STARTING FIVE

1. Minnesota heads to Nebraska for its second-to-last road game of the regular season. This will be the 75th all-time meeting between the schools and Minnesota leads the series 54-20 (Minnesota's 72% winning percentage against the Huskers is its best against teams in the Big Ten). That includes a 79-61 home win earlier this season, where the Gophers were led by Marcus Carr (21 points, 8 assists) and Brandon Johnson (13 points, 10 rebounds). Carr played only 19 minutes in that game as he battled foul trouble. Ten players saw action and eight scored. Minnesota is 15-12 overall at Nebraska.

2. Saturday's game will be the second meeting between Minnesota and Nebraska during the regular season. The Huskers will be the sixth opponent that Minnesota will face twice this year. Minnesota went 1-1 against Michigan, Iowa and Purdue and is 0-2 against Illinois and Maryland. The Gophers will face Rutgers for a second time this season on March 6, looking for a season split.

3. Minnesota has used six different starting lineups this season and nine different players have started a game. Many of these changes were necessitated because of injuries, as Brandon Johnson, Liam Robbins and Gabe Kalscheur have all missed time this season. The only Gopher to start all 24 games this season is Marcus Carr.

4. Minnesota is 5-5 against ranked opponents this year. The Gophers, who played only eight ranked opponents last season, have beaten No. 4 Iowa, No. 7 Michigan, No. 17 Michigan State, No. 24 Purdue and No. 25 Ohio State this year. The five ranked wins also ties a school regular-season record, as Minnesota also beat five ranked opponents in 2012-13. That year, Minnesota beat No. 1 Indiana, No. 12 at Illinois, No. 18 Michigan State, No. 19 vs. Memphis and No. 20 Wisconsin (OT). The Gophers picked up a sixth ranked win in the NCAA tournament when it beat No. 24 UCLA. The previous high under Coach Pitino was four ranked wins in the regular season and came in 2018-19. That year, Minnesota played 11 ranked opponents (Pitino-era high) and beat No. 11 Purdue, No. 19 Iowa, No. 22 at Wisconsin and No. 24 Nebraska. The Gophers earned a fifth ranked win in the Big Ten tournament by beating No. 13 Purdue.

5. Marcus Carr played in his 55th game as a Gopher against Northwestern. Carr averages 17.0 points per game and 5.98 assists per game as a Gopher. At this point in his career, his 17.0 points per game would rank tenth in school history (minimum 40 games played) and would be the best career scoring average since Mychal Thompson averaged 20.8 points from 1975-78. His average of 5.98 assists per game would rank first in school history (minimum 40 games played) ahead of Ray Williams who averaged 5.7 from 1976-77.

KALSCHEUR OUT

• Gabe Kalscheur broke a finger in his right hand (shooting hand) when the team was practicing at Maryland on Feb. 16. Kalscheur, who started the first 88 games of his career, has missed the last three games and is out indefinitely. The junior is Minnesota's best defender and team's third leading scorer (9.2 points per game). He ranks sixth in school history in made threes (180) and attempted threes (521). He has scored 916 points for Minnesota and is 84 shy away of scoring 1,000 for his career.

ROBBINS HOBBLED

• Center Liam Robbins missed the Northwestern game with an ankle injury. Robbins, who has been battling the injury for a few weeks, is the Big Ten's leading shot blocker (2.69 bpg), Minnesota's leading rebounder (6.6) and the team's second leading scorer (11.7).

MASHBURN STEPPING UP

• Jamal Mashburn Jr. has started the last three games in place of Gabe Kalscheur and has been producing. He is averaging 36 minutes, 16 points, 3.6 rebounds and 2.0 assists in those three games. His 48 points rank second on the team during the last three games, just behind Marcus Carr who has scored 52 points.

CURRY PROVIDES RELIEF

• Eric Curry, who has overcome two significant ACL injuries during his career, started against Northwestern and played 32:22. He scored nine points and grabbed eight rebounds. The 32 minutes is tied for the second most in his career and just behind the 35 minutes he played in a start against Southern Illinois on Nov. 25, 2016 (8 points, 11 rebounds).

TEST DRIVE

• Marcus Carr scored six points at Purdue (1/30), which was his lowest output of the season (snapped an 18-game streak in double figures). Carr scored 18 points at Rutgers, which was Minnesota's next game after Purdue. Carr scored only nine points at Maryland and then scored 19 at Indiana. The bounce-back performances are typical for Carr. Prior to the game at Purdue, his last sub-10 point-performance was at Indiana (3/4/20). Carr scored less than 10 points in seven games last season and never consecutively. He typically followed up a less than 10-point game with a memorable output, averaging 20.28 points per game in the next game last season.

CLOSING TIME

• Marcus Carr banked in a three with 7.0 seconds left to beat Purdue 71-68 on Feb. 11. It was the last field goal attempt of game by Minnesota and was Carr's fourth game winner or game-tying basket of his career. This season he is 14-33 from the field in end of half situations (under a minute to play) and 8-22 from three. He has 15 field goals in the final 20 seconds of halves and nine field goals in the final ten seconds of his career.

There are 287 active players with 1000 career points, two of which are Golden Gophers: Marcus Carr (117th at 1,257) and Brandon Johnson (139th at 1,224 points).

CAREER HIGHS

• Tre' Williams scored a career high 11 points at Indiana and then scored 11 at home against Illinois. Williams has scored in double figures three of the last four games. Isaiah Ihnen scored a career high 12 points at Maryland. The output snapped a six-game scoreless drought for the sophomore.

MEMORABLE HOME START

• Minnesota started this season 11-0 at Williams Arena. That mark was its best since 2016-17 when it was also 11-0. Michigan State handed Minnesota its first home loss that season in the twelfth game, defeating the Gophers 75-74 in OT. Minnesota would finish 2016-17 with a 17-3 home mark. Minnesota plays 17 home games this year and has one game left against Rutgers. If Minnesota were to win, it would finish the season 14-3 at home. It would be only the 11th time in program history the U would have 15 home wins.

• Minnesota won its first four Big Ten home games, as it beat No. 4 Iowa, No. 17 Michigan State, No. 25 Ohio State and No. 7 Michigan. The 4-0 conference start at home tied the team's best mark under Coach Pitino, which it also accomplished last season.

• Dating back to last season, Minnesota had won 12 straight at home before falling to Maryland on Jan. 23. That was the longest stretch for the Gophers since they won 12 straight at home more than a decade ago. Minnesota ended 2007-08 going 3-0 at home and started 2008-09 with a 9-0 home record.

15 AND 5

• Liam Robbins had 11 points and 10 rebounds against Purdue (2/11) for his third double-double. Robbins has scored in double figures 15 times and has grabbed five or more rebounds 16 times. He has totaled at least 15 points and five rebounds in seven games this season. The U is 5-2 when he hits those benchmarks.

BLOCKED AND REPORTED

• Liam Robbins averages 2.69 blocks per game, which leads the Big Ten and ranks 12th in the nation. The 7-0 center is the first Gopher to total more than five blocks in one game (six at Purdue on 1/30) since Daniel Oturu had five against Northwestern (1/5/20). Robbins has 62 blocks this season and needs five more to crack the top 10 in school single-season history (Damian Johnson is currently tenth after recording 67 blocks in 2009-10). Robbins' average of 2.69 blocks per game places him sixth in the school single-season record books, just behind Randy Breuer (3.0 bpg in 1982-83) and ahead of Kevin McHale (2.6 bpg in 1979-80) and Breuer (2.6 bpg in 1981-82).

DOUBLE FIGURES

• Minnesota has 11 games (seven in B1G play) this year with at least four players scoring in double figures. Minnesota has two games – wins against Ohio State and St. Louis – where five players scored in double figures.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for working media credentials (newspaper, radio, TV, photo) for Minnesota home games must be made on-line at gophersports.com/media. All credentials for the 2020-21 season will be issued on a single-game format. No season-long passes will be granted. PHOTO AND FILM CREDENTIALS

Only approved photographers will be permitted into Tier 3 photography areas, which start in Row 5 and are in sections 112-114 and 118-120. Please adhere to the physical distancing in those sections.

MEDIA PASS GATE

The media pass gate is located at Oak Street Entrance. Media must have proper identification to receive credentials. The media pass gate opens two and a half hours before game time.

GAME NOTES

Minnesota, opponent and Big Ten conference notes can be found on each organization's respective website. Game notes will not be printed and will not be available at the game.

MEDIA ROOMS

All media rooms at Williams Arena and Maturi Pavilion will be closed. As Tier 3 credential holders, media have access to their assigned seat, restrooms and concourse (enter/exit areas).

BEVERAGES PROVIDED

There will be one bottle of water at each media member's seat when they arrive at Williams Arena. A media meal will not be provided before the game. Concession stands are not open for basketball games so media are suggested to bring their own light snacks from home.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Postgame coach and player interviews are conducted via Zoom. A link will be provided to the media prior to game day.

WEEKLY PRACTICE ACCESS/INTERVIEW AVAILABILITY

Coach Pitino and select students will be available for interviews the day before each game. Requests for individual players should be submitted to Paul Rovnak no less than 24 hours before scheduled availability, but are not guaranteed for availability.

SUPPORT STAFF CHANGES

• Head coach Richard Pitino added Jeff Mailhot as an assistant coach prior to the season. Mailhot, a native of Minneapolis and graduate of Hopkins High School, was an assistant at Iona College last year.

• Former Gopher student-athlete Jarvis Johnson is in his second year with the team as a graduate manager, while Gopher alum Andre Hollins is in his first year as graduate manager.

FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE

- Brandon Johnson recorded his first double-double as a Gopher (13 points, 10 rebounds) against Nebraska (2/8). He has scored at least 10 points 11 times this season and has grabbed at least 10 rebounds twice.

AT THE HALF

- Minnesota was winning three of its last four road games at the half (35-30 at Purdue, 37-35 at Rutgers, 37-35 at Indiana). These are three of the four games that Minnesota did not win when leading at the half (lost to Northwestern after being up 31-25). Minnesota is 11-4 when leading at the half and 2-7 when trailing (wins against Boston College (trailed 31-30, won 85-80 OT) and Purdue (trailed 32-30, won 71-68).

CLOSE WINS

- Minnesota is 3-1 in games decided by five points or less and 6-3 in games decided by 10 points or less.

RANKED WINS

- Minnesota beat St. Louis when it was unranked, but receiving votes, meaning that Minnesota faced a ranked team or a receiving votes team in nine-straight games (Gophers went 5-4). That streak started on Dec. 15, 2020 at No. 13 Illinois and ran through Jan. 16, 2021 against No. 7 Michigan.

- Minnesota handed Michigan (17-1), Iowa (17-7) and St. Louis (11-5) their first losses of the season. The combined record of those three schools is 45-13. Add in Ohio State (18-6), who Minnesota beat 77-60, and the record of the four schools is 63-19, meaning that Minnesota is responsible for 21% of the losses of those four teams.

- Minnesota has won 12 games against ranked opponents during the last three seasons, which is the most in a three-season span in program history. Pitino's 20 ranked wins are the most in school history. Jim Dutcher is second (19) and Tubby Smith third (16).

CARR REACHES 1,000 CAREER POINTS, CLOSING IN ON 1,000 AT THE U

- Marcus Carr scored his 1,000th career point against Iowa on Christmas. He had 320 points in 2017-18 at Pittsburgh. At Minnesota, he has scored 937 points (4459 this year) and is 63 shy of 1,000 as a Gopher.

GOPHERS IN THE CLASSROOM

- Minnesota had a 3.18 term GPA last semester and a 3.05 cumulative GPA. It was the third-straight semester where the Gophers had a term and cumulative GPA of at least 3.0. The Gophers also held its highest multiyear APR this past year at 990.

SCHOLARSHIP EARNED

- Hunt Conroy was put on scholarship by Coach Pitino on Jan. 25. The senior guard has played in nine career games and aspires to be a coach one day. His father is Associate Head Coach Ed Conroy.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- Minnesota has had three Big Ten Players of the Week (Marcus Carr, Liam Robbins 2X). Robbins was named USBWA National Player of the Week (Jan. 5) and Naismith Trophy Award Player of the Week (Jan. 18). Robbins averaged 19.0 points and 10.7 rebounds per game against Michigan State/Wisconsin/Ohio State. He scored 22 points and grabbed eight rebounds in a win against No. 7 Michigan. Carr was honored after posting 30 points against No. 4 Iowa when he went 6-of-13 from 3-point range and had eight assists.

RECORDS FALL AGAINST IOWA ON CHRISTMAS

- Brandon Johnson set a school record for 3-point field goal accuracy (.889, 8-9) and tied a school record for 3-pointers made against Iowa (fourth player to make 8). The Gophers attempted 43 3s, which was seven more than the previous record of 36. Minnesota made 17 3s, one shy of the school record 18 (vs. Nebraska on 3/8/20).

ATTACKING THE BOARDS

- Minnesota held a season-best 52 rebounds against Michigan State. It marked the first time the Gophers had 50 rebounds in a game since Jan. 2, 2020 against Purdue.

GOPHERS & SOCIAL JUSTICE

- Minnesota wears a 'Love Us' BLM patch on its uniforms and will wear a 'Unity' warm up shirt. In addition, Lift Every Voice and Sing will be played prior to the National Anthem at home games.

CAPTAINS

- Minnesota's captains are Marcus Carr, Gabe Kalscheur and Eric Curry. The trio was voted by the players. It marks the second time Carr has been named a captain and first for Kalscheur and Curry.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN

- Marcus Carr was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten Team. A Third Team selection last year, Carr set school records with 207 assists (130 in B1G) and ended the year averaging 6.7 assists (second in B1G).

PITINO RECOGNIZED BY AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY

- Coach Pitino has been honored as the Spirit of Hope Community Honoree at the Minnesota Made Extravaganza, a gala held virtually to benefit the American Cancer Society. He was recognized for his work the past five years to raise money for the Minneapolis Hope Lodge, a facility for cancer patients and their caregivers, through his annual Coaches vs. Cancer Tip-Off Reception. The reception has helped raise more than \$500,000. Pitino and the men's basketball program have also donated their time as volunteers at the Hope Lodge, cooking dinner and providing entertainment and encouragement to the guests.





Richard Pitino is in his eighth season as the 17th head coach of the University of Minnesota's Golden Gophers men's basketball team.

Pitino's seventh season at the helm of the Golden Gophers was cut short as COVID-19 resulted in the cancellation of the season as Minnesota was prepared to play in the second round of the Big Ten Tournament and sitting on the bubble for the NCAA Tournament. Daniel Oturu earned numerous awards for his play, including NABC All-District, Sporting News and CBS Sports All-America Third Team honoree, as well as a Associated Press All-America honorable mention. At the conference level, Oturu earned All-Big Ten Second Team honors from the coaches and media, along with Big Ten All-Defensive Team recognition and a spot on the USBWA All-District Team. Marcus Carr also got conference recognition as he earned a spot on the All-Big Ten third team by the media vote.

Pitino guided the Gophers to their second NCAA Tournament bid in three seasons in 2018-19, along with just the second tournament victory in nearly 30 years. The Gophers won 22 games, finished seventh in the Big Ten and upset the No. 7-seed Louisville Cardinals in the NCAA first round. Two Gophers in Jordan Murphy and Amir Coffey earned All-Big Ten nods, the former also earning NABC All-District honors.

In his fifth season, Pitino saw the Gophers achieve several notable achievements. The Gophers were ranked nationally to begin the season and as high as 12th, while two individuals picked up All-Big Ten honors. Jordan Murphy earned his third straight All-Big Ten nod after a year in which he led the conference in rebounding and tied for the nation's lead in double-doubles (24). Nate Mason received All-Big Ten honorable mention after capping a career in which he ranked among the all-time Gophers.

The 2017 Big Ten Coach of the Year as voted by the league's media and head coaches, Pitino led the Gophers to a school-record 23 regular season wins and an NCAA appearance for the first time since 2013. Earning a No. 5 seed in the tournament - the Gophers' highest since 1982 - Pitino guided the Gophers to an 11-win Big Ten season, the most since the 1990 campaign. Four Gophers received All-Big Ten honors, including First Team selection Nate

Mason and Defensive Player of the Year Reggie Lynch along with third teamer Jordan Murphy and All-Freshman selection Amir Coffey.

The 2016-17 season saw several accomplishments, including the selection of freshman Jordan Murphy to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. He was the Gophers' first honoree since 2005 and only the third ever. The Gophers also picked up signature victories over No. 6 Maryland at home, along with improving to 3-0 under Pitino in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge after a home victory over Clemson in November.

In 2015-16, the Gophers set a new school single-season record with 313 steals, passing the previous mark of 297 set in 2007-08. The team averaged 74.2 points per game, the highest since the 2001-02 season and the second straight season under head coach Richard Pitino that the Gophers have averaged more than 71 points per game. Two of his players garnered All-Big Ten honorable mentions in guard Andre Hollins (coaches & media) and Maurice Walker (media). In February, the Gophers defeated then-#25 and eventual Final Four team Michigan State in East Lansing for the first time since 1997 (later vacated) – the team's first road win over a top-25 team since 2012.

Pitino came to Gold Country after spending one season at the helm of the Florida International University (FIU) basketball program.

Prior to leading FIU, Pitino served as the Associate Head Coach for one season and an assistant for two other seasons under his father, Rick, at Louisville. In three years overall with the Cardinals, he helped the program to a combined 88-25 record, a pair of NCAA Elite Eight berths (2008 and 2009) and one NCAA Final Four appearance (2012). His efforts also helped the Cards land two of top 15 recruiting classes in his three years (2007-08 and 2008-09). Pitino also spent time as an assistant for two seasons under Billy Donovan at Florida. In his time with the Gators, the club was a combined 50-20 with back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, including reaching the 2011 NCAA Southeast Regional finals before falling to NCAA runner-up Butler.




