FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

1 RV/RV Minnesota (8-4, 6-3 B1G) makes its 22nd all-time bowl appearance on Tuesday, Dec. 28, when it faces West Virginia (6-6, 4-5 Big 12) in the 2021 Guaranteed Rate Bowl. The game will be held at Chase Field in Phoenix, Ariz., at 9:15 p.m. on ESPN.

2 The Golden Gophers are 9-12 in their history in bowl games, but they have won four straight bowl contests, including both appearances under head coach **P.J. Fleck** (2020 Outback, 2018 Quick Lane). The four-game bowl winning streak is tied for the third longest active streak in the country. Only Alabama (excluding national championship game appearances) and Appalachian State have longer streaks with six straight wins each.

3 The Golden Gophers have one of the strongest rush defenses in the country, ranking ninth nationally and second in the Big Ten by allowing 100.2 rushing yards per game this year. That's on pace to be the best opponent rush total for the Gophers since a program-record 52.2 yards allowed per game in 1962. The national average for rushing yards per game through Dec. 4 is 162.9 yards per game; only two Gopher opponents have gone above 144 yards rushing this year and six have been held to less than 80 rushing yards. In fact, Minnesota had a two-game stretch of just 3 rush yards allowed (-19 at Colorado, 22 vs. Bowling Green). The -19 rushing yards allowed at Colorado on Sept. 18 are the second fewest in any game in the country this year and the fewest by any Power 5 team against another Power 5 opponent. Minnesota is second in the country in fewest opponent rush attempts (349), 10th in opponent rush yards (1202), 14th in opponent rushing touchdowns (10) and 18th in opponent yards per carry (3.44).

4 Minnesota ended the regular season with an 8-4 record overall and a 6-3 mark in the Big Ten. The Gophers have reached eight wins for the second time in the last three years under **P.J. Fleck's** guidance. Multiple eight-win seasons in a three-year span have happened only three other times since 1960-61. In addition, Minnesota produced a .500 or better record in Big Ten play for just the ninth time in the past 50 years. Coupled with a 7-2 league record in 2019, Fleck is the first Gophers coach since **Murray Warmath** (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

5 Minnesota's win against Wisconsin in the regular season finale improved **P.J. Fleck's** record with the Golden Gophers to 34-23. Closing out his fifth season with Minnesota, Fleck is already sixth in program history in overall wins and Big Ten wins (21), and eighth in games coached (57). Fleck's .596 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only **Henry L. Williams** (.786, 1900-21) and **Bernie Bierman** (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his ninth season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 64-45 (.587).



Minnesota has won four straight bowl games, including most recently the 2020 Outback Bowl where Tanner Morgan threw for 278 yards and two touchdowns.

SHUT-DOWN DEFENSE

Minnesota has held seven straight opponents, and nine of its last 10, below their total offense average entering the game, including five by more than 100 yards.

A BOWL WIN WOULD...

- Give Minnesota its 10th 9-win season in program history, and its second under **P.J. Fleck**
- Make Minnesota 10-12 all-time in bowl games (3-0 under Fleck) and extend their bowl win streak to five games
- Improve the Gophers' record at the Guaranteed Rate Bowl to 1-3
- Put the Gophers' record at 14-1 against non-conference opponents under Fleck
- Make the Gophers 1-0 all-time against West Virginia and push their record to 63-21-2 when facing an FBS team for the first time
- Snap a six-game losing streak against Big 12 teams and make Minnesota 32-15-1 all-time against the conference
- Have the Gophers 14-4 away from home (including bowl games) in their last 18 contests
- Put Minnesota 7-1 all-time when playing on Tuesdays
- Improve the team's record to 2-2 when playing on Dec. 28

FACING WEST VIRGINIA

► Minnesota and West Virginia meet for the first time ever at the Guaranteed Rate Bowl. The Golden Gophers have played 85 different teams currently in the FBS, and they are 62-21-2 when playing an FBS foe for the first time, including a 6-5 mark when it occurs in a bowl game.

► Neither team has a player on its roster from the opposing team's state. The game is taking place in Phoenix, and Minnesota does have one Arizonan on its roster in freshman DB **Steven Ortiz, Jr.** He attended Desert Edge High School in Goodyear, which is about 20 miles west of Chase Field.

► On Dec. 6, Minnesota announced the hiring of **Kirk Ciarrocca** as its new offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Ciarrocca was on staff this season at West Virginia as an offensive analyst. After conversations between Minnesota head coach **P.J. Fleck** and West Virginia head coach Neal Brown, it has been determined that Ciarrocca will not be coaching in the bowl game.

► Ciarrocca was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Delaware from 2002-07, while Brown was the Blue Hens' wide receiver coach in 2005.

► Brown said in a media conference call that Minnesota quarterback **Tanner Morgan** attended youth football camps while Brown was the offensive coordinator at Kentucky.

► Minnesota defensive line coach **Chad Wilt** held the same position at Army from 2016-18. West Virginia co-defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach ShaDon Brown was the Army cornerbacks coach in 2016.

► West Virginia went 6-6 during the regular season and tied for fifth in the Big 12 with a 4-5 conference record.

The Mountaineers went 2-1 in the non-conference, but lost five of their first seven games once league play started. However, West Virginia finished the year with back-to-back wins over Texas and Kansas to become bowl eligible.

► Minnesota and West Virginia had one common opponent during the regular season in Maryland. The Gophers defeated the Terrapins, 34-16, on Oct. 23 in Minneapolis, while the Mountaineers opened the season with a 30-24 road loss to the Terps.

► Jarret Doege has completed 254-of-386 passes (65.8 completion percentage) for 2,908 yards with 19 touchdowns and 11 interceptions for a QB rating of 139.6. He finished the regular season second in the Big 12 in touchdown passes, passing yards, passing yards per game (242.3) and completions per game (21.17).

► Winston Wright has been Doege's top target with team highs in receptions (60), receiving yards (672) and receiving yards per game (56.0), and he's tied with Sam James for the lead in touchdown catches (5). Wright has also been one of the top kick returners in the country this year with an average of 27.4 yards per return that ranks 17th nationally.

► Laddie Brown is West Virginia's leading rusher at 88.8 yards per game. He's rushed 223 times for 1,065 yards, and his 13 rushing touchdowns rank third in the Big 12 and 24th nationally.

► Defensively, Josh Chandler-Semedo leads the team with 104 tackles total and 8.7 stops per game, which is third in the Big 12. He's also tied for the team lead in interceptions (2) and forced fumbles (2). Dante Stills has a team-best 13.0 tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks, while Taijhi Alston also has double-digit TFLs with 10.0 to go with 5.0 sacks.

► Casey Legg leads the Big 12 and is 14th nationally with 1.58 field goals made per game.

BOWL HISTORY

► As mentioned on Page 1 of the notes, Minnesota is 9-12 all-time in bowl games.

► This year will mark the fourth time Minnesota has played in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl, previously appearing in 2006, 2008 and 2009 when it was called the Insight Bowl. The four appearances tie Kansas State for the most in the bowl's history.

► The Golden Gophers are 0-3 all-time in the bowl and are looking to be the first Big Ten team to win it since Michigan State in 2012.

TAKING ON THE BIG 12

► Minnesota and West Virginia are meeting for the first time, but it will not be the Golden Gophers' first match-up against a Big 12 opponent. They are 31-15-1 all-time against teams currently in the league (more on Page 4).

► Of the 47 games against Big 12 teams in Minnesota's history, 26 of them have come against Iowa State. The Gophers own a 22-3-1 record against the Cyclones, leaving them 9-12 against the rest of the conference.

► In bowl games, Minnesota is 0-4 against the Big 12, falling to Texas Tech in the 2006 Insight Bowl and 2012 Meineke Car Care Bowl, to Kansas in the 2008 Insight Bowl and Iowa State in the 2009 Insight Bowl.

► Minnesota last faced a Big 12 team when it opened the season the 2015 season at home against TCU. The Gophers have lost six straight against teams from the league and are looking for their first win versus a Big 12 opponent since a 34-9 win at Baylor in 2000.

LAST BOWL: 2020 OUTBACK

► With assistance from the AP: **Tyler Johnson** had 12 receptions for 204 yards and two touchdowns to become Minnesota's career receiving leader and propel the 16th-ranked Gophers to a 31-24 victory over No. 9 Auburn in the 2020 Outback Bowl.

► Johnson broke **Eric Decker's** school record for receiving yards on his second catch of the day and became Minnesota's all-time leader for scoring receptions on a one-handed, 2-yard TD catch that put the Gophers up 24-17 at halftime. His 73-yard catch-and-run put Minnesota ahead for good early in the fourth quarter.

► Minnesota finished with more than 10 wins for the first time since 1904.

► **Tanner Morgan** completed 19 of 29 passes for 278 yards, one interception and both of the TDs to Johnson, who finished with 3,305 receiving yards and 33 TD catches in his career. Receiver **Seth Green** tossed a 1-yard touchdown pass to **Bryce Witham** on fourth-and-inches midway through the second quarter.

► The Gophers dominated on the ground, too, outrushing Auburn 215 yards to 56. **Mohamed Ibrahim** ran for 140 yards on 20 carries, and **Rodney Smith** finished with 69 on 16 attempts.

- Noah Igbinoghene returned a kickoff 96 yards for Auburn's first touchdown. Bo Nix threw a 37-yard TD pass to Sal Cannella and Ja'Tarvious Whitlow scored 3-yard run that made it 24-24 heading into the fourth quarter. Nix was 17 of 26 for 176 yards, one TD and no interceptions.
- Morgan broke the tie with his second TD throw to Johnson, who posted the 16th 100-yard game of his career and caught at least one TD pass for the seventh straight game, tying a another school record.

RECAPING WISCONSIN

- *With assistance from the AP:* In the regular season finale on Nov. 27, **Tanner Morgan** led three scoring drives after halftime to help Minnesota take down 18th-ranked Wisconsin, 23-13, to bring back Paul Bunyan's Axe.
- The Badgers had only 160 total yards over the final three quarters and three points after halftime. They turned the ball over on downs on their last two possessions, and the Gophers got to hoist the 73-year-old trophy on their home field for the first time since 2003.
- Morgan went 11 for 16 for 199 yards and a third-quarter touchdown pass to **Chris Autman-Bell**, while the defense stole the show.
- Freshman standout Braelon Allen was limited to 47 yards on 17 rushes. He had topped the 100-yard mark in each of the last seven games, all wins for Wisconsin. The Badgers had 62 rushing yards, after averaging 269 yards on the ground during their winning streak. Over the last 23:05 of the game, Allen had two carries for minus-2 yards.
- **Justin Walley** wrestled away his first career interception at the Wisconsin 28 early in the third quarter.
- Morgan then hit tight end **Brevyn Spann-Ford** for 26 yards to the 2 on the next play. **Ky Thomas** ran it in for a 13-10 lead with eight offensive linemen blocking on the play. The Gophers had five scoring drives of 50-plus yards.
- Collin Larsh made two field goals for Wisconsin, but he had a 48-yard try — four yards beyond his career long — bounce off the crossbar early in the fourth quarter. Minnesota went the other way for **Matthew Trickett's** third field goal of the game to put the stamp on it.

BIG TEN HONORS

- Twelve Minnesota players (5 defense, 7 offense) were announced as all-conference performers by the Big Ten.
- **Boye Mafe** was named Second Team All-Big Ten by the media and was a Third Team All-Big Ten selection by the coaches. He leads Minnesota with six sacks and nine tackles for loss, while ranking sixth on the team with 30 tackles. Mafe's roommate **Ezezi Otomewo** was named Honorable Mention by both the coaches and the media. He has recorded 27 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and one sack.
- Minnesota's top two leading tacklers — **Jack Gibbens** and **Mariano Sori-Marin** — were both named Honorable Mention. Sori-Marin was tabbed Honorable Mention by both the coaches and the media, while Gibbens received recognition from the media. Gibbens leads the Gophers with 86 tackles and Sori-Marin is second with 82.
- Defensive back **Tyler Nubin** was named Honorable Mention by the media. The safety leads the defense with three interceptions and is third on the team with 44 tackles.
- Leading the way on offense were **Daniel Faalele** and **Blaise Andries**, who were both named All-Big Ten First Team. Faalele received the nod from the coaches, while Andries was honored by the media. The media placed Faalele on the Third Team and the coaches did the same with Andries. The last time Minnesota had two offensive linemen named All-Big Ten First Team was 2005 when center **Greg Eslinger** and guard **Mark Setterstrom** received the honor.

- Center **John Michael Schmitz** was named All-Big Ten Second Team by the coaches and Third Team by the media. **Conner Olson** was slotted on the Third Team by the coaches and was an Honorable Mention selection by the media, while **Sam Schlueter** was named Honorable Mention by both the coaches and media.
- Minnesota's bruising tight end **Ko Kieft** was named Honorable Mention by both the coaches and media, while receiver **Chris Autman-Bell** was named Honorable Mention by the media.

CIARROCCA RETURNS AS OC

- University of Minnesota football coach **P.J. Fleck** announced the hiring of **Kirk Ciarrocca** on Dec. 6 as Minnesota's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, a role he previously held from 2017-19.
- Ciarrocca returns after being away for two years. He spent 2020 as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Penn State and served in a non-coaching role as an offensive analyst at West Virginia in 2021.
- In addition to previously working with Fleck at Minnesota, Ciarrocca was also Fleck's offensive coordinator at Western Michigan for four seasons. He has spent seven total seasons as an offensive coordinator under Coach Fleck and helped both schools produce record-setting numbers on offense.
- Ciarrocca was named one of 15 semifinalists for the Broyles Award in 2019 after the Gophers averaged 432 yards per game (fourth most in school history in the modern era) and 34.1 points per game (third most in school history in the modern era). That same year, Minnesota rushed for 25 touchdowns and threw for 31 touchdowns, which was the first time in school history that the Gophers reached both of those numbers in the same season.
- Ciarrocca started at Minnesota on Monday, Dec. 6, but after conversations between Fleck and West Virginia Coach Neal Brown, he will not be coaching in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl. **Matt Simon**, who is Minnesota's wide receivers coach and co-offensive coordinator, will call the Minnesota offense during the game.

IN THE POLLS

- Minnesota is receiving votes in both the latest AP and Coaches polls, ranking fourth among those receiving votes in each poll.
- This will be the fourth game this season that Minnesota is receiving votes entering the contest. The Gophers appeared in the AP Poll against Northwestern, in both polls versus Illinois and in the Coaches Poll at Iowa.

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

- Minnesota finished the regular season 4-1 on the road, shutting out Colorado, 30-0, in Boulder on Sept. 18, winning at Purdue, 20-13, on Oct. 2 and beating Northwestern in Evanston, 41-14, on Oct. 30. The Gophers lost at Iowa, 27-22, on Nov. 13, but bounced back with a 35-14 victory at Indiana on Nov. 20.
- The four road wins are tied for the most in school single-season history, also notching four wins in 2019, 2003, 1999 and 1961.
- The Golden Gophers are 13-4 (.765) in their last 17 games away from home, including bowl games, beginning with a 37-15 win at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018. During that span, only Ohio State (16-3; .842) has a better mark away from home among Big Ten teams. More on Page 6.

► Minnesota has a .653 winning percentage in its history when playing on days other than Saturday, going 54-28-3. Under **P.J. Fleck**, it is 7-3 on non-Saturdays.

MORGAN LEADS MAROON & GOLD

► Fifth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan**, who will be returning in 2022, is in his third full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's established himself as the winningest signal-caller to ever wear the Maroon and Gold.

► Morgan is 26-12 as a starter, breaking the previous mark of 24 career wins held by **Mitch Leidner**. Morgan has completed 546 (third most in school history) of 890 passes (fifth most) for 7,963 yards (second most) and 56 touchdowns (second most) in his career.

► His career completion percentage of .613 is first in school history, as is his 151.43 efficiency rating and .684 win percentage.

► At Purdue on Oct. 2, Morgan became the fourth player in Gophers history to reach 50 career touchdown passes, joining **Adam Weber** (72), **Bryan Cupito** (55) and **Asad Abdul-Khaliq** (55). Of the four, Morgan did it in the fewest pass attempts with 727, edging out Abdul-Khaliq's mark of 736. Morgan also tied Weber for second fewest games to reach 50, doing so in his 34th game.

► Against Nebraska on Oct. 16, Morgan finished 20-of-24 for 209 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. His completion percentage of 83.3 percent tied for fourth in school annals since 1979. He also owns the No. 1 (21-22 at Purdue in 2019) and No. 2 (18-20 vs. Penn State in 2019) spots on that list.

► Morgan was 14-of-15 (93.3 percent) for 171 yards and two touchdowns in the first half against the Huskers. He completed 16 straight passes in one span between the first and third quarters, breaking the school record for consecutive completions of 14 done four times previously, including once by himself. The 16 straight completions tied for the third longest streak in a conference game in B1G history.

► Morgan has 12 Minnesota season and game records and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-Big Ten Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.

► This season, Morgan has completed 141-of-236 passes for 1,935 yards and 10 touchdowns against eight interceptions for an efficiency rating of 135.8, and he's added two rushing touchdowns. He ranks fourth in the Big Ten in both yards per completion (13.72) and yards per pass attempt (8.20).

FRESHMEN RB DUO CALLED UPON

► With **Mohamed Ibrahim**, **Trey Potts**, **Bryce Williams** and **Preston Jelen** out for the season with injuries, the Minnesota running game has rested on the shoulders of true freshman **Mar'Keise Irving** and redshirt freshman **Ky Thomas**.

► Both have answered the call as each ran for over 100 yards against Maryland on Oct. 23 and at Northwestern on Oct. 30, while Thomas has added two more 100-yard games at Iowa on Oct. 13 and Indiana on Nov. 20.

► Against the Terrapins, Irving went for 105 yards and a TD, while Thomas had a career-high 139 yards and a score. Versus the Wildcats, Irving ran for a career-high 110 yards and two touchdowns on 19 attempts and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week, while Thomas had 106 yards on 21 carries at Northwestern.

► Until the duo did it against Maryland, no Minnesota freshmen had run for at least 100 yards in the same game since at least 1932. Irving and Thomas then became the first Minnesota duo to go for 100 yards in consecutive weeks since **Laurence Maroney** and **Gary Russell** did so at Michigan (10/8/05) and versus Wisconsin (10/15/05).

► At Iowa, Thomas ran a career-high 29 times for 126 yards. It was the most rushing yards the Hawkeyes had allowed to an individual this year, and they entered the contest allowing just 98.6 rush yards per game. In fact, it was the highest rushing total given up by Iowa since Ibrahim had 144 yards in the 2020 meeting, a span of 14 games.

► At Indiana, Thomas rushed 26 times for 105 yards and two scores, his first career game with multiple scoring runs.

► Over the final five games of the regular season, Thomas ran for 591 yards and four scores on 131 carries (4.5 avg), while Irving had 430 rushing yards on 82 carries (5.2 avg) with four touchdowns.

► Overall, Thomas has played in eight games this year and leads the team in rushing attempts (145) and yards (680). He's scored five rushing TDs and has four 100-yard rushing games this season, which is the most for a Minnesota freshman since Ibrahim in 2018.

► Thomas, who did not see any action last year, was a four-star recruit and ranked the No. 25 running back in the country by 247Sports out of high school. Thomas (5'11, 205 pounds) finished his prep career with 7,703 rushing yards and 95 rushing TDs.

► Irving, who made his backfield debut against Colorado on Sept. 18, has tallied 570 yards and four touchdowns on 114 carries this year, tying for the team lead with 5.0 yards per rush attempt. Irving (5'10, 190 pounds) was a four-star recruit by 247Sports and was the No. 10 running back, according to Rivals. His high school career consisted of 3,264 rushing yards and 587 receiving yards.

► Irving has also been the team's top kick returner this year with eight returns for 212 yards, including a 41-yarder against Miami (OH) that was the longest by a Gopher since 2018. Irving's 26.5 yards per return would rank 20th in the nation if he had enough returns to qualify.

► At Northwestern, Minnesota also turned to redshirt sophomore linebacker **Derik LeCaptain**, and all he did was run three times for 31 yards, including a 24-yard touchdown run. LeCaptain was a two-way player in high school at Southern Door in Wisconsin, winning 2019 Wisconsin High School Male Athlete of the Year honors. LeCaptain recorded the most yards from scrimmage (passing, rushing and receiving) in Wisconsin high school football history, posting 5,199 career rushing yards and 100 career touchdowns. A former walk-on and 2019 Special Teams Scout Player of the Year, LeCaptain was awarded a scholarship in August.

► Minnesota has had five individuals run for 100 yards this year for the Gophers, something the Gophers have not had since at least 1932. In fact, Minnesota is the only FBS team this season to have five different individuals reach 100 yards.

► Eight different players have also scored a rushing touchdown this year: Potts (6), Thomas (5), Irving (4), Williams (3), **Cole Kramer** (2), Ibrahim (2), **Tanner Morgan** (2) and LeCaptain (1). That's the most individuals with a rushing touchdown in one season for the Gophers since 10 different players did so in 1985.

AUTMAN-BELL NEXT WR UP

► Senior **Chris Autman-Bell** was Minnesota's No. 3 receiver two years ago behind **Tyler Johnson** and **Rashod Bateman**, and the No. 2 target last year before Bateman opted out. But with those two now on to the NFL, Autman-Bell has proven to be the team's next top target.

► Even better for Minnesota, Autman-Bell announced he would be returning to the Golden Gophers in 2022 for his final season of eligibility.

► Despite missing the first two games of the season, most of the Bowling Green contest and most of the second half against Illinois due to varying injuries, Autman-Bell still leads the team this year in receptions (35), receiving yards (490), receiving yards per game (49.0), receiving touchdowns (6), targets (57) and targets per game (5.7).

► In addition, his catch percentage of 61.4 is second-highest on the team of anyone with at least 10 targets.

► At Iowa on Nov. 13, Autman-Bell caught a team-high five passes for 109 yards, including a 68-yard TD in the fourth quarter. The 109 yards were the most by a Gopher this year, and it was his second 100-yard game this season (fourth career).

► The following week at Indiana, Autman-Bell had his first multi-TD reception game and the first by a Gopher since Johnson in the 2019 Outback Bowl.

► Autman-Bell posted a career-high 11 receptions for 103 yards against Nebraska on Oct. 16. His reception total was the highest by a Gopher since Johnson had 12 vs. Auburn in the 2020 Outback Bowl and tied for 10th in program single-game history. Autman-Bell, whose previous career high for receptions was five, caught nine passes for 100 yards and a score in the first half alone.

► With four catches against Maryland on Oct. 23, Autman-Bell became the 17th player in program history to record 100 career receptions. Reaching the mark in 38 games, he was the 11th quickest to get there.

► Autman-Bell has played in 43 career games with 113 catches (13th in program history) for 1,740 yards (12th) and 12 TDs (T-14th). He has caught at least one pass in 42 games and has made at least one catch in his past 37 games (second longest streak in school history and tied for the fifth longest active FBS streak).

► In seven games last year, he caught 22 passes for 430 yards and one score. That came after recording 28 catches for 371 yards and five touchdowns in 2019 and 28 catches (fourth all-time for a Minnesota freshman) for 449 yards (third all-time for a Minnesota freshman) in 2018 (also led team with 16.03 yards/catch).

BROWN-STEPHENS: PLAYMAKER

► Redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Mike Brown-Stephens** has 22 catches on the year and has turned them into 387 receiving yards, the second-highest total on the team. His 17.6 yards per catch average is second on the team and, among players with at least 20 catches this year, ranks fifth in the Big Ten and 37th in the nation.

► At Purdue on Oct. 2, Brown-Stephens caught two passes for 105 yards, tallying catches of 54 and 51 yards, the second and third longest receptions by a Gopher this year, respectively. Since 2000, the only Minnesota player with more receiving yards on two or fewer receptions was **Duane Bennett**, with 121 yards on two catches vs. Michigan State on Oct. 31, 2009.

► The last time a Gopher had multiple catches of 50+ yards in one game was **Rashod Bateman**, who had TD catches of both 86 and 61 yards at Illinois on Nov. 3, 2018.

► Brown-Stephens followed that performance at Purdue with three receptions for 58 yards on Oct. 16 against Nebraska, a 35-yard grab vs. Maryland on Oct. 23 and a career-high four receptions for 63 yards at Northwestern on Oct. 30. At Iowa, he matched his career high with four catches for 52 yards.

JACKSON, WRIGHT GETTING LOOKS

► With **Chris Autman-Bell** missing the team's first two games due to injury, sophomore wide receivers **Daniel Jackson** and **Dylan Wright** got the chance to develop their in-game chemistry with **Tanner Morgan**, and they've turned into two of his top targets this year.

► Jackson, who has also missed two games, is second on the team in targets (47) and targets per game (4.7), and is tied for third in receptions (22). He had a career-high 58 receiving yards versus Ohio State in the opener.

► As a freshman in 2020, Jackson was third on the team with 12 catches for 167 yards, averaging 23.9 yards/game.

► Though he missed the game at Purdue, Wright leads the team in yards per catch (19.2), is second in TD receptions (2), and is third in receiving yards (307) and yards per game (27.9).

► In the opener against Ohio State, Wright caught five passes for 57 yards and a touchdown, then followed with three catches for 73 yards and another TD vs. Miami (OH).

► Wright played in eight games over two seasons at Texas A&M but did not record any stats. At 6'3, 215 pounds, Wright was an Under Armour All-American in high school and the No. 12 WR in the country by 247Sports.

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

Dating back to a 37-15 win at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018, Minnesota has gone 13-4 away from home, including two bowl wins. RELIABLE TIGHT END TARGETS

► Gopher tight ends **Brevyn Spann-Ford** and **Ko Kieft** have seen their production grow over the last few weeks, serving as reliable targets in the Gopher passing attack.

► Of Spann-Ford's 30 targets this year, 17 have come in just the last four weeks, including a season-high six targets versus Illinois and four against Iowa and Wisconsin. He has caught 23 passes for 296 yards and a touchdown this year, ranking second on the team in receptions and fourth in receiving yards.

► At Indiana on Nov. 20, Spann-Ford had three catches for 67 yards, all in the first half, with the receiving yards being a career-high. He logged career-long 48-yard reception in the second quarter that was the longest for a Minnesota tight end since a 50-yard reception for **Nate Wozniak** versus Middle Tennessee on Sept. 16, 2017.

► Additionally, Spann-Ford's 80.0 percent catch rate is the best of any Gopher with at least nine targets this year.

► Kieft has seven catches for 101 yards and a touchdown this year, and his 14.4 yards per catch rank third on the team among those with more than one reception.

► Kieft had two catches for a career-high 48 yards at Iowa on Nov. 13, highlighted by a 37-yard TD catch. He also has a catch rate of 77.8 percent, trailing only Spann-Ford among Gophers with at least nine targets this year.

KRAMER AT WILDCAT QB

► Redshirt sophomore QB **Cole Kramer** has established himself over the last nine games as the Minnesota wildcat quarterback.

► He made his season debut against Bowling Green, rushing twice for 22 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown run. He followed that with eight carries for 32 yards at Purdue, including five carries on one drive late in the fourth quarter that ended in a Minnesota field goal.

► Against Nebraska, he rushed six times for 20 yards, plus a 5-yard TD pass (the first of his career), while against Maryland he carried five times for 30 yards and another score, and he had five rushes for 23 yards at Northwestern along with four rushes for 20 yards against Illinois.

► At Iowa, Kramer only ran once for four yards, but he did throw a 37-yard touchdown pass on a 4th-and-2.

► On the season, Kramer has rushed 36 times for 165 yards and two TDs, averaging 4.6 yards per carry.

► He's also completed all three of his pass attempts for 62 yards and two touchdowns. Kramer is one of three players in the country this year, and one of two in the Power 5, with two touchdown passes on three or fewer attempts. Over the last five years, Kramer is one of 11 to accomplish the feat.

► Of his 36 carries, 15 have come on third down and he's turned 10 of them into first downs. Of the five he didn't convert, three were on plays of 3rd-and-5 or longer. A 3rd-and-3 rush against Nebraska went for 2 yards, but he followed with a 5-yard TD pass on 4th down.

OLSON SETS BIG STARTS RECORD

► With his start against Maryland on Oct. 23, Minnesota redshirt senior offensive lineman **Conner Olson** set the Golden Gophers program record with his 52nd career start. He broke the mark of 51 set by former long snapper **Payton Jordahl** from 2015-18.

► Now up to 57 starts, Olson broke the Big Ten record of 55 starts set by Ohio State's Billy Price (2014-17) at Indiana on Nov. 20. Olson has started every Minnesota game since the beginning of the 2017 season, which is the entire **P.J. Fleck** era. Olson has started 28 games at left guard, 15 at center and 14 at right guard. He currently holds the fifth longest active starting streak in the country.

O-LINE DEPTH AMONG THE BEST

► Minnesota boasts one of the deepest offensive lines in the entire country as 12 members of the unit have appeared in at least one game and nine have started at least one contest (page 17).

► In fact, the Golden Gophers' offensive line has more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 230. The next closest squad is Miami (FL) with 219, while Michigan State is third at 216.

► Redshirt senior **Conner Olson** leads the team with his Big Ten-record 57 starts. Fellow redshirt seniors **Blaise Andries** and **Sam Schlueter** have each started 45 contests. Those three have started at least two games at more than one position.

► Additionally, **Daniel Faalele** (30), **John Micheal Schmitz** (22) and Utah State transfer **Karter Shaw** (19) and have all started double-digit games in their careers.

► Not only does the offensive line have tremendous experience, but it also has impressive versatility. The unit has at least 37 combined starts at every position, with a high of 54 at right guard, and each position features starts from at least two different players, including four players with starts at right guard and right tackle, and three players with starts left guard and center.

► Further showcasing the depth, in the 2021 season opener the Minnesota offense opened in a jumbo package that featured seven starting offensive linemen, and it started six linemen against Miami (OH), Colorado, Nebraska and Northwestern.

IRVING NAMED BIG F.O.W.

► Running back **Mar'Keise Irving** was named co-Big Ten Freshman of the Week after his standout performance at Northwestern; sharing with Michigan's Andre Anthony.

► He became the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week since **Rashod Bateman** was honored on Nov. 5, 2018.

► Irving rushed 19 times for a career-high 110 yards and two touchdowns to help lead Minnesota to a 41-14 road win. Irving scored on runs of three and 41 yards.

GOPHERS BOAST TOP-5 DEFENSE

► Minnesota enters the bowl season with the No. 4 total defense in the country, allowing just 284.8 yards per game. That's on pace to be the best mark the program has had since 1974 when it allowed just 135.4 yards per game.

► The Golden Gophers have held each of their last six opponents under 300 yards of total offense, the longest active streak in the nation. On the season they've held seven teams below that number, tying with Alabama and Georgia for the second most in the FBS behind only Wisconsin (10).

► In addition to the rush defense notes on page 1, the most dominant performance came at Colorado, which entered the Sept. 18 contest with 226.0 rush yards per game. The Gophers held CU to -19 yards rushing, meaning the Buffaloes were held 245 yards below their average.

SHUTTING DOWN THE RUN

Minnesota has held nine of its last 11 opponents below their rushing average entering the game, including five by more than 50 yards.

► Against Nebraska on Oct. 16, Minnesota limited Nebraska QB Adrian Martinez, a 2,000-yard rusher in his career with seven games over 100 yards, to -17 rushing yards on eight carries. The -17 rushing yards were his fewest in 36 career games to that point.

► Teams haven't had much success through the air either as Minnesota ranks 10th in the country and second in the Big Ten with 184.7 yards allowed per game. Four times this year Minnesota has held a team below 100 yards passing, tied with Arizona for the third most in the country behind Washington and Georgia, who have each done it five times.

► The Gophers are holding opponents to 18.2 points per game. The unit is looking to post a scoring defense below 20 points per game for the season for the first time since 1999 (16.3). The last time before that was 1977 (15.5). The Gophers have held eight opponents to 16 points or fewer this year, tied with Wisconsin for second most in the nation behind only Georgia (11).

► Prior to giving up 27 points at Iowa on Nov. 20, Minnesota had held its previous seven opponents to 23 points or fewer, the team's longest such streak since a seven-game stretch from the 2002 Music City Bowl through the first six games of 2003. The last seven-game streak to occur in one season was the first seven games of 1999.

LINEBACKER DUO PACING THE 'D'

► On a defense with its top nine tacklers back from last season, the linebacking duo of **Jack Gibbens** and **Mariano Sori-Marin** has paced the unit in 2021.

► Gibbens leads the team with 86 tackles, and he's tied for third in pass breakups (3, all coming at Purdue). He also has 3.0 tackles for loss and one forced fumble. Gibbens has at least six tackles in 10 of the last 11 contests, including eight games with eight stops. He had a season-high 10 tackles against Maryland on Oct. 23 and matched it against Wisconsin on Nov. 30.

► Gibbens spent the past four seasons at the FCS level with Abilene Christian where he totaled 258 tackles, 22.5 tackles for loss, seven sacks and five interceptions. He was the team's leading tackler last season and was second in both 2019 and 2018.

► Sori-Marin, who has started all 12 games but was limited to less than one quarter of play at Purdue, is right behind Gibbens with 83 tackles, including 40 over the last five games. After 11 at Northwestern, he had 12 against Illinois, which is the most by a Gopher this year. Sori-Marin also has 4.5 tackles for loss this year, three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and an interception.

► Sori-Marin was the team's top tackler from a year ago, registering 54 stops in seven games in 2020. He also made 1.5 tackles for loss, broke up three passes and forced a fumble. His top performance last year came at Nebraska when he recorded a career-high 18 tackles and forced a fumble en route to being named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week.

SACK TOTALS GOING UP

► Minnesota did not have a sack through its first two games, but the Gophers have since tallied 20 sacks over the last 10 games.

► **Boye Mafe** and **Thomas Rush** recorded 2.0 sacks a piece at Colorado on Sept. 18. It was the first time Minnesota had two players with 2.0 sacks in a game since **Blake Cashman** and **Steven Richardson** each had 2.0 against Northwestern on Nov. 19, 2016.

► Mafe added 2.0 more against Bowling Green on Sept. 25, while **Trill Carter** and Rush each had a solo sack. At Purdue, Mafe and **Jaquondis Burns** had 1.0 sack a piece, with Rush, **Coney Durr**, **Micah Dew-Treadway** and **Nyles Pinckney** each picking up half a sack.

► Pinckney and **Esezi Otomewo** both had 1.0 sacks against Nebraska, as did Rush and **Coney Durr** versus Maryland. At Northwestern, Mafe had another sack, while MJ Anderson recorded the first of his career. Rush added another sack against Illinois, as did Pinckney at Indiana.

► The 12 sacks (four in each game) against Colorado, Bowling Green and Purdue were the most for Minnesota in a three-game span since recording 14 against Purdue (6), Nebraska (1) and Northwestern (7) from Nov. 5-19, 2016.

► The Gophers had not had a streak of three straight games with at least four sacks since Oct. 4-25, 2008, when they did so versus Indiana (4), Illinois (5) and Purdue (5).

► Mafe's 6.0 sacks this year are the most by a Gopher since **Carter Coughlin** had 9.5 in 2018. Mafe also leads the team with 8.0 tackles for loss this year.

► With Rush at 5.5 sacks this year, he and Mafe are the first Gopher duo with at least 5.5 sacks in the same season since Cashman (7.5) and Richardson (7.0) in 2016.

TURNING TO'S INTO POINTS

► Minnesota's defense has forced 15 turnovers this year and has capitalized on nearly all of them. The Gophers have scored on the ensuing drive on 10 of the 15 turnovers and added a fumble return for a touchdown, turning them into 61 points.

► In the opener against Ohio State, cornerback **Terrell Smith** returned an interception 23 yards, resulting in a **Mohamed Ibrahim** rushing touchdown.

► Versus Miami (OH), the Gophers recovered a fumble on the RedHawks' opening drive, and **Trey Potts** cashed in with a rushing touchdown. In the fourth quarter, **Tyler Nubin's** 18-yard interception return against Miami (OH) was followed by a **Matthew Trickett** field goal.

► At Colorado, **Jack Gibbens** stripped the CU quarterback in the third quarter, **Justus Harris** recovered and seven plays later, Potts scored. Later in the fourth, a muffed Buffaloes punt was recovered by **Bishop McDonald** and Trickett hit a 33-yard field goal.

► Against Bowling Green, **Mariano Sori-Marin** notched the first interception of his career and Trickett followed with a 36-yard field goal. Later in the contest, **Braelen Oliver** forced a fumble that was recovered by Smith, but Minnesota was forced to punt.

► Purdue's opening drive ended with a strip sack by **Boye Mafe** with a recovery by Val Martin. Four plays later, **Tanner Morgan** hit **Chris Autman-Bell** for a score. In the fourth quarter, Nubin had an interception with less than a minute to go that didn't result in any points, but it did allow the Gophers to run out the clock.

► At Northwestern, Sori-Marin forced a fumble in the first quarter and **Justin Walley** returned it 25 yards for a touchdown. It was the first fumble return for a touchdown for Minnesota since **Blake Cashman** did so against Purdue in 2018.

► At Iowa, Walley forced and recovered a fumble late in the second quarter, and Trickett made a 31-yard field goal.

► At Indiana, Nubin's interception led to a touchdown, though a later interception by **Phillip Howard** was followed by a punt.

► In the finale against Wisconsin, Walley recorded his first career interception and the Gophers followed with a rushing touchdown.

WALLEY TABBED BIG F.O.W.

► Defensive back **Justin Walley** was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after a standout performance in Minnesota's 23-13 win against Wisconsin.

► Walley is the first Gopher freshman defensive player to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

► He recorded his first career interception and finished the game with a career high five tackles, helping Minnesota win Paul Bunyan's Axe for the second time in four years.

4TH-DOWN SUCCESS

► Minnesota has been one of the more successful teams this season on fourth downs on both sides of the ball. The defense is 10th in the country by holding opponents to just a 35.3 percent conversion rate (6-17), while the offense is 33rd by converting 61.5 percent of its attempts (8-13).

► The Gophers have stopped opponents on nine of their past 12 fourth-down attempts. After Purdue started 2-2 on Oct. 2, Minnesota stopped the Boilermakers on 4th-and-5 at the MN43. The Gophers then held Nebraska to 0-2 on its tries on Oct. 16, and Maryland was 0-1 the following week.

► At Northwestern, the Wildcats picked up a 4th-and-1 at the NU49 in the third quarter, but on the same drive a 4th-and-3 at the MN28 was incomplete. In the fourth quarter, a pass on 4th-and-8 at the NU43 also was incomplete. Iowa was 1-1, gaining one yard on a 4th-and-1, while Indiana was 0-1 last week, throwing an incompleteness on a 4th-and-6.

► Wisconsin was 1-3 on Nov. 30. After converting their first 4th-down try in the fourth quarter, the Gophers forced an incompleteness on a 4th-and-4 and a stop on a 4th-and-1.

► Offensively, Minnesota started the year 3-4 in 4th-down attempts, before going 1-3 vs. Illinois on Nov. 6. At Iowa they bounced back by going 3-4, their most fourth-down conversions in one game since going 3-3 at Wisconsin in 2018.

► **Mohamed Ibrahim** turned a 4th-and-1 at the MN29 against Ohio State into a 56-yard run that set up a touchdown pass. At Colorado, **Trey Potts** gained 5 yards on a 4th-and-1 at the CU8 and scored on the next play. After getting stopped on a 4th-and-1 at the MN29 versus Bowling Green, the Gophers came back against Nebraska and passed for a touchdown on 4th-and-1 at the NEB5.

► Against the Hawkeyes, the Gophers turned a 4th-and-2 into a 37-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter. Later in the fourth, **Ky Thomas** had a three-yard run on 4th-and-1, and after an incompleteness on a 4th-and-17, the Gophers converted a 4th-and-10. At Indiana, the Gophers were stopped on a 4th-and-1 in the first quarter, but in the second quarter they picked up five yards on another 4th-and-1.

TRICKETT COMING THROUGH

► Graduate transfer **Matthew Trickett** is making the most of his lone season with Minnesota.

► Trickett has made 35 of 37 extra points and 16 of 23 field goals for a season total of 83 points. He ranks eighth in the Big Ten in scoring and 10th with 6.9 points per game. His 83 points are 11th overall in Minnesota single-season history and seventh among kickers.

► Trickett's 16 made field goals are tied for 10th most in program history and the most since **Emmit Carpenter** made 17 in 2018. He's made 1.33 field goals per game this year, good for sixth in the Big Ten.

► Though he's missed seven field goal tries this year, five of those attempts were from 45 yards or longer and three were 50-plus yards.

► Trickett came to Minnesota after three seasons at Kent State where he earned All-MAC First Team honors in 2018 and was the MAC Special Teams Player of the Year in 2019. He made 47-57 (82.5%) field goals and was 94-95 on PATs for 235 career points. In 2019, he tied for the NCAA lead and set a Kent State record with 29 made field goals.

KESICH THE KICKOFF SPECIALIST

► Sophomore kickoff specialist **Dragan Kesich**, who did not play against Illinois, has 41 touchbacks on 62 kickoffs this year. He is 25th in the country with his 66.13 percent touchback rate and 19th with his 63.69 average yardage on kickoffs.

► Against Maryland on Oct. 23, he had a career high six touchbacks and tied a career high with seven kickoffs.

► Minnesota is 16th nationally by holding opponents to 17.44 yards per return and 18th with only 279 kickoff return yards allowed. The Gophers are also tied for 25th in the country with only 16 opponent kick returns this year.

BIG HONOR FOR CRAWFORD

► Minnesota punter **Mark Crawford** was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 4 after a standout performance in Minnesota's 20-13 win at Purdue on Oct. 2. Crawford shared the honor with Penn State's Jordan Stout.

► Crawford continually flipped the field in a rain-soaked game, as he averaged 51.3 yards on six punts. He recorded a career-long, 60-yard punt twice, which was Minnesota's longest punt since **Ryan Santoso** had a 61-yarder against Illinois on Oct. 21, 2017.

► Crawford's six punts traveled 60, 60, 58, 46, 45 and 39 yards with his three longest punts all ranking in the top 20 of longest punts in the Big Ten at the time. He placed four punts inside the 15-yard line, which led to Purdue starting drives on its own 2, 9, 15 and 15 yard lines.

► Minnesota also allowed zero punt return yards against Purdue, which was a big reason why the Boilermakers, who ran 86 total plays, were limited to only 13 total points and did not score in the second half.

► Crawford also executed four successful holds (two point-after attempts and two field goals) in a driving rain.

► He was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week since holder **Casey O'Brien** was recognized on Oct. 21, 2019, and he's the first Minnesota punter to receive the honor since 2013 when **Peter Mortell** was recognized on Nov. 4 and Nov. 11.

► On the season, Crawford has punted 44 times for 1830 yards, an average of 41.6 yards per punt that ranks eighth in the Big Ten. He's had six kicks cover at least 50 yards and 21 punts land inside the 20-yard line.

PITCHING A SHUTOUT

► Minnesota's 30-0 win at Colorado on Sept. 18 was its first shutout since a 62-0 shutout of Temple on Sept. 16, 2006, and its first on the road since a 44-0 triumph over Kent State on Aug. 31, 2006.

► It was the first shutout for Minnesota versus a Power 5 team since defeating Illinois 45-0 on Oct. 23, 2004. The Gophers' last shutout of a Power 5 team on the road also took place against Illinois, a 21-0 win in Champaign on Nov. 12, 1977.

► The Golden Gophers held Colorado to just 63 yards of total offense with 82 yards passing and -19 rush yards.

► The 63 yards of total offense allowed was the third best in program history since 1960, bested only by 50 yards given up against Michigan in 1962 and a school-record 48 yards yielded to Navy also in 1962.

► According to Chris Vannini of *The Athletic*, the 63 yards were the fewest by an FBS team since Kansas had 21 yards against TCU in 2017.

► Minnesota outgained Colorado 83-0 in the first quarter (12 passing yards, -12 rushing yards) and held a 225-7 (34 passing, -27 rushing) advantage in total offense at halftime.

► The -19 rushing yards were the fourth lowest allowed since 1960 by Minnesota, trailing only -23 vs. Michigan in 1998, -31 in the aforementioned Navy contest in 1962 and the school record of -46 versus Michigan also in 1962.

► Colorado had 21 rushing attempts, the fewest by a Minnesota foe since Miami (OH) also had 21 in 2011.

► After shutting out Colorado, Minnesota kept Bowling Green scoreless in the first quarter in its next contest. It marked the first time the Gophers had recorded five consecutive scoreless quarters since October 2004. The scoreless streak covered 87 minutes and 24 seconds, dating back to the end of the Miami (OH) game on Sept. 11.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

► Minnesota has had an average time of possession of 35:10 this year, which leads the Big Ten and ranks fourth nationally behind only Army (36:46), Air Force (36:41) and Western Michigan (35:30).

► Four times in the **P.J. Fleck** era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game. Most recently, the Gophers held the ball for 40:02 at Iowa on Nov. 13, while they had it for 40:09 at Northwestern on Oct. 30 and at Colorado on Sept. 18, Minnesota had it for 40:13. The only larger time of possession came against Maryland in 2019 (42:53).

► In 57 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 43 times and gone 28-15 in those contests.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

► Among active FBS players, **Tanner Morgan** ranks 19th in pass yards (7,963), 21st in career pass efficiency (151.60), 27th in pass TDs (56), 28th in total offense (7,928), 30th in completions (546), 34th in pass attempts (889), 36th in TDs responsible for (60), 37th in completion percentage (61.4) and 40th in pass yards/game (194.2).

► With his years at Abilene Christian included, **Jack Gibbens** ranks 11th among FBS players with 344 career tackles and 34th in tackles per game (6.75).

► Including his career at Kent State, **Matthew Trickett** is fourth among active FBS players with 2.00 career field goal attempts per game, sixth in field goals made per game (1.58), 9th in field goals made (63), 11th in field goal attempts (80), 12th in points per game (8.0), 21st in points (318), 26th in PAT percentage (97.7), 33rd in extra points made and attempted (129-of-132) and 37th in field goal percentage (78.8).

► **Mohamed Ibrahim** is out for the season due to injury but he still ranks third among active FBS players in career rushes per game (18.86), sixth in rushing yards per game (103.6), 11th in rushing touchdowns (33), 16th in touchdowns scored (33), 13th in all-purpose yards per game (109.1), 16th in rushing yards (3,003), 20th in rushes (547), 21st in yards per rush (5.49), 30th in points per game (6.8) and 50th in all-purpose yards (3,164).

FLECK SIGNS 7-YEAR CONTRACT

► The University of Minnesota and head football coach **P.J. Fleck** have agreed to a new seven-year contract, it was announced on Nov. 3. This agreement, pending Board of Regents approval, will keep Fleck in Maroon and Gold through the 2028 season.

► "This is home," said Fleck. "Our family loves it here and we are excited to continue this journey at the University of Minnesota. From day one, we talked about cultural sustainability and how important it is to building a successful football program and life program. Today is another step in that process, and this new contract is a commitment to our elite staff and the entire state of Minnesota. Heather and I are so thankful to our staff, **Mark Coyle**, President **Joan Gabel** and the Board of Regents for trusting us to lead this program. Our goal is to recruit and coach at an elite level and to have our young people achieve academic, athletic, social and spiritual excellence. It's a tremendous honor to lead this program, and we will continue to work to build a culture that connects the entire state."

► "P.J. and Heather continue to do everything the right way," said Director of Athletics **Mark Coyle**. "He continues to build a program that fans can take great pride in, and his student-athletes compete at a high level academically, athletically and socially. He is a tremendous recruiter and has elevated the stature of our program by an immeasurable amount. I am grateful to President Gabel and the Board of Regents for their continued support, and I look forward to Coach Fleck continuing to lead the Gophers."

NON-CON STREAK SNAPPED

► Minnesota saw its 21-game non-conference win streak end on Sept. 25 with a 14-10 setback against Bowling Green. It was the nation's longest active streak in the country, and at that time, only three other schools in the country had non-conference win streaks longer than seven games.

► The streak was tied for the third longest in the last 25 years along with LSU, which also won 21 in a row from 2005-09. Only Alabama (26, 2009-13) and Utah (23, 2012-18) had longer streaks in that span.

► The Golden Gophers hadn't lost a non-conference game since Sept. 3, 2015, at home to then-No. 2 TCU. Included in the streak were 17 regular season wins and four bowl victories. Also in the streak were 13 straight home wins against non-B1G teams, which was tied for the 10th longest streak in the FBS. Minnesota is 13-1 under **P.J. Fleck** in non-conference games.

IBRAHIM OUT FOR THE YEAR

► **Mohamed Ibrahim**, the 202 Big Ten Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year, suffered a season-ending lower leg injury in Minnesota's season-opening loss to Ohio State. He had surgery on Sept. 7, but announced on Nov. 24, that he would be returning for the 2022 season.

► Ibrahim has 14 career 100-yard rushing games, including a streak of nine in a row from the 2020 Outback Bowl through this year's season opener. Ibrahim's nine-game streak is the longest in program history, two more than former Gopher **Laurence Maroney**.

► Before leaving in the third quarter with his injury, Ibrahim ran for 163 yards and two touchdowns on 30 attempts. In two career games against Ohio State, Ibrahim has run for 320 yards and four TDs on 53 carries.

► Ibrahim has 3,003 rushing yards for his career, the eighth Minnesota player to reach the 3,000-yard milestone.

► An All-Big Ten First Team honoree and AP Third-Team All-American last year, Ibrahim ran 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history). He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

► He also set a school record with a rushing average of 153.7 yards per game and tied a school mark with four rushing scores in one game (at Maryland and at Illinois).

POTTS ALSO LOST FOR SEASON

► Minnesota head coach **P.J. Fleck** announced on Oct. 11 that redshirt sophomore running back **Trey Potts** would miss the remainder of the season.

► Potts left the field in the fourth quarter of the team's Oct. 2, 2021, game at Purdue. Potts was immediately observed and treated by the team's medical staff and was then transported to a hospital for further observation. Potts was discharged from an Indiana hospital on Oct. 8 and returned to Minneapolis.

► The Gophers turned to Potts as their lead back with the season-ending injury to All-American **Mohamed Ibrahim**. In four games as a starter, Potts rushed for 518 yards and scored six touchdowns on 102 carries.

► In his first career start against Miami (OH) on Sept. 11, Potts ran for 178 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries, smashing personal highs in all three categories. In fact, Potts' 34 carries were the most by an FBS player this season until Sept. 25, and they now rank tied for 13th. He followed that by rushing for 121 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 26 carries at Colorado, then tallied 141 yards on 27 rushes against Bowling Green before recording 78 yards and a score on 15 carries at Purdue.

► Overall on the season, Potts rushed 111 times for 552 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 110.4 yards per game and 5.0 yards per rush. He also caught three passes for 16 yards, returned six punts for 65 yards and brought back one kick for 17 yards.

► From Sept. 11 to Oct. 2 (his four games as a starter), Potts had the third-most rushing yards of any FBS player in the country and the second most carries.

► Through games on Oct. 2, Potts ranked ninth in the country in rushing yards, 11th in rushing yards per game, 19th in punt return average (10.8), 21st in rushing TDs and 25th in all-purpose yards per game (130.0).

WILLIAMS OUT FOR YEAR, TOO

► Head coach **P.J. Fleck** announced Nov. 1 that redshirt junior running back **Bryce Williams** suffered a season-ending injury at Northwestern.

► In eight games this year, Williams ran for 186 yards and three touchdowns on 37 carries. Most of his production came in the last three weeks, running for 184 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries since Oct. 16. Williams was also second on the team in kick returns (5) and kick return yards (60).

► In the first game without Ibrahim or Potts, it was Williams who got the start against Nebraska on Oct. 16. It was the third start of his career and his first since Oct. 26, 2018. Williams finished with 127 rushing yards on 17 carries, highlighted by a career-long touchdown run of 56 yards that gave Minnesota a 30-16 lead with just over two minutes to play. The 56-yard run tied Ibrahim for the longest rush by a Gopher this year.

MAFE, FAALELE ON 'FREAKS' LIST

► Seniors **Boye Mafe** and **Daniel Faalele** both appeared on the "2021 College Football Freaks List" from *The Athletic's* Bruce Feldman.

► Mafe came in at No. 17 of 101 players listed. "He's put on more than 50 pounds since arriving at Minnesota and weighs 263 now, up from 260 last year," Feldman wrote. "Mafe says he did a lot of single-leg work this off-season in hopes of improving his footwork." Among Mafe's weight room numbers listed by Feldman are a vertical jump of 40.5 inches, a broad jump of 10-6, a 4.57 40 and power cleaning 400 pounds.

► Faalele was ranked No. 29. "Two years ago, Faalele ranked No. 11 on this list because of his freakish combination of enormous size and a surprisingly athletic 29-inch vertical and 8-7 broad jump, but as he's reshaped his body, he's become a lot more nimble and flexible," Feldman said.

HUNTINGTON BANK STADIUM

- Minnesota opened Huntington Bank Stadium with a 20-13 win against Air Force in 2009. All-time, the Gophers are 53-37 at Huntington, including a 21-13 record under Head Coach P.J. Fleck.
- Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher Hockey, MNF, an NHL game, international soccer, MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings and Minnesota United also played seasons on campus while their stadiums were being constructed.
- Upon completion, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960.
- The Gopher locker room is a state of the art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in the country. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.

HEAD COACH // FIFTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 40, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 64-45 and is 34-23 at Minnesota.

While at Minnesota, Fleck has guided Minnesota to its most wins (11 in 2019) since 1904, has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), six Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries twice, Sam Renner twice, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 194 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had eight players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962. The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962. Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history. Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999. The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same span.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck, which included a school record 3.33 cumulative team GPA after the 2020-21 academic year.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988. Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts. Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.
