## FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

**1** University of Minnesota football begins its 138th season, and fifth under head coach **P.J. Fleck**, Thursday night as it hosts No. 4/4 Ohio State at Huntington Bank Stadium. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. with a national TV audience on FOX.

**2** Minnesota is 96-35-6 all-time in season openers, including wins in four of their last five openers (3-1 under head coach P.J. Fleck). The Golden Gophers are 100-30-7 all-time in home openers with an identical stretch of four wins in their past five home openers (also 3-1 under Fleck). Minnesota is 8-4 in home openers since Huntington Bank Stadium opened in 2009.

**3** For the second straight season, Minnesota opens the year with a Big Ten opponent after facing Michigan last year in a schedule that featured only league action. Thursday's matchup with the Buckeyes will be the 10th time in program history that Minnesota faces a conference foe in the season opener. The Gophers are 2-7 in those previous games, including an 0-2 mark against Ohio State. The Gophers also opened the season with the Buckeyes in 1973 and 1974. Overall, Minnesota is 63-54-8 in Big Ten openers, including a 71-49-5 mark at home.

**4** **Mohamed Ibrahim** is the Big Ten's reigning Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year. He has 13 career 100-yard rushing games, which includes a current streak of eight in a row (2020 Outback Bowl and all seven games in 2020). Ibrahim's eight-game streak is the longest in program history, breaking a tie of seven with former Gopher great **Laurence Maroney**. An All-Big Ten First Team honoree and AP Third-Team All-American last year, Ibrahim ran 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history). He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4). Ibrahim also set a school record with a rushing average of 153.7 yards per game and twice tied a school record with four rushing touchdowns in one game (at Maryland and at Illinois).

**5** The 2021 campaign is the fifth for head coach **P.J. Fleck** at Minnesota. He enters the year with a record of 26-19. In Minnesota football history, only **Henry L. Williams** (42, 1900-03) had more wins in his first four seasons than Fleck's 26. In addition, Fleck's 15 wins in Big Ten play are tied with **Cal Stoll** (1972-75) for the most in a coach's first four years with the Gophers. Overall, Fleck is already ninth in program history for wins, while his .578 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Williams (.786, 1900-21) and **Bernie Bierman** (.716, 1932-41, '45-50).



**Mohamed Ibrahim has run for over 100 yards in each of his last eight games, a school record. He's averaging 152.0 yards per game and has scored 16 touchdowns during the span.**

## FACING OHIO STATE

► Minnesota and Ohio State meet for the 53rd time on Thursday. The Buckeyes hold a 45-7 edge in the series, including 11 straight wins, marking the Gophers' longest active losing streak against one opponent.

► At home, Minnesota is 4-22 against Ohio State, and the Buckeyes have won 13 straight in Minneapolis. Minnesota is looking for its first win at home over OSU since a 35-31 victory in 1981.

► Minnesota has nine Ohioans on the roster: **Austin Beier, Mike Brown-Stephens, Miles Fleming, Conner Keyes, Gage Keys, Thomas Rush, Matthew Trickett, Devon Williams, Donald Willis**. Ohio State has no Minnesotans on its roster.

► Gophers head coach **P.J. Fleck** began his coaching career as an Ohio State graduate assistant in 2006. Cornerbacks coach **Paul Haynes** was at Ohio State from 2005-2011, holding the position of co-defensive coordinator/secondary coach in 2011 after being the secondary coach from 2005-10.

► Thursday's game will mark the fourth time that Minnesota will face a team that played in the previous year's national championship game since the BCS began in 1998. All of the matchups have come against Ohio State, and the Buckeyes have won each of the meetings. First was a 30-7 loss in 2007, followed by a 34-21 setback the following year and a 28-14 defeat in 2015.

## FACING A TOP-5 TEAM

► Ohio State enters Thursday's game ranked No. 4 in the preseason Associated Press poll. It will be the highest-ranked opponent for a Minnesota opener since hosting No. 2 TCU in 2015 and the fourth time the Gophers have opened with an AP preseason top-5 team, three of which will have been against Ohio State.

► Eleven times previously Minnesota has opened with a ranked opponent, going 1-9-1 in those contests with the victory coming over No. 12 Nebraska in 1960.

► Minnesota is 12-45 all-time versus AP top-5 teams, including a 1-6 mark against teams ranked No. 4. The last time the Gophers faced a top-5 team though came in 2019 when they took down No. 5 Penn State in Minneapolis, 31-26, in one of the biggest wins in program annals.

## LAST TIME(S) VS. OHIO STATE

► Minnesota last faced Ohio State on Oct. 13, 2018, falling 30-14 in Columbus to the third-ranked Buckeyes.

► **Mohamed Ibrahim** ran for 157 yards and two touchdowns on 23 carries, while **Zack Annexstad** threw for 218 yards in the loss. **Tyler Johnson** was Annexstad's top target, catching eight passes for 119 yards. Defensively, **Antonio Shenualt** and **Blake Cashman** each tallied a game-high 13 tackles, including 2.0 tackles for loss for Cashman. **Carter Coughlin** added 3.0 tackles for loss with a pair of sacks and a forced fumble.

► Dwayne Haskins threw for 412 yards and three touchdowns for Ohio State. The Buckeyes used two second-half field goals from Blake Haubiel and a late TD pass from Haskins to K.J. Hill to pull away from the Gophers.

► The teams have not met in Minneapolis since a 31-24, Ohio State victory in 2014. It stands as the closest final score in the last 10 games in the series since a three-point OSU win in 2001.

► **David Cobb** ran 27 times for 145 yards and three touchdowns for Minnesota in the loss, while on the other side of the ball **Brian Boddy-Calhoun** forced two turnovers (interception, forced fumble) for the Gophers in the coldest kickoff in the history of Huntington Bank Stadium at 15 degrees. For the Buckeyes, J.T. Barrett threw for three touchdowns and ran for an Ohio State quarterback-record 189 yards and another score.

## MEMORABLE GAMES VS. OSU

► Oct. 14, 2000: **Ron Johnson** caught eight passes for 163 yards and a touchdown in Minnesota's 29-17 upset of No. 6 Ohio State in Columbus. The Buckeyes managed just 200 yards of total offense.

► Nov. 7, 1981: **Mike Hohensee** set school records with 37 completions and 67 attempts, while throwing for 444 yards and five touchdowns as Minnesota upset No. 18 Ohio State, 35-31, in the final season at Memorial Stadium.

► Oct. 19, 1940: In a matchup of top 15 teams, No. 7 Minnesota defeated No. 15 Ohio State, 13-7, in Columbus en route to the program's fifth national title

## THURSDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

► Minnesota is opening the season on a Thursday night, something it has done 12 times previously in its history, all since 2001. In fact, the Golden Gophers opened on a Thursday for eight straight seasons from 2012-19.

► The Gophers are 18-9 all-time in program history on Thursdays, including 10-2 in season openers, and have won four straight games on the day, including all three contests under **P.J. Fleck**.

► Minnesota has a .661 winning percentage in its history when playing on days other than Saturday, going 54-27-3. Under Fleck, it is 7-2 on non-Saturdays.

## O-LINE DEPTH AMONG THE BEST

► Minnesota enters the 2021 season with one of the deepest offensive lines in the entire country as 13 members of the unit have appeared in at least one game and 10 have started at least one contest (page 16).

► In fact, the Golden Gophers' offensive line has more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 180. The next closest squad is Miami (FL) with 159, while Michigan State (151) is third. Only three other squads have more than 140 combined starts.

► In addition, the 10 individuals on the line with starts at the FBS level are the most of any program in the country.

► Redshirt senior **Conner Olson** leads the team by starting all 45 games he's played in, putting him six games shy of matching the school record of 51 games played held by long snapper **Payton Jordahl** (2015-18). Fellow redshirt seniors **Blaise Andries** and **Sam Schlueter** have each started 33 contests. Those three have also started at least two games at multiple positions. In addition, Utah State transfer **Karter Shaw** (19), **Daniel Faalele** (19), **Curtis Dunlap Jr.** (13) and **John Micheal Schmitz** (10) have all started double-digit games in their careers.

## MORGAN'S NUMBERS STAND OUT

► Redshirt senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is back for his third full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's already proven himself to be one of the best signal-callers to ever wear the Maroon and Gold.

► Morgan is 18-8 as a starter and has completed 405 passes (seventh most in school history) on 653 attempts (eighth most in school history) for 6,028 yards (sixth most in school history) in his career. His career completion percentage of .620 ranks first in school history and his 46 career touchdown passes rank fourth.

► Here's how Morgan compares with the top five passers (by yardage) in program history through three seasons.

► Morgan owns 11 Minnesota season and game records and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-Big Ten Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.

## AUTMAN-BELL NEXT WR UP

► Senior **Chris Autman-Bell** was Minnesota's No. 3 receiver two years ago behind **Tyler Johnson** and **Rashod Bateman**, and the No. 2 target last year before Bateman opted out. But with those two now in the NFL, Autman-Bell is poised to be the team's next top target.

► Autman-Bell has played in 33 career games and has made 78 catches for 1,250 yards (21st in school history) and six touchdowns. He enters the 2021 season with an average of 16.0 yards per catch, good for a tie for 10th in team history. He has also caught at least one pass in 31 games and has made one catch in 27 straight games, tied for the eighth longest active streak in the FBS.

► In seven games last year, he caught 22 passes for 430 yards and one score. That came after recording 28 catches for 371 yards and five touchdowns in 2019 and 28 catches (fourth all-time for a Minnesota freshman) for 449 yards (third all-time for a Minnesota freshman) in 2018 (also led team with 16.03 yards/catch).

## TOP NINE TACKLERS BACK

► Senior linebacker **Mariano Sori-Marin** returns as the team's top tackler from a year ago, registering 54 stops in seven games in 2020. He also made 1.5 tackles for loss, broke up three passes and one forced fumble. His top performance last season came at Nebraska when he recorded a career-high 18 tackles and forced a fumble en route to winning Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors.

► With Sori-Marin leading the way, Minnesota's top nine tacklers from a year ago are all back in 2021, including senior defensive lineman **Boye Mafe**, who led the squad with 5.5 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks last season.

► In the defensive backfield, junior **Tyler Nubin** was second on the team a year ago with 41 tackles, and he was one of five Gophers with an interception. Senior **Jordan Howden** ranked third with 37 tackles, while sixth-year senior **Coney Durr** was fourth with 29 stops in addition to his team-leading five pass breakups. Durr also had an interception.

## GRAD TRANSFERS BOOST D

► While the Gophers' defense has a lot returning in 2021, three grad transfers are looking to provide an instant impact this season.

► Linebacker **Jack Gibbens** spent the past four seasons at the FCS level with Abilene Christian where he totaled 258 tackles, 22.5 tackles for loss, seven sacks and five interceptions. He was the team's leading tackler this past season and was second in both 2019 and 2018. Gibbens' accolades at ACU included being a 2020 Campbell Trophy Finalist and 2019 First Team CoSIDA Academic All-American.

► After two seasons at Iowa Western, defensive lineman **Val Martin** comes to Minnesota following three years at North Carolina State where he made 29 tackles in 22 games. In 2020, Martin played in eight games and recorded 12 tackles with one forced fumble.

► Fellow defensive lineman **Niles Pinckney** brings a championship pedigree to the Golden Gophers after being a part of two national titles in five years at Clemson. Pinckney was credited with 98 tackles (13.5 for loss), three sacks, a forced fumble and three fumble recoveries in 1,125 defensive snaps over 55 career games (15 starts) from 2017-20 for the Tigers.

## NEW SPECIAL TEAMS FACES

► The Gophers return redshirt junior kicker **Brock Walker** (2-3 FG in 2020), sophomore kicker **Dragan Kesich** (24 kickoffs in 2020) and sophomore punter **Marc Crawford** (37.8 avg. in 2020) for 2021, but they also welcome in three transfer specialists.

► Redshirt senior **Will Mobley** spent the past four seasons at Temple where he was 26-35 (74.3%) on field goals with a career long of 44 yards. He was also 99-104 (95.2%) on extra points, including a Temple-record 51 straight made in 2018.

► **Daniel Sparks** was a freshman last year at Louisiana-Monroe, playing in all 10 games for the Warhawks. He averaged 44.6 yards on 30 punts and also kicked off 33 times with six touchbacks.

► Senior **Matthew Trickett** comes to Minnesota after three seasons at Kent State where he earned All-MAC First Team honors in 2018 and was the MAC Special Teams Player of the Year in 2019. He made 47-57 (82.5%) field goals and was 94-95 on PATs for 235 career points. In 2019, he tied for the NCAA lead and set a Kent State record with 29 made field goals.

## MAFE, FAALELE ON 'FREAKS' LIST

► Seniors **Boye Mafe** and **Daniel Faalele** both appeared on the "2021 College Football Freaks List" from The Athletic's Bruce Feldman.

► Mafe came in at No. 17 of 101 players listed. "He's put on more than 50 pounds since arriving at Minnesota and weighs 263 now, up from 260 last year," Feldman wrote. "Mafe (4.5 sacks in six games in 2020) says he did a lot of single-leg work this offseason in hopes of improving his footwork." Among Mafe's weight room numbers listed by Feldman are a vertical jump of 40.5 inches, a broad jump of 10-6, a 4.57 40 and power cleaning 400 pounds."

► **Tanner Morgan** has 46 career touchdown passes, putting him four away from joining **Adam Weber** (72), **Bryan Cupito** (55) and **Asad Abdul Khaliq** (55) as the only Gopher QBs to reach at least 50 career touchdown passes.

► With 25 career pass breakups, **Coney Durr** is six PBUs short of tying **Trumaine Banks**, **Ukee Dozier** and **Michael Lehan** for the school record of 31.

## 2X ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

► In mid-July, offensive lineman **Blaise Andries** was named to the 2020 Academic All-America Division I Football First Team selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). This honor recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom.

► Andries, who is majoring in Mathematics and is an aspiring actuary, is a repeat honoree after being named Second Team last season. He is Minnesota's first repeat selection since **Sam Renner**, who was named Second Team in both 2018 and 2019.

► Andries was named Academic All-Big Ten in 2020, 2019 and 2018 and was selected All-Big Ten Third Team in 2020 and 2019.

## WELCOME TO HUNTINGTON

► In late June, the University of Minnesota Board of Regents approved renaming the University's on-campus football stadium in Minneapolis from TCF Bank Stadium to Huntington Bank Stadium.

► Huntington completed its merger with TCF in June 2021, creating a powerhouse Midwest bank that ranks in the top 25 nationally and top 10 regionally. Huntington will continue to have a significant presence in Minnesota through a large operations center and 80 branches within the Twin Cities.

► Minnesota previously played home games at TCF Bank Stadium from 2009-20. The Gophers are 49-34 at the venue, including a 41-19 mark at home in its last 60 games.

## D FINISHES STRONG IN 2020

► After a slow start to the 2020 season, the defense under **Joe Rossi** clamped down over the final five games, giving the unit momentum heading into 2021.

► In back-to-back losses to Michigan and Maryland to open the season, the Gophers allowed 47 points, 578 yards of total offense, over 309 yards passing and nearly 270 rushing yards per contest.

► However, over the final five games of the season Minnesota cut its points allowed in half, took over 85 yards off its rushing yards allowed and over 140 yards off its passing yards allowed. The team's total defense figure dropped by more than 225 yards over its final five games and its yards per play allowed fell by over 3.5 yards.

► The Gophers held three of their final five opponents to 20 points or less, four to less than 350 yards of total offense, four to less than 200 yards rushing and four to less than 150 yards passing.

## TWO GOPHERS DRAFTED

► Minnesota had two players selected in the 2021 NFL Draft. Baltimore took **Rashod Bateman** with the 27th overall pick, making him the first Minnesota receiver ever to be taken in the first round and the first Gopher selected in the first round since **Laurence Maroney** was taken 21st overall by New England in 2006.

► On day two, **Benjamin St-Juste** was selected in the third round by Washington with the 74th overall pick. He was the third Minnesota defensive back drafted in the last two years, joining **Antoine Winfield Jr.** (No. 45 to Tampa Bay in 2020) and **Chris Williamson** (No. 247 to the New York Giants in 2020).

► The 2021 draft was the first time that Minnesota had two top-75 selections since 1978 when three linebackers were taken in the top 43 picks.

## COACHING EXPERIENCE

► Four of Minnesota's assistant coaches have head coaching experience. **Mike Sanford Jr.** (OC/QBs) was the head coach at Western Kentucky from 2017-18, while **Paul Haynes** (Cornerbacks) led Kent State from 2013-17. **Joe Harasymiak** (Defensive Backs, Safeties and Co-DC) was the head coach at Maine from 2016-18 and was named the 2018 FCS Coach of the Year. **Clay Patterson** (Tight Ends) was the head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College from 2016-17, earning conference coach of the year honors in 2017.

## BACK TO FULL CAPACITY

► Gopher Athletics has announced that it plans to operate at full capacity for live sporting events when teams return to competition for the 2021-22 academic year. The first ticketed-sports slated to welcome full capacity at its venues are soccer, volleyball and football.

► Minnesota also anticipates a return to traditional fan activities surrounding its football games, which includes tailgating, the team's Ski-U-March arrival, Gopher Garden activities, performances from the University of Minnesota Marching Band, spirit squads and more.

► "We are excited to safely welcome fans back into our venues," said Director of Athletics **Mark Coyle**. "We will follow all University, local and state guidelines, and we are looking forward to our fans once again providing a tremendous advantage for our Gopher student-athletes when they compete on campus. We are so thankful for our fans, donors and sponsors who helped provide necessary resources for our student-athletes last season, but we missed seeing and hearing them at games. We cannot wait to welcome everyone back to campus in a few months, while still providing our fans with a safe and enjoyable experience."

## HUNTINGTON BANK STADIUM

- Minnesota opened Huntington Bank Stadium with a 20-13 win against Air Force in 2009. All-time, the Gophers are 49-34 at Huntington, including a 41-19 mark in their last 60 games and a 17-10 record under Head Coach P.J. Fleck.
- Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher Hockey, MNF, an NHL game, international soccer, MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings and Minnesota United also played seasons on campus while their stadiums were being constructed.
- Upon completion, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960.
- The Gopher locker room is a state of the art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in the country. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.

## HEAD COACH // FIFTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 40, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 56-41 and is 26-19 at Minnesota.

While at Minnesota, Fleck has guided Minnesota to its most wins (11 in 2019) since 1904, has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), six Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries twice, Sam Renner twice, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 194 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had eight players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962. The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962. Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history. Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999. The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same span.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck, which included a school record 3.33 cumulative team GPA after the 2020-21 academic year.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988. Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts. Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.
