FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

1 After opening the 2021 season with a 45-31 loss to No. 4/4 Ohio State on Sept. 2, Minnesota (0-1, 0-1 B1G) plays its first non-conference game of the year on Saturday when it hosts Miami (OH) (0-1, 0-0 MAC) at 11 a.m. on ESPNU.

2 Minnesota enters Saturday's contest with 19 straight non-conference victories, the longest active streak in the country. Through Saturday's games, Iowa and Kentucky had each won 12 straight against non-conference foes, while Alabama (9) was the only other team in the country with a streak longer than five games. The Golden Gophers haven't lost a non-conference game since Sept. 3, 2015, at home to then-No. 2 TCU. Included in the streak are 15 regular season wins and four bowl victories (complete list of wins on Page 4). Minnesota is 11-0 under **P.J. Fleck** in non-conference games.

3 **Mohamed Ibrahim** rushed 30 times for 163 yards and two touchdowns for the Gophers, extending his school record to nine straight games with at least 100 yards, but No. 4 Ohio State rallied from a third-quarter deficit for a 45-31 win on Sept. 2 at Huntington Bank Stadium in the season opener for both teams. After trailing 10-0, Minnesota led 14-10 at halftime, and again at 21-17 with 10 minutes remaining in the third quarter. A complete recap can be found on page two of the notes.

4 Fifth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is in his third full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's already proven himself to be one of the best signal-callers to ever wear the Maroon and Gold. Morgan is 18-9 as a starter and has completed 419 passes (seventh most in school history) of 678 attempts (eighth most) for 6,233 yards (sixth most) in his career. His career completion percentage of .618 ranks first in school history, as does his 156.59 pass efficiency rating, while his 47 career touchdown passes ranks fourth. Morgan owns 11 Minnesota season and game records and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-Big Ten Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semi-finalist and a Manning Award finalist.

5 The 2021 campaign is the fifth for head coach **P.J. Fleck** at Minnesota. He entered the year with a record of 26-19.

In Minnesota football history, only **Henry L. Williams** (42, 1900-03) had more wins in his first four seasons than Fleck's 26. In addition, Fleck's 15 wins in Big Ten play tied with **Cal Stoll** (1972-75) for the most in a coach's first four years with the Gophers. Overall, Fleck is now 26-20, putting him ninth in program history for wins, while his .565 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Williams (.786, 1900-21) and **Bernie Bierman** (.716, 1932-41, '45-50).



Playing in his first game for Minnesota, redshirt sophomore **Dylan Wright** caught five passes for 57 yards and a score in the season opener against Ohio State.

FACING MIAMI (OH)

► Minnesota and Miami meet for the fifth time on Saturday. The Golden Gophers have never lost to the RedHawks, owning a 4-0 mark in the series.

► All four games in the series have been played in Minneapolis. The Gophers have outscored Miami 131-64 in those contests, an average final score of 33-16.

► The Gophers' 4-0 record against the RedHawks is tied for their most wins without a loss against a current FBS opponent. Minnesota is also 4-0 versus Colorado State and Western Michigan. The four-game win streak against those three programs marks Minnesota's longest active against an FBS school.

► Including two wins during his tenure at Western Michigan, **P.J. Fleck** is 3-0 all-time against Miami. A win Saturday would give him four wins against the RedHawks, tying them with Illinois (4-1) for Fleck's most wins against one school.

► All-time against schools in the Mid-American Conference, the Golden Gophers are 32-4-1, including seven straight wins dating back to 2011.

► Minnesota has nine Ohioans on the roster: **Austin Beier** (Toledo), **Mike Brown-Stephens** (Springfield), **Miles Fleming** (Columbus), **Connor Keyes** (Cincinnati), **Gage Keys** (Hilliard), **Thomas Rush** (Marysville), **Matthew Trickett** (Cleveland), **Devon Williams** (Dublin), **Donald Willis** (Garfield Heights). Miami's roster has no Minnesotans.

► Miami is coming off a 49-14 loss at No. 8/10 Cincinnati in its season opener. The Bearcats opened the contest scoring touchdowns on their first three drives to take an early 21-0 lead and led 35-0 at halftime. Trailing 42-0, Kenny Tracy got the RedHawks on the board in the fourth quarter with a 19-yard touchdown run, while John Saunders, Jr., later added a 32-yard pick-six.

► AJ Mayer completed 9-of-28 passes for 109 yards, while Keyon Mozee was the team's top runner with 80 yards rushing on 15 carries and Mac Hippenhammer had a team-high 64 receiving yards on three catches as Miami's offense was held to 3.8 yards per play and 278 yards of total offense.

► The RedHawks defense, which allowed 542 yards of total offense, was led by Cedric Boswell and Ja'don Rucker-Furlow, who each had eight stops. The unit forced two interceptions and tallied two sacks.

LAST TIME VS. MIAMI

► Minnesota last faced Miami (OH) on Sept. 15, 2018, recording a 26-3 victory in Minneapolis. Temperature at kickoff was 91 degrees, making it the second warmest game in Huntington Bank Stadium history.

► In his third collegiate start, **Zack Annexstad** completed 12 of 20 throws for 142 yards and threw two short touchdown passes to **Tyler Johnson**. **Bryce Williams**, then a freshman, had 176 yards total offense, including 141 yards rushing on 33 carries.

► Williams carried seven times for 40 yards on Minnesota's opening drive, capped by Annexstad's 7-yard touchdown pass to Johnson to give the Gophers a 7-0 lead. Williams also gained 35 yards on a screen pass on third-and-17 late in the first half, helping to set up Johnson's second touchdown -- a 7-yard toss from **Seth Green**. Johnson caught nine balls for 133 yards and tied a stadium record with his three touchdown receptions.

► Defensively, **Thomas Barber** and **Kamal Martin** each made a team-high eight tackles, including a safety for Barber. **Carter Coughlin** recorded a pair of sacks and **Antonio Shenault** recorded a 42-yard interception return that set up a Minnesota score.

► For Miami, Gus Ragland completed 11 of 20 passes for 108 yards and the interception that set up the second Annexstad-to-Johnson touchdown in the third to make it 26-3. The RedHawks lost three offensive starters in the first half, including receivers Kenny Young and James Gardner.

► The game includes the last safety recorded by Minnesota, the last time the Gophers held a team to 10 or fewer first downs in a game (10 for Miami) and the last time they shut out an opponent in the second half.

MEMORABLE GAMES VS. MIAMI

► Sept. 17, 2011: **MarQueis Gray** tallied 334 yards of total offense, including 171 yards on the ground. At the time it was the most rushing yards by a QB in program history.

► Sept. 8, 2007: **Adam Weber** threw four touchdown passes and **Amir Pinnix** ran for 126 yards in a triple-over-time win for Minnesota. It was the first 3-OT game in program history, and there has only been one other since: a 30-27 victory at UNLV on Aug. 30, 2012.

► Sept. 17, 1988: **Darrell Thompson** recorded one of his school-record 23 games with at least 100 yards rushing when he ran for 179 yards in Minnesota's first ever match-up against the RedHawks, a 35-3 Gopher victory.

RECAPPING THE OHIO ST. GAME

► **Mohamed Ibrahim** rushed for 163 yards and two touchdowns but left in the third quarter due to injury, and No. 4 Ohio State rallied from a third-quarter deficit for a 45-31 win Thursday night at Huntington Bank Stadium.

► Ibrahim, who extended his school-record streak of games with 100 yards rushing to nine, broke off a 56-yard run in the second quarter that helped set up a 13-yard touchdown pass from **Tanner Morgan** to **Dylan Wright**, cutting the Ohio State lead to 10-7. Making his Minnesota debut after transferring from Texas A&M, Wright finished with a team-high five receptions for 57 yards and the score.

► On the next OSU possession, **Terrell Smith** recorded the second interception of his career, leading to a one-yard touchdown run for Ibrahim, giving the Gophers a 14-10 lead which they took into halftime.

► After Ohio State took the lead early in the third, Ibrahim notched his 10th career multi-TD game with a 19-yard scoring run to put Minnesota back up 21-17. The Buckeyes scored 21 of the next 24 points in the game before **Bryce Williams'** two-yard touchdown rush with 5:31 to play got Minnesota within 38-31, but that would be as close as Minnesota would get.

► C.J. Stroud passed for 294 yards and four touchdowns in his debut as the Ohio State starter. As a team, the Buckeyes scored four touchdowns of at least 50 yards.

► Daniel Jackson had a team-high 58 receiving yards on three catches for Minnesota, while Brevyn Spann-Ford had the first multi-catch game of his career with three receptions for 44 yards.

► Defensively, Mariano Sori-Marin was the top Minnesota tackler with six stops, while Coney Durr had the team's tackle for loss and Boye Mafe picked up a quarterback hurry.

► In his Minnesota debut after transferring from Kent State, Matthew Trickett connected on his lone field goal attempt, converting from 46 yards. The field goal was Minnesota's longest since Emmitt Carpenter's 49-yarder against Iowa on Oct. 6, 2018.

O-LINE DEPTH AMONG THE BEST

► Minnesota boasts one of the deepest offensive lines in the entire country as 13 members of the unit have appeared in at least one game and 10 have started at least one contest (page 16).

► In fact, the Golden Gophers' offensive line has more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 187. The next closest squad is Miami (FL) with 164, while Michigan State (156) is third.

► In addition, the 10 individuals with starts was tied with Arkansas State for the most among all FBS squads entering the season.

► Redshirt senior Conner Olson leads the team by starting all 46 games he's played in, putting him five games shy of matching the school record of 51 games played set by long snapper Payton Jordahl from 2015-18. Fellow redshirt seniors Blaise Andries and Sam Schlueter have each started 34 contests. Those three have also started at least two games at multiple positions. In addition, Daniel Faalele (20), Utah State transfer Karter Shaw (19), Curtis Dunlap Jr. (14) and John Micheal Schmitz (11) have all started double-digit games.

► Not only does the offensive line have tremendous experience, but it also has impressive versatility. The unit has at least 25 combined starts at every position, with a high of 58 at right guard, and each position features starts from at least two different players, including four each at right guard and right tackle.

► Further showcasing the depth, in the 2021 season opener the Minnesota offense opened in a jumbo package that featured seven starting offensive linemen.

IBRAHIM OUT FOR THE YEAR

► Mohamed Ibrahim, the Big Ten's reigning Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year, suffered a season-ending lower leg injury in Minnesota's season-opening loss to Ohio State. He had surgery on Sept. 7.

► Ibrahim has 14 career 100-yard rushing games, including a streak of nine in a row from the 2020 Outback Bowl through this year's season opener. Ibrahim's nine-game streak is the longest in program history, two more than former Gopher great Laurence Maroney.

► Before leaving Minnesota's season opener late in the third quarter with his injury, Ibrahim ran for 163 yards and two touchdowns on 30 attempts. In two career games against Ohio State, Ibrahim has run for 320 yards and four scores on 53 carries.

► Ibrahim has 3,003 rushing yards for his career, becoming the eighth Minnesota player to reach the 3,000-yard milestone.

► An All-Big Ten First Team honoree and AP Third-Team All-American last year, Ibrahim ran 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history). He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

► He also set a school record with a rushing average of 153.7 yards per game and tied a school mark with four rushing scores in one game (at Maryland and at Illinois).

RB ROOM READY TO GO

► With the injury to Ibrahim, Minnesota will look to its running back room to try to fill the void.

► After Ibrahim went down against Ohio State, redshirt sophomore Trey Potts carried four times for 20 yards (10 rushes for 34 yards total), while redshirt junior Bryce Williams had a two-yard touchdown run and redshirt sophomore Cam Wiley gained one yard on two rushes (3-4 total) as Minnesota tried to rally.

► The 5'11, 210-pound Potts entered 2021 having played in seven games with 26 career rushes for 172 yards and one touchdown. He was ranked the No. 13 all-purpose running back by 247Sports out of high school as he rushed 347 times for 3,490 yards and 59 touchdowns in 31 career games during his prep career.

► Williams (6'0, 215 pounds) has the most experience of the running back trio with 541 rushing yards and six touchdowns on 140 career carries. The majority of his production came as a freshman in 2018 with 502 yards and four scores on 117 carries, including a breakout performance against Miami (OH) with 33 carries for 141 yards.

► The biggest of the bunch at 6'2, 210 pounds, Wiley has 43 carries for 215 yards and one touchdown in 11 career games. He had a career-high 81 yards on seven attempts last season in a win at Nebraska.

► Two others that could see carries are redshirt freshman Ky Thomas (5'11, 205 pounds) and true freshman Mar'Keise Irving (5'10, 190). Thomas, who did not see any action last year, was four-star recruit and ranked the No. 25 running back in the country by 247Sports out of high school. Thomas finished his career with 7,703 rushing yards and 95 rushing touchdowns. Irving was also a four-star recruit by 247 and was the No. 10 running back, according to Rivals. Though he was not able to have a senior season due to COVID, Irving ended his high school career with 3,264 rushing yards and 587 receiving yards.

AUTMAN-BELL NEXT WR UP

► Senior Chris Autman-Bell was Minnesota's No. 3 receiver two years ago behind Tyler Johnson and Rashod Bateman, and the No. 2 target last year before Bateman opted out. But with those two now on to the NFL, Autman-Bell is poised to be the team's next top target.

► Autman-Bell, who missed the 2021 season opener due to injury, has played in 33 career games and has made 78 catches for 1,250 yards (21st in school history) and six TDs. He boasts a career average of 16.0 yards per catch, good for a tie for 10th in team annals. He has caught at least one pass in 31 games and has made one catch in 27 straight games he's played in (10th longest active streak).

► In seven games last year, he caught 22 passes for 430 yards and one score. That came after recording 28 catches for 371 yards and five touchdowns in 2019 and 28 catches (fourth all-time for a Minnesota freshman) for 449 yards (third all-time for a Minnesota freshman) in 2018 (also led team with 16.03 yards/catch).

TOP NINE TACKLERS BACK

► Senior linebacker **Mariano Sori-Marin** was the team's top tackler from a year ago, registering 54 stops in seven games in 2020. He also made 1.5 tackles for loss, broke up three passes and forced one fumble. His top performance last season came at Nebraska when he recorded a career-high 18 tackles and forced a fumble en route to winning Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors.

► With Sori-Marin leading the way, Minnesota's top nine tacklers from a year ago are all back in 2021, including senior defensive lineman **Boye Mafe**, who led the squad with 5.5 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks last season.

► In the defensive backfield, junior **Tyler Nubin** was second on the team a year ago with 41 tackles, and he was one of five Gophers with an interception. Senior **Jordan Howden** ranked third with 37 tackles, while sixth-year senior **Coney Durr** was fourth with 29 stops in addition to his team-leading five pass breakups. Durr also had an interception.

GRAD TRANSFERS BOOST D

► While the Gophers' defense has a lot returning from 2010, three grad transfers are looking to provide an instant impact this season.

► Linebacker **Jack Gibbens** spent the past four seasons at the FCS level with Abilene Christian where he totaled 258 tackles, 22.5 tackles for loss, seven sacks and five interceptions. He was the team's leading tackler this past season and was second in both 2019 and 2018. Gibbens' accolades at ACU included being a 2020 Campbell Trophy Finalist and 2019 First Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He made two tackles in a start Thursday against Ohio State.

► Defensive lineman **Niles Pinckney** brings a championship pedigree to the Golden Gophers after being a part of two national titles in five years at Clemson. Pinckney was credited with 98 tackles (13.5 for loss), three sacks, a forced fumble and three fumble recoveries in 1,125 defensive snaps over 55 career games (15 starts) from 2017-20 for the Tigers. He started the opener and had one stop.

► After two seasons at Iowa Western, defensive lineman **Val Martin** comes to Minnesota following three years at North Carolina State where he made 29 tackles in 22 games. In 2020, Martin played in eight games and recorded 12 tackles with one forced fumble. Martin played in the season opener but did not record any stats.

TRICKETT WINS KICKING JOB

► Senior **Matthew Trickett** won the Gophers kicking job after three seasons at Kent State where he earned All-MAC First Team honors in 2018 and was the MAC Special Teams Player of the Year in 2019. He made 47-57 (82.5%) field goals and was 94-95 on PATs for 235 career points. In 2019, he tied for the NCAA lead and set a Kent State record with 29 made field goals. He made a 46-yard field goal in the opener against Ohio State and was perfect on all four extra points.

► The Gophers returned redshirt junior kicker **Brock Walker** (2-3 FG in 2020), sophomore kicker **Dragan Kesich** (24 kickoffs in 2020) and sophomore punter **Marc Crawford** (37.8 avg. in 2020) for 2021, but they also welcomed in three transfer specialists, including Trickett.

► Redshirt senior kicker **Will Mobley** spent the past four seasons at Temple where he was 26-35 (74.3%) on field goals with a career long of 44 yards. He was also 99-104 (95.2%) on extra points, including a Temple-record 51 straight made in 2018.

► **Daniel Sparks** was a freshman last year at Louisiana-Monroe, playing in all 10 games for the Warhawks. He averaged 44.6 yards on 30 punts and also kicked off 33 times with six touchbacks.

► Seniors **Boye Mafe** and **Daniel Faalele** both appeared on the "2021 College Football Freaks List" from The Athletic's Bruce Feldman.

► Mafe came in at No. 17 of 101 players listed. "He's put on more than 50 pounds since arriving at Minnesota and weighs 263 now, up from 260 last year," Feldman wrote. "Mafe (4.5 sacks in six games in 2020) says he did a lot of single-leg work this offseason in hopes of improving his footwork." Among Mafe's weight room numbers listed by Feldman are a vertical jump of 40.5 inches, a broad jump of 10-6, a 4.57 40 and power cleaning 400 pounds."

► Faalele was ranked No. 29. "Two years ago, Faalele ranked No. 11 on this list because of his freakish combination of enormous size and a surprisingly athletic 29-inch vertical and 8-7 broad jump, but as he's reshaped his body, he's become a lot more nimble and flexible," Feldman wrote.

► Andries, who is majoring in Mathematics and is an aspiring actuary, is a repeat honoree after being named Second Team last season. He is Minnesota's first repeat selection since **Sam Renner**, who was named Second Team in both 2018 and 2019.

► Andries was named Academic All-Big Ten in 2020, 2019 and 2018 and was selected All-Big Ten Third Team in 2020 and 2019.

► Four of Minnesota's assistant coaches have head coaching experience. **Mike Sanford Jr.** (OC/QBs) was the head coach at Western Kentucky from 2017-18, while **Paul Haynes** (Cornerbacks) led Kent State from 2013-17. **Joe Harasymiak** (Defensive Backs, Safeties and Co-DC) was the head coach at Maine from 2016-18 and was named the 2018 FCS Coach of the Year. **Clay Patterson** (Tight Ends) was the head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College from 2016-17, earning conference coach of the year honors in 2017.

TWO GOPHERS DRAFTED

► Minnesota had two players selected in the 2021 NFL Draft. HUNTINGTON BANK STADIUM

- Minnesota opened Huntington Bank Stadium with a 20-13 win against Air Force in 2009. All-time, the Gophers are 49-35 at Huntington, including a 40-20 mark in their last 60 games and a 17-11 record under Head Coach P.J. Fleck.
- Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher Hockey, MNF, an NHL game, international soccer, MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings and Minnesota United also played seasons on campus while their stadiums were being constructed.
- Upon completion, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960.
- The Gopher locker room is a state of the art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in the country. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.

HEAD COACH // FIFTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 40, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 56-42 and is 26-20 at Minnesota.

While at Minnesota, Fleck has guided Minnesota to its most wins (11 in 2019) since 1904, has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), six Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries twice, Sam Renner twice, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 194 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had eight players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962. The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962. Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history. Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999. The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same span.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck, which included a school record 3.33 cumulative team GPA after the 2020-21 academic year.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988. Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts. Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.
