FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

Winners of four in a row and six of its last seven, RV/RV Minnesota (6-2, 4-1 B1G) looks to continue its winning ways and remain in first place in the Big Ten West this weekend as it hosts Illinois (3-6, 2-4 B1G) Saturday at 11 a.m. on ESPN2.

The Golden Gophers have one of the strongest rush defenses in the country, ranking eighth nationally and second in the Big Ten by allowing 92.9 rushing yards per game this year. The national average for rushing yards per game through Oct. 30 is 164.8 yards per game; only one Gopher opponent has even gone above 144 yards rushing this year and only three have had more than 104 rushing yards. In fact, Minnesota had a two-game stretch of just 3 yards allowed (-19 at Colorado, 22 vs. Mar'Keise Irving ran for a career-high 110 Bowling Green). The -19 rushing yards allowed at Colorado on Sept. 18 are yards and two touchdowns on 19 carries Satthe fewest by any FBS team this year with the next fewest coming when urday at Northwestern, en route to winning Western Kentucky held FIU to -17 on Oct. 23. The next fewest among Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors. Power 5 teams came also on Oct. 23 when Wisconsin held Purdue to -13



on Oct. 23. Minnesota is third nationally in fewest opponent rush attempts (221), eighth in opponent rush yards (743), 16th in opponent rushing touchdowns (7) and 20th in opponent yards per carry (3.36).

For the second straight game, Minnesota true freshman Mar'Keise Irving and redshirt freshman RB Ky Thomas both ran for over 100 yards Saturday at Northwestern. Last week, Irving went for 105 yards and a TD, while Thomas had a career-high 139 yards and a score against Maryland on Oct. 23. This week, Irving ran for a career-high 110 yards and two touchdowns on 19 attempts and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week, while Thomas had 106 yards on 21 carries at Northwestern. Until last week, no Minnesota freshmen had run for at least 100 yards in the same game since at least 1942. Now, Irving and Thomas are the first Minnesota duo to go for 100 yards in consecutive weeks since Laurence Maroney

and Gary Russell did so at Michigan (10/8/05) and versus Wisconsin (10/15/05). Minnesota has had five individuals run for 100 yards this year for the Gophers (see box right), something the Gophers have not had since at least 1942. In fact, Minnesota is the only FBS team this season to have five different individuals reach 100 yards.

- Minnesota's four-game winning streak is its longest since winning the first nine games of the 2019 season. All four wins in the streak have come in league play, making it the longest conference win streak since winning six in a row in 2019. Prior to that, the Gophers had won four straight in the Big Ten just twice (2016 and 2013) since 1990. A win Saturday against Illinois would give Minnesota its second five-game win streak in the Big Ten since 1970.
- Minnesota's 41-14 win at Northwestern Saturday, its biggest win over the Wildcats since 1980, improved P.J. Fleck's record at Minnesota to 32-21. In his fifth season, Fleck is sixth in wins in school history and 10th in games coached (53). Fleck's .604 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his ninth season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 62-43 (.590).

A WIN SATURDAY WOULD...

- Keep Minnesota in sole possession of first place in the Big Ten West
- Push Minnesota's record to 7-2, their third season with 7+ wins in five years under P.J. Fleck after three 7-win seasons in the 8 years prior to Fleck's arrival in 2017
- Improve Minnesota to 41-30-3 all-time against Illinois, including a 24-13-2 mark in Minneapolis
- Be the Gophers' third straight win in the series overall and fifth straight at home against the Illini
- Mark P.J. Fleck's fifth win over Illinois all-time, his most against any program
- Give the Gophers their first five-game winning streak since starting 9-0 in 2019
- · Be the first for Minnesota against Bret Bielema
- Put Minnesota at 25-10 over its last 35 games, the team's best stretch since Oct. 26, 1940-Oct. 14, 1944, when it also went 25-10.
- Be Tanner Morgan's school-record 25th win as starting QB

FACING ILLINOIS

- ▶ Minnesota and Illinois meet for the 74th time on Saturday with the Golden Gophers leading the all-time series, 40-30-3. The Gophers have won the last two in the series, outscoring the Illini 81-31, and are winners in five of the last six matchups between the schools.
- ▶ In Minneapolis, Minnesota holds a 23-12-2 record in the series, including wins in each of the last four meetings. In those four games, the Gophers have outscored the Illini, 123-64, an average final of 31-16.
- ▶ P.J Fleck is 3-1 against Illinois as head coach of Minnesota and 4-1 against the Illini overall. A win Saturday would mark the first time he's beaten a time five times in his career. He also has four wins lifetime against Nebraska, Purdue and Miami (OH).
- After Minnesota (31 players), Illinois (13) is the No. 2 state from where the Gophers call home.
- Minnesota's 13 Illinois natives are: senior WR

- ▶ Illinois has no Minnesotans on its roster.

- ▶ Three members of the Illinois coaching staff also spent time at Minnesota in their careers. Ilinois offensive coordinator/QBs coach Tony Petersen spent eight seasons on staff at Minnesota, first as passing game coordinator in 1999 and co-offensive coordinator/QBs coach from 2000-06. Illini assistant head coach/WRs coach George McDonald was also on the Gophers staff from 2007-08 as wide receivers coach. Illinois offensive line coach Bart Miller held the same role at Minnesota in 2016.
- ▶ In addition, Minnesota offensive coordinator/QBs coach Mike Sanford was an offensive assistant at Stanford from 2007-08, while Illinois linebackers coach Andy Buh was the Cardinal linebackers coach from 2007-09.
- ▶ Illinois enters the game 3-6 on the season and 2-4 in league play. The Illini opened the season with a win over Nebraska before losing its next four contests. They won two of their next three, including an NCAA-record 9-overtime game at then-No. 9 Penn State on Oct. 23, but they lost at home to Rutgers, 20-14, in their most recent game.
- ▶ Minnesota and Illinois have three common opponents so far this year in Maryland, Nebraska and Purdue. The Gophers went 3-0 against those teams, while the Illini beat the Huskers and lost to the Terrapins and Boilermakers.
- ► Chase Brown is Illinois' leading rusher at 100.6 yards per game, which ranks third in the Big Ten and 21st nationally. He's rushed 111 times for 704 yards and four touchdowns, while his average of 6.34 yards per carry is fifth in the B1G and 17th in the nation.

- ▶ Illinois has gone back and forth at quarterback with Brandon Peters and Artur Sitkowski. Both have endured injuries, but Sitkowski is now out for the year putting Peters back as QB1. Peters has thrown for 600 yards on 54-of-101 passing with three touchdowns and one interception.
- ▶ Isaiah Williams leads the team in receptions (37), receiving yards (372), while Daniel Barker has a team-high four touchdown catches.
- ▶ Defensively, Sydney Brown leads the team with 61 tackles, while Owen Carney Jr., has a team-best 6.5 tackles for loss and 5.5 sacks. Kerby Joseph has three of the team's five interceptions and he leads the country with three recovered fumbles this year.

LAST TIME VS. ILLINOIS

- ▶ With assistance from the AP: Mohamed Ibrahim rushed for 224 yards and four touchdowns and Tanner Morgan threw for one more as Minnesota beat depleted Illinois 41-14 when the teams met last season in Champaign.
- ▶ It was Ibrahim's second straight game with four rushing touchdowns and his second consecutive 200-yard rushing game. Morgan was 17 of 27 passing for 231 yards and a touchdown. He also threw an interception.
- ▶ Minnesota was clicking on all cylinders most of the game. **Trey Potts** scored on a 9-yard run that was set up by a 37-yard pass from Morgan to **Rashod Bateman** late in the first quarter. Mixing runs and passes, the Gophers methodically worked the depleted Illinois secondary, racking up 556 yards in total offense to Illinois' 287.
- ▶ Bateman later caught a 5-yard TD pass from Morgan in the second quarter before Ibrahim added his first score of the game to put Minnesota up 21-0.
- ► The Illini's only score before intermission came on a 1-yard run by Epstein, which was set up by his 63-yard run to the Gophers' 9-yard line. Ibrahim answered, though, with his second TD and Minnesota led 28-7 at halftime.
- lbrahim added two more scores in the second half, running in on plays from one and four yards out.
- ▶ Boye Mafe tied for the team lead with six tackles and recorded a pair of sacks and a forced fumble. Esezi Otomewo and Trill Carter also had sacks in the win.
- ▶ Illinois had 12 players out due to COVID-19 protocols and was down to fourth-string QB Coran Taylor, who was 6 of 17 through the air for a touchdown and no interceptions. One bright spot for Illinois was often-injured running back Mike Epstein, who rushed for 108 yards on 11 carries with one touchdown.

LAST TIME IN MINNEAPOLIS

- ▶ With assistance from the AP: Rodney Smith ran for a career-best 211 yards and a touchdown, Shannon Brooks added 111 rushing yards and a touchdown and Minnesota totaled 332 yards on the ground against Illinois in a 40-17 win in Minneapolis in 2019.
- ▶ Tanner Morgan was 9-of-17 passing for 155 yards and three touchdowns for the Gophers, who rushed for more than 300 yards for the first time since tallying 409 yards against Nebraska in 2017.
- Minnesota's defense allowed just three points and held Illini running back Reggie Corbin, the third-leading rusher in the Big Ten, to 68 yards on 14 carries.
- ▶ Illinois scored two defensive touchdowns. Dele Harding returned an interception of Morgan for a touchdown in the first quarter to give the Illini an early lead and Milo Eifler returned a fumble for another score in the third after Jake Hansen stripped Morgan on a sack.
- ▶ Illinois lost starting quarterback Brandon Peters in the first half after he hit the turf hard while being tackled. He walked off the field with assistance and was replaced by Matt Robinson, who was 15-of-29 passing for 125 yards.

- ► Smith helped the Gophers grab momentum in the second after a slow start by both teams. He had a season-long 64-yard run to set up the Gophers first touchdown, a 12-yard pass from Morgan to Tyler Johnson.
- ► Leading 16-10 at halftime, Minnesota extended its lead to 30-10 thanks to passing scores to **Chris Autman-Bell** (10 yards) and **Brevyn Spann-Ford** (12 yards).
- ► Minnesota's defense recorded three sacks, while Antoine Winfield, Jr., had an interception. Kamal Martin was the team's leading tackler with seven stops and two forced fumbles.

MEMORABLE GAMES VS. ILLINOIS

- ▶ Oct. 23, 2004: Minnesota put up 587 yards of total offense, the seventh highest total in team annals, in a 45-0 shutout of the Illini. Marion Barber III ran for 138 yards and two touchdowns, and the Gophers finished with 319 yards and four touchdowns on the ground. The Gophers added 268 yards passing, including 21 on a TD pass from Barber to Ernie Wheelwright.
- ► Sept. 30, 2000: **Tellis Redmon** tallied 314 all-purpose yards, the third highest total in program history in a 44-10 victory. Redmon ran for 183 yards and two touchdowns, caught three passes for 116 yards and added 15 yards on two punt returns.
- ▶ Nov. 12, 1977: Kent Kitzmann ran for 266 yards and three touchdowns on a Big Ten-record 57 carries as Minnesota won 21-0. Kitzmann's rushing total remains the third highest in program history.

RECAPPING NORTHWESTERN

- ▶ Via the AP: Mar'Keise Irving ran for two touchdowns and a career-high 110 yards and Justin Walley scooped up a fumble and ran 25 yards for a score as Minnesota defeated Northwestern 41-14 Saturday.
- ► Tanner Morgan threw for 134 yards and ran for a touchdown and **Ky Thomas** added 106 yards on 21 carries as Minnesota improved to 3-0 on the road.
- ▶ Already thin at running back with season-ending injuries to Mohamed Ibrahim and Trey Potts, Minnesota's **Bryce Williams** suffered a lower leg injury, putting pressure on Irving, a freshman, and Thomas, a redshirt freshman. Thomas was banged up early in the game but returned. The Gophers' depth chart has taken so much of a hit that Fleck experimented with linebacker **Derik LeCaptain** at running back. LeCaptain had a 24-yard run for a touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- ▶ Before it could get its offense untracked Northwestern starter Ryan Hilinski was pulled. Andrew Marty finished 10 of 16 for the Wildcats and threw a pair of touchdowns.
- ▶ The Gophers never trailed after opening the game with a 13-play, 67-yard drive capped by a 26-yard field goal by Matthew Trickett. On the next play from scrimmage, Hilinski completed a pass to Malik Washington, who was stripped by Mariano Sori-Marin and Walley picked up the loose ball and scored.
- ▶ Minnesota held Northwestern to a three-and-out and capitalized with another field goal from Trickett for a 13-0 first-quarter lead.
- Marty came in during an 11-play 75-yard drive and capped it with a 6-yard touchdown pass to Evan Hull, who accounted for 50 yards of total offense on the drive.
- ► The Gophers answered on their next possession with Irving scoring from the 3. Morgan had an 18-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter.

IN THE POLLS

► Thanks to a four-game win streak and having won six of its past seven games, Minnesota remained in the AP Poll for a second straight week and made its first appearance of the season in the Coaches Poll. (Polls on Page 5).

► The Gophers rank sixth out of the 11 teams receiving votes in the Oct. 31 AP poll. In the Coaches Poll, they are fifth out of 14 teams receiving votes.

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

- ▶ Minnesota is 3-0 on the road this year, shutting out Colorado, 30-0, in Boulder on Sept. 18, winning at Purdue, 20-13, on Oct. 2 and beating Northwestern in Evanston, 41-14, on Oct. 30. It's the fourth time since 1961 that Minnesota has won its first three road games of a season, also winning its first three in 2019 and its first four in 2003 and 1999.
- ► The Golden Gophers are 12-3 in their last 15 games away from home, including bowl games, beginning with a 37-15 victory at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018. During that stretch, only Ohio State (15-2) has a better mark away from home among Big Ten teams. More on Page 6.

MORGAN LEADS MAROON & GOLD

- ▶ Fifth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is in his third full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's proven himself to be one of the best signal-callers to ever wear the Maroon and Gold.
- ▶ Morgan is 24-10 as a starter and has completed 492 (fifth most in school history) of 798 passes (seventh most) for 7,205 yards and 52 touchdowns (both fourth most) in his career. His career completion percentage of .618 ranks first in school history, as does his 153.82 efficiency rating, 2.26 TD-to-INT ratio, .706 starter win percentage and 24 wins as a starter.
- ▶ At Purdue on Oct. 2, Morgan became the fourth player in Gophers history to reach 50 career touchdown passes, joining Adam Weber (72), Bryan Cupito (55) and Asad Abdul-Khaliq (55). Of the four, Morgan did it in the fewest pass attempts with 727, edging out Abdul-Khaliq's mark of 736. Morgan also tied Weber for second fewest games to reach 50, doing so in his 34th game.

- ▶ Against Nebraska on Oct. 16, Morgan finished 20-of-24 for 209 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. His completion percentage of 83.3 percent ranks tied for fourth in school annals since 1979. He also owns the No. 1 (21-22 at Purdue in 2019) and No. 2 (18-20 vs. Penn State in 2019) spots on the list.
- ▶ Morgan was 14-of-15 (93.3 percent) for 171 yards and two touchdowns in the first half against the Huskers. He completed 16 straight passes in one span between the first and third quarters, breaking the school record for consecutive completions of 14 done four times previously, including once by himself. The 16 straight completions tied for the third longest streak in a conference game in B1G history.
- ▶ Morgan has 11 Minnesota season and game records and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-Big Ten Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.
- ▶ This season, Morgan has completed 87-of-142 passes for 1,177 yards and six touchdowns against five interceptions for an efficiency rating of 137.8, and he's added 47 rushing yards and a rushing score. He ranks fourth in the Big Ten in both yards per completion (13.53) and fifth in yards per pass attempt (8.29), marks that put him 31st and 39th in the country, respectively.

WILLIAMS OUT FOR YEAR

- ▶ Head coach P.J. Fleck announced Monday that redshirt junior running back Bryce Williams suffered a season-ending injury in Saturday's game at Northwestern. He becomes the fourth Minnesota running back to be lost for the year due to injury along with Mohamed Ibrahim, Trey Potts and Preston Jelen.
- ▶ In eight games this year, Williams ran for 186 yards and three touchdowns on 37 carries. Most of his production came in the last three weeks, running for 184 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries since Oct. 16. Williams was also second on the team in kick returns (5) and kick return yards (60).
- In the first game without Ibrahim or Potts, it was Williams who got the start against Nebraska on Oct. 16. It was the third start of his career and his first since Oct. 26, 2018. Williams finished with 127 rushing yards on 17 carries, highlighted by a career-long touchdown run of 56 yards that gave Minnesota a 30-16 lead with just over two minutes to play. The 56-yard run tied Ibrahim for the longest rush by a Gopher this year.

RB ROOM STAYS READY

- ▶ With Mohamed Ibrahim, Trey Potts and now Bryce Williams out for the season with injuries, Minnesota has turned once again to the running back room to fill the void and they've answered the call.
- ▶ As mentioned on Page 1, redshirt freshman **Ky Thomas** and true freshman **Mar'Keise Irving** have each rushed for over yards in both of the last two contests. In fact, in the last two weeks, Thomas has run for 245 yards and a touchdown on 42 carries, while Irving has 215 rushing yards on 34 carries with three scores.
- ► Thomas has played in four games this year and has 56 carries for 334 yards and two scores. His 6.0 yards per carry leads the team. Thomas, who did not see any action last year, was a four-star recruit and ranked the No. 25 running back in the country by 247Sports out of high school. Thomas (5'11, 205 pounds) finished his prep career with 7,703 rushing yards and 95 rushing TDs.
- ▶ Irving, who made his backfield debut against Colorado on Sept. 18 with 15 rushes for 89 yards, has tallied 355 yards and three touchdowns on 66 carries this year, averaging 5.4 yards per attempt. Irving (5'10, 190 pounds) was a four-star recruit by 247Sports and was the No. 10 running back, according to Rivals. His high school career consisted of 3,264 rushing yards and 587 receiving yards.
- ▶ Irving has also been the team's top kick returner this year with six returns for 173 yards, including a 41-yarder against Miami (OH) that was the longest by a Gopher since 2018. Irving's 28.8 yards per return would rank eighth in the nation if he had three more returns to qualify.
- ▶ Saturday at Northwestern, Minnesota also turned to redshirt sophomore linebacker **Derik LeCaptain**, and all he did was run three times for 31 yards, including a 24-yard touchdown run. LeCaptain was a two-way player in high school at Southern Door in Wisconsin, winning 2019 Wisconsin High School Male Athlete of the Year honors. LeCaptain recorded the most yards from scrimmage (passing, rushing and receiving) in Wisconsin high school football history, posting 5,199 career rushing yards and 100 career touchdowns. A former walk-on and 2019 Special Teams Scout Player of the Year, LeCaptain was awarded a scholarship in August.
- ▶ Eight different players have scored a rushing touchdown this year: Potts (6), Irving (3), Williams (3), Cole Kramer (2), Ibrahim (2), Thomas (2), LeCaptain (1) and Tanner Morgan (1). That's the most individuals with a rushing touchdown in one season for the Gophers since 10 different players did so in 1985.

IRVING NAMED B1G F.O.W.

- ► Running back Mar'Keise Irving was named co-Big Ten Freshman of the Week after his standout performance last Saturday at Northwestern. He shared it with Michigan's Andrel Anthony.
- ► He rushed 19 times for a career-high 110 yards and two touchdowns to help lead Minnesota to a 41-14 road win. Irving scored on runs of three and 41 yards.
- ▶ Irving is the second Gopher to be named a Big Ten Player of the Week this season, joining punter Mark Crawford who was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 4 (more on Page 7). Irving is the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week since Rashod Bateman was honored on Nov. 5, 2018.

AUTMAN-BELL NEXT WR UP

- ► Senior Chris Autman-Bell was Minnesota's No. 3 receiver two years ago behind Tyler Johnson and Rashod Bateman, and the No. 2 target last year before Bateman opted out. But with those two now on to the NFL, Autman-Bell is poised to be the team's next top target.
- ▶ Despite missing the first two games of the season and most of the Bowling Green contest due to injury, Autman-Bell leads the team in receptions (23) and receiving yards per game (46.0), is tied for the lead in receiving TDs (2) and ranks second in receiving yards (276), targets (31) and targets per game (5.2).
- Autman-Bell posted a career-high 11 receptions for 103 yards against Nebraska on Oct. 16, his third career 100-yard game. His reception total was the highest by a Gopher since **Tyler Johnson** had 12 vs. Auburn in the 2020 Outback Bowl and ranks tied for 10th in program single-game history. Autman-Bell, whose previous career high for receptions was five, caught nine passes for 100 yards and a score in the first half alone against the Huskers.
- ▶ With four catches against Maryland on Oct. 23, Autman-Bell became the 17th player in program history to record 100 career receptions. Reaching the mark in 38 games, he was the 11th quickest to get there.
- ▶ Autman-Bell has played in 39 career games with 101 catches (17th in program history) for 1,526 yards (15th all-time at Minnesota) and eight TDs. He has caught at least one pass in 38 games and has made at least one catch in his past 33 games (fifth in school history and sixth longest active streak in the country).
- ▶ In seven games last year, he caught 22 passes for 430 yards and one score. That came after recording 28 catches for 371 yards and five touchdowns in 2019 and 28 catches (fourth all-time for a Minnesota freshman) for 449 yards (third all-time for a Minnesota freshman) in 2018 (also led team with 16.03 yards/catch).

BROWN-STEPHENS: PLAYMAKER

- ▶ Redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Mike Brown-Stephens** has 12 catches on the year and has turned them into a team-best 295 receiving yards. His 24.6 yards per catch average leads the team and ranks second in the nation among all players with at least 10 catches this year behind only FIU's Tyrese Chambers (26.3).
- ▶ At Purdue on Oct. 2, Brown-Stephens caught two passes for 105 yards, tallying catches of 51 and 54 yards, the two longest receptions by a Gopher this year. Since 2000, the only Minnesota player with more receiving yards on two or fewer receptions was **Duane Bennett**, with 121 yards on two catches vs. Michigan State on Oct. 31, 2009.
- ► The last time a Gopher had multiple catches of 50+ yards in one game was **Rashod Bateman**, who had TD catches of both 86 and 61 yards at Illinois on Nov. 3, 2018.
- ► He followed that performance at Purdue with three receptions for 58 yards on Oct. 16 against Nebraska, a 35-yard grab vs. Maryland on Oct. 23 and a career-high four receptions for 63 yards Saturday at Northwestern.

► His receptions of 54, 51, and 35 yards this year give him three of Minnesota's five longest pass plays in 2021.

JACKSON, WRIGHT GETTING LOOKS

- ▶ With Chris Autman-Bell missing the team's first two games due to injury, sophomore wide receivers Daniel Jackson and Dylan Wright got the chance to develop their in-game chemistry with Tanner Morgan, and they've turned into two of his top targets so far this year.
- ▶ Jackson, who missed the last two games before returning at Northwestern, leads the team with 32 targets and 5.3 targets per game, and is second in receptions (15). He has caught at least three passes in three games this year and had at least 25 receiving yards in each of the first four contests, including a career-high 58 versus Ohio State.
- As a freshman in 2020, Jackson was third on the team with 12 catches for 167 yards, averaging 23.9 yards/game.
- ▶ Despite not playing at Purdue, Wright is tied for the team lead in TD receptions (2), is second in yards per catch (16.7) and third in receptions (12), receiving yards (200), yards per game (28.6), targets (24) and targets per game (3.4).
- ▶ In the opener against Ohio State, Wright caught five passes for 57 yards and a touchdown, then followed with three catches for 73 yards and another TD vs. Miami (OH).
- ▶ Wright played in eight games over two seasons at Texas A&M but did not record any stats. At 6'3, 215 pounds, Wright was an Under Armour All-American in high school and the No. 12 WR in the country by 247Sports.

KRAMER AT WILDCAT OB

- ▶ Redshirt sophomore QB **Cole Kramer** has entrenched himself over the last five games as the Minnesota wildcat guarterback.
- ► He made his season debut against Bowling Green, rushing twice for 22 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown run. He followed that with eight carries for 32 yards at Purdue, including five carries on one drive late in the fourth quarter that ended in a Minnesota field goal.
- Against Nebraska, he rushed six times for 20 yards, plus a 5-yard TD pass (the first of his career), while against Maryland he carried five times for 30 yards and another score, and he had five rushes for 23 yards at Northwestern.
- ► On the season, Kramer has rushed 26 times for 127 yards and two TDs, averaging 4.9 yards per carry.
- ▶ Of his 26 carries, 15 have come on third down and he's turned 10 of them into first downs. Of the five he didn't convert, three have been on plays of 3rd-and-5 or longer. A 3rd-and-3 rush against Nebraska went for 2 yards, but he followed with his 5-yard TD pass.

OLSON SETS STARTS RECORD

- ▶ With his start against Maryland on Oct. 23, Minnesota redshirt senior offensive lineman **Conner Olson** set the Golden Gophers program record with his 52nd career start. He broke the mark of 51 set by former long snapper **Payton Jordahl** from 2015-18. Now at 53 starts, Olson is two away from tying the Big Ten record of 55 starts by Ohio State's Billy Price (2014-17).
- ▶ Olson has started every Minnesota game since the beginning of the 2017 season, which is the entire **P.J.**Fleck era. Olson has started 24 games at left guard, 15 at center and 14 at right guard. Olson currently holds the fifth longest active starting streak in the country.

O-LINE DEPTH AMONG THE BEST

▶ Minnesota boasts one of the deepest offensive lines in the entire country as 12 members of the unit have appeared in at least one game and nine have started at least one contest (page 17).

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

Dating back to a 37-15 win at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018, Minnesota has gone 12-3 away from home, including two bowl wins. The only better 15-game stretches in program history were 12-2-1 periods from 1900-1907 and again from 1913-19. Since the date of Minnesota's win at Wisconsin, the only Big Ten team with a better record away from home is Ohio State at 15-2. Below is a list of the 15 Gopher games during the current span.

- In fact, the Golden Gophers' offensive line has more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 210. The next closest squad is Miami (FL) with 199, while Michigan State (196) is third.
- Redshirt senior Conner Olson leads the team with his school-record 53 starts. Fellow redshirt seniors Blaise Andries and Sam Schlueter have each started 41 contests. Those three have also started at least two games at multiple positions.
- Additionally, Daniel Faalele (26), Utah State transfer Karter Shaw (19) and John Micheal Schmitz (18) have all started double-digit games in their careers.

- Not only does the offensive line have tremendous experience, but it also has impressive versatility. The unit has at least 33 combined starts at every position, with a high of 50 at right guard, and each position features starts from at least two different players, including four players with starts at right guard and right tackle, and three players with starts left guard and center.
- Further showcasing the depth, in the 2021 season opener the Minnesota offense opened in a jumbo package that featured seven starting offensive linemen, and it started six lineman against Miami (OH), Colorado, Nebraska and Northwestern.

GOPHERS BOAST TOP-20 DEFENSE

▶ Minnesota enters Saturday's game with the No. 11 total defense in the country, allowing just 303.1 yards per game. That's on pace to the be the best mark the program has had since 1977 when it allowed 292.8 yards per game. Not including the season opener, Minnesota has held five of its seven opponents this season below what their

season total offense average was entering the contest.

- In addition to the rush defense notes on page 1, Minnesota has held each of its last seven opponents below its rushing average entering the game, including four opponents more than 50 yards below their average. The most dominant performance came at Colorado, which entered the Sept. 18 game with 226.0 rush yards per game. The Gophers ended up holding CU to -19 yards rushing, meaning the Buffaloes were held 245 yards below their average.
- Against Nebraska on Oct. 16, Minnesota limited Nebraska QB Adrian Martinez, a 2,000-yard rusher in his career with seven games over 100 yards, -17 rushing yards on eight carries. The -17 rushing yards were his fewest in 36 career games to that point.
- ▶ The Gophers are holding opponents to 18.9 points per game. The unit is looking to post a scoring defense below 20 points per game for the season for the first time since 1999 (16.3). The last time before that was 1977 (15.5).

Minnesota has held its last six opponents to 23 points or fewer, the team's longest such streak since a seven-game stretch from the 2002 Music City Bowl through the first six games of 2003. The last seven-game streak to occur in one season was the first seven games of 1999.

4TH-DOWN SUCCESS

- Minnesota has been one of the most successful teams this season on fourth downs on both sides of the ball. The offense ranks eighth in the country by converting 75 percent of its attempts (3-4), while the defense ranks 18th by holding opponents to just a 33.3 percent conversion rate (4-12).
- Offensively, Mohamed Ibrahim turned a 4th-and-1 at the MN29 against Ohio State into a 56-yard run that set up a touchdown pass. At Colorado, Trey Potts gained 5 yards on a 4th-and-1 at the CU8 and scored on the next play. After getting stopped on a 4th-and-1 at the MN29 versus Bowling Green, the Gophers came back against Nebraska and passed for a touchdown on 4th-and-1 at the NEB5.
- The Gophers have stopped opponents on six of their past seven fourth-down attempts. After Purdue started 2-2 on Oct. 2, Minnesota stopped the Boilermakers on 4th-and-5 at the MN43. The Gophers then held Nebraska to 0-2 on its tries on Oct. 16, and Maryland was 0-1 the following week.
- Last Saturday at Northwestern, the Wildcats picked up a 4th-and-1 at the NU49 in the third quarter, but later on the same drive a 4th-and-3 at the MN28 was incomplete. In the fourth quarter, a pass on 4th-and-8 at the NU43 also fell incomplete.

LINEBACKER DUO PACING THE 'D'

- On a defense with its top nine tacklers back from last season, the linebacking duo of Mariano Sori-Marin and Jack Gibbens has paced the unit in 2021.
- Sori-Marin, who has played in all eight games but was limited to less than one quarter of play at Purdue, leads the team with 53 tackles, including 11 Saturday at Northwestern, which is the most by a Gopher this year. Sori-Marin also has 2.0 tackles for loss this year, two pass breakups, a forced fumble and one of the team's four interceptions.
- Sori-Marin was the team's top tackler from a year ago, registering 54 stops in seven games in 2020. He also made 1.5 tackles for loss, broke up three passes and forced a fumble. His top performance last year came at Nebraska when he recorded a career-high 18 tackles and forced a fumble en route to being named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week.
- ▶ Gibbens is right behind Sori-Marin with 51 tackles. He also has one forced fumble, and he's tied for second in pass breakups (3, all coming at Purdue). After two tackles in the season opener, Gibbens had at least six stops in each of the next five contests, including four games with eight tackles, with a season-high 10 coming against Maryland on Oct. 23.
- Gibbens spent the past four seasons at the FCS level with Abilene Christian where he totaled 258 tackles, 22.5 tackles for loss, seven sacks and five interceptions. He was the team's leading tackler this past season and was second in both 2019 and 2018.

MEETING AT THE OUARTERBACK

- Minnesota did not have a sack through its first two games, but the Gophers have since tallied 18 sacks over the last six games.
- Boye Mafe and Thomas Rush recorded 2.0 sacks a piece at Colorado on Sept. 18. It was the first time Minnesota had two players with 2.0 sacks in a game since Blake Cashman and Steven Richardson each had 2.0 against Northwestern on Nov. 19, 2016.
- Mafe added 2.0 more against Bowling Green on Sept. 25, while Trill Carter and Rush each had a solo sack. At Purdue. Mafe and Jagwondis Burns had 1.0 sack a piece. with Rush, Coney Durr, Micah Dew-Treadway and Nyles Pinckney each picking up half a sack. Pinckney and Esezi Otomewo both had 1.0 sacks against Nebraska, as did Rush and Coney Durr versus Maryland. At Northwestern, Mafe had another sack, while MJ Anderson recorded the first
- The 12 sacks (four in each game) against Colorado, Bowling Green and Purdue were the most for Minnesota in a three-game span since recording 14 against Purdue (6), Nebraska (1) and Northwestern (7) from Nov. 5-19, 2016.
- ► The Gophers had not had a streak of three straight games with at least four sacks since Oct. 4-25, 2008, when they did so versus Indiana (4), Illinois (5) and Purdue (5).
- Mafe's 6.0 sacks this year are tied for 20th nationally and rank tied for third in the Big Ten. He already has the most by a Gopher since Carter Coughlin had 9.5 in 2018. Mafe also leads the team with 8.0 tackles for loss this year.

TURNING TO'S INTO POINTS

- ▶ Minnesota's defense has forced 11 turnovers this year and has capitalized on nearly all of them. The Gophers have scored on the ensuing drive on seven of the 11 turnovers and added a fumble return for a touchdown, turning them into 44 points.
- In the opener against Ohio State, cornerback Terrell Smith returned an interception 23 yards against Ohio State, resulting in a Mohamed Ibrahim rushing touchdown.
- Versus Miami (OH), the Gophers recovered a fumble on the RedHawks' opening drive, and Trey Potts cashed in with a rushing touchdown. In the fourth quarter, Tyler Nubin's 18-yard interception return against Miami (OH) was followed by a Matthew Trickett field goal.

- At Colorado, Jack Gibbens stripped the CU guarterback in the third quarter, Justus Harris recovered and seven plays later, Potts scored. Later in the fourth, a muffed Buffaloes punt was recovered by Bishop McDonald and Trickett hit a 33-yard field goal.
- Against Bowling Green, Mariano Sori-Marin notched the first interception of his career and Trickett followed with a 36-yard field goal. Later in the contest, Braelen Oliver forced a fumble that was recovered by Smith, but Minnesota was forced to punt.
- Purdue's opening drive ended with a strip sack by Boye Mafe with a recovery by Val Martin. Four plays later, Tanner Morgan hit Chris Autman-Bell for a score. In the fourth quarter, Nubin had an interception with less than a minute to go that didn't result in any points, but it did allow the Gophers to run out the clock.
- At Northwestern, Sori-Marin forced a fumble in the first quarter and Justin Walley returned it 25 yards for a touchdown. It was the first fumble return for a touchdown for Minnesota since Blake Cashman did so against Purdue in 2018.

KESICH THE KICKOFF SPECIALIST

- Kickoff specialist Dragan Kesich has 34 touchbacks on 46 kickoffs this year. He ranks 20th in the country with his 73.91 percent touchback rate and 32nd with his 63.74 average yardage on kickoffs.
- Against Maryland, he set a career high with six touchbacks and tied a career high with seven kickoffs.
- Minnesota is sixth nationally by holding opponents to 15.0. yards per return and 14th with only 120 kickoff return yards allowed. The Gophers are also tied for 15th in the country with only eight opponent kick returns this year.

B1G HONOR FOR CRAWFORD

- ▶ Minnesota punter Mark Crawford was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 4 after a standout performance in Minnesota's 20-13 win at Purdue on Oct. 2. Crawford shared the honor with Penn State's Jordan Stout.
- Crawford continually flipped the field in a rainsoaked game, as he averaged 51.3 yards on six punts. He recorded a career-long, 60-yard punt twice, which was Minnesota's longest punt since Ryan Santoso had a 61-yarder against Illinois on Oct. 21, 2017.
- Crawford's six punts traveled 60, 60, 58, 46, 45 and 39 yards with his three longest punts all ranking in the top 20 of longest punts in the Big Ten at the time. He placed four punts inside the 15-yard line, which led to Purdue starting drives on its own 2, 9, 15 and 15 yard lines.
- Minnesota also allowed zero punt return yards against Purdue, which was a big reason why the Boilermakers, who ran 86 total plays, were limited to only 13 total points and did not score in the second half.
- Crawford also executed four successful holds (two point-after attempts and two field goals) in a driving rain.
- He was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week since holder Casey O'Brien was recognized on Oct. 21, 2019, and he's the first Minnesota punter to receive the honor since 2013 when Peter Mortell was recognized on Nov. 4 and Nov. 11.

PITCHING A SHUTOUT

- Minnesota's 30-0 win at Colorado on Sept. 18 was its first shutout since a 62-0 shutout of Temple on Sept. 16, 2006, and its first on the road since a 44-0 triumph over Kent State on Aug. 31, 2006.
- It was the first shutout for Minnesota versus a Power 5 team since defeating Illinois 45-0 on Oct. 23, 2004. The Gophers' last shutout of a Power 5 team on the road also took place against Illinois, a 21-0 win in Champaign on Nov. 12, 1977.

- ► The Golden Gophers held Colorado to just 63 yards of total offense with 82 yards passing and -19 rush yards.
- ► The 63 yards of total offense allowed was the third best in program history since 1960, bested only by 50 yards given up against Michigan in 1962 and a school-record 48 yards yielded to Navy also in 1962.
- According to Chris Vannini of *The Athletic*, the 63 yards were the fewest by an FBS team since Kansas had 21 yards against TCU in 2017.
- Minnesota outgained Colorado 83-0 in the first quarter (12 passing yards, -12 rushing yards) and held a 225-7 (34 passing, -27 rushing) advantage in total offense at halftime.
- ► The -19 rushing yards were the fourth lowest allowed since 1960 by Minnesota, trailing only -23 vs. Michigan in 1998, -31 in the aforementioned Navy contest in 1962 and the school record of -46 versus Michigan also in 1962.
- ► Colorado had 21 rushing attempts, the fewest by a Minnesota foe since Miami (OH) also had 21 in 2011.
- ▶ After shutting out Colorado, Minnesota kept Bowling Green scoreless in the first quarter in its next contest. It marked the first time the Gophers had recorded five consecutive scoreless quarters since October 2004. The scoreless streak covered 87 minutes and 24 seconds, dating back to the end of the Miami (OH) game on Sept. 11.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

- ▶ Minnesota has had an average time of possession of 35:40 this year. That figure leads the Big Ten and ranks fourth nationally behind only Army (38:50), Western Michigan (36:38) and Air Force (36:31).
- ▶ Three times in the **P.J. Fleck** era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game, including twice this year. Most recently, the Gophers held the ball for 40:09 at Northwestern on Oct. 30, while at Colorado on Sept. 18, Minnesota had it for 40:13.The only larger time of possession came against Maryland in 2019 (42:53).
- ▶ In 53 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 41 times and gone 27-14 in those contests.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

- Among active FBS players, **Tanner Morgan** ranks 14th in career pass efficiency (153.81), 20th in pass yards (7,205), 21st in pass TDs (52), 25th in completion percentage (61.9), 29th in total offense (7,211), 32nd in pass yards per game (197.6), 32nd in pass attempts (795), 33rd in completions (492) and 37th in TDs responsible for (55).
- ▶ With his years at Abilene Christian included, **Jack Gibbens** ranks 12th among FBS players with 309 career tackles and 38th in tackles per game (6.57).
- ▶ Including his career at Kent State, **Matthew Trickett** is third among active FBS players with 2.03 career field goal attempts per game, and he is fifth in field goal made per game (1.58), eighth in field goals made (57), eighth in points per game (8.1), 12th in field goal attempts (73), 21st in PAT percentage (98.4), 20th in points (292), 35th in field goal percentage (78.1), and 33rd in extra points made and attempted (121-of-123).
- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim is out for the season due to injury but he still ranks third among active FBS players in career rushes per game (18.86), fiftth in rushing yards per game (103.6), sixth in rushing touchdowns (33), ninth in touchdowns scored (33), 10th in rushing yards (3,003), 11th in all-purpose yards per game (109.1), 13th in rushes (547), 13th in yards per rush (5.49), 28th in points per game (6.8) and 38th in all-purpose yards (3,164).

NUN-CON STREAK SNAPPED

▶ Minnesota saw its 21-game non-conference win streak end on Sept. 25 with a 14-10 setback against Bowling Green. It was the nation's longest active streak in the country, and at that time, only three other schools in the country had non-conference win streaks longer than seven games.

- ► The streak was tied for the third longest in the last 25 years along with LSU, which also won 21 in a row from 2005-09. Only Alabama (26, 2009-13) and Utah (23, 2012-18) had longer streaks in that span.
- ▶ The Golden Gophers hadn't lost a non-conference game since Sept. 3, 2015, at home to then-No. 2 TCU. Included in the streak were 17 regular season wins and four bowl victories. Also in the streak were 13 straight home wins against non-B1G teams, which was tied for the 10th longest streak in the FBS. Minnesota is 13-1 under P.J. Fleck in non-conference games.

IBRAHIM OUT FOR THE YEAR

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim, the Big Ten's reigning Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year, suffered a season-ending lower leg injury in Minnesota's season-opening loss to Ohio State. He had surgery on Sept. 7.
- ▶ Ibrahim has 14 career 100-yard rushing games, including a streak of nine in a row from the 2020 Outback Bowl through this year's season opener. Ibrahim's ninegame streak is the longest in program history, two more than former Gopher Laurence Maroney.
- ▶ Before leaving in the third quarter with his injury, Ibrahim ran for 163 yards and two touchdowns on 30 attempts. In two career games against Ohio State, Ibrahim has run for 320 yards and four TDs on 53 carries.
- ▶ Ibrahim has 3,003 rushing yards for his career, the eighth Minnesota player to reach the 3,000-yard milestone.
- ▶ An All-Big Ten First Team honoree and AP Third-Team All-American last year, Ibrahim ran 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history). He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).
- ► He also set a school record with a rushing average of 153.7 yards per game and tied a school mark with four rushing scores in one game (at Maryland and at Illinois).

POTTS ALSO LOST FOR SEASON

- ► Minnesota head coach **P.J. Fleck** announced on Oct. 11 that redshirt sophomore running back **Trey Potts** would miss the remainder of the season.
- ▶ Potts left the field in the fourth quarter of the team's Oct. 2, 2021, game at Purdue. Potts was immediately observed and treated by the team's medical staff and was then transported to a hospital for further observation. Potts was discharged from an Indiana hospital on Oct. 8 and returned to Minneapolis.
- ▶ The Gophers turned to Potts as their lead back with the season-ending injury to All-American **Mohamed Ibrahim**. In four games as a starter, Potts rushed for 518 yards and scored six touchdowns on 102 carries.
- ▶ In his first career start against Miami (OH) on Sept. 11, Potts ran for 178 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries, smashing personal highs in all three categories. In fact, Potts' 34 carries were the most by an FBS player this season until Sept. 25, and they now rank eighth. He followed that by rushing for 121 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 26 carries at Colorado, then tallied 141 yards on 27 rushes against Bowling Green before recording 78 yards and a score on 15 carries at Purdue.
- ► From Sept. 11 to Oct. 2 (his four games as a starter), Potts had the third-most rushing yards of any FBS player in the country and the second most carries.

- ▶ Overall on the season, Potts rushed 111 times for 552 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 110.4 yards per game and 5.0 yards per rush. He also caught three passes for 16 yards, returned six punts for 65 yards and brought back one kick for 17 yards.
- ► Through games on Oct. 2, Potts ranked ninth in the country in rushing yards, 11th in rushing yards per game, 19th in punt return average (10.8), 21st in rushing TDs and 25th in all-purpose yards per game (130.0).

Mafe, faalele on 'freaks' list

- ► Seniors **Boye Mafe** and **Daniel Faalele** both appeared on the "2021 College Football Freaks List" from *The Athletic*'s Bruce Feldman.
- ▶ Mafe came in at No. 17 of 101 players listed. "He's put on more than 50 pounds since arriving at Minnesota and weighs 263 now, up from 260 last year," Feldman wrote. "Mafe says he did a lot of single-leg work this off-season in hopes of improving his footwork." Among Mafe's weight room numbers listed by Feldman are a vertical jump of 40.5 inches, a broad jump of 10-6, a 4.57 40 and power cleaning 400 pounds."
- ► Faalele was ranked No. 29. "Two years ago, Faalele ranked No. 11 on this list because of his freakish combination of enormous size and a surprisingly athletic 29-inch vertical and 8-7 broad jump, but as he's reshaped his body, he's become a lot more nimble and flexible," Feldman said.

- In mid-July, offensive lineman Blaise Andries was named to the 2020 Academic All-America Division I Football First Team selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). This honor recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom.
- ▶ Andries, who is majoring in Mathematics and is an aspiring actuary, is a repeat honoree after being named Second Team last season. He is Minnesota's first repeat selection since **Sam Renner**, who was named Second Team in both 2018 and 2019.
- ▶ Andries was named Academic All-Big Ten in 2020, 2019 and 2018 and was selected All-Big Ten Third Team in 2020 and 2019.

▶ Four Minnesota assistant coaches have head coaching experience. Mike Sanford (OC/QBs) was the head coach at Western Kentucky from 2017-18, while Paul Haynes (CBs) led Kent State from 2013-17. Joe Harasymiak (DBs, Safeties and Co-DC) was the head coach at Maine from 2016-18 and was named the 2018 FCS Coach of the Year. Clay Patterson (TEs) was the head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M from 2016-17, earning conference coach of the year honors in 2017.

- · Minnesota opened Huntington Bank Stadium with a 20-13 win against Air Force in 2009. All-time, the Gophers are 52-36 at Huntington, including a 20-12 record under Head Coach P.J. Fleck.
- · Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher Hockey, MNF, an NHL game, international soccer, MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings and Minnesota United also played seasons on campus while their stadiums were being constructed.
- · Upon completion, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960.
- The Gopher locker room is a state of the art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- · The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 fee wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten.
- · The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in the country. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction



HEAD COACH // FIFTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 40, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 62-43 and is 32-21 at Minnesota.

While at Minnesota, Fleck has guided Minnesota to it's most wins (11 in 2019) since 1904, has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr. Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), six Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries twice, Sam Renner twice, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 194 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had eight players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

in 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in

school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten

games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962. The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was

Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962. Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team)

and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving

Mlinnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New

Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history. Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats om the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999. The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26

in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesola since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same span.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck, which included a school record 3.33 cumulative team GPA after the 2020-21 academic year.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988. Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts. Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.


