TEs) was the head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M from 2016-17, earning conference coach of the year honors in 2017.



When Minnesota last faced Indiana in 2018, it was the first start of Tanner Morgan's career. He passed for 302 yards and three touchdowns, including the tiebreaking 67-yard scoring pass to Rashod Bateman with 1:34 remaining that gave Minnesota a 38-31 victory.

HUNTINGTON BANK STADIUM

- · Minnesota opened Huntington Bank Stadium with a 20-13 win against Air Force in 2009. All-time, the Gophers are 52-37 at Huntington, including a 20-13 record under Head Coach P.J. Fleck.
- · Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher Hockey, MNF, an NHL game, international soccer, MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings and Minnesota United also played seasons on campus while their stadiums were being constructed.
- · Upon completion, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960.
- The Gopher locker room is a state of the art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- · The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 fee wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten.
- · The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in the country. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction

HEAD COACH // FIFTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 40, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 62-45 and is 32-23 at Minnesota.

While at Minnesota, Fleck has guided Minnesota to it's most wins (11 in 2019) since 1904, has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr. Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), six Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries twice, Sam Renner twice, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 194 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had eight players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

in 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in

school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten

games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962. The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also

ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962. Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team)

and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving

Mlinnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New

Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history. Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats om the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999. The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26

in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesola since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same span.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck, which included a school record 3.33 cumulative team GPA after the 2020-21 academic year.

Ski-U-Mah // Row The Boat

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Misconsin

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988. Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts. Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Offf the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife. Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.
