

The No. 2 seeded Golden Gopher women's hockey team drops the puck on the 2022-23 season, the 26th in program history, with a conference series against the Bemidji State Beavers (2-1-1) on Friday and Saturday at Ridder Arena. Puck drop is scheduled for 6:00 pm on Friday and 2:00 pm on Saturday.

Raising a Banner

The Gophers look to build upon last year's squad that won the program's 11th WCHA Regular Season Championship. The Maroon and Gold posted a 29-9-1 record and entered the NCAA Tournament as the No. 2 overall seed before falling to Minnesota Duluth in the quarterfinals. The Gophers will raise their 2022 WCHA Championship banner roughly 15 minutes before puck drop on Friday.

Scouting the Beavers

The Beavers travel to Ridder Arena with four games already under their belt after a sweep of Lindenwood and a loss and tie against No. 10 Clarkson. Bemidji State is led by stout defense and junior goaltender Hannah Hogenson, who brings a 2.90 GAA and .900 Sv % into this weekend's series. The Anchorage, Alaska native recorded a combined 127 saves against the Gophers in three games last year. Minnesota leads the all-time series 86-9-7 and has won the last 14 meetings. At Ridder Arena, the Gophers are 40-5-3 all-time against the Beavers.

2022-23 Roster Preview

Minnesota returns 20 players from last year's roster, including the highest-scoring line in college hockey of Taylor Heise, the reigning Patty Kazmaier Award winner, Abigail Boreen and Catie Skaja. Fifth-

year forward Grace Zumwinkle and sophomore forward Abbey Murphy also return to the lineup after donning the red, white and blue for Team USA in the 2022 Winter Olympics. The Gophers also added four freshmen – Josefin Bouveng (Swedish Olympian), Nelli Laitinen (Finnish Olympian), Madison Kaiser and Allie Franco. Lizi Norton, a fifthyear defender, transferred to the 'U' from Minnesota Duluth to round out the 27-player roster.

National Recognition

The Gophers enter the 2022-23 season ranked second in both national polls. Minnesota was ranked fourth entering last season before climbing to the top spot in the month of February. In September, Taylor Heise was named Preseason Player of the Year and a member of the Preseason All-WCHA Team by the WCHA coaches with Grace Zumwinkle named as an honorable mention. The Gophers were also picked in the coaches' poll to repeat as conference champions.

Between the Pipes

Minnesota will rely on a goaltending trio of senior Makayla Pahl, sophomore Skylar Vetter and senior Olivia King this season. Last season, Pahl posted a 9-1-0 record with a 1.70 GAA and .934 Sv%, while Vetter went 6-2-0 with a 1.57 GAA and a .926 Sv% in her first season in Maroon and Gold. Both Pahl and Vetter were honored with a WCHA Goaltender of the Week honor. King saw action in four games last season (1.15 GAA, .909 Sv%) including a shift as a skater against St. Thomas.

MVP

This August, Fifth-year forward Taylor Heise was named MVP and Best Forward of the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship after leading all players in points (18) and goals (7) in her first action with the USA Senior National Team. Her 18 points rank second all-time in a single Women's Worlds tournament. Heise and Kessel were each named to the Media All-Stars Team.

Scoring Milestones on the Horizon

Fifth-year forward Taylor Heise continues to climb the program ranks as Minnesota's active career scoring leader with 160 career points (67g-93a) in 134 career games. Fifth-year forward Grace Zumwinkle, who ranks 10th in program history in goals (84), is two points away from reaching the 150 career points. Fifth-year forwards Abigail Boreen (39g-50a), Emily Oden (27g-61a) and Catie Skaja (33g-47a) are the closest active skaters to the century mark.

Home Grown

The 2022-23 Gopher Women's Hockey roster includes 20 players who hail from Minnesota, the most in program history. Wisconsin, Illinois, Missouri, Massachusetts, Finland and Sweden are also represented in the largest roster in program history.

Behind the Bench

Head coach Brad Frost is back for his 16th season as the bench boss of Gopher Women's Hockey. Under Frost's guidance, the program has posted a 442-93-36 record with four national titles and seven conference titles. Natalie Darwitz is back behind the bench for her fourth season as assistant coach and is joined by newly promoted Jessica Scott, who served as the program's Director of Operations for the last three seasons.

Quest for Eighth National Title

Minnesota has won seven national championships (2000, 2004, 2005, 2012, 2013, 2015, and 2016) and looks for a historic eighth title national crown in 2022-23.

HEAD COACH BRAD FROST

The 2022-23 season marks head coach Brad Frost's 16th season at the helm of Gopher women's hockey. Frost has brought the program to the pinnacle of the collegiate hockey world by advancing to six-straight NCAA Women's Frozen Fours from 2011-12 to 2016-17. Frost's Gophers won four national titles in six years, including back-to-back titles in 2012 and 2013 and again in 2015 and 2016. After joining the program in 2001 as an assistant coach and later holding the interim head coach title during the 2007-08, Frost was named the program's second head coach on April 16, 2008.

In 15 seasons leading the Gophers, the Bethel University graduate has guided the Gophers to four NCAA national championships, nine NCAA Frozen Four appearances, seven WCHA regular season titles, and four WCHA Final Faceoff championships. Frost ended the 2020-21 season with a career record of 413-84-35 (.776) and has not had a team finish lower than fourth in the WCHA.

COACHING EXCELLENCE

Frost, who has won four national titles, is considered one of the best and most respected coaches in college hockey. In his 14 seasons, he has been named an AHCA Coach of the Year Finalist nine times and has won the national honor twice (2013 and 2014). Frost has been named WCHA Coach of the Year four times (2008, 2009, 2013, and 2014). Under his tutelage, the Gophers have tallied seven seasons with 30 or more wins. In 2013, Frost led the Gophers to the NCAA's first-ever perfect season (41-0-0).

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Over the last 15 years, Frost has coached some of the top talent not only in the nation but also in the world. He has seen 12 players (Megan Bozek, Hannah Brandt, Dani Cameranesi, Mira Jalosuo, Amanda Kessel, Gigi Marvin, Abbey Murphy, Kelly Pannek, Noora Räty, Anne Schleper, Lee Stecklein, and Grace Zumwinkle) represent their respective countries in the Olympics. He also aided the development of former Gophers and Olympians Natalie Darwitz, Kelly Stephens, Lyndsay Wall, and Krissy Wendell while a Minnesota assistant coach. Frost has coached a total of 15 players to a combined 25 All-American honors. Among those All-Americans is 2022 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner Taylor Heise. A total of 14 Minnesota student-athletes have been named Top-10 Patty Kaz finalists 22 times under Frost's tutelage.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Under Frost's guidance, the Gophers have recorded a 3.0 or higher grade point average and increased the team's Academic Progress Rating (APR). Minnesota has accumulated 174 WCHA All-Academic Team awards (15 in 2020-21), 77 WCHA Scholar Athlete honors (13 in 2020-21) and three WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year award recipients (Alex Woken, 2020; Gigi Marvin, 2009; Kelly Terry, 2014) since Frost took reign.

INTERNATIONAL COACHING EXPERIENCE

Frost has served USA Hockey by working development camps and serving as a coach for various U.S. teams. In 2006, he was an assistant coach of the U.S. Under-22 Team, and from 2008-09, he was an assistant coach for the U.S. National Team.

PERSONAL LIFE

Frost grew up in Burlington, Ontario, and attended Aldershot High School. After graduating from Aldershot, he decided to attend college at Bethel University, which is where his parents originally met. While at Bethel, he studied Physical & Health Education and was a two-sport athlete, competing in hockey and golf. Frost was a four-year letterwinner in hockey and completed his career ranked eighth on Bethel's career scoring list. In 1994 and 1995, he was voted the team's Most Valuable Player and Most Inspirational. He also captained the Royals his junior and senior seasons. At Bethel, Frost met his wife Dayna. They now reside in Cottage Grove, Minn., and have three sons: Micah, Jonah and Josiah.



RIDDER ARENA: HOME OF GOPHER WOMEN'S HOCKEY

The first-ever facility built specifically for women's hockey, Ridder Arena is home to the seven-time national champion Gopher women's hockey program. Since its opening in 2002, Ridder Arena has been a regular host of WCHA Championships, NCAA Regionals, and NCAA Frozen Fours. A new center-hung video board was installed during the 2011-12 season.

- Set an attendance record of 3,400 with its first sold-out crowd on Dec. 1, 2012
- · Has hosted seven sold-out Gopher women's hockey games
- Hosted 15 WCHA conference championships (2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022)
