STARTING FIVE

1. Minnesota welcomes No. 24 Purdue to Williams Arena for a rare 4 p.m. game on Thursday. This will be the second meeting between the two schools this season, with the Boilermakers taking the first 81-62. Purdue will be the third Big Ten opponent that Minnesota has faced twice this year, joining Michigan and Iowa. Minnesota went 1-1 against both the Wolverines and Hawkeyes this season and will be looking for the season split with Purdue. The Boilers will be the ninth ranked opponent that Minnesota will face this season. The Gophers opened Big Ten play against eight ranked teams and went 4-4 during that span. Minnesota played only eight ranked opponents last season after facing 11 (a high in the Pinto era) in 2018-19. Minnesota faced six ranked opponents in 2017-18, five in 2016-17, six in 2015-16, six in 2014-15, and nine in 2013-14 (Pitino's first season at Minnesota).

2. Minnesota is 52-32 all-time against Purdue at home, which is a winning percentages of 61.9%. That is the seventh-best for Minnesota against current Big Ten programs. Minnesota is 495-308 at home against current Big Ten opponents (winning percentage of 61.6%) and is above .500 against every team except Maryland.

Minnesota's last home game against Purdue was a 73-69 win on March 5, 2019. In that game, Amir Coffey (Los Angeles Clippers) scored 32 points and had eight rebounds. Daniel Oturu, who is also with the Clippers, scored two points and had one block. The only current Gopher who played in that game and is still on the team is Gabe Kalschauer.

3. Minnesota is averaging 76.0 points per game this year. That mark - if it holds - would be the highest for Minnesota since it averaged 76.7 points per game during 1992-93 season. The last time Minnesota average more than 76 points per game in a season was 1989-90 when it averaged 83.3 points.

4. Marcus Carr played in his 50th career game as a Gopher on Monday. Carr, who played his freshman season at Pittsburgh, averages 17.1 points per game, 6.2 assists per game and 4.9 rebounds per game as a Gopher. Those are historically good numbers. At this point in his career, his 17.1 points per game would rank tenth in school history (minimum 40 games played) and would be the best career scoring average for a Gopher since Mychal Thompson averaged 20.8 points from 1975-78. His average of 6.2 assists per game would rank first in school history (minimum 40 games played) ahead of Ray Williams who averaged 5.7 from 1976-77.

5. Gabe Kalschauer ranks sixth in school history in made threes (175) and attempted threes (510). Kalschauer has scored 893 points for Minnesota and is 107 shy away of scoring 1,000 for his career.

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SOMETHING ABOUT HOME

• Minnesota is 12-1 at home this year (25th time in school history with 12 home wins) and averages 81.4 points, while allowing only 68.3. In scoring 1,058 points at Williams Arena, Minnesota has made 344 field goals, 97 3-pointers and 273 free throws (opponents have attempted only 275 free throws at Williams Arena). Minnesota also has lopsided home numbers in blocks (65-30) and steals (84-64).

• Minnesota started 11-0 this season at Williams Arena. That mark was its best since 2016-17 when it was also 11-0 at home. Michigan State handed Minnesota its first home loss that season in the twelfth game, defeating the Gophers 75-74 in overtime. Minnesota would finish the 2016-17 campaign with a 17-3 mark at home. Minnesota's first home loss this year was 63-49 to Maryland. Minnesota plays only 17 games this year and has games left against Purdue, Illinois, Northwestern and Rutgers.

• Minnesota won its first four Big Ten home games, as it beat No. 4 Iowa, No. 17 Michigan State, No. 25 Ohio State and No. 7 Michigan. The 4-0 conference start at home tied the team's best mark under Coach Pitino, which it also accomplished last season.

• Dating back to last season, Minnesota had won 12 straight at home before falling to Maryland on Jan. 23. That was the longest stretch for the Gophers since they won 12 straight at more than a decade ago. Minnesota ended 2007-08 going 3-0 at home and started 2008-09 with a 9-0 home record.

• Liam Robbins had 16 points and 10 rebounds at Rutgers. It was his second double-double of the season (27 points, 14 rebounds against Ohio State). Robbins has scored in double figures 14 times this season and has grabbed five or more rebounds 15 times. He has totaled at least 15 points and five rebounds in seven games this season. The U is 5-2 when he hits those benchmarks.

BLOCKED AND REPORTED

• Liam Robbins had a season-high six blocks at Purdue. The 7-0 center averages 2.68 blocks per game, which leads the Big Ten and ranks tied for 12th in the nation. He is the first Gopher to total more than five blocks in one game since Daniel Oturu had five against Northwestern on Jan. 5, 2020. Robbins has 51 blocks this season and needs 16 more to crack the top 10 in school single-season history (Damian Johnson is currently tenth after recording 67 blocks in 2009-10). Robbins' average of 2.68 blocks per game currently places him sixth in the school single-season record books, just behind Randy Breuer (3.0 bpg in 1982-83) and ahead of Kevin McHale (2.6 bpg in 1979-80) and Breuer (2.6 bpg in 1981-82).

DOUBLE FIGURES

• Minnesota had four players (Marcus Carr, Gabe Kalschauer, Brandon Johnson and Jamal Mashburn Jr.)

score in double-figures against Nebraska. It was the second straight game and ninth game this season (fifth in BIG play) where four players scored 10 points or more. Minnesota has two games this year – wins against Ohio State and St. Louis – where it had five players score in double figures.

CURRY MAKES SPICY PLAYS

• Eric Curry has provided Minnesota with some valuable minutes off the bench this season. Curry, who has overcome two significant ACL injuries during his career, is averaging 12.9 minutes, 3.9 points and 2.1 rebounds. He scored six points and had three steals in 15 minutes in a home win against Michigan and then added 10 points at Purdue. The 10 points were a season high and were the most for Curry since he scored 11 against Penn State on Jan. 19, 2019.

NEW STARTER

• Tre' Williams started the last three games over Both Gach. At Purdue, he had eight points and five rebounds in 23:35 of action. It was his first start this season and fifth of his career. The eight points and five boards were both season highs. He had three points at Rutgers and eight against Nebraska.

RARE SETBACKS

• Minnesota led Purdue 35-30 at the half and was winning 37-35 at the half at Rutgers. However, the Gophers dropped both road contests. These are the only two times this season that Minnesota did not win when it was leading at the half. Minnesota is 11-2 when leading at the half and 1-5 when trailing. Minnesota's lone win when trailing came against Boston College (trailed 31-30, but won 85-80 in overtime).

FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE

• Brandon Johnson recorded his first double-double as a Gopher (13 points, 10 rebounds). It was the seventh time he has scored at least 10 points this season and was the second time he had 10 rebounds.

RANKED CONVERSATION

• Minnesota beat St. Louis when it was unranked, but receiving votes, meaning that Minnesota faced a ranked team or a receiving votes team in nine-straight games (Gophers went 5-4). That streak started on Dec. 15, 2020 at No. 13 Illinois and ran through Jan. 16, 2021 against No. 7 Michigan.

• The Gophers have four ranked wins this year, as they have beaten No. 4 Iowa, No. 17 Michigan State, No. 25 Ohio State and No. 7 Michigan. Minnesota handed Iowa (13-5), Michigan (13-1) and St. Louis (8-3) their first losses of the season. The combined record of those three schools is 34-9. Add in Ohio State (16-4) and the record of the four schools is 50-13, meaning that Minnesota is responsible for 30.7% of the losses of those four teams.

• Minnesota has won 11 games against ranked opponents during the last three seasons, which is the most in a three-season span in program history.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

PHOTO AND FILM CREDENTIALS

Only approved photographers will be permitted into Tier 3 photography areas, which start in Row 5 and are in sections 112-114 and 118-120. Please adhere to the physical distancing in those sections.

MEDIA PASS GATE

The media pass gate is located at Oak Street Entrance. Media must have proper identification to receive credentials. The media pass gate opens two and a half hours before game time.

GAME NOTES

Minnesota, opponent and Big Ten conference notes can be found on each organization's respective website. Game notes will not be printed and will not be available at the game.

MEDIA ROOMS

All media rooms at Williams Arena and Maturi Pavilion will be closed. As Tier 3 credential holders, media have access to their assigned seat, restrooms and concourse (enter/exit areas).

BEVERAGES PROVIDED

There will be one bottle of water at each media member's seat when they arrive at Williams Arena. A media meal will not be provided before the game. Concession stands are not open for basketball games so media are suggested to bring their own light snacks from home.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Postgame coach and player interviews are conducted via Zoom. A link will be provided to the media prior to game day.

WEEKLY PRACTICE ACCESS/INTERVIEW AVAILABILITY

Coach Pitino and select students will be available for interviews the day before each game. Requests for individual players should be submitted to Paul Rovnak no less than 24 hours before scheduled availability, but are not guaranteed for availability.

SUPPORT STAFF CHANGES

• Head coach Richard Pitino added Jeff Mailhot as an assistant coach prior to the season. Mailhot, a native of Minneapolis and graduate of Hopkins High School, was an assistant at Iona College last year.

• Former Gopher student-athlete Jarvis Johnson is in his second year with the team as a graduate manager, while Gopher alum Andre Hollins is in his first year as graduate manager.

TWO IN THE TOP 10

• Marcus Carr and Liam Robbins were both recently names top ten candidate for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award (Carr) and the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Award (Robbins). Minnesota and Illinois (Ayo Dosunmu - Cousy, Kofi Cockburn - Abdul-Jabbar) are the only schools with a student-athlete on each list.

BACK AT IT

• Prior to last Monday's home win against Nebraska, the Gophers last played at Williams Arena on Jan. 23, which meant that Minnesota had a 16-day span between home games (longest since 16 days between home games in a win vs. Cleveland State on Nov. 5, 2019 and a win vs. Central Michigan on Nov. 21, 2019). Minnesota played at Rutgers a week ago Thursday and is in a stretch of playing four games in 11 days, five games in 14 days and six games in 17 days. Earlier this year, Minnesota had stretches of six games in 16 days and six games in 18 days. The Gophers are scheduled to play seven games in February, which would be their second busiest month of the season. Minnesota's busiest months this season have been December (8 games), January (6 games) and November (3 games). Minnesota is scheduled to play two regular-season games in March.

CARR REACHES 1,000 CAREER POINTS, CLOSING IN ON 1,000 AT THE U

• Marcus Carr scored his 1,000th career point against Iowa on Christmas. He had 320 points in 2017-18 at Pittsburgh. At Minnesota, he has scored 836 points, including 379 this year. Carr has scored 857 points in his Minnesota career and is just 143 shy of reaching 1,000 as a Gopher.

GOPHERS IN THE CLASSROOM

• Minnesota recorded a 3.18 term GPA last semester. In also held a 3.05 cumulative GPA, with a majority of the players posting a 3.0 GPA or higher. It marked the third-straight semester where the Gophers had a term and cumulative GPA of at least 3.0. The Gophers also held its highest multiyear APR (Academic Progress Report) this past year at 990.

SCHOLARSHIP EARNED

• Hunt Conroy was put on scholarship by Coach Pitino on Jan. 25. The senior guard has played in nine career games and aspires to be a coach one day. His father is Associate Head Coach Ed Conroy.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

• Minnesota has had three Big Ten Players of the Week (Marcus Carr, Liam Robbins 2X). Robbins was also named USBWA National Player of the Week (Jan. 5) and Naismith Trophy Award Player of the Week (Jan. 18). Robbins averaged 19.0 points per game and 10.7 rebounds per game against Michigan State/Wisconsin/Ohio State. In the win versus Michigan State, Robbins had 18 points and added nine rebounds. He scored 22 points and grabbed eight rebounds in a win against No. 7 Michigan. Carr was named the Big Ten Player of the Week after posting 30 points against the then-No. 4 Hawkeyes when he went 6-for-13 shooting from 3-point range and eight assists.

RECORDS FALL AGAINST IOWA ON CHRISTMAS

• In the win against Iowa on Christmas, Brandon Johnson set a school record for 3-point field goal accuracy (.889, 8-9) and tied a school record for 3-pointers made in a game (fourth player to make 8). The Gophers attempted 43 3-pointers, which was seven more than the previous school (36). Minnesota made 17 3-pointers, which was one shy of the school record 18 (vs. Nebraska on 3/8/20).

ATTACKING THE BOARDS

• Minnesota held a season-best 52 rebounds against Michigan State. It marked the first time the Gophers had 50 rebounds in a game since Jan. 2, 2020 against Purdue.

GOPHERS & SOCIAL JUSTICE

• Minnesota wears a 'Love Us' BLM patch on its uniforms and will wear a 'Unity' warm up shirt. In addition, Lift Every Voice and Sing will be played prior to the National Anthem at home games.

CAPTAINS

• Minnesota's captains are Marcus Carr, Gabe Kalscheur and Eric Curry. The trio was voted by the players. It marks the second time Carr has been named a captain and first for Kalscheur and Curry.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN

• Marcus Carr has was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten Team. Carr is the first Gopher to make the preseason team since Jordan Murphy in 2018-19 and the first Minnesota guard since Amir Coffey and Nate Mason in 2017-18. An All-Big Ten Third Team selection last year, Carr set school records with 207 assists, including 130 during conference action. He finished the year second in the conference and ninth nationally with 6.7 assists per game, and tied for second with an assist/turnover ratio of 2.5.

PITINO RECOGNIZED BY AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY

• Coach Richard Pitino was honored earlier this year as the Spirit of Hope Community Honoree at the Minnesota Made Extravaganza, a gala held virtually to benefit the American Cancer Society.

• Pitino was recognized for the work he has done over the past five years to raise money for the Minneapolis Hope Lodge, a facility for cancer patients and their caregivers, through his annual Coaches vs. Cancer Tip-Off Reception. According to the ACS, the reception has helped raise over \$500,000. Pitino and the men's basketball program have also donated their time as volunteers at the Hope Lodge, cooking dinner and providing entertainment and encouragement to the guests.

Richard Pitino is in his eighth season as the 17th head coach of the University of Minnesota's Golden Gopher men's basketball team.

Pitino's seventh season at the helm of the Golden Gophers was cut short as COVID-19 resulted in the cancellation of the season as Minnesota was prepared to play in the second round of the Big Ten Tournament and sitting on the bubble for the NCAA Tournament. Daniel Oturu earned numerous awards for his play, including NABC All-District, Sporting News and CBS Sports All-America Third Team honoree, as well as a Associated Press All-America honorable mention. At the conference level, Oturu earned All-Big Ten Second Team honors from the coaches and media, along with Big Ten All-Defensive Team recognition and a spot on the USBWA All-District Team. Marcus Carr also got conference recognition as he earned a spot on the All-Big Ten third team by the media vote.

Pitino guided the Gophers to their second NCAA Tournament bid in three seasons in 2018-19, along with just the second tournament victory in nearly 30 years. The Gophers won 22 games, finished seventh in the Big Ten and upset the No. 7-seed Louisville Cardinals in the NCAA first round. Two Gophers in Jordan Murphy and Amir Coffey earned All-Big Ten nods, the former also earning NABC All-District honors.

In his fifth season, Pitino saw the Gophers achieve several notable achievements. The Gophers were ranked nationally to begin the season and as high as 12th, while two individuals picked up All-Big Ten honors. Jordan Murphy earned his third straight All-Big Ten nod after a year in which he led the conference in rebounding and tied for the nation's lead in double-doubles (24). Nate Mason received All-Big Ten honorable mention after capping a career in which he ranked among the all-time Gophers.

The 2017 Big Ten Coach of the Year as voted by the league's media and head coaches, Pitino led the Gophers to a school-record 23 regular season wins and an NCAA appearance for the first time since 2013. Earning a No. 5 seed in the tournament - the Gophers' highest since 1982 - Pitino guided the Gophers to an 11-win Big Ten season, the most since the 1990 campaign. Four Gophers received All-Big Ten honors, including First Team selection Nate

Mason and Defensive Player of the Year Reggie Lynch along with third teamer Jordan Murphy and All-Freshman selection Amir Coffey.

The 2016-17 season saw several accomplishments, including the selection of freshman Jordan Murphy to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. He was the Gophers' first honoree since 2005 and only the third ever. The Gophers also picked up signature victories over No. 6 Maryland at home, along with improving to 3-0 under Pitino in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge after a home victory over Clemson in November.

In 2015-16, the Gophers set a new school single-season record with 313 steals, passing the previous mark of 297 set in 2007-08. The team averaged 74.2 points per game, the highest since the 2001-02 season and the second straight season under head coach Richard Pitino that the Gophers have averaged more than 71 points per game. Two of his players garnered All-Big Ten honorable mentions in guard Andre Hollins (coaches & media) and Maurice Walker (media). In February, the Gophers defeated then-#25 and eventual Final Four team Michigan State in East Lansing for the first time since 1997 (later vacated) - the team's first road win over a top-25 team since 2012.

Pitino came to Gold Country after spending one season at the helm of the Florida International University (FIU) basketball program.

Prior to leading FIU, Pitino served as the Associate Head Coach for one season and an assistant for two other seasons under his father, Rick, at Louisville. In three years overall with the Cardinals, he helped the program to a combined 88-25 record, a pair of NCAA Elite Eight berths (2008 and 2009) and one NCAA Final Four appearance (2012). His efforts also helped the Cards land two of top 15 recruiting classes in his three years (2007-08 and 2008-09). Pitino also spent time as an assistant for two seasons under Billy Donovan at Florida. In his time with the Gators, the club was a combined 50-20 with back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, including reaching the 2011 NCAA Southeast Regional finals before falling to NCAA runner-up Butler.
