FIRST AND TEN

- Miami football ranks first all-time in the Mid-American Conference in wins (700), conference wins (301), MAC Championships (16) and bowl wins (7). The RedHawks also captured the 2019 MAC Championship with a 26-21 win over Central Michigan.
- Although Miami was 4-26 in Coach Martin's first 30 Mid-American Conference games, the RedHawks are 25-9 in the last 34 games versus schools from the MAC, the best record in the conference during that span.
- Miami went 2-1 in 2020, missing the final three contests of the year due to COVID. The RedHawks beat Ball State, the eventual MAC Champions, to open 2020, 38-31.
- The RedHawks clinched the MAC East Division Championship with a 6-2 record in 2019 and went 2-1 in 2020. Miami has now had a winning conference record in four of the past five years.
- Martin, in his eighth year leading the RedHawks, has had many of the same coordinators in the previous six seasons. Offensive Coordinator Eric Koehler has been with Martin all eight years on the offensive side of the ball. Spence Nowinsky (fourth year) and John Hauser (eighth year) manage the defense.
- Since 2014, Miami Athletics has added nearly \$40 million in facilities for the football program. The Dauch Indoor Sports Center was opened in 2015 and the Athletic Performance Center was added in early 2017. Both facilities are located in the north end zone of Yager Stadium.
- Miami is 8-0 in one-score games, dating back to the 2018 campaign. The RedHawks were 5-0 in one-score games in 2019, including a 26-21 victory over Central Michigan in the MAC Championship Game.
- In its last 26 contests, Miami has had a lead at some point in 24 of those games. The only two setbacks were a 42-10 loss at Buffalo in 2020 and last week at Cincinnati.
- Miami competed in the 2020 LendingTree Bowl, its fourth bowl eligible season in the last five years. From 2006-15, Miami was bowl eligible just twice.
- Miami's defense has forced a turnover in 30 of its last 42 games and is 19-11 in contests when it forces a turnover. The RedHawks' defense has also recorded a sack in 32 of its last 42 games.

ABOUT CHUCK MARTIN

- Head coach Chuck Martin, who earned that title on Dec. 3, 2013, brings an impressive resume to Oxford, Ohio.
- Not only was he 74-7 in six years at Grand Valley State (2004-09), he has coached in seven national championship games in the past 19 seasons. Martin has an all-time head coaching record of 106-54.
- He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year and has been a coordinator on both sides of the ball.
- Martin was inducted into the Hall of Fame at Grand Valley State University on Oct. 23, 2015.

700 CLUB

Last season, Miami captured its 700th win in school history. The 700 wins is tops in the MAC and ranks 28th among Division I teams in NCAA history.

ABOUT MINNESOTA

Minnesota is coming off a 45-31 loss to Ohio State last Thursday. Head coach P.J. Fleck, a former member of the Mid-American Conference, is led by running back Mohamed Ibrahim, who had 163 yards and two touchdowns versus the Buckeyes. Defensively, Mariano Sori-Marin had six tackles in the season opener.

SERIES VS. MINNESOTA

Saturday marks the fifth meeting between the two schools with Minnesota holding a 4-0 advantage in the all-time series. All four previous meetings, including the 2018 contest have been played in Minneapolis.

20 YEARS AGO...

Saturday will be the 20th anniversary on 9/11. Back in 2001, following the terrorist attacks on Sept. 11, college football cancelled all football games for that week. Miami, who was scheduled to play Kent State that week, was able to reschedule that game for later in the season.

CHAMPIONSHIP EXPERIENCE

While Miami's 2019 MAC Championship victory was two seasons ago, Miami still has 13 starters returning in 2021 that started in that championship game. On offense: Andrew Homer, Rusty Feth, Jaylon Bester, Tyre Shelton, Brett Gabbert, Pete Nank, Caleb Shaffer and Jack Sorenson all started in the 26-21 win over CMU. Defensively, Mike Brown, Sterling Weatherford, Ryan McWood, Kameron Butler and Ben Kimpler return in 2021. In all, Miami has 26 players on the 2021 roster that participated in the 2019 MAC Championship Game.

HOME COOKING

Miami finished a perfect 5-0 at home during the 2019 season (1-0 in 2020) and has won nine straight at Yager Stadium. Miami's last home loss was on Sept. 29, 2018. In all, it has been 1,071 (when the UC game takes place) days since Miami's last loss at home. Miami's next scheduled home game is Sept. 18, 2021 vs. LIU. When that game takes place it will have been 1,085 days since Miami's last home loss.

BOUNCE BACK

Since early in the 2016 season Miami has lost back-to-back MAC games just once in that span. In fact, Miami is now 8-1 following a MAC loss under Martin, dating back to Oct. 15, 2016.

MARTIN VS. THE MAC SINCE 2016

Miami is 25-9 versus MAC opponents over its last 34 games, best in the conference in that span. Over that time, Miami has outscored its opponents 981-748.

RED HOT

Miami's redzone offense has been downright amazing over the last three years. In all, Miami is 90-of-101 (89.1%) in redzone scoring over the past 29 games. It's even better in MAC play. In Miami's last 20 MAC games, the RedHawks are 66-of-72 (91.7%) inside the redzone.

GABBERT MAKES A NAME FOR HIMSELF

When Miami opened the 2019 season at Iowa, Brett Gabbert became the first true freshman quarterback to open the season as the starter in Miami football history. The younger brother of NFL quarterback, Blaine Gabbert, started all 14 games in 2019, throwing for 2,411 yards and 11 touchdowns. For his efforts, he was named the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year, just the third RedHawk in school history to accomplish this feat. Gabbert joins Ben Roethlisberger (2001) and Deland McCullough (1992) on this small list. Gabbert has started 16 games in his young Miami career.

THE MAYER OF OXFORD

Filling in for an injured Brett Gabbert last week, Mayer threw for 109 yards versus No. 8 Cincinnati. This is not the first time Mayer has seen action. Back in 2020, he was named MAC East Offensive Player of the Week after coming off the bench to throw for 212 yards and three scores in a win over Ball State. He started the following week at Buffalo as well and in his career he has thrown just one interception on 77 pass attempts.

JACK OF ALL TRADES

Jack Sorenson finished second in the MAC with 118.0 receiving yards per game in 2020. He is coming off of a 177-yard and four-touchdown performance versus Akron in 2020 and over his last six games, the 2019 MAC Championship Offensive Player of the Game, has 38 catches for 616 yards and five touchdowns.

FRESH FACES

Freshman running back Keyon Mozee led the RedHawks with 80 yards rushing on 15 carries last week at Cincinnati. Kenny Tracy, who saw limited action in 2020, had 37 yards on the ground and Miami's lone offensive touchdown. Reid Holskey and Sam Vaughan also both made their first career starts at both offensive tackle positions.

NEW LOOK OFFENSIVE LINE

Miami returns eight starters on offense from 2020, but two of the biggest holes to fill are along the offensive line. Tommy Doyle and Danny Godlevske combined for 55 starts over the past three years and have departed. George Barnett, Miami's Offensive line coach since 2014 also left.

MONSTERS OF THE MAC

Miami returns 10 starters from 2020, including third-team All-MAC performers in Kameron Butler and Lonnie Phelps. Miami's defense has been stellar lately. In 2019, Miami's last full season of competition, the RedHawks ranked top-five in nearly every defensive category, highlighted by allowing just 22.5 points (2nd), 352.9 yards (3rd) and 175.9 passing yards (1st) per conference game.

TRENCH WARFARE

Since the start of the 2018 MAC season, Miami ranks second in the conference in sacks with 80. In 2020, the RedHawks ranked second with 13 sacks (played three less games). They also finished second in 2019 (38) and sixth in 2018 (29).

FROM ZERO TO HERO

Many times, walk-ons rarely get noticed. That is not true with Ryan McWood. McWood began his career at Miami as a walk-on, but is now a vital cog in Miami's defense. McWood has led the team in tackles in 2019 and 2020 and was a CoSIDA Academic All-District selection in 2020.

- Ivan Pace had 6.0 sacks versus Akron back in 2019, matching the NCAA record for sacks in a game.
- Kameron Butler has 18.0 TFL and 8.0 sacks in his last 18 games.
- Sterling Weatherford has done a little bit of everything for the Red and White, recording 150 tackles, 17 pass breakups, three interceptions, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 29 games played.
- Mike Brown is starting his 28th straight game and has 135 tackles in his career.
- Dominique Robinson, who came to Miami as a quarterback, and later moved to wide receiver, now plays a crucial role at defensive end for the Red and White. Last season he had 2.5 TFLs and 2.0 sacks.

IF YOU BUILD IT...

Miami's Athletic Director, David Sayler continues to add facilities for the department. The two newest football installments can be seen just north of Yager Stadium. The new David and Anita Dauch Indoor Sports Center (DISC) opened in February of 2015 and features a full-length 120-yard field and four sprint lanes.

Between Yager Stadium and the DISC is the Athletic Performance Center. The APC provides much-needed upgrades to Miami Football's locker room and offices while also hosting a state-of-the-art medical and athletic training facility that serves all Miami's student-athletes.

Retired Miami Numbers

#7 Ben Roethlisberger

Ben Roethlisberger took his place in Miami Football history when his jersey No. 7 was retired on October 13, 2007. Roethlisberger ended his three-year playing tenure (2001-03) as the most prolific passer in program history.

#40 Bob Hitchens

No. 40 was retired in 1973 to mark the accomplishments of tailback Bob Hitchens, who concluded his career as the most prolific runner in Miami history. At the end of his three-year tenure (1971-73), Hitchens owned Miami's season and career records for points, rushing touchdowns, rushing attempts and rushing yards.

#41 Travis Prentice

No. 41 was retired to honor Travis Prentice. Prentice ranks sixth all-time in NCAA history with 5,596 rushing yards and second in total touchdowns with 78. He continues to own four NCAA records.

#42 John Pont

Worn by halfback John Pont through three varsity football campaigns, No. 42 was retired by the Athletic Advisory Council following his senior season in 1951. Pont thus became the first athlete in Miami history to have his jersey retired.

Player Awards from 2021

GAME 2 • MINNESOTA

Miami University, known world-wide as the "Cradle of Coaches," contributed four alumni to *Sporting News Magazine's* 50 Greatest Coaches, dominating all other universities.

PAUL BROWN ('30) was named as the 12th greatest coach of all time by The Sporting News (TSN). Miamians WALTER ALSTON ('35) and BO SCHEMBECHLER ('51) ranked 35th and 36th on the list, while ARA PARSEGHIAN ('49) was selected as sports' 44th greatest coach. A fifth man with Miami ties, WOODY HAYES, ranked 27th on TSN's list. Hayes served as Miami's football coach from 1949-50.


The August 3, 2009 publication asked a panel of 118 top coaches, media and sports administrators to choose the Top 50 list.

Altogether, only four universities contributed more than one alumnus to the list. Miami's four alumni topped Alabama (Paul "Bear" Bryant and Bobby Bowden), Minnesota (Bud Wilkinson and Herb Brooks) and Kansas (Dean Smith and Adolph Rupp), which each had two alums ranked among the Top 50. Purdue graduate John Wooden, the famed "Wizard of Westwood", was ranked as the No. 1 coach of all time.




An Ohio native who was a two-year football letter winner (1928-29), **Paul Brown** is a member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and excelled as a coach at the collegiate and professional levels. Brown was head coach at Ohio State (1941-43) and led the Buckeyes to their first national title in 1942. **Brown** then served as head coach at the professional level with the Cleveland Browns (1946-62) and Cincinnati Bengals (1968-75), winning championships in the All-America Football Conference and National Football League. **Brown** was elected into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1967, and the current home stadium of the Bengals bears his name.

PAUL BROWN




Always displaying a calm, professional demeanor, the unflappable **Walter Alston** managed the Brooklyn and Los Angeles Dodgers for 23 seasons (1954-76), winning seven National League pennants and four World Series championships. His squads would win 2,040 games during his tenure, the seventh-highest win total among major league managers. He helped to establish a "Dodger Way" which many of his former players later used to become successful managers themselves.

WALTER ALSTON




A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Bo Schembechler** was a two-year letter winner (1949-50) and head coach (1963-68) with the Red and White. During his six seasons as head coach, **Schembechler** led Miami to a 40-17-3 record and back-to-back conference co-championships (1965-66). **Schembechler** then became the head coach at the University of Michigan (1969-89) and led the Wolverines to 13 Big Ten titles.



A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Ara Parseghian** was a football letter winner (1946-47) before moving to the sidelines as an assistant coach (1950) and head coach (1951-55). During his five seasons as Miami's head coach, **Parseghian** compiled a 39-6-1 record and won back-to-back Mid-American Conference Championships (1954-55). **Parseghian** went on to coach at Northwestern (1956-63) and Notre Dame (1964-74) where he was named National Coach of the Year in 1964.

ARA PARSEGHIAN



A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Woody Hayes** served as the head coach of Miami during the 1949-50 and 1950-51 seasons. In his last year as head coach he led the RedHawks to a 9-1 record and a MAC Championship, and also led his team to a victory in the Salad Bowl. Hayes went on to coach at the Ohio State University (1951-78) where he became a fixture for the Scarlet and Grey and quickly became recognized as one of the greatest coaches of all time. At OSU he compiled a 205-61-10 record (.761) and led the Buckeyes to five national titles, 13 Big Ten championships, and four bowl victories. He is a three-time winner of the College Football Coach of the Year Award.

In his career, Chuck Martin has more than 20 years in college coaching experience, including 14 years as a head coach. He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach

of the Year, earning the honor in 2005 and 2006, and has coached in seven national championship games. In addition to his head coaching experience, Martin has served as a coordinator on both sides of the ball. Of those seven national championship game appearances, he has been a part of four national championship wins, with two titles under his direction as head coach/offensive coordinator and one as a defensive coordinator.

After taking over a team that had just gone 0-12, Miami was 4-26 in Martin's first 30 conference games. From there, the rest is history. Martin and the RedHawks are 25-9 in the MAC, best in the conference since 2016. The RedHawks won the 2019 MAC Championship with a 26-21 win over Central Michigan and advanced to the LendingTree Bowl. Miami has now been bowl eligible in four of the last five years.

This was done year after year with strong recruiting classes. Miami's classes have been some of the best the school has ever seen. Over the last six years, Miami's recruiting classes have ranked second (2020), second (2019), sixth (2018), second (2017), second (2016) and third (2015) in the MAC.

Miami's turnaround began back in 2016 as Martin orchestrated something that had never been done in college football. Miami rattled off six straight wins to become the first team in college football history to begin a season 0-6 and finish 6-6. The six-game win streak also moved Miami to 6-2 in the MAC, finishing in a tie for first in the East and helped the RedHawks advance to the St. Petersburg Bowl versus Mississippi State, Miami's first bowl appearance since 2010.

Prior to joining Miami, Martin spent four seasons at Notre Dame, serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach (2012-13) and defensive backs/recruiting coordinator (2010-11). In 2012, he orchestrated an offense that played in the BCS National Championship game versus Alabama. In 2011, he was named one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation by ESPN.com and was named to Rivals.com's Second-Team Assistant Coach Dream Team.

In Martin's two years calling plays, Notre Dame combined to go 20-5 overall and was one of the most balanced offenses in the country, averaging 26.4 points, 170.0 rushing and 235.6 passing per game.

Prior to arriving in South Bend, Martin was head coach and offensive coordinator for Grand Valley State University from 2004-2009 and compiled a 74-7 (.914) record, including an impressive 16-4 record in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. He and the Lakers won back-to-back national championships in 2005 and 2006 and finished runner-up in 2009. He directed Grand Valley State to 48 consecutive regular-season victories and 45 straight wins in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). He also guided the Lakers to a Division II record 40-game winning streak from 2005-07. Martin produced seven Associated Press First-Team All-America players as head coach.

At GVSU, Martin's offenses averaged 35.1 points, 208 rushing and 427 total yards per game. The Lakers ranked among the top-25 nationally in total offense in five of six seasons and ranked in the top-27 in scoring offense in all but one season. In that time, his offense scored at least 30 points in 56 of 81 games and scored at least 40 points in 34 contests.

Many of those offenses were led by quarterbacks who were developed under Martin. In six years, GVSU produced four Harlon Hill finalists, given annually to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year (Cullen Finnerty in 2006 and Brad Iciek from 2007-09). In that span, Laker quarterbacks threw 184 touchdown passes

and just 41 interceptions.

His offenses were not just about the quarterback. In all six seasons, he produced a 1,000-yard rusher. In four of those seasons, a running back finished as a top-10 rusher in Grand Valley State history.

Before becoming head coach, Martin served as the defensive coordinator for the Lakers in 2003, helping GVSU win a national championship. Martin's defense allowed just nine total points in the final three games of the playoff run and among the ranked top-10 nationally in scoring, rushing and total defense that season.

Martin served as the defensive backs and outside linebackers coach at GVSU from 2000-02. Prior to arriving in Allendale, Mich., Martin spent time at Eastern Michigan (1998-1999, linebackers), Millikin University (1996-97, defensive coordinator/defensive backs), Wittenberg University (1994-95, linebackers) and Mankato State University (1992-93, graduate assistant/linebackers).

While attending Millikin (1986-90), Martin was an All-American safety and was selected as a GTE Academic All-American. He doubled as an All-American place kicker, received Academic All-District honors for the Millikin baseball team and was inducted into the Millikin Hall of Fame in 2008.

He graduated in 1990 with a degree in accounting and earned his master's degree in physical education from Mankato State University in 1993.

Martin and his wife Dulcie have two children, Max and Emma.
