FALCONS SOAR TO THE LAND OF 10,000 LAKES
• Bowling Green State University returns to the road to face the Minnesota Golden Gophers of the Big Ten Conference.

- FIVE TOP STORYLINES**
- Bowling Green held total possession of the ball for 21:35 in the second half against Murray State, including for 12:09 in a decisive third quarter. Minnesota is No. 4 in the nation in time of possession, holding the ball for an average of 37:10 per game.
 - LB **Darren Anders** is one of two players in the nation this season with 25+ tackles (29), one interception, one fumble recovery, one forced fumble and one sack. Utah's Devin Lloyd is the other player. Anders currently ranks No. 17 in the nation and No. 2 in the MAC with 9.7 tackles per game.
 - QB **Matt McDonald** is No. 14 in the nation and No. 2 in the MAC in completion percentage. He also ranks No. 1 in the MAC in completions per game, passing yards and passing yards per game. McDonald is 3 in the MAC in total offense.
 - WR **Austin Osborne** is No. 1 in the MAC and No. 16 in the nation with 7.0 receptions per game. The Washington transfer entered the season with one career reception and currently leads BGSU with 21 this season.
 - S **Davon Ferguson** is the only player in the nation that is averaging 7.0+ tackles per game (8.3), has at least 2.0+ tackles for loss (3.5) and has defended at least four passes (4).



CB Davon Ferguson is No. 17 in the nation with 5.7 solo tackles per game.

- This is the 13th-annual Coach to Cure MD effort and all American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) members will wear a Coach to Cure MD logo patch during games this week. Last year they took a hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Coach to Cure MD is a partnership between the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy (PPMD), the largest nonprofit organization in the United States focused entirely on Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy, the leading childhood genetic killer of young men.

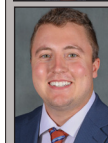

THE FALCONS

The nickname Falcons was chosen for BGSU athletic teams in 1927. It was suggested by the sports editor of the Daily Sentinel Tribune, who thought the nickname was fitting because it was indicative of a powerful bird that was small in stature, its coloring represented the school colors, and, like the athlete, the falcon must go through a long period of training before battle. Freddie and Frieda Falcon are the campus mascots.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

The historical story behind how BGSU began using Brown and Orange as its school colors dates back to 1914.

Dr. Williams, the university's first President, gathered a group of people which included a Dr. L.L. Winslow from Industrial Arts as a selection committee for the school's new colors. While on an interurban (or trolley) ride to Toledo, Dr. Winslow sat behind a woman wearing a large hat adorned with beautiful brown and orange feathers. It is unclear whether or not she ever actually gave him a few of these feathers from her hat, however, he was so interested in the color scheme of the pair that he convinced the committee to approve the combination of Brown and Orange.

INSPIRATION TO THE CLEVELAND BROWNS

It was early in the calendar year of 1946 and Browns general manager/head coach Paul Brown was scouring Ohio, looking for a training camp site for that summer on which the team could get ready for its inaugural season in the start-up All-America Football Conference.

His travels took him to Bowling Green and Bowling Green State University. Brown was interested in the school because it was far enough away from Cleveland that he could sequester his team there away from all the noise and chatter of the big city, but close enough that the Browns, when they needed to, could get back to Cleveland in a decent amount of time (two hours-plus at a point in history before the existence of the Ohio Turnpike).

Brown was getting a tour when he stopped in an athletic building. What caught his attention was a framed BGSU football jersey on a wall. He really liked the school's orange-and-brown color combination and the rest is history.

SONGS OF BGSU

President Ralph McDonald opened a five-year contest during which each year a college song was chosen and presented on Honors Day. At the end of the five-year period, a committee convened to listen to all five winners. Edith Ludwig Bell's composition was publicly presented as The Alma Mater of BGSU at the Golden Anniversary Convocation on May 19, 1960.

Before 1948, there was not an official fight song for campus. The Commoners, a men's independent group, created a contest for a new fight song. Following the students' lead, campus officials asked the music department to develop an official fight song. Dr. Wayne Bohrstedt, assistant professor of music from 1947-53, composed the current song, "Forward Falcons." The words were written by Sidney Freeman, a graduate assistant in the English department.

Brought to Bowling Green over half a century ago by original SICSIC member and World War II veteran Gilbert Fox, "Ay Ziggy Zoomba" is BGSU's unofficial fight song. In 1946, Fox, an Army Air Corps bombardier who served in Italy, brought his interpretation based upon a Zulu war chant back to the University.

YOU ARE NOT FORGOTTEN

Bowling Green has a permanently unoccupied seat in Doyt Perry Stadium to honor the tens of thousands of military personnel who are or were prisoners of war (POW) or have been declared missing in action (MIA).

POW/MIA Chair of Honor is a national program designed to remember prisoners of war and those missing in action. The chair was permanently installed in the stadium in 2014 to help visitors and fans remember that even though our service members are not with us, they are not forgotten.

BOWLING GREEN VS. MINNESOTA

- Minnesota holds a narrow 2-1 advantage in the all-time series. BGSU's lone win came the last time these teams played in Minneapolis. The game went to overtime at the Metrodome in 2007. It is the last overtime game BGSU has played.
- The last meeting in 2008 served as the first time a Big Ten Conference team played at BGSU's Doyt Perry Stadium.
- In BGSU's lone win in 2007: After building a 21-0 halftime lead over Minnesota the Falcons trailed 24-21 with 2:12 remaining in the fourth quarter the last time BGSU traveled to Minnesota. Tyler Sheehan and the Falcons marched down the field to set up a 35-yard field goal, which Sinisa Vrvilo converted.
- After surrendering a touchdown in overtime the Falcons answered back when Sheehan found a wide open Marques Parks for a nine-yard score. Electing to go for two instead of the extra point, Sheehan found a streaking Freddie Barnes for the score to give BGSU the 32-31 win.
- In his first career start Sheehan was 34-of-51 for 388 yards and two scores. He also caught a 24-yard touchdown from Corey Partridge. Barnes finished the game with six catches for 99 yards, while Partridge chipped in with 52 yards on six catches as well.

BOWLING GREEN VS. B1G

- Bowling Green is 8-20 all-time against current members of the Big Ten Conference, which includes games against Indiana (1-1), Maryland (1-1), Michigan (0-2), Michigan State (0-3), Minnesota (1-2), Northwestern (2-1), Ohio State (0-5), Penn State (0-2), Purdue (3-0) and Wisconsin (0-3).
- Bowling Green is scheduled to play at Michigan in 2023, at Penn State in 2024, at Minnesota in 2025 and at Ohio State in 2027. The 2027 Ohio State game is a reschedule from the 2020 meeting that was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

BOWLING GREEN - UMN CONNECTIONS

- Minnesota head coach P.J. Fleck is no stranger to Bowling Green and the MAC. He coached four years at Western Michigan and played at Northern Illinois. While at NIU, he threw an interception in Bowling Green's 34-18 win over then-No. 12 NIU in 2003. ESPN's College GameDay was on the BGSU's campus for that day.
- Minnesota's offensive line coach and run game coordinator Brian Callahan has coached in the MAC at Akron and Western Michigan.
- Minnesota cornerbacks coach Paul Haynes got his college coaching career started in 1994 as a graduate assistant at Bowling Green. A Kent State alum, he was the head coach at his alma mater from 2013-17.
- Minnesota co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach Matt Simon played at NIU and coached in the MAC at NIU and at Western Michigan.
- Minnesota defensive line coach Chad Wilt worked at Liberty and Virginia with Bowling Green assistant AD for strategic communications, Vincent Briedis. The first two months Briedis was on the job at UVA in 2009 he lived with Wilt in Charlottesville as he looked for a place to live.

Last Meeting

Minnesota's Adam Weber threw three touchdown passes and made a nifty grab of his own in the fourth quarter to help Minnesota beat Bowling Green 42-17 the last time these teams met.

Lined up in the shotgun on third down, Weber leaped high to grab an errant snap, spun around and flung a 14-yard pass to Ben Kuznia, keeping a drive alive.

Five plays later, Weber threw a 28-yard touchdown pass to the diving Eric Decker that put Minnesota ahead 28-17 with 10:41 left in the game.

The Gophers then turned a pair of Bowling Green turnovers into two touchdowns, sealing the victory.

FERGUSON MAKING HIS MARK

- CB Davon Ferguson is making his mark after coming to Bowling Green as a transfer from Kansas last spring.
- Ferguson made 2.0 tackles for a loss and broke up two passes against Murray State last time out. He was the only player in the nation this past weekend to accomplish such a feat and is one of five to do so this season. Tyler Bride (Georgia Southern), Nate Landman (Colorado), Devon Witherspoon (Illinois) and Theo Jackson (Tennessee) are the other players to do so through the first three weeks.
- He is currently No. 17 in the nation and No. 2 in the MAC with 5.7 solo tackles per game. He is also No. 2 in the MAC and No. 25 in the nation with 1.3 passes defended per game.

OSBORNE BECOMING A KEY TARGET

- WR Austin Osborne made eight catches in his Bowling Green debut at Tennessee. Osborne, a transfer from Washington, entered the 2021 season with one career reception. He was high school teammates with Bowling Green quarterback Matt McDonald at Mission Viejo High School in Southern California.
- Osborne followed up his BGSU debut with seven catches against South Alabama and six more against Murray State.
- His 69 receiving yards against Murray State are a career high.
- Osborne is No. 16 in the nation and No. 1 in the MAC with 7.0 receptions per game.

MCDONALD SETTLING IN

- After playing all of 2020 injured, QB Matt McDonald is settling in.
- Through three games McDonald is No. 1 in the MAC in passing yards (716), passing yards per game (238.7) and completions per game (23.33). He is No. 3 in total offense (231.3).

STARTING THE HALF HOT

- For the first time this year, Bowling Green scored on its opening drive of the game and second half against Murray State. Both went for touchdowns. This was the first time in the Scot Loeffler era that Bowling Green scored on its opening drives in both the first and second halves of the same game.
- The last time a BG team scored on its opening drive in the first half and second half in the same game was the 2017 season at Kent State. Both went for touchdowns then too.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

- So far through three games there have been 12 different Falcons that have made at least one reception. Compared to 2020, only eight Falcons caught a pass, which was down from 14 in 2019.
- BGSU is averaging 7.3 different receivers a game that have made at least one catch.

MORE CAREER HIGHS CAME IN THE SOUTH ALABAMA GAME

- Four Falcons recorded career highs in either receptions, receiving yards, long reception, or all three against South Alabama.
- TE Christian Sims had a career-high eight receptions on a career-high 76 yards and his 51-yard reception in the third quarter was a career long.
- WR Tyrone Broden made his season debut and caught three passes for 76 yards and had a 47-yard reception. All were career bests. He made six catches against Murray State to double his previous career high.
- RB Taron Keith had career highs in catches (2), receiving yards (55) and long reception (44) as well against South Alabama.
- TE Andrew Bench, who moved from defense to offensive this offseason, caught his first career pass for 33 yards and touchdown in the third quarter.

TAYLOR MAKES IMPRESSIVE BOWLING GREEN DEBUT

- CB Devin Taylor made his Bowling Green debut at Tennessee and defended three passes.
- Taylor transferred to BG late in August from Virginia Tech.
- Taylor was an FCS All-American at Illinois State after spending the 2020 season as a starting cornerback at Virginia Tech.

ZIMMERLY MAKES DEBUT FOR FALCONS

- C Cade Zimmerly earned his first career start at Tennessee. He is the only offensive or defensive true freshman walk-on to start a game. Georgia Southern has a placekicker Britton Williams that started on special teams.

DEBUTS AT TENNESSEE

- Thirteen Falcons made collegiate debuts at Tennessee: OG Gabriel Brown, OG Matt Fortner, RB Jamal Johnson**, CB Deshawn Jones Jr., DL Dierre Kelly**, LB Avi McGary, WR Jaedyn McKinstry, LB Diego Neri**, RB Jaison Patterson**, LB Charles Rosser, DL Ali Saad, RG Malone VanGorder, C Cade Zimmerly**

- Six Falcons made their first career starts: WR Caven Croom, WR Austin Osborne, RB Terion Stewart, DL Billie Roberts, RG Malone VanGorder, C Cade Zimmerly
- Six receivers made their first career receptions against the Vols. Those six receivers collected 16 of Matt McDonald's career-high 25 completions.

LOEFFLER QUARTERBACKS AND THE LOMBARDITROPHY

• Bowling Green head coach Scot Loeffler has coached seven quarterbacks who went on to play in the NFL. Those seven quarterbacks have gone on to win a combined nine Super Bowl championships (Tom Brady - 7; Brian Griese - 1; Chad Henne - 1).

LOEFFLER NAMES CAPTAINS

• Bowling Green head coach Scot Loeffler announced that QB Matt McDonald, DL Karl Brooks and LS James Carolan were named captains, as voted on by their teammates.

COACH LOEFFLER AND COMPANY ENTER YEAR NUMBER THREE

- BGSU Director of Athletics Bob Moosbrugger named veteran Scot Loeffler as the 20th head coach in Bowling Green history on Nov. 28, 2018.
- Although the 2019 season marked Loeffler's first as a head coach, the Ohio native brought a wealth of high-level college football experience with him to Bowling Green. Loeffler has served as the offensive coordinator at Boston College, Virginia Tech, Auburn and Temple. He has also coached at Florida, his alma mater Michigan, and Central Michigan -- as well as the Detroit Lions.
- Loeffler has coached seven quarterbacks who went on to play in the NFL, a list that includes: Tom Brady, Tim Tebow, Brian Griese, Chad Henne, Drew Henson, John Navarre and Logan Thomas. His teams have qualified for 17 bowl games, including coaching for Michigan's 1997 Rose Bowl team that won the national championship.
- Cornerbacks coach Eric Lewis was elevated to defensive coordinator after the retirement of Brian VanGorder. Bob Ligashesky returns to Bowling Green as the special teams coordinator after spending 12 years in the NFL and the last three at Illinois. Ligashesky previously was at Bowling Green from 1991-99. Cato June joins the staff in 2021 as the run game coordinator and the outside linebackers coach. June, who won Super Bowl XLI with the Colts, has coached in college at Howard and most recently at UMass.
- A few position shifts took place among the rest of the coaching staff, who all return for year number three with Loeffler. OC Terry Malone (previously offensive line) is now coaching running backs, Chris Hedden (previously tight ends) is on the offensive line and Greg Nosal (previously running backs) has moved to tight ends.

NFL QUARTERBACK PEDIGREE

- Bowling Green and LSU are the only two programs in the nation that have at least two quarterbacks that are the sons of former NFL starting quarterbacks.
- Bowling Green has Matt McDonald, son of former Cleveland Brown starting quarterback Paul McDonald. BGSU also has Jayden George, son of former NFL starter (Colts, Falcons, Raiders, Vikings, Washington) Jeff George.
- LSU has Max Johnson, son of Brad Johnson, and Garrett Nussmeier, son of Doug Nussmeier.
- Matt McDonald's father, Paul, led USC to a win over Joe Montana and Notre Dame in 1978 at the Coliseum. McDonald later faced Montana in the NFL, but his Browns fell to the 49ers in 1984.

BGSU BRINGS IN TRANSFERS FROM THE PORTAL

- Bowling Green welcomes seven transfers from "Power 5" FBS schools this season, which includes: Bryce Brand (West Virginia), Davon Ferguson (Kansas), Jayden George (Alabama), Tommy Guajardo (Michigan State), Austin Osborne (Washington), Ali Saad (Minnesota) and Devin Taylor (Virginia Tech).
- Osborne was the primary receiving target in high school for BGSU quarterback Matt McDonald at Mission Viejo High School in California. The PrepStart All-American caught 36 passes for 961 yards and 16 touchdowns as a junior during McDonald's senior season at Mission Viejo.
- Taylor was an FCS All-American at Illinois State after spending the 2020 season as a starting cornerback at Virginia Tech.
- Ferguson appeared in 20 games over the past three seasons at Kansas. He made 90 tackles, 31 tackles for loss and picked off one pass for the Jayhawks.

YOUTH ON THE ROSTER

- Bowling Green has 71 combined student-athletes from the classes of 2020 and 2021, which ranks No. 3 in the nation.
- 67.6 percent of the roster was in high school the last time BGSU played a non-conference game.

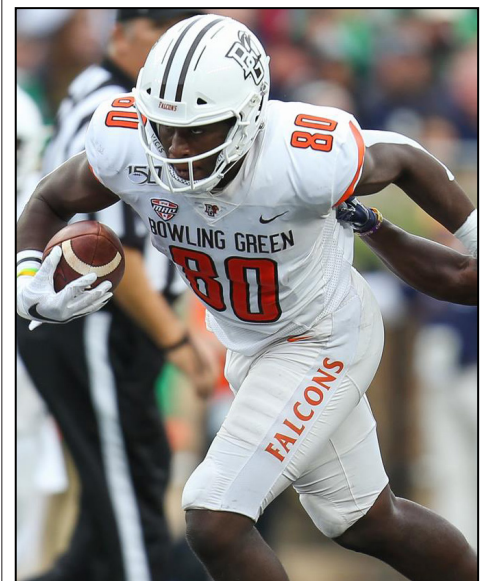
- TE Levi Gazarek is also a RHP on the Bowling Green baseball team.

FRESHMEN STARTING IN 2020

- Eight players with freshman eligibility status in 2020 made starts and 20 true freshmen saw game action.
- Among FBS schools, BGSU's 20 true freshmen on the field was tied for the sixth most in the country. It was the highest total in the Mid-American Conference.

ANDERS IN THE MIDDLE

- Junior Darren Anders returns in 2021 after he made the most of his first opportunities to shine in 2020.
- Anders led BGSU with 55 tackles in 2020 and his 11 tackles per game ranked No. 12 in the nation. Of the 11 tacklers ahead of him, all but one were juniors or seniors, making Anders the second-most productive sophomore (or freshman) tackler in the country in 2020.
- After playing in 11 games as a true freshman in 2019 (including one start), Anders truly had his first chance as a keystone figure defensively in the 2020 season opener at Toledo and he made the most of his chance.
- He led the Falcons with 11 tackles and also recovered an early third-quarter fumble that was forced by teammate Sy Dabney. Anders added a team-best 1.5 tackles for loss.
- Anders added nine more tackles against Kent State, before posting a career-best 14 against Buffalo and then 13 at Ohio. In the season finale, he posted eight more against Akron. That gave him 55 tackles on the season, almost tripling his total of 20 from his freshman campaign.

HEY COLLEGE GRADUATE!

- Despite the youth on Bowling Green's roster, there are seven players who already hold degrees from college.
- LB Bryce Brand, LS James Carolan, CB Davon Ferguson, PK Nate Needham, WR Austin Osborne, P Matt Naranjo and CB Devin Taylor all have bachelor degrees in hand.
- Carolan, Needham and Naranjo graduated from Bowling Green, while Brand (West Virginia), Ferguson (Kansas), Osborne (Washington) and Taylor (Virginia Tech) all came to BGSU as graduate transfers.

SENIORS USING THE FREE COVID-19 YEAR

- Bowling Green's top-three specialists – punter Matt Naranjo, kicker Nate Needham and long snapper James Carolan – all return for their second senior seasons in 2021. All three are using the extra COVID year granted by the NCAA and will officially exhaust their eligibility after the year.
- Needham is 16-for-26 on field goal attempts at BGSU, including 5-for-7 in 2020. He is also 61-of-63 on extra-point attempts.
- Naranjo currently ranks eighth all-time at BGSU, averaging 40.4 yards per punt. He had a season-long punt of 63 yards in 2020 and five of his 19 punts last year landed inside the 20. He also had four 50+ yard punts in 2020.
- Carolan has played in 40 games over four seasons for the Orange and Brown and has been a steady snapper for the Falcons during his career.
- CB Devin Taylor is also using his COVID year in 2021 after spending three years at Illinois State (2017-19) and last year at Virginia Tech.

TERION LOOKS TO BUILD UPON SOLID ROOKIE CAMPAIGN

- RB Terion Stewart earned his first career carry in the fourth quarter against Kent State in the second game of the 2020 season. He made the most of those chances, toting the rock 14 times for 162 yards and two touchdowns.
- The 162 rushing yards were the most for a BGSU true freshman in a game since Willie Geter rushed for 203 against the same Kent State program in 2007.
- That yardage total was the most for any BGSU running back since the program's all-time leading rusher Travis Greene had 183 against Northern Illinois in the 2015 MAC Championship game.
- Stewart followed up that performance with 42 more yards and two more fourth-quarter touchdowns against Buffalo. In the season finale against Akron, Stewart carried the ball 14 times for 91 yards and is now the team's leading rusher with 295 yards.
- Stewart had a knack for scoring touchdowns at Sandusky High School, posting more than 90 in his career.

BGSU ATHLETIC TRAINER FOR FOOTBALL IS ONE OF A FEW

- BGSU's Dani Coppes is one of 12 women at the FBS level that is their school's sports medicine department's primary care provider for football.

DOYT PERRY STADIUM

Doyt Perry Stadium is named in honor of the man who led Bowling Green to a 77-11-5 record in his 10 years as the head coach of the Falcons.

Doyt L. Perry was simply one of the greatest football coaches of his day. His .855 winning percentage over 10 seasons in the 1950s and 1960s remains one of the highest in football history. In fact, Perry is sixth all-time behind Bob Reade (Augustana), Knute Rockne (Notre Dame), Frank Leahy (Notre Dame), Larry Kehres (Mount Union) and Jeff Devaney (Trinity, Conn.) in winning percentage among coaches with at least 10 years of service on the collegiate level. Perry served as the BGSU athletic director for seven years (1965-71) after stepping down as football coach.

Bowling Green won the first game ever played in Perry Stadium, defeating Dayton, 13-0, on Oct. 1, 1966. The football facility at BGSU was formally dedicated as Doyt L. Perry Stadium on Sept. 26, 1992.

Bowling Green has played 280 games in the venue. BGSU's all-time record at Doyt Perry Stadium stands at 170-104-6.

Scot Loeffler

Head Coach • Third Season

Scot Loeffler begins his third season as the head coach at Bowling Green State University in 2020. The 20th head coach of the Bowling Green football program, Loeffler came to BGSU after serving as Deputy Head Coach and Offensive Coordinator at Boston College.

In his first season at Bowling Green, the Falcons built a foundation for success. Although BGSU went just 3-9 overall and 2-6 in MAC play, the program began to turn the corner in many ways. Most notably, the Falcons defeated rival Toledo 20-7 to end a nine-game losing streak in the Battle of I-75.

In BGSU's three victories (over Toledo, Akron and Morgan State), the Falcons outscored their opponents 101-16, highlighting explosive offensive performances and stifling defensive efforts. Bowling Green held Morgan State to just 70 yards of offense and Akron to 100 yards. BGSU gave up just one touchdown in those three victories.

Loeffler's coaching career, which spans back to his time as a student assistant at Michigan during the 1996 season, includes stops at Michigan, Central Michigan, Florida, Temple, Auburn, Virginia Tech and Boston College. He also spent a year coaching quarterbacks for the Detroit Lions.

Loeffler has coached seven quarterbacks who went on to play in the NFL – Tom Brady, Tim Tebow, Brian Griese, Chad Henne, Drew Henson, John Navarre and Logan Thomas. He has also directed a potent rushing attack behind sophomore AJ Dillon, who was 12th nationally in rushing yards per game in 2018. Dillon was the ACC Rookie of the Year in 2017 and the nation's second-leading rusher among freshmen.

In 2018, Boston College scored 40+ points in four of its first five games, including an average of 52.7 points in consecutive wins over Massachusetts, Holy Cross and Wake Forest. The Eagles then defeated Temple 45-35 and Louisville 38-20. The team ended the regular season at 7-5 overall.

Including the 201 season, Loeffler's teams will have played in 15 bowl games in the past 17 seasons he has been a college coach.

In 2017, Loeffler's offense posted 35+ points in three consecutive games for the first time in 15 years at Boston College. The team scored 40+ points in consecutive conference games for the first time in the program's Big East and ACC history. The rushing offense climbed from 96th to 25th in the country and the Eagles were one of the faster teams in the nation, ranking 18th nationally in total plays.

In 2016, his first year on staff at Boston College, the Eagles won a bowl game for the first time in nine years.

Prior to his tenure at Boston College, Loeffler served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Frank Beamer at Virginia Tech from 2013-15. He mentored Logan Thomas, who finished his collegiate career by breaking career records for passing yards, attempts, touchdown passes and rushing touchdowns by a quarterback. He oversaw a trio of wide receivers who became the first group in Virginia Tech history to each record 40 or more receptions in a season.

As the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Auburn in 2012, Loeffler mentored Tre Mason, a 1000-yard rusher who became the first non-quarterback to lead Auburn in total offense since Bo Jackson in 1985.

Loeffler guided Temple to the seventh-best rushing average in the nation as offensive coordinator in 2011 and running back Bernard Pierce ranked sixth nationally, including 107 yards on the ground in Doyt L. Perry Stadium in a 13-10 BGSU victory. That team went on to win the program's first bowl game since 1979.

Prior to his time at Temple, he was quarterbacks coach at Florida under former BGSU head coach Urban Meyer, helping the unit to the best pass efficiency in the nation in 2009. He guided Tebow in his final season in Gainesville as he passed for 2,895 yards and 21 touchdowns. Tebow graduated from Florida with five NCAA, 14 SEC and 28 school record.

In 2008, Loeffler worked with the Detroit Lions' quarterbacks, following his tenure at Michigan. From 2002-07, he coached quarterbacks for the Wolverines. Chad Henne became the first true freshman quarterback to lead his team to a Big Ten title and start in a BCS game, while John Navarre became Michigan's first All-Big Ten first team quarterback since 1997.

Along with his time at Temple, Loeffler has familiarity in the Mid-American Conference as he was Central Michigan's quarterbacks coach from 2000-01. Prior to that, he was a graduate assistant and student assistant at Michigan, working with Brady and Griese. He was part of the Wolverines' undefeated national championship season in 1997.

A native of Barberton, Ohio and Barberton High School, Loeffler played quarterback at Michigan from 1993-96. A 1998 graduate of Michigan, Loeffler earned his undergraduate degree in history with a minor in political science.

Loeffler is married to Amie, who holds an undergraduate degree in chemistry from Bowling Green in 1999 and a graduate degree in chemistry in 2005. The couple has three children – Luke, Alexis and Mary Elizabeth.

DID YOU KNOW?

• Jayden George is the son of former NFL quarterback Jeff George. His father, Jeff (1984-85) and brother Jeffrey (2013), along with Jayden (2018), led Warren Central High School in Indianapolis to four of the school's nine state championships.

• In 2020 before enrolling at Bowling Green, running back Terion Stewart was setting up for a picnic at the Shelby Street Public Boat Launch, but soon found himself in the middle of a life-and-death situation. Stewart, then a recent Sandusky High School graduate, pulled two children out of the water next to a dock near the parking lot after he heard them calling for help.

• QB Matt McDonald and WR Austin Osborne were high school teammates at Mission Viejo High School in Southern California. They were members of MVHS's 2015 state championship and Osborne holds school records for receiving touchdowns in a game (4), season (20) and a career (46).

• While in high school, TE Jaedyn McKinstry overcame rhabdomyosarcoma, a cancer that mostly affects children and forms in soft skeletal muscle tissue. The cancer was determined to be in stage 4 based on location — parastesticular, lymph node and lung — and required surgical removal. He was given only a 50% chance of surviving. He beat it and returned to high school sports in the fall of 2019.

• Head coach Scot Loeffler, associate head coach (LBs) Steve Morrison, OC (RBs) Terry Malone and passing game coordinator (WRs) Erik Campbell were all on staff with each other at Michigan under former head coach Lloyd Carr.
