## HEADING INTO THE MATCH

- The Gophers (7-3, 2-0 Big Ten) made it through an extremely challenging non-conference slate with five wins and three losses. Minnesota played five top-15 ranked opponents and came out 2-3, most notably winning the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge with wins over Stanford and Oregon. The Gophers most recently took down Michigan (3-2) and Maryland (3-0) to open Big Ten play 2-0. They've won six straight matches.
- Minnesota entered the 2021 season ranked as the No. 7 team in the country (AVCA). It was Minnesota's seventh straight season being ranked in the preseason top-10, including the eighth time in the ten years of the Hugh McCutcheon era. The 'U' came in at No. 7 again in the Sept. 27 AVCA rankings.
- The Gophers returned 11 letterwinners, including six players with significant starting experience, putting together an extremely well-balanced roster.
- Four-time AVCA All-American and reigning Big Ten Player of the Year Stephanie Samedy returned for her fifth year in the maroon and gold. The Preseason All-Big Ten selection won Big Ten Player of the Week on Sept. 13 and 27 and currently ranks in the top five nationally in points and kills per set.
- DS/L CC McGraw was named First Team All-Big Ten and AVCA All-America Honorable Mention in 2019. McGraw, listed as a senior, will play through the 2022 season. She won Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week Sept. 13 after notching 59 digs in two wins over Stanford (19) and Oregon (30).
- Sophomore outside Jenna Wenaas is in the midst of a breakout sophomore season in the maroon and gold. She ranks second on the team and eighth in the Big Ten in points per set (4.26). She has double digit kills in seven of eight matches this year and won Big Ten Player of the Week on Sept. 20.
- The 2020-21 season marked the 25th year the Golden Gophers advanced to the NCAA tournament. Minnesota has also advanced to the tournament in six-straight seasons and eight of nine seasons under tenth-year head coach Hugh McCutcheon. Minnesota has had a top-10 seed the past six seasons. The Gophers were the No. 2 seed in 2015, 2016 and 2018, No. 3 last year, and the No. 7 seed in both 2017 and 2019.
- Minnesota went 16-3 (15-2 Big Ten) in the 2020-21 spring season and entered the NCAA Tournament as the No. 3 seed nationally. The Golden Gophers defeated Georgia Tech in round one before falling to Pittsburgh in five sets in the Sweet 16. Under McCutcheon, the Gophers have made it to three NCAA Final Fours, three Sweet 16's and an Elite Eight in just nine years. He holds a 239-59 (.802) collegiate coaching record and has led Minnesota to two Big Ten Championships.

## THE 2021 POSTSEASON

- All 48 teams participating in the Division I Women's Volleyball Championship gathered in Omaha, Nebraska, which had been scheduled to host the NCAA national semifinals and finals.
- Kentucky, Texas, Washington and Wisconsin went to the Final Four, with Kentucky topping Texas for the title.
- Minnesota fell to Pittsburgh in the Sweet 16 (3-2) after besting Georgia Tech in the second round.

## LAST TIME OUT

- The then No. 9 University of Minnesota volleyball team took down Michigan in five sets on Friday night before sweeping Maryland at the Pav to start Big Ten play with a 2-0 record.
- Samedy (30 kills) and McGraw (30 digs) led the 'U' Friday. They led 2-0 over Michigan before the Wolverines evened it up and sent it five. The Gophers prevailed, 15-11, in the final set.
- A dominant performance Sunday ended the Terrapins undefeated season. Samedy and Wenaas led the way with 11 kills while nine blocks from Ellie Husemann led a suffocating defensive effort. Maryland hit -.096.

## GOPHERS WIN THIRD STRAIGHT BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Wenaas became the third Gopher to win a weekly conference award on Sept. 20 when she was named player of the week, her first weekly honor from the league. She had 28 kills, 19 digs and eight blocks total.
- Minnesota seniors CC McGraw and Stephanie Samedy were named Big Ten Defensive Player and Big Ten Player of the Week on Sept. 13. McGraw spearheaded strong defensive efforts for Minnesota in two victories this weekend over top-15 teams. It was her third career defensive player of the week honor.
- Samedy notched her second player of the week honor in three weeks on Sept. 27 after she tallied 30 kills and 17 digs vs. Michigan and 11 kills/14 digs Sunday vs. Maryland. It was her tenth career Big Ten POW honor.

## ABOUT WISCONSIN

- The No. 5 Wisconsin Badgers (9-1, 1-1 Big Ten) have been to back-to-back Final Fours in addition to winning the last two Big Ten regular season titles. Led by Kelly Sheffield, UW has a school-record 25-match win streak on the line on Friday night against the Gophers. They haven't lost at home since Sept. 2019 vs. Washington.
- Despite hitting a season-low .196 at Maryland Friday, Wisconsin leads the nation with a .331 team hitting percentage. Fifth-year senior Dana Rettke leads the nation in hitting % (.554) and is a four-time All-American.
- Senior setter Sydney Hilley leads the nation with 12.06 assists per set. She has over 5,000 career assists.

## ABOUT NORTHWESTERN

- Northwestern (5-8, 0-2 Big Ten) is led by sixth-year head coach Shane Davis. He is looking to lead the Wildcats to their first .500 season in the Big Ten since 2014.
- NU is led by Temi Thomas-Ailara, who ranks ninth in the Big Ten in kills per set (3.54). She also ranks eighth in points per set at 4.21.
- The Wildcats have posted non-conference wins against Missouri, Loyola Chicago, UIC, Wyoming and Colorado State. They fell in four sets to Nebraska last weekend and in five sets to Illinois.

### SAMEDY AND WENAAS COMBINING AS LETHAL DUO

• Minnesota opposite Stephanie Samedy and outside Jenna Wenaas have combined for 301 of Minnesota's 506 kills (.594). They've reached double digit kills a combined 18 times this season while Samedy has hit the 20-kill mark in six of nine matches. Statistically, they're the top attacking duo in the Big Ten Conference (chart below).

### TIME TO DIG IT OUT

- The Gophers rank first in the Big Ten and rank 32nd nationally in digs per set (16.66). CC McGraw leads the team (4.82) while Samedy (3.71) and Melani Shaffmaster (2.70) are right around four and three per set, respectively.
- CC McGraw ranks fifth in the conference (39th nationally) in digs (183) and second in digs per set (4.82).

### BLOCK PARTY IN MINNESOTA

- The Gophers rank No. 3 in the Big Ten and No. 12 nationally in blocks with 106.5 as a team and 2.80 per set.
- Ellie Husemann ranks 5th in the conference with 1.44 blocks per set while Katie Myers is right behind her at 1.17. Samedy ranks third at 0.83 while Wenaas leads all outsiders in blocks at 0.81 per set.

### SAMEDY NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE YEAR; SIX GARNER B1G HONORS

- After an outstanding 2021 spring season, senior opposite hitter Stephanie Samedy was named the Big Ten Player of the Year. It marks Samedy's first-ever player of the Year and Minnesota's seventh in school history. Of the seven, four have come under head coach McCutcheon. Samedy averaged a B1G-best 4.15 kills per set/4.69 points per set.
- Samedy, along with Regan Pittman and Taylor Landfair, landed spots on the First Team All-Big Ten team. Landfair and Shaffmaster were named to the B1G All-Freshman Team. Bayley McMenimen won the Sportsmanship Award.

### SAMEDY RANKS AMONG ACTIVE NCAA ALL-TIME LEADERS, 2021 LEADERS

- Stephanie Samedy currently ranks 8th among NCAA active leaders in career kills (1,663), 11th in total attacks (4,333), 24th in matches played (124) and 53rd in digs (1,215). She also ranks 23rd in kills per set (3.76).
- In 2021, Samedy ranks 6th in the nation in points per set (5.64), 5th in kills per set (5.09) and 6th in attacks per set (12.89). She leads the Big Ten in each offensive category.

## MEDIA PROTOCOLS DURING COVID-19

**MEDIA CREDENTIALS:** Requests for working media credentials (newspaper, radio, TV, photo) for Minnesota home games must be made on-line at [gophersports.com/media](http://gophersports.com/media). All credentials for the 2021 season will be given out on a single-game format. No season-long passes are allowed this year. Please contact the Athletic Communications office for more information regarding the on-line credentialing system.

**FACE COVERINGS:** All media will be required to wear a face covering while they are at Maturi Pavilion. The face covering needs to cover both the nose and mouth at all times. The lone exception is when an individual is eating or drinking; however, physical distancing practices must still be observed. Media and personnel who do not have a face covering will not be granted access. Individuals who do not comply with Minnesota's face covering policy while inside Maturi Pavilion will be asked to leave.

**MEDIA ENTRANCE:** Media must enter Maturi Pavilion through west lobby, which is at the main ticket office and between University of Fourth Street. Individuals - who have completed their COVID-19 questionnaire - will have their temperature taken upon arrival. Media will then be issued a credential, which will grant them access to the press area.

**PRESS AREA:** Print media are asked to remain in their seats for the majority of the time. Media should use restrooms located off the concourse.

**PHOTO LOCATIONS:** Tier 3 photogs are allowed to shoot in bleacher sections on the south side, 25 feet away from the court and higher. Please adhere to the safe social distancing in those sections. Photographers must stay within the Tier 3 photo area, no exceptions.

**POSTGAME INTERVIEWS:** As pf now, postgame interviews with coaches and student-athletes will take place via Zoom.

**PRESS AREA CLOSING:** Press area will close 75 minutes following the last conducted interview.

#### 20-PLUS KILL PERFORMANCES

- Stephanie Samedy produced 20-plus kills in five matches last season. The senior opposite hitter had 28 and 20 against Purdue (2/5-6), 23 against Penn State (2/13) and 27 against Nebraska (2/19). She finished the season with a 23-kill performance in the five-set Sweet 16 loss to Pittsburgh.
- Samedy kicked off 2021 with 20+ kill performances in six out of her nine appearances this season, a figure that leads the country. She's totaled 20+ kills 20 times in her Gophers career. She had her first 30+ kill performance of her career on Sept. 5 at Florida and her second Friday vs. Michigan.

#### GOPHERS ADDED FOUR FRESHMAN TO 2021 ROSTER

- The Gophers welcomed Lauren Crowl (Eagan, Minn.), Natalie Glenn (Southlake, Texas), Skylar Gray (Maple Grove, Minn.) and Anna Wolf (River Falls, Wis.) to Minnesota this fall.
- Anna Wolf joined the Gopher in January of 2021 and trained with the team last semester. A 6-foot-4 middle blocker, Wolf played for River Falls High School and Minnesota Select Volleyball Club.
- Gray, a 5-foot, 10-inch outside hitter/defensive specialist, played for Maple Grove High School and Minnesota Select Club Volleyball Team. Glenn, a 5-foot-10 outside/right side hitter, played for Carroll Senior High and Texas Advantage Volleyball Club. Crowl, a 6-foot-4 outside/right side hitter, plays for Eastview High School and Northern Lights Volleyball Club.

#### CC CONTINUES PLAYING AT A HIGH LEVEL

- Senior libero/ds CC McGraw, who was named First Team All-Big Ten and AVCA All-America Honorable Mention in 2019, returned as another key piece for a Gophers team looking to take another step from last year. McGraw, who already earned her bachelor's degree at the 'U,' is enrolled in a two-year master's program in sport and exercise science.
- She also announced that she will be playing two more seasons with the Gophers and will be taking advantage of the NCAA-granted COVID year in 2022. After missing the team's final eight games last year, she is off to a great start in 2021, ranking first on the team and 2nd in the Big Ten in d/s (4.82).
- CC was Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week after a 30-dig match at Oregon. She tallied her second 30+ dig match vs. Michigan Friday with 32. She's the only B1G Player with 2+ 30-dig matches.

#### LANDFAIR COMES BACK WITH A FORCE

- The No. 1 recruit in 2020 (Volleyball Mag), Landfair made the All-Big Ten First Team, AVCA All-America hon. mention and was named the AVCA North Region Freshman of the Year in 2020-21.
- After starting the first three matches this season, Landfair was limited for four matches after being injured late in the Texas match. She came back strong last weekend, tallying eight kills each in matches against Michigan and Maryland.
- She played in all three sets against Maryland, which was the first time she'd played in every set in a match since Sept. 1. Landfair had all eight of her kills in the fourth and fifth sets vs. Michigan Friday.

#### SHFFMASTER SETS THE TABLE

- A rare 6-foot-3 setter, Melani Shaffmaster was spectacular as a freshman. The New Castle, Ind., native averaged 9.69 assists per set.
- The sophomore leads Minnesota with 388 assists in 2021, averaging 10.49 per set. She ranks No. 6 in the Big Ten in assists and already ranks No. 14 in program history (1,037).
- She committed to Minnesota as an eighth grader in April of 2016 and shut down her recruitment.

#### HUSEMANN/MYERS HOLDING DOWN THE MIDDLE

- Ellie Husemann and Katie Myers have really emerged in the middle during the past couple weeks for the Gophers. Husemann (1.44 b/s) ranks No. 13 nationally and No. 5 in the Big Ten while Myers (1.17) lands in the top-15 in the B1G. They're a big reason for the team's improvement on the block.
- Husemann had a career-high nine blocks in a sweep of Maryland on Sunday afternoon while Myers has registered multiple blocks in each of the last five matches.

#### NO. 1 RECRUITING CLASS LOOKING TO BUILD OFF SOLID 2020-21

- Minnesota's 2020 recruiting class was ranked No. 1 in the nation, according to VolleyballMag.com. It marked the first time head coach Hugh McCutcheon has recruited the nation's top class and second time in school history.
- Minnesota's top recruiting class included four freshmen and a graduate transfer. The Golden Gophers' class had Taylor Landfair (6-4 outsider from Plainfield, Ill.), Melani Shaffmaster (6-3 setter from New Castle, Ind.) and Jenna Wenaas (6-1 outside from Frisco, Texas). The Gophers added grad transfer Katie Myers (6-2 middle from Westerville, Ohio) to strengthen their roster.
- Landfair was ranked VolleyballMag.com's No. 1 recruit, while Wenaas was named the fifth-ranked recruit and Shaffmaster was No. 6.

#### ACADEMIC HONORS

- Minnesota earned a 3.58 team GPA during the 2020-21 season, including a 3.61 this past spring.
- Minnesota had eight individuals receive Academic All-Big Ten honors, while Ellie Husemann, CC McGraw, Bayley McMenimen and Shea Rubright were named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.

# GOPHER NOTES TO KNOW

## GOPHERS HISTORY AGAINST WISCONSIN AND NORTHWESTERN

- All-time, Minnesota is 52-33 against Wisconsin. Under coach McCutcheon, the Gophers are 11-6 against the Badgers. Minnesota had won eight in-a-row against UW from 2015-18 but the Badgers have won three straight in the series.
- UW won last year's only meeting, 3-1, at Maturi Pavilion, 14-25, 25-22, 15-25, 23-25. Minnesota was playing shorthanded however, missing starters CC McGraw, Melani Shaffmaster and Katie Myers to injury. Taylor Landfair led Minnesota with 15 kills while Samedy had seven kills and Miyabe had four.
- Samedy all-time vs. UW: 4-3 record, 69 kills, five assists, 77 digs, 18 blocks.
- The 'U' is 61-19 all-time vs. Northwestern, including a 14-1 record under Hugh McCutcheon. The lone loss came in 2014 (three sets). Of the last 15 meetings, nine have been decided in three sets.

## GOPHERS IN BIG TEN PLAY

- Under Hugh McCutcheon, Minnesota is 134-37 (.784) in Big Ten competition. In his nine seasons prior to 2021, the Gophers have had eight seasons above .500 in conference play. In all eight of those seasons, the 'U' went 15-5 or better in conference play, with the best being 19-1 in 2018.
- The Gophers won Big Ten titles in 2016 and 2018 and have finished either first, second or third in eight of the last nine seasons.

## DIFFICULT SCHEDULE AWAITS MINNESOTA IN 2021

- The No. 7-ranked Gophers have a gauntlet of schedule once again. In addition to playing 20 conference games in the always difficult Big Ten slate, they played eight non-conference matches, including five against AVCA top-25 ranked teams.
- Minnesota is set to take on seven teams ranked in the AVCA preseason top-10 (second most top-10 games in the country). The Gophers have 13 ranked opponents out of 28 games on their schedule.

## LANDFAIR AND SAMEDY MAKE PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN

- Sophomore Taylor Landfair and redshirt senior Stephanie Samedy both landed a spot on the Pre-season All-Big Ten team. It is Landfair's first preseason all-league honor and Samedy's fourth.
- The Gophers, ranked No. 7 by the AVCA preseason poll, are tabbed to finish fourth in the league standings, which was voted on by the conference coaches. Wisconsin was predicted to win the conference, followed by Nebraska, Penn State, Minnesota and Purdue to round out the top five.

## GOPHERS IN THE PROS

- Minnesota has had a total of 11 Gopher alums that played professional volleyball this past season.
- Lauren Gibbemeyer, Samantha Seliger-Swenson, Taylor Morgan, Molly Lohman, Erica Handley and Dalianliz Rosado are all a part of Athletes Unlimited. In partnership with USA Volleyball, Athletes Unlimited launches the first pro indoor women's league in the U.S. on February 27, 2021. Paige Tapp was training with Athletes Unlimited, but tore her ACL and missed the season.
- Daly Santana (Turkey), Sarah Wilhite (Turkey), Hannah Tapp (Japan) and Alexis Hart (Germany) are all playing internationally. Tori Dixon completed her international competition (China) earlier this year. Gibbemeyer also competed internationally (Sweden).
- Gophers alumnae Tori Dixon ('14), Hannah Tapp ('16) and Sarah Wilhite ('16) were alternates for the USA Women's Volleyball team, which won its first-ever gold medal at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

## FINAL FOUR SUCCESS

- Since 2015, Minnesota is one of just FOUR teams in the country to have made at least three Final Four appearances in the past six seasons.
- The Gophers went to the Final Four in 2015, 2016 and 2019. Texas, Minnesota's opponent in the home opener, has also been to three Final Fours in the past six years.
- Stanford and Nebraska have been four times each in the past six seasons, the only programs to make the national semifinals more than the Gophers in that span.

## BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD RUNS THROUGH MINNEAPOLIS

- In the past six seasons, Minnesota has dominated the Big Ten Player of the Year award race. A Gopher has won the conference's most prestigious award four times since 2015.
- All-time, seven Gophers have won Big Ten Player of the Year since its debut in 1983. Martie Larsen (1983), Nicole Branagh (2000) and Cassie Busse (2003) were the others.

Hugh McCutcheon enters his tenth season at the helm of Golden Gopher Volleyball program. Named the 2015 AVCA National Coach of the Year and 2015 Big Ten Coach of the Year, McCutcheon continues building Minnesota into a perennial powerhouse. Since arriving on campus in 2012, McCutcheon has led the Gophers to three NCAA Final Fours, two Big Ten Championships, four Sweet 16 finishes and an Elite Eight appearance in just nine years. He enters the 2021 spring season with a 216-53 (.808) collegiate coaching record.

Last year, during the COVID-19 pandemic shortened 2020-21 spring season, McCutcheon guided the Gophers to a 16-3 (15-2 Big Ten) record and a No. 3 national seed in the NCAA Tournament. Minnesota earned Big Ten runner-up honors, losing just two conference matches in a year with COVID stoppages and untimely injuries. Senior opposite Stephanie Samedy earned her fourth straight AVCA All-American honor in addition to becoming the fourth Gopher in the past six seasons to win Big Ten Player of the Year. Freshman Taylor Landfair and senior Regan Pittman also earned All-America honorable mention as the Gophers made their fourth Sweet 16 in the last nine seasons under Hugh.

Under McCutcheon's guidance, the Golden Gophers advanced to their third Final Four appearance in just five seasons in 2019. As the Golden Gophers were riddled with injuries during the 2019 regular season, McCutcheon guided the Gophers to a 17-3 Big Ten Conference record, which tied for second place. With a healthy team by postseason play, the Gophers advanced to the program's sixth NCAA Championship in program history. Minnesota finished 2019 with a 27-6 record as McCutcheon was named the AVCA North Region Coach of the Year. Regan Pittman, Stephanie Samedy and Alexis Hart all garnered All-America honors this past season.

McCutcheon and the Gophers earned a 19-1 record in Big Ten play action in 2018. The Gophers broke their school record of most wins in a conference season and longest conference win streak in program history, bettering their 15-match run in 2015. Overall, the Gophers went 27-4 in 2018 and held a Sweet 16 berth. Three individuals received All-America honors in Samantha Seliger-Swenson, Stephanie Samedy and Regan Pittman. In fact, those three also received First Team All-Big Ten honors, while Seliger-Swenson was named Big Ten Player of the Year.

The 2018 calendar year also marked a special accolade as he was inducted into the International Volleyball Hall of Fame, the first New Zealander to ever be inducted into the hall.

Coming off back-to-back Final Four appearances and graduating six 2016 seniors, Minnesota remained one of the top programs in NCAA Division I and Big Ten standings during the 2017 campaign. The Golden Gophers advanced to the Sweet 16 and finished third in the Big Ten with a 28-6 overall record and a 15-5 mark in league action. The Golden Gophers had three individuals garner All-America and Big Ten honors, including First Team All-American Stephanie Samedy. She became Minnesota's first-ever freshman to receive First Team All-America honors in school history. Minnesota finished 10th in the final AVCA poll, with a team that relied on five underclassmen that saw significant action.

Minnesota went 29-5 and 17-3 in league action during the 2016 campaign. Finishing in a tie for second place in the Big Ten, the Gophers were the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year. Minnesota also went 17-0 at home during 2016, marking 36-straight wins at the Sports Pavilion, spanning back to the 2014 campaign. Under the direction of McCutcheon, Minnesota garnered its first-ever AVCA and ESPNW National Player of the Year when Sarah Wilhite received the award. With McCutcheon's guidance, Wilhite went from never receiving any yearly awards, to become the top play in the nation. Along with Wilhite, Samantha Seliger-Swenson and Hannah Tapp were named AVCA All-Americans. Wilhite was named the Big Ten Player of the Year, the second-straight Gopher to don the honor, while Seliger-Swenson was named Big Ten Setter of the Year.

Paige Tapp received the Senior CLASS Award, which goes to one graduating individual who excels on the court, in the classroom and in the community. Tapp also was named a First Team Academic All-American, her second honor in two years. The Gophers also added 10 Academic All-Big Ten selections during 2016.

Completing a historic year in 2015, McCutcheon led the Gophers to an impressive 30-5 overall record, a league-best 18-2 Big Ten mark, a perfect 15-0 on their home court and an unprecedented 15-match Big Ten win streak. Under McCutcheon's guidance, Minnesota garnered four All-Americans and three First Team All-Big Ten selections, as Daly Santana was named the Big Ten Player of the Year. Samantha Seliger-Swenson was also named Minnesota's first Big Ten Freshman of the Year in over two decades. With McCutcheon leading the way, the Golden Gophers won their second Big Ten Championship in school history in 2015 and earned their first trip to the NCAA Final Four since 2009.

McCutcheon came to Minnesota after an illustrious career with USA Volleyball as he earned two medals with the United States Men's and Women's Olympic teams. Immediately following his commitment to Team USA, McCutcheon arrived in Minnesota in August of 2012. In his first season, McCutcheon led Minnesota to a 27-8 record in 2012 and just two sets shy of a Final Four appearance. With the Gophers advancing to the NCAA Elite Eight, McCutcheon coached Minnesota to a tie for second in the Big Ten Conference standings, while Katherine Harms and Tori Dixon earned first and second team All-America citations. He followed with a Sweet 16 appearance in 2013, was named the regional coach of the year, all while Dixon was named a First Team All-American as Ashley Wittman donned second team honors. Under McCutcheon's guidance, the Gophers finished the 2013 campaign with a 29-7 overall record and 15-5 mark in the Big Ten, which was third in league standings.

### USA VOLLEYBALL

McCutcheon guided both the men's and women's indoor volleyball teams to Olympic medals, the only United States coach to ever do so. McCutcheon mentored the U.S. Women's National Volleyball Team to a 106-39 record in his four years after leading the U.S. Men's National Volleyball Team program to the 2008 Olympic Games gold medal. Counting his 107-33 record leading the U.S. Men's program from 2005 to 2008, McCutcheon held a combined record of 213-72 with USA Volleyball.

In his final three seasons with the women's program, McCutcheon guided the U.S. to an 88-25 record with podium finishes in 10 of 12 tournaments. In 2012, Team USA captured its second consecutive Olympic Games silver medal with a 7-1 record. In addition, the U.S. captured FIVB World Grand Prix gold medal for the third consecutive year.



## COACHING RECORDS

Team USA was 14-0 in the 2012 edition, including victories over Olympic Games bound Brazil twice (No. 2 in the world), Italy (No. 4), China (No. 5), Serbia (No. 6), Dominican Republic (No. 9) and Turkey (No. 11).

The U.S. finished the 2011 season with a 39-10 record. Among the team's highlights were picking up the silver medal at the FIVB World Cup, their second consecutive FIVB World Grand Prix title, capturing the NORCECA Women's Continental Championship and winning the bronze medal at the Pan American Cup. Overall, the U.S. scored an 11-match victory improvement over 2010 and a 21-victory improvement from two years ago.

Team USA finished the 2010 season with a 28-13 record - a 10-match improvement in the victory column from the previous year. The U.S. claimed the silver medal at the Montreux Volley Masters and the bronze at the Pan American Cup in June 2010. The 2010 season was capped by a fourth-place finish at the FIVB World Championship.

In his first year leading the squad, McCutcheon was able to evaluate 30 players in international competitions, along with training several other players who were new or returning to the program. With the mix of youth and veterans, Team USA finished 2009 with an 18-14 record and provided vast experience for a young roster. The squad qualified for the 2010 FIVB World Grand Prix and 2010 FIVB World Championship based on results in 2009. The U.S. won the FIVB World Championship - NORCECA Group G third-round pool to advance to the FIVB World Championship at the end of 2010.

Less than four months after leading the U.S. Men's Olympic Volleyball Team to a gold medal at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing en route to being named the 2008 USOC National Coach of the Year, McCutcheon accepted the head coach position of the U.S. Women's National Team for the 2009-2012 Olympic quadrennial.

As the head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team at the 2008 Olympic Games, McCutcheon and Team USA went undefeated in Beijing to claim its third Olympic Games gold medal and its first podium finish since 1992. He compiled a 107-33 record in four years with the U.S. Men's National Team program, which ended 2008 ranked second in the FIVB World Ranking.

The U.S. Men's National Team enjoyed one of its best seasons ever in 2008 under McCutcheon's guidance as the team won all three of its major tournaments of the year. Team USA secured its first-ever FIVB World League championship in July 2008 after a bronze medal finish in the same event in 2007, the first time the Americans earned back-to-back medals in the annual event. The U.S. started the 2008 campaign in dominating fashion by sweeping all five matches at the NORCECA Men's Continental Olympic Qualifier to earn its berth in the 2008 Olympics.

McCutcheon started coaching the men's team in 2005. That season, the U.S. Men's Team flourished in going 27-6 and winning five medals in five tournaments. The team earned a silver medal at the USOC International Sports Invitational in San Diego, Calif., gold medals at the Americas' Cup in Brazil, the FIVB World Championship Qualifying Tournament in Puerto Rico and the NORCECA Continental Championship in Canada and another silver medal at the FIVB World Grand Champions Cup in Japan.

McCutcheon, a former Brigham Young University assistant coach, joined USA Volleyball as a full-time assistant coach for the men's national team program in April 2003.

Prior to that, in the summers of 2001 and 2002, respectively, he served as a volunteer assistant coach for the men's national team, helping out during the 2001 World League, the 2002 World Championships and on five international tours.

He has also served as the head coach of the U.S. Boys' Youth National Team in 2000 and 2001. McCutcheon was the top assistant coach and recruiter for BYU men's team from 1995-2001 under head coach Carl McGown. During that time, the Cougars posted a record of 138-44 and captured two NCAA championships (1999 and 2001).

After leaving BYU, McCutcheon was the head coach of the Vienna Hotvolleys in Austria for two seasons. In his first season there, the Hotvolleys won the 2001-02 Inter-Liga, Austrian Cup and Austrian League championships. He also coached the first Austrian team to ever beat an Italian A1 opponent.

McCutcheon's love for volleyball developed in New Zealand where he played on the junior and senior national teams from 1986-90 before coming to the United States. He was also a member of New Zealand's national team in 1996 and represented his country on the FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour in 1997.

He played for BYU from 1991-1993 after transferring from the University of Canterbury in New Zealand. In 1993 he earned honorable mention All-America honors. In 1992 he earned Academic All-Conference honors from the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation.

After receiving his bachelor's degree in physical education from BYU in 1993, McCutcheon played professionally for two years in Finland and Japan before returning to BYU to complete his master's degree in 1998. In 1999, McCutcheon received an MBA from BYU's Marriott School of Management.

Married to former U.S. Olympian Elisabeth "Wiz" Bachman, the couple has two children, Andrew and Annika.
